VIRGINIA-MIAMI SERIES

- The Hurricanes lead the all-time series against Virginia, 15-8.
- Miami won all four games against the Cavaliers last year, including a three-game sweep in Coral Gables and in the title game of the ACC Baseball Championship.
- Two of the games in Coral Gables were decided by one run (1-0, 4-3 in 10 innings).

NOTING THE 18-GAME WIN STREAK

- Virginia enters the weekend on an 18-game winning streak, the longest win streak in school history.
- UVa is the lone remaining unbeaten team in Division I and holds the longest active winning streak in Division I.
- Virginia also has won 15 in a row at home.
- The Cavaliers have started 4-0 in the ACC for the first time in school history.

HULTZEN NAMED ACC PITCHER OF THE WEEK

- Danny Hultzen was named the ACC's Pitcher of the Week following his big performance last weekend vs. Florida State.
- Hultzen tossed seven innings vs. the Seminoles, giving up one earned run, four hits and two walks while striking out a career-best 13.
- He struck out seven in a row from the first to the third inning and did not allow a runner past first until the seventh inning.

13 Ks: IT'S BEEN AWHILE

- Hultzen's 13-strikeout performance was the most for a UVa pitcher since Sean Doolittle had 13 at Maryland in 2006.
- It was the most by a UVa freshman since 1994 when Seth Greisinger recorded 15 against North Carolina.
- Greisinger was the last Cavalier pitcher to post more than 13 strikeouts – he had 16 in 1996 against North Carolina.

RACKING UP RUNS IN RECORD NUMBERS

- Virginia piled up 177 runs through its first 15 games – the most ever at UVa.
- The previous high was 161 runs during the first 15 games of the 1898 season.

CARRAWAY NAMED LOWE'S SENIOR CLASS AWARD CANDIDATE

- Andrew Carraway has been named one of 30 baseball candidates for the Lowe's Senior CLASS Award.
- To be eligible, a student-athlete must be a Division I senior and have notable achievements in four areas of excellence: Classroom,

Character, Community, and Competition.

- The award focuses on the total student-athlete and encourages those leaders to use their platform in athletics to make a positive impact on their circle of influence.
- The list will be narrowed to a final 10 in mid-April.

VIRGINIA'S POWER SURGE

- Virginia has hit 19 home runs in its first 18 games. It took the Cavaliers 38 games last year (until April 13 at Maryland) to accumulate 19 homers.
- UVa had 25 home runs in all of 2008.
- Five Cavaliers have three homers this year – only three players had at least three in 2008.

PARKER SETS THE TABLE WELL

- Jarrett Parker has done a stellar job as UVa's new leadoff hitter this year.
- He is tied for second in the ACC with 26 runs scored and scored at least one run in 15 of 18 games
- He also has hit two home runs to lead off games, the first two dingers of his career.
- Parker's first leadoff homer was Virginia's first home run to lead off a game since Mark Reynolds hit one at Liberty on May 18, 2004.
- Parker ranks 13th the ACC in batting (.400). He is tied for the ACC lead in 3B (3), and total bases (56).

RUNNING THE GAUNTLET

- UVa is in the midst of a brutal ACC stretch, competing against each of the league's 2008 College World Series participants in consecutive weeks.
- Last week the Cavaliers played host to FSU. Miami visits this weekend, and UVa travels to North Carolina next weekend.
- Virginia is the lone ACC school to face these three teams in consecutive weeks this year.

GROVATT RIDES 18-GAME HIT STREAK

- Entering the weekend, Dan Grovatt is riding an 18-game hitting streak (20 dating to last season)
- It is the longest hit streak for a Cavalier since Brandon Guyer had a 26-game streak in 2007.
- Grovatt is second the ACC in batting at .491 and is tied with FSU's Tyler Holt for first with 27 hits.
- Grovatt leads the ACC in hits (34) and runs score (28).

GOSSELIN REBOUNDS FROM TOUGH START

- After starting the season 0-for-16, Phil Gosselin has bounced back in a big way, going 22-for-52 (.423) in the last 14 games.
- He has been the Cavaliers' top run-producer this year with an ACC-high 24 RBI.
- Gosselin has homered twice during this stretch – March 6 at Wake Forest and a grand slam March 10 vs. Navy.

PROSCIA KEEPS MASHING

- In his freshman season, Steven Proscia has gotten off to an outstanding start.
- He ranks fourth in the ACC (first among freshmen) with a .444 batting average.
- He is first in the ACC in doubles (11) and total bases (54), third in hits (32), fourth in RBI (22) and slugging (.750) and seventh in runs (21).
- He leads the team with 11 multiple-hit games.

ARE THOSE NUMBERS FOR REAL?

- Virginia's offense has put up some eye-popping numbers thus far, highlighted by its .388 team batting average, which leads the ACC.
- The Cavaliers have posted at least 10 hits in all but two games this year.
- UVA has recorded at least 20 hits in four games.
- The Cavaliers have racked up 78 extra-base hits (51 2B, 8 3B, 19 HR) among their 257 hits.

WHAT A SERIES - UVA WALLOPS WAKE

- Virginia put up some blistering numbers two weeks ago in the series sweep at Wake Forest.
- UVA hit .452 as a team and had a .500 on base percentage.
- The Cavaliers scored 47 runs and had 61 hits (16 doubles, 5 home runs) in three games.
- The 47 runs in the series were UVA's most in an ACC series since a 1990 series at Maryland.
- The 18- and 21-run games were the most scored in a single ACC road game since a 29-run outburst at Maryland in 1990.

- Every UVA starter had a hit in each of the three games.

EVERYONE HITS!

- With its offense clicking, Virginia has made a habit of batting around in innings this year.
- In 18 games, the Cavaliers have batted around 15 times.
- UVA's high for the year is 12 batters in one inning against George Washington.

PITCHING OFF TO BLAZING START

- The Virginia pitching staff has racked up the best ERA (1.94) in the conference thus far.
- Clemson is second with a 2.27 ERA.
- The Cavaliers have surrendered just 112 hits (6.2/game) this year.
- Opponents are batting .193 against Virginia pitching.

DON'T FORGET THE SPEED TOO

- Known for its prowess on the basepaths, Virginia has had its stolen base totals overlooked by many this year – but they still love to run.
- Virginia leads the ACC with 50 steals (in 57 attempts).
- Clemson is second with 32 steals.
- UVA has safely stolen 12 bases in a row since Jared King was thrown out against FSU.
- Four Wahoos ranks among the top six in the ACC in steals, highlighted by Phil Gosselin, Tyler Cannon and Dan Grovatt in a three-way tie for first with 10.
- Jarrett Parker is tied for sixth with seven.

HULTZEN GETS OFF ON THE RIGHT FOOT

- Freshman Danny Hultzen has had four-consecutive strong starts to kick off his college career, going 4-0 in the process.
- In 26 innings this year, Hultzen has whiffed 39 batters – most in the ACC. In contrast, he has walked only five.
- Hultzen already has a 13-strikeout game to his credit (vs. FSU), a 12-strikeout performance (vs. Fordham) and a nine-strikeout game (at Wake Forest).

DAVENPORT DOMINANCE

- Virginia is 15-0 this year in the friendly confines of Davenport Field after going 31-9 last season.
- UVA is 161-35 (.813) at Davenport since 2002, including 53-20 (.723) in ACC games.
- In nonconference games, the record is even more impressive – 108-15 (.868).

ROBERTS HAS MEMORABLE FIRST START

- In his first college start against William & Mary (Feb. 24), Will Roberts recorded eight strikeouts in five innings (3 H, 1 BB).
- It was the most strikeouts for a freshman in his first start since Andrew Carraway racked up eight vs. VMI on April 18, 2006.

CARRAWAY, POUTIER SERVE AS 2009 CAPTAINS

- Virginia has two captains this year – seniors Andrew Carraway and Robert Poutier.
- Poutier, who graduated in 2008 and is currently working on his master’s degree, is serving as a captain for the second straight year.
- Carraway is a three-time All-ACC Academic Baseball Team honoree and currently is living on the Lawn at UVa – one of the highest honors bestowed upon UVa students.

UVA AMONG SELECT FEW IN LAST FIVE NCAA TOURNAMENTS

- Virginia is one of just 17 Division I baseball programs to reach the NCAA Tournament in each of the last five seasons.
- The Cavaliers are one of five schools in the ACC to hold that distinction, joining Florida State, Miami, North Carolina and NC State.
- The other programs are Arizona State, Arkansas, Cal State Fullerton, Missouri, Oral Roberts, Pepperdine, Rice, South Carolina, Southern Miss, TCU, Texas and Wichita State.

ERA TOPS IN NATION OVER LAST FOUR YEARS

- Virginia pitchers boast a 3.10 ERA over the last four seasons – the lowest ERA in NCAA Division I over the last four seasons.
- UVa ranked third in the nation in ERA in 2005, 2006 and 2007 and was 15th last year.

- The Cavaliers ranked fifth nationally last year with 134 stolen bases. They were 11th in 2007 (128) and 19th in 2006 (114).

- Virginia has one of its youngest teams in recent memory, featuring 23 underclassmen, including 12 true freshmen.
- UVa returns 19 letterwinners from last season, while losing 11.
- Despite featuring so much youth, the Cavaliers still return four of their top six hitters from 2008.

SUMMER SUCCESS = SPRING SUCCESS?

- Several Cavaliers had extremely strong summers and will look to parlay that into big 2009 seasons.
- Among the top performers:
 - Tyler Wilson (Delaware) earned the Great Lakes Collegiate League Pitcher of the Year Award.
 - Corey Hunt (Sanford) won the New England Collegiate Baseball League’s defensive player of the year award.
 - Andrew Carraway (Hyannis – Cape Cod), Sean Lucas (Saratoga – NYCBL), Hunt and Wilson all were named to their respective leagues’ all-star teams.

ERA CHAMP PACKER ON WALLACE LIST

- UVa junior left-handed pitcher Matt Packer was named to the 2009 Brooks Wallace Player of the Year Watch List.
- Packer recorded the lowest ERA last year in NCAA Division I, posting a 1.14 mark after allowing just nine earned runs in 71.1 innings.
- He went 6-3 last year and allowed just 51 hits and 15 walks while striking out 58 as batters hit an ACC-low .202 against him.
- His season ERA was the fourth-lowest in Virginia history, and he became just the second Virginia pitcher (Seth Greisinger, 1996) to lead the country in ERA.
