VIRGINIA-MARYLAND SERIES

- Virginia leads the all-time series, 96-72-1.
- The win total is Virginia's second most against any school (VMI, 99).
- Virginia has won 18 straight against the Terrapins dating to April 6, 2002, in College Park.
- UVa has taken 11 straight over Maryland in Charlottesville, dating to April 25, 1999.

CAVALIER TOP PERFORMERS VS. TERPS

- Tyler Cannon had a big weekend last year vs. Maryland, going 8-for-14 (2B, HR, 4 RBI) as he improved to 10-for-26 (.385) in six career games vs. the Terrapins.
- Dan Grovatt went 4-for-13 (.308) last year (2 2B, HR, 3 RBI), while Franco Valdes went 4-for-12 (.333, 2 RBI).
- On the mound, Andrew Carraway is 2-0 with 0.82 ERA in three career games vs. UM. Last year, he started and earned the Sunday win (7 IP, 1 ER, 6 H, 0 BB, 9 K).
- Matt Packer has a 3.00 career ERA in two games vs. UM. Last year he tossed a scoreless inning of relief vs. the Terps.

THE HOMERS KEEP COMING

- Virginia has hit 26 home runs in its first 28 games, topping its total from the entire 2008 season (62 games).
- Six Cavaliers have at least three homers this year – only three players had at least three in 2008.

SWEATING THE TIGHT ONES

- Three of UVa's four losses have come by one run; the other defeat was by two runs. All four came to top-five teams (UNC, Miami).
- UVa's last five ACC games have all come by three runs or fewer.

PARKER SETS THE TABLE WELL

- Jarrett Parker has been strong as UVa's new leadoff hitter.
- He leads the ACC with 34 runs scored and has scored at least one run in 24 of 28 games.
- He has scored a run in eight straight games entering the weekend.
- Parker ranks third in the ACC in batting (.419). He leads the ACC in runs (42), triples (4) and total bases (86) and is among the top 10 in nearly every offensive category.

GOSSELIN REBOUNDS FROM TOUGH

START

- After starting the season 0-for-16 in the first weekend, Phil Gosselin has bounced back in a big way, going 40-for-89 (.449) in the last 24 games.
- He has been the Cavaliers' top run-producer this year with an ACC-high 38 RBI – nearly twice his 2008 total of 20.

RUNNING THE GAUNTLET

- UVa just finished a brutal ACC stretch, competing against each of the league's 2008 College World Series participants in consecutive weeks.
- Three weeks ago the Cavaliers played host to FSU. Miami then came to Charlottesville before Virginia traveled to North Carolina. UVa went 3-4 in the stretch (1-0 vs. FSU, 1-2

vs. Miami, 1-2). Three of the four losses were by one run, the other by two.

- Virginia is the lone ACC school to face these three teams in consecutive weeks this year.

LEADING OFF WITH A BANG

- Jarrett Parker has hit three home runs to lead off games this season
- Parker's first leadoff homer was Virginia's first home run to lead off a game since Mark Reynolds hit one at Liberty on May 18, 2004.
- He since has hit leadoff home runs against Delaware and North Carolina.

PITCHING OFF TO BLAZING START

- The Virginia pitching staff has racked up the best ERA (2.56) in the conference thus far.
- North Carolina is second with a 3.24 ERA.
- The Cavaliers have surrendered just 198 hits (7.1/game) this year.
- Opponents are batting an ACC-low .217 against Virginia pitching.

DON'T FORGET THE SPEED TOO

- Virginia leads the ACC with 59 stolen bases.
- That total ranks sixth nationally.
- Remarkably, UVa also is tied for the fewest times caught stealing (9) with Maryland.
- Only NC State (60) has attempted more stolen bases than UVa has stolen.
- Four Wahoos ranks among the top six in the ACC in steals – Tyler Cannon (second, 12), Phil Gosselin (fifth, 11), Dan Grovatt (sixth, 10) and Jarrett Parker (seventh, 9).
- Virginia has led the ACC in stolen bases in each of the last three seasons.

PROSCIA KEEPS MASHING

- In his freshman season, Steven Proscia has gotten off to an outstanding start.
- He ranks 10th in the ACC (first among freshmen) with a .390 batting average.
- Proscia is tied for fifth in the ACC with 11 doubles, tied for seventh in total bases (66) and tied for ninth in hits (41).
- He has at least one RBI in 20 of 27 games.

NOTING THE UNC SERIES

- In game one, UVA took an eighth-inning lead before UNC got a two-out, two-run triple from Mike Cavasinni to win, 4-3.
- Andrew Carraway pitched seven strong innings and was supported offensively by homers from Jarrett Parker and Steven Proscia in a 5-2 win.
- UVA tied the game in the ninth on a two-run homer by Dan Grovatt, but UNC put up the winning run in the bottom of the inning when Ryan Graepel was hit by a pitch with the bases loaded.

OFFENSE AMONG NATION'S BEST

- Virginia ranks seventh nationally in team batting average (.363 entering the week). New Mexico leads at .407.
- The Cavaliers also are fifth in hits (337), sixth in runs (248) and 12th in doubles (66).

PITCHING UP THERE AS WELL

- Virginia's pitching staff ranks third in the country in ERA (2.65 entering the week). Only Texas (2.03) and Arizona State (2.37) were better.
- UVA also stands third in hits allowed per nine innings (7.04) and fifth in strikeouts per nine innings (10.0).

HULTZEN GETS OFF ON THE RIGHT FOOT

- Freshman Danny Hultzen has had six-consecutive strong starts to kick off his college career, going 5-0 in the process.
- In 39 innings this year, Hultzen has whiffed 53 batters – most in the ACC. In contrast, he has walked only 12.
- Hultzen already has a 13-strikeout game (vs. FSU), a 12-strikeout performance (vs. Fordham) and a nine-strikeout game (at Wake Forest).

EVERYONE HITS!

- Virginia has made a habit of batting around in innings this year.
- In 28 games, the Cavaliers have batted around 20 times.
- UVA's high in one inning this year is 13 batters, set Tuesday against Radford.
- UVA scored a season-high nine runs in the second inning vs. Radford.

HULTZEN NAMED ACC PITCHER OF WEEK

- Danny Hultzen was named the ACC's Pitcher of the Week following his big performance vs. Florida State.
- Hultzen tossed seven innings vs. the Seminoles, giving up one earned run, four hits and

two walks while striking out a career-best 13.

- He struck out seven in a row from the first to the third inning and did not allow a runner past first until the seventh inning.

13 Ks: IT'S BEEN AWHILE

- Hultzen's 13-strikeout performance was the most for a UVA pitcher since Sean Doolittle had 13 at Maryland in 2006.
- It was the most by a UVA freshman since 1994 when Seth Greisinger recorded 15 against North Carolina.
- Greisinger was the last Cavalier pitcher to post more than 13 strikeouts – he had 16 in 1996 against North Carolina.

RACKING UP RUNS IN RECORD NUMBERS

- Virginia piled up 177 runs through its first 15 games – the most ever at UVA.
- The previous high was 161 runs during the first 15 games of the 1898 season.

GROVATT 19-GAME HIT STREAK ENDS

- Dan Grovatt saw his career-best 19-game hitting streak (21 dating to last season) end March 21 vs. Miami.
- It was the longest hit streak for a Cavalier since Brandon Guyer had a 26-game streak in 2007.

NOTING THE 19-GAME WIN STREAK

- Virginia started the season with a 19-game winning streak, the longest win streak in school history.
- The streak came to a halt with a 4-3 loss last Saturday to Miami.
- UVA was the last unbeaten team in Division I and held the longest active winning streak in Division I.
- The Cavaliers started 5-0 in the ACC for the first time in school history.

FIFTH-LONGEST STREAK IN ACC HISTORY

- The Cavaliers' 19-game win streak is tied for the sixth-longest in ACC history.
- It was the longest streak by an ACC team since FSU ran off 25 straight wins in 2002.

Top ACC Winning Streaks

ARE THOSE NUMBERS FOR REAL?

- Virginia's offense has put up some eye-popping numbers thus far, highlighted by its .360 team batting average, which leads the ACC.
- The Cavaliers have posted at least 10 hits in all but five games this year.
- UVA has at least 20 hits in four games.
- The Cavaliers have racked up 106 extra-base hits (71 2B, 10 3B, 25 HR) among 362 hits.

WHAT A SERIES - UVA WALLOPS WAKE

- Virginia put up some blistering numbers in the series sweep at Wake Forest.

- UVA hit .452 as a team and had a .500 on base percentage.
- The Cavaliers scored 47 runs and had 61 hits (16 doubles, 5 home runs) in three games.
- The 47 runs in the series were UVA's most in an ACC series since a 1990 series at Maryland.
- The 18- and 21-run games were the most scored in a single ACC road game since a 29-run outburst at Maryland in 1990.
- Every UVA starter had a hit in each of the three games.

DAVENPORT DOMINANCE

- Virginia is 19-2 this year at Davenport Field after going 31-9 last season.
- UVA is 165-37 (.816) at Davenport since 2002, including 54-22 (.711) in ACC games.
- In nonconference games, the record is even more impressive – 111-15 (.880).

ROBERTS HAS MEMORABLE FIRST START

- In his first college start against William & Mary (Feb. 24), Will Roberts recorded eight strikeouts in five innings (3 H, 1 BB).
- It was the most strikeouts for a freshman in his first start since Andrew Carraway racked up eight vs. VMI on April 18, 2006.

CARRAWAY, POUTIER SERVE AS 2009 CAPTAINS

- Virginia has two captains this year – seniors Andrew Carraway and Robert Poutier.
- Poutier, who graduated in 2008 and is currently working on his master's degree, is serving as a captain for the second straight year.
- Carraway is a three-time All-ACC Academic Baseball Team honoree and currently is living on the Lawn at UVA – one of the highest honors bestowed upon UVA students.

CARRAWAY NAMED LOWE'S SENIOR CLASS AWARD CANDIDATE

- Andrew Carraway has been named one of 30 baseball candidates for the Lowe's Senior CLASS Award.
- To be eligible, a student-athlete must be a Division I senior and have notable achievements in four areas of excellence: Classroom, Character, Community, and Competition.
- The award focuses on the total student-athlete and encourages those leaders to use their platform in athletics to make a positive impact on their circle of influence.
- The list will be narrowed to 10 in mid-April.

UVA AMONG SELECT FEW IN LAST FIVE NCAA TOURNAMENTS

- Virginia is one of just 17 Division I baseball programs to reach the NCAA Tournament in each of the last five seasons.
- The Cavaliers are one of five schools in the ACC to hold that distinction, joining Florida State, Miami, North Carolina and NC State.
- The other programs are Arizona State, Arkansas, Cal State Fullerton, Missouri, Oral Roberts, Pepperdine, Rice, South Carolina, Southern Miss, TCU, Texas and Wichita State.

ERA TOPS IN NATION OVER LAST FOUR YEARS

- Virginia pitchers boast a 3.10 ERA over the last four seasons – the lowest ERA in NCAA Division I over the last four seasons.
- UVA ranked third in the nation in ERA in 2005, 2006 and 2007 and was 15th last year.

- Over the last three years, Virginia ranks fourth nationally in stolen bases.
- From 2006-08, UVA stole 376 bases, an average of 125.3 steals per season.
- The Cavaliers ranked fifth nationally last year with 134 stolen bases. They were 11th in 2007 (128) and 19th in 2006 (114).

- Virginia's returning players accounted for just over half of the total last year (68 of 134, 50.7 percent).

ROOKIES WILL BE KEY

- Virginia has one of its youngest teams in recent memory, featuring 23 underclassmen, including 12 true freshmen.
- UVA returns 19 letterwinners from last season, while losing 11.
- Despite featuring so much youth, the Cavaliers still return four of their top six hitters from 2008.

SUMMER SUCCESS = SPRING SUCCESS?

- Several Cavaliers had extremely strong summers and will look to parlay that into big 2009 seasons.
- Among the top performers:
 - Tyler Wilson (Delaware) earned the Great Lakes Collegiate League Pitcher of the Year Award.
 - Corey Hunt (Sanford) won the New England Collegiate Baseball League's defensive player of the year award.
 - Andrew Carraway (Hyannis – Cape Cod), Sean Lucas (Saratoga – NYCBL), Hunt and Wilson all were named to their respective leagues' all-star teams.
