VIRGINIA-FLORIDA STATE SERIES

- Florida State owns a 44-16 all-time series advantage against Virginia.
- The teams split four games last year, with Virginia picking up its first-ever series win at FSU (winning 2 of 3), and FSU earning an 11-4 win in the ACC tournament.
- The Cavaliers have won five of the last seven meetings.
- In FSU's last trip to Charlottesville, the teams played only one game in the series because of poor weather; UVa took the Friday night game 15-2 in sub-freezing temperatures behind a stellar outing from Danny Hultzen.

VIRGINIA BASEBALL APPROACHING 2,000 WINS

- With 17 wins this season, the Virginia baseball program now owns 1,992 all-time wins (against 1,609 losses and 40 ties).
- Virginia currently is playing its 122nd baseball season.

VIRGINIA TAKES 11-GAME WIN STREAK INTO WEEKEND

- UVa has won its last 11 games, including all three at Clemson last week.
- It currently is the second-longest win streak in the nation (Longwood, 13).
- It marks the seventh time in eight seasons under the current coaching staff that UVa has posted a double-digit win streak. 2006 was the lone season that UVa did not record a double-digit win streak (UVa's high was nine that year).
- The list of double-digit win streaks since 2004:
 - 2009 - 19
 - 2004 and 2010 - 14
 - 2007 - 13
 - 2005, 2008 and 2011 - 11

PROSCIA ETCHES NAME IN VIRGINIA CAREER RECORDS BOOK

- Steven Proscia continues to stand out as one of Virginia's top run producers.
- He has moved into 10th place in career RBI at Virginia with 142; he needs one RBI to match David Adams (2006-08) for ninth and three to tie Phil Goselin (2008-10) for eighth.
- He also has 46 career doubles, which is tied with Justin Counts (1993-96) for ninth in the Virginia career annals. With his next double Proscia will tie Ryan Zimmerman (2003-05) for eighth at UVa.

- Virginia owns 17 wins this season – tied for the NCAA lead with Vanderbilt.
- Virginia ranks 24th nationally in total attendance (21,435) and average attendance (2,381) this year.
- UVa leads the ACC in ERA (1.72) and strikeouts (198).
- UVa's 11-game win streak is the second longest current streak in Division I (Longwood, 13).
- Virginia ranks second in the nation in runs allowed per game (2.2) and is seventh in scoring margin (+5.3).

HULTZEN NAMED NATIONAL PLAYER OF THE WEEK – AGAIN

- Virginia LHP/utility Danny Hultzen was named one of *Collegiate Baseball's* National Players of the Week Monday. He joined Baylor RHP Logan Verrett and Georgia Tech RHP Mark Pope in earning the honor.
- It marks the second time in three weeks that Hultzen has gleaned this distinction from *Collegiate Baseball*.
- Hultzen improved to 4-0 on the season after firing 6.2 shutout innings Friday against Clemson, which came into the game as the top hitting team in the ACC with a .343 batting average. He fanned 14 Clemson batters and struck out at least two batters in six of the seven

innings he worked during a 5-0 win against the Tigers.
 • Hultzen also went 3-for-8 with three RBI at the plate last week and is now batting .372 this season.

HICKS SWINGING A HOT STICK

- John Hicks has been on fire at the plate to start the year.
- He is batting a team-best .397, which ranks sixth in the ACC.
- Hicks has reached base in every game this season, joining Chris Taylor as the only Cavaliers who have done so this year.
- He recorded his first career multi-homer game on Wednesday with a two-homer, four-RBI day vs. JMU.

VIRGINIA VS. RANKED TEAMS

- Virginia has played four games against two ranked team this season, sweeping then-No. 4 Clemson last weekend and winning 13-2 at then-No. 23 Auburn on Feb. 19.
- UVa went 19-10 against ranked opponents last year, including a 6-4 mark on the road.
- Virginia is 35-18-1 against ranked foes since 2009.

PITCHING, DEFENSE COMBINE FOR LETHAL COMBO

- Virginia boasts a strong tandem of pitching and defense this year.
- UVa has allowed just 2.2 runs per game, second fewest in Division I. Texas A&M (2.1) is the only team to allow fewer runs per game.
- Virginia owns a .984 fielding percentage this season; the Cavaliers set a school record in 2010 with a .977 fielding percentage.

PITCHING HAS BEEN LINCHPIN TO SUCCESS

- Virginia's pitching has been sensational this season, as UVa leads the ACC with a 1.72 team ERA.
- UVa has recorded five shutouts this year (two in 2010) and has allowed no more than four earned runs in any game this year.
- One huge key – UVa pitchers have cut their bases on balls in half, walking just 34 batters (2.0/9 innings). In 2010 UVa averaged 3.31 walks per nine innings.
- On Wednesday UVa held the most prolific offensive team in the nation, James Madison, to three runs. JMU came in averaging a national-best 12.1 runs per game.

ROTATION SETS TONE FOR CAVALIERS

- Virginia's starting rotation of Danny Hultzen, Tyler Wilson and Cody Winiarski collectively has been strong over the first four weekends.
- The three have combined to go 9-1 with a 1.73 ERA in 72.2 innings. The trio has allowed just 50 hits and 15 walks while striking out 99.
- They have allowed more than one run in a start just four times this year.

KLINE EMPHATICALLY SHUTS THE DOOR

- In his first season as the Virginia closer, sophomore righty Branden Kline has been brilliant with eight saves in as many opportunities.
- Kline has struck out 17 in 10.2 innings. In that span he has allowed a run, five hits and one walk (0.84 ERA).
- He pitched in 24 games (eight starts) as a freshman and was entrusted with big starts in the championship games of both the NCAA regional and super regional.

TAYLOR SETS THE TABLE

- Chris Taylor has filled the leadoff slot in every game this season and has proven to be strong on that role.
- He ranks third on the team with a .342 batting average. That mark stands 25th in the ACC
- Taylor had 59 at bats in 29 games last year (13 starts) and hit .305.

LAST YEAR VS. FSU - TEAMS SPLIT FOUR GAMES

- Virginia and Florida State split four games last year.
- Virginia won two of three games last year in the teams' three-game series at Dick Howser Stadium, marking UVa's first-ever series win at FSU.
- The Seminoles then won 11-4 in the ACC tournament.
- In the regular-season series, UVa won the opener, 5-0, behind seven shutout innings from Danny Hultzen.
- UVa scored six runs in the ninth inning to rally from an 8-3 deficit and win 9-8 in the Saturday game.
- FSU got a two-run homer from Tyler Holt in the eighth inning to win the finale, 9-8.

VIRGINIA-CLEMSON RECAP

- Virginia earned its first-ever three-game sweep at Clemson last weekend (5-0, 8-7, 7-6). UVa became the first team since FSU in 2008 to sweep Clemson at Doug Kingsmore Stadium.
- Steven Proscia was UVa's top performer at the plate, going 6-for-12 with a homer and four RBI.
- In the opener UVa blanked the Tigers behind 6.2 shut-out innings and 14 strikeouts from Danny Hultzen.
- Saturday, UVa rallied with three runs in the eighth and one with two out in the ninth to win 8-7.
- Sunday, the Cavaliers received a four-hit day from Proscia in taking a 7-6 win for the sweep.

NOTING THE 2011 GAME TIME RULE CHANGES

- The NCAA is enforcing a 20-second clock between pitches (with no runners on base) as well as a 90-second clock between innings.
- Through 18 games Virginia is averaging 2 hours, 40 minutes per game.
- UVa's games averaged 3 hours, 5 minutes in 2010.

HULTZEN CONTINUES TO DAZZLE

- Danny Hultzen has dominated in his first three starts, going 4-0 with a 0.66 ERA. In 27.1 innings he has allowed just 13 hits and four walks while striking out 50 (16.5 K/9 innings).
- He has not allowed a run in his last two starts and 13.2 innings pitched.
- Hultzen has struck out at least 10 in each of his four starts, including a career-high 15 vs. East Carolina (most at UVa since Seth Greisinger struck out 16 UNC batters in 1996).
- He has allowed no more than five hits in any start.
- In Hultzen's four outings only nine baserunners have advanced past first base.

HULTZEN CLIMBS VIRGINIA CHARTS

- Danny Hultzen continues his march up the all-time Virginia pitching charts.
- He is now second in career wins at UVa with 24; the record is 27, set by Jacob Thompson (2005-08).
- Hultzen is first in career winning percentage (.923; 24-2), just ahead of Robert Poutier (.917; 11-1).
- His career ERA of 2.28 stands fourth in UVa history, while his 280 strikeouts ranks second (he needs 10 to match Seth Greisinger for the record).

HULTZEN, COLEMAN GET ANOTHER CHANCE IN LINEUP

- After seeing little action at the plate last year, Danny Hultzen and David Coleman each have started strong at the dish.
- The two combined to get just 80 at-bats last season, but they already have eclipsed that total in 2011 – Coleman with 47 and Hultzen with 46 (93 combined).

WILSON SEAMLESSLY MOVES TO ROTATION

- After pitching out of the bullpen for most of his first three seasons, including 51 straight relief outings entering the season, Tyler Wilson has shifted to the week-end rotation in 2011.
- He is 3-0 with a 1.82 ERA this year. In 24.2 innings he has allowed just 20 hits and five walks with 30 strikeouts.
- Wilson now owns 20 career wins, which is tied for seventh in Virginia history (20-7, 3.08 ERA).
- He ranks fourth in career pitching appearances at UVA with 76 (seven starts).

- Tyler Wilson has been named one of 30 candidates for the 2011 Lowe's Senior CLASS Award.
- An acronym for Celebrating Loyalty and Achievement for Staying in School®, the award focuses on the total student-athlete and encourages students to use their platform in athletics to make a positive impact as leaders in their communities.
- A biology major, Wilson is planning to go into the medical field and become an orthopedic surgeon after his baseball career concludes.

SOUTHPAWS GIVE UVA MORE OPTIONS OUT OF 'PEN

- Virginia has added a quartet of left-handed options to its bullpen this year, with a healthy Scott Silverstein, sophomore Aaron Stull and freshmen Kyle Crockett and Ryan Ashooh.
- The lefties have combined to work 8.0 innings out of the bullpen and 12.0 innings total in 13 appearances.
- In 65 games last year, left-handers made 25 appearances out of the bullpen for the Cavaliers.
- Silverstein did not pitch his first two seasons at UVA while recovering from shoulder surgery.

LEVINE MAKES MOST OF OPPORTUNITY

- Ryan Levine has played well when given the chance to DH; he did not play last year as a freshman.
- In six games (five starts) over the last two weeks, Levine hit .400 (8-for-20) with a pair of doubles and eight RBI.
- In the Saturday contest at Clemson, Levine went 2-for-4 with a pair of RBI singles.
- The switch-hitter hit out of the cleanup position three times and once each out of the five- and six-holes in the last two weeks.

UVA EARNS NATIONAL PITCHING STAFF OF THE WEEK AWARD

- Virginia's pitching staff was honored Monday (March 7) by InsidePitching.com as the National Pitching Staff of the Week following a 6-0 week.
- UVA's pitchers combined for three shutouts and posted a miniscule 0.67 team ERA for the week. UVA struck out 60 and walked just 12 in 54 innings.

O'CONNOR RANKS FOURTH IN WIN PERCENTAGE ENTERING 2010

- UVA head coach Brian O'Connor entered 2011 with a career record of 316-118-1 (.728) and a 126-71-1 record in ACC play.
- O'Connor's 72.8 winning percentage ranked as the fourth best mark among active NCAA Division I coaches entering the 2011 season.
- The only coaches who own a higher winning percentage are Mike Martin (Florida State), Mike Fox (North Carolina) and Gene Stephenson (Wichita State).

IF YOU BUILD IT, THEY WILL COME

- Because of unprecedented ticket demand, Virginia added over 1,500 general admission seats to Davenport Field during the 2010 season to push the stadium's official capacity to 4,825.
- These seats were added in three increments as fans continued to fill the stadium and create even more demand.
- Davenport Field started the 2010 season with a capacity of 3,600.

DEMAND RESULTS IN RECORD ATTENDANCE

- A school-record 125,959 fans walked through the turnstiles at Davenport Field in 2010 (14th nationally). UVA averaged 3,148 fans per game.
- Virginia obliterated all of its previous attendance records. The previous season highs were 1,774 per game and 65,661 total in 2007.
- Virginia played in front of 11 home sellout crowds, including a school-record 4,825 for the May 16 contest with North Carolina.

HULTZEN A PRESEASON ALL-AMERICAN

- UVA junior southpaw Danny Hultzen was named a 2011 Preseason First-Team All-American by Baseball America, *Collegiate Baseball* and the NCBWA.
- The reigning ACC Pitcher of the Year, Hultzen posted an 11-1 record with a 2.78 ERA in 2010. In 106.2 innings he allowed 75 hits and 24 walks while striking out 123. Batters hit a league-low .193 against him.
- Hultzen led the ACC with 11 wins and 123 strikeouts. He ranked ninth nationally in fewest hits allowed per nine innings (6.33), 13th in strikeouts and 36th in ERA. He pitched at least six innings in 14 of his 16 starts.

EXPERIENCED PITCHING STAFF RETURNS

- Virginia returns 10 pitchers who saw time on the mound in 2010. In all, the group represents 73 percent of the total innings tossed by UVA hurlers last season.
- The group has combined to appear in 237 career games and pitch over 650 innings.

- Weekend starters Danny Hultzen and Cody Winiarski are both back, as is Tyler Wilson, who primarily has been a reliever in his career. Branden Kline and Will Roberts, who each spent time as weekday starters in 2010, also are in the pitching mix.
- Bullpen stalwarts Chad O'Connor, Shane Halley, Justin Thompson, Corey Hunt and Mayberry all return with plenty of experience.

PLENTY OF BATS BACK TOO

- Virginia returns five position starters from the 2010 team which was the second straight UVa squad to top the ACC in batting average.
- UVa hit a league-high .331 last season after leading the conference with a .327 average in 2009.
- The five returning starters all hit at least .300 last year, led by Keith Werman, who hit .414 last year – the fifth-highest average in program history.
- John Barr (.373), Kenny Swab (.328), Steven Proscia (.314) and John Hicks (.307) all topped the .300 mark.

NINE WAHOOS SELECTED IN 2010 MLB DRAFT

- Virginia had a school-record nine players selected in the 2010 MLB First-Year Player Draft.
- Seven of the nine signed contracts:
 - OF Jarrett Parker (2nd round, SF), 2B Phil Gosselin (5th round, ATL), RHP Robert Morey (5th round, FLA), RHP Kevin Arico (10th round, CIN), OF Dan Grovatt (11th round, PIT), INF Tyler Cannon (12th round, CLE) and Neal Davis (36th round, PHI).
 - RHP Tyler Wilson (35th round, CIN) and C/1B/OF Keny Swab each have returned for their senior seasons.
 - The previous UVa high for draft picks in a year was six.

SILVERSTEIN BACK ON THE MOUND

- After a year off the mound because of shoulder surgery, left-hander Scott Silverstein is back to toe the rubber this year.
- Now in his third year at UVa, Silverstein has not yet made a pitching appearance for the Cavaliers.
- He has not pitched since his high school because of injuries; as a UVa freshman he saw limited action at the plate and first base.
- He was a two-time high school All-American and was drafted by the Nationals in the 32nd round of the '08 draft.

VIRGINIA LEADS NATION IN ERA LAST SIX YEARS

- Virginia led all NCAA Division I teams in ERA over the past six seasons, boasting a 3.26 team ERA.
- UVa is the only school to rank in the top 20 in the country in ERA each of the last six seasons, including No. 3 marks in 2005, 2006, 2007 and 2009.
- Virginia also is the only team in Division I to rank among the top 20 nationally in ERA, strikeouts and fewest hits allowed each of the last three years.

- Virginia's defense has racked up the ACC's best fielding percentage since the current coaching staff arrived in 2004.
- Virginia has accumulated a .972 fielding percentage over the last seven years combined, including a school-record .977 mark last season (seventh nationally).
- Georgia Tech ranks second in the ACC over the same span with a .968 fielding mark.

VERSATILITY WILL BE KEY

- Much of the UVa's depth comes because of its versatility – several players could see action at a variety of positions.
- John Hicks and Kenny Swab each are athletic players who primarily are catchers but both will shift to first base and the outfield at times.
- Danny Hultzen will pitch and also is a strong defensive first baseman and will DH and play the outfield as well.
- Reed Gragnani and Chris Taylor each can play multiple infield positions as well as the outfield.
- Corey Hunt (INF) and Shane Halley (OF) each will pitch, but are great defensive players in the field as well.

SOPHOMORE TRIO GETS ITS SHOT

- Virginia's infield trio of Stephen Bruno, Chris Taylor and Reed Gragnani waited in the wings for the most part in 2010, but they will be vital to the potential success for UVa this year.
- Bruno made 36 appearances last year (25 starts), primarily at DH, and is expected to share time at shortstop with Taylor this year.
- Bruno hit .388 with three homers and 30 RBI last year. Taylor hit .305 in 29 games in 2010, but the coaches have big expectations for him this season as he steps into a more prominent role.
- Gragnani hit .365 in 65 at bats as a rookie and could also see time in the infield or outfield.
