FOR OPENERS

- UVA seeks its third consecutive non-conference, regular-season tournament title.
- The Cavaliers captured the Corpus Christi championship in 2013 and Barclays Center Classic title in 2014.
- Bradley head coach Brian Wardle served as head coach at Tony Bennett's alma mater, Green Bay, for five seasons from 2010-15.
- Virginia posted a 2-1 record against Green Bay during Brian Wardle's tenure at the school.

VIRGINIA'S RANKED NO. 6 AP IN BOTH POLLS

- UVA is ranked No. 6 in the latest Associated Press and USA Today Coaches' preseason polls.
- The Cavaliers' No. 6 preseason ranking was UVA's best since a No. 1 ranking to start the 1982-83 season.
- UVA has been ranked in the top 10 in 25 consecutive AP polls since March 3, 2014, its longest span since 49 consecutive polls from 1980-83.
- Virginia has been ranked in the preseason top-10 in back-to-back seasons for the first time since 1981-82 and 1982-83.
- UVA has finished in the top 10 (No. 3 in 2014 & No. 6 in 2015) in the final AP rankings in back-to-back seasons for the first time since three straight seasons from 1981-83.

ABOUT THE 'HOOS

- The Cavaliers defeated Morgan State 86-48 to open the season, but suffered a 73-68 loss at George Washington on Monday, Nov. 16.
- Senior All-America candidate Malcolm Brogdon and Anthony Gill lead the Cavaliers into action at the Charleston Classic.
- Brogdon tallied a career-high 28 points at George Washington and leads UVA in scoring at 16.5 points per game.
- Gill is averaging 11.5 points and 6.0 rebounds, and has reached double figures in scoring in each of the first two games.
- Senior center Mike Tobey has averaged 12.5 points and a team-leading 7.5 rebounds.

UVA VS. THE CHARLESTON CLASSIC FIELD

- Virginia is 13-8 all-time against the 2015 Charleston Classic field.
- The Cavaliers are 0-2 vs. Bradley, 7-1 vs. George Mason, 0-0 vs. Long Beach State, 1-1 vs. Mississippi, 0-1 vs. Oklahoma State, 0-3 vs. Seton Hall and 5-0 vs. Towson.

LAST TIME OUT

- Virginia suffered a 73-68 loss at George Washington on Monday, Nov. 16.
- Malcolm Brogdon led UVA in points (28), rebounds (6) and assists (4) in the loss.
- Tyler Cavanaugh (18), Patricio Garino (18), Paul Jorgensen (10) and Joe McDonald (10) each scored in double figures for George Washington.
- The Colonials out-rebounded Virginia 37-33 and went 23-28 from the charity stripe.
- UVA shot 40.3 percent from the field, including 25 percent (5-20) from 3-point range.
- 59 of UVA's 68 points came from its starters.
- The loss ended Virginia's seven-game winning streak vs. George Washington.

SERIES HISTORY VS. BRADLEY

- UVA is 0-2 all-time against Bradley in the series that dates back to 1947.
- Bradley defeated UVA, 96-85, in the last meeting between the teams during the College Basketball Invitational at John Paul Jones Arena in 2007-08.
- Bradley defeated Virginia 77-58 in the first meeting between the teams in 1947.

LAST TIME VS. BRADLEY

- Jeremy Crouch led five players in double figures with 27 points to send Bradley to a 96-85 win over Virginia during the College Basketball Invitational on March 26, 2008.
- Jeff Jones led the Cavaliers with 26 points and Sean Singletary added 17 as UVA ended the season with a 17-16 record.
- Adrian Joseph chipped in 15 points and Mamadi Diane had 10 for the Cavaliers. The Braves out-rebounded the Cavaliers 43-38 and made 21-27 free throws in the win.

ALL-TIME VS. THE MISSOURI VALLEY CONFERENCE

- Virginia has a 5-3 all-time record vs. current Missouri Valley Conference opponents (1-0 vs. Drake, 1-0 vs. Loyola, 1-0 vs. Missouri State, 1-0 vs. Northern Iowa, 1-0 vs. Southern Illinois, 0-2 vs. Bradley and 0-1 vs. Wichita State).
- The Cavaliers recorded wins over Missouri State (83-63) and Northern Iowa (57-43) of the MVC during the 2013-14 season.

VIRGINIA HEAD COACH TONY BENNETT

- Head coach Tony Bennett sports a 137-65 mark in seven seasons at Virginia and 206-98 career mark in 10 seasons.
- Bennett was named 2015 USBWA National Coach of the Year after leading Virginia to a school-record tying 30 wins and its second consecutive ACC regular-season title.
- Bennett was also named ACC Coach of the Year, NABC District 2 Coach of the Year and USBWA District 3 Coach of the Year for the second consecutive year.
- Bennett has led the Cavaliers to 30 wins in back-to-back seasons for the first time in school history.
- In 2013-14, Bennett guided UVA to its first ACC regular season and tournament championship (first since 1976) in the same season for the first time in school history.
- Bennett has led the Cavaliers to four consecutive postseason tournaments (NCAA in 2012, 2014 and 2015, and NIT in 2013).
- Bennett-coached teams are 76-3 when holding opponents to fewer than 50 points during his 10-year coaching career.
- Bennett-coached teams have led the nation in scoring defense three times (2008-09, 2013-14 & 2014-15), and finished in the top five nationally in six of nine seasons.
- Bennett is one of 26 Division I head coaches who played in the NBA.

VIRGINIA PICKED 2ND IN THE ACC

- Virginia was picked to finish second in the ACC preseason poll.
- The second-place preseason selection is UVA's highest since being selected first in 1982-83.
- The Cavaliers, who were picked fourth and finished first in each of the last two seasons, have finished at or higher than their predicted finish in each of the last six seasons.
- North Carolina is the preseason favorite, followed by Virginia, Duke, Notre Dame, Miami, Florida State, Louisville, NC State, Syracuse, Pitt, Wake Forest, Clemson, Georgia Tech, Virginia Tech and Boston College.

EMBRACE THE PACE

- Virginia is averaging 77.0 points and yielding 60.5 points in 2015-16.
- The Cavaliers are shooting 44.9 percent from the field and 26.3 percent from 3-point range, while limiting their opponents to 39.6 percent from the field and 26.2 percent from 3-point range.
- In 2014-15, Virginia averaged 65.4 points and yielded a nation-leading and school-record (modern era) 51.5 points.
- UVA shot 45.7 percent from the field and 35.2 percent from 3-point range, while limiting its opponents to 36.7 percent from the field (3rd nationally) and 30.8 percent from 3-point range.
- The Cavaliers ranked in the top five nationally in eight defensive categories: points per game (1st), points per possession (2nd), true shooting percentage (2nd), field goal percentage (3rd), effective shooting percentage (4th), possessions per 40 minutes (4th), offensive rebounding percentage (5th) and rebounds per game (5th).
- UVA ranked in the top 20 nationally in three offensive categories: defensive rebound percentage (5th), rebound percentage (9th) and assist-to-turnover ratio (20th).
- Virginia limited its opponents to 106 fast break points (3.1 per game).

ALL-AMERICAN BROGDON LEADS CAVALIERS INTO ACTION

- Preseason co-ACC Player of the Year Malcolm Brogdon leads UVA into action this season.
- Brogdon is averaging a team-leading 16.5 points and 6.0 rebounds per game in 2015-16.
- Brogdon was named a preseason All-American by The Sporting News (1st team), Blue Ribbon Yearbook (1st team), CBSSports.com (2nd team), NBCSports.com (2nd team), Bleacher Report (2nd team), USA Today (3rd team) and CollegeInsider.com.
- In 2014-15, Brogdon averaged a career-high 14.0 points and 3.9 rebounds en route to All-America second-team and All-ACC first-team accolades.

2015-16 Opponents in Bold

- The two-time All-ACC performer, who was a John Wooden Award finalist last season, ranks 36th on UVA's all-time scoring list with 1,167 points in 101 career games (11.6 career ppg).
- Brogdon ranks second on UVA's career free-throw percentage list at 86.4% (292-for-338).
- Brogdon, who is a candidate for the 2016 Senior CLASS Award and Wooden Citizen Cup Award, was named to the 2014 Allstate NABC Good Works Team.
- Brogdon helped Team USA to a bronze medal at the 2015 Pan American Games in Toronto.
- The redshirt senior earned a degree in history and is pursuing a master's degree in public policy from the Frank Batten School of Leadership and Public Policy.

HIGH POINT MAN TO THE GILLS

- Preseason All-ACC second-team selection Anthony Gill, who is averaging 11.5 points and 6.5 rebounds, is Virginia's best frontcourt player.
- Gill, a High Point, N.C., native, averaged career highs in points (11.6) and rebounds (6.5) en route to All-ACC third-team (media) honors in 2014-15.
- Gill's team-leading 29 steals helped earn him a spot on the coaches' All-ACC Defensive Team in 2014-15.
- Gill, who has led UVA in field goal percentage in each of the past two seasons, is shooting 58.2 percent during his UVA career.
- Gill earned MVP honors at the 2014 Barclays Center Classic and ranked 13th in the ACC in rebounding.
- Gill is 28 points shy of reaching 1,000 career points in three seasons at UVA and one at South Carolina.

LONDON CALLING THE SHOTS

- Junior point guard London Perrantes had six points (2-3 3-point FGs), three rebounds, one steal and one blocked shot vs. Morgan State.
- Perrantes averaged 6.4 points and 4.6 assists en route to honorable mention All-ACC honors last season.
- Perrantes ranked third in the ACC in assist-to-turnover ratio (3.0) and fourth in assists (4.6 apg).
- He set career highs in points (26) and 3-pointers (5) at Miami (1/3/15).
- Perrantes has a career 3.13 assist-to turnover ratio (291 assists, 93 turnovers) in 69 career games.
- Perrantes earned All-ACC Freshman Team honors in 2013-14.

NEWCOMERS ENJOY IMPRESSIVE UVA DEBUTS

- Darius Thompson, Jack Salt and Jarred Reuter made their UVA debuts against Morgan State.
- Thompson had 12 points, six rebounds, four assists and three steals in the 86-58 win, while Salt had five points and three rebounds in eight minutes and Reuter had eight points and six rebounds in 10 minutes.
- Thompson sat out last season after averaging 2.6 points and 2.4 assists in 37 games at Tennessee in 2013-14.
- Salt played at the same high school as former All-Big 10 player and current New Zealand pro basketball player Kirk Penney, whom Tony Bennett coached while an assistant at Wisconsin. Reuter helped Brewster Academy to back-to-back national prep titles.

BROGDON AND GILL ON WOODEN AWARD WATCH LIST

- Malcolm Brogdon and Anthony Gill are among 50 players on the preseason 2016 John R. Wooden Award Watch List, honoring the nation's top player.
- Gill earns his first preseason Wooden Award Watch List honor, while Brogdon was a Wooden Award All-American and finalist last season.
