FOR OPENERS

- Virginia (10-0) meets Harvard (7-1) for the first time.
- Virginia seeks its first 11-0 start since 1992-93.
- The Cavaliers rank second in the nation in scoring defense (48.1 ppg) and third in field goal percentage defense (32.7%).
- UVA has held opponents under 70 points in a nation-leading 16 consecutive contests.
- UVA owns the nation's eighth-longest home winning streak at 16 games.

ALL-TIME AGAINST THE HORIZON LEAGUE

- Virginia is 18-8 all-time against Ivy League members (8-5 vs. Penn, 3-0 vs. Brown, 3-0 vs. Dartmouth, 2-0 vs. Columbia, 2-1 vs. Yale and 0-2 vs. Princeton).
- The Cavaliers are meeting an Ivy League opponent for the first time since Jan. 6, 2009, when they defeated Brown 74-50 at JPJ.

SIXTH MAN NO MORE

- 2014 ACC Sixth Man of the Year Justin Anderson has started and led the team in scoring in eight games this season.
- He was named the USBWA's Oscar Robertson National Player of the Week and ACC Co-Player of the Week on Dec. 9 after averaging 18.5 points and seven rebounds in wins at Maryland and VCU.
- Anderson tallied a season-high 21 points at VCU and had 20 against Tennessee State.
- He is averaging career highs in points (15.8), rebounds (4.9), field goal percentage (56.7%), 3-point percentage (59.5%) and free-throw percentage (81.3%).
- He ranks first in the ACC in 3-point percentage, sixth in free-throw percentage, eighth in scoring, eighth in 3-pointers per game (2.2) and ninth in field goal percentage.
- Anderson tied a career high with five 3-pointers on 5-5 shooting from distance against Tennessee State.
- Anderson was named 2014 ACC Sixth Man of the Year after averaging 7.8 points and 3.2 rebounds off the bench.
- In 2013-14, Anderson led the team in scoring in five games and had several game-changing defensive plays to ignite UVA.

UVA RANKED IN TOP 10 FOR SEVEN STRAIGHT WEEKS

- UVA is ranked No. 6/5 in the latest Associated Press and USA Today coaches polls.
- The Cavaliers have been ranked in the top 10 for the first seven weeks of the season for the first time since 1982-83.
- The No. 9 AP preseason ranking was UVA's best since a No. 1 ranking to start the 1982-83 season.

THERE'S NO PLACE LIKE HOME

- UVA is 113-35 (.764) in nine seasons, including a 5-0 mark in 2014-15, at John Paul Jones Arena.
- UVA is 75-19 (.798) at home under head coach Tony Bennett.
- Virginia has a 16-game home winning streak (15 of the 16 victories during the streak have been by double digits).
- Virginia has sold out home contests vs. Harvard (12/21), Duke (1/31), Louisville (2/7), Wake Forest (2/14) and Virginia Tech (2/28) this season.
- UVA has won a school-best 18 consecutive ACC home games.
- Virginia's 18-game ACC winning streak is tied with Duke for the longest current streak in the league.
- Virginia went 20-2 at JPJ in 2012-13, setting a school record for home wins in a season.
- UVA's 19-game home winning streak in 2012-13 marked a JPJ record.

LAST TIME OUT

- Justin Anderson and Anthony Gill tallied 16 points apiece to lead Virginia to a 70-54 win over Cleveland State on Dec. 18.
- Virginia shot 50 percent or better for the third straight game and held the Vikings scoreless for 10:03 in the first half.
- Anthony Gill added 13 points and a game-high eight rebounds.

VIRGINIA HEAD COACH TONY BENNETT

- Sixth-year head coach Tony Bennett sports a 116-60 mark at Virginia and 185-93 mark in nine seasons overall.
- Bennett was named 2014 ACC Coach of the Year after guiding the Cavaliers to their first ACC Tournament championship since 1976.
- In 2013-14, he guided UVa to its first ACC regular season and tournament championship in the same season for the first time in school history.
- Bennett has guided the Cavaliers to three consecutive postseason tournaments (NCAA in 2012 and 2014 and NIT in 2013).
- Bennett has increased UVa's win total in each of the last five seasons (15 in 2009-10, 16 in 2010-11, 22 in 2011-12, 23 in 2013-13 and 30 in 2013-14).
- Bennett-coached teams are 65-3 when holding opponents to fewer than 50 points during his nine-year coaching career.
- Bennett-coached teams have finished in the top five nationally in scoring defense in five of eight seasons (first in 2008-09 and 2013-14, second in 2007-08 and 2011-12, and fifth in 2012-13).
- Bennett is one of 24 Division I head coaches who played in the NBA.

EMBRACE THE PACE

- Virginia is averaging 68.8 points and allowing 48.1 points (second in the nation), marking its best averages under head coach Tony Bennett.
- UVa has shot 48.8 percent from the field and 37.9 percent from 3-point range, while limiting its opponents to 32.5 percent from the field and 28.4 percent from 3-point range.
- The Cavaliers have held 34 straight opponents and 37 straight ACC opponents under 50 percent shooting from the field.
- UVa has limited its opponents to 16 fast break points.
- As of Dec. 19, the Cavaliers rank in the top five nationally in 10 defensive categories: rebounds per game (1st), points per game (2nd), defensive rebounds per game (3rd), field goal percentage (3rd), effective shooting percentage (4th), points per possession (4th), possessions per 40 minutes (4th), assists per game (5th), true shooting percentage (5th), rebound percentage (6th) and offensive rebound percentage (7th).

BROGDON LEADS CAVALIERS INTO ACTION

- Preseason All-ACC performer Malcolm Brogdon leads UVa into action this season.
- Brogdon ranks third on the team at 12.9 points per game and had a season-high 20 points against La Salle and added 18 at Maryland.
- Brogdon has 10 or more points in seven games.
- In 2013-14, Brogdon averaged a career-high 12.7 points and 5.4 rebounds en route to All-ACC honors.
- Brogdon scored a career-best 23 points in the 2014 ACC Tournament final win against Duke.

HIGH POINT MAN IN THE PAINT

- Anthony Gill, a High Point, N.C., native, is averaging career highs in points (13.0) and rebounds (6.7) this season.
- Gill tallied his first career double-double with 16 points and a career-high 10 rebounds en route to MVP honors at the Barclays Center Classic.
- Gill has hit doubles figures in six straight games, and is averaging 14.5 points during that span.
- Gill leads the team in field goal percentage (62.2%) and is shooting a career-best 73.1 percent (38-52) from the free-throw line after shooting 62.7 percent last season and 64.6 percent at South Carolina in 2011-12.

LONDON CALLING

- Sophomore point guard London Perrantes is averaging 7.0 assists and 1.7 turnovers in his last three games.
- Perrantes is averaging 3.0 points, 2.1 rebounds and 4.1 assists in nine games overall.
- Perrantes ranks fourth in the ACC in assist-to-turnover ratio (3.1) and 10th in assists (4.1 apg) this season.
- Perrantes averaged 5.5 points and 3.8 assists and ranked sixth nationally in assist-to-turnover ratio (3.5) to earn All-ACC Freshman Team honors last season.

NOLTE KNOWS SHOOTING

- Junior forward Evan Nolte is one of Virginia's top 3-point shooting threats.
- Nolte, who keyed UVa's rally with a pair of 3-pointers against Coastal Carolina in the 2014 NCAA Tournament, has shot 34.8 percent from 3-point range during his career.
- Nolte, who tallied a season-high eight points against Cleveland State, is averaging 5.3 points in his last three games.

ROOKIES ARE FINDING THEIR WAY ON GROUNDS

- Redshirt freshman Devon Hall and true freshmen Isaiah Wilkins and Marial Shayok have made solid contributions in 2014-15.
- Shayok had nine points, five rebounds and four assists at Maryland.
- Hall had five points and five steals in a starting role in place of London Perrantes at James Madison.
- Wilkins chipped in eight points, five rebounds, three assists, two steals and two blocks at James Madison.
- Freshman B.J. Stith has seen limited action in seven games, scoring his first career points (4) against Tennessee State.
- Wilkins averaged 18.2 points, 10.3 rebounds and 3.4 blocks en route to Georgia Gatorade Player of the Year honors for Greater Atlanta Christian last season, while Shayok averaged 15 points and 6 rebounds per game for Blair Academy.
- Stith averaged 12.4 points and 4.3 rebounds for national runner-up Oak Hill Academy.
- Wilkins is the stepson of NBA Hall of Famer Dominique Wilkins, and Stith is the son of UVa all-time leading scorer Bryant Stith.

PAINT IT ORANGE AND BLUE

- Virginia is averaging 34 points in the paint, while limiting its opponents to 17.6 points per game in the paint.
- Frontcourt players Anthony Gill, Mike Tobey and Darion Atkins have combined to shoot 57.3 percent (102-178) from the field and are averaging 19.2 rebounds as a unit.
- UVa has outrebounded its opponent in every game and has a +13.6 rebounding margin.
- Gill, Tobey, Atkins and Isaiah Wilkins have combined for 36 blocked shots.

ANDERSON NAMED USBWA NATIONAL PLAYER OF THE WEEK

- Justin Anderson earned USBWA's Oscar Robertson National Player of the Week honors on Dec. 8.
- Anderson averaged 18.5 points and seven rebounds as Virginia posted road wins at then-No. 21 Maryland (76-65) and VCU (74-57).
- He tallied 16 points and six rebounds in the ACC/Big Ten Challenge win at Maryland on Dec. 3.
- Anderson added a season-high 21 points and eight rebounds in the 17-point win at VCU on Dec. 6.
- In the two wins, Anderson shot 68.8 percent (11-16) from the field and 84.6 percent (11-13) from the free-throw line.
- Anderson shared ACC Player of the Week honors with Notre Dame's Jerian Grant.

BARCLAYS CENTER CLASSIC RECAP

- The Cavaliers' Barclays Center title on Nov. 29 marked their third tournament championship in the Tony Bennett era (2014 ACC Tournament and Corpus Christi Challenge).
- Virginia defeated Norfolk State (67-39), Tennessee State (79-36), La Salle (64-56) and Rutgers (45-26) en route to the title.
- The 26 points allowed against Rutgers were the fewest allowed by UVa in the shot clock era (since 1986).
- The Cavaliers held Rutgers scoreless for 9:24 in the second half of the title game.
- Anthony Gill was named tournament MVP after averaging 14 points and eight rebounds in the four games.
- Justin Anderson joined Gill on the all-tournament team.

ABOUT THE 2014-15 SCHEDULE

- Six of Virginia's opponents are ranked in the latest AP poll (Duke, Louisville, Maryland, Miami, Notre Dame and North Carolina), while one (VCU) received votes.
- UVa is 1-0 vs. ranked opponents, defeating then-No. 21 Maryland.
- The Cavaliers have also defeated a pair of opponents (George Washington & VCU) that received votes in the AP poll.
- Nine opponents (Duke, Louisville, Pittsburgh, NC State, George Washington, Harvard, North Carolina, Syracuse and VCU) played in the 2014 NCAA Tournament, while three (Clemson, Davidson and Florida State) participated in the National Invitation Tournament and two (Norfolk State and Cleveland State) in the CollegenInsider.com Tournament.
