QUICK HITS - WEEK 10

Two top 25 games highlight week 10 of the ACC football schedule as No. 6/5 Clemson travels to No. 20/19 NC State for a 3:30 p.m. kickoff on Saturday, Nov. 4, followed by a primetime matchup between No. 13/13 Virginia Tech at No. 9/6 Miami at 8 p.m.

The annual "Textile Bowl" between Clemson and NC State shapes up as an Atlantic Division showdown with the Wolfpack trying to snap a five-game losing streak against the Tigers. Clemson holds a commanding 56-28-1 advantage in a series that began in 1899 in Rock Hill, S.C. The Tigers have won 12 of the last 13 meetings, including last year's overtime victory that kept alive Clemson's national championship hopes. NC State's last win in the series came in 2011, when it stunned the seventh-ranked Tigers, 37-13, at Carter-Finley Stadium. Both teams are ranked for the first time since 1992 and only the fourth time in series history.

Clemson ranks sixth nationally in scoring defense and seventh in total defense, while the Wolfpack is first in fewest turnovers committed and 14th in the country in turnover margin.

COASTAL CLINCH SCENARIO

- Miami can clinch a berth in the ACC Championship Game and at least a share of the Coastal Division with a win over Virginia Tech AND a Virginia loss to Georgia Tech.

A key Coastal Division contest finds the Hokies and Hurricanes meeting for the 35th time overall and the 14th time as ACC members. It is the first time both teams are ranked in the top 25 since 2010, when No. 24 Miami knocked off No. 14 Virginia Tech, 31-17. Miami leads the series 12-6 at home, including a 4-2 record at Hard Rock Stadium. The game shapes up as a defensive battle as Virginia Tech ranks second nationally in scoring defense and ninth in total defense, while the Hurricanes are third in pass efficiency defense and third in team tackles for loss.

Miami has won its five ACC games this season by an average of just 8.6 points per game, while Virginia Tech, in its three league victories, has outscored its opponents 106-20.

Syracuse, which has just two losses in league play, travels to Tallahassee for a 12:20 p.m. kickoff on the ACC Network. FSU holds a 9-1 advantage against the Orange in a series which began in 1966 with Syracuse's only victory. The Seminoles have won all four meetings in ACC play by an average of 32.3 points per game and are 4-0 against the Orange in Tallahassee. Syracuse QB Eric Dungey ranks seventh nationally in total offense.



IN THE RANKINGS

- Syracuse senior WR Steve Ishmael is second in the nation in receptions per game (8.3), third in total receptions (66), sixth in total receiving yards (843), and sixth in receiving yards per game (105.4). Ishmael is one of three ACC players in the top 10 in receptions per game, including his teammate Ervin Phillips, who is tied for sixth (7.6) and Virginia's Olamide Zaccheaus, who is tied for 10th (7.1). NC State's Jaylen Samuels is currently 13th (7.0).
- Boston College's Michael Walker leads the nation in combined return yardage. Walker, who is ninth nationally in punt return average (16.1), has 912 total return yards, including both punt (356) and kickoff (556) returns. North Carolina sophomore Anthony Ratliff-Williams is second with 716 yards, all on kickoff returns, while Pitt's Quadree Henderson is fourth with 684.
- Miami's Braxton Berrios is sixth in the country in punt return average (16.3).
- NC State senior DE Bradley Chubb is second nationally in tackles for loss, averaging 2.1 per game. He is also sixth nationally in quarterback sacks, averaging 0.93 per game.
- Wake Forest freshman WR Greg Dortch, who was lost for the season with an injury after a spectacular game against Louisville, is tied for third nationally in receiving touchdowns with nine. Dortch is also ranked fifth in the nation in all-purpose yards per game (161.25) and is 19th in receptions per game (6.6).
- Louisville QB Lamar Jackson leads the nation in total offense, averaging 426.3 yards per game, points responsible for (194), while also ranking 14th among all players in rushing (114.3). He is ahead of the ACC total offense record of 393.4 yards per game that he set last year.
- Syracuse junior QB Eric Dungey is currently seventh nationally in total offense, averaging 337.9 yards per game.

QUICK HITS

- Georgia Tech and Virginia meet at 3 p.m. on RSN in an evenly matched series that the Yellow Jackets lead, 20-18-1. Georgia Tech has won four of the last five meetings and six of the last eight, but the Cavaliers have only lost twice at Scott Stadium (2009, 2013) since Georgia Tech's historic 38-35 win over then No. 1-ranked Virginia in 1990. A win by the Cavaliers makes them bowl eligible for the first time since 2011. The Jackets are the only team in the country yet to throw an interception and are fourth nationally in rushing offense.
- The Demon Deacons meet the Irish for the fourth time overall and travel to Notre Dame for the third straight trip. The Irish have won all three prior meetings in the series, which began in 2011. Wake Forest President Nathan Hatch, who took over in Winston-Salem in 2005, came to the Deacons after spending 30 years at Notre Dame, including the last six as the Provost. Notre Dame's new defensive coordinator, Mike Elko, came from Wake Forest, and spent 12 years as an assistant coach to Wake head coach Dave Clawson. Wake leads in the nation in team tackles for loss (9.3), while Notre Dame ranks sixth in rushing offense (317.9).
- Led by Clemson with six, the ACC leads all conferences in wins (29) vs. teams with a .500-or-better record. No other team in the AP Top 10 has played more .500-or-better teams than Clemson (6).
- Based on opponent winning percentage, Boston College and Florida State have played the nation's fourth- and seventh-most difficult schedules, respectively. BC's nine opponents are 38-19 (.667), while Florida State's seven opponents are 30-16 (.652).
- The ACC has four bowl-eligible teams this week – Miami (7-0), Clemson (7-1), Virginia Tech (7-1) and NC State (6-2). Four other teams need just one win to achieve postseason eligibility, including Boston College (5-4), Louisville (5-4), Virginia (5-3) and Wake Forest (5-3). BC and Louisville are off this week, while Virginia hosts Georgia Tech and Wake Forest travels to Notre Dame.
- Miami is 7-0 for the first time since winning its first seven games in 2013. The last time the Hurricanes won eight straight to open a season was 2002, when they won 12 straight before falling in the Fiesta Bowl to Ohio State.
- With its fourth dramatic win in as many weeks, Miami now has a winning streak of 12 consecutive games, which is the longest current streak in the FBS. The Hurricanes have won six straight games at home and will face Virginia Tech this Saturday. The Hokies have won five straight games on the road, which ties for the fourth longest current road winning streak.
- Miami has won its last four games by an average of just 4.5 points per game. The Hurricanes are the 10th ACC team to win four consecutive games by a margin of eight or fewer points. The ACC record of five consecutive wins by eight or fewer points was set by Maryland in 2006.
- Clemson has been ranked in the top 10 of the AP poll in each of the past 36 weeks. That ties Alabama for the longest current streak in the nation.
- Florida State head coach Jimbo Fisher (80-22, .784) and Clemson head coach Dabo Swinney (96-29, .768) are the two winningest coaches by percentage in ACC history.
- Four ACC coaches are included on the Bobby Dodd Award Midseason Watch List, including Dave Doeren of NC State, Justin Fuente of Virginia Tech, Mark Richt of Miami and Dabo Swinney of Clemson. Swinney is a past winner of the Dodd Coach of the Year Award in 2011.
- Two ACC schools honored future their National Football Foundation College Football Hall of Fame inductees with on-campus salutes this past weekend. Boston College honored 1985 Outland Trophy winner Mike Ruth and Clemson recognized legendary head coach Danny Ford, who led the Tigers to their first national championship in 1981. Both will be inducted into the NFF Hall of Fame at its annual banquet this Dec. 5 in New York City.
- Louisville QB Lamar Jackson is only the second ACC quarterback in history to top 1,000 rushing yards twice in a season, joining former Clemson standout Woodrow Dantzler. He has an ACC-best 1,026 rushing yards this season. No quarterback has ever led the ACC in rushing.
- Jackson became the fastest player in league history to gain 10,000 yards of total offense,



WIN STREAKS

- Miami's 12-game win streak is the longest in the country ahead of Georgia and Wisconsin, which have each won nine. Miami has not won 12 consecutive games since 2002.
- Virginia Tech and Miami have each won five straight road games, which ties for the fourth-longest streak in the country behind Oklahoma (14), Alabama (12) and Wisconsin (6). The Hokies travel to Miami this weekend.
- Clemson has won eight straight over top 25 teams, the longest streak in Tiger history. The Tigers are 10-1 in matchups of top 15 teams over the last three years and 13-1 in its last 14 games against teams ranked in the top 25 of at least one poll.
- Georgia Tech has won seven straight at home, which is the seventh-longest in the country.

EIGHTY WINS

FSU head coach Jimbo Fisher is just the eighth coach in ACC history to have won at least 80 games at an ACC school since the conference began in 1953. Fisher won his 80th game at Duke on Oct. 14 and is currently 80-21. He joins Dabo Swinney, Danny Ford and Frank Howard of Clemson; Bill Murray of Duke; Bobby Bowden of Florida State; George Welsh of Virginia and Frank Beamer of Virginia Tech with 80 wins at one ACC school.

accomplishing the feat in just 31 games. He is only the second junior to top the 10,000-yard mark, joining Clemson's Deshaun Watson, who did so in 33 games. Jackson's career total now stands at 11,751 through 34 games. He ranks fourth on the ACC career list, trailing only Watson (12,097), Tajh Boyd of Clemson (13,069) and Philip Rivers (13,582) of NC State.

ACC teams have performed well this season on third down with four teams ranking among the top 12 nationally in third down defensive percentage. Syracuse is second (.238), followed by No. 3 Virginia Tech (.240), No. 10 Georgia Tech (.279) and No. 12 Clemson (.290).

Wake Forest leads the nation in tackles for loss, averaging 9.3 hits behind the line of scrimmage per game. The Deacons are one of four ACC teams ranked in the top 10, and are followed by Miami (third, 8.9), Clemson (sixth, 8.4) and Virginia Tech (ninth, 8.0).

The two longest punt returns in the nation have been turned in this year by ACC returners. NC State's Nyheim Hines has the longest in the FBS to his credit, a 92-yarder for a TD against Pitt on Oct. 14 that was one yard longer than the 91-yard return for a score by Virginia Tech's Greg Stroman against North Carolina on Oct. 21.

Three ACC players – Clemson's Dorian O'Daniel, Virginia's Micah Kiser and Virginia Tech's Tremaine Edmunds – have been named semifinalists for the Butkus Award, which is presented annually to the nation's top linebacker.

Three ACC players have been named semifinalists for the Paycom Jim Thorpe Award, which is presented annually to the nation's top defensive back. Named from the ACC were Jeremy McDuffie of Duke, Derwin James of Florida State and Quin Blanding of Virginia.

Six ACC players were chosen as quarterfinalists for the Lott IMPACT Trophy, the most of any conference nationally. Named as members of the 20 quarterfinalists from the ACC were Quin Blanding, S, Virginia; Tremaine Edmunds, LB, Virginia Tech; Zaire Franklin, LB, Syracuse; Derwin James, DB, Florida State; Micah Kiser, LB, Virginia and Christian Wilkins, DT, Clemson. Virginia was one of just two schools in the country to have two players chosen as quarterfinalists.

Eight ACC football players have been named semifinalists for the National Football Foundation's Campbell Trophy, which is given annually to the nation's top football scholar-athlete. The semifinalists are OT Gabe Brandner of Duke; OT Andrew Marshall of Georgia Tech; WR Braxton Berrios of Miami; TE Cole Cook of NC State; P Ryan Winslow of Pitt; DB Jordan Martin of Syracuse; LB Micah Kiser of Virginia and TE Cam Serigne of Wake Forest.

Twelve ACC football players have been nominated for the 2017 Allstate AFCA Good Works team. The list is led by Heisman Trophy winning QB Lamar Jackson of Louisville and includes DT Christian Wilkins of Clemson, T Gabe Brandner of Duke, TE Mavin Saunders of Florida State, QB Matthew Jordan of Georgia Tech, DL Demetrius Jackson of Miami, WR Austin Proehl of North Carolina, P A.J. Cole III of NC State, T Brian O'Neill of Pitt, QB Zack Mahoney of Syracuse, S Quin Blanding of Virginia and PK Joey Slye of Virginia Tech.

Eleven quarterbacks from ACC schools have started an NFL game this season. Four of those signal callers are from NC State, including Philip Rivers (Chargers), Russell Wilson (Seahawks), Jacoby Brissett (Colts) and Mike Glennon (Bears). They are joined by Clemson's Deshaun Watson (Texans), Boston College's Matt Ryan (Falcons), North Carolina's Mitch Trubisky (Bears), Pitt's Tom Savage (Texans), Virginia Tech's Tyrod Taylor (Bills) and Florida State's Jameis Winston (Buccaneers) and E.J. Manuel (Raiders). All 11 played in the ACC.

Seven ACC quarterbacks have made their first career starts this season. Boston College's

CAMPBELL TROPHY FINALISTS

Miami wide receiver Braxton Berrios and Virginia linebacker Micah Kiser are among the 13 finalists for the 2017 William V. Campbell Trophy, which is awarded by the National Football Foundation to an individual deemed the absolute best football scholar-athlete in the nation.

Boasting a nearly perfect 3.96 GPA, Berrios is the leading receiver for undefeated Miami. His impressive resume earned his spot as the Hurricanes' fourth NFF National Scholar-Athlete.

Kiser personifies the student-athlete ideal, having already earned his degree while claiming All-America accolades as one of the top defensive players in the nation. The two-year team captain becomes Virginia's fifth NFF National Scholar-Athlete.

Anthony Brown, Clemson's Kelly Bryant, Virginia Tech's Josh Jackson and Georgia Tech's TaQuon Marshall all made their first starts in week one. North Carolina's Chazz Surratt made his first career start in week two vs. Louisville. Florida State true freshman James Blackman and Pitt sophomore Ben DiNucci made their first starts on Sept. 23. In addition, Miami's Malik Rosier made just the second start of his career in the Hurricanes' season-opener against Bethune-Cookman.

COASTAL NOTES

Virginia Tech Quarterback Josh Jackson leads all freshmen nationally with 17 touchdowns passes and 2,032 passing yards. He is second among freshmen QBs in pass efficiency rating (153.9).

Virginia Tech head coach Justin Fuente has won 36 games in his last four seasons as a head coach, two at Memphis and his first two years at Virginia Tech. Fuente's teams posted a 36-11 mark during that time as he became just the 13th coach to be named ACC Coach of the Year in his first season in the league and only the third to be named Coach of the Year and lead his team to 10 wins.

Virginia Tech senior WR Cam Phillips has 216 career receptions, which is the second-highest total of any active FBS player. Phillips is tied with Wake Forest's Desmond Clark (1995-98) for 10th place on the ACC career receiving list.

With his 75-yard punt return last Saturday against Virginia, Pitt junior Quadree Henderson now has seven career kick return touchdowns – four by kickoff returns and three by punt returns. That is one shy of the FBS record, currently held by eight different players, including Clemson's C.J. Spiller, who is also the ACC record-holder.

Virginia Tech PK Joey Slye needs just eight points to become the fifth player in ACC history with 400 or more career points. Slye currently has 392 points and is sixth on the ACC career list. He now has 76 career field goals, which is the fourth-highest total in league history. This weekend he will be facing a Miami PK in the Hurricanes' Michael Badgley who has 72 career field goals, which ranks fifth on the ACC list and 369 points, which is eighth.

Virginia Tech defensive back Greg Stroman has four career punt returns for touchdowns. Stroman got his fourth on a 91-yard return against North Carolina. The return put him over 1,000 punt return yards for his career. He now has 1,057 career yards, the eighth-best total in league history.

Virginia LB Micah Kiser, who is one of the semifinalists for the prestigious National Football Foundation Campbell Trophy, the award also known as the academic Heisman, is 12th nationally in total tackles, averaging 9.9 per game. He is also 12th among all active players in the FBS in career tackles per game, averaging 7.84 throughout his four-year career.

Virginia safety Quin Blanding leads all active FBS players in career total tackles with 441. Blanding, currently in his fourth year as a starter, averages 10.02 tackles per game.

Duke LB Joe Giles-Harris ranks fourth among all active players in the FBS, averaging 9.19 tackles per game in his career. A sophomore, Giles-Harris has 193 career hits in 21 games.

ATLANTIC NOTES

When Wake Forest QB John Wolford passed for 461 yards in the Deacons' 42-32 win over Louisville it marked the 24th-highest single-game passing total in ACC history. It was also the fifth-best day by a Wake Forest QB. Wolford, who completed 28 of 34 passes for 461 yards, five TDs and no interceptions, had an ACC single-game best 244.7 pass efficiency rating. He currently leads the ACC in pass efficiency with a 167.9 mark.

Wolford's 461 passing yards marked the first time in school history a Demon Deacon QB has thrown for 400 or more yards in a winning cause. The Deacons previously had been 0-7 when recording 400 or more passing yards.

Wake Forest TE Cam Serigne has 17 career touchdown receptions. That ties him with former Florida State All-America Nick O'Leary for third place on the all-time ACC list for tight ends. Serigne trails only Heath Miller and Bucky Hodges, who each had 20 career scoring catches.



ACC Louisville's Lamar Jackson has recorded seven of the top 10 single-game rushing performances by an ACC quarterback. Jackson is also one of two quarterbacks in the country to have rushed for 175 or more yards seven times this century. Michigan's Denard Robinson is the other.

ACC Jackson has been responsible for 106 career touchdowns, including 46 by rush and 60 by pass. He is fourth on the ACC career list, trailing only Clemson's Tajh Boyd (133) and Deshaun Watson (116) and NC State's Philip Rivers (112).

ACC Jackson is averaging 104.7 career rushing yards per game, which is the fifth-best of any current FBS player. In fact, Jackson is one of just two quarterbacks in the top 10. The other is Navy's Zach Abey with 127 yards per game in a run-first offense.

ACC Jackson has rushed for 46 touchdowns, an ACC career record for a quarterback. The conference career mark for rushing touchdowns regardless of position is 52, set by Pitt's James Conner. The 46 rushing scores ties Florida State's Dalvin Cook (2014-16) for fourth on the ACC career list.

ACC NC State QB Ryan Finley had his streak of consecutive passes without an interception broken against Notre Dame. Finley's streak ended at 339 attempts, the second longest streak in ACC history, trailing only former NC State QB Russell Wilson, who set the ACC mark with 379 passes without an interception during the 2008-09 seasons. Wilson's record is also the NCAA standard.

ACC Boston College RB A.J. Dillon ran for 272 yards and four TDs in the Eagles' win over Louisville on Oct. 14 to earn Walter Camp National Offensive Player of the Week honors. His 272 yards are the highest rushing total in the ACC since BC's Andre Williams set the league record with 339 yards against NC State in 2013. The 272 yards are the second-highest total by a freshman in league history and the fifth-highest single game total in the nation this year. It is also the 11th-best rushing effort by an ACC player in league history.

ACC Syracuse' 27-24 upset of No. 2-ranked Clemson marked the highest-ranked opponent the Orange had defeated since downing No. 1 Nebraska (17-9) in Syracuse in 1984, a span of 33 years. It was the first top five foe defeated by the 'Cuse since a 22-14 win over fifth-ranked Virginia Tech in 2001. It was also the third time in the AP poll era Syracuse beat the defending national champion (1987 - Penn State, 1998 - Michigan) and the first time the Orange defeated a No. 2-ranked team.

ACC NC State's Nyheim Hines had an 83-yard touchdown run and a 92-yard punt return for a touchdown in the win over Pitt. He became the first FBS player this century with touchdowns of 80-or-more yards on both a punt return and a rush in the same game. Hines was named to the Hornung Award honor roll for the third time this season following the game.

ACC Clemson has won 10 or more games in each of the last six years. The Tigers and Alabama are the only two teams that currently have active streaks of six or more years with double-figure victories. The Tigers are only the 11th team to have had 10 wins in six successive seasons.

ACC COACHING SUCCESS

ACC Clemson head coach Dabo Swinney has guided the Tigers to 96 victories, which ties him with two former Clemson legends – Frank Howard and Danny Ford – for fifth place on the all-time ACC wins list.

ACC Six ACC coaches – the most of any conference – rank in the top

18 of all active coaches in career winning percentage with a minimum of five years as a head coach. Florida State's Jimbo Fisher ranks fourth (.784), followed by Clemson's Dabo Swinney (sixth, .768), Miami's Mark Richt (seventh, .745), Louisville's Bobby Petrino (10th, .708), Georgia Tech's Paul Johnson (15th, .668) and Virginia's Bronco Mendenhall (19th, .654).

ACC Georgia Tech head coach Paul Johnson ranks fourth among all active head coaches in career victories, having recorded 181 wins in his 20-year career. Miami's Mark Richt is ninth with 161 wins, followed by Louisville's Bobby Petrino, who is tied for 17th with 114 wins, Dave Clawson of Wake Forest (108) who is tied for 21st, Virginia's Bronco Mendenhall, who is 23rd with 106 wins, and Duke's David Cutcliffe, who is 24th with 100 wins.

NATIONAL TITLES & HEISMAN TROPHY WINNERS

ACC Two of the last four national champions have come from the ACC (Clemson in 2016, Florida State in 2013), the only conference with multiple winners over that stretch. The ACC has had a team in the championship game in three of the four years.

ACC The ACC is the first conference since 1994 to have a football national title winner (Clemson) and a Heisman Trophy winner (Lamar Jackson, Louisville) from two different schools in the same season.

ACC In 2016, Louisville's Lamar Jackson became the second ACC player in the last four years to claim the Heisman Trophy. With Clemson's Deshaun Watson at No. 2 in the Heisman voting, it marked the seventh time in the 82-year history of the award that the top two finishers have been from the same conference, and only the second time that the top two finishers have been quarterbacks from the same conference.

ACC With junior QB Lamar Jackson returning to lead Louisville in 2017, the ACC has had reigning Heisman Trophy-winner return to compete in the league twice in the last four years. Florida State's Jameis Winston did so in 2014 after winning the 2013 Heisman Trophy. Jackson is the youngest athlete (19 years, 337 days) to win the Heisman Trophy, while Winston (19 years, 342 days) is the second youngest.

DR PEPPER ACC FOOTBALL CHAMPIONSHIP GAME

ACC This season, The Dr Pepper ACC Football Championship Game will be held at Charlotte's Bank of America Stadium for a seventh time, resuming an agreement between the ACC and the Queen City venue that runs through the 2020 season.

ACC The 13th annual Dr Pepper ACC Football Championship Game is set for Saturday, Dec. 2. The game will again be shown in prime time on ESPN (at 7:45 p.m.) or ABC (at 8 p.m.)

ACC The six Dr Pepper ACC Football Championship Games held in Charlotte have been extremely successful from a fan experience and attendance standpoint. The games have averaged over 69,000 fans per contest, including sellout crowds in 2010, 2011, and 2015. An ACC Football Championship record crowd of 74,514 in 2015 set an attendance record at Bank of America Stadium. Over the last seven years, the ACC ranks second among all conferences in attendance at its football championship games.

ACC Since 2011, the ACC Championship has been the most competitive of the four major conference championship games, as it has been decided by more than five fewer points per game than any other championship.

ACC Divisional Tiebreaker

If more than one team in the same division is tied for the best winning percentage in its Conference games, the procedures listed below will be followed to determine the division's representative in the ACC Championship Game:

Two-Team Tie:

1. Head-to-head competition between the two tied teams.
2. Win percentage of the tied teams within the division.
3. Head-to-head competition versus the team within the division with the best overall win percentage. (Divisional and non-divisional) and proceeding through the division. Multiple ties within the division will be broken from first-to-last using the league's tiebreaking procedures.
4. Overall win percentage versus all common non-divisional opponents.
5. Combined win percentage vs. all non-divisional opponents.
6. Win percentage versus common non-divisional opponents based on their order of finish (overall conference win percentage) and proceeding through other common non-divisional teams based upon their divisional order of finish.
7. The tied team with the higher ranking by the Team Rating Score metric provided by SportSource Analytics following the conclusion of regular season games.
8. The representative shall be chosen by a draw. (as administered by the Commissioner or the Commissioner's designee.)

Three-Team (or More) Team Tie:

(Once a team is eliminated from the tie, the tie-breaker procedures restart for the remaining teams. If the three (or more) team tie can be reduced to two teams, the two-team tiebreaker format will then be applied.)

1. Combined head-to-head win percentage among the tied teams.
2. Win percentage of the tied teams within the division.
3. Head-to-head competition versus the team within the division with the best overall (divisional and non-divisional) Conference win percentage, and proceeding through the division. Multiple ties within the division will be broken first to last, using the league's tie-breaker policies.
4. Combined win percentage versus all common non-divisional opponents.
5. Overall win percentage versus non-divisional opponents.
6. Win percentage versus common non-divisional opponents based upon their order of finish (overall win percentage) and proceeding through other common non-divisional opponents based upon their divisional order of finish.
7. The tied team with the highest ranking by the Team Rating Score metric provided by SportSource Analytics following the conclusion of regular season games.
8. The representative shall be chosen by a draw as administered by the Commissioner or the Commissioner's designee.

Four current ACC head coaches rank among the Top 10 coaches nationally in active career winning percentage and six are ranked in the Top 20, led by Florida State's Jimbo Fisher, who ranks fourth overall with an .784 mark just behind Ohio State's Urban Meyer (.852) and Washington's Chris Peterson (.824). Joining Fisher in the Top 10 are Dabo Swinney of Clemson at 6th, Mark Richt of Miami at 7th and Bobby Petrino of Louisville 10th. Paul Johnson (15th) of Georgia Tech and Bronco Mendenhall (19th) are also ranked in the Top 20. After a 6-1 start this year, NC State's Dave Doeren is ranked 27th (.628).

Georgia Tech's Paul Johnson, in his 21st year as a head coach, is ranked fourth in the NCAA's FBS in career victories with 181.
