Georgia Tech Hosts Virginia Tech on ESPN's Thursday Night Package Third-ranked Clemson hosts Wake Forest; No. 8 FSU to BC in Atlantic Matchups No. 15 Miami Travels to USF; Pitt Hosts Virginia in a Coastal Division Clash

A second straight ESPN Thursday night appearance with Coastal Division rivals Virginia Tech and Georgia Tech meeting in Atlanta headlines the Atlantic Coast Conference Football Schedule for Week 5 of the 2013 season...The ACC posted a 7-0 non-conference record last week, matching its best one-day non-conference record set originally in 2007 and matched in 2012...Also, for the first time, five ACC teams begin the year with 3-0 or better records led by Maryland (4-0), and including Clemson, Florida State, Georgia Tech and Miami, who are each 3-0...Three ACC teams remain ranked in both polls led by No. 3 Clemson (AP) and including No. 8 Florida State and No. 15 Miami...Maryland, which has a bye week this week, and Georgia Tech both received votes and are just out of the Top 25 in AP, with Tech the next team with votes in USA Today...The Yellow Jackets, coached by Paul Johnson and led by QB Vad Lee, and the Hokies coached by Frank Beamer and led by QB Logan Thomas, meet this Thursday night at Bobby Dodd

Stadium (7:30 pm, ESPN) in a renewal of a rivalry which has seen one or the other team represent the Coastal Division in each of the eight Dr. Pepper ACC Football Championship Games...The two teams have appeared on ESPN's Thursday night package more often than any other ACC school with Georgia Tech hosting its 19th ESPN Thursday night game, the most of any ACC school, while Virginia Tech has won more ESPN Thursday night games (19) than any other ACC schools...The Hokies feature the nation's 5th-ranked defense, while the Yellow Jackets have the 3rd-best rushing offense and are 5th in team pass efficiency...Georgia Tech has already taken an early lead in the Coastal Division with back-to-back wins over Duke and North Carolina...Third-ranked Clemson, coached by Dabo Swinney and led by QB Tajh Boyd, returns home to host Atlantic Division foe Wake Forest at Memorial Stadium in Clemson (3:30 pm, ESPN)...The Tigers have a 16-2 record against ACC teams

in Clemson under Swinney...Wake, coached by Jim Grobe, is led by QB Tanner Smith and WR Michael Campanaro, who leads the ACC in pass receptions per game...Several miles to the north in Chestnut, Mass., Boston College hosts 8th-ranked Florida State at Alumni Stadium (3:30 p.m., ABC/ESPN2) in another Atlantic Division matchup...The Eagles of coach Steve Addazio are led by the senior trio of RB Andre Williams, the ACC's leading rusher (118.7/gm), QB Chase Rettig and WR Alex Amidon...The Seminoles of coach Jimbo Fisher are led by redshirt freshman QB Jameis Winston, who is 2nd nationally in pass efficiency, and RB Devonta Freeman, who is 4th in the ACC in rushing (91.0/gm)...FSU ranks 5th nationally in scoring offense (52.3) and is tied for 3rd in the nation in scoring defense (8.7)...In Pittsburgh, the Panthers host Virginia at Heinz Field (12:30, Regional Sports

Networks), in the Panthers' second straight Coastal clash...Pitt, coached by **Paul Chryst** and led by senior **QB Tom Savage** and the big-play WR tandem of **Devin Street** and **Tyler Boyd**, have scored 107 points in their last two games...UVA, coached by **Mike London** and led by **QB David Watford**, will be playing in its first ACC game of the year and its first-ever league game at Heinz Field...15th-ranked Miami, coached by **Al Golden**, and led by versatile, big-play **RB Duke Johnson**, will be making its first road trip of the year when it travels to Tampa, Fla. to meet USF at Raymond James Stadium (Noon, ESPN)...The Bulls are coached by **Willie Taggart**...The Bulls are seeking their first win of the year...Raymond James Stadium hosted the Dr Pepper ACC Football Championship Game in 2008 and 2009...In Chapel Hill, N.C., the Tar Heels of coach **Larry Fedora** will look to rebound from their loss to Georgia Tech but face a test from East Carolina at Kenan Stadium (12:30 pm, ACC Network)...UNC is led by **QB Bryn Renner** and **TE Eric Ebron**...The Pirates are coached by **Ruffin McNeill**...UNC has won four straight in the series with East Carolina's only win in Chapel Hill coming in 1975...A few miles to the east in Durham, N.C., Duke faces its third consecutive home game this Saturday when the Blue Devils of coach **David Cutcliffe** host Troy, coached by **Larry Blakeney**, at Wallace Wade Stadium (3 pm, ESPN3)...The Blue Devils are led by **QB Brandon Connette**, who had 6 TDR in Duke's loss to Pitt, and **WR Jamison Crowder**, who ranks 2nd in the ACC in pass receiving and 6th nationally in punt returns...In Raleigh, N.C., NC State, coached by **Dave Doeren**, hosts Central Michigan at Carter-Finley Stadium (3:30 pm, ESPN3)...The Wolf-pack is led by **QB Pete Thomas** and **WR Rashard Smith** on offense and **LB Robert Caldwell**, the ACC's leading tackler (10.0/gm), on defense.

ACC Has Three Teams Ranked in the AP Top 15

Georgia Tech, Maryland just out of Top 25

Clemson remained at No. 3 in the AP poll and No. 4 in the USA Today coaches poll, while both polls agree on No. 8 Florida State and No. 15 Miami. Georgia Tech and Maryland received enough votes to be ranked just out of the Top 25.

ACC Compiles 7-0 Non-Conference Record

The ACC tied its best single-day winning percentage with a perfect 7-0 non-conference mark this past weekend. The league previously was 7-0 on a single day on two occasions. The ACC was also 7-0 on Sept. 15, 2007 and Sept. 1, 2012. The conference now has a 28-7 record this year against non-conference foes, an .800 winning percentage.

Pitt's Savage, Maryland's Hendy Named Walter Camp National Players of the Week

Pitt senior **QB Tom Savage** and Maryland **S A.J. Hendy** were named the Walter Camp National Offensive and Defensive Players of the Week for their performances last Saturday. Savage threw for 424 yards and tied an ACC record with 6 TD passes in Pitt's 58-55 win over Duke. Hendy had two fumble recoveries and returned an interception 28 yards for a score in the Terrapins' 37-0 win over West Virginia.

Pitt's Boyd, Conner; Tech's Roof Named National Freshman, Coordinator of Week by Athlon Sports

Pitt **WR Tyler Boyd**, who had 8 receptions for 154 yards and 3 TDs and 239 total yards, and **RB James Conner**, who rushed for 173 yards on 26 carries and a TD and in the Panthers' win over Duke, were named National Freshmen of the Week by Athlon Sports. Georgia Tech defensive coordinator **Ted Roof**, whose defense held North Carolina without a score in the second half of the Jackets' 28-20 win, was named the National Coordinator of the Week by Athlon Sports.

For First Time Five ACC Teams Are 3-0

For the first time in league history, five teams have started the season 3-0 or better. Maryland is 4-0 after sweeping its four-game non-conference schedule while Clemson, Florida State, Georgia Tech and Miami are each 3-0. The league has had four teams start the year 3-0 or better on three previous occasions: 1992, 2005 and 2011.

Five for 50

For the first time in league history, five ACC teams scored 50 or more points on the same day. For only the second time, two teams scored 50 or more in the same game when Pitt defeated Duke, 58-55. Also topping the 50 point mark on Saturday were Miami (77), Florida State (54) and Syracuse (52). Virginia also came close to joining the 50-point group, scoring 49 points against VMI.

Beamerball Is Back

After taking a short hiatus, Beamerball is back in Blacksburg. Virginia Tech head coach Frank Beamer's teams have always been known for excellent special teams play and in Saturday's triple-overtime thriller over Marshall, the Hokies needed every bit of it. VT senior **CB Kyle Fuller** blocked a punt that was returned for the first touchdown of the day and senior **DT Antoine Hopkins** came up with a crucial block of a field goal attempt which sent the game into the third overtime.

700, 700, 500

Both **Syracuse** and **Virginia Tech** captured their 700th all-time victories this past week when the Orange downed Tulane 52-17 and Tech outlasted Marshall in triple overtime 29-21. Florida State also reach a milestone, winning its 500th game with a 54-6 win over Bethune-Cookman.

2013 ACC FB Game Summaries -- Sept. 19-21

Clemson 26, NC State 14

QB Tajh Boyd threw for 244 yards and three touchdowns to lead the third-ranked Tigers (3-0, 1-0) to an ACC road win before a national ESPN Thursday night audience. Boyd threw an 11-yard touchdown pass to TE Sam Cooper in the first half, then found WR Martavis Bryant with 30- and 15-yard scoring tosses in the second half. PK Chandler Catanzaro, who became Clemson's all-time leading scorer, kicked field goals of 49 and 45 yards in addition to a pair of extra points. DE Vic Beasley keyed the Tigers' defensive effort with three quarterback sacks and a forced fumble that set up a touchdown. Senior LB Robert Caldwell led NC State (2-1, 0-1) with 12 tackles, including four tackles for a loss, as the Wolfpack came up short despite holding Clemson's high-powered offense to its lowest scoring output over its past 10 ACC games. RB Shadrach Thornton scored NC State's first touchdown on a 21-yard run in the first half, and QB Pete Thomas capped the night's scoring on a 4-yard keeper with 3:50 remaining in the game.

Pitt 58, Duke 55

Pitt captured its first-ever Atlantic Coast Conference win in high-scoring fashion on Saturday, as QB Tom Savage tied a league record with six touchdown passes and the visiting Panthers (2-1, 1-1) piled up 598 yards total offense. Savage, named the Walter Camp National Offensive Player of the Week, delivered three of his scoring strikes to freshman WR Tyler Boyd, who finished with eight total catches for 154 yards. Senior WR Devin Street added six receptions for a game-high 166 receiving yards and two TDs. RB James Conner added to Pitt's balanced offensive attack with 173 yards rushing and a touchdown on 26 carries. Duke QB Brandon Connette had four passes intercepted, including one that Pitt LB Anthony Gonzalez returned 37 yards for a score. But Connette also threw four touchdown passes, including a 75-yarder to wideout Brandon Braxton and a 62-yarder to WR Jamison Crowder, who finished with seven catches for 141 yards and added an 82-yard punt return for a touchdown. Connette rushed for 101 yards and two touchdowns to lead the Blue Devils (2-2, 0-2) on the ground.

Georgia Tech 28, North Carolina 20

The Yellow Jackets (3-0, 2-0) overcame a 20-7 first-half deficit and held the visiting Tar Heels (1-2, 0-1) scoreless in the second half. RB David Sims matched his career high with 99 rushing yards and two touchdowns, and RB Robert Godhigh added 100 rushing yards on just 9 carries for the Yellow Jackets. QB Vad Lee's 1-yard touchdown run in the third quarter pushed Georgia Tech ahead 21-20, and he also threw a 21-yard touchdown pass to WR Darren Waller. RB Romar Morris staked UNC to an early lead with a 4-yard touchdown run, and QB Bryn Renner threw touchdown passes of 19 yards to TE Eric Ebron and 24 yards to WR Sean Tapley.

Maryland 37, West Virginia 0

Terrapin DB A.J. Hendy earned Walter Camp National Defensive Player of the Week honors after leading a dominant effort. Hendy returned an interception 28 yards for Maryland's first touchdown and recovered a pair of fumbles as the Terrapins (4-0) forced six West Virginia turnovers and held the Mountaineers to 175 yards of total offense at Baltimore's M&T Bank Stadium. It is the first shutout for the Terps since blanking Wake Forest on Oct. 18, 2008 (26-0), and its first shutout of West Virginia since defeating the Mountaineers 33-0 on Sept. 18, 1999. Maryland, off to its first 4-0 start since 2001, ended a seven-game losing streak versus the rival Mountaineers. The Terps also saw QB C.J. Brown throw for one touchdown and run for another score.

Syracuse 52, Tulane 17

The Orange (2-2) sailed past the Green Wave in the Carrier Dome to earn its 700th all-time win. Syracuse and Virginia Tech became the 16th and 17th teams in FBS history to accomplish that feat with their wins on Saturday. In his first start, QB Terrel Hunt was responsible for five touchdowns, four in the air and one on the ground. He completed 16 of 21 passes for 175 yards and was the second-leading Orange rusher with 39 yards. Syracuse RBs Clay Cleveland and Jerome Smith each scored a pair of touchdowns, which tied a school record with 42 first-half points. The SU special teams unit blocked two punts and a field goal in the first half. The two blocked punts put the Orange in the red zone and led to two touchdowns.

Virginia Tech 29, Marshall 21 (3OT)

QB Logan Thomas had a 2-yard touchdown run and added the two-point conversion run in the third overtime period, lifting the Hokies (3-1) past the visiting Thundering Herd (2-2). Virginia Tech had tied the game with 3:09 remaining in regulation when Thomas' 2-yard fourth-down pass--after being tipped by Marshall defender Darryl Roberts--was hauled in by Tech WR Willie Byrn. The Hokies blocked two kicks, one of which was returned by LB Derek DiNardo for a touchdown, as they joined Syracuse on Saturday in becoming the 15th and 16th FBS programs to post 700 all-time wins.

Florida State 54, Bethune-Cookman 6

LB Telvin Smith set the tone for the eighth-ranked Seminoles with a 68-yard interception return for a touchdown on the game's opening series, and Florida State (3-0) never looked back. RB Devonta Freeman registered his second 100-yard game of the season and the sixth of his career with 112 yards and a touchdown on 10 carries. RB Karlos Williams added 83 rushing yards and a pair of TDs. QB Jameis Winston completed 10 of 19 passes for 148 yards and two touchdowns.

Miami 77, Savannah State 7

The 16th-ranked Hurricanes (3-0) set a school record for points scored in a game and tied an ACC record for largest margin of victory, despite seeing starting QB Stephen Morris leave the game in the first quarter with a sprained ankle. Morris left after throwing an 80-yard touchdown pass to WR Allen Hurns. Miami amassed 637 yards total offense as RB Gus Edwards rushed for 113 yards and three touchdowns. RB Duke Johnson returned the opening kickoff 95 yards to set up a touchdown and added another rushing score. QB Ryan Williams, coming on in relief of Morris, finished 11-of-13 for 176 yards and two touchdowns.

Wake Forest 25, Army 11

RB Josh Harris rushed for 96 yards on 19 carries and a pair of touchdown runs as the Demon Deacons (2-2) snapped a two-game losing skid with a road win at West Point. QB Tanner Price added a career-high 66 yards on 11 carries and threw a touchdown pass. The TD pass was the 44th of Price's career, tying him for second in Wake Forest's all-time school list. The touchdown pass was a 66-yarder to WR Michael Campanaro, who finished with 91 yards on four catches. Wake Forest held Army (1-3) to more than 40 yards under its season average for rushing yards. Senior nose NG Nikita Whitlock was the leader up front, making a career-high 14 tackles, including a career-high tying three tackles for loss.

Virginia 49, VMI 0

The Cavaliers (2-1) exploded for three touchdowns in both the second and third quarters in downing the visiting Keydets. RB Daniel Hamm rushed for 136 yards and a pair of touchdowns after starting RB Kevin Parks delivered 135 rushing yards and two TDs. They became the first Virginia running back duo to each run for more than 100 yards since 2005, when Jason Snelling and Wali Lundy did it against Temple. Defensively, Virginia limited VMI (1-3) to 79 yards and four first downs. The Keydets were 1-of-16 on third down conversions.

ACC Notes By The Numbers

.889 - The winning percentage in ACC games at Clemson's Memorial Stadium for the Tigers under current head coach **Dabo Swinney**. Clemson is 16-2 under Swinney in Clemson, since he became the Tigers' head coach in 2008. Only former Clemson coach Ken Hatfield, has a better home record against ACC foes (12-1-1, .893, 1990-93).

.968 - Clemson **PK Chris Catanzaro** has made 30 of his last 31 field goal attempts, a .968 percentage. He had a school-record string of 20 field goal attempts without a miss in 2012 and now has a current streak of 10 without a miss.

1.67 - Clemson **DE Vic Beasley** had 3 sacks in the Tigers' win over NC State and now has 5 for the season and is averaging 1.67 sacks per game and is ranked 2nd nationally. In his last nine games, Beasley has made 11 sacks (1.22/gm).

2 - The **Walter Camp Foundation** named a pair of ACC performers as its National Players of the Week. Pitt senior **QB Tom Savage** was named by the Foundation as its national offensive player of the week for tying an ACC record with 6 TD passes and throwing for 424 yards in the Panthers' win over Duke, and Maryland **S A.J. Hendy** recovered two fumbles and had a 28-yard interception return in the Terrapins' 37-0 win over West Virginia.

3 - When **Virginia Tech** took three overtimes to defeat Marshall, 29-21, last Saturday, they became the 5th team in league history to play three overtimes. No conference team has ever played more than three overtimes. Tech became the first ACC team to play three overtimes against a non-conference opponent and win. Previously, North Carolina (Syracuse), NC State (Ohio State) and Florida State (Penn State) dropped triple overtime efforts to non-league foes.

4-0 - **Maryland**, which defeated West Virginia last Saturday in impressive fashion, 37-0, is 4-0 for the first time since 2001, when the Terrapins captured their first 7 games.

5 - For the first time in **ACC history**, five league teams scored 50 or more points in a single day. Miami (77) led the way followed by Pitt (58), Duke (55), Florida State (54) and Syracuse (52). Prior to Saturday, three 50-point games was the most on a single day accomplished on five occasions, the most recent of which occurred on Sept. 15 of last year.

5 - Also for the first time in **ACC history**, the league has five teams (Clemson, Florida State, Georgia Tech, Maryland and Miami) which have started the season with three or more wins. The previous high was four teams in 1992, 2005 and 2011.

6 - Pitt **QB Tom Savage** tied an ACC single-game record with 6 touchdown passes in the Panthers'

58-55 win over Duke. The record was originally set by Duke's Steve Slayden in 1987 against Georgia Tech and matched in 1999 by Florida State's Chris Weinke and Virginia's Dan Ellis.

7-0 - The **ACC** posted a 7-0 non-conference record last Saturday tying the league's best non-conference record for a single day. The ACC was also 7-0 on Sept. 15, 2007 and Sept. 1, 2012.

8 - This Thursday, **Virginia Tech** and **Georgia Tech** will meet at Bobby Dodd Stadium in Atlanta. In each of its first eight years of existence, the Dr Pepper ACC Championship Game has featured one of these teams as the representative of the Coast Division: Virginia Tech in 2005, 2007, 2008, 2010 and 2011; Georgia Tech in 2006, 2009 and last fall.

8.3 - The number of receptions per game for Wake Forest senior **WR Michael Campanaro**. Campanaro leads the ACC in catches per contest and is tied for 9th nationally with 25 in three games.

10.0 - The number of tackles per game for NC State senior **LB Robert Caldwell**. Caldwell had 12 tackles, including 3.0 for loss in the Wolfpack's strong effort against 3rd-ranked Clemson. Caldwell leads the ACC in tackles per game.

11 - Through its first three games of the season, **Florida State** has had a total team effort as 11 different Seminoles have scored touchdowns.

19.8 - The punt return average for Duke junior **WR Jamison Crowder**. Crowder has already returned two punts for touchdowns in just four games, including an 82-yarder last Saturday against Pitt. Crowder leads the ACC and is 6th nationally in punt return average.

51 - The number of times **Georgia Tech** and **Virginia Tech** have appeared on ESPN's Thursday night nationally-televised package. The two teams will meet again this Thursday night in Atlanta. The Yellow Jackets have hosted more ESPN Thursday night games (18) than any other ACC team, while the Hokies have won more games on Thursdays (19) with ESPN.

55 - The 55 points for **Duke** in its 58-55 loss to Pitt Saturday were the most points scored by a losing team in ACC history.

70 - **Miami** tied an ACC record for margin of victory set earlier this year when Georgia Tech downed Elon 70-0 on August 31. The Hurricanes' 77-7 win over Savannah State gave them a 70-point triumph.

95 - For the third time in his career, Miami **RB Duke Johnson** returned a kickoff for 95 yards, when he accomplished the feat against Savannah State. Johnson had two scoring returns last year for exactly 95 yards. Saturday, Johnson had a

95-yard kickoff return which ended at the Savannah State four yard line.

150 - When Georgia Tech defeated North Carolina last Saturday, the victory was the 150th in the career of Tech head coach **Paul Johnson**. Johnson, in his 17th season as a head coach at Georgia Southern, Navy and Tech, has posted a 150-65 (.698) career mark and ranks 13th in wins among current head coaches in the FBS.

151.34 - The career pass efficiency rating for North Carolina junior **QB Bryn Renner**. Renner has completed 579 of 880 passes (.658) for 7,207 yards, 58 TDs and only 22 interceptions. His pass efficiency rating would be an ACC record if maintained through this season. The current record is 151.15, set by Florida State's Chris Weinke.

195.0 - The all-purpose yardage average of Pitt freshman **WR Tyler Boyd**. Boyd leads all freshmen nationally and ranks 5th overall in all-purpose yardage. He is 3rd in the ACC in reception yards per game, averaging 104.7 yards a game and 19.6 yards per catch.

200.54 - The pass efficiency rating for Georgia Tech **QB Vad Lee**, a mark which would be 2nd in the ACC if he had six more pass attempts. Lee does not appear in the ACC or NCAA standings for pass efficiency because he is just short of the minimum number of pass attempts (15 per game).

210.5 - The pass efficiency rating for Florida State redshirt freshman **QB Jameis Winston**. Winston leads the ACC and is ranked 2nd nationally in pass efficiency.

261 - Virginia Tech head coach **Frank Beamer** has a total of 261 coaching victories in his career and leads all active NCAA FBS head coaches. Beamer is in 6th place on the NCAA FBS all-time wins list. The late Joe Paterno (298) is next on the list.

320 - The number of receiving yards for Pitt senior **WR Devin Street** and true freshman **WR Tyler Boyd** in the Panthers' 58-55 win over Duke. Street had 6 catches for 166 yards (27.7/catch) and 2 TDs while Boyd had 8 catches for 154 yards and 3 touchdowns.

500th - Florida State scored the 500th win in school history with its 54-6 win over Bethune-Cookman. The Seminoles now have a record of 500-237-17 (.674).

700th - Both **Virginia Tech** and **Syracuse** notched the 700th victory in their schools' histories last week. Virginia Tech defeated Marshall, 29-21 in triple overtime and Syracuse downed Tulane (52-17) to become the 15th and 16th schools to win 700 or more college football games. Overall, the Hokies have a 700-441-46 (.609) while Syracuse is 700-498-49 (.581).

The ACC & ESPN Thursday Night: A Great College and ACC Tradition

When Georgia Tech hosts Virginia Tech this Thursday night (7:30 p.m.) at Bobby Dodd Stadium in Atlanta, the game will be the 86th contest involving an ACC team on ESPN on Thursday night. It will also mark the 26th appearance for Georgia Tech and 27th for Virginia Tech on the ESPN Thursday night package, the two teams that have been on ESPN's Thursday night package more than any others.

The game marks the fifth time the two teams have played on ESPN's Thursday night. In each of those five games, the winner represented the Coastal Division in the Dr Pepper ACC Football Championship Game. They last met on Thursday in 2011 in Atlanta, with the Hokies emerging with a 37-20 victory. Virginia Tech has won all four previous meetings between the teams on ESPN Thursday night.

Georgia Tech has hosted more games, this week is their 19th, than any other ACC school. The Yellow Jackets actually began the Conference's Thursday night tradition, which, more often than not, has featured high drama. Tech hosted Virginia on Sept. 19, 1991, at Bobby Dodd Stadium in Atlanta, utilizing a 34-yard field goal by Scott Sisson on the game's final play to record a 24-21 victory.

The Yellow Jackets are 11-14 overall, 10-8 at Bobby Dodd Stadium. Virginia Tech has the second-best record and the most wins on ESPN Thursdays, with a 19-7 record overall, including an 8-3 mark on the road. The Hokies have won more ESPN Thursday night road games than any other ACC school.

Miami has the highest winning percentage on nationally televised games on Thursday night of any current ACC school, having posted a 16-3 overall mark, an .842 winning percentage. The Hurricanes have been better at home, posting a 11-1 mark in the Old Orange Bowl (8-0) and at Sun Life Stadium (3-1). The only UM loss came in 2011, when Virginia snapped the Canes' 10-game home win streak with a 28-21 verdict.

In all, after this week's game, ACC teams will have made 147 appearances on ESPN's Thursday night package. After the Hokies and Yellow Jackets, Miami and NC State, each of 19 appearances followed by Maryland (13), Boston College (12), Florida State (12), Virginia (12), Clemson (12) and North Carolina (11).

There have been many other great moments in the series, including the previously mentioned 2007 game when 2nd-ranked Boston College rallied to beat 8th-ranked Virginia Tech, 14-10, behind a pair of touchdown passes from QB Matt Ryan in the game's final two minutes and 11 seconds. meeting of ACC opponents that were both ranked in the Top Ten nationally.

The 2009 season featured a pair of thrillers both involving North Carolina. The Tar Heels and Seminoles were involved in an offensive gut-wrencher, as FSU overcame a 24-6 third quarter deficit to capture a 30-27 triumph. A week later, UNC turned the tables, upsetting 14th-ranked Virginia Tech, 20-17, on the game's final play, a 22-yard field goal by UNC placekicker Casey Barth.

The 2010 match-up between Georgia Tech and Virginia Tech was also a classic; a see-saw battle which featured a dramatic 90-yard kickoff return for a touchdown by the Hokies' David Wilson with 2:23 remaining as the deciding play.

Perhaps the most memorable Thursday night moment and biggest upset on the Thursday night ESPN package was 24th-ranked Virginia's dramatic upset of 2nd-ranked Florida State in 1995. That game snapped the Seminoles' 29-game Conference winning streak, which began when FSU joined the ACC in 1992.

Miami still has claim to the highest-rated game on Thursday night, when it met 10th-ranked Houston in an early season showdown in 1991. The Hurricanes and Cougars drew a 6.5 national rating as Miami took a lopsided 40-10 triumph.

The highest-rated Thursday ESPN battle between two ACC teams was the 1995 Virginia-Florida State telecast, which resulted in a 6.1 rating.

This week's game is the third of five ACC Thursday ESPN contests this year, and second straight. North Carolina lost to 6th-ranked South Carolina, 27-10 on Aug. 29 and Clemson downed NC State, 26-14, last week. North Carolina will make its second Thursday night appearance of the year on Oct. 17, when it hosts Miami. Georgia Tech then travels to Clemson on Nov. 14 for the second 2013 Thursday night appearance by both the Yellow Jackets and Tigers.

Virginia Tech's Frank Beamer Is NCAA FBS Active Career Leader in Wins

Virginia Tech's Frank Beamer is now the leading active head coach in the NCAA's FBS in career victories with a total of 261 triumphs in his 33-year coaching career. With a win over Rutgers in last year's Russell Athletic Bowl, Beamer passed former BYU head coach LaVell Edwards for 6th place on the all-time NCAA FBS coaching victory list. Penn State's Joe Paterno, with an NCAA adjusted total of 298, is next on the list in 5th place. Georgia Tech head coach Paul Johnson ranks 13th on the active FBS list with 150 career wins. Former Florida State head coach Bobby Bowden, who retired after the 2009 season, is now the NCAA FBS all-time leader with 377 victories.

Johnson, Beamer, London Among Top 20 Active Coaches in Wins Per Season

The ACC has four coaches who rank among the Top 25 active football coaches in the NCAA in wins per season with five or more seasons as a head coach. Georgia Tech's **Paul Johnson** leads the way among ACC coaches, currently averaging 9.19 wins per full season. Johnson's record puts him in 8th place nationally among active head coaches with five or more years of experience. Virginia Tech's **Frank Beamer** (17th, 8.06), Virginia's **Mike London** (tied for 18th, 8.00) and Clemson's **Dabo Swinney** (tied for 18th, 8.00) join Johnson among the Top 25 coaches in the nation in the NCAA's FBS. Florida State's **Jimbo Fisher** is off to an impressive start in his career as well, averaging 10.33 wins a year in his first three seasons at the helm at Florida State. NC State's new head coach **Dave Doeren** is also off to a strong start, averaging 11.5 wins a year in his first two seasons at Northern Illinois.

After Just Three Seasons Florida State's Jimbo Fisher Joining Select Company



Having completed only three seasons as head coach at Florida State, head coach **Jimbo Fisher** has already joined some select company among ACC football coaches. Fisher has compiled a 31-10 record (.756). His winning percentage has him in 5th place among all ACC head coaches after three seasons, ahead of such prominent figures as NC State's Lou Holtz, Clemson's Danny Ford, Maryland's Ralph Friedgen and Georgia Tech's Bobby Ross. The best mark recorded by an ACC head coach in his first three years in the league was by Fisher's predecessor at FSU, Bobby Bowden, who posted a 33-3-1 record. Maryland's Jim Tatum was 27-4-1 (.859) in his first three years with Virginia Tech's Frank Beamer third at 31-8-0 (.795).

Clemson's Memorial Stadium Is Home Sweet Home for Tiger's Dabo Swinney



Clemson head coach Dabo Swinney has enjoyed coaching in the cozy and imposing confines of the Tigers' home field, also known as Death Valley. In his first four seasons as head coach of the Tigers, Swinney's teams won 16 of the first 18 home ACC games, a winning percentage of .889. That stacks up pretty well with some of the great names in ACC coaching. Swinney's winning percentage has him 2nd among ACC head coaches. Another former Tiger coach, Ken Hatfield, has the highest percentage, posting a 12-1-1 mark in four seasons (.893). Legendary Florida State coach Bobby Bowden won more ACC home games than any other coach, with 62 triumphs in his 18 years in the league. His winning percentage of .861, is third-best. Bowden's successor at Florida State, Jimbo Fisher is on a pretty good pace himself, having won 10 of his first 12 ACC home games. Four Clemson coaches rank in the Top 10 including Hatfield (1st), Swinney (2nd), Danny Ford (8th) and the legendary Frank Howard (tied for 9th).

North Carolina Sets Offensive Records In First Year Under Larry Fedora

North Carolina Head Coach **Larry Fedora's** fast-paced offense had his team scoring at a school-record pace in his first year in Chapel Hill. UNC ranked 8th nationally in scoring offense in 2012, averaging 40.6 points a game while also ranked 14th nationally in total offense,

■ In Fedora's first 15 games as head coach at UNC, North Carolina has topped the 40-point mark 7 times.

■ Also, in his first 15 games, UNC has topped the 30-point mark on 10 occasions.

■ In his first 15 games at UNC, the Tar Heels have gained 400 or more yards of total offense 13 times.

■ UNC set school records in 2012 for most points, highest scoring average and highest average of total offense (485.6).

■ UNC's 487 total points in 2012 were the 7th-highest single-season total in ACC history.



NC State's New Head Coach Dave Doeren Among Nation's Winningest Coaches in 2011-12

New NC State Head Coach, **Dave Doeren**, who led the Wolfpack to a 2-1 record in his three games as State's head coach and now is 25-5 overall, has not wasted time in winning games in his first two years as a head coach at the FBS level. In fact, only one other coach in the Football Bowl Subdivision--Alabama's Nick Saban--has won more games than has Doeren in the past two seasons. He guided Northern Illinois to a 23-4 mark in 2011 and 2012, including the school's first berth in the BCS bowl game, a slot in the 2013 Discover Orange Bowl this past January. Only Saban, among current FBS coaches, posted more wins in the past two years than Doeren's teams at Northern Illinois. In all, three current ACC Coaches rank among the Top 11 coaches nationally in wins among current college coaches th past two years. Both Florida State's Jimbo Fisher and Clemson's Dabo Swinney have 21 wins in 2011 and 2012, tying Kansas State's Bill Snyder for the 8th.



Duke Experiencing Success Under ACC Coach of the Year David Cutcliffe

With a 2-2 start to the 2013 season, David Cutcliffe, the ACC's 2012 Coach of the Year, has led the Blue Devils to 23 victories since coming to Durham in 2008. That may not sound like a great record, except when you consider that it is more wins than the Blue Devils totalled in the 12 seasons before Cutcliffe came to Durham. Cutcliffe led the Blue Devils to a 6-7 mark in 2012, their first appearance in a bowl game since 1994 and came within a few yards of claiming the Blue Devils' first winning season in 18 years and their first bowl triumph since 1961.

■ In the five-plus years that Cutcliffe has been in Durham, he has already mentored a pair of quarterbacks who finished their careers ranked in the ACC's top seven of career passing yardage. **Thaddeus Lewis** (2006-09) threw for 10,065 yards, the second-highest total in league history and **Sean Renfree** (2009-12), threw for 9,465 career yards, the 7th-best total by an ACC player.

■ Also, under his guidance, Duke **WR Conner Vernon** became the all-time leading pass receiver in ACC history setting conference career marks for pass receptions (283) and pass reception yardage (3,749).

When Virginia Tech and Marshall ended regulation tied at 21 in week four of the 2013 season, it marked the 63rd game featuring an ACC team that has had to go to extra sessions. Of the 63 overtime contests, a large portion of them--27--have been played in the month of September. Games have gone into overtime for ACC teams a total of 14 times in November, while 12 have been played in October, three in August, five in December and two in January (2006 FedEx Orange Bowl, 2012 Allstate Sugar Bowl). Of the 63 overtime contests, 31 have been ACC games while 32 nonconference games have gone into overtime. The home team has a 35-20 advantage in the 55 games played on campus. The team which wins the toss has a 32-31 record. Forty-nine of the games were decided in the first overtime with nine games in double overtime and five in triple overtime.
