Game Storylines

- Pitt looks to build on its 3-1 start when it hosts ACC Coastal Division foe Virginia this Saturday. The Panthers are back at Heinz Field following three consecutive away games. Pitt completed its road swing with a 17-13 victory over Virginia Tech in its ACC opener.
- The Cavaliers visit Heinz Field with a 1-3 mark. However, their three losses are to teams with a combined 12-3 record (UCLA, Notre Dame and Boise State). Virginia defeated Pitt last year, 24-19.
- A win over Virginia would give Pitt its first 4-1 start since the 2009 season. The Panthers have opened with a 4-1 record five times in the past 15 seasons. Since joining the ACC in 2013, Pitt has never won its opening two league games.
- The Panthers enter the Virginia contest with 699 all-time wins. A victory over UVA would make Pitt just the 19th Bowl Subdivision team to achieve 700 all-time wins.
- Pitt boasts one of the country's most productive defenses. The Panthers own national top-5 rankings in quarterback sacks (second, an ACC-best 4.25 sacks/game), rushing defense (fourth, 71.3 yards/game) and total defense (fourth, 243.8 yards/game).
- With their seven sacks at Virginia Tech, the Panthers now have 17 through four games. In comparison, the Panthers had only 19 sacks in 13 contests last year.
- Twelve different Pitt players have been in on sacks this season. Senior defensive end Ejuan Price paces the team with three sacks followed by senior linebacker Nicholas Grigsby with 2.5.
- On the other side of the ball, Pitt features a viable All-America and ACC Offensive Player of the Year candidate in receiver Tyler Boyd. The junior leads the ACC in receptions (8.7 avg.) and receiving yards (91.3 avg.) per game. Boyd is the nation's active career leader with 6.52 catches per contest.

✓ Pat Narduzzi arrived at Pitt following eight highly successful years as the defensive coordinator at Michigan State. Under his direction, the Spartans were the only team to rank in the nation's top 10 in total defense and rushing defense each season from 2011-14. Working under two-time Big Ten Coach of the Year Mark Dantonio, Narduzzi helped Michigan State to Top 25 finishes in five of the past seven seasons.

✓ In 2014, the Spartans finished with a No. 5 national ranking and 11-2 record following a stirring 42-41 victory over Baylor in the AT&T Cotton Bowl. Narduzzi's defense shut out the high-scoring Bears in the fourth quarter, opening the door for 21 unanswered points by Michigan State in one of the most thrilling games of the 2014-15 bowl season.

✓ Michigan State boasted the nation's top rushing defense in 2014, yielding just 88.5 yards per game. The Spartans finished third nationally with 34 turnovers gained and eighth in total defense, holding opponents to just 315.8 yards per contest.

✓ In 2013, Michigan State finished No. 3 in the country following a Big Ten title and 24-20 victory over No. 5 Stanford in the Rose Bowl. In the wake of that championship season, Narduzzi was named the 2013 recipient of the prestigious Broyles Award, annually presented to the country's top assistant coach.

✓ Narduzzi has tutored an impressive list of decorated defensive players, including first team All-Americans in cornerback Darqueze Dennard, safety Kurtis Drummond, linebacker Greg Jones and defensive tackle Jerel Worthy. Dennard was a unanimous All-American in 2013, becoming the first Michigan State cornerback to earn that distinction. He also was the school's first winner of the Jim Thorpe Award, given annually to college football's top defensive back.

✓ Darqueze Dennard was a first-round NFL Draft pick of the Cincinnati Bengals in 2014, the first Spartans defensive back taken in the initial round since 1961. In the 2015 draft, another Narduzzi pupil, Michigan State cornerback Trae Waynes, was a first-round pick of the Minnesota Vikings.

✓ Narduzzi coached 19 first-team All-Big Ten selections. Four players won the conference's top individual awards under his watch, including the past two Big Ten Defensive Back of the Year honorees (Dennard in 2013 and Drummond in 2014). Shilique Calhoun was the Big Ten Defensive Line-man of the Year in 2013 while Greg Jones was the overall Defensive Player of the Year in 2009.

✓ Prior to Michigan State, Narduzzi spent three years (2004-06) as defensive coordinator under Dantonio at Cincinnati, helping the Bearcats to a pair of bowl invitations.

✓ In 2003, Narduzzi was the defensive coordinator at Miami of Ohio under the late Terry Hoeppner. The RedHawks stormed to a 13-1 record that season, capturing the Mid-American Conference (MAC) championship and defeating nationally ranked Louisville in the GMAC Bowl to finish No. 10 in the Associated Press poll.

✓ While quarterback Ben Roethlisberger headlined Miami's offense in 2003, Narduzzi's stout unit topped the MAC in rushing defense (19th nationally), scoring defense (22nd nationally) and pass efficiency defense (34th nationally).

✓ Narduzzi served as linebackers coach at Northern Illinois for three seasons (2000-02). NIU won a pair of MAC divisional titles during his tenure and in 2002 had the league's top rushing defense.

✓ From 1993-99, Narduzzi coached at his alma mater, Rhode Island, serving as the Rams' defensive coordinator his final two seasons. He began his coaching career at Miami of Ohio, working as a graduate assistant in 1990 and 1991, before earning his first full-time position as receivers coach for the 1992 season.

✓ Narduzzi was an all-state performer at Youngstown's Ursuline High School, leading the Irish to the Steel Valley championship and Ohio state playoffs as a senior in 1984.

✓ Narduzzi was a starting linebacker under his father, the late Bill Narduzzi, as a freshman at Youngstown State University in 1985 before transferring to Rhode Island, where he became a three-year starter for the Rams from 1987-89.

✓ Bill Narduzzi was head coach at YSU from 1975-85. He led the Penguins to two NCAA Division II playoff appearances, including the national championship game in 1979, and twice was named the Ohio Valley Conference (OVC) Coach of the Year.

SERIES NOTES

This is the eighth meeting between Pitt and Virginia in a series that dates back to 1953...Pitt leads the series, 4-3...the Cavaliers won last season's encounter at Scott Stadium, 24-19...in 2013, Pitt triumphed, 14-3, at Heinz Field in the first Atlantic Coast Conference meeting between the two schools...Pitt and Virginia meet annually as members of the ACC's Coastal Division...the Panthers are 3-0 against Virginia in Pittsburgh...in addition to its 2013 victory, Pitt owns home wins in 2006 (38-13) and 1955 (18-7)...Virginia has a 2-1 edge in games played in Charlottesville, winning in 2014 and 2007 (44-14)...Pitt's lone road win in the UVA series occurred in 1953 (26-0)...the lone postseason encounter took place in the 2003 Continental Tire Bowl in Charlotte, a game that featured Pitt receiver Larry Fitzgerald and UVA standouts Matt Schaub at quarterback and Heath Miller at tight end...the Cavaliers won that bowl matchup, 23-16.

TEAM NOTES

COMING HOME

When they host Virginia on Oct. 10, the Panthers will have gone 35 days between home games. Pitt opened the season at Heinz Field with a victory over Youngstown State on Sept. 5. Following the YSU win, the Panthers played three consecutive road contests.

Pitt last played three consecutive away games during the 2008 season. That extended road trip also bridged 35 days between home contests for the '08 Panthers.

SEEKING WIN #4...

Pitt is 3-1 following its 17-13 win at Virginia Tech last week. With a victory over Virginia this Saturday, the Panthers would be 4-1 for the first time since 2009. Pitt has opened with a 4-1 record five times over the past 15 seasons (2000, 2002, 2006, 2008 and 2009). Pitt went bowling in four of those seasons, the exception being the 2006 campaign.

...AND ACC WIN #2

Since joining the ACC in 2013, the Panthers have never won their opening two league contests. A win over Virginia would give Pitt its first 2-0 record in the ACC and its first 2-0 conference mark since 2010 (when the Panthers started Big East play 3-0).

...AND WIN #700 ALL-TIME

Pitt's win at Virginia Tech marked the 699th in program history. The Panthers would become just the 19th Bowl Subdivision program to achieve 700 wins should they defeat Virginia this week. Only three other ACC programs belong to the "700 Club"—Georgia Tech (713), Virginia Tech (713) and Syracuse (711)—according to NCAA.org.

126 YEARS AND COUNTING

The 2015 campaign marks the 126th football season in Pitt history. The Panthers, who played their inaugural season in 1890, have a 699-511-42 all-time record (.575). The program's rich legacy includes 90 first team All-Americans, 24 College Football Hall of Famers, eight Pro Football Hall of Famers and nine national championships.

SEASON-ENDING INJURIES

Pitt has lost three prominent players (either returning starter or significant contributor) to season-ending injuries in 2015: junior running back and 2014 ACC Player of the Year James Conner (knee), junior running back Rachid Ibrahim (Achilles tendon) and sophomore offensive tackle Jaryd Jones-Smith (knee).

VIRGINIA PRODUCTS AT PITT

Pitt has four Virginia natives on its 2015 roster: redshirt freshman fullback George Aston (Stephens City/Sherando), junior placekicker Chris Blewitt (Alexandria/West Potomac), freshman defensive back Rimoni Dorsey (Richmond/Trinity Episcopal School) and redshirt freshman offensive lineman Mike Herndon (Greenville/Riverheads). Additionally, wide receivers coach Kevin Sherman hails from Radford, Va., and graduated from Ferrum College. Sherman had coaching stints at both Virginia Tech (2006-12) and VMI (1993-96).

FRESH FACES

Four true freshmen have played for Pitt this season: running back Darrin Hall, wide receiver Quadree Henderson, wide receiver Tre Tipton and defensive back Jordan Whitehead. Of that select group, Hall and Whitehead have both earned starting assignments. Hall made his first career start when the Panthers played at Iowa. Whitehead has started each of the past three contests at strong safety and currently leads the team in tackles with 29 stops.

YOUR 2015 PITT TEAM CAPTAINS

As selected by their teammates, the captains for the 2015 Panthers are senior tight end J.P. Holtz, senior cornerback Lafayette Pitts, senior defensive tackle Darryl Render and senior center Artie Rowell.

PITT SENIOR CLASS SMALL BUT MIGHTY

Pitt has only 11 seniors on its 2015 roster, the sixth fewest amount among Bowl Subdivision teams. In 2014, the Panthers fielded one of their youngest teams in memory. Pitt had 81 underclassmen (53 freshmen and 28 sophomores) on last year's roster, the highest total of any FBS team.

PITT PENALTY PROFICIENCY

Pitt has done an excellent job at limiting penalties through four games, incurring just 20 for 148 yards. The Panthers rank among the nation's best in fewest penalties (10th), fewest penalties per game (25th, 5.00 avg.), fewest penalty yards (fourth) and fewest penalty yards per game (eighth, 37.00 avg.).

FWAA 75TH ANNIVERSARY ALL-AMERICA TEAM

Five legendary Pitt Panthers were named to the Football Writers Association of America (FWAA) 75th Anniversary All-America Team, the second-highest total in the country.

Pitt's five selections—end Mike Ditka, running back Tony Dorsett, wide receiver Larry Fitzgerald, offensive lineman Bill Fralic and defensive end Hugh Green—were second only to Nebraska's six. (Ohio State tied for second with five picks.) Fitzgerald was a first-team selection on the all-time FWAA All-America Team, while Ditka, Dorsett, Fralic and Green were second-team picks.

A nomination ballot with selected players from all FWAA All-America teams was sent to the entire membership this spring. The popular vote was then taken into consideration by a Blue Ribbon Committee of FWAA past presidents, current board members and officers. That committee put the finishing touches on selecting the 75-man team.

BLUE & GOLD RALLY CAPS

Since the 2002 season, Pitt has won 25 games with second-half comebacks. During the 2013 campaign, the Panthers won three contests with second-half rallies: Notre Dame (28-21), Syracuse (17-16) and Bowling Green (30-27 in the Little Caesars Pizza Bowl). From 2010-12, the Panthers did not win a single contest when facing a second-half deficit.

Pitt had one second-half comeback in 2014. The Panthers trailed host FIU at intermission, 16-14, but rallied for a decisive 42-25 win. Pitt trailed FIU, 16-0, in the first quarter before scoring 26 unanswered points to seize control. The 16-point deficit was the largest overcome by Pitt to win a game since 1996, when the Panthers rallied past Temple, 53-52, after being down 19 in the fourth quarter.

Despite a strong second-half rally, Pitt could not overcome a 21-point halftime deficit and fell at Virginia, 24-19...a big second quarter by UVA proved to be the difference...with the game tied, 3-3, at the end of the opening period, the Cavaliers (4-2, 2-0) broke the game open by scoring 21 points in an 8:11 span...LB Max Valles capped the onslaught with a 35-yard interception return, giving Virginia a 24-3 lead with 2:40 left in the half...Pitt (3-3, 1-1) scored 10 unanswered points in the third...Dontez Ford blocked a UVA punt, setting up Pitt's first TD, a 17-yard pass from Chad Voytik to Manasseh Garner...later in the quarter, safety Pat Amara had his first career INT and Pitt moved to the UVA 1...but Pitt had to settle for a field goal—and 24-13 deficit—when James Conner was ruled short of the goal line and a false start penalty pushed the ball back to the 6...the Panthers were flagged 10 times for 75 yards on the night...Pitt would not score again until Voytik hit J.P. Holtz with a TD pass with 1:27 left...the ensuing 2-point conversion pass was batted down and Pitt's onside kick was unsuccessful, sealing the result.

TYLER AND LARRY FITZ

Tyler Boyd and Larry Fitzgerald are the only players in Pitt history to achieve two 1,000-yard receiving seasons. Making this accomplishment even more impressive is the fact that they both did it during their freshman and sophomore seasons. In ACC annals, Boyd is the only player to achieve 1,000-yard seasons as both a frosh and sophomore.

In terms of single-season catches, Boyd owns two of the top three totals at Pitt. As a freshman in 2013, he hauled in 85 passes, the second-highest total in school history. In 2014, Boyd had 78 catches, the third most by a Panther. Fitzgerald owns the Pitt record with 92 catches as a sophomore in 2003, the same season he won the Biletnikoff Award and Walter Camp Award and was the Heisman Trophy runner-up.

DAZZLING DEBUT

Redshirt freshman Qadree Ollison entered the Youngstown State opener as Pitt's third-string tailback. He finished it having achieved one of the most dazzling debuts in school history.

Ollison ripped off 207 yards and a touchdown on just 16 carries—all in the second half. He came off the bench when James Conner and Chris James left the game due to injuries. Ollison set a Pitt record for rushing yards by a freshman in a season opener. The prior mark was held by Dion Lewis, who had 129 against YSU in 2009.

Ollison's first career carry was a 46-yard sprint. His third carry was a 71-yard touchdown. He later added a 52-yard dash during which he broke multiple tackles, tightroped the sideline and then dragged a defender several yards to the YSU one. Ollison, who averaged 12.9 yards per carry for the game, was awarded a "Helmet Sticker" on ESPN's *College Football Final* and named the ACC Rookie of the Week.

RARE FRESHMAN 200-YARD GAME

Qadree Ollison is one of just four freshmen at Pitt to rush for 200 yards in a game, joining such luminaries as Tony Dorsett, Curvin Richards and James Conner. Ollison's 207-yard effort against Youngstown State ranks fifth (tied) for the most rushing yards by a Pitt freshman.

TEAM RUSHING LEADER

Qadree Ollison is Pitt's rushing leader with 427 yards and three touchdowns on 60 carries (7.1 avg.). He is averaging 106.8 rushing yards per game, which ranks second in the ACC behind Florida State's Dalvin Cook (142.5 avg.).

CONNER UNDERGOES SEASON-ENDING SURGERY

Pitt junior All-America running back James Conner underwent season-ending surgery on his right knee for a torn medial collateral ligament. Conner sustained the injury during the second quarter of Pitt's season-opening win over Youngstown State.

Conner entered this season as one of college football's most decorated players. He was selected the 2014 ACC Player of the Year after rushing for 1,765 yards and 26 touchdowns. Conner was named to seven postseason All-America squads as a sophomore, including first-team honors from the American Football Coaches Association (AFCA). He was the first Pitt running back to garner first-team All-America honors in 27 years, dating back to Craig "Ironhead" Heyward in 1987.

DEFENSIVE NOTES

NATIONAL RANKINGS ON "D"

Pitt is ranked in the nation's top 25 in eight defensive categories this week: fourth-down conversion defense (first, 0%), quarterback sacks (second, an ACC-best 4.25 sacks/game), rushing defense (fourth, 71.3 yards/game), total defense (fourth, 243.8 yards/game), fewest first downs allowed (fourth, 58 total), pass efficiency defense (12th, 98.00 rating), tackles for loss (14th, 8.3 TFL/game) and third-down conversion defense (23rd, 29.1%).

In addition to its top-25 rankings, the Panthers' defense is also 26th nationally in fewest passing yards allowed with an average of 172.5 yards per contest.

DEFENSE DOMINANT AT VIRGINIA TECH

In their 17-13 win at Virginia Tech last week, the Panthers yielded just 100 yards in total offense, including a mere nine yards on the ground, and had seven sacks. The effort was noteworthy on several counts:

- The 100 yards marked Virginia Tech's lowest offensive output since Frank Beamer's first game as head coach in 1987 (60 in a 22-10 loss to Clemson).
- It was the lowest total offense and rushing yardage allowed by Pitt in an ACC game (since 2013).
- It was the lowest rushing yardage allowed by Pitt overall since holding USF to eight yards on the ground in 2012.
- Pitt's seven sacks were its most in an ACC game. Overall, it was the Panthers' highest sack total since also notching seven in their 2013 Little Caesars Pizza Bowl win over Bowling Green.

"COACH DUZZER'S" DEFENSES

Pat Narduzzi arrived at Pitt after establishing himself as one of college football's top defensive coordinators during his Michigan State tenure from 2007-14. Under his direction, the Spartans were the only team to rank in the nation's top 10 in total defense each of the past four seasons (No. 6 in 2011, No. 4 in 2012, No. 2 in 2013, No. 8 in 2014). Additionally, MSU was the only team to rank in the top 10 in both total defense and rushing defense the past four seasons. MSU ranked No. 1 in the nation in rushing defense (88.5 yards/game) and No. 8 in total defense (315.8 yards/game) in 2014.

TURNING UP THE HEAT

An elevated pass rush was a defensive priority for Pitt heading into this season. Through four games, the Panthers are achieving that goal with 17 quarterback sacks. Last year Pitt had only 19 sacks in 13 games.

Twelve different Pitt players have been in on sacks this season. Senior defensive end Ejuan Price paces the team with three sacks followed by senior linebacker Nicholas Grigsby with 2.5.

NATIONAL TOP 30 DEFENSES

Since the 2000 season, Pitt has finished in the nation's top 30 in total defense eight times. The feat was most recently accomplished in 2012 when the Panthers ranked 17th nationally while allowing just 330.5 yards per game.

WHITEHEAD PACES PITT

Freshman strong safety Jordan Whitehead leads Pitt in tackles through four games with 29 total stops. Whitehead compiled a season-high 16 stops at Iowa, the highest single-game tackle total by a freshman at Pitt since 2002.

The last time a freshman led Pitt in tackles for the season was in 1999 when free safety Ramon Walker had 131 stops.

AVONTE ACTIVE DEFENDING THE PASS

Sophomore cornerback Avonte Maddox has been highly active in the secondary thus far. Maddox has totaled seven passes defended (six breakups and one interception), an average of 1.8 per contest, which ranks tied for first in the ACC and 12th nationally. As a freshman last season, Maddox had three passes defended in 13 games.

TOSSING SHUTOUTS

Since the 2000 season, Pitt has shut out seven opponents. The Panthers blanked Delaware in the 2014 opener, 62-0, their first shutout since 2005.

The only other current Pitt player with a block on his résumé is junior receiver Dontez Ford, who blocked a punt at Virginia in 2014.

Since 2000, the Panthers are 25-18 when they block a kick of any variety.

Pitt opened the 2015 season and the Pat Narduzzi coaching era with a 45-37 win over Youngstown State...the Panthers posted 458 yards, including 325 on the ground, but also surrendered 407 yards to persistent YSU...Qadree Ollison, who entered the game as Pitt's third-string tailback, rushed for 207 yards and a TD on 16 carries (12.9 avg.), all in the second half...Ollison came off the bench when Pitt's top two backs, James Conner and Chris James, were sidelined due to injuries...Ollison's yardage set a Pitt freshman record for rushing yards in a season opener...Avonte Maddox had an 89-yard kickoff return TD, Pitt's first since 2011...defensively the Panthers collected six sacks...LB Nicholas Grigsby had two sacks, three TFLs and 10 total stops... The University of Pittsburgh and its multimedia rights holder IMG College provide the Panthers with comprehensive radio coverage throughout the football season. Led by 50,000-watt flagship station Sportsradio 93.7 The Fan (KDKA-FM) in Pittsburgh, Pitt football games are broadcast on the Pitt IMG Sports Network, a loyal network of stations that spans the Commonwealth.

Football radio coverage on the Pitt IMG Sports Network includes:

- A three-hour pregame show (first hour on 93.7 The Fan and the last two on the entire Pitt IMG Sports Network).
- *Panther Reaction*, a call-in show on 93.7 The Fan following post-game coverage.
- *The Pat Narduzzi Show presented by the Dollar Energy Fund* airing live from Cupka's Cafe II on most Wednesdays from 6 to 7 p.m. Coach Narduzzi previews the upcoming game and takes questions from callers listening on many of the same Pitt IMG Sports Network affiliates that carry Panthers' game broadcasts.

Known to Pitt fans nationwide as the "Voice of the Panthers," **Bill Hillgrove** will handle football play-by-play duties for the 42nd consecutive year. His accurate and descriptive style truly paints the picture for Pitt fans listening to the network. Hillgrove has a long association with the Panthers and Pittsburgh sports scene. Prior to taking over as the play-by-play man for Pitt football, Hillgrove served as the Panthers' color analyst from 1970-73. He has also served as the Panthers' play-by-play man for Pitt basketball broadcasts since 1969.

Hillgrove is a 1962 graduate of Duquesne and has also been the Pittsburgh Steelers' play-by-play announcer since 1995. Hillgrove was named the 2007 recipient of the prestigious Chris Schenkel Award for excellence in college football broadcasting.

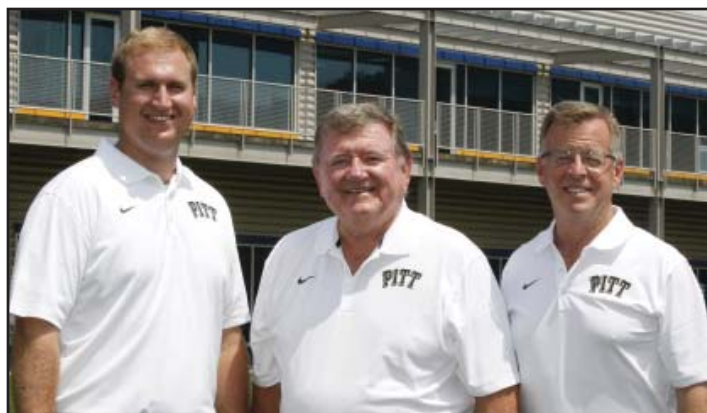
Joining Hillgrove in the booth for his fifth year as color analyst will be former Pitt quarterback **Pat Bostick**. A three-year letterman (2007-08, 2010), Bostick was under center for such memorable Pitt victories as the 13-9 upset of West Virginia in 2007 and 36-33 quadruple-overtime win at Notre Dame in 2008.

Bostick makes a tremendous impression on listeners with his keen insight and analysis. In addition to Pitt game days, he will continue to be a frequently heard voice talking college football on 93.7 The Fan's various shows.

A 2010 honors graduate of the University of Pittsburgh, Bostick earned his bachelor's degree in just three years before beginning work on his master's degree in Pitt's School of Education. He also serves as the director of development for the Panther Club, the athletic department's official fundraising office.

Pitt pregame coverage and in-game sideline reports will be provided by **Larry Richert**, one of Pittsburgh's most recognized voices and faces. Host of the venerable *KDKA Morning News Show* (1020 AM) since 2001, Richert's broadcasting career spans nearly 35 years in both radio and television.

Richert is highly active in community endeavors, emceeding more than 100 benefits annually around the region. He is the Heinz Field public address announcer for Pittsburgh Steelers home games and narrates the Steelers' annual highlight films.

The 2013 season marked Richert's return to college football. During the latter 1980s, he produced Pitt football radio broadcasts for four seasons. Born in Millvale and raised in McCandless Township, Richert graduated from North Allegheny High School and Clarion University.

The 2015 season marks the sixth for Pitt's partnership with CBS Radio Pittsburgh and its flagship, Sportsradio 93.7 The Fan. Beyond game broadcasts, the station airs a wide array of weekly programming focusing on the Panthers' sports scene throughout the year.
