OPENING DRAW

GAME OVERVIEW

- Virginia returns to the "Charm City" for the second time in 2017 for a non-conference tilt with Johns Hopkins in the battle for the Doyle Smith Cup. Faceoff is set for 1 p.m.
- This week Virginia is ranked No. 15 in the USILA coaches poll and No. 15 in the Inside Lacrosse/Maverik media poll. Johns Hopkins is ranked No. 18 in the coaches poll and No. 17 in the media poll.
- The game will be broadcast live on ESPN3 and there will be a television tape delay on ESPNU, airing Sunday, March 26 at 11 a.m.

THE SERIES VS. THE BLUE JAYS

- The 2017 season marks the 71st straight season the Cavaliers and the Blue Jays have clashed in an all-time series that began in 1904. Johns Hopkins holds the all-time advantage with a 59-31-1 mark, however Virginia has won nine of the last 14 meetings, including a streak of six in a row before dropping five of the last eight matchups.
- Virginia's 91 all-time games against the Blue Jays is the most games the Cavaliers have played against any opponent in their history.
- JHU head coach Dave Pietramala is in his 17th season with the Blue Jays and is coming off an 8-7 record in 2016 and a first round NCAA Tournament loss to current UVA head coach Lars Tiffany and his Brown team that reached Championship Weekend.



With five goals and two assists against then-No. 3 Notre Dame, freshman Michael Kraus has nine combined goals and 13 combined points in UVA's two ACC games this season.

COVERING THE CAVALIERS

UNIQUELY UVA

The University of Virginia is an institution rich with history and tradition. Here is some of the terminology that contributes to UVA's culture.

Grounds: The term used by students, faculty and alumni to refer to the University dating as far back as Thomas Jefferson. "Campus" is never used.

First Year, Second Year, Third Year, Fourth Year: Instead of freshman, sophomore, junior, senior. Why you may ask? To be a "senior" implies that a person has reached the final phase of learning, a feat that Thomas Jefferson believed to be impossible, arguing instead that education is a life-long process.

Commonwealth: Virginia is one of four constituent states of the United States of America that officially uses the name "Commonwealth" instead of the word state in all references. The other three commonwealths are Kentucky, Massachusetts and Pennsylvania.

UNIVERSITY NICKNAMES

Virginia's athletics teams have been accompanied by a somewhat confusing array of nicknames. The most prominent and widely accepted of these monikers are "Cavaliers," "Wahoos" and "Hoos."

Although the terms "Cavaliers," "Wahoos" and "Hoos" are used almost interchangeably to refer to University teams and players, "Cavaliers" is more often used by the media, while "Wahoos" and "Hoos" are frequently used by Virginia students and fans.

Legend has it that Washington & Lee baseball fans dubbed the Virginia players "Wahoos" during the fiercely contested rivalry that existed between the two in-state schools in the 1890s. By 1940, "Wahoos" was in general use around Grounds to denote University students or events relating to them. The abbreviated "Hoos" sprang up later in student newspapers and has gained growing popularity in recent years.

THE CAVALIER MASCOT

The costumed Cavalier with a large character head debuted during Virginia's 1984 football season and has remained the official mascot of the University.

UNIVERSITY COLORS

Orange and blue were adopted as the University of Virginia's official athletic colors at a mass student meeting in 1888. UVA athletic teams had previously worn silver gray and cardinal red, but those colors did not stand out on muddy football fields, prompting a student movement to change them.

One of the students attending the mass meeting was Allen Potts, a star athlete who played on Virginia's first football team in 1888. Potts showed up at the meeting wearing a navy blue-and-orange scarf that he had acquired during a summer boating expedition at Oxford University. Orange and blue were chosen as the official athletic colors after one of Potts' fellow students pulled the scarf off Potts' neck and, waving it to the crowd, yelled, "How will this do?" UVA later served as the inspiration for schools like Auburn and Florida when they selected school colors.

WAH-HOO-WAH

The origin of "Wah-hoo-wah" is uncertain. The cheer was used to root on Virginia teams as early as 1890 and may have been borrowed from Dartmouth College, whose athletics teams were once known as the Indians.

Legend attributes the yell to Natalie Floyd Otey, who sang the ballad "Where'er You Are, There Shall My Love Be" at Charlottesville's Levy Opera House in 1893. The predominantly student audience noticed that Otey warbled the first three words of the song between each of the stanzas and decided to join in the refrain. By evening's end, goes the legend, the crowd had corrupted "Where'er You Are" into "Wah-hoo-wah."

The Levy Opera House stands at the corner of High Street and Park Street and has since been renovated into an office building.

Broadcasts are made from the radio broadcast facilities in Klöckner Stadium. There is one courtesy line available for use by visiting radio crews. Adequate space is available for the visiting team needs. Arrangement for broadcasts must be validated in advance through the UVA Athletics Media Relations Office.

INTERVIEWS

All requests for interviews with coaches and players should be made through Vincent Briedis in the Athletics Media Relations Office. Postgame interviews are conducted at field level following the postgame handshake. Locker rooms are closed.

THE SERIES VS. JOHNS HOPKINS

- Johns Hopkins holds a commanding 59-31-1 record in the all-time series.
- The rivalry between the two schools goes all the way back to two meetings in 1904, well before lacrosse was recognized as a varsity sport at UVA.
- The teams have met at least once every season since 1948, the longest current series of any Virginia opponent
- Virginia has closed the gap recently by winning 18 of the last 28.
- John Hopkins' 59 wins over Virginia are by far the most wins by any school over the Cavaliers.
- Virginia has also played more games against Hopkins than any one else (91).
- Four of the last five regular season games have been won in overtime. Johns Hopkins won in 2012 at Klöckner Stadium, while UVA won 2014 and 2016 at Klöckner Stadium, and in 2015 at Homewood Field.
- In last meeting at Homewood Field UVA scored two goals in the final 1:34 of regulation to force overtime and for the second season in a row Greg Coholan scored an overtime goal to give UVA a win over the Blue Jays. Ryan Tucker added five goals in the win at Homewood Field, only UVA's 10th all-time win in 46 tries at Charm City's historic edifice. Coholan scored the overtime-winning goal in 2014 at Klöckner Stadium.
- Coholan scored with 20 seconds left in regulation to force overtime in the 2016 installment at Klöckner Stadium. Mike D'Amario scored an unassisted game-winning goal at 3:41 in the overtime period.

THE CLASH FOR THE DOYLE SMITH CUP

- Virginia and Johns Hopkins meet once again with the Doyle Smith Cup at stake.
- The two schools have joined to honor E. Doyle Smith, Jr., for his lifetime of contributions to the lacrosse programs at both schools and on the national level with the annual winner laying claim to the cup.
- Virginia won the cup the first five times it was presented before losing possession in 2011 at Homewood Field. Johns Hopkins won the 2012 and 2013 meetings as well.
- The cup returned to Charlottesville with UVA's 11-10 overtime win at Klöckner Stadium in 2014. A 16-15 overtime win at Homewood Field in 2015 kept the cup in Charlottesville. UVA won the cup for the third year in a row after an overtime win in Charlottesville in 2016, a 13-12 triumph.
- Smith served as team manager and statistician for Johns Hopkins under coach Bob Scott from 1963-1968.
- He enrolled at UVA to pursue a doctorate in the fall of 1968, and became the University's first full-time assistant sports information director, a position he held for 31 years until his retirement in 1999, serving as the lacrosse team's publicist for four head coaches—Buddy Beardmore, Glenn Thiel, Jim Adams and Dom Starsia.
- On the national level, Smith was one of the nation's foremost authorities on the sport as his name is synonymous with the game's history and record keeping.
- He served as the information director compiling the weekly rankings and statistics for the United States Intercollegiate Lacrosse Association (USILA) from 1973-95 and twice received its Man of the Year Award. The USILA media award bears his name.
- In 2000 he was elected to the US Lacrosse Hall of Fame and is believed to be the only individual inducted who never played or coached the game at some level.
- Smith passed away in June 2004, not long after the 2004 national championship game.

UVA AND JOHNS HOPKINS CONNECTIONS

- Current Johns Hopkins attackman, Shack, is the younger brother of former UVA great Steele Stanwick.
- Steele Stanwick is UVA's all-time leader in career points (269) and is No. 4 all-time in assists (143) and No. 7 all-time in goals (126). Steele was a two-time first-team All-American and was the 2011 Tewaaraton Trophy winner as the nation's top player. He helped lead UVA to the 2011 NCAA title when the Cavaliers became the first seven seed to win it all.

MORE ON THE HOPKINS SERIES

- The Blue Jays have dominated the series in Baltimore, winning 35-of-46 match-ups at Homewood Field (with one tie).
- The series is more even when played in Charlottesville with the Blue Jays holding the 21-16 advantage.
- Nine of the last 17 games have been barn burners decided by one goal (Hopkins won four).
- This game features some historical patterns that could bode well for the Cavaliers. Known as a team that likes the up-tempo pace, Virginia would certainly like to see its offense explode vs. the Blue Jays since the Cavaliers are 24-9 all-time when scoring at least 10 goals, but have lost two of the last four times they have scored at least 10 goals.
- In fact, when UVA scores more than 13 goals they have won 17-of-20 games against Hopkins.
- The Cavaliers can also be successful if they are able to contain the Hopkins offense because they are 18-7-1 when allowing fewer than 10 goals (2008's 13-12 UVA overtime win ended a streak of 10 consecutive games with single-digit goals by the Blue Jays).

HISTORY SUGGESTS RANKINGS DON'T MEAN TOO MUCH

- One of the characteristics of the Virginia vs. Johns Hopkins series since the late 1980s is the inability to use rankings as a predictor of victory.
- The higher ranked team has lost 18 of the last 30 regular season meetings dating back to 1987.
- In fact, from 1990-1995, the higher ranked squad lost each time.
- UVA lost two of the last three regular season matchups as the higher ranked team, including 2012's No. 1 vs. No. 2 meeting - in 2011 UVA was No. 2 and Johns Hopkins was No. 11. UVA won the 2015 meeting in overtime, 16-15, as the No. 7 team and Johns Hopkins was the No. 19 team.
- The 2014 matchup went in favor of UVA, 11-10, in overtime as the Cavaliers were the No. 10 team in the nation and Johns Hopkins was No. 9.
- In 2016 Johns Hopkins was No. 8 and UVA was unranked for a Cavalier win.
- UVA is ranked No. 15 this week, while Johns Hopkins is No. 18.

 • Brugel was a perfect 11-of-11 on faceoffs in the second half.

TIFFANY CONNECTED TO UVA'S TITLE COACHES

• UVA head coach Lars Tiffany is connected in the lacrosse world to both Glenn Thiel and Dom Starsia, the two Virginia coaches who brought NCAA titles to Charlottesville.
 • Tiffany played for Starsia at Brown and coached under Thiel at Penn State (2000-04).

FIRST YEARS SHINE AT LOYOLA

- First years Dox Aitken (four goals) and Michael Kraus (two goals, three assists) led UVA with nine combined points at then-No. 6 Loyola.
- The nine combined points is the most by a UVA freshman duo in a season-opening collegiate debut since Drew McKnight (two goals, four assists) and Jay Jalbert (four goals) combined for 10 points in the 1997 season opener against then-No. 2 Syracuse.
- Aitken's four goals in his collegiate debut makes the freshman the third Cavalier since 1997 to score four goals in a season-opening collegiate debut, joining Jay Jalbert (1997, 4 against Syracuse) and Joe Yevoli (2002, 4 against Drexel).
- Aitken and Kraus become the 6th and 7th Cavalier freshmen since 1997 to record at least four points in a season-opening debut.

AITKEN SCORES UVA'S FIRST GOAL OF 2017

- Dox Aitken scored the first goal of 2017 for the Cavaliers at then-No. 6 Loyola on Feb. 11.
- It is the second year in a row the first goal of the season for UVA was scored by a true freshman. Ryan Conrad scored the first goal of 2016 for UVA against Loyola at Klöckner Stadium. Conrad was the first true freshman to do so since Ryan Tucker in 2012 at Drexel.
- Since 2010 a UVA true freshman has scored the season's first goal five times. Connor English did so in 2010 and Rob Emery in 2011.

TIFFANY'S STAFF IS CHAMPIONSHIP CALIBER

- UVA head coach Lars Tiffany brought both of his full-time assistants with him from Brown, Sean Kirwan and Kip Turner. Both Kirwan and Turner own a championship pedigree.
- Turner is a 2007 Virginia graduate and was the starting goalie on the Cavaliers' historic 17-0 NCAA title team in 2006. Turner later went on to win three MLL championships as a player. He won his first in 2011 with Boston, followed by 2012 and 2013 with Chesapeake.
- Kirwan, an All-American attackman at Tufts, won the 2010 NCAA DIII title and helped guide the Jumbos to the 2014 NCAA DIII title as an assistant coach at his alma mater.

VIRGINIA IS A GROUND BALL MACHINE

- UVA has led the nation in ground balls three of the last eight years.
- Currently UVA ranks No. 1 in the nation in ground balls (48.50).
- UVA is the only school in the nation to finish in the Top-5 nationally in ground balls per game seven times over the last eight seasons.
- Duke is the closest team to UVA, finishing in the Top-5 four times during the same span.
- The only school in 2016 to finish with more ground balls per game was new UVA head coach Lars Tiffany's 2016 Brown team.

CAN'T SCORE UNLESS YOU CLEAR THE BALL

- Virginia registered a .918 percent success rate on clears in 2013, giving the Cavaliers four seasons in a row clearing the ball above .900 percent.
- No other team in the nation has ever been able to boast such a streak.
- UVA cleared at a .907 rate in 2012, a .900 rate in 2011 and a .922 rate in 2010.
- During that time UVA twice ranked No. 3 in the nation in scoring offense, scoring 13.44 goals per game in 2010 and 12.56 goals per game in 2011. UVA ranked No. 11 in 2012 with 11.5 goals per game.
- The streak snapped in 2014 when UVA only cleared at a .851 rate.
- According to research in collaboration with all NCAA DI men's lacrosse SIDs, only 30 teams have cleared at over .900 in a season, five times its been done by UVA, dating back to 1971 - the first year lacrosse was an NCAA Championship sport.
- UVA records on clearing date back to 1971 - some schools like Syracuse (1983), only go back to a certain year in regards to clearing stats. Below is the current list of all-time .900+ clearing schools in a season:
