## NAVY TO FACE VIRGINIA IN 10TH ANNIVERSARY MILITARY BOWL PRESENTED BY NORTHROP GRUMMAN

- The Military Bowl presented by Northrop Grumman, benefiting the USO, announced on Dec. 3 that Navy and Virginia have accepted invitations to play in the 10th anniversary Military Bowl on Thursday, Dec. 28 at Navy-Marine Corps Memorial Stadium in Annapolis, Md.
- Navy (6-6) will be making its third appearance in the Military Bowl and its second at Navy-Marine Corps Memorial Stadium. The Mids lost to Wake Forest, 29-19, in the inaugural EagleBank Bowl at RFK Stadium in 2008 and beat Pittsburgh, 44-28, in the 2015 Military Bowl in Annapolis.
- This will be the 14th bowl appearance in 15 years for Navy.
- Virginia (6-6) will be making its first bowl appearance since 2011. It will be the Cavaliers' first appearance in the Military Bowl.
- This will be the 40th meeting between the two schools and the first since 1994. The two teams first met back in 1889 (26-6 win by Navy in Annapolis). Navy leads the all-time series, 28-11, but Virginia is riding a five-game winning streak against the Mids, beating Navy annually from 1990 to 1994, including a 47-10 victory in Annapolis on Sept. 10, 1994.
- Virginia's coach at that time was George Welsh, who guided the Cavaliers from 1982 to 2000 and is the all-time winningest coach in school history. Welsh previously coached Navy from 1973 to 1981 and his 55 victories at Navy are second only to current Midshipmen coach Ken Niumatalolo.
- Navy head coach Ken Niumatalolo is in his 10th year at Navy, making him the longest-tenured coach in school history. Both George Welsh and Eddie Ederlatz served as head coach at Navy for nine seasons. With 83 career wins he is the winningest coach in school history.
- Navy fans can purchase tickets to attend the Military Bowl or donate tickets right now at <https://goo.gl/MP2D9H> or by calling 1-800-US4-NAVY during business hours. Ticket prices are \$80 for the lower level, \$60 for the upper level and \$25 for standing room only. Donated tickets are \$60 and will be given to either midshipmen or enlisted personnel in the area.
- ESPN will televise the game nationally with Clay Matvick, Kirk Morrison and Alex Corddry on the call. John Brickley and Brad Edwards handle the call for ESPN Radio.
- The Navy Football Tailgate Show on WNAV Radio 1430 AM / 99.9 FM will air at 11:30 AM.
- The Navy Football Pregame Show with host Tim Murray will get underway at 12:30 PM on the Navy Radio Network, followed by game action beginning at 1:30 PM with Pete Medhurst, Tom O'Brien and Joe Miller on the call on the Navy Federal Navy Radio Network.
- Following the contest, Medhurst, O'Brien, Miller and Murray will recap the day's events in a 30-minute postgame show.

### NAVY FAST FACTS

- Navy is 32-14 (.696) over its last 46 games. The Mids own wins over No. 15 Memphis (2015) and No. 6 Houston (2016) during that time period, as well as a win over Notre Dame in Jacksonville (2016).
- Over the last five years, Navy is 28-3 (.903) when winning the turnover battle. This year the Mids have won the turnover battle just twice, finishing +2 in a win over Air Force and a +1 in a loss to Houston. Navy was even in the turnover battle against FAU (win), Cincinnati (win), SMU (win), Temple (loss), Notre Dame (loss) and Army (loss). The Mids were -1 vs. Tulsa (win), -2 vs. Tulane (win), -2 vs. UCF (loss) and -4 vs. Memphis (loss).
- Navy is 54-9 (.857) under Niumatalolo when scoring first, including 5-1 (.833) this year.
- Navy is 69-5 (.932) under Niumatalolo when entering the fourth quarter with the lead, including 6-1 (.857) this year.

### SCOUTING VIRGINIA

- The Cavaliers enter the bowl game with a 6-6 record and very similar to Navy started out the season hot only to stumble down the stretch. Virginia owns victories over William & Mary (28-10), UConn (38-18), Boise State (42-23), Duke (28-21), North Carolina (20-14) and Georgia Tech (40-36). The Cavaliers lost to Indiana (34-17), Boston College (41-10), Pitt (31-14), Louisville (38-21), Miami (44-28) and Virginia Tech (10-0). UVA started the year 5-1, but have lost five of its final six contests.
- The Cavaliers are led by quarterback Kurt Benkert, who has completed 282 of his 473 pass attempts (.596) for 3,062 yards with 25 touchdowns and eight interceptions.
- Olamide Zaccheaus leads the Wahos in receiving with 80 catches for 833 yards and five touchdowns. Doni Dowling has 48 catches for 632 yards and five touchdowns, while Andre Levrone has seen seven of his 31 catches (662 yards) go for touchdowns.
- Jordan Ellis leads the Virginia rushing attack with 799 yards and six touchdowns on 204 carries.
- The Virginia defense is led by the Academic Heisman winner Micah Kiser, who has recorded a whopping 134 tackles, with 9.5 tackles for a loss and five sacks.
- Quin Blanding (121 tackles) and Jordan Mack (105 tackles) also have recorded more than 100 tackles on the year. Chris Peace leads Virginia in tackles for a loss (10.5) and sacks (7.5), while Juan Thomhill has 12 pass breakups.
- Kicker A.J. Mejia is 8-11 on field goals with a long of 38, while Lester Coleman is averaging 44.0 yards per punt with 28 of his 71 punts downed inside the 20.

## TOUGH SCHEDULE

- According to the Cody Kellner Strength of Schedule Index, Navy has played the nation's 33rd-toughest schedule and the toughest among the non-autonomous five conferences. The Kellner Index gives each team a rating that is reflective of the success they have had within their strength of schedule.
- Navy's opponents are a combined 72-52 on the year (.581). The Mids' four nonconference opponents - Notre Dame 9-3, Florida Atlantic 10-3, Army 9-3 and Air Force 5-7 - are a combined 33-16 (.673). The six teams that beat Navy - Notre Dame (9-3), UCF (13-0), Memphis (10-2), Houston (7-4), Temple (6-6) and Army (9-3) - are a combined 54-18 (.750).
- Navy played eight opponents in the 2017 regular season who have qualified for a bowl, posting a 2-6 record - the Mids beat Florida Atlantic, lost to Memphis, lost to UCF, lost to Temple, beat SMU, lost to Notre Dame, lost to Houston and lost to Army.

## PALMORE, THOMAS NAMED SECOND-TEAM ALL-EAST

- Navy senior outside linebacker D.J. Palmore and senior inside linebacker Micah Thomas have been named Second-Team All-East by the ECAC.
- Penn State's Saquon Barkley was named the Offensive Player of the year, while Avonte Maddox of Pitt was named the Defensive Player of the Year. Geoff Collins of Temple was named the Coach of the Year.
- The All-East Team is made up of players from Army, Navy, Boston College, UConn, Maryland, UMass, Penn State, Pitt, Rutgers, Syracuse and Temple.
- Palmore leads Navy in tackles for a loss with 12.5 and fumble recoveries with three. He is third on the team in tackles with 73 stops and second in sacks with 2.5.
- Thomas leads the Mids in tackles with 81, including four tackles for a loss and a team-high three interceptions.

## PALMORE SELECTED TO EAST-WEST SHRINE GAME

- Navy senior outside linebacker and co-captain D.J. Palmore has been selected to the 94th annual East-West Shrine All-Star Game, which will be played Jan. 20 in St. Petersburg, Fla.
- For 93 years some of football's greatest athletes and coaches have contributed to the tradition of the East-West Shrine Game. Players like Gale Sayers, Tom Brady, John Elway, Allan Page, Dick Butkus, Brett Favre, Gino Marchetti and Walter Payton, along with coaches Don Shula, Dick Vermeil, Paul "Bear" Bryant and Jerry Glanville, to name a few, have supported the East-West Shrine Game.
- Created by the Shriners in 1925, the East-West Shrine Game was the nation's first college all-star football game. The game is driven by the desire to support Shriners Hospitals for Children in its mission to help children in need of expert medical care. More than 1 million children have benefited from Shriners Hospitals' unique way of providing hope and healing, regardless of the families' ability to pay for services.
- Every year, players and coaches visit the local Shriners Hospitals for Children during game week to meet the patients and gain a greater understanding of the importance of the game. During the inspirational and humbling visit, the teams experience a day they will never forget. Whether dancing to music, playing games or simply sharing stories with one another, the instant friendships that form between the patients and players are a testament to our motto of being more than just a game.
- Palmore is the 30th Navy player to be selected to the game. Three of the last four selected could not play due to injuries: Will Worth (2016), Keenan Reynolds (2015) and Cody Peterson (2013). Parrish Gaines (2014) is the last Navy player to actually play in the game.

## PALMORE NAMED SECOND-TEAM ALL-AMERICAN ATHLETIC CONFERENCE; THOMAS AND WILLIAMS EARN HONORABLE MENTION HONORS

- Senior outside linebacker **D.J. Palmore** was named Second-Team All-American Athletic Conference, while senior linebacker **Micah Thomas** and junior safety **Sean Williams** were both named honorable mention. The all-league team is voted on by the league's 12 head coaches.
- UCF quarterback McKenzie Milton was named the AAC Offensive Player of the Year, Houston defensive tackle Ed Oliver was named the Defensive Player of the Year, Tony Pollard of Memphis was named the Special Teams Player of the Year, Memphis corner T.J. Carter was the Rookie of the Year and UCF's Scott Frost was named the Coach of the Year.

## AAC OVERALL CONFERENCE STANDINGS SINCE NAVY JOINED IN 2015

- Since joining the American Athletic Conference in 2015, Navy has compiled an overall conference record of 18-6, shared a West Division title in 2015 and won the West Division outright in 2016.
- Navy's 18-6 cumulative record is tied with Temple for the second-best record within the league over the last three years. USF is first at 19-5.

## TIME TO GET READY

- Under Niumatalolo, Navy is 25-17 (.595) with more than one week to prepare for an opponent, including a 3-2 mark this year.

## MORE ON NIUMATALOLO

- 10th-year head coach **Ken Niumatalolo** has led the Midshipmen to a 83-48 (.634) record and is the program's all-time winningest coach.
- He is 8-2 (.800) all-time against Navy's biggest rival, Army West Point, and is the first head coach in the history of the Army-Navy game to win his first eight games against the rival service academy.
- His eight wins against the Black Knights are tied for the most in Army-Navy history with College Football Hall of Fame Coach Army West Point's Earl Blaik, who was just 8-8-2 (.500) from 1941-58 against Navy.
- He is the fastest in school history to reach 50 wins, earning his 50th victory in 2013 against Temple in what was his 81st career game.
- He is one of seven active coaches that are the all-time winningest coach at their respective schools. Two of the seven have been the only coach in that school's history.
- He is the 13th-longest tenured head coach in the FBS taking over the head job at Navy on Dec. 8, 2007. Niumatalolo has been the head coach at Navy longer than the other 11 AAC coaches combined.
- His four bowl wins are the most in school history and he is the only coach in school history to win three-consecutive bowl games.
- His four wins against top 25 opponents are tied with George Welsh for the second most in school history. Eddie Erdelatz holds the record with nine.
- Niumatalolo has three wins over Notre Dame, which is tied with Wayne Hardin for most in school history.
- He has led Navy to a Top 25 ranking in the AP poll in three-straight years marking the first time since 1958-60 that Navy has been able to achieve that.
- In Navy's first two years as a member of the American Athletic Conference, he led the Mids to a share of the AAC West Division title (2015) and won the AAC West title outright in year two (2016).
- Niumatalolo is the first Samoan head football coach on the collegiate level and the second Polynesian head coach in FBS history (Larry Price, who was the head coach at Hawai'i from 1974-76, was the first).

## MIDS HAVE GONE UP AGAINST SOME PROLIFIC OFFENSES

- The Navy defense is ranked 64th nationally against the run (164.9), 62nd in passing yards allowed (221.7), 58th in total defense (386.6) and 75th in scoring defense (27.9 ppg).
- However, if you dig deeper into those numbers you will see that Navy has played some really potent offenses.
- The Mids have played four of the top-seven and six of the top-20 rushing offenses in the country and the Navy defense held all of them except Air Force below their average: Army (first, 355.8 yards per game, 221 vs. Navy), Air Force (fourth, 307.4 yards per game, 340 vs. Navy), FAU (sixth, 283.2, 40 vs. Navy) Notre Dame (seventh, 279.1, 163 vs. Navy), Tulsa (16th, 247.3, 229 vs. Navy) and Tulane (20th, 231.5, 191 vs. Navy) and still have to play the No. 1 rushing offense (Army, 368.1).
- Navy has faced two of the top eight and three of the top-16 passing offenses in the country and held all three below their average: UCF (7th, 339.3, 236 vs. Navy), Memphis (8th, 339.1, 279 vs. Navy) and SMU (16th, 308.0, 261 vs. Navy).
- Navy has faced two of the top five, four of the top 14 and five of the top-25 total offense leaders in the country and held all five below their average: Memphis (4th, 548.2, 397 vs. Navy), UCF (5th, 540.4 yards per game, 483 vs. Navy), SMU (13th, 493.8, 426 vs. Navy), FAU (14th, 491.9, 326.0 vs. Navy) and Notre Dame (25th, 454.9, 327 vs. Navy).
- Navy has faced the top two scoring offenses in the country, four of the top-9 and five of the top-21 scoring offenses in the country and held four below their average and one to their average: UCF (1st, 49.4 points per game, 31 vs. Navy), Memphis (2nd, 47.7, 30 vs. Navy), SMU (8th, 40.2, 40 vs. Navy), FAU (9th, 39.8, 19 vs. Navy), and Notre Dame (21st, 35.3, 17 vs. Navy).

## IN SUPPORT OF JARREN JASPER

- Navy football players are wearing a sticker on the back of their helmets with the initials JJ inside of a heart in support of Navy offensive coordinator **Ivin Jasper's** son, Jarren.
- Jarren Jasper, who is 14 years old, went for a routine physical on June 27 in advance of trying out for football at Broadneck High, where he would be a freshman this fall. The physician who performed the physical did not like the sound of the youngster's heart rhythm and referred the family to a pediatric cardiologist.
- Jarren underwent an echocardiogram and the cardiologist was concerned about the results, subsequently ordering a stress test and 24-hour Holter monitor. That is when it was discovered that Jarren had a condition known as Accelerated Idioventricular Rhythm. Ivin and his wife Donna took their son to see an electrophysiologist since the condition involves the electrical function of the heart.
- Jarren was admitted to Children's National Medical Center in D.C., where he was diagnosed with Ventricular Tachycardia — an abnormally fast heart rhythm arising from improper electrical activity in the upper portion of the heart. On Aug. 4, Jarren underwent a procedure called Catheter Ablation, which is designed to selectively destroy areas of the heart that are causing a heart rhythm problem. Thin, flexible wires with electrodes at the tips were inserted into the heart. Each electrode sends out radiowaves that create heat and destroys the bad heart tissue. Unfortunately, Jarren's heart swelled too much and completely closed off his coronary artery, which basically sent him into cardiac arrest. Jarren was placed on an Extracorporeal Membrane Oxygenation (ECMO) machine, which performs the heart function of pumping blood to all the vital organs.
- Jarren then received a stent to open his coronary artery and doctors were hopeful the heart would heal on its own and resume normal functioning. On Monday Aug. 14, Ivin and Donna were informed that things were not progressing positively and a heart assistance device would be necessary until a transplant can be performed.
- Jarren currently has the heart assistance device and was able to leave the hospital and return home on Thursday, Oct. 5. He has attended the last three home games.



## IN HONOR OF NAVY'S 34 SENIORS

- Navy's 34 seniors have compiled a record of 34-18 (.654), won a Commander-In-Chief's Trophy (2015), shared an American Athletic Conference West Division title (2015) and won the AAC West outright (2016). The seniors are 2-1 in bowl games with wins over San Diego State and Pitt and a loss to Louisiana Tech.
- On Nov. 16, the seniors received their service assignments. Graduates of the Naval Academy serve a minimum of five years in the Navy or Marine Corps, while pilots serve eight years upon earning their wings.
- Fifteen seniors will be commissioned 2nd Lieutenants in the United States Marine Corps (14 Marine Ground, 1 Marine Air), while 19 will be Ensigns in the United States Navy (11 Surface Warfare, 3 Submarines, 3 Supply Corps, 2 Pilot).

NOT MANY POINTS

- Navy has scored just 44 points over the last three games (17 vs. Notre Dame, 14 vs. Houston, 13 vs. Army) which is the fewest in a three-game span since 2006 when the Mids scored just 38 against Air Force (24), Rutgers (0) and Notre Dame (14).
- The 13 points against Army were Navy's fewest against the Black Knights since 1995 when it lost by the same 14-13 score.

NAVY AMONG NATION'S MOST SUCCESSFUL PROGRAMS IN THE COUNTRY

- The Mids own a 126-67 (.653) record from 2003-present after posting a 3-30 (.091) mark from 2000-02. The 126 wins are tied for the 21st most in the FBS over the last 15 years. The Mids are just one behind Louisville for 20th.
- Navy is 83-48 (.634) over the last 10 years under the direction of head coach Ken Niumatalolo. The 83 wins are tied with Auburn for the 24th most in the country over the last 10 years. The Mids trail BYU by just one for 23rd.
- Navy is 43-22 (.662) over the last five years. The 43 wins are tied for the 23rd most over the last five years and the Mids are just one win out of 20th on the list.

- Navy senior linebackers **Micah Thomas** and **Winn Howard** have been selected for leadership positions within the Brigade of Midshipmen for the spring semester. Thomas was selected as the Second Regiment Commander, which is the second-highest position you can receive next to Brigade Commander (there are two regimental commanders), while Howard will serve as the Third Battalion Commander (there are six battalion commanders).
- Thomas is a three-year starter for the Mids and led Navy in tackles this fall with 81. He has recorded four tackles for a loss and his three interceptions led the team. Howard played in all 12 games this year and started two games. He recorded 21 tackles and picked off a pass in Navy's win over SMU.

- The rigors a student-athlete faces at a Service Academy are unlike those a typical student-athlete might encounter on a day-to-day basis. Whether it's the added military training, mandatory room or uniform inspections or the academic schedule, Service Academy student-athletes are in a league of their own.

## BONNER AND PALMORE NAMED TEAM CAPTAINS

- Rising seniors slot back **Darryl Bonner** (Fayetteville, N.C.) and outside linebacker **D.J. Palmore** (Bartlett, Tenn.) have been elected team captains for the 2017 football season by their teammates.
- "Being elected team captain at the Naval Academy is one of the highest honors you can receive at an institution that prides itself on producing great leaders," said head coach Ken Niumatalolo. "Darryl and D.J. are not only outstanding football players, but they are great leaders in the locker room and in Bancroft Hall and I have no doubt that they will be great captains for us."
- Bonner, who entered his junior campaign with two career yards of total offense (rushing), turned into "Big Play" Darryl in 2016. He rushed for 229 yards and two touchdowns on 30 carries (7.6 yds / carry), catching 10 passes for 278 yards (27.8 yds / catch) and three touchdowns and returning two kickoffs for 71 yards (35.5 yds / return). He averaged 14.0 yards every time he touched the ball.
- Palmore has started 25 career games for the Mids at outside linebacker, including 12 starts last fall. He was Navy's fourth-leading tackler a year ago with 56 stops, while leading the team in sacks (six) and tackles for a loss (11.5). In his career, Palmore has recorded 99 tackles, 16.5 tackles for a loss and eight sacks.

## MALCOLM IN THE MIDDLE

- Sophomore **Malcolm Perry**, who has played both slot back and quarterback this year, rushed for more than 100 yards in three consecutive games as a slot back (Cincinnati, Tulsa and Air Force) before being "held" to 68 yards on nine carries (7.6 yds/carry) against Memphis.
- He is the first Navy slot back to have three consecutive 100-yard rushing days since Shun White in 2008. No slot back has ever had four straight 100-yard rushing games. White's four total (not consecutive) 100-yard rushing games in 2008 is the record for a slot back. Perry is the only other slot back to have three 100-yard rushing games in a season.
- Perry rushed for 100 yards and a touchdown on 10 carries against Cincinnati and a then career-best 104 yards and a touchdown on 10 carries against Tulsa.
- He had an incredible day against Air Force rushing for 127 yards and a touchdown on four carries, while catching two passes for 45 yards and a touchdown. His 91-yard touchdown run against the Falcons was at that time tied for the second-longest run in school history and the longest run in stadium history.
- Against UCF, Perry caught a 75-yard touchdown pass from **Zach Abey** and had a long touchdown run called back because of holding.
- Against Temple, Perry caught four passes for 94 yards and carried the ball five times for 23 yards. He also threw a five yard touchdown pass to Abey.
- Perry took over the starting quarterback job against SMU and rushed for an AAC-record 282 yards and four touchdowns on 33 carries to lead Navy to a 43-40 win. The 282 rushing yards are the fourth most in the country this year and the second most by a quarterback. It is also the fifth most in FBS history by a quarterback. His 92-yard touchdown run now stands at the longest run in Navy-Marine Corps Memorial Stadium history and the second-longest run in program history. He was named the FBS Walter Camp National Offensive Player of the Week for his performance.
- There have been only five runs of 90 yards or more in the history of Navy football and Perry has two of them - both this season.
- After missing the Notre Dame game with an injury, Perry moved back to slot back against Houston due to injuries at that position and rushed for 82 yards and a touchdown on 15 carries, while catching two passes for 34 yards.
- Against Army, Perry was back as the starter at quarterback and rushed for 250 yards and a touchdown on 30 carries.
- Perry is one of just five Navy players in school history to have two 200-yard rushing games in a single season, joining **Zach Abey** (2017), Keenan Reynolds (2013 and 2014), Chris McCoy (1996 and 1997) and Napoleon McCallum (1983).
- Perry's 250 rushing yards against Army were the second most in series history. Eddie Meyers rushed for 278 against Army in 1979.
- Perry's 250 rushing yards against Army were the 14th most in the country this year and the fourth most by a quarterback. He's the only quarterback in the country with two games of 250 yards or more rushing this year and he did it in two starts.
- He is the only player in the FBS this year to have two runs of 70 or more yards and one reception of 70 or more yards and is one of only two players (Denard Robinson of Michigan) in FBS history to have rushed for 100 or more yards in a game as both a running back and quarterback in the same season. His four offensive touchdowns of 65 yards or more this year are tied for the most in the country.
- He is just the third player in FBS history to have two runs of 90 yards or more in the same season.
- On the year, Perry has 122 carries for 1,068 yards (8.8 yds/carry) and nine touchdowns, has caught 13 passes for 303 yards (23.3 yds/catch) and two touchdowns and returned 13 kickoffs for 318 yards (24.5 yards per return). He is also 1-2 passing for five yards and a touchdown. In 148 touches this year, Perry has 1,689 yards (11.4 yds/touch) and 11 touchdowns. His 8.8 yards per carry is a school record and ranks third nationally, while his 153.55 all-purpose yards is the sixth-best average in the country.

- Navy head coach Ken Niumatalolo is the only FBS head coach that has two sons playing FBS football.
- Va'a is a senior linebacker at BYU, while Ali'i is a freshman linebacker at Utah. Utah beat BYU, 19-13, on Sept. 9.
- On Sept. 16, thanks to Navy's bye week and some fortuitous scheduling, Niumatalolo got to watch both sons play in person as BYU hosted Wisconsin in the afternoon and Utah hosted San Jose State at night. Both Va'a and Ali'i saw action on special teams.

NIUMATALOLO SPELLS SUCCESS

- Navy head football coach Ken Niumatalolo has been on the Mids sideline as either an assistant or head coach for 20 of the last 23 years (1995-98 and 2002-2007 as an assistant, head coach since 2008).
- Over those 20 years, Navy has compiled a 150-98 record (.605), won 10 Commander-In-Chief's Trophies, gone to 15 bowl games and won six bowl games, and either shared or won the AAC West in Navy's first two years in the league. Navy is 27-13 in Service Academy games with Niumatalolo on the coaching staff (.675) and has won 25 of the last 31 Service Academy games (.806).
- In the 117 seasons without Niumatalolo, Navy has posted a 555-460-57 (.549) record, won five Commander-In-Chief's Trophies (in 26 yrs), gone to eight bowl games and won three bowl games. Navy is 54-64-7 (.460) in Service Academy games without Niumatalolo.

ABEY PUTTING UP HUGE NUMBERS

- Junior quarterback **Zach Abey** rushed for 235 yards and two touchdowns on 32 carries, while throwing for 110 yards and a touchdown to lead Navy to a 42-19 victory over Florida Atlantic in the season opener. He was named AAC Co-Offensive Player of the Week and a Manning Award Star of the Week for his efforts.
- Abey is the second Navy quarterback in school history to rush for over 200 yards and throw for over 100 yards in a single game against an FBS opponent and third overall. Brian Madden rushed for 201 yards and threw for 113 yards in a 42-28 loss against Tulane in 2001. Brian Broadwater did it in 1998 against FCS Colgate, rushing for 216 yards and passing for 165 yards in a 42-35 win.
- Abey's 235 yards rushing were the most by a Navy player since Keenan Reynolds rushed for 277 yards against Georgia Southern on Nov 15, 2014. It's the sixth-most yards by a QB in 2017 and is the 21st most by any player this year.
- Abey's 235 yards rushing broke the record for the most rushing yards by a quarterback in American Athletic Conference history (later broke by teammate Malcolm Merry). The previous record was 210 yards set by USF's Quinton Flowers last year against Memphis. It is also tied as the 20th most rushing yards by a quarterback in NCAA history.
- Abey's 345 yards of total offense was the best by a Navy player since Oct. 28, 2016, when Will Worth set a school record with 428 yards of total offense against USF.
- Abey rushed for 108 yards and threw for 132 yards and a touchdown against Tulane and ran for 128 yards and threw for 53 against Cincinnati.
- Abey's 79-yard touchdown pass to **Tyler Carmona** against Tulane was the longest TD pass by a Navy player since Ricky Dobbs threw an 85-yard touchdown pass to Greg Jones against Arkansas State in 2010.
- Abey earned AAC Co-Offensive Player of the Week for

the second time this season after rushing for 185 yards and three touchdowns on a career-high 36 carries, while completing three of his four passes for 90 yards at Tulsa. He is the first Navy player to run for three touchdowns since Will Worth did it against SMU last year.

- Abey had his best game yet against Air Force, rushing for 214 yards and two touchdowns, while throwing for 86 yards and two TDs, including a 16-yard touchdown pass to Tyler Carmona with 15 seconds remaining that gave Navy a 48-45 win. Abey marched Navy 75 yards in 11 plays and took just 1:38 to do it and the Mids never needed to take a timeout (had two available).
- Against Memphis, Abey rushed for 146 yards and three touchdowns on 37 carries, but completed just one of his seven passes for 20 yards while throwing two interceptions and losing three fumbles.
- Abey was having a solid game against UCF before leaving in the third quarter with an injury. He rushed for 126 yards and a touchdown on 25 carries, while completing two of his four passes for 115 yards with one touchdown and one interception.
- Against Temple, Abey had a good day throwing the ball completing six of his nine passes for 111 yards with one interception, but was held to just 60 yards on the ground on 25 carries.
- Abey sat out the win over SMU with an injury.
- Abey came off the bench at Notre Dame and had a solid day rushing for 87 yards and a touchdown on 29 carries while completing three of his six pass attempts for 41 yards and a touchdown.
- Abey was back in a starting role against Houston and carried the ball 16 times for 33 yards and completed two of his four pass attempts for 45 yards.
- Abey rushed for 100 yards or more in a school-record eight straight games dating back to last year (114 vs. LA Tech in the bowl game last year, 235 vs. Florida Atlantic, 108 vs. Tulane, 128 vs. Cincinnati, 185 vs. Tulsa, 214 vs. Air Force, 146 vs. Memphis and 126 vs. UCF). That streak ended in the Temple game.
- Abey has had nine games total of more than 100 yards rushing, as he also ran for 111 yards off the bench against SMU in 2016.
- Abey's two 200-yard rushing games is tied with Malcolm Perry (twice), Keenan Reynolds (twice), Chris McCoy (twice) and Napoleon McCallum for the most in school history and is tied with Perry Eddie Meyers for fourth on the career list.
- Abey has rushed for at least one touchdown in 11 of the 16 games he's played in, including in seven of 10 this year. He also caught a touchdown pass from Malcolm Perry in the Temple game.
- Abey is averaging 120.5 yards per game on the ground, which is the 12th-best rushing average in the country and third-best among quarterbacks.
- Abey's 14 rushing touchdowns are tied for the 15th most in the country and tied for the fourth most among quarterbacks.
- Abey has rushed for 1,325 yards on the year which is the sixth most in a season in school history. He is two yards behind Napoleon McCallum (1985) for fifth, 21 yards behind Keenan Reynolds (2013) for fourth, 45 yards behind Chris McCoy (1997) for third and 48 yards behind Keenan Reynolds (2015) for second. Abey is 262 yards behind Napoleon McCallum (1983) for first. McCallum is not only the all-time leading rusher in Navy history, he's the all-time leading rusher in Service Academy history.
- Abey's 285 rushing attempts this year ranks as the fifth most in school history.

## TWO OVER 1,000 YARDS

- For just the third time in program history, Navy has a pair of 1,000 yard rushers in a single season.
- Kyle Eckel (1,249) and Craig Candeto (1,112) did it in 2003
- Keenan Reynolds (1,373) and Chris Swain (1,023) accomplished the feat in 2015.
- Zach Abey** (1,325) and **Malcolm Perry** (1,068) did it in 2017.

## MIDS CONSISTENTLY AMONG NATION'S TOP RUSHING TEAMS

- Over the last 14 years, Navy has consistently been one of the top rushing teams in the country, never finishing lower than sixth.
- The Mids kicked off the trend in 2002 when they finished third in the country in rushing, averaging 270.8 yds/gm.
- In 2003, Navy led the nation averaging a then school-record 323.2 yds/gm.
- In 2005, Navy led the country in rushing for the second time in three years, averaging 318.7 yds/gm.
- Navy finished the 2006 campaign averaging a nation's-best and then school-record 327.0 yds/gm.
- The Mids rushed for a school-record 348.8 yds/gm in 2007, becoming the first team in NCAA history to lead the nation in rushing three-consecutive years.
- In 2008, Navy led the country in rushing for an unprecedented fourth straight year, averaging 292.4 yds/gm.
- The Mids finished No. 2 in the country in 2013, averaging 325.4 yards per game.
- Navy finished No. 2 in the country in 2014, rushing for 338.1 yards per game. It was the Mids' best rushing effort since 2007 when they set the school record.
- In 2015, Navy finished No. 2 in the country, averaging 326.7 yards per game. Georgia Southern, coached by current Tulane coach Willie Fritz, led the country in 2015 averaging a whopping 363.0 yards per game.
- The Mids finished 2016 ranked No. 4, rushing for 310.9 yards per game.
- Navy is No. 2 in the country in rushing yards per game this season, averaging 343.0 yards per game. That is the best mark since the 2007 team set a school record by averaging 348.8 yards per game.

## THE RED ZONE

- Navy has scored 37 times in 44 trips to the red zone this year (.841) with just 29 of those trips resulting in a touchdown (.659). The Mids have missed three field goals, had a field goal blocked, thrown an interception, stopped on downs and taken a knee to end the game. Navy ranks 69th in red zone offense.
- The defense has allowed the opposition to score on 40 of 45 trips to the red zone (.888), with 30 resulting in touchdowns (.667). The Mids rank 108th in the country in red zone defense.
- The .659 touchdown percentage for the offense is major a dropoff from the previous four years when the Mids scored a touchdown 75% of the time when reaching the red zone.

## SCORE FIRST; LEAD ENTERING THE FOURTH

- The Mids are 54-9 (.857) under Niumatalolo when scoring first and 29-39 (.426) when the opposition scores first. Navy is 5-1 this year when scoring first and 1-5 when the opposition scores first.
- Navy is a remarkable 69-5 (.932) under Niumatalolo when entering the fourth quarter with the lead, including 6-1 (.857) this year.

## WINNING THE QUARTER

- Navy has outscored the opposition in only the second quarter this year.
- The Mids are a -13 in the first quarter (64-77), +62 in the second quarter (125-63), -4 in the third quarter (89-93) and -33 in the fourth quarter (69-102). All told, the Mids are outscoring the opposition 347-335.

## 30 POINTS IS THE KEY

- Under Niumatalolo, the Mids are 56-13 (.812) when scoring 30 or more points in a game and 71-17 (.807) when holding the opposition to under 30 points.
- This year, Navy is 6-0 when scoring 30 or more points and 0-6 when scoring less than 30 points.

## CONTROL THE FOOTBALL

- Navy has an average time of possession of 36:29 per game this season, which is the best mark in the country.

## KEEP AWAY

- The Navy offense kept the ball for 42:42 against Notre Dame and gave the Irish just seven possessions (not counting a kneel down). The 42:42 time of possession is the best in the Niumatalolo era.
- Thanks to Navy's ball control, Notre Dame gained just 327 yards against Navy, which is the fewest the Irish have gained against the Mids since Nov. 3, 2007, when Navy held Notre Dame to 327 yards in a triple OT win.
- Notre Dame's 24 points were the fewest it has scored against Navy in a win since a 21-17 win on Nov. 1, 1997.

## SLOW STARTS

- The offense has gotten off to a slow start in the first half in each of Navy's losses this year.
- The Mids have scored just six touchdowns and a total of 57 points in the first half of games against Memphis (touchdown, field goal, tied at 10), UCF (touchdown, down 14-7), Temple (two field goals, down 17-6), Notre Dame (touchdown, field goal, tied at 10), Houston (two touchdowns, up 14-7) and Army (field goal, touchdown, up 10-7)

## SECOND HALF STRUGGLES

- Navy has been outscored in the second half this year, 195-158.
- Over the last eight games (Air Force, Memphis, UCF, Temple, SMU, Notre Dame, Houston and Army), the Mids have been outscored 156-90 in the second half.
- Over the last four games (SMU, Notre Dame, Houston and Army), the Mids have been outscored 67-19 in the second half.

## MIDS IN A RUSH

- Navy rushed for 569 yards on 72 carries in its 42-32 victory over Cincinnati. The 569 yards are the second most in school history, the most in American Athletic Conference history and the most in Navy-Marine Corps Memorial Stadium history.
- The school record is 572 yards set against North Texas in 2007. The Mids actually had 573 yards against Cincinnati before taking a knee twice at the end of the game, losing two yards both times.
- The 569 rushing yards are also the most allowed by Cincinnati in its school history.
- Navy's slot backs had an incredible day carrying the football and blocking on the perimeter against the Bearcats. The slots combined to rush for 333 yards and three touchdowns on 28 carries.
- The Mids piled up 662 yards of total offense against Cincinnati, which is the 11th most in school history and the most under Niumatalolo.

## CONSECUTIVE 400-YARD RUSHING GAMES

- Navy is one of just four teams since 2000 to string together three consecutive 400-yard rushing games. The Mids rushed for 569 yards against Cincinnati, 421 at Tulsa and 471 against Air Force.
- In addition to this year's Navy team, Georgia Southern did it in 2015, Oregon in 2012 and Nevada in 2009.

## TWO QUARTERBACKS OVER 100 YARDS PASSING

- Navy threw for a season-high 226 yards (13 for 19, three touchdowns and one interception) against Temple.
- The 226 yards passing were the most by Navy since last year's USF game when Will Worth threw for 299 yards.
- The Temple game provided another oddity, however, as the Mids had two different quarterbacks throw for more than 100 yards in the game. **Zach Abey** completed six of his nine pass attempts for 111 yards with one interception, while **Garret Lewis** came off the bench to complete six of nine passes for 110 yards and two touchdowns. Slot back **Malcolm Perry** accounted for the third touchdown pass when he tossed a five-yard TD pass to Abey.

## CARMONA MAKING PLAYS IN THE PASSING GAME

- As a sophomore and junior, wide receiver **Tyler Carmona** was known mainly for the devastating blocks he laid on the defense to help spring Navy's running game.
- Coming into his senior year, Carmona had nine catches for 192 yards (21.3 yards per catch) and three touchdowns.
- This year, Carmona has been Navy's big-play receiver, catching 14 passes for 381 yards (27.2 yds per catch) and four touchdowns.
- Carmona caught a then career-long 56-yard pass from **Zach Abey** against Florida Atlantic and a career-long 79-yard TD pass from Abey against Tulane. Against Cincinnati, Carmona caught a 19-yard touchdown pass from Abey. Against Air Force, Carmona's only catch of the game was a 16-yard scoring strike from Abey with 15 seconds remaining to give Navy the 48-45 win. He had three catches for 66 yards against UCF and four catches for 63 yards and a touchdown against Temple. Against Houston, Carmona had one catch for 40 yards.
- For his career, Carmona has 23 catches for 573 yards (24.9 yds/catch) and seven touchdowns.

## HOME FIELD ADVANTAGE

- The Mids are 43-11 (.796) at home under Niumatalolo, including a 28-5 (.848) mark over the last five seasons.

OFFENSIVE FIREWORKS

- The 93 combined points in the Navy-Air Force game was a series record. Navy's 48 points were the most points it has ever scored against Air Force.
- Navy's 471 rushing yards against Air Force were the most in the 50-year history of the series by either team. Navy's 557 yards of total offense were the most by a Navy team in series history.
- Navy had two players (Zach Abey-214, Malcolm Perry-127) rush for more than 100 yards against Air Force for the fourth time in the series. Eddie Meyers (179) and Marco Pagnanelli (106) did it in 1981, Adam Ballard (134) and Brian Hampton (105) did it in 2006 and Alex Teich (148) and Kriss Proctor (134) did it in 2011.

DISCIPLINED FOOTBALL

- Since 2008 when Ken Niumatalolo became the head coach, Navy has never finished lower than second in penalties per game or penalty yards per game.
- Navy has had zero penalties in a game 12 times since 2002 including once so far this year against Tulane.
- This year has been a different story for the Mids. Navy is tied for 9th in the country in fewest penalties per game (4.17) and 25th in fewest penalty yards per game (41.92).

KEEP THE BALL, WIN THE GAME

- Navy is 28-3 (.903) over the last six years when winning the turnover battle and 23-24 (.489) when breaking even or losing the turnover battle.
- The Mids are 5-5 this year when breaking even or losing the turnover battle and 1-1 when winning the turnover battle.

CAUSING TURNOVERS

- Navy has forced at least one turnover in 39 of the last 46 games. The Mids did not create a turnover against Tulane, Tulsa or Army this year.
- During that 46-game span, the Mids have forced 70 turnovers (34 interceptions and 36 fumble recoveries).

NEVER GIVE IN

- The Navy defense has allowed just 14 touchdowns on the last 55 turnovers (.255) by the Navy offense dating back to the 2014 season (does not count offensive turnovers returned for touchdowns or turnovers at the end of the game)

NAVY DEFENSE PLAYS TOUGH AGAINST UCF

- The Navy defense held UCF, which entered the game leading the country in scoring at 50.6 points per game, to just 31 points in the Mids' 31-21 loss.
- The 31 points are tied for the fewest points UCF has scored in a game all year. SMU also held the Knights to 31 points.

TOO MANY TURNOVERS

- Navy turned it over five times in its 30-27 loss at Memphis on Oct. 14. It was the most turnovers by a Navy team since 2002 when Navy turned it over six times against Boston College in 2002.
- Navy turned it over three more times in its 10-point loss to No. 20 UCF (a fumble and two interceptions) and threw an interception against Temple, giving the Mids nine turnovers and just three takeaways during their three-game losing streak
- The Mids have turned it over 19 times in 12 games this year (11 times in the 6 losses, 8 times in the 6 wins) after turning it over just 16 times in 14 games last year.
- Navy has lost nine fumbles in its 12 games after losing just nine fumbles in 14 games last year.

PALMORE COMING UP WITH THE BALL

- Senior outside linebacker **D.J. Palmore** has been Navy's top playmaker this year leading the Mids in tackles for a loss (12.5) and fumble recoveries (3) and is second in sacks (2.5). Palmore is also third on the team in tackles with 73.
- With three fumble recoveries, Palmore is tied for fourth in the country with 19 other players.
- William Harris of Boston College, Brody Hoying of Eastern Michigan and Brian Keyes of UNLV lead the nation with four.

KICKOFF TEAM DOING ITS JOB

- The Navy kickoff team is giving up just 17.19 yards per return which makes them the ninth-best kickoff return unit in the country.

OSBORN'S FIRST CAREER KICK ONE TO REMEMBER

- Making just his second career appearance and first as a placekicker, sophomore **J.R. Osborn** hit an 18-yard field goal as time expired to give Navy a 43-40 victory over SMU and make the Mids bowl eligible for the 14th time in the last 15 years.
- Osborn is Navy's third-string kicker, but the Mids were without starter **Bennett Moehring** (injury) and punter/kicker **Owen White** (cramps), so Osborn was sent in to attempt the game-winning field goal and delivered.

OT BABY

- Navy owns a 7-4 record all-time in overtime games with each of the four losses coming on a missed or blocked kick: Tulsa (blocked extra-point), Ball State (blocked field goal), Air Force (blocked extra-point), Toledo (missed field goal).
- The Toledo game was the first time Navy lost a multiple overtime contest.

ANDREW WOOD NAMED ACADEMIC ALL-DISTRICT

- Navy junior offensive tackle **Andrew Wood** was named to the CoSIDA (College Sports Information Directors of America Academic All-District Team. This is the second year in a row Wood has been named to the all-district team.
- Wood, who carries a 3.55 grade-point average in operations research, has started 24 consecutive games for the Mids.

HEISMAN WINNER, NAISMITH WINNER, PRESIDENT OF THE UNITED STATES

- Navy is one of just two schools to produce a President of the United States (Jimmy Carter), a Hesiman Trophy winner (Joe Bellino and Roger Staubach) and a Naismith Award winner (David Robinson).
- The other school to match that feat is Michigan, who produced President Gerald Ford, Heisman winners Tom Harmon, Desmond Howard and Charles Woodson and Naismith Award winner Trey Burke.

CONTINUITY IS THE KEY TO SUCCESS

- Navy has lost just six coaches under head coach Ken Niumatalolo (3 changed jobs, 3 retired). Eight of Navy's coaches (7 assistants and Niumatalolo) have been in Annapolis for at least 10 years, giving Navy, along with Northwestern, the most coaches in the country that have been at the same school for 10 years or more.
- Defensive coordinator Dale Pehrson is in his 22nd year at Navy, which is tied for the fifth-longest tenured assistant in the FBS. Niumatalolo is in his 20th year at Navy and his 10th as the head coach, offensive coordinator and quarterbacks coach Ivin Jasper is in his 18th year, slot backs coach and special teams coordinator Danny O'Rourke is in his 16th year, outside linebackers coach Justin Davis is in his 11th year, while Ashley Ingram (OL/running game coordinator), Steve Johns (LB) and Mike Judge (FB) are in their 10th year at Navy.

## NAVY WINS AGAINST RANKED OPPONENTS

- Navy's 46-40 win over No. 6/5 Houston last year marked the second straight year it has knocked off a nationally-ranked opponent after the Mids dealt No. 15/16 Memphis a 45-20 loss in 2015.
- Navy's win over Houston marked the first time the Mids had defeated an AP top 10 team since Nov. 17, 1984, when it shocked No. 2 South Carolina, 38-21.
- Navy's 2015 win over Memphis, meanwhile, was its first road win over an AP top 10 team since Sept. 21, 1974, when it knocked off No. 8 Penn State, 7-6
- Navy has not beaten more than one ranked team in a season since 1957, when it defeated No. 5 Notre Dame (20-6), No. 10 Army (27-20) and No. 8 Rice (20-7) in the Cotton Bowl.
- Navy has not beaten a ranked opponent in three straight years since 1941-45 when the Mids did it five consecutive years.

## NAVY TO WEAR UNDER ARMOUR BLUE ANGELS UNIFORMS FOR ARMY-NAVY GAME AND MILITARY BOWL

- The Navy football team will wear Under Armour Blue Angels uniforms for the 2017 Army-Navy Game presented by USAA on Dec. 9 at Lincoln Financial Field in Philadelphia and for the Dec. 28 Military Bowl vs. Virginia at Navy-Marine Corps Memorial Stadium.
- "Although the uniform departs from our customary characteristics, this tribute to the Blue Angels reflects the enthusiastic pride and appreciation we have for the Navy's premier flying team and the motivation they convey to Navy football and the fleet at large," said Naval Academy Director of Athletics Chet Gladchuk. "The masterminds at Under Armour are always thinking of ways to inspire our troops while still reflecting a deep appreciation for a Naval history that is so ingrained in our game day traditions. Annually, a special Navy uniform has become a statement in this game and brings with it appreciated meaning and a clear message that we are all in."
- "Our partnership with the United States Naval Academy has afforded us the opportunity to tell some incredible stories through our specialty uniform designs and we hope, in some way, that the special moments we create on behalf of the Academy manifest the gratitude we

feel. From the "Summer White" design to the "Don't Tread on Me" uniforms, each opportunity leads down a path of research and information that drives us towards another special moment or achievement to celebrate," said Adam Clement, Under Armour's Senior Creative Director of Team Sports. "This year we partnered with the Naval Academy to use the Army-Navy Game to honor the incredible pilots that make up the Blue Angels. Anyone who has had the privilege of watching the Blue Angels perform knows there is no show quite like it. It inspires and excites all who stand witness and we couldn't think of a better way to pay homage to their great feats than creating a uniform that pays tribute to them."

- The annual Army-Navy Game is steeped in tradition and has been a source of competition and camaraderie since 1890. To commemorate this year's matchup, and one of the most enduring rivalries in college football, Under Armour created specialty Navy football uniforms inspired by the Blue Angels.
- Featuring hand-painted helmets depicting a Delta Formation, and a chrome facemask to mimic the visor of the Blue Angel pilots, the Under Armour design team incorporated design elements that pay tribute to the skill, precision, and rich history of the Blue Angels squadron.

### Additional design details include:

- U.S. flag on left sleeve matches the flight suits the squadron wear in the cockpit.
- The number font is inspired by the numbers on the tail of the F/A-18 Hornet aircraft.
- Blue Angel insignia on the right sleeve; this is the same design on the F/A-18 Hornet aircraft.
- The color of the uniforms are an exact match to the Blue Angels flight suit.
- Stripe dimensions on the pants are an exact match to the flight suit.

## NAVY SPORTS INFORMATION OFFICE HONORED BY FOOTBALL WRITERS ASSOCIATION OF AMERICA

- Navy was one of 11 schools whose sports information staff was honored in 2016 by the Football Writers Association of America.
- Five previous winners and six first-time winners comprised the Eighth Annual Super 11 Awards, which the Football Writers Association of America gives out annually to the best performing sports information departments in the Football Bowl Subdivision.
- USC claimed its seventh Super 11 award, including third straight, while Nebraska won for the fifth time overall and fourth time in five seasons. Clemson and Colorado each won for a fourth time. It was Clemson's second straight award and Colorado's third award in four seasons.
- Navy was the other past winner, having claimed a spot back in 2010.
- The first-time winners included Air Force, Arkansas State, Miami (Ohio), Oklahoma State, Tennessee and UTEP in the awards selection that dates back to the 2009 season.
- Criteria employed in determining the winners not only included how press boxes and media operations were operated, but also the quality and timeliness of information provided. Also judged was the amount of information presented and appropriately updated on websites, and personal responsiveness to media inquiries as well as the accessibility of a program's players, coaches and assistant coaches. The ratings considered those departments that went the extra mile in servicing the media.
- In January 2009, the FWAA formed the first Super 11 Committee. The concept has been supported and endorsed by the College Sports Information Directors of America (CoSIDA), many of whom are members of the FWAA.
- The Football Writers Association of America consists of more than 1,300 men and women who cover college football for a living. The membership includes journalists, broadcasters and publicists, as well as key executives in all the areas that involve the game. The FWAA works to govern areas that include game day operations, major awards, a national poll and its annual All-America team.

## SIGNIFICANT STADIUM MOMENTS DURING THE NIUMATALOLO ERA

**Aug. 30, 2008** – Shun White rushed for a school-record 348 yards and three touchdowns on just 19 carries to lead Navy to a season-opening 41-13 victory over Towson.

**Nov. 1, 2008** – Clint Sovie's 42-yard fumble return for a touchdown with 37 seconds left in regulation capped a 20-point rally in the final 9:16 to send the game into overtime. Quarterback Ricky Dobbs' one-yard run in OT gave Navy a miraculous 33-27 victory over Temple.

**Oct. 3, 2009** – Navy shut down the nation's top rushing offense, while Joe Buckley drilled three field goals, including a 38-yarder in overtime, to lead Navy to a 16-13 victory over Air Force in front of a sellout crowd of 37,820.

**Oct. 20, 2012** – Navy scored 10 points in the final 5:30 to come from behind and shock Indiana, 31-30, on Homecoming. Keenan Reynolds hit Matt Aiken with a touchdown pass with 2:02 remaining to give Navy the lead and a Parrish Gaines interception clinched the Mids' first win over a BIG TEN opponent at home since 1926.

**Oct. 26, 2013** – One week after missing an extra-point against Toledo in the second overtime, Nick Sloan booted a 30-yard field goal against Pitt as time expired to give Navy a thrilling 24-21 come-from-behind victory.

**Nov. 15, 2014** – Keenan Reynolds rushed for a career-high 277 yards and a stadium-record six touchdowns to lead Navy to a 52-19 victory over Georgia Southern.

**Sept. 19, 2015** – Keenan Reynolds ran for five touchdowns and 142 yards as the Midshipmen dominated East Carolina in their American Athletic Conference debut, 45-21.

**Oct. 3, 2015** – Keenan Reynolds rushed for 183 yards to lead Navy to a 33-11 rout of Air Force. It was Navy's largest margin of victory in the series since 1978.

**Nov. 14, 2015** – Keenan Reynolds shattered the FBS career rushing touchdown record scoring four rushing touchdowns against SMU in Navy's 55-14 rout of SMU. The four rushing touchdowns gave Reynolds 81 in his career, surpassing Montee Ball's record of 77.

**Dec. 28, 2015** – Keenan Reynolds wrapped up his record-setting career by rushing for three scores and passing for another to lead Navy to a 44-28 win over Pitt in the Military Bowl. Reynolds' final touchdown clinched the win and gave him 88 total touchdowns for his career, breaking the tie with La. Tech's Kenneth Dixon for most touchdowns in FBS history. The win was the 11th on the year for Navy, setting a school record.

**Sept. 10, 2016** – Navy stopped UConn on the one yard line in the final seconds to hold off the Huskies, 28-24, to improve to 2-0 on the year. UConn had the ball on the one-yard line with 17 seconds left, but burned its final timeout before running the ball and being stuffed by the Navy defense.

**Oct. 8, 2016** – Will Worth ran for a touchdown and threw for two more, while Josiah Powell picked off a pass and returned it 34-yards for a touchdown to lead Navy to a 46-40 upset of #6 Houston. It was Navy's first win over a top 10 opponent since beat #2 South Carolina in 1984.

**Oct. 7, 2017** – Zach Abey fired a 16-yard touchdown pass to Tyler Carmona with 15 seconds remaining to give Navy a thrilling 48-45 victory over Air Force in front of a stadium-record crowd of 38,792. It was the highest scoring game in the history of the Navy-Air Force series.

**Nov. 11, 2017** – Malcolm Perry, making his first career start at quarterback, rushed for 282 yards and four touchdowns on 33 carries to lead Navy to a 43-40 victory over SMU and make the Mids bowl eligible for 14th time in the last 15 years. Perry had a stadium record 92-yard touchdown run in the game.

- Junior quarterback **Zach Abey** rushed for 235 yards and two touchdowns on 32 carries, while throwing for 110 yards and a touchdown to lead Navy to a 42-19 victory over Florida Atlantic in the season opener.
  - Abey is the third Navy quarterback in school history to rush for over 200 yards and throw for over 100 yards in a single game.
  - His 235 yards rushing were the most by a Navy player since Keenan Reynolds rushed for 277 yards against Georgia Southern on Nov 15, 2014.
  - His 235 yards rushing broke the record for the most rushing yards by a quarterback in American Athletic Conference history. The previous record was 210 yards set by USF's Quinton Flowers last year against Memphis.
  - His 235 yards rushing are the most by any player in the country this season.
  - Abey's 345 yards of total offense was the best by a Navy player since Oct. 28, 2016, when Will Worth set a school record with 428 yards of total offense against USF.
  - Abey has now scored a touchdown in five-consecutive games dating back to last year.
  - Abey has had back-to-back games of rushing for more than 100 yards and passing for more than 100 yards. He rushed for 114 yards and threw for 159 yards against Louisiana Tech in the Armed Forces Bowl.
  - The Navy defense held Florida Atlantic to just 40 yards on the ground on 24 carries.
  - The 40 rushing yards were the fewest Navy has allowed since Oct. 10, 2009, when Navy held Rice to just 21 yards on the ground.
  - Navy produced 526 yards of total offense against Florida Atlantic, with 416 of it coming on the ground.
  - The 526 yards of total offense is the 45th most in school history, while the 416 rushing yards ranks as the 42nd most in school history.
  - Senior wide receiver **Tyler Carmona** caught a career-long 56-yard pass from **Zach Abey** in the second quarter. His previous long was 47 yards against East Carolina.
  - Sophomore defensive back **Noruwa Obanor** recorded his first careeer interception in the fourth quarter.
  - Senior linebacker **Micah Thomas** picked off his first career pass in the fourth quarter.
  - Senior outside linebacker **Jerry Thompson** recorded his first career sack in the second quarter.
  - Senior fullback **Joshua Walker's** 48-yard touchdown run in the third quarter was a career long.
  - Junior slot back **Tre Walker's** four-yard touchdown run in the first quarter was the first of his career.

- Quarterback **Zach Abey** amassed 240 total yards with a touchdown, leading Navy past Tulane 23-21 in the American Athletic Conference opener.
- Abey was coming off a record-setting performance last week against Florida Atlantic when he ran for 235 yards -- the most ever for a quarterback in the AAC. He was the difference again with 108 yards on 29 carries. Abey also completed 4 of 12 passes for 132 yards, including a 79-yard touchdown throw to **Tyler Carmona**.
- Tulane quarterback Jonathan Banks, a junior college transfer, took a hard hit in the second quarter and did not return with an undisclosed injury. Sophomore Johnathan Brantley, however, provided a spark off the bench and scored his first career touchdown with a 3-yard run in the second quarter.
- The Green Wave cut the margin to 23-21 on a 1-yard dive by Dontrell Hilliard and a two-point conversion with 12:56 left in the game. Tulane, however, failed to convert a pair of key fourth downs late in the game to extend drives.
- A penalty for too many players on the field gave Navy a 4th and 1 from the Green Wave's 46 with 1:58 left. Abey converted the first down and the Midshipmen were able to run out the clock to seal the win.
- Brantley completed five of eight passes for 58 yards. He also ran for 73 yards on nine carries with the score.
- The game was a battle of two teams that have a similar offense.
- Midshipmen coach Ken Niumatalolo ran the triple-option as a quarterback at Hawaii and was later an assistant under coach Paul Johnson, who ran the same system. Tulane's Willie Fritz has used the zone option throughout his 24-year coaching career.
- On this day, Navy was more successful moving the ball, out-gaining the Green Wave 326 to 262.
- Tulane was looking to open the season with two straight wins for the first time since 2002.

- Quarterback **Zach Abey** ran for 128 of Navy's 569 rushing yards in a 42-32 victory over Cincinnati at Navy-Marine Corps Memorial Stadium.
- Navy (3-0, 2-0) amassed the second-most rushing yards in program history, just three yards shy of the record of 572 set in 2007 against North Texas.
- Bearcats quarterback Hayden Moore had a 3-yard touchdown pass to Tyler Cogswell on 4th down that pulled them to within 10 points with 6:06 left in the game. Cincinnati (2-2, 0-1) advanced to the Midshipmen's 11-yard line with just over two minutes remaining, but **Tyris Wooten** stripped the ball while sacking Moore and **D.J. Palmore** recovered it to seal the win.
- Abey ran for a pair of scores in the second half that helped keep Navy in control. He also had a 19-yard touchdown pass to **Tyler Carmona** in the first quarter.
- Navy sophomore **Malcolm Perry** had 100 yards on 10 carries and scored the game's first touchdown on a 23-yard run. Fellow slotback and senior **Josh Brown** also got his first career touchdown in the opening quarter with a 24-yard run, which was also his first carry of the season. Brown's second touchdown on the opening drive of the second half gave Navy a 28-17 lead.
- Moore was effective attacking Navy's secondary and went 28 for 46 for 381 yards with three touchdowns. His favorite target was Devin Gray, who caught six passes for 112 yards with a touchdown.
- It was the first game between the two schools since Oct. 20, 1956, when Navy beat Cincinnati, 13-7, in Annapolis.

- Malcolm Perry** gained 104 yards and a touchdown on 10 rushes, while also adding 53 yards on two receptions, and **Chris High** ran for 89 yards on 13 carries as Navy (4-0, 3-0 The American) continued to display a devastating ground game. The Midshipmen rolled up 511 yards of total offense, 421 rushing.

## 40: 2017 NAVY FOOTBALL GAME NOTES

### GM 5 NAVY 48, AIR FORCE 25 OCT. 7, 2017 • ANNAPOLIS, MD. • NMC MEMORIAL STADIUM • 38,792 (RECORD)

- **Zach Abey** threw a 16-yard touchdown pass to **Tyler Carmona** with 15 seconds left, and unbeaten Navy defeated Air Force, 48-45, at Navy-Marine Corps Memorial Stadium after blowing a 21-point lead in the second half.
- Despite allowing five touchdowns after halftime, Navy (5-0) took a huge step toward regaining possession of the Commander-In-Chief's Trophy, awarded annually to the team with the most wins in games between Army, Navy and Air Force.
- The winner of the Navy-Air Force matchup has captured the trophy every year since 1997. Air Force won it last season after beating Navy 28-14.
- In this one, after Arion Worthman threw a 51-yard touchdown pass to Marcus Bennett with 1:53 remaining to put the Falcons up 45-41, Abey took the Midshipmen 75 yards in 11 plays for the go-ahead score.
- That turned out to be the final salvo in a wild game in which Air Force (1-4) amassed 621 yards and Navy accumulated 557, including 471 on the ground.
- Abey ran for 214 yards and two touchdowns, and **Malcolm Perry** contributed two long scores.
- The Midshipmen converted a short punt and two Air Force fumbles into three touchdowns and a 28-10 halftime lead. After a 75-yard quarterback keeper by Abey made it 38-17 in the third quarter, Air Force rallied.
- But the Falcons still came away with their fourth straight loss.
- Worthman ran for 139 yards and two touchdowns, and he passed for 257 yards and two scores. But he fumbled twice, and both miscues led to Navy touchdowns.
- Perry got the Midshipmen started with a 91-yard run and added a 40-yard touchdown catch late in the second quarter. The sophomore finished with a career-high 127 yards rushing.
- Though Air Force leads the series between these two military academies 29-21, Navy has won 11 of the last 15.

- Memphis quarterback Riley Ferguson completed 24 of his 40 pass attempts for 279 yards and three touchdowns, including two touchdown strikes to Anthony Miller (10 catches for 90 yards). Miller's second touchdown catch with 13:17 remaining gave the Tigers a 30-19 lead.
- Riley Patterson kicked a 42-yard field goal with 11:08 lead to increase the Memphis lead to 11 and after Navy turned the ball over for the fourth time it looked like the game was over.
- The Navy defense, which hung tough against a potent Memphis offense all day, forced a turnover and the Mids moved 82 yards in 10 plays taking just 3:09 off the clock to cut the lead to three on a one-yard touchdown run by **Zach Abey** and a two-point conversion rush by **Darryl Bonner**.

- It was tied in the third quarter before Killins bolted down the right sideline for a 79-yard touchdown run to put the Knights ahead for good.
- With the victory, Central Florida (6-0, 4-0 American Athletic Conference) became bowl eligible, matched its win total of last year and improved to 6-0 for the first time in the 39-year history of the program.
- The Midshipmen (5-2, 3-2) kept it close, but their chances of pulling off an upset dwindled after quarterback **Zach Abey** was forced from the game in the third quarter. Abey was dazed from a hit to the helmet at the end of a run and had to be helped off the field.
- Abey, the key figure in Navy's triple option, carried 25 times for 126 yards and a touchdown - his school-record eighth straight 100-yard game. He also threw a touchdown pass.
- His backup, **Garret Lewis**, directed a 75-yard drive that got the Midshipmen to 24-21 with 12:50 left.
- Navy then intercepted a pass and moved inside the UCF 40 before Lewis sent a late pitch to **Darryl Bonner**, who fumbled when hit by cornerback Brandon Moore.
- Moore recovered the loose ball with just over seven minutes remaining, and UCF freshman Otis Anderson scored the clincher on a 10-yard run with 3:30 to go.
- The Knights came into the game averaging 50.6 points per game and with an average winning margin of 33.8 points. UCF didn't come close to matching either of those numbers, but it did end Navy's 17-game home winning streak during the regular season.

- Frank Natile threw for 289 yards and four touchdowns, and Temple's struggling offense awoke to beat Navy, 34-26, at Lincoln Financial Field on national television.
- Natile, making his second straight start in place of the injured Logan Marchi, completed 22 of 30 passes with one interception as Temple (4-5, 2-3 American Athletic Conference) snapped a two-game skid.
- Adonis Jennings had five catches for 127 yards, including touchdown catches of 34 and 40 yards. Keith Kirkwood and Jake Robinson also caught TDs for the Owls, who entered averaging just 20.9 points a game, 112th best in the FBS.
- Navy quarterback **Zach Abey**, who sustained a concussion in a loss to UCF on Oct. 21, rushed for 87 yards and caught a touchdown pass on trick play before leaving with another injury. The Midshipmen (5-3, 3-3) rushed for 136 yards, well below their nation-best average of 376.
- A trip to Lincoln Financial Field had always ended on a positive note for the Midshipmen, who entered 12-0 at the home of the Philadelphia Eagles - including a 10-0 mark against rival Army.
- But much like a year ago when Temple cruised to a 34-10 win in the AAC title game, Navy's defense faltered.
- Navy cornerback **Tyris Wooten** was suspended for violating team rules. **Noruwa Obanor** started in his place and the Owls picked on the Midshipmen's secondary.
- Jennings beat **Elijah Merchant** on his two scores and Robinson's first career catch came against Merchant. **Khaylan Williams** was beaten in the end zone on Kirkwood's 8-yard catch that made it 17-3 in the second quarter.
- Temple, playing a triple-option team for the second-straight game after losing in overtime at Army on Oct. 21, plugged running lanes with an eight-man front that left Navy frustrated.
- Abey left after taking a hit on his interception early in the fourth. **Garret Lewis** entered with Temple trailing 34-13 and threw touchdown passes to **Brandon Colon** and **Tyler Carmona**.

- Navy's **Malcolm Perry** ran for 282 yards with four touchdowns in his first start at quarterback and backup kicker **J.R. Osborn** hit an 18-yard game-winning field goal as time expired to give Navy a 43-40 victory over SMU.
- Perry was originally recruited as a quarterback, but converted to slot back in the spring. Starting quarterback **Zach Abey** was active after suffering a shoulder injury last week against Temple, but Perry got the nod to run the triple-option offense and that proved to be a wise decision for Navy (6-3, 4-3 American Athletic Conference).
- Perry had the third most rushing yards in school history before leaving late in the fourth quarter with an apparent leg injury.
- SMU quarterback Ben Hicks threw a 29-yard touchdown to Courtland Sutton and then completed another pass to Trey Quinn for a 2-point conversion that tied the game, 40-40, with 3:32 remaining to play.
- Garret Lewis** entered for the injured Perry and handed the ball to fullback **Anthony Gargiulo**, who managed 50 yards on two carries to the Mustangs' 9-yard line that eventually set up the game-winning kick.
- Gargiulo finished with a career-high 145 yards on 15 carries and had the game's first touchdown on a 4-yard run. The Midshipmen snapped a three-game losing streak and became bowl-eligible for the sixth consecutive season.
- The Mustangs (6-4, 3-3) struggled against the Midshipmen's running attack, allowing 559 yards.
- Perry gave Navy a 27-11 lead with a 92-yard touchdown scamper in the second quarter-the second longest run in school history.
- Trailing 34-11 at the half, SMU got back in the game on a 14-yard touchdown pass from Hicks to Sutton and a 3-yard touchdown run by Xavier Jones early in the third quarter. Jones finished with 106 yards on 18 carries.

- Ahmad Bradshaw pushed over the goal line on a quarterback sneak with 5:10 remaining and Blake Wilson kicked the extra point to put Army ahead.
- Quarterback **Malcolm Perry**, who ran for 250 yards and a 68-yard score in the second quarter, then led Navy to the Army 31 with 3 seconds left.
- Navy elected to try a field goal, and after about 10 players used their feet to clear the steady snow during a timeout, Moehring's kick was long enough but drifted barely left.
- Army cut its deficit in the series to 60-51-7 in a matchup of bowl-bound teams. The Black Knights claimed the Commander-in-Chief's Trophy thanks to an earlier victory over Air Force.
- In a game that included only three passes - Army completed its lone toss - the Black Knights produced a 13-play, 65-yard to take a late lead. John Trainor tiptoed the sideline for 8 yards one play before Bradshaw's 12th touchdown of the season.
- Navy took advantage of the ensuing kickoff going out of bounds and moved down the field. Perry dropped a shotgun snap on fourth down at the Army 37, but picked up the ball and ran for a first down. But Navy committed two false start penalties, making the final field goal attempt more difficult.
- Snow started falling in the late morning on the 29-degree day, leaving a coating on the field. Workers used blowers to uncover the lines and hashmarks during timeouts as a light snow fell throughout.
- The teams, both of whom run the triple-option, combined to complete only 58 passes all season. The snow made both coaches want to throw it even less.
- The first pass of the game came with under 9 minutes left in the second quarter. Army completed its only pass, a 20-yard wobbler from Bradshaw to Calen Holt, midway through the third quarter.
- The weather made one of sports' biggest rivalries an even more physical contest. Army's all-white uniforms - a nod to the 10th Mountain Division of World War II - served as almost camouflage in the snow.
- Perry was the star through three quarters. Getting the start at quarterback ahead of **Zach Abey**, his long touchdown run in the second quarter was his third rushing TD of more than 65 yards this season.
- Perry's shifty 46-yard run to the Navy 11 early in the third quarter put him over 1,000 yards for the season and led to Moehring's second field goal, from 24 yards, to make it 13-7.

Navy had two players rush for over 100 yards in three consecutive games for just the second time in school history (Zach Abey and Malcolm Perry vs. Cincinnati, Tulsa and Air Force) ... Navy also did it in 1996 vs. Rutgers (Tim Cannada 107, Chris McCoy 101), SMU (Chris McCoy 140, Omar Nelson 108) and Boston College (Chris McCoy 183, Omar Nelson 118) ... the line allowed Navy's starting quarterback Zach Abey to rush for 100 yards or more in a school-record eight straight contests dating back to 2016 - 114 vs. LA Tech, 235 at Florida Atlantic, 108 vs. Tulane, 128 vs. Cincinnati, 185 at Tulsa, 214 vs. Air Force, 146 at Memphis, 136 vs. UCF (broke the record) ... Abey is the only player in school history to rush for 100 or more yards in each of the season's first seven contests ... he is the first Navy player to rush for 150-plus yards in back-to-back games (185 vs. Tulsa, 214 vs. Air Force) since Adam Ballard in 2005 (167 vs. Temple and 192 vs. Army) ... Navy has had only five 90-plus yard touchdown runs in school history, Perry has two of the five - 92 vs. SMU and 91 vs. Air Force this season ... remarkably, he is one of just three players in FBS history to have two 90-yard runs in the same season (Chris Hardy of San Diego State in 1985 and Buddy Young of Illinois in 1944 ... Perry's 92-yard TD run set a Navy-Marine Corps Memorial Stadium record for longest rush ... the previous long was 91 yards set in 1997 by Pat McGrew against Kent State and tied earlier this year against Air Force by Perry ... it is also the second-longest run in program history behind John Sai's record-setting 93-yard run against Duke in 1963 ... Perry is also one of just three players in the country with four offensive touchdowns of 65 yards or more, joining Baylor's Chris Platt and Southern Miss' Ito Smith ... for the first time in program history, Navy was able to string together three straight games of 400-plus yards rushing - 569 vs. Cincinnati, 421 vs. Tulsa, 471 vs. Air Force ... Navy had two players rush for over 100 yards in three consecutive games for just the second time in school history (Zach Abey and Malcolm Perry vs. Cincinnati, Tulsa and Air Force) ... Navy also did it in 1996 vs. Rutgers (Tim Cannada 107, Chris McCoy 101), SMU (Chris McCoy 140, Omar Nelson 108) and Boston College (Chris McCoy 183, Omar Nelson 118) ... the line allowed Navy's starting quarterback Zach Abey to rush for 100 yards or more in a school-record eight straight contests dating back to 2016 - 114 vs. LA Tech, 235 at Florida Atlantic, 108 vs. Tulane, 128 vs. Cincinnati, 185 at Tulsa, 214 vs. Air Force, 146 at Memphis, 136 vs. UCF (broke the record) ... Abey is the only player in school history to rush for 100 or more yards in each of the season's first seven contests ... he is the first Navy player to rush for 150-plus yards in back-to-back games (185 vs. Tulsa, 214 vs. Air Force) since Adam Ballard in 2005 (167 vs. Temple and 192 vs. Army) ... Abey and Perry are just the fourth and fifth different Navy players to rush for 200 yards TWICE in a season (235 vs. Florida Atlantic, 214 vs. Air Force), joining Keenan Reynolds (2013, and 2014), Chris McCoy (1996 and 1997) and Napoleon McCallum (1983) ... it's the first time in school history that Navy has had four 200-yard rushing games in a single season ... the line has allowed Abey to rush for 1,325 yards this season, along with 1,068 yards by Perry, marking just the third time in program history Navy has had two 1,000-yard rushers in a single season - Kyle Eckel (1,249) and Craig Candeto (1,112), in 2015 Keenan Reynolds (1,373) and Chris Swain (1,023) and in 2017 Zach Abey (1,325) and Malcolm Perry (1,068).

Navy has had only five 90-plus yard touchdown runs in school history, Perry has two of the five - 92 vs. SMU and 91 vs. Air Force this season ... remarkably, he is one of just three players in FBS history to have two 90-yard runs in the same season (Chris Hardy of San Diego State in 1985 and Buddy Young of Illinois in 1944 ... Perry's 92-yard TD run set a Navy-Marine Corps Memorial Stadium record for longest rush ... the previous long was 91 yards set in 1997 by Pat McGrew against Kent State and tied earlier this year against Air Force by Perry ... it is also the second-longest run in program history behind John Sai's record-setting 93-yard run against Duke in 1963 ... Perry is also one of just three players in the country with four offensive touchdowns of 65 yards or more, joining Baylor's Chris Platt and Southern Miss' Ito Smith ... for the first time in program history, Navy was able to string together three straight games of 400-plus yards rushing - 569 vs. Cincinnati, 421 vs. Tulsa, 471 vs. Air Force ... Navy had two players rush for over 100 yards in three consecutive games for just the second time in school history (Zach Abey and Malcolm Perry vs. Cincinnati, Tulsa and Air Force) ... Navy also did it in 1996 vs. Rutgers (Tim Cannada 107, Chris McCoy 101), SMU (Chris McCoy 140, Omar Nelson 108) and Boston College (Chris McCoy 183, Omar Nelson 118) ... the line allowed Navy's starting quarterback Zach Abey to rush for 100 yards or more in a school-record eight straight contests dating back to 2016 - 114 vs. LA Tech, 235 at Florida Atlantic, 108 vs. Tulane, 128 vs. Cincinnati, 185 at Tulsa, 214 vs. Air Force, 146 at Memphis, 136 vs. UCF (broke the record) ... Abey is the only player in school history to rush for 100 or more yards in each of the season's first seven contests ... he is the first Navy player to rush for 150-plus yards in back-to-back games (185 vs. Tulsa, 214 vs. Air Force) since Adam Ballard in 2005 (167 vs. Temple and 192 vs. Army) ... - **Trending:** Perry is the only player in the FBS this year to have two runs of 70 or more yards and one reception of 70 or more yards and is one of only two players (Denard Robinson of Michigan) in FBS history to have rushed for 100 or more yards in a game as both a running back and quarterback in the same season ... he is the only quarterback in the FBS this season to rush for 250-plus yards twice this season ... he is also one of just three players in the country with four offensive touchdowns of 65 yards or more, joining Baylor's Chris Platt and Southern Miss' Ito Smith ... Navy has had only five 90-plus yard touchdown runs in school history, Perry has two of the five - 92 vs. SMU and 91 vs. Air Force this season ... his 92-yard TD run set a Navy-Marine Corps Memorial Stadium record for longest rush ... he is the first Navy slot back to rush for 100 yards in three consecutive games since Shun White in 2009 ... White rushed for 148 yards vs. Towson, 138 yards vs. Ball State and 112 yards vs. Duke ... Perry had 100 yards against Cincinnati, 104 at Tulsa and a career-high 127 yards vs. Air Force ... Navy had two players rush for over 100 yards in three consecutive games (all three have been Zach Abey and Malcolm Perry) ... it's just the second time in school history that Navy has put together three straight games with 100-yard rushing pairs ... Navy also did it in 1996 vs. Rutgers (Tim Cannada 107, Chris McCoy 101), SMU (Chris McCoy 140, Omar Nelson 108) and Boston College (Chris McCoy 183, Omar Nelson 118) ... a half by a Navy player in school history behind Shun White's 214 in the opening half against Towson on Aug. 30, 2008 ... • **Trending:** Member of Navy's offensive line that was named to the Mid-Season Honor Roll for the Joe Moore Award ... helped slot back-turned-quarterback Malcolm Perry rush for an AAC record 282 yards (third most in program history) against SMU ... Navy has had only five 90-plus yard touchdown runs in school history, Perry has two of the five - 92 vs. SMU and 91 vs. Air Force this season ... remarkably, he is one of just three players in FBS history to have two 90-yard runs in the same season (Chris Hardy of San Diego State in 1985 and Buddy Young of Illinois in 1944 ... Perry's 92-yard TD run set a Navy-Marine Corps Memorial Stadium record for longest rush ... the previous long was 91 yards set in 1997 by Pat McGrew against Kent State and tied earlier this year against Air Force by Perry ... it is also the second-longest run in program history behind John Sai's record-setting 93-yard run against Duke in 1963 ... game this season in the FBS ... it stands No. 2 in the Navy record books, while it's the most under Niumatalolo's tenure as head coach ... the 72 rushing attempts are the third most in the FBS this season ... the 622 yards of total offense, meanwhile, ranks No. 11 all-time at Navy and the most under Niumatalolo ... member of a line that allowed QB Zach Abey to become the first player in program history to rush for 200 yards (235) AND throw for 100 yards (110) in a single game, while also setting the AAC record for most yards rushing by a QB (235) in the win over FAU.

- **Trending:** Member of Navy's offensive line that was named to the Mid-Season Honor Roll for the Joe Moore Award ... helped slot back-turned-quarterback Malcolm Perry rush for an AAC record 282 yards (third most in program history) against SMU ... Navy has had only five 90-plus yard touchdown runs in school history, Perry has two of the five - 92 vs. SMU and 91 vs. Air Force this season ... remarkably, he is one of just three players in FBS history to have two 90-yard runs in the same season (Chris Hardy of San Diego State in 1985 and Buddy Young of Illinois in 1944 ... Perry's 92-yard TD run set a Navy-Marine Corps Memorial Stadium record for longest rush ... the previous long was 91 yards set in 1997 by Pat McGrew against Kent State and tied earlier this year against Air Force by Perry ... it is also the second-longest run in program history behind John Sai's record-setting 93-yard run against Duke in 1963 ... Navy had two players rush for over 100 yards in three consecutive games for just the second time in school history (Zach Abey and Malcolm Perry vs. Cincinnati, Tulsa and Air Force) ... Navy also did it in 1996 vs. Rutgers (Tim Cannada 107, Chris McCoy 101), SMU (Chris McCoy 140, Omar Nelson 108) and Boston College (Chris McCoy 183, Omar Nelson 118) ... the line allowed Navy's starting quarterback Zach Abey to rush for 100 yards or more in a school-record eight straight contests dating back to 2016 - 114 vs. LA Tech, 235 at Florida Atlantic, 108 vs. Tulane, 128 vs. Cincinnati, 185 at Tulsa, 214 vs. Air Force, 146 at Memphis, 136 vs. UCF (broke the record) ... Abey is the only player in school history to rush for 100 or more yards in each of the season's first seven contests ... he is the first Navy player to rush for 150-plus yards in back-to-back games (185 vs. Tulsa, 214 vs. Air Force) since Adam Ballard in 2005 (167 vs. Temple and 192 vs. Army) ... Abey and Perry are just the fourth and fifth different Navy players to rush for 200 yards TWICE in a season (235 vs. Florida Atlantic, 214 vs. Air Force), joining Keenan Reynolds (2013, and 2014), Chris McCoy (1996 and 1997) and Napoleon McCallum (1983) ... it's the first time in school history that Navy has had four 200-yard rushing games in a single season ... the line has allowed Abey to rush for 1,325 yards this season, along with 1,068 yards by Perry, marking just the third time in program history Navy has had two 1,000-yard rushers in a single season - Kyle Eckel (1,249) and Craig Candeto (1,112), in 2015 Keenan Reynolds (1,373) and Chris Swain (1,023) and in 2017 Zach Abey (1,325) and Malcolm Perry (1,068).

ground against Cincinnati en route to 622 yards of total offense ... the 569 yards rushing set an AAC record (previous high was 496 by Navy in 2016 against SMU), while it is the best rushing game this season in the FBS ... it stands No. 2 in the Navy record books, while it's the most under Niumatalolo's tenure as head coach ... the 72 rushing attempts are the third most in the FBS this season ... the 622 yards of total offense, meanwhile, ranks No. 11 all-time at Navy and the most under Niumatalolo ... recovered a Zach Abey fumble in the end zone for a touchdown against Tulane ... he is the first Navy lineman to recover a fumble in the end zone for a TD since Jake Zuzek scored the game-winner in overtime against Air Force on Oct. 6, 2012 ... member of a line that allowed QB Zach Abey to become the first player in program history to rush for 200 yards (235) AND throw for 100 yards (110) in a single game, while also setting the AAC record for most yards rushing by a QB (235) in the win over FAU.

• **2016:** A starter in all 14 games ... was part of a starting line that entered the year with just a combined 4 starts, including 3 by Copeland ... the line paved the way for the Mids to finish the year ranked #1 in third down conversion pct. (54.5), #3 in passing yards per completion (19.29), #4 in rushing offense (310.1), #5 in tackles for loss allowed (4.21) and #7 in team passing efficiency (164.17) ... earned 2016 CoSIDA Academic All-District II honors ...
