Head Coach

STEVE GARLAND



Former Cavalier All-American Steve Garland is serving in his eighth season as head wrestling coach at Virginia. A master motivator, recruiter and coach, Garland has worked diligently to push the Cavaliers among the nation's elite.

The results of Garland's perseverance are evident. In Garland's first seven seasons at Virginia, the Cavaliers earned six All-America honors and 12 ACC individual titles while qualifying 42 to the NCAA Championships and now recording four-consecutive Top-30 team finishes at NCAAs. UVa has a 98-44 dual record during his tenure. The Virginia wrestling program also has been a standout in the classroom;

in 2013 UVa was honored by the NWCA as one of the nation's top academic teams.

In 2010 Garland was named the ACC Coach of the Year as Virginia won the program's first ACC Championship since 1977 before earning a 15th-place finish at the NCAA Championship, UVa's second-best finish at the national championships.

Chris Henrich became Virginia's first three-time All-American in 2011 when he took sixth place at 174 pounds. Henrich was part of UVa's strong 2007 recruiting class, which was ranked No. 5 nationally by W.I.N. Magazine and No. 8 by InterMat. Garland has brought in eight straight Top-25 recruiting classes, including the 2009 class, which was ranked as high as No. 6 nationally.

Virginia set program records with nine NCAA qualifiers and four national seeds in 2012-13. Jedd Moore (157 pounds) and Nick Sulzer (165) each earned All-America honors while Matt Snyder (125) and George DiCamillo (133) reached the All-America round. DiCamillo was crowned the ACC champion at 133 pounds, becoming the first UVa freshman to win an ACC title since 1995.

The Cavaliers recorded a program-best No. 11 national ranking during the season and defeated then-No. 9 Central Michigan at the Virginia Duals, marking the first top-10 opponent that Virginia has ever beaten. UVa posted a 16-4 record in dual matches before narrowly finishing second at the ACC Championships and taking 21st at the NCAA Championships.

Virginia also was honored as one of the top academic teams in college wrestling in 2013 as UVa recorded the fifth-best GPA nationally (3.239), while a national-best eight Cavaliers wrestlers were named to the 2012-13 NWCA All-Academic Team. Matt Snyder was named an Academic All-American for the second straight year.

Virginia had another standout year in 2011-12 as three Cavaliers won ACC championships, while the team went 11-1 in dual matches. In recording a 91.7 winning percentage, the Cavaliers set a program record. Matt Snyder (125 pounds), Nick Nelson (141) and Jon Fausey (184) all won ACC titles, while Snyder also was honored as an Academic All-American. A league-high seven Cavaliers were named to the All-ACC Wrestling Academic Team.

Virginia recorded a strong 2010-11 season as the Cavaliers posted their second straight Top 25 finish at the NCAA Championships after taking 23th place. UVa produced a pair of All-Americans, as Derek Valenti (149) and Chris Henrich (174) each reached the podium at NCAAs, while seven Cavaliers qualified for the national championships.

As a team, UVa won a school-record 19 dual meets during the 2010-11 season, including a victory over then-No. 14 Kent State, which at the time was the highest ranked opponent that Virginia had defeated.

The Cavaliers also had a record-setting season in 2009-10 as UVa won the ACC title and took 15th at the NCAA Championships. A school-record eight Cavaliers qualified for the NCAA event. At the ACC Championships, Henrich and freshman Mike Salopek won individual championships but the championship was a total team effort. All 10 competing Cavaliers reached the semifinal round and posted finishes of fourth place or better. Henrich finished 35-3, while Brent Jones earned the Gorrarian Trophy at the NCAA Championships. As a team, Virginia went 16-6 in dual meets and earned a then-program-best national ranking of No. 16 in January.

Virginia qualified seven wrestlers to the NCAA Championships in 2009, despite an injury-riddled season. Henrich was named an All-American at 174 pounds after taking seventh place at the national championship. He went 40-3 during a dominating season. For the second straight year, Virginia took second place at the ACC Championship, again falling just two points shy of the title. Henrich, Caponi (184) and Brent Jones (197) all earned ACC titles, and Jones was named the tournament's Most Outstanding Wrestler.

In 2007-08, the Cavaliers went 18-5 in dual meets (3-2 ACC) in setting the then-school record for dual-meet wins. Chris Henrich was named ACC Freshman of the Year and joined Michael Chaires on the Amateur Wrestling News All-Rookie Team. In January 2008, Virginia earned its first-ever national ranking in the W.I.N. rankings at No. 25.

With a young lineup including four freshmen and three sophomores, UVa made major waves at the ACC Championships in taking runner-up honors to Maryland, falling short of the title by just two points. UVa wrestlers finished in the top three in nine

of 10 weight classes, with Ross Gitomer (125) and Rocco Caponi (184) earning championships. Both were named All-ACC, as were Henrich and freshman Nick Nelson. Gitomer, Caponi and Henrich all advanced to the NCAA Championships.

Garland's Cavaliers notched an 8-10 overall mark in his opening campaign in 2006-07. Under Garland's tutelage, Caponi captured the ACC title at 184 pounds, while Eric Albright was the league runner-up at 133. Both earned a berth in the NCAA Championships, where Albright won three matches.

PRIOR TO VIRGINIA

Garland was appointed to his post on April 20, 2006, after serving the previous six seasons as an assistant coach at Cornell, where he helped the Big Red to four-consecutive top-11 finishes at the NCAA Championships. He spent his final four seasons at Cornell as the top assistant under 2005 NCAA Coach of the Year Rob Koll. Garland was named the 2005-06 NCWA Assistant Coach of the Year after helping the Big Red to a top-five finish at the NCAA Championships.

During his six seasons at Cornell, Garland helped the Big Red wrestling program move into the national spotlight. He coached 17 All-Americans, four NCAA finalists and 46 NCAA qualifiers.

The Cornell wrestling team finished in the top five at the NCAA Championships two years in a row (2005-06) and the top 11 at the NCAA Tournament for four straight seasons. The Big Red won the Ivy League title in five of Garland's six seasons. He worked closely with and was integral in the development of four-time All-American (2001-05) and two-time NCAA Champion Travis Lee and true freshman NCAA finalist Troy Nickerson (2006).

As the recruiting coordinator his last four years, Garland helped bring in two top-five recruiting classes, which included three high school national champions, four junior national champions and numerous state champions. His 2005-06 class was ranked second nationally and included the No. 1 recruits at their weight classes in Nickerson (125 pounds) and Adam Frey (130 pounds).

VIRGINIA WRESTLING CAREER

Garland, a 2000 Virginia graduate, was a three-time Atlantic Coast Conference finalist and winner of the ACC championship at 125 pounds in 1997. He qualified for the NCAA championships in each of his three years of competition. At the 2000 NCAA Championships, Garland earned All-America honors, falling in the national title match after he upset the top seed, Jody Strittmatter of Iowa, 9-7 in overtime, in the semifinals. Garland currently is tied for 10th all-time in career wins at UVa (91).

In 2000, Garland was named the ACC Wrestler of the Year. In his career, he compiled 91 wins, including a 30-5 mark during his senior season, when he competed in the NWCA All-Star meet. He also was a member of the 50th Anniversary Atlantic Coast Conference Team.

PERSONAL

Garland is currently on the Board of Directors for the National Wrestling Coaches Association and has served on the NCAA Division I Wrestling Rules Committee. Garland (36) and his wife, English, are the proud parents of two daughters, Sarah and Grace.

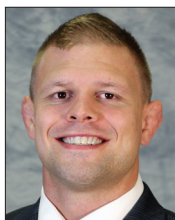

ALEX CLEMSEN



Alex Clemesen is serving in his fifth season as assistant wrestling coach at Virginia. A former All-America wrestler at Edinboro, Clemesen has helped Virginia to four straight record-breaking seasons.

In Clemesen's time at Virginia, the Cavaliers have boasted 30 NCAA qualifiers, five All-Americans and six ACC champions.

Virginia set program records with nine NCAA qualifiers and four national seeds in 2012-13. Jedd Moore (157 pounds) and Nick Sulzer (165) each earned All-America honors while Matt Snyder (125) and George DiCamillo (133) reached the All-America round. DiCamillo was crowned the ACC champion at 133 pounds, becoming the first UVa freshman to win an ACC title since 1995.

The Cavaliers recorded a program-best No. 11 national ranking during the season and defeated then-No. 9 Central Michigan at the Virginia Duals, marking the first top-10 opponent that Virginia has ever beaten. UVa posted a 16-4 record in dual matches before narrowly finishing second at the ACC Championships and taking 21st at the NCAA Championships.

As a team, UVa won a school-record 19 dual meets during the 2010-11 season, including a victory over then-No. 14 Kent State, which marked the highest ranked opponent that Virginia had ever defeated at the time.

In Clemesen's first season in Charlottesville, Virginia won the ACC Championship in 2010 and recorded a 15th-place finish at the NCAA Championships in 2010, marking UVa's top finish at the national championships since 1957.

Virginia's ACC Championship was its first since 1977 as Chris Henrich and Mike Salopek each captured individual crowns. Behind Henrich's All-America finish at the NCAA Championships, UVa notched a 15th place, which was tops among ACC schools. Brent Jones also won the Gorrarian Trophy at the NCAA Championships, becoming just the second Cavalier to earn the honor.

Prior to his time at Virginia, Clemesen worked for two years as Oregon State's Director of Wrestling Operations. During Clemesen's time at OSU, the Beavers had seven NCAA qualifiers, one All-American and one Academic All-American.

At Edinboro, Clemesen was an All-American and four-time NCAA qualifier while posting a 121-35 career record. He was just the 14th wrestler to win four Pennsylvania State Athletic Conference championships, and he also was named an Eastern Wrestling League Champion. He ended his career with the ninth-most wins in Edinboro history.

At the international level, Clemesen was a University Nationals All-American and a University World Team Trials runner-up.

Clemesen also was a two-time Academic All-American, graduating with the highest GPA of any wrestler in school history.

At Moberly Senior High School, Clemesen finished with a 158-7 career record and was an All-American. He twice posted perfect records, while winning the Missouri state championship three times and advancing to the state finals all four years. Clemesen also holds the state record with 27 tournaments won. In addition, he received Academic All-America honors.

A native of Moberly, Mo., Clemesen graduated in 2007 from Edinboro with a bachelor's degree in business administration with concentrations in financial services and marketing. Clemesen and his wife Lindsay have a daughter, Payten, and son, Porter.

JORDAN LEEN



Former national champion Jordan Leen is serving in his third season as an assistant coach with the Virginia wrestling team. Leen was a four-time NCAA qualifier and three-time All-America selection while competing at Cornell.

Virginia has had two standout seasons since Leen's arrival, highlighted by 16 NCAA qualifiers, four ACC champions and a pair of All-Americans.

Virginia set program records with nine NCAA qualifiers and four national seeds in 2012-13. Jedd Moore (157 pounds) and Nick Sulzer (165) each earned All-America honors while Matt Snyder (125) and George DiCamillo (133) reached the All-America round. DiCamillo was crowned the ACC champion at 133 pounds, becoming the first UVa freshman to win an ACC title since 1995.

The Cavaliers recorded a program-best No. 11 national ranking during the season and defeated then-No. 9 Central Michigan at the Virginia Duals, marking the first top-10 opponent that Virginia has ever beaten. In Leen's first year in Charlottesville in 2011-12, three Cavaliers won ACC championships, and the team posted an impressive 11-1 mark in dual matches. In recording a 91.7 winning percentage, the Cavaliers set a program record for a single season. Matt Snyder (125), Nick Nelson (141) and Jon Fausey (184) all won ACC titles, while Snyder also was honored as an Academic All-American.

A 2009 graduate of Cornell, Leen earned his first coaching job as an assistant coach at Duke for the 2010-11 season and worked closely with the middle weights.

He recorded a strong career at Cornell and was recruited to the school by Garland, who was a Big Red assistant coach at the time. Leen made four straight appearances in the NCAA tournament for while wrestling for Cornell at 149 and 157 pounds. The 2008 national champion at 157 pounds, Leen posted a career record of 118-29 and was a First-Team All-Ivy League selection three times.

Leen went 27-3 during his redshirt junior season (2007-08) en route to winning the national championship at 157 pounds. He also was the team captain for the Big Red team, which recorded a ninth-place finish at the NCAA Championships. Leen upset three higher-seeded foes on the road to his championship.

Leen qualified for the NCAA tournament as a true freshman, going 25-16 and taking third place at the EIWA tournament to earn an automatic bid to NCAAs. He also was named the 2005 Ivy League Rookie of the Year. Leen redshirted the 2005-06 season before posting a big season in 2006-07, as he recorded 37 wins and notched All-America honors after taking eighth place at the NCAA Championships.

In his final season with the Big Red (2008-09), Leen won his second EIWA Championship and took third at the NCAA tournament at 157 as he again earned All-America honors. He posted an overall record of 29-3.

Leen worked with ESPN as a commentator during the 2010 NCAA Championships. He was one of three former All-Americans selected to provide analysis during the semifinal bouts.

DEREK VALENTI



Former Cavalier All-American Derek Valenti is in his first year as UVa's volunteer assistant coach.

Valenti earned All-America honors in 2011 after an eighth-place finish at 149 pounds at the NCAA Championships.

He was a three-time NCAA qualifier, as he reached the NCAA Championships at 141 in 2010 and 149 in 2011 and 2013.

Valenti also was the 2011 and 2013 ACC runner-up at 149 pounds.

Valenti tied for ninth in career wins at Virginia with 95 and also finished fifth in career dual wins at Virginia with 52. He wrestled in 140 career matches, which was ninth in the program annals.

2012-13 SEASON HIGHLIGHTS

- A record nine Cavaliers competed at the NCAA Championships: Matt Snyder (125), George DiCamillo (133), Joe Spisak (141), Derek Valenti (149), Jedd Moore (157), Nick Sulzer (165), Jon Fausey (174), Stephen Doty (184) and Mike Salopek (197).
- Virginia was one of 11 schools to boast nine or more NCAA qualifiers in 2013.
- UVa earned its fourth straight Top 30 finish at the NCAA Championships.
- Virginia had four seeded wrestlers at the NCAA Championships for the first time in program history: Matt Snyder (eighth at 125), George DiCamillo (11th at 133), Jedd Moore (12th at 157) and Nick Sulzer (eighth at 165).
- DiCamillo was the first UVa freshman to earn a national seed at NCAAs and was one of just five true freshman seeds in 2013.
- DiCamillo also set the UVa freshman record for wins in a season with 33.
- Moore (6th) and Sulzer (8th) each earned All-America honors, becoming the 14th and 15th Cavaliers to earn the distinction.
- Snyder and DiCamillo also reached the NCAA Round of 12 but fell one win shy of All-America status.
- UVa narrowly took second place to Virginia

Tech at the ACC Championships.

- George DiCamillo won the ACC championship at 133 pounds, becoming the first UVa freshman since 1995 to earn a conference title.
- Virginia went 16-4 in dual action, recording the third-most dual wins in program history.
- The Cavaliers recorded their first-ever win over a top-10 team, defeating No. 9 Central Michigan on Jan. 12
- Matt Snyder finished his UVa career with 100 wins, ninth most in program history, while Derek Valenti wrapped up his career with 95 wins, which stands 10th in UVa history.
- Snyder finished third in career falls at Virginia with 33.
- Snyder was named to the Capital One Academic All-America third team for the second straight year.
- Snyder also named the ACC Scholar-Athlete of the Year for the second straight year and also was an ACC Postgraduate Scholarship recipient.
- A national-best eight UVa wrestlers were named to the NWCA All-Academic Team.
