VIRGINIA-LOUISVILLE SERIES

- Virginia and Louisville played for the first time last season in the Cardinals' inaugural season in the ACC, with UofL sweeping a three-game series in Charlottesville.
- This weekend series marks Virginia's first-ever baseball games in the state of Kentucky.

ROAD CHALLENGES LOOM

- Beginning with the Louisville series, 15 of UVA's remaining 26 games heading into finals break are on the road.
- This includes ACC road series at UofL, Boston College, Miami and Pitt.
- UVA has played 22 games thus far – 16 at home, four on the road and two at neutral sites.
- Of UVA's next 21 games, 12 are against current top-20 teams Louisville, NC State, UNC and Miami.

OFFENSE PRODUCING THROUGH 22 GAMES

- Virginia's offense has started the season strong, batting .326 through 22 games (second in ACC to Georgia Tech, .329).
- UVA has a league-high 256 hits and is second in the ACC with 52 doubles. UVA had 10 doubles in its series with Wake Forest.
- UVA has scored at least four runs in 20 of its 22 games this season, including five of six in ACC play.
- The Cavaliers also are batting .342 as a team with two outs.

WHO BLINKS IN THE RUNNING GAME?

- Virginia has surrendered only five stolen bases this season (in 11 attempts).
- Led by ACC leader Corey Ray (22 SB), Louisville has swiped an ACC-high 44 bases this year.
- UVA catcher Matt Thaiss has thrown out 42 percent of potential base stealers in his career (18-of-43).

THINGS TO KNOW

- The series at UofL marks the first three games of seven on a synthetic surface this year. UVA was 7-3 on turf last year.
- UVA (94) and UofL (92) have struck out the fewest times among ACC teams.
- Ernie Clement (36) and Adam Haseley (35) rank first and third, respectively, in hits among ACC players.
- Virginia has started at least three freshmen in every game this year.

BIG FIVE HIGHLIGHT TOP OF ORDER

- Virginia has leaned on five veterans to anchor its batting order this year.
- Adam Haseley, Ernie Clement, Matt Thaiss, Pavin Smith and Daniel Pinero have hit 1-5, respectively, in all 22 games this season.
- They are batting a combined .358 thus far and have 152 of the team's 256 hits (59.3 percent) and 109 of the 169 runs (64.5 percent).

HASELEY LOOKS TO BUILD ON MONSTER WEEK

- Currently riding a career-best 12-game hit streak, Adam Haseley is coming off his hottest week at UVA after going 12-for-20 (.600) with five extra-base hits (3 2B, 2 3B) in five games.
- He had a big series against Wake Forest, going 9-for-13 (.692) with five extra-base hits.
- In the second game of the Friday doubleheader, he became the first Cavalier in nearly six years to hit two triples in one game and recorded a career-high four hits.

HASELEY SETS THE TABLE

- Adam Haseley has been a key instigator in the Cavaliers' offense this year, scoring at least one run in all but two of UVA's games.
- He leads the team with 31 runs scored and has a team-high 15 extra-base hits (10 2B, 3 3B, 2 HR).
- Haseley leads the team with a .505 on-base percentage, 150 points higher than 2015 (.355).

NOTING THE WAKE FOREST SERIES

- Virginia won two of three games over Wake Forest last week at home for its second straight ACC series win.
- Adam Haseley (9-13, 5 R), Pavin Smith (4-9, 3 RBI, 4 BB) and Cameron Simmons (4-9) were the top UVA hitters in the series.
- UVA's bullpen worked 9 2/3 innings and allowed just one unearned run.
- In a tough spot, UVA got a solid spot start from David Rosenberger, followed by four shutout innings from Tyler Shambora in game 2 of the Friday DH to help clinch the series win.

KARSTETTER GIVES HOOS BOOST IN FIELD, AT PLATE

- After a slow start, rookie Ryan Karstetter has hit a groove at the plate.
- He went hitless in his first 12 at bats, but has gone 19-for-52 (.365) since.
- Karstetter also has plugged a hole in left field after the season-ending injury to Jake McCarthy and has started each of the last 14 games there.

CLEMENT CONTINUES TO RAKE

- Ernie Clement is off to a fantastic start and has gone 36-for-93 (.387) to start the season.
- He is tied for the ACC lead in hits (36) and ranks 11th in batting.
- Clement started the season with a career-long eight-game hit streak but topped that was a nine-game streak that ended last Friday.
- He owns 12 multiple-hit games in the first 22 contests.

SMITH PRODUCING IN CLEANUP SPOT

- In his first year of batting cleanup, Pavin Smith has produced thus far.
- He is batting .346 with a team-high 24 RBI while hitting cleanup in every game.
- He ranks fifth in the ACC in RBI.
- Smith saw most of his action in the 3-hole (18 games) and 5-hole (49 games) last year.

FRESHMEN SETTLING INTO LINEUP

- Much like 2015, Virginia has relied on a host of freshmen as part of its regular lineup.
- UVA has started at least three freshmen in the field in every game, including three games with four rookie starters.
- Andy Weber leads the freshmen with 20 starts at third base, while Ryan Karstetter has started each of the last 14 games in left field.
- 36 percent of UVA's at bats have come from rookies (286 of 785).

INJURIES PLAGUE CAVALIERS AT KEY POSITIONS EARLY

- Injuries have hit UVA hard in the first few weeks of the season.
- A pair of regulars, Robbie Coman (elbow) and Jake McCarthy (big toe), each are out for the season after injuries suffered in the East Carolina series.
- Charlie Cody suffered a sprained ankle against VMI and also is out indefinitely.

CAVALIERS FINISH LONG STRETCH OF HOME GAMES

- Virginia just finished a stretch with 16 of 19 games at home. UVA went 12-4 in that stretch.
- Virginia is 364-87 (.807) at home since 2004 under Brian O'Connor.
- UVA was 44-24 last season but played only 23 home games (its fewest since 1984 when it played only 20 home contests).
- UVA has averaged 3,330 fans per game this year, including a season-high 3,993 on Feb. 28 vs. ECU.

LYNCH NABS RARE FRESHMAN ROTATION SLOT

- Daniel Lynch is the first UVA freshman to start in the Cavaliers' opening-weekend rotation since Brandon Waddell earned the starting nod in UVA's 2013 season opener at East Carolina.
- Lynch had a strong debut, working five shutout innings against Appalachian State.
- He struck out nine batters, most by a UVA freshman since Alec Bettinger fanned 11 against Richmond on April 23, 2014.
- It also was the most by a UVA rookie in his debut in the Brian O'Connor era.
- Lynch was high school teammates with current UVA infielder Jack Gerstenmaier at Douglas Freeman HS in Richmond.

SEVEN OF NINE STARTING POSITION STARTERS RETURN

- Virginia returns seven of its nine starting position players from its championship team (77.5 percent of games started).
- UVA lost four-year starting third baseman Kenny Towns and three-year starting right fielder Joe McCarthy.
- Three-quarters of the infield is back with Pavin Smith (1B), Ernie Clement (2B) and Daniel Pinero (SS), while starting catchers/DH Matt Thaiss and Robbie Coman also are back in the mix.
- Starting outfielders Adam Haseley and Kevin Doherty also are back.

UVA PICKED SECOND IN COASTAL IN PRESEASON

- Virginia was voted second in the ACC's Coastal Division in the 2016 ACC Preseason Coaches Poll.
- Miami was picked to win the ACC Coastal Division, totaling 97 points. Virginia was second with 80 points.
- Louisville was a unanimous selection as the team to beat in both the Atlantic Division and the conference. Florida State was picked second in the division with 74 points.

PITCHING ROTATION FEATURES PAIR OF NEW FACES

- UVA's starting rotation takes on a new look this year.
- Preseason All-America RHP Connor Jones headlines the group after an excellent 2015 campaign in which he took over as the Friday starter in late April.
- Gone are MLB draft picks Nathan Kirby (Brewers) and Brandon Waddell (Pirates), who combined to make 84 career starts.
- In are freshman LHP Daniel Lynch and sophomore RHP Tommy Doyle.
- Doyle made 16 relief appearances last year, but did not start a game.

2015 NATIONAL CHAMPIONS

- In a turbulent season, Virginia peaked at the perfect time as the Cavaliers won their first NCAA National Championship.
- Making its second straight trip to the College World Series Finals, UVA avenged its 2014 series defeat to Vanderbilt by defeating the Commodores in a best-of-three series.
- Virginia finished with a 44-24 record, including a 10-2 mark in the NCAA tournament.
- UVA became the first ACC team to win the NCAA baseball championship since Wake Forest in 1955.
- The NCAA championship was the 23rd in Virginia Athletics history.

REGULAR SEASON

- Dealing with youth and an onslaught of injuries, the Cavaliers went 18-19 in March and April and a berth in the ACC tournament was in peril.
- UVA bounced back to go 5-1 in their final two ACC series, including a three-game sweep at North Carolina to end the regular season.
- After winning their ACC tournament play-in game, 11-0, over Georgia Tech, UVA then lost the next three games in pool play.

NCAA TOURNAMENT

- After winning three straight games at the Lake Elsinore Regional, UVA rallied for back-to-back super regional wins at home against Maryland, with Ernie Clement's walk-off, two-run single sending UVA to Omaha.
- UVA topped Arkansas, 5-3, in its CWS opener, and won two of three games against No. 4 seed Florida to advance to the CWS Finals.
- UVA dropped the first game of the CWS Finals to Vandy, 5-1, but allowed just two runs over the final two games to rally and win the title.
- The Cavaliers trailed 2-0 after one inning in Game 3 against Vandy, but Pavin Smith's two-run homer in the fourth inning tied the game and his two-out RBI single in the fifth gave UVA the lead.

TOURNAMENT NOTES

- UVA came from behind in seven of its 10 tournament and scored the go-ahead run in the fifth inning or later in each of their 10 wins.
- Forty of Virginia's 57 runs in the tournament came in the fifth inning or later. In seven CWS games, Virginia recorded 24 two-out hits that resulted in 15 runs.
- Sborz was named College World Series Most Outstanding Player. He tied a CWS record by earning three wins at the 2015 CWS.
- Sborz made eight appearances in the NCAA tourney and did not allow an earned run. He did not allow an earned run over his final 27 innings, including all 13 of his innings in Omaha.
- Virginia was just the the third No. 3 seed or lower to win the CWS Finals since seeding began in 1988 (joining No. 3 Oregon State in 2007 and No. 4 Fresno State in 2008).

JONES, THAISS ON GOLDEN SPIKES WATCH LIST

- Virginia pitcher Connor Jones and catcher Matt Thaiss each were named to the preseason Golden Spikes Award watch list.
- The list consists of 50 players in amateur baseball.
- Virginia is one of six schools who have multiple players on the list, joining Florida, Louisville, Missouri, Oklahoma and Vanderbilt.

TRIO OF PRESEASON ALL-AMERICANS

- Three Cavaliers have earned preseason All-America honors from the plethora of national publications: RHP Connor Jones, 1B/OF Pavin Smith and C Matt Thaiss.
- Jones has been named to the preseason All-America squads of D1Baseball (first team), Collegiate Baseball and Perfect Game (second team) and Baseball America (third team).
- Thaiss was a second-team selection by D1Baseball and a third-team pick by Collegiate Baseball.
- Smith was a third-team selection by Baseball America.

JONES TAKES OVER ACE ROLE

- After stepping up in 2015, Connor Jones takes full control of UVA's Friday starting rotation slot this year.
- Jones went 7-3 with a 3.19 ERA over 115 2/3 innings last year. He limited opponents to a .216 batting average and struck out 113.
- He ranked eighth nationally in innings pitched.
- He was named to the 2015 USA Baseball Collegiate National Team, although he did not compete after UVA's long season.
- After Friday starter Nathan Kirby went down with an injury on April 17, Jones went 4-1 with a 2.67 ERA over nine starts, working at least 6 1/3 innings in each.

FRESH FACES LINE CAVALIERS' ROSTER

- Virginia's roster features 17 newcomers this season – 15 freshmen and junior transfers Holden Grounds and Tyler Shambora.
- The group of 15 incoming freshmen is the largest in Brian O'Connor's 13 years at UVA.
- UVA had 14 freshmen on the roster last year, which was the previous high.
- The 17 newcomers hail from nine different states.

O'CONNOR LEADS ACTIVE COACHES IN WIN PCT., 13TH ALL-TIME

- Virginia head coach Brian O'Connor is 574-207-2 (.734) in his 13th season in charge of the Cavaliers' program.
- O'Connor needs 21 surpass Dennis Womack (1981-2003) for the winningest coach in program history.
- O'Connor's 73.3 percent winning percentage entering the season ranked No. 3 among active Division I head coaches.
- O'Connor also ranks 14th all-time in career winning percentage among all coaches with at least 10 years of head coaching experience.
- Coming off the program's first national championship in 2015, Virginia has won at least 39 games in all 12 of O'Connor's seasons, including 10 40-win seasons and four 50-win campaigns.

RECENT PROGRAM NOTES

- Virginia owns the most wins in the nation over the last seven years (351).
- UVA has won 565 games since 2004 – an average of more than 46 victories per season.
- UVA has four 50-win seasons: 2010 (51), 2011 (56), 2013 (50) and 2014 (53).
- UVA has recorded at least 39 wins each of the last 12 years, including 10 40-win seasons.
- Every UVA recruiting class since 2005-06 has played in at least one College World Series.

THE TOURNAMENT STREAK

- Virginia has qualified for 12 straight NCAA tournaments, capped by UVA's first national championship in 2015.
- UVA is one of six programs nationally to play in each tournament since 2004 and one of two to play in six of the last seven NCAA Super Regionals.
- Virginia is one of 17 schools in Division I history to have a streak of at least 12 consecutive NCAA tournament appearances.

NCAA TOURNAMENT SUCCESS

- UVA has won 40 NCAA tournament games since 2009 – second most in the nation in that span.
- Eighteen of the 40 tournament wins since 2009 have come in the College World Series.
- Virginia has earned four national seeds in the NCAA Tournament, including the No. 1 overall seed in 2011.

BRINGING HOME THE HARDWARE

- Virginia has made four College World Series appearances, including two trips to the CWS Finals.
- UVA has won six NCAA Regional and four Super Regional championships since 2009.
- UVA earned the 2010 and 2011 ACC Coastal Division Championships (regular season).
- Virginia has made four appearances in the ACC Championship game, including titles in 2009 and 2011.

NATIONAL RECOGNITION

- UVA reached the No. 1 national ranking in the polls in 2010, 2011, 2014 and 2015.
- Twenty-one Cavaliers have earned All-America selections in the last 12 seasons.
- Brian O'Connor has been named National Coach of the Year on three occasions.

SUCCESS AT NEXT LEVEL

- Sixty-six Cavaliers have been selected in the MLB Draft in the last 12 years, including seven in 2015
- Under the current coaching staff, 14 former Cavaliers have reached the big leagues.
- Sean Doolittle (Oakland) and Ryan Zimmerman (Washington) each have been named MLB All-Stars.

WHO'S GONE?

- Virginia lost several key players off of its 2015 National Championship squad.
- The biggest losses came on the mound, where UVA lost key contributors Brandon Waddell (school-record 53 career starts), Nathan Kirby (31 starts) and Josh Sborz (80 career games).
- Sborz was the Most Outstanding Player of the 2015 College World Series, while Waddell and third baseman Kenny Towns joined him all the All-CWS Team.
- Towns played in 207 career games (ninth in UVA history), including 178 starts.
- Starting right fielder Joe McCarthy (151 career starts) also departed for the MLB Draft.

IT'S BIG, IT'S BLUE, BUT IT'S NO LONGER A MONSTER

- Virginia's infamous Blue Monster in center field takes on a new meaning this year. It now serves simply as a batter's eye.
- With the addition of wall padding this year, a consistent home run line was established throughout the park.
- Previously, a ball had to carry over the 32-foot-high wall to be a home run.

WHAT ELSE IS NEW AT DAVENPORT?

- Fans will notice an array of enhancements to Davenport Field this season, with several to commemorate Virginia's 2015 National Championship. Among the additions and changes:
 - A new backlit sign hangs below the scoreboard in right-center field, honoring the 2015 National Champions
 - A new trophy case to showcase the 2015 NCAA Championship trophy on the concourse level
 - New signage to honor UVA's CWS teams and ACC championship teams located beneath the press box
 - New NCAA championship murals on the back of the right-field bleachers as well as the façade of the suite level on the first-base side of the stadium
 - Higher protective netting that extends throughout the entire blue-seat reserved section
 - All of the bleacher seats have been painted blue
 - New padding and signage on the outfield wall
 - The foul poles also have been painted yellow, per NCAA rules

- A plaque commemorating the 2015 NCAA Championship team has been installed on the concourse along the third-base line

VIRGINIA ONE OF SIX SCHOOLS IN LAST 12 NCAA TOURNAMENTS

- Virginia is one of six Division I baseball programs to reach the NCAA tournament each of the last 12 seasons (including 2015).
- The Cavaliers are one of three teams in the ACC to hold that distinction, joining Florida State and Miami.
