UVA, JMU MEET FOR FIRST TIME SINCE 2007

- Virginia owns a 30-25 edge in the all-time series with James Madison.
- The teams have not met since since April 25, 2007, a 7-6, 14-inning win by the Dukes.
- In that contest, JMU scored five runs in the top of the 14th before UVa staged a furious rally in its half of the 14th, scoring four runs before Beau Seabury flew out to the warning track for the final out, leaving the bases loaded.
- UVa will travel to JMU two weeks from Wednesday (March 17).

BOOKENDS OF BATTING ORDER HAVE BIG WEEK

- UVa's leadoff hitter, Phil Gosselin, and nine-hole hitter, Keith Werman, each posted strong performances last week.
- Werman went 7-for-11 (.636) during the week, while Gosselin was 9-for-17 (.529) with a home run and six RBI.
- · Werman has hits in all four of his starts, including a three-hit game at East Carolina (2/21) and a four-hit outing vs. Rhode Island (2/27).
- · Gosselin currently is riding a seven-game hit streak.

HULTZEN NAMED ACC PITCHER OF THE WEEK

- Danny Hultzen was tabbed the ACC Pitcher of the Week on Monday.
- · In earning his second win of the season, Hultzen pitched seven shutout innings against the Rhode Island, allowing just two baserunners while striking out 12 and not walking a batter.
- He gave up only two hits, of which just one left the infield.
- It marks Hultzen's second career conference pitcher of the week award. He also earned the honor on March 16, 2009.

VIRGINIA RANKS 29TH NATIONALLY IN ATTENDANCE

- With a season average of 1,811 per game, Virginia ranks 29th nationally in attendance through the first two weeks of the season.
- UVa ranks third in attendance among ACC schools, behind only Florida State and Miami.
- UVa averaged 1,513 fans per game last season. The UVa single-season attendance average record is 1,774, set in 2007.

CAVALIERS EARN FIRST-EVER NO. 1 NATIONAL

- Virginia has earned a No. 1 national ranking by Baseball America and Rivals.com for the second straight
- · It marks the first No. 1 ranking in school history for Virginia Baseball.
- The baseball team becomes the 10th athletics program at Virginia to garner a No. 1 national ranking, joining men's basketball, women's basketball, field hockey, football, men's lacrosse, women's lacrosse, men's soccer, women's soccer and men's tennis.

BALANCE THROUGHOUT LINEUP

- Eight UVa players have at least eight hits through the first seven games.
- In the last four of the last five games, at least eight of the nine starters recorded one hit or more.
- UVa has posted at least 10 hits in five of its six wins.

DEFENSE OFF TO GOOD START

- Through seven games, Virginia has committed just three errors – good for an impressive .989 fielding pct.
- The Cavaliers recorded a .972 fielding mark last year.
- The school record for fielding percentage is .975, set in 2005.

CANNON CLIMBS VIRGINIA CHARTS

- Tyler Cannon comes into the game with 709 career at bats, which is eighth in UVa history; he needs 25 ABs to match Ryan Zimmerman (2003-05) for seventh.
- Cannon, if he starts today, will move into the top 10 in career games played at Virginia with 193.
- With two doubles last week, Cannon now has 47 doubles — tied for sixth at UVa. He also ranks seventh in triples (9) and 10th in HBP (19) and is nearing the top 10 in runs (141), hits (209) and stolen bases (39).

ARICO, PARKER MOVE UP IN UVA ANNALS

- With his save Sunday, Kevin Arico now has 14 career saves — good for fourth in Virginia history. He needs two to match Michael Schwimer (2005-08) for third.
- With his triple at ECU, Jarrett Parker has hit 11 triples in his career, which is tied for second in UVa history. He needs two more three-baggers to tie Brian Buchanan (1992-94) for the Virginia record.

VETERAN-LADEN CAVALIERS

- Virginia has one of its most experienced teams ever.
- The Cavaliers' returning position players have combined for 977 career starts, led by senior shortstop Tyler Cannon, who has started 186 games.
- Ten players have started at least 50 career games apiece for UVa. Cannon, Dan Grovatt (126), Jarrett Parker (117) and Phil Gosselin (110) each have more than 100 career starts.

STARTING LINEUP BACK IN TACT

- · Virtually the entire offense returns from 2009, including everyone from the starting lineup.
- Almost all of the offensive production is back 99 percent of the RBI-production returns, with 98.4 percent of the hit-producers (755 of 767) coming back.
- Virginia hit .327 last season the Cavaliers' best mark since 1985 – and swatted 59 home runs – UVa's most since 2002.
- Dan Grovatt (.356), Jarrett Parker (.355) and Tyler Cannon (.351) led UVa in batting last year. UVa has nine regular starters back who hit at least .292 last year.

WHO'S GONE?

- Virginia will need to replace 229.0 innings lost from the 2009 squad.
- The top loss comes from starter Andrew Carraway, who tossed 91.0 innings last year.
- Matt Packer pitched 61 innings second-most out of the bullpen.

UVA LEADS NATION IN ERA LAST FIVE YEARS

- Virginia led all NCAA Division I teams in ERA over the past five seasons, boasting a 3.13 team ERA.
- UVa ranked in the top 15 in the country in ERA each of the last six seasons, including No. 3 marks in 2005, 2006, 2007 and 2009.

STRONG CORE OF PITCHERS BACK, BUT HOLES REMAIN

- UVa has to fill the holes of six pitchers who logged 226.0 innings and made 30 starts last season. Nine pitchers return.
- Danny Hultzen (9-1, 2.17) and Robert Morey (3-0, 3.33) each had strong 2009 seasons and will anchor the rotation, but the third weekend rotation slot as well as several bullpen spots are still in limbo.
- UVa had a 3.23 ERA last year (third nationally) and has the best ERA in the nation (3.13) over the last five seasons.

NEXT MAN UP ON MOUND

- While Virginia has plenty of arms returning, they still need players to step up, particularly in the bullpen.
- Senior Neal Davis and freshman Aaron Stull both will be key left-handed options.
- From the right side, Kevin Arico, Corey Hunt, Ryan Briggs, Tyler Wilson, Chad O'Connor, Branden Kline, Shane Halley, Will Roberts, Justin Thompson, Cody Winiarski and Whit Mayberry all will have chances to step up for UVa.

NEWCOMERS ADD TALENT, DEPTH

- UVa welcomes a top-10 recruiting class this year, including five who were previously drafted.
- Stephen Bruno, Reed Gragnani and Chris Taylor all will push the returning infielders at second, third and shortstop for immediate playing time.

- Ryan Briggs, Branden Kline, Cody Winiarski, Whit Mayberry and Aaron Stull all provide pitching options.
- Rob Amaro gives UVa another option at first or behind the plate, while Colin Harrington adds depth in the infield and outfield.

VERSATILITY WILL BE KEY

- Much of the UVa's depth comes because of its versatility several players could see action at a variety of positions.
- John Hicks and Kenny Swab each are athletic players who primarily are catchers but both will shift to first base and the outfield at times.
- Danny Hultzen will pitch and also is a strong first baseman and will DH as well, while Phil Gosselin could play at second or left field.
- Corey Hunt (INF) and Shane Halley (OF) each will pitch, but are great defensive players in the field as well.

SCHEDULE WILL CHALLENGE

- Virginia's schedule is not for the faint of heart $-\,11$ teams from the 2009 NCAA Tournament line the schedule.
- Thirty-six games will come against teams that won at least 30 games last year.
- UVa opened with a three-game set at East Carolina, a 2009 Super Regional qualifier.
- The ACC slate features six NCAA teams from last season North Carolina (CWS), Clemson and Florida State (Super Regionals) and Boston College, Georgia Tech and Miami (Regionals).
- The Cavaliers also have non-conference matchups with 2009 NCAA Tournament foes Coastal Carolina, Dartmouth, George Mason and Wright State.
