## FIVE THINGS YOU NEED TO KNOW

- Virginia and Richmond are meeting for the 32nd time in series history. UVa's current streak of nine wins in a row in the series began in 1947.
- UVa head coach Mike London not only played at Richmond, but he led the Spiders to the 2008 FCS National Championship during his first head coaching job.
- WR Doni Dowling's five receptions against UCLA are the most by a UVa true freshman (any position) in a debut dating back to 1972. That was the first season in which freshmen were eligible to play varsity football.
- Quin Blanding started at free safety against UCLA and was the first UVa true freshman to start a season opener at one of the two safety positions since Tony Blount did so on Sept. 11, 1976 at Washington.
- UVa in 2013 and Florida State in 2002 are the only teams in college football history to play 11 teams during the regular season that would go on to play in a bowl game.

## #URvsUVA AT A GLANCE

## VIRGINIA WELCOMES IN-STATE FOE RICHMOND TO SCOTT STADIUM

- Saturday is Youth Day at Scott Stadium as UVa welcomes the Richmond Spiders to Charlottesville for the fourth time in seven seasons, renewing an in-state rivalry that dates back to 1893. The first 5,000 kids in the eighth grade and under will receive a free Virginia drawstring backpack and youth program upon entry.

## VIRGINIA VS. RICHMOND, CAA

- Virginia owns a 27-2-2 edge in the all-time series with Richmond. UVa has won the last nine meetings, including a 42-19 win the last time these teams met in 2012.
- Richmond's last win in the series came in 1946, a 19-7 victory in Richmond.
- The Cavaliers own a 56-9-3 record against current members of the CAA.
- London is 16-3 all-time vs. the CAA and 8-3 all-time against FCS ranked CAA foes.

## LONDON FACES ALMA MATER

- Mike London is facing his alma mater, Richmond, for the third time as UVa's head coach.
- London is a 1983 graduate of Richmond where he played as a defensive back.
- UVa hosted Richmond in 2010 and again in 2012, both Cavalier wins.
- In 2010, London became the second UVa head coach to make his debut for the Cavaliers against his alma mater.
- Former UVa head coach George Welsh made his debut in 1982 against his alma mater, Navy.
- In both cases, London and Welsh also made their UVa debut against the programs they just left as head coach. London was the head coach of Richmond from 2008-09 and Welsh was the head coach at Navy from 1973-81.

Requested defensive players and defensive coaches will be available for telephone interviews Tuesday, while offensive players and offensive coaches will be available Wednesday.

No player or coach interviews will be arranged after Wednesday during game week.

Coach London will hold his postgame press conference in the media room, while requested players and assistant coaches will be brought to the media room to meet with media representatives after London. UVa athletics media relations personnel will take player requests during the fourth quarter of each game.

No other announcements regarding player injuries will be made until the end of practice on Thursday or two days prior to the next football game (Tuesday for Thursday game, Thursday for Saturday). On that day, within 90 minutes of the end of practice, injured players' playing status for the next game will be announced in one of five categories:

- Definitely will play
- Probable
- Questionable
- Doubtful
- Out

**UNIQUELY UVA**

The University of Virginia is an institution rich with history and tradition. Here is some of the terminology that contributes to UVA's culture.

**Grounds:** The term used by students, faculty and alumni to refer to the University dating as far back as Thomas Jefferson. "Campus" is never used.

**First Year, Second Year, Third Year, Fourth Year:** Instead of freshman, sophomore, junior, senior. Why you may ask? To be a "senior" implies that a person has reached the final phase of learning, a feat that Thomas Jefferson believed to be impossible, arguing instead that education is a life-long process.

**Commonwealth:** Virginia is one of four constituent states of the United States of America that officially uses the name "Commonwealth" instead of the word state in all references. The other three commonwealths are Kentucky, Massachusetts and Pennsylvania.

**UNIVERSITY NICKNAMES**

Virginia's athletics teams have been accompanied by a somewhat confusing array of nicknames. The most prominent and widely accepted of these monikers are "Cavaliers," "Wahoos" and "Hoos."

Although the terms "Cavaliers," "Wahoos" and "Hoos" are used almost interchangeably to refer to University teams and players, "Cavaliers" is more often used by the media, while "Wahoos" and "Hoos" are frequently used by Virginia students and fans.

Legend has it that Washington & Lee baseball fans dubbed the Virginia players "Wahoos" during the fiercely contested rivalry that existed between the two in-state schools in the 1890s. By 1940, "Wahoos" was in general use around Grounds to denote University students or events relating to them. The abbreviated "Hoos" sprang up later in student newspapers and has gained growing popularity in recent years.

**THE CAVALIER MASCOT**

The costumed Cavalier with a large character head debuted during Virginia's 1984 football season and has remained the official mascot of the University.

The first documented Cavalier on horseback was Francis Bell, a Virginia student from Dublin, Va., in 1947. Bell rode onto the field dressed as Cavaliers for Virginia's home football game with Harvard on the afternoon of October 11.

The Cavalier on horseback returned as the University's mascot in 1963. The UVA Polo Club provided both the horse and rider. However, the mounted Cavalier and his horse parted company in 1974 with the inception of AstroTurf at Scott Stadium.

The mounted Cavalier made its return in the Florida Citrus Bowl at the end of the 1989 football season. Due to its instant popularity, the Cavalier on horseback returned the following season on a regular basis and continues to lead the Virginia football team onto the field at the beginning of all home games.

**UNIVERSITY COLORS**

Orange and blue were adopted as the University of Virginia's official athletic colors at a mass student meeting in 1888. UVA athletic teams had previously worn silver gray and cardinal red, but those colors did not stand out on muddy football fields, prompting a student movement to change them.

One of the students attending the mass meeting was Allen Potts, a star athlete who played on Virginia's first football team in 1888. Potts showed up at the meeting wearing a navy blue-and-orange scarf that he had acquired during a summer boating expedition at Oxford University. Orange and blue were chosen as the official athletic colors after one of Potts' fellow students pulled the scarf off Potts' neck and, waving it to the crowd, yelled, "How will this do?" UVA later served as the inspiration for schools like Auburn and Florida when they selected school colors.

**WAH-HOO-WAH**

The origin of "Wah-hoo-wah" is uncertain. The cheer was used to root on Virginia teams as early as 1890 and may have been borrowed from Dartmouth College, whose athletics teams were once known as the Indians.

Legend attributes the yell to Natalie Floyd Otey, who sang the ballad "Where'er You Are, There Shall My Love Be" at Charlottesville's Levy Opera House in 1893. The predominantly student audience noticed that Otey warbled the first three words of the song between each of the stanzas and decided to join in the refrain. By evening's end, goes the legend, the crowd had corrupted "Where'er You Are" into "Wah-hoo-wah."

The Levy Opera House stands at the corner of High Street and Park Street and has since been renovated into an office building.

## LAST MEETING: 2012 (UVA 43, UR 19)

- Former UVA quarterback and current Richmond Spider Michael Rocco threw for 311 yards and a touchdown to help top Richmond in the 2012 season opener.
- Rocco finished 25 for 37 with a touchdown on a short pass that Darius Jennings took 51 yards for a score. Kevin Parks ran for two touchdowns and Perry Jones ran for another for UVA.
- The Cavaliers took a 16-0 lead in the first 6:27, had to settle for two field goals in the second quarter and put the game away with touchdown runs by Parks in the third quarter and Jones early in the fourth.
- The Cavaliers outgained Richmond 523-201 in the first three quarters, and much of the Spiders' yards came after the game was well in Virginia's control.

## FAMILIAR FACES ON BOTH SIDELINES

- The coaching staffs from the two teams are uniquely intertwined, with former UR head coach Mike London now in his fifth season at UVA and former UVA assistant head coach Danny Rocco now in his third season as the head coach at Richmond.
- Both London and Rocco served as defensive assistants together at Virginia under former UVA head coach Al Groh (2001-04). Rocco played two seasons under Groh at Wake Forest, was a graduate assistant with the Demon Deacons and later joined Groh with the Jets in 2000. Rocco followed Groh to Charlottesville in 2001 and spent five seasons with the Cavaliers.
- UR head coach Danny Rocco's daughter Amy is a fourth-year at UVA and works in the UVA athletics media relations office.
- Three Richmond assistants (Bob Trott, Levern Belin, Byron Thweatt) have been assistant coaches at Virginia. Thweatt is a former Cavalier standout and was a UVA graduate assistant in 2006.
- Richmond tight ends coach Fontel Mines is a 2007 graduate of UVA and was a wide receiver for the Cavaliers. Mines finished his career with 68 receptions for 737 yards and five touchdowns before a short career in the NFL with the Chicago Bears.
- UVA OL coach Scott Wachenheim spent three seasons as the OC and assistant head coach at Liberty (2006-08) under current Richmond head coach Danny Rocco. The Flames put up prolific numbers under Wachenheim's offense and ranked in the top-10 in the FCS in yards and scoring during the tenure.
- Richmond assistant coaches Brandon Streeter (OC/QBs) and Blaine McCorkle (OL) both worked under Wachenheim during UVA's offensive line coach's time at Liberty.
- Richmond QB Michael Strauss spent the 2010 and 2011 seasons at UVA. He redshirted the 2010 season and did not appear in any games in 2011 before enrolling at Richmond as a transfer student for the 2012 spring.
- Richmond QB Michael Rocco spent three seasons (2010-12) at UVA. He started 21 games for the Cavaliers at quarterback, going 11-10 as a starter, including an 8-5 mark in 2011 and an appearance in the Chick-fil-A Bowl. Rocco is No. 8 all-time at UVA with 4,731 career passing yards. He transferred to Richmond to play for his uncle Danny Rocco following the 2012 season.

SCOTT STADIUM, HOME OF THE CAVALIERS

The Carl Smith Center, home of David A. Harrison III Field at Scott Stadium, with its unique architectural design, scenic setting on the University's Grounds and exceptional sight lines, is one of the nation's finest college football settings.

Opened in 1931, Scott Stadium might be one of the oldest campus college football stadiums in the nation, but you could never tell from its appearance. Numerous upgrades and expansions make it a modern home for the Cavaliers and their fans.

Scott Stadium was the gift of Frederic William Scott and Elisabeth Strother Scott, and was dedicated to the memory of his parents, Frederic Robert Scott and Frances Branch Scott.

Virginia played its dedication game at Scott Stadium on Oct. 15, 1931 against the Virginia Military Institute before a then-capacity crowd of 22,000. Prior to that season, the Cavaliers staged their home games at the University's Lambeth Field.

Virginia has played 437 games in the historic venue. UVA's all-time record at Scott Stadium stands at 246-180-12.

### FRESHMEN SHINE AMONG UVA RECEIVING CROPS

- Redshirt freshman Andre Levrone and true freshman Doni Dowling made their collegiate debuts in solid fashion against No. 7 UCLA.
- The duo caught eight combined balls for 100 combined yards and one touchdown.
- Dowling caught five balls for 25 yards, while Levrone recorded three receptions for 75 yards and one touchdown.
- Dowling's five receptions are the most by a UVA true freshman receiver in a debut since 1972. That was the first season in which freshmen were eligible to play varsity football. The NCAA had historically prohibited freshmen from varsity competition, except during the US involvement in World War II.
- Dowling's effort passed teammate Darius Jennings' four catches in the senior's 2011 debut against William & Mary.

- Swanson moved back to tight end in 2013 after being the nation's tallest fullback in 2012; Swanson was injured and missed three games in 2013.
- Rob Burns moved in 2012 from defensive end to tight end and saw time in 2013.
- UVA TEs have caught 641 passes for 6,801 yards and 54 TDs since 2001, by far the best figures in the ACC in that span.

- UVa freshman wide receiver Doni Dowling is a Virginia native and wears No. 19.
- These facts prompt the question if the first year is related to former All-ACC performer and UVa graduate, Ras-I Dowling, who hailed from Chesapeake.
- While Ras-I Dowling also wore No. 19 during his time on Grounds as a cornerback, there is no relation to the current UVa receiver.
- However, Doni Dowling does have some Varina High School ties with this current UVa roster. Current UVa cornerbacks Maurice Canady and Tim Harris played alongside Dowling at Varina.
- Ras-I Dowling graduated in 3.5 years from UVa in December 2010 and was the No. 2 overall pick in the 2011 NFL Draft by the New England Patriots. He currently is with the New York Jets.

**REMEMBER THE TITANS**

- UVa's Jay Whitmire graduated from T.C. Williams High School in Alexandria, Va., the same school made famous in Disney film, "Remember the Titans."
- There is a tragic connection between UVa and Charlottesville with one of the real life individuals from the famous Titans story.
- Gerry Bertier, the defensive lineman who was paralyzed from the waist down in an automobile accident, passed away at the University of Virginia hospital due to injuries suffered from a second accident, when his car was struck by a drunk driver on March 20, 1981 on Route 20 in Charlottesville. **DEFENSE STUFFS UCLA AFTER FIRST DOWN**

- UVa yielded 175 yards to the Bruins on first down in the season opener.
- However, No. 7 UCLA only managed 183 combined yards on second, third and fourth down against the Cavaliers.
- That comes out to an average of 5.8 yards per first down play and 4.2 yards average for second, third and fourth down combined. UCLA was 0-2 on fourth down chances.

**DEFENSE PRESSURES VAUNTED UCLA OFFENSE**

- UVa sacked UCLA quarterback Brett Hundley five times and recorded 11 tackles for a loss.
- TCU and Baylor are the only football programs during the opening weekend of college football to amass more tackles for loss. TCU had 14.0 and Baylor had 13.0.
- Baylor, FIU and Louisiana-Monroe are the only programs during the opening weekend of college football to record more sacks than the Cavaliers. Baylor had 8.0, while FIU and Louisiana-Monroe had 6.0.

**UVA RETURNS EXPERIENCE IN THE SECONDARY**

- UVa opened the 2014 season with 112 career starts among its returning defensive backs, which was the most in the nation amongst teams that run schemes with four defensive backs.
- Demetrious Nicholson leads the group with 30 career starts. He started the first 30 games of his collegiate career before being hurt in game five last season against Ball State and did not play the rest of the season.
- All-American Anthony Harris is second among returning defensive backs entering the season with 23 career starts.
- 2014 is a stark difference over 2012 when UVa was one of the four schools in the nation without a senior in the secondary and started four sophomores for most games, sometimes throwing a freshman into the mix. 2012 sophomores Anthony Harris (12), DreQuan Hoskey (10) and Brandon Phelps (12) started the majority of the games, while 2012 freshman Maurice Canady (2) also started two games. Now they make up one of the nation's most experienced defensive backfields.

**COLEY & ROMERO RETURN FOR SENIOR CAMPAIGN**

- Senior linebackers Henry Coley and Daquan Romero each return to starting lineup for the Cavaliers.
- Coley moved to inside linebacker in 2013 and led UVa with 91 tackles.
- He is a two-time All-ACC Academic team member, already owns a degree in African American studies and an extension of defensive coordinator Jon Tenuta.
- In 2013 Romero was second on the team with 89 tackles and No. 13 in the ACC.

**DEPTH ON THE DEFENSIVE LINE**

- UVa may have no seniors starting on the defensive line in 2014, but they have a lot of depth and experience.
- David Dean, Eli Harold, Mike Moore and Donte Wilkins have all started games for the Cavaliers.
- The likes of Andrew Brown, Trent Corney and Kwontie Moore will see time to give rest to the unit as a whole.
- This wasn't always the case, guys like Harold (806 plays) and Dean (719 plays) saw significant time in 2013.

**BLANDING AND BROWN BEGIN UVA CAREERS**

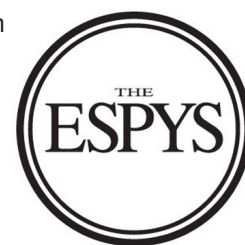
- Freshmen Quin Blanding and Andrew Brown became the first multiple five-star recruits UVa signed in one year since 2002 when the Cavaliers signed three, Ahmad Brooks, Michael Johnson and Kai Parham.
- Brooks later prepped a year at Hargrave Military and enrolled a year later.
- Brown was rated the No. 5 overall recruit in the nation and the No. 1 defensive tackle, while Blanding was rated the No. 10 overall recruit in the nation and No. 1 safety.
- Blanding and Brown join TB Taquan Mizzell as former five-star recruits on the UVa roster. Mizzell, nicknamed Smoke in high school for his elusiveness, signed in 2013 and was the first five-star recruit for the Cavaliers since Eugene Monroe in 2005.

**FRESHMAN QUIN BLANDING GETS THE STARTING NOD AT FREE SAFETY**

- Freshman Quin Blanding made his collegiate debut against UCLA.
- Blanding started at free safety and was the first UVa true freshman to start a season opener at one of the two safety positions since Tony Blount did so on Sept. 11, 1976.
- Blount played strong safety for the Cavaliers in a road opener at Washington, Virginia's first-ever game against a Pac-12 school. At the time of the 1976 game it was the Pac-8 Conference.
- Blanding is the first true freshman Cavalier at any position to start a season opener since fellow UVa teammate Demetrious Nicholson did so in 2011. Nicholson and Blanding are both graduates of Bayside High School in Virginia Beach.
- Blount was a four-year letterwinner (1976-79) and starter for the Cavaliers. Current UVa defensive coordinator Jon Tenuta was Blount's backup at one point.

**ANDREW BROWN IS UVA'S SECOND GATORADE NATIONAL PLAYER OF THE YEAR - ATTENDS ESPYS**

- UVa freshman defensive tackle was named the 2013 Gatorade High School National Player of the Year.
- Former UVa great Terry Kirby is the only other Cavalier football player to earn the award.
- The five-star recruit is the 11th Virginia athlete to earn Gatorade National Player of the Year honors in their respective sports.
- Current UVa senior women's soccer player Morgan Brian was the 2011 Gatorade National Female Athlete of the Year.
- Seven former UVa men's soccer players and one women's basketball player also won the national honor for their respective sports.
- Brown attended the 2014 ESPYS at the Nokia Theatre in Los Angeles in July.

**ANTHONY HARRIS EARNS THE GRAY-CARRINGTON MEMORIAL SCHOLARSHIP**

- Established in 1971 in memory of Arthur P. "Pete" Gray IV and expanded in 1987 to include Edward C. Carrington Jr., this award honors two outstanding students whose achievements have served as an inspiration to others. Its one of the highest honors given to a UVa student.
- Winners exhibit traits that defined Pete Gray and Ed Carrington, including personal integrity, achievement, leadership and humility.
- Harris said what makes this award special is that it's not a sports award; it's an award that the entire student body is eligible for. "To actually win meant that I accomplished not only some things on the football field, but things within the social and academic community as well," said Harris. "It is a very humbling award."

**ANTHONY HARRIS LED THE NATION IN INTERCEPTIONS IN 2013**

- Anthony Harris led the nation with eight interceptions in 2013.
- Harris set a UVa record recording at least one INT (six overall) in five straight games.
- The eight picks by Harris were four more than the entire UVa team had in 2012.
- The eight interceptions were the most by a Cavalier since Ronde Barber led the ACC with eight in 1994.
- The eight interceptions rank No. 2 all-time at UVa for most in a season.
- Harris' eight interceptions are the most by a UVa safety since Keith McMeans led the nation with nine in 1987. Harris' 2013 season is tied for No. 2 at UVa for INTs in a season with Kevin Cook (1987) and Barber.
- Harris was named a first-team All-American by Sports Illustrated and a second-team honoree by the Walter Camp Football Foundation for his 2013 efforts.

**LOOKING BACK AT 2013: UVA ON THIRD DOWNS**

- UVa closed out 2013 No. 3 in the nation as a defense forcing three and outs, posting a 6.00 three and out average per game.
- UVa's opponents went three and out 72 times over 12 games; 39.3 percent of UVa's opponents drives ended in a three and out.
- UVa was No. 2 in the ACC as Clemson was No. 2 in the nation with 6.08 three and outs per game.
- The Cavaliers improved on their 2012 numbers when they finished No. 15 in the nation in three and outs per game with a 4.58 average.
- UVa's defense in 2013 held strong on third downs.
- UVa's opponents were 58-181 (.320) on third downs.
- UVa finished 2013 ranked No. 8 in the nation on third down defense and No. 3 in the ACC.

**TENUTA GAVE UVA'S DEFENSE AN AGGRESSIVE MAKEOVER IN 2013 AND IT CONTINUES INTO 2014**

- Virginia's associate head coach for defense and defensive coordinator Jon Tenuta is a UVa alum and has brought an aggressive makeover to the Cavaliers since he came home to Charlottesville in 2013.
- UVa over the six seasons prior to Tenuta Uava had the sixth-worst turnover margin in the nation. In 2012 UVa recorded only four interceptions, the fewest by a Virginia Cavalier team since the birth of the forward pass.
- Tenuta said prior to the 2013 season that "we want to create problems for the front five and never let the quarterback set his feet in the passing game."
- UVa over the past few seasons have been near the bottom nationally in turnover margin and sacks per game – Tenuta wants to change that.
- During Tenuta's first season at UVa the Cavaliers boasted Anthony Harris who led the nation in interceptions. Eli Harold was No. 4 in the nation among underclassmen with 8.5 sacks.
- Tenuta enters his 34th season of collegiate coaching and his 18th as a defensive coordinator. He has had stops in the ACC, Big Ten, Big 12 and at Notre Dame and looks to continue to create turnovers and sack numbers that have declined in recent years at UVa prior.

**NICHOLSON ANCHORS DEFENSIVE SECONDARY**

- Senior CB Demetrious Nicholson is now the veteran of the Virginia defense, starting the first 30 games of his career since he stepped foot on Grounds prior to the 2011 season.
- An injury in the third quarter against Ball State led him to miss the final seven games of the 2013 season and the first game of 2014.
- Of the 2,055 defensive plays Virginia lined up for since the opening game of the 2011 season until the injury against Ball State, Nicholson played 1,981 of those plays, meaning from Sept. 3, 2011 through Oct. 5, 2013 he played 96.39 percent of UVa's defensive plays.
- In 2011 Nicholson became the first freshman to start the season-opener at the cornerback position since Kevin Cook in 1986, when the Cavaliers faced South Carolina in Scott Stadium.

**COLEY & MOORE SPEND 2013 SUMMER IN AFRICA**

- Linebackers Henry Coley and Kwontie Moore took a summer class at Virginia that took them to South Africa in July 2013.
- Coley and Moore paid attention to the social, economic and environmental aspects in and throughout different regions of South Africa.
- From rural regions to industrial ones, the class conversed, ate, slept and fellowshiped with locals all over the region in order to fully immerse themselves in the culture.
- The trip included two students from South Africa, 11 UVa students and one Ohio State student.
- The group visited schools, villages and took part in intellectual sharing between the groups.
- Coley and Moore were able to do some sightseeing and visit some historical landmarks, museums and Kruger National Park.



**KICK RETURN COVERAGE ON UCLA**

- UCLA averaged 24.9 yards per kick return in 2013, but Virginia held the Bruins to 49 total kick return yards over four returns, a 12.25 yards per return average.
- Wilfred Wahee led UVa with two tackles on kick-offs, his first collegiate action after sitting out 2013 with a knee injury.

**KHALEK SHEPHERD EYES KR RECORD**

- Senior Khalek Shepherd set a UVa season record in 2012 with 929 kick return yards.
- Shepherd currently sits No. 3 all-time at UVa with 1,468 career kick return yards and needs 176 more yards to pass No. 1 Joe Sroba (1,645).
- Shepherd is the son of former NFL wide receiver Leslie Shepherd, who spent seven seasons in the NFL with the Redskins, Browns and Dolphins after a stellar career at Temple.

**IAN FRYE RETURNS HEALTHY IN 2014**

- Junior PK Ian Frye returns healthy in 2014 after missing the final eight games after he sustained an injury in the Pitt game.
- Frye connected on 2-of-2 field goals and both PATs he attempted against UCLA in his first game action since Pitt.
- Frye's range can reach 50+ and owns the third-longest made field goal in program history, connecting on a 53-yard field goal as time expired in the first half against BYU.
- The kick is tied with Connor Hughes, who hit his 53-yarder in 2003 against Wake Forest.
- The program record is 56 yards by Kenny Stadlin in 1984 against Virginia Tech and matched by Rafael Garcia vs. Texas in 1995.
- Coach London put Frye on scholarship during the spring semester.

**UVA WILL DEBUT A NEW LONG SNAPPER**

- UVa will debut a new long snapper in 2014 after using only two over the past seven seasons.
- From 2007-10 Danny Aiken was UVa's long snapper before moving on to the NFL. He currently is the New England Patriots' long snapper.
- Matt Fortin succeeded Aiken during for the 2011 season and held the job through 2013.
- Fortin's graduation in May has forced a competition between redshirt freshmen Alex Foertsch and Tyler Shirley for the open long snapper spot.

**ALEC VOZENILEK CAN PLACE KICK IN A PINCH**

- UVa punter Alec Vozenilek is an option to place kick in a pinch if needed. The precedent was set last season.
- Due to an injury to Ian Frye at Pitt in 2013, UVa's punter Alec Vozenilek filled in on field goals and PAT attempts the rest of the 2013 season.
- Vozenilek kicked his first two career field goals, making a 39-yard field goal on his first career attempt. He later made a 38-yard field goal and both his PAT attempts against Ball State.
- Vozenilek also did his normal duties of punting, booting one 56 yards and averaging 45.0 yards per punt.
- Vozenilek kicked a career-high four field goals at Maryland. His fifth attempt sailed wide right from 42 yards in the game's final seconds.

**ALEC VOZENILEK IS A SEASONED PUNTER**

- Alec Vozenilek returns for his final season after serving as UVa's punter the past two seasons. His punting numbers have improved over the last 24 games. Of Vozenilek's 151 career punts, 43.7 percent have gone for 50 yards, or have pinned an opponent inside the 20 yard line.
- Vozenilek booted the fifth-longest punt in the nation in 2013 with a 77-yard kick at Pitt. The punt was also the fourth longest in UVa history.
- Vozenilek punted 13 balls over 50 yards and averaged 41.2 yards per kick in 2013.

## CAVALIERS IN NFL CAMPS ENTERING 2014

- There were seven seniors on UVA's roster in 2013. Five of those seniors decided to pursue a career in professional football and took part in UVA's NFL Pro Day.
- All five of UVA's participants from its NFL Pro Day in March have taken part in a camp this NFL Preseason.
- OG/C Luke Bowanko (Jaguars), OT Morgan Moses (Redskins) and DT Brent Urban (Ravens) were all drafted.
- WR Tim Smith (Browns) and DE Jake Snyder (Vikings) signed free agent contracts. Both have since been released.
- Overall, 22 former Cavaliers are currently playing in the NFL.

**DID YOU KNOW?**

• UVa freshman Quin Blanding was named after the folk-rock song titled "The Mighty Quinn" by his mother Cory Lee. It was the first song she heard following a checkup during her seventh month of pregnancy and the moment held significant meaning to her. At that checkup the doctor's told her they thought they saw a hole in Quin's head and that it appeared to them his cerebrum wasn't connected. Quin was born completely healthy. Cory named him Quin with one "n" instead of two in recognition of that moment during pregnancy.

• Blanding's father Kevin played football at NCAA Division II Glenville State (W.V.) for current Arizona football head coach Rich Rodriguez.

• UVa head coach Mike London's younger brother, Paul, was a defensive back for Virginia from 1992-95. Paul played a major part during UVa's NCAA record streak of 39 straight games with at least one interception. The streak ran from Nov. 6, 1993 through Nov. 29, 1996.

• UVa quarterback David Watford and current wide receivers coach Marques Hagans are first cousins and both were quarterbacks at Hampton High before enrolling at UVa.

• UVa's oldest living football alum, Dr. John Risher, turned 104 years old this year; he also works in the press box on the UVa stats crew on game day. (More on page 18).

• Paul Wisman also works in the press box on the UVa stats crew staff and has done so since 1956. His 59 straight years of work in the press box is the longest current streak in the nation (More on page 18).

• Current UVa offensive line coach Scott Wachenheim was the offensive coordinator at Liberty (2006-08) when UVa WR Dominique Terrell's older brother, Zach, was a standout All-Big South running back and slot receiver for the Flames.

• CB Demetrious Nicholson has been growing his signature dread locks since the summer of 2005, just before he entered the sixth grade.

• WR Kyle Dockins also has been growing his dread locks since the sixth grade, dating back to 2006.

• Sophomore CB Kelvin Rainey has two brothers that have played FBS football. His older brother Johnathan played at New Mexico (2008-11), while his other older brother Derrick played at Arizona (2010-13).

• Air Force Academy graduate and UVa assistant coach Scott Wachenheim was awarded his bachelor's degree by then-President Ronald Reagan.

• Graduate assistant Jacob Hodges served as a team manager for two years (2008, 2009) and then was a three-year letterwinner as UVa's holder (2010-12).

• DE Trent Corney's older brother, Taylor, won the Bronze at the 2009 Pan American Junior Championships in the Decathlon. Taylor has also been ranked in the Top 10 in the world in the Decathlon.

• Matt Johns made his collegiate debut as the UVa holder in 2013. The first time Johns made it into a college game he had to hold in the rain on Ian Frye's 53-yard field goal in the 2013 season-opening win over BYU. Frye's kick sailed through as time expired in the first half, tying the third-longest field goal in UVa history.

• P/PK Alec Vozenilek's younger brother Rob is a member of UVa's men's basketball squad. On off days from spring football, Alec drove down to Greensboro, N.C., to support his brother and watch UVa win the ACC Tournament. Alec also attended all of UVa's NCAA Tournament games in Raleigh, N.C., and at Madison Square Garden in New York City.

## GREYSON LAMBERT TO MAKE FIRST CAREER START AGAINST UCLA

- On May 5 after the conclusion of spring practice, UVa head coach Mike London put Greyson Lambert atop of his post-spring depth chart at quarterback. The redshirt sophomore started his first collegiate game in the season opener against UCLA.
- Lambert is the fifth different QB to start a game during the Mike London era at Virginia.
- Of London's 50 games at UVa, 21 have been started by Michael Rocco, 12 by Marc Verica, 12 by David Watford, four by Phillip Sims and one by Lambert.
- Lambert is the eighth different UVa QB to start a game since the start of the 2007 season. Included in that group was two games started by Vic Hall and two by Peter Lalich. The other 83 games over the span of eight seasons have been started by Jameel Sewell (23), Marc Verica (22), Michael Rocco (21), David Watford (12), Phillip Sims (4) and Greyson Lambert (1).

## GREYSON LAMBERT ON A SHORT LIST OF ACC QUARTERBACKS

- Greyson Lambert attempted 75 passes in his seven games off the bench in 2013.
- Despite making his first career start Saturday against UCLA, Lambert is one of the more experienced starting ACC quarterbacks from last year.
- Lambert is one six starting ACC quarterbacks in 2014 that attempted at least 50 passes last season.
- The other quarterbacks with at least 50 pass attempts in 2013 are from Clemson (Cole Stoudt), Duke (Anthony Boone), Florida State (Jameis Winston), North Carolina (Marquise Williams) and Syracuse (Terrel Hunt).

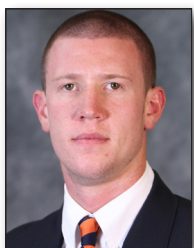

- David Watford and current UVa wide receivers coach Marques Hagans are first cousins.
- Both played quarterback at Hampton High School in Hampton, Va., and Watford followed his older cousin to UVa to play quarterback.
- Hagans was the starting quarterback at UVa from 2004-05. He was wide receiver and kick returner in 2002 and 2003 when he was the back up quarterback to Matt Schaub.
- Other notable quarterbacks from the Hampton HS football family are Ronald Curry and Tyrod Taylor.

## WATFORD IN THE UVA RECORD BOOK

- David Watford owns a few UVa passing records.
- Watford owns the UVa record for completions in a game with 43 against Georgia Tech last season. The mark is also an opponent record for the Yellow Jackets.
- His 61 attempts against Georgia Tech is also a UVa record for a game.
- Watford passed for 376 yards against Georgia Tech in 2013, the fourth highest passing total in UVa history.
- Watford also owns the single season UVa record for completions in a season by a sophomore with 244.
- His 427 passing attempts in 2013 are also a school record for a season.

## WATFORD OWNS OVERTIME WIN FOR VIRGINIA

- David Watford led UVa to an overtime victory over Idaho in 2011.
- Coming off the bench as a true freshman, Watford completed a 27-yard pass to fellow true freshman Dominique Terrell for what ended up as the game-winning touchdown.
- The Virginia defense deflected a two-point attempt afterwards to solidify the overtime victory, 21-20.
- Watford ended the Idaho game 10-of-20 for 95 yards and the touchdown.

## JOHNS SHINES OFF THE BENCH VS. UCLA

- Matt Johns threw his first collegiate passes against No. 7 UCLA.
- His first collegiate pass came on UVa's final drive of the second quarter, he connected with Canaan Severin for 32 yards.
- The next play he rushed for nine yards before stepping out of bounds.
- Johns capped the drive on the very next play with a 29-yard scoring strike to Andre Levrone, the first collegiate touchdown for both Cavaliers.
- Johns finished the game 13-of-22 for 154 yards and two touchdowns.
- The UCLA game marked the second time Johns played quarterback for the Cavaliers.
- Johns played quarterback against VMI in 2013, but only handed the ball off.

## JOHNS IS UVA'S PRIMARY HOLDER

- Johns has held on every field goal attempt and PAT since the 2013 season opener against BYU.
- The very first collegiate play for Johns came when he held on Ian Frye's 53-yard field goal as time expired in the second quarter against BYU in 2013. The field goal by Frye is tied for the third longest in UVa history.

## A LOOK BACK AT COLLEGE FOOTBALL HISTORY ON THE GROUNDS OF UVA AS THE COLONNADES AT LAMBETH FIELD CELEBRATE 101 YEARS

- The colonnades at Lambeth Field turn 101 in 2014. The playing surface at Lambeth Field hosted Virginia football from 1902 until Scott Stadium opened up in the midst of the 1931 season on Oct. 15, 1931.
- Lambeth Field is the location where the American game of football that we know today, played from youth league all the way up to the NFL, was first played.
- It all started in 1909 with the death of UVA's Archer Christian.
- Christian died in 1909 as a result of injuries sustained in a football game at Georgetown on Nov. 13, 1909. Christian's death highlighted 29 football related deaths during the 1909 season. Papers from all over the country carried the front-page headline of Christian's death.
- Former UVA President Edwin A. Alderman and the father of UV athletics, William Lambeth, went to New York City to meet with other presidents and administrators from other big time universities to discuss how they could make the game of football safer.
- At the time there was legislation happening in Washington to make it illegal to play the game of football in America.
- A new rules committee that was appointed from that meeting in New York City included Lambeth and the father of American football, Walter Camp.
- Lambeth noted to the committee, which met almost on a monthly basis, that the two deaths he had seen personally were due to exhaustion. At the time there were no substitutions, if you came out you could no longer return. The original game had a lot of pulling and pushing. Players were not considered down until they really couldn't move under the pile. Lambeth suggested that the game be split into four quarters, totaling 15 minutes a piece and that players could substitute back in. Walter Camp's notes from the committee meetings credit Lambeth, in the margins, with these changes.
- The committee asked Lambeth to take the new rules back to the University of Virginia and experiment with them during the spring of 1910.
- On the Grounds of the University of Virginia, under the watchful eye of William Lambeth, a new version of American football, divided into four quarters was played for the first time in history.
- Other notable rules that were played for the first time that spring at Lambeth Field were: seven men required on the line at the time of the snap, players could no longer push or pull the ball carrier and the forward pass could now be made across the line of scrimmage.
- Virginia football returned to its roots at Lambeth Field during camp in 2013 and 2014, taking part in various scrimmages and practices on the hallowed ground.

## WISEMAN AND RISHER HAVE BOTH WORKED ON UVA'S FOOTBALL STAT CREW FOR 50+ YEARS

- Paul Wiseman and Dr. John Risher have each worked on the stats crew at Scott Stadium for over 50 years.
- Wiseman enters his 58th consecutive season on the UVA stat crew, which is tied with Toledo's Chet Sullwold for the longest active streak in FBS football. Both men started in 1956.
- Risher began in 1963 and enters his 51st season in a row.
- Risher used to be Wiseman's primary care physician in Lynchburg before retiring. When Risher found out what Wiseman did with UVA, he hounded him to plug him in with the stats crew too.
- Risher is UVA's oldest living football alum. He turned 104 on May 13 of this year. He golfed nine holes on his 100th birthday in 2010.
- Wiseman has missed only one home game at Scott Stadium since he started working on the stat crew and that was the 2011 season-opening game against William & Mary.
- The William & Mary game in 2011 is the only home game Wiseman has missed for that matter at Scott Stadium since 1946.
- In April 2013, both Risher and Wiseman were recipients of the "Order of the Crossed Sabre" award, which goes annually to someone who has contributed greatly to Virginia football.

Mike London enters his fifth season at Virginia with a complete roster of players he has recruited, a large number of returning letterwinners and all of his coaching coordinators from the 2013 campaign. Fresh off a recruiting class that included two top-10 prospects for the first time in the program's history, London believes the Cavaliers are in position to return to the form that saw UVa win eight

games in 2011 and compete in the Chick-fil-A Bowl.

Facing one of the nation's toughest schedules in 2014 will be a challenge, but the energetic London feels the Cavaliers are ready to turn the corner. With recruiting classes consistently ranked among the top-30 in the nation, Virginia is in a position to erase the memories of the 2013 campaign when it went 2-10 with a roster that featured just six seniors who played on a consistent basis. In both 2012 and 2013, the Cavaliers were among the nation's leading teams in terms of playing true freshmen.

Knowing London's backstory, it is easy to understand why he is so optimistic as well as why his players enjoy and embrace his coaching approach.

A former Richmond police detective, London's time in law enforcement dealing with the entire spectrum of human emotions and actions has provided a wealth of experience that he draws on to assist players both on and off the field. There are few stressful situations he has not faced — including having a loaded pistol pointed at him and the trigger pulled, only to have the weapon malfunction and not discharge its potentially lethal round.

London also had the remarkable opportunity to save one of his daughter's lives when he was identified as a perfect match for her rare bone marrow disorder. That opportunity is one reason why London is an advocate of servitude and makes sure his players understand and embrace the concept of giving back through a variety of community services activities. One of the most visible is the team's annual bone marrow donor registration drive as part of the national "Get in the Game, Save a Life" initiative.

London's biography includes plenty of chapters of football success on the field as well.

In the spring of 2013 OT Oday Aboushi was selected by the New York Jets to mark the 30th consecutive season a UVa player has been picked in the NFL Draft, the second longest streak among ACC schools.

In 2011, he led Virginia to one of its most outstanding seasons as the Cavaliers went 8-4 during the regular season, finished second in the ACC's Coastal Division with a 5-3 mark and played Auburn in the 2011 Chick-fil-A Bowl. The Cavaliers were one win from advancing to the ACC's Championship game.

The Virginia turnaround featured four games that the team won in the final seconds. Along the way the Cavaliers became the first college football program to ever win road games at Miami and Florida State in the same season on the way to UVa being ranked in the Associated Press Top-25 poll for the first time since the 2007 season.

For his efforts, London was recognized as the Atlantic Coast Conference's Coach of the Year. He was also selected by the Fellowship of Christian Athletes to receive its 2011 Grant Teaff Coach of the Year Award. Five of his players earned either first or second-team All-ACC honors. The 2011 team saw two players — CB Chase Minnifield and OG Austin Pasztor — receive All-America honors and CB Demetrius Nicholson was named a Freshman All-American.

Since taking over the Virginia program London has worked tirelessly to build relationships with the University's faculty and staff, alumni and former players, fans and supporters and the region's high school coaches. He has made dozens of appearances, spoke at clinics and been readily available to the media.

He has had the team hold spring practices and coaches clinics across the state, including in Virginia Beach to build support and interest in one of the state's most fertile recruiting areas.

He defines the culture for the football team by prescribing three basic tenets for his players:

- Go to Class
- Show Class
- Treat People with Dignity and Respect

The results of his actions were tangible. In his first spring semester at UVa the team posted its best cumulative grade point average in 10 years. Those results have continued to improve and during the spring of 2013, his players once again set a high mark for its GPA.

While all of those things are impressive, London is the first to remind everyone his primary goal is to reverse the fortunes of the Cavalier program on the field. Success has been a big part of the Mike London story even prior to being named the 39th coach in the Virginia program's history.

In two seasons at Richmond, London led the Spiders to a 24-5 record. In his first year at the helm, his team went 13-3 and won the Football Championship Series national title. The 2009 Spider team, ranked nine consecutive weeks at No. 1 in the FCS polls, went 11-2 and reached the quarterfinals of the FCS playoffs. His teams were 13-4 in the Colonial Athletic Association during the 2008 and 2009 campaigns.

London's efforts in 2008 earned him FCS National Coach of the Year honors from both the American Football Coaches Association and Schutt Sports/ American Football Monthly magazine. London was also honored as the Black Coaches Association Male Coach of the Year in 2008, beating out Mike Tomlin of the Super Bowl Champion Pittsburgh Steelers for the award. In addition to the national honors, London was tabbed the State Coach of the Year from both VaSID and the Peninsula Sports Club.

Under London's watch, 16 Spiders were named to the All-CAA Football Team in 2009 after placing 12 in 2008. His first year at UR, nine Spiders garnered 15 All-America awards and six were recognized on the Academic All-Conference Team. DE Lawrence Sidbury was a fourth-round NFL draft pick by the Atlanta Falcons, while RB Josh Vaughan was a free-agent signee by the Tampa Bay Buccaneers.

Before returning to coach his alma mater, London spent six of seven seasons coaching for Al Groh at Virginia. In 2001 London joined the UVa staff for the first time as the defensive line coach. He took over the responsibilities as recruiting coordinator in 2002. In 2005 London left UVa to work as the defensive line coach for the NFL's Houston Texans. He returned to Virginia in 2006 as the defensive coordinator and defensive line coach.

During his tenure with the Cavaliers, he saw five defensive players (Chris Long, Marcus Hamilton, Chris Canty, Andrew Hoffman and Monsanto Pope) drafted by NFL teams. Long was the ACC Defensive Player of the Year in 2007, earned unanimous All-America honors, was the Ted Hendricks Award winner as the nation's top defensive end and the second overall selection in the 2008 NFL Draft.

A native of Hampton, Va., London played defensive back at Richmond from 1979-82. Under head coach Dal Shealy, he led the Spiders with six interceptions as a senior captain in 1982. In addition to earning all-state honors, he was chosen the team's MVP and received the Spiders' Coaches Award. In 1982, the Virginia Peninsula Sports Club selected him as the male in-state Athlete of the Year.

London graduated from Richmond in 1983 with a bachelor's degree in sociology and a year later received a degree in law enforcement from the Richmond Police Academy, serving as a detective for the street crimes unit from November of 1984 to July of 1989. The Dallas Cowboys signed him as a free agent in 1983.

London broke into the collegiate coaching ranks in 1989, spending two seasons with Richmond as the outside linebackers coach and admissions liaison, followed by four seasons (1991-94) as the defensive line coach at William & Mary.

He returned to Richmond for two more years (1995-96) as the outside linebackers coach and recruiting coordinator, coaching All-America LB Shawn Barber, who was a fourth-round draft pick by the Washington Redskins in 1998 and played 10 years in the NFL. London served as defensive line coach at Boston College for the 1997-2000 seasons, where he helped lead the Eagles to two bowl appearances.

London and his wife Regina, are the parents of four children — Ticynn, Korben, Jaicyn and Madicyn. He has three older children, Michael, Jr., Brandon and Kristen through a previous marriage. The 53-year-old London was born in West Point, N.Y. in 1960.

His son, Brandon, led Massachusetts in receiving in 2006 and finished his career as the school's second leading receiver. He was signed to the Miami Dolphins active roster in 2008 after spending the 2007 season on the Super Bowl Champion New York Giants practice squad. Brandon since 2010 has been with the Montreal Alouettes of the CFL. One of London's daughters, Kristen, played on the UVa women's basketball team during the 2007-08 and 2008-09 seasons. His younger brother, Paul, was a defensive back at UVa from 1991-95.
