VIRGINIA-NORTH CAROLINA SERIES

- The Tar Heels lead the all-time series against UVa, 165-87-4.
- It marks Virginia's most games (256) against any opponent.
- The teams split four games last year, with the Tar Heels winning two of three in Charlottesville before Virginia prevailed 8-7 in 11 innings in the ACC Baseball Championship.
- The teams have split the last 10 meetings.

CAVALIER PLAYERS CAREER VS. TAR HEELS

- John Barr is 4-for-11 (.364) with four runs scored in his career vs. UNC. He is the top returning UVa hitter vs. the Tar Heels.
- Andrew Carraway made two starts last year (0-0, 5.40 ERA, 10 IP) against the Tar Heels and has a 5.79 career ERA vs. UNC.
- Matt Packer has an 0-1 career record but a strong 3.27 ERA vs. UNC. Last year he pitched seven scoreless innings against the Tar Heels.

VIRGINIA'S POWER SURGE

- Virginia has hit 20 home runs in its first 23 games. It took the Cavaliers 38 games last year (April 22) to rack up 20 homers.
- UVa had 25 home runs in all of 2008.
- Five Cavaliers have at least three homers this year – only three players had at least three in 2008.

PARKER SETS THE TABLE WELL

- Jarrett Parker has been strong as UVa's new leadoff hitter.
- He is tied for second in the ACC with 26 runs scored and scored at least one run in 15 of 18 games
- Parker ranks seventh in the ACC in batting (.402). He leads the ACC in triples (4) and total bases (67) and is among the top 10 in nearly every offensive category.

RUNNING THE GAUNTLET

- UVa is in the midst of a brutal ACC stretch, competing against each of the league's 2008 College World Series participants in consecutive weeks.
- Two weeks ago the Cavaliers played host to FSU. Miami came to Charlottesville last weekend, and Virginia travels to North Carolina this weekend. UVa is 2-2 in the stretch so far (1-0 vs. FSU, 1-2 vs. Miami).
- Virginia is the lone ACC school to face these three teams in consecutive weeks this year.

CAVALIERS SHORE UP THE DEFENSE

- Since committing a season-high five errors Feb. 27 vs. Fordham, the Cavaliers have made only 11 miscues since.
- UVa had a .949 fielding percentage in the first eight games, but has a .980 mark over the last 15.
- Virginia ranks third in the ACC in team fielding at .969.

PITCHING OFF TO BLAZING START

- The Virginia pitching staff has racked up the best ERA (2.49) in the conference thus far.
- Clemson is second with a 2.82 ERA.
- The Cavaliers have surrendered just 157 hits (68/game) this year.
- Opponents are batting an ACC-low .209 against Virginia pitching.

DON'T FORGET THE SPEED TOO

- Virginia leads the ACC with 58 stolen bases (in 67 attempts).
- That total ranks third nationally behind Savannah State (79) and Kansas State (67).
- No ACC team has attempted more than 51 stolen bases this year.
- NC State is second with 40 steals.
- Four Wahoos ranks among the top six in the ACC in steals, highlighted by Tyler Cannon with a league-high 12. Phil Gosselin (11) and Dan Grovatt (10) rank second and fifth, respectively.
- Jarrett Parker is tied for sixth with nine.
- Virginia has led the ACC in stolen bases in each of the last three seasons.

NOTING THE MIAMI SERIES

- In game one, Virginia handed Miami starter Chris Hernandez his first career loss, hanging seven runs (five earned) on the sophomore.
- The last two games each boiled down to one tough inning.
- In the second game, Miami scored all four of its runs with two out. UM then tallied three in the eighth inning of the third contest.
- It marked the only times the Canes scored more than one run in an inning in the last two games.

NOTING THE 19-GAME WIN STREAK

- Virginia started the season with a 19-game winning streak, the longest win streak in school history.
- The streak came to a halt with a 4-3 loss last Saturday to Miami.

- UVA was the last unbeaten team in Division I and held the longest active winning streak in Division I.
- The Cavaliers started 5-0 in the ACC for the first time in school history.

FIFTH-LONGEST STREAK IN ACC HISTORY

- The Cavaliers' 19-game win streak is tied for the sixth-longest in ACC history.
- It was the longest streak by an ACC team since FSU ran off 25 straight wins in 2002.

OFFENSE AMONG NATION'S BEST

- Virginia ranks fifth nationally in team batting average (.374 entering the week).
- The Cavaliers also are fifth in runs (215) and hits (282).

PITCHING UP THERE AS WELL

- Virginia's pitching staff ranks third in the country in ERA (2.39 entering the week).
- UVA also stands third in strikeouts per nine innings (10.4) and fourth in hits allowed per nine innings (6.65)

HULTZEN GETS OFF ON THE RIGHT FOOT

- Freshman Danny Hultzen has had five-consecutive strong starts to kick off his college career, going 5-0 in the process.
- In 32 innings this year, Hultzen has whiffed 45 batters – most in the ACC. In contrast, he has walked only seven.
- Hultzen already has a 13-strikeout game (vs. FSU), a 12-strikeout performance (vs. Fordham) and a nine-strikeout game (at Wake Forest).

EVERYONE HITS!

- Virginia has made a habit of batting around in innings this year.
- In 23 games, the Cavaliers have batted around 18 times.
- UVA's high for the year is 12 batters in one inning against George Washington.
- UVA scored a season-high seven runs in the second frame Tuesday vs. Towson.

HULTZEN NAMED ACC PITCHER OF WEEK

- Danny Hultzen was named the ACC's Pitcher of the Week following his big performance vs. Florida State.
- Hultzen tossed seven innings vs. the Seminoles, giving up one earned run, four hits and two walks while striking out a career-best 13.
- He struck out seven in a row from the first to the third inning and did not allow a runner past first until the seventh inning.

13 Ks: IT'S BEEN AWHILE

- Hultzen's 13-strikeout performance was the most for a UVA pitcher since Sean Doolittle

had 13 at Maryland in 2006.

- It was the most by a UVA freshman since 1994 when Seth Greisinger recorded 15 against North Carolina.
- Greisinger was the last Cavalier pitcher to post more than 13 strikeouts – he had 16 in 1996 against North Carolina.

RACKING UP RUNS IN RECORD NUMBERS

- Virginia piled up 177 runs through its first 15 games – the most ever at UVA.
- The previous high was 161 runs during the first 15 games of the 1898 season.

GROVATT 19-GAME HIT STREAK ENDS

- Dan Grovatt saw his career-best 19-game hitting streak (21 dating to last season) end last Saturday.
- It was the longest hit streak for a Cavalier since Brandon Guyer had a 26-game streak in 2007.

GOSELIN REBOUNDS FROM TOUGH START

- After starting the season 0-for-16 in the first weekend, Phil Gosselin has bounced back in a big way, going 30-for-70 (.429) in the last 19 games.
- He has been the Cavaliers' top run-producer this year with an ACC-high 33 RBI.

PROSCIA KEEPS MASHING

- In his freshman season, Steven Proscia has gotten off to an outstanding start.
- He ranks 11th in the ACC (first among freshmen) with a .389 batting average.
- Proscia is third in the ACC with 11 doubles and seventh in the league in hits (35), RBI (25) and total bases (57).
- He has at least one RBI in 19 of 23 games.

ARE THOSE NUMBERS FOR REAL?

- Virginia's offense has put up some eye-popping numbers thus far, highlighted by its .374 team batting average, which leads the ACC.
- The Cavaliers have posted at least 10 hits in all but three games this year.
- UVA has at least 20 hits in four games.
- The Cavaliers have racked up 92 extra-base hits (62 2B, 10 3B, 20 HR) among 308 hits.

WHAT A SERIES - UVA WALLOPS WAKE

- Virginia put up some blistering numbers in the series sweep at Wake Forest.
- UVA hit .452 as a team and had a .500 on base percentage.
- The Cavaliers scored 47 runs and had 61 hits (16 doubles, 5 home runs) in three games.
- The 47 runs in the series were UVA's most in an ACC series since a 1990 series at Maryland.
- The 18- and 21-run games were the most scored in a single ACC road game since a 29-run outburst at Maryland in 1990.
- Every UVA starter had a hit in each of the three games.

LEADING OFF WITH A BANG

- Jarrett Parker has hit two home runs to lead off games, the first two dingers of his career.
- Parker's first leadoff homer was Virginia's first home run to lead off a game since Mark Reynolds hit one at Liberty on May 18, 2004.

DAVENPORT DOMINANCE

- Virginia is 18-2 this year in the friendly confines of Davenport Field after going 31-9 last season.
- UVa is 164-37 (.816) at Davenport since 2002, including 54-22 (.711) in ACC games.
- In nonconference games, the record is even more impressive – 110-15 (.880).

ROBERTS HAS MEMORABLE FIRST START

- In his first college start against William & Mary (Feb. 24), Will Roberts recorded eight strikeouts in five innings (3 H, 1 BB).
- It was the most strikeouts for a freshman in his first start since Andrew Carraway racked up eight vs. VMI on April 18, 2006.

CARRAWAY, POUTIER SERVE AS 2009 CAPTAINS

- Virginia has two captains this year – seniors Andrew Carraway and Robert Poutier.
- Poutier, who graduated in 2008 and is currently working on his master's degree, is serving as a captain for the second straight year.
- Carraway is a three-time All-ACC Academic Baseball Team honoree and currently is living on the Lawn at UVa – one of the highest honors bestowed upon UVa students.

CARRAWAY NAMED LOWE'S SENIOR CLASS AWARD CANDIDATE

- Andrew Carraway has been named one of 30 baseball candidates for the Lowe's Senior CLASS Award.
- To be eligible, a student-athlete must be a Division I senior and have notable achievements in four areas of excellence: Classroom, Character, Community, and Competition.
- The award focuses on the total student-athlete and encourages those leaders to use their platform in athletics to make a positive impact on their circle of influence.
- The list will be narrowed to 10 in mid-April.

UVA AMONG SELECT FEW IN LAST FIVE NCAA TOURNAMENTS

- Virginia is one of just 17 Division I baseball programs to reach the NCAA Tournament in each of the last five seasons.
- The Cavaliers are one of five schools in the ACC to hold that distinction, joining Florida State, Miami, North Carolina and NC State.
- The other programs are Arizona State, Arkansas, Cal State Fullerton, Missouri, Oral Roberts, Pepperdine, Rice, South Carolina, Southern Miss, TCU, Texas and Wichita State.

ERA TOPS IN NATION OVER LAST FOUR YEARS

- Virginia pitchers boast a 3.10 ERA over the last four seasons – the lowest ERA in NCAA Division I over the last four seasons.
- UVa ranked third in the nation in ERA in 2005, 2006 and 2007 and was 15th last year.

- From 2006-08, UVa stole 376 bases, an average of 125.3 steals per season.
- The Cavaliers ranked fifth nationally last year with 134 stolen bases. They were 11th in 2007 (128) and 19th in 2006 (114).

- Virginia's returning players accounted for just over half of the total last year (68 of 134, 50.7 percent).

ROOKIES WILL BE KEY

- Virginia has one of its youngest teams in recent memory, featuring 23 underclassmen, including 12 true freshmen.
- UVa returns 19 letterwinners from last season, while losing 11.
- Despite featuring so much youth, the Cavaliers still return four of their top six hitters from 2008.

SUMMER SUCCESS = SPRING SUCCESS?

- Several Cavaliers had extremely strong summers and will look to parlay that into big 2009 seasons.
- Among the top performers:
 - Tyler Wilson (Delaware) earned the Great Lakes Collegiate League Pitcher of the Year Award.
 - Corey Hunt (Sanford) won the New England Collegiate Baseball League's defensive player of the year award.
 - Andrew Carraway (Hyannis – Cape Cod), Sean Lucas (Saratoga – NYCBL), Hunt and Wilson all were named to their respective leagues' all-star teams.
