OPENING KICK

VIRGINIA WELCOMES BC TO SCOTT STADIUM

• Virginia returns home on Saturday when the Cavaliers welcome the Boston College Eagles to Scott Stadium for Homecomings. Kickoff is set for 12:30 p.m. and the game will be televised by regional sports networks.

IT IS HOMECOMINGS IN CHARLOTTESVILLE

• Saturday is Homecomings at UVA and the Cavaliers own a 46-44-2 (.511) all-time Homecomings record.
 • UVA's last win on Homecomings was in 2015 when the Cavaliers defeated Syracuse, 44-38, in three overtimes.

VIRGINIA VS. BOSTON COLLEGE

• This is just the sixth meeting between Boston College and Virginia and the fourth in ACC play.
 • The Eagles own a 5-0 edge in the series, including a 3-0 mark since joining the ACC.
 • The 1994 meeting was in the Carquest Bowl in Miami Gardens, Fla.
 • BC won the first ACC contest between the teams, 28-17, in 2005 in Chestnut Hill.
 • The seven-year gap between meetings is currently the longest hiatus for any of UVA's ACC opponents.
 • UVA is not slated to play Boston College again until the 2024 season.
 • This is only Boston College's second trip to Charlottesville.
 • Syracuse (one) is the only ACC team UVA has played fewer conference games against than Boston College (three). UVA also has played just three ACC games against Louisville, but its fourth matchup with the Cardinals will take place on Nov. 11.



TB Jordan Ellis is coming off a career day at North Carolina when he rushed 27 times for 136 yards. It was the junior's first career 100-yard rushing game and he helped UVA defeat UNC for the first time since 2009 in the South's Oldest Rivalry.

FIVE TOP STORYLINES

• Boston College is the only ACC team Virginia has never beaten, losing all five previous meetings, including three in league play.
 • Virginia has held back-to-back FBS opponents (Duke, 255 and UNC, 257) below 300 yards of total offense for the first time since 2012 when over the course of three games UVA held Maryland (235), Wake Forest (213) and NC State (216) under 300 yards.
 • FS **Quin Blanding** needs 17 tackles to pass Jamie Sharper and become UVA's all-time career leader in that category. He needs two tackles to pass Angelo Crowell for No. 3 all-time at UVA.
 • UVA is 5-1 for the first time since the 2007 season (started 7-1). The Cavaliers are looking to start ACC play 3-0 for only the second time since 2007 when UVA started league play 4-0.
 • UVA has started off 2-0 on the road for the first time since the 2000 season when the Cavaliers won road games at Duke and Wake Forest.

- 1** FS Quin Blanding's 419 career tackles are the most among all active FBS players and ranks No. 4 all-time in the UVA record book.
- 4** WR Andre Levrone is No. 4 in the nation and No. 1 in the ACC with 25.13 yards per reception. He is No. 3 on the team with 377 receiving yards.
- 650** UVA's 20-14 win at North Carolina was the 650th win in the history of the Virginia football program.

On that day, within 90 minutes of the end of practice, injured players' playing status for the next game will be announced in one of five categories:

- Probable
- Questionable
- Doubtful

UNIQUELY UVA

The University of Virginia is an institution rich with history and tradition. Here is some of the terminology that contributes to UVA's culture.

Grounds: The term used by students, faculty and alumni to refer to the University dating as far back as Thomas Jefferson. "Campus" is never used.

First Year, Second Year, Third Year, Fourth Year: Instead of freshman, sophomore, junior, senior. Why you may ask? To be a "senior" implies that a person has reached the final phase of learning, a feat that Thomas Jefferson believed to be impossible, arguing instead that education is a life-long process.

Commonwealth: Virginia is one of four constituent states of the United States of America that officially uses the name "Commonwealth" instead of the word state in all references. The other three commonwealths are Kentucky, Massachusetts and Pennsylvania.

UNIVERSITY NICKNAMES

Virginia's athletics teams have been accompanied by a somewhat confusing array of nicknames. The most prominent and widely accepted of these monikers are "Cavaliers," "Wahoos" and "Hoos."

Although the terms "Cavaliers," "Wahoos" and "Hoos" are used almost interchangeably to refer to University teams and players, "Cavaliers" is more often used by the media, while "Wahoos" and "Hoos" are frequently used by Virginia students and fans.

Legend has it that Washington & Lee baseball fans dubbed the Virginia players "Wahoos" during the fiercely contested rivalry that existed between the two in-state schools in the 1890s. By 1940, "Wahoos" was in general use around Grounds to denote University students or events relating to them. The abbreviated "Hoos" sprang up later in student newspapers and has gained growing popularity in recent years.

THE CAVALIER MASCOT

The costumed Cavalier with a large character head debuted during Virginia's 1984 football season and has remained the official mascot of the University.

The first documented Cavalier on horseback was Francis Bell, a Virginia student from Dublin, Va., in 1947. Bell rode onto the field dressed as Cavaliers for Virginia's home football game with Harvard on the afternoon of October 11.

The Cavalier on horseback returned as the University's mascot in 1963. The UVA Polo Club provided both the horse and rider. However, the mounted Cavalier and his horse parted company in 1974 with the inception of AstroTurf at Scott Stadium.

The mounted Cavalier made its return in the Florida Citrus Bowl at the end of the 1989 football season. Due to its instant popularity, the Cavalier on horseback returned the following season on a regular basis and continues to lead the Virginia football team onto the field at the beginning of all home games.

UNIVERSITY COLORS

Orange and blue were adopted as the University of Virginia's official athletic colors at a mass student meeting in 1888. UVA athletic teams had previously worn silver gray and cardinal red, but those colors did not stand out on muddy football fields, prompting a student movement to change them.

One of the students attending the mass meeting was Allen Potts, a star athlete who played on Virginia's first football team in 1888. Potts showed up at the meeting wearing a navy blue-and-orange scarf that he had acquired during a summer boating expedition at Oxford University. Orange and blue were chosen as the official athletic colors after one of Potts' fellow students pulled the scarf off Potts' neck and, waving it to the crowd, yelled, "How will this do?" UVA later served as the inspiration for schools like Auburn and Florida when they selected school colors.

WAH-HOO-WAH

The origin of "Wah-hoo-wah" is uncertain. The cheer was used to root on Virginia teams as early as 1890 and may have been borrowed from Dartmouth College, whose athletics teams were once known as the Indians.

Legend attributes the yell to Natalie Floyd Otey, who sang the ballad "Where'er You Are, There Shall My Love Be" at Charlottesville's Levy Opera House in 1893. The predominantly student audience noticed that Otey warbled the first three words of the song between each of the stanzas and decided to join in the refrain. By evening's end, goes the legend, the crowd had corrupted "Where'er You Are" into "Wah-hoo-wah."

The Levy Opera House stands at the corner of High Street and Park Street and has since been renovated into an office building.

VIRGINIA - BOSTON COLLEGE CONNECTIONS

- UVA long snapper Joe Spaziani is the son of former Boston College head coach Frank Spaziani, who lifted the Eagles over the Cavaliers in the 2009 and 2010 meetings. Frank Spaziani also had his UVA ties, serving nine years as an assistant to George Welsh (1982-90), including being the defensive coordinator from 1985-90. Frank is now the defensive coordinator at New Mexico State.
- Boston College defensive coordinator Jim Reid served as an assistant head coach and defensive coordinator at Virginia from 2010-12. Reid is no stranger to the Commonwealth after serving as the head coach at Richmond (1995-2003) and VMI (2006-07). Reid recruited the Richmond area for UVA and some current players like Malcolm Cook and Tim Harris came to UVA under Reid's recruitment.
- UVA OT Jack English's older sister, Kate, is a recent law school graduate of Boston College.
- UVA OG Jack McDonald attended Boston College High School, an all-male, Jesuit, Roman Catholic, college preparatory secondary school founded in 1863 with historical ties to Boston College.

UVA PLAYERS FROM MASSACHUSETTS

- UVA has three players hail from the Commonwealth of Massachusetts.
- OG Jack McDonald (Quincy), OG John Montelus (Everett) and LS/QB Joe Spaziani (Hingham) all call Massachusetts home.

BC IS NO STRANGER TO MENDENHALL

- UVA head coach Bronco Mendenhall is familiar with Boston College, facing the Eagles twice as the head coach at BYU.
- Mendenhall's first game as a head coach in 2005 came against then-No. 22 Boston College, a 20-3 setback in Provo. Mendenhall's BYU team lost only two games a year later in 2006, the first in double overtime to then-No. 25 Boston College in Chestnut Hill. The BC head coach for those two meetings was former UVA assistant coach and offensive coordinator Tom O'Brien.

STRANGER IN THE NEIGHBORHOOD

- No player on UVA's current roster has ever played in a game against Boston College. Boston College and NC State are the only current ACC teams where that is the case. At least one player on UVA's 2017 roster has played in a game against the other 11 ACC foes, including former ACC rival Maryland.
- OG John Montelus was a member of Notre Dame squad in 2015 that faced BC at Fenway Park. He was dressed for that game but did not play in the game.
- As for NC State, UVA is scheduled to travel to Raleigh next season.

Last Meeting

Montel Harris carried 24 times for 114 yards, including a go-ahead 4-yard touchdown late in the third quarter, to lift Boston College to a 17-13 victory over Virginia the last time these programs met.

Eagles quarterback Chase Rettig threw a 39-yard scoring strike to Alex Amidon and Nate Freese booted a 23-yard field goal.

Robert Randolph had a pair of field goals for the Cavaliers, Perry Jones had his first career rushing touchdown, a 1-yarder midway into the second quarter, and quarterback Marc Verica completed 31 of 49 passes for 284 yards with one interception.

Harris' score pushed BC ahead 17-13 late in the third quarter, one play after backup Andre Williams busted through the middle for 59 yards on his first carry of the day. The score capped a 96-yard drive.

The game ended when Verica's long desperation pass was knocked down by BC linebacker Luke Kuechly near the 6-yard line.

The Cavaliers nearly took the lead when receiver Dontrelle Inman made a catch at the back of the end zone with just over five minutes left, but was ruled out of bounds. Replays appeared to show he reached down with his left hand before falling out on the back line, but the ruling on the field stood after a booth review.

Randolph then missed a 25-yard field goal attempt.

Virginia led 13-10 at halftime after Randolph booted a 40-yard field goal as time expired. The Cavaliers took over on their 18 and looked like they were taking a gamble trying to move downfield after Verica fumbled at his 23, but two BC defensive players mishandled it and knocked it out of bounds.

Verica then completed four straight passes for 54 yards, setting up the kick.

The Cavaliers had taken a 10-3 lead on Jones' scoring run. Virginia had its second lengthy play drive of the opening half, holding the ball for 13 plays. Jones scored on a fourth-and-1 play, powering up the middle.

The Eagles tied it 10-10 with 1:21 left in the first half on Rettig's 39-yard TD pass down the middle to Amidon, who went up between defenders Rodney McLeod and Mike Parker to come down with the ball. He scampered into the end zone from about 10 yards out after the defensive backs collided and fell.

UVA IN MIDST OF A FOUR-GAME WINNING STREAK

- UVA has a four-game winning streak for the first time since the 2011 season when the Cavaliers reeled off a four-game winning streak en route to an 8-4 regular season finish.
- It is only UVA's third winning streak of four games or more since winning seven in a row in 2007.
- The seven-game winning streak in 2007 is the last time UVA won five games or more in a row.
- During UVA's four-game winning streak the Cavaliers have started the same five on the offensive line: LT - Jack English, LG - John Montelus, C - Dillon Reinkensmeyer, RG - Jake Fieler and RT - Brandon Pertile. The only four games those five have started together are the four games UVA has just won.

BENKERT AND PASSES OF 80+ YARDS

- At North Carolina last Saturday Kurt Benkert found Olamide Zaccheaus on an 81-yard scoring strike. The touchdown served as the fourth-longest one-play scoring drive in program history and it was Benkert's third career pass of 80 yards or more.
- In program history, only Benkert and Wayne Schuchts have three career passes of 80 yards or more.
- Benkert's first two came in 2016 at Duke (84 yards to David Eldridge) and against Central Michigan (82-yard touchdown to Zaccheaus).
- Schuchts' passes were 93 yards (to Nick Merrick, vs. Wake Forest, 1982), 85 yards (to Barry Word, vs. Wake Forest, 1983) and 80 yards (to Quentin Walker, vs. Duke, 1983).

THIRD-DOWN DEFENSE HAS BEEN STRONG IN 2017

- UVA is No. 7 in the nation and No. 4 in the ACC in third-down defense, allowing a 26.8 success rate.
- UVA is holding opponents to 8-of-50 (.160) on third downs where the yardage is six yards or greater.

ZACCHEAUS A BIG OFFENSIVE WEAPON FOR VIRGINIA

- Junior Olamide Zaccheaus recorded his second career receiving touchdown of 80+ yards when he scored on an 81-yard pass from Kurt Benkert at North Carolina.
- Zaccheaus is the only player in UVA history with two career receptions of 80+ yards. He also scored on an 82-yard scoring strike from Benkert in 2016 against Central Michigan.
- Zaccheaus has scored at least one touchdown in all seven wins of the Bronco Medenhall era, seven via the pass and one on a rush.
- In UVA's five wins in 2017, Zaccheaus has caught 31 passes for 376 yards and four touchdowns, while also rushing 13 times for 130 yards and one more score.
- Over the seven wins of the Mendenhall era, Zaccheaus has caught 43 passes for 559 yards and seven touchdowns, which comes out to 13.0 yards per reception.
- Zaccheaus became the 37th Cavalier all-time with 1,000 career receiving yards after his 122-yard day against UConn.
- Zaccheaus also became the 21st Cavalier to reach 100-career receptions in UVA history after grabbing four at Boise State.
- Zaccheaus' 12 receptions against Indiana on Sept. 9 are the sixth most in a single game in UVA history.
- Olamide is Nigerian for "the blessing has come."

UVA'S THIRD-DOWN OFFENSE

- UVA is ranked No. 25 in the nation and No. 3 in the ACC in third down offense with a success rate of 45.6 percent.
- UVA's 4-of-16 performance at UNC dropped UVA down from No. 10 nationally and No. 2 in the ACC.
- QB Kurt Benkert is 38-of-62 passing (61 percent) on third down, collecting 26 first downs and two touchdowns.
- Benkert is 34-of-57 passing (60 percent) when its 3rd and 6, or greater, connecting on 23 first downs and two touchdowns.

ELLIS RUNS HARD FOR THE VIRGINIA OFFENSE

- TB Jordan Ellis is averaging 5.1 yards per rush on first down through six games with nine first downs and one touchdown.
- Ellis has been a workhorse in short yardage on 3rd and 4th down. On fourth down, Ellis has rushed five times for four first downs on an average of 2.4 yards per carry. On third down, Ellis has 13 first downs, four touchdowns on 27 rushes.
- UVA's rushing offensive by Jordan Ellis helped eat clock and secure victory against Duke two weeks ago.
- Ellis rushed seven times for 33 yards (4.7 per carry) and two first downs in the fourth quarter, helping seal the ACC victory.

SNOWDEN COMES UP BIG LATE AGAINST DUKE

- OLB Charles Snowden played two defensive plays in crunch time against Duke and made the most of them. He was on the field on UVA's last two defensive plays, one being a 3rd and 6 where he dropped Duke quarterback Daniel Jones for a loss of 10. The sack was his first career solo sack and set up a 4th and 16 last ditch effort for the Blue Devils.
- Snowden also was on the field for the 4th and 16 play, providing pressure on the pass play Juan Thornhill broke up to secure the victory.
- Snowden played four total defensive plays against Duke, as well as playing on kickoff and punt return.
- Snowden made his collegiate debut at Boise State late in the game. He and fellow true freshman Elliott Brown shared a sack in Boise.

UVA MAKES A LITTLE HISTORY AT BOISE STATE

- UVA's 42-23 win at Boise State on Sept. 22 created a little niche in history for the Cavaliers.
- It was UVA's first win on a Friday since Nov. 10, 1939 when UVA beat Washington & Lee, 7-0.
- It was UVA's first non-conference road win since 2011 (at Indiana).
- UVA is now 6-8-1 all-time on Fridays in the regular season.
- UVA handed Boise State its first double-digit loss at home since Sept. 8, 2001 vs. Washington State, which was a 41-20 triumph.
- UVA snapped Boise State's 32-game regular season non-conference home winning streak, which dated back to the 2001 Washington State game.
- Boise State lost by 19 points at home to Virginia. In its 102 previous home games, Boise State lost 4 games by a combined 17 points.
- It was UVA's first win west of the Mississippi River since winning at BYU in 1999.

LEVRONE PUTS BACK-TO-BACK 100-YARD RECEIVING GAMES TOGETHER

- In back-to-back games against UConn and Boise State WR Andre Levrone has set new career highs in receiving yards for a game.
- He recorded his first 100-yard receiving game against UConn with four catches for 127 yards and a score.
- Levrone followed that up with five receptions for 141 yards and two scores at Boise State, which led to him being named the ACC Receiver of the Week on Sept. 25.
- Levrone leads UVA with 377 receiving yards and his 25.13 yards per reception ranks No. 3 in the nation and No. 1 in the ACC. His 377 receiving yards ranks No. 9 in the ACC, while his four receiving touchdowns ranks No. 6 in the ACC.

RECEIVING TRIO SETS RECORD AGAINST UCONN

- For the first time in program history, UVA had three different players record at least 100 yards receiving in the same game. Doni Dowling (136), Andre Levrone (127) and Olamide Zaccheaus (122) became the first UVA trio to accomplish the milestone in UVA's 38-18 win over UConn.
- It was only the 10th time UVA had multiple Cavaliers with at least 100 yards receiving in the same game and the first time since the 2013 Georgia Tech game (Tim Smith, 151 yard & Darius Jennings, 119 yards).
- Dowling, Levrone and Zaccheaus are only the sixth ACC trio to accomplish the feat since 2000.
- Since 2000, Florida State accomplished the feat twice in 2000 and once in 2005. Miami did it in 2012 and Virginia Tech in 2016.

UVA RECEIVERS HAVE RARE ACCOMPLISHMENT IN 2017

- UVA is one of eight schools in all of FBS in 2017 with at least three different players with at least one 100-yard receiving game.
- UVA is tied for No. 4 in the nation with three.
- Oklahoma State, who had four receivers go over 100 yards against Pitt this year, is the only other team this season with at least three players in the same game reach the 100-yard receiving mark.

BENKERT BREAKS UVA SINGLE-GAME PASSING/TOTAL OFFENSE RECORD

- QB Kurt Benkert was 30-of-40 for a career-high 455 passing yards against UConn on Sept. 16. He broke his own UVA single-game passing record (421) that he set last season against Central Michigan.
- UVA has had a quarterback throw for over 400 yards only three times in program history and Benkert has done it twice.
- Marc Verica was the first Cavalier to throw for at least 400 yards in a game in 2010 when he threw for 417 at Duke.
- Benkert also broke Verica's record for total offense in a game with 465 yards of total offense. Verica's record was 413 at Duke in 2010.

DOWLING AND ZACCHEAUS REACH MILESTONE TOGETHER

- WR Doni Dowling and HB Olamide Zaccheaus each passed the career 1,000-yard receiving mark in UVA's win against UConn on Sept. 16. Zaccheaus became the 37th Cavalier in program history in the second quarter, while Dowling became the 38th Cavalier in program history in the fourth quarter.
- Against UConn, Dowling recorded his first career 100-yard receiving game (136). Zaccheaus recorded his second career 100-yard receiving game (122). Zaccheaus had his first last season against Central Michigan, the other career game QB Kurt Benkert threw for over 400 yards.

DOWLING HONORS TIM HARRIS

- WR Doni Dowling moved from No. 7 to No. 5 prior to the Indiana game to honor CB Tim Harris. Wearing No. 5 since his arrival on Grounds in 2013, Harris had a season-ending injury in the opener against William & Mary.
- Dowling and Harris have been lifelong friends, as well as teammates at Richmond's Varina High School.

BLANDING AND KISER ANCHOR THE DEFENSE

- ILB Micah Kiser (10.5) and FS Quin Blanding (10.2) currently rank No. 1 and No. 2 in the ACC in tackles. This is nothing new for the duo as they finished No. 1 and No. 2 in the ACC in tackles in 2015 and 2016.
- Kiser ranks No. 9 in the nation in tackles in 2017, while Blanding ranks No. 12 in the nation.
- In 2016 Kiser (11.2) led the ACC in tackles and finished No. 4 nationally. Blanding (10.0) finished No. 2 in the ACC in tackles for the third year in a row and No. 9 nationally.
- Kiser (9.75) and Blanding (9.58) also finished No. 1 and No. 2, respectively, in the ACC in tackles in 2015.
- Since the ACC started tracking tackle leaders in 1990, no previous tandem of tacklers has led the league in tackles for two consecutive seasons until Kiser and Blanding.
- Blanding, who also finished No. 2 in the ACC in tackles in 2014 (10.25), is the only player in ACC history to finish second in tackles for three straight seasons.
- The only ACC player since 1990 to lead the league in tackles for three consecutive seasons is Boston College's Luke Kuechly (2009-11), now of the NFL's Carolina Panthers.

BLANDING AND KISER GET HELP ON DEFENSE

- Despite ranking No. 1 and No. 2 in the ACC in tackles, FS Quin Blanding and ILB Micah Kiser are getting solid help on defense as UVA has three of the ACC's Top 17 tacklers.
- ILB Jordan Mack is No. 14 in the ACC with 7.7 tackles per game.

BLANDING DOUBLES UP THE TACKLES

- UVA's Quin Blanding has 22 double-digit tackle games over 42 collegiate games.
- Blanding has had six double-digit tackle games in each of his first three seasons.
- Blanding has 419 career tackles, 10.0 per game.

EVAN BUTTS HAD A CAREER DAY AGAINST INDIANA

- Tight end Evan Butts had a career-high six receptions for a career-high 54 yards against Indiana.
- Butts' six receptions was the most by a UVA tight end since Jake McGee made eight at Maryland in 2013.
- With eight receptions in 2017 already, Butts has more catches than he had in all of 2016 (seven).

VIRGINIA FOOTBALL TO WEAR #HOOSTOGETHER PATCHES ON UNIFORMS IN 2017

- In the aftermath of the events that took place in Charlottesville this summer, the Virginia athletics department initiated the #HoosTogether campaign on social media in an effort to unite our community in support of love, diversity and inclusion.
- During the 2017-18 academic year, all UVA sports programs will incorporate a #HoosTogether patch on their uniforms or equipment. It is UVA's hope the patches serve as a reminder of what can be accomplished when we are united behind a common goal and we hope this effort continues to help bring our community together.

HAMM RUSHES FOR A TOUCHDOWN IN FIVE STRAIGHT SEASONS

- After his five-yard rushing score against UConn, TB Daniel Hamm has rushed for at least one touchdown in five straight seasons.
- Hamm becomes the first Cavalier to rush for at least one touchdown in five straight seasons.
- With available records dating back to 2004, no ACC player has rushed for at least one touchdown in five straight seasons.
- Hamm played in two games as a true freshman in 2013 before being hurt at Pitt and receiving a medical hardship. In his collegiate debut, he set a UVA record for most rushing yards in a college debut with 136 against VMI. Hamm also rushed for two touchdowns against the Keydets in 2013.
- Hamm has six career rushing touchdowns.

REINKENSMEYER STARTS OPENER AT LEFT TACKLE, SHIFTS TO CENTER

- Dillon Reinkensmeyer was the first freshman, true or redshirt, to start a season-opening game on the offensive line for UVA since R-Fr. Will Barker started at RT in 2006 vs. Pitt.
- Reinkensmeyer is the first freshman, redshirt or true, to start a season-opening game at LT since D'Brick-ashaw Ferguson (true freshman) in 2002 vs. Colorado State.
- Reinkensmeyer has not appeared at left tackle since, despite receiving the highest grade on the offensive line against the Tribe.
- He played most of the second half at center against Indiana and started the UConn game at center.

FIFTEEN TRUE FRESHMEN HAVE PLAYED IN 2017

- Fifteen UVA true freshmen have played in 2017, which ranks No. 7 in the nation entering week No. 6.
- Ten true freshmen made their collegiate debut against William & Mary on Sept. 2. Mandy Alonso (DL), Lamont Atkins (TB), Joey Blount (FS), Germane Crowell (CB), Brian Delaney (PK), Matt Gahm (LB), Terrell Jana (WR), PK Kier (TB), A.J. Mejia (PK) and Jamari Peacock (FB) all made their collegiate debuts against the Tribe.
- ILB Zane Zandier became the 11th UVA true freshman to play in 2017 after he appeared on defense against Indiana.
- OLB Elliott Brown and DL John Kirven became the 12th and 13th UVA true freshmen to play in 2017. Brown saw time on defense and Kirven played on special teams against UConn.
- OLB Charles Snowden and CB Darrius Bratton made their collegiate debuts at Boise State
- The 10 true freshmen playing on the opening weekend ranked No. 8 among the nation's FBS teams.
- Six redshirt freshmen also made their collegiate debut against William & Mary. Dillon Reinkensmeyer (OT), Brenton Nelson (CB), DeVante Cross (WR), Nick Grant (CB) Nash Griffin (Holder) and Ben Knutson (OG) also made their collegiate debuts against the Tribe.
- Additionally, sophomore walk-on linebacker Reed Kellam and junior punter Lester Coleman also made their collegiate debut against William & Mary.

NOTING FIRST CAREER STARTS IN 2017

- Eleven Cavaliers have made their first collegiate starts in 2017.
- Six Cavaliers made their first career starts against William & Mary on Sept. 2.
- First time starters on offense vs. William & Mary: Jordan Ellis (TB), Ben Hogg (WR), John Montelus (OG) and Dillon Reinkensmeyer (OT).
- First time starters on defense vs. William & Mary: Malcolm Cook (OLB) and Brenton Nelson (CB).
- Three Cavaliers made their first collegiate starts against Indiana on Sept. 9. Tanner Cowley (TE) and Richard Burney (TE) started on offense, while Juwan Moye (DE) started on the defensive line.

SCOTT STADIUM, HOME OF THE CAVALIERS

The Carl Smith Center, home of David A. Harrison III Field at Scott Stadium, with its unique architectural design, scenic setting on the University's Grounds and exceptional sight lines, is one of the nation's finest college football settings.

Opened in 1931, Scott Stadium might be one of the oldest campus college football stadiums in the nation, but you could never tell from its appearance. Numerous upgrades and expansions make it a modern home for the Cavaliers and their fans.

Scott Stadium was the gift of Frederic William Scott and Elisabeth Strother Scott, and was dedicated to the memory of his parents, Frederic Robert Scott and Frances Branch Scott.

Virginia played its dedication game at Scott Stadium on Oct. 15, 1931 against the Virginia Military Institute before a then-capacity crowd of 22,000. Prior to that season, the Cavaliers staged their home games at the University's Lambeth Field.

Virginia has played 460 games in the historic venue. UVA's all-time record at Scott Stadium stands at 258-190-12.

JOE REED EXCELS ON KICK RETURN

- Wide Receiver Joe Reed has returned 10 kicks in 2017 for 229 yards (22.9 yards per return), which is No. 6 in the ACC.
- Reed is coming off a solid 2016 where he led UVA with 678 kick return yards as a true freshman.
- Reed's 25.1 yards per kick return average was No. 3 in the ACC and No. 21 in the nation in 2016.
- Reed's 678 kick return yards are the second most in a season by a Cavalier, trailing only Khalek Shepherd's single-season program record of 929 in 2012.
- Reed's best game in 2016 was 117 return yards against Miami and his 50-yard return against North Carolina was a season best.

BREAKING IN A NEW PLACEKICKER/PUNTER

- Entering 2017, zero of the UVA kickers on the 2017 roster had attempted a field goal or a punt in a collegiate game. In fact, no UVA kicker or punter had appeared in a college game.
- Virginia, Arizona State and UAB were the only programs in the nation that entered 2017 with a kicker or a punter on its roster with zero collegiate experience.
- Virginia was one of six schools in the nation that had zero career collegiate field goal attempts and punts among the kickers on its roster entering 2017. Arizona State, Georgia Tech, Hawaii, Troy and UAB are the other schools.
- This was the the second year in a row UVA has entered a season without a kicker that had attempted a field goal in college.
- Punter Lester Coleman and placekicker A.J. Mejia both made debuts against William & Mary in the season-opening win.
- Mejia is 4-of-5 on field goals (22, 28, 20, 27) and 23-of-23 PATs. Coleman is averaging 42.4 yards per punt with four of his 11 punts landing inside the 20.



Bronco Mendenhall

Head Coach • Second Season

Bronco Mendenhall is in his second season as Virginia's head football coach after being named the program's 40th head coach on Dec. 4, 2015.

In Mendenhall's first season on Grounds he oversaw a secondary that boasted first-team All-ACC honoree and All-American, Quin Blanding. Blanding finished the season No. 2 in the ACC in tackles for the third year in a row with 120 stops. Inside linebacker Micah Kiser, an All-American and first-team All-ACC honoree, thrived to lead the ACC in tackles for the second year in a row with 134, which is tied with former Cavalier great Wali Rainer for fourth-most in a single season in program history. Kiser was also a second-team CoSIDA Academic All-American, becoming the first Cavalier since Tiki Barber in 1996 to earn both

academic and athletic All-America honors in the same season.

Offensively, in Mendenhall's first season, Taquan Mizzell became the first player in ACC history to record at least 1,500 career rushing and 1,500 career receiving yards. UVA quarterback Kurt Benkert set a couple of passing marks in UVA's new offense, including a program record for passing yards in a game with 421 against Central Michigan, which was only the second time in program history a UVA quarterback surpassed 400 passing yards in a game. Benkert reached 1,000 passing yards in four games and 2,000 passing yards in eight games, setting a program record for fastest to that standard in a season.

Mendenhall came to Charlottesville after 11 years as the head coach at Brigham Young University. In his 11 seasons, from 2005-2015, Mendenhall compiled an overall record of 99-43 at BYU to rank 12th in total wins among all FBS teams during that time.

In the three seasons prior to Mendenhall becoming the head coach at BYU, the Cougars compiled an overall record of 14-21. Over the last 11 years, the Cougars are one of only 11 programs to advance to a bowl game each season (includes the 2015 season). BYU is joined by Alabama, Boise State, Clemson, Florida State, Georgia, LSU, Oklahoma, Oregon, Virginia Tech and Wisconsin on that list.

Among those 11 teams, only Florida State has achieved more bowl wins (seven) than BYU's six bowl game victories.

BYU football student-athletes have earned freshman All-America recognition in eight of the past 10 seasons. More than 60 BYU players have signed with NFL teams since Mendenhall arrived in Provo, including defensive end Ezekiel Ansah, the No. 5 overall pick in the 2013 NFL Draft and Kyle Van Noy, the No. 40 overall pick in the 2014 NFL Draft.

Under Mendenhall, the Cougars tied for seventh among all FBS programs for the most Academic All-America citations over the last decade and BYU tops all FBS programs with the most selections (39) to the National Football Foundation Hampshire Honor Society (recognizing starters and significant contributors finishing their eligibility with a 3.2 GPA or better over their college career) since the program began in 2007.

The success of Mendenhall's leadership approach in running the BYU football program has been highlighted in a management book, *Running Into the Wind: Bronco Mendenhall -- 5 Strategies for Building a Successful Team*, written by Alyson Von Feldt and Paul Gustavson, a leading management consultant specializing in leadership development and organizational design.

Mendenhall was elected in 2013 to the American Football Coaches Association Board of Trustees as the District 8 Representative and also serves on the AFCA Ethics Committee.

Following the 2006 season, Mendenhall was named the American Football Coaches Association Region IV Coach of the Year. In addition, the Football Writers Association of America named Mendenhall one of nine finalists for the prestigious Eddie Robinson Coach of the Year Award.

A dominant defense led BYU to its seventh winning season in as many years as the BYU football team finished the 2012 season with eight wins, a program-best fourth consecutive bowl victory and the No. 3 defense in the nation. With an 8-5 record, BYU claimed its sixth season with at least eight wins under Mendenhall's eight-year head coaching tenure. Incredibly consistent all year long, BYU finished the year ranked No. 3 in total defense, allowing just 266.1 yards per game. The Cougars ended the season ranked in the top four in five major defensive categories.

Mendenhall has served as the BYU's defensive coordinator for much of his tenure as the head coach. He returned to a full-time role with the defense again in 2015.

During his tenure in Provo, the Cougars have consistently fielded one of the nation's strongest defenses. Mendenhall's defense excels at keeping opponents out of the end zone. Entering the 2015 season, they averaged a No. 20 national ranking in scoring defense while he oversees the defense, including three top-10 ratings.
