### VIRGINIA-GEORGIA TECH SERIES

- Georgia Tech leads the all-time series, 61-37-1.
- The Yellow Jackets won two of three last year at UVa.
- UVa last played in Atlanta in 2006, with Georgia Tech winning two of three.
- Virginia has won 10 of the last 16 meetings since 2004.

### TOP PERFORMERS VS. JACKETS

- John Barr went 5-for-10 last year in three games vs. GT.
- Franco Valdes was 6-for-12, including a home run and three RBI, last year vs. the Yellow Jackets.
- Dan Grovatt hit .417 (5-for-12) with three RBI last year.
- Tyler Cannon is 6-for-20 (.300) career vs. GT and was 3-for-8 last year
- Matt Packer is 1-0 with a 4.09 career ERA vs. the Yellow Jackets, but started and went seven innings in a win last year (1 ER, 5 H, 7 K)

### CARRAWAY COMES HOME

- Andrew Carraway returns to his home state this weekend. He hails from nearby Marietta, Ga., and went to Walton High School.
- Carraway did not pitch at Georgia Tech in the team's last trip in 2006.
- He is slated to start on the mound Saturday.

### ANOTHER SERIES VS. RANKED OPPONENT

- Virginia is playing a ranked foe for the fourth time in the last five ACC weekends.
- The Cavaliers are 3-4 against ranked teams, going 1-0 against then-No. 14 Florida State in a rain-shortened series, 1-2 vs. then-No. 4 Miami and 1-2 vs. then-No. 5 North Carolina.
- Three of the four losses were by one run (the other loss was by two runs).

### THE HOMERS KEEP COMING

- Virginia has hit 30 home runs in its first 32 games, topping its total from the entire 2008 season (25 in 62 games).
- Six Cavaliers have at least three homers this year – only three players had at least three in 2008.

## SWEATING THE TIGHT ONES

- Four of UVA's five ACC losses have come by one run; the other defeat was by two runs. Four of the five came to top-five teams (UNC, Miami).
- Prior to the 17-2 win Sunday, UVA's last seven ACC games had each been decided by three runs or fewer.

## HITTING, PITCHING NOT LIMITED TO NON-CONFERENCE

- Virginia, which leads the league in batting (.358) and pitching (2.75) also paces the conference in batting in ACC games only. UVA is hitting .361 in ACC contests.
- The Cavaliers also are tops in ERA in ACC games only with a 4.25 ERA.

## UNDERCLASSMEN PUT UP BIG NUMBERS

- UVA's offense has been dominated by the freshmen and sophomores.
- In all, 83 percent (350 total) of the Cavaliers' hits this year have come from underclassmen (73 from upperclassmen).
- Freshmen and sophomores also account for 83 percent of the team's runs and RBI.

## PARKER SETS THE TABLE WELL

- Jarrett Parker has been strong as UVA's new leadoff hitter.
- He leads the ACC with 51 runs and has scored at least one run in 28 of 33 games.
- He had scored a run in 11 straight games before that streak was snapped Wednesday.
- Parker ranks third in the ACC in batting (.419). He leads the ACC in runs (51), triples (4) and total bases (102) and is tied with UNC's Dustin Ackley for first with 52 hits. He is among the top 10 in every offensive category.

## GOSSELIN REBOUNDS FROM TOUGH START

- After starting the season 0-for-16 in the first weekend, Phil Gosselin has bounced back in a big way, going 45-for-107 (.421) in the last 29 games.
- He has been the Cavaliers' top run-producer this year with an ACC-high 46 RBI – more than doubling his 2008 total of 20 (40 games).

- Jarrett Parker has hit four home runs to lead off games this season.

• Parker's first leadoff homer was Virginia's first home run to lead off a game since Mark Reynolds hit one at Liberty on May 18, 2004.  
• He since has hit leadoff home runs against Delaware, North Carolina and Maryland.

### PITCHING OFF TO BLAZING START

• The Virginia pitching staff has racked up the best ERA (2.75) in the conference thus far.  
• North Carolina is second with a 3.58 ERA.  
• The Cavaliers have surrendered just 239 hits (7.2/game) this year.  
• Opponents are batting an ACC-low .220 against Virginia pitching.

### DON'T FORGET THE SPEED TOO

• Virginia leads the ACC with 66 stolen bases.  
• That total ranks 15th nationally.  
• Remarkably, UVA also is tied for the fewest times caught stealing (12) in the ACC.  
• Only NC State (72) has attempted more stolen bases than UVA has stolen.  
• Four Wahoos ranks among the top six in the ACC in steals – Phil Gosselin (third, 13), Tyler Cannon and Jarrett Parker (fifth, 12) and Dan Grovatt (seventh, 10).  
• Virginia has led the ACC in stolen bases in each of the last three seasons.

### RANDOM STAT OF THE DAY

• Virginia leads the nation in sacrifice flies.  
• UVA has 32 this year, led by Phil Gosselin with a nation's best seven.

### PROSCIA KEEPS MASHING

• In his freshman season, Steven Proscia has gotten off to an outstanding start.  
• He ranks ninth in the ACC (first among freshmen) with a .387 batting average.  
• Proscia is tied for fourth in the ACC with 14 doubles and tied for ninth in total bases (76) and hits (48).  
• He has at least one RBI in 23 of 30 games.

### NOTING THE MARYLAND SERIES

• In game one, UVA rallied with three runs in the seventh and two in the eighth to win 7-4. Jarrett Parker and Danny Hultzen each had four hits.  
• Maryland turned the tables in game two, getting a grand slam from Dan Benick in the eighth inning to rally and win, 8-7.  
• UVA exploded for seven runs in the second inning to cruise to a 17-2 win in the finale. Phil Gosselin drove in five and John Hicks had four hits. Franco Valdes hit a grand slam.

### OFFENSE AMONG NATION'S BEST

• Virginia ranks sixth nationally in team batting average (.363 entering the week). New Mexico leads at .393.  
• The Cavaliers also are sixth in hits (406), runs (297) and doubles (82).

### PITCHING UP THERE AS WELL

• Virginia's pitching staff ranks third in the country in ERA (2.77 entering the week). Only Texas (2.26) and Arizona State (2.30) were better.  
• UVA also stands fourth in hits allowed per nine innings (7.3) and seventh in strikeouts per nine innings (9.9).

### RUNNING THE GAUNTLET

• UVA recently finished a brutal ACC stretch, competing against each of the league's 2008 College World Series participants in consecutive weeks.  
• It started when the Cavaliers played host to Florida State. Miami then came to Charlottesville before Virginia traveled to North Carolina. UVA went 3-4 in the stretch (1-0 vs. FSU, 1-2 vs. Miami, 1-2). Three of the four losses were by one run, the other by two.  
• Virginia is the lone ACC school to face these three teams in consecutive weeks this year.

### EVERYONE HITS!

• Virginia has made a habit of batting around in innings this year.  
• In 33 games, the Cavaliers have batted around 21 times.  
• UVA's high in one inning this year is 13 batters, set March 31 against Radford.  
• UVA scored a season-high nine runs in the second inning vs. Radford.

### HULTZEN GETS OFF ON THE RIGHT FOOT

• Freshman Danny Hultzen has had seven consecutive strong starts to kick off his college career, going 5-0 in the process.  
• In 45.2 innings this year, Hultzen has whiffed 58 batters – second-most in the ACC.  
• Hultzen already has a 13-strikeout game (vs. FSU), a 12-strikeout performance (vs. Fordham) and a nine-strikeout game (at Wake Forest).

### HULTZEN NAMED ACC PITCHER OF WEEK

• Danny Hultzen was named the ACC's Pitcher of the Week following his big performance vs. Florida State.  
• Hultzen tossed seven innings vs. the Seminoles, giving up one earned run, four hits and two walks while striking out a career-best 13.  
• He struck out seven in a row from the first to the third inning and did not allow a runner past first until the seventh inning.

### 13 Ks: IT'S BEEN AWHILE

• Hultzen's 13-strikeout performance was the most for a UVA pitcher since Sean Doolittle had 13 at Maryland in 2006.  
• It was the most by a UVA freshman since 1994 when Seth Greisinger recorded 15 against North Carolina.  
• Greisinger was the last Cavalier pitcher to post more than 13 strikeouts – he had 16 in 1996 against North Carolina.

**RACKING UP RUNS IN RECORD NUMBERS**

- Virginia piled up 177 runs through its first 15 games – the most ever at UVa.
- The previous high was 161 runs during the first 15 games of the 1898 season.

**GROVATT 19-GAME HIT STREAK ENDS**

- Dan Grovatt saw his career-best 19-game hitting streak (21 dating to last season) end March 21 vs. Miami.
- It was the longest hit streak for a Cavalier since Brandon Guyer had a 26-game streak in 2007.
- Grovatt had a nine-game hit streak end on Tuesday.

**NOTING THE 19-GAME WIN STREAK**

- Virginia started the season with a 19-game winning streak, the longest win streak in school history.
- The streak came to a halt with a 4-3 loss March 21 to Miami.
- UVa was the last unbeaten team in Division I and held the longest active winning streak in Division I.
- The Cavaliers also started 5-0 in the ACC for the first time in school history.

**FIFTH-LONGEST STREAK IN ACC HISTORY**

- The Cavaliers' 19-game win streak is tied for the sixth-longest in ACC history.
- It was the longest streak by an ACC team since FSU ran off 25 straight wins in 2002.

**ARE THOSE NUMBERS FOR REAL?**

- Virginia's offense has put up some eye-popping numbers thus far, highlighted by its .358 team batting average, which leads the ACC.
- The Cavaliers have posted at least 10 hits in all but six games this year.
- UVa has at least 20 hits in four games.
- The Cavaliers have racked up 132 extra-base hits (89 2B, 13 3B, 30 HR) among 423 hits.

**DAVENPORT DOMINANCE**

- Virginia is 22-4 this year at Davenport Field after going 31-9 last season.
- UVa is 168-39 (.812) at Davenport since 2002, including 56-23 (.711) in ACC games.
- In nonconference games, the record is even more impressive – 112-16 (.875).

**CARRAWAY, POUTIER SERVE AS 2009 CAPTAINS**

- Virginia has two captains this year – seniors Andrew Carraway and Robert Poutier.
- Poutier, who graduated in 2008 and is currently working on his master's degree, is serving as a captain for the second straight year.

• Carraway is a three-time All-ACC Academic Baseball Team honoree and currently is living on the Lawn at UVa – one of the highest honors bestowed upon UVa students.

**CARRAWAY NAMED LOWE'S SENIOR CLASS AWARD CANDIDATE**

- Andrew Carraway has been named one of 30 baseball candidates for the Lowe's Senior CLASS Award.
- To be eligible, a student-athlete must be a Division I senior and have notable achievements in four areas of excellence: Classroom, Character, Community, and Competition.
- The award focuses on the total student-athlete and encourages those leaders to use their platform in athletics to make a positive impact on their circle of influence.
- The list will be narrowed to 10 in mid-April.

**UVA AMONG SELECT FEW IN LAST FIVE NCAA TOURNAMENTS**

- Virginia is one of just 17 Division I baseball programs to reach the NCAA Tournament in each of the last five seasons.
- The Cavaliers are one of five schools in the ACC to hold that distinction, joining Florida State, Miami, North Carolina and NC State.
- The other programs are Arizona State, Arkansas, Cal State Fullerton, Missouri, Oral Roberts, Pepperdine, Rice, South Carolina, Southern Miss, TCU, Texas and Wichita State.

**ERA TOPS IN NATION OVER LAST FOUR YEARS**

- Virginia pitchers boast a 3.10 ERA over the last four seasons – the lowest ERA in NCAA Division I over the last four seasons.
- UVa ranked third in the nation in ERA in 2005, 2006 and 2007 and was 15th last year.
