- •The Blue Devils are in the round of 16 for the third time in the past five years
- Duke defeated Radford (5-1) and William & Mary (1-0) in the first two rounds

# **Series History**

- UVa leads the all-time series 15-10-6 (UVa leads 7-3-3 in Charlottesville)
- The teams played to a 0-0 tie in the regular season match at Klöckner (10/30)
- Duke has won all three previous NCAA matchups, including 3-0 in the 2004 second round, Virginia's only home NCAA loss of the Steve Swanson era

- At home, Virginia is 14-9-3 in NCAA Tournament play
- UVa is 12-1-2 at home in NCAA play since 2000

# **Alwine Ties School Assist Record**

- Lauren Alwine tied the school record for assists in a season when she recorded her 14th of the year against West Virginia in the NCAA second round
- Sarah Huffman set the record of 14 assists in 2004

# **Senty Sets Career Appearances Record**

- Defender Sarah Senty set the school record for most career games played with her 92nd appearance during the NCAA second round game vs. West Virginia
- Becky Sauerbrunn previously held the record with 91 appearances from 2003-07

#### **ACC-olades**

- Nikki Krzysik was named the 2008 ACC Defensive Player of the Year
- She is the third Cavalier to win the award (Sarah Huffman in 2004 and Becky Sauerbrunn in 2007)
- Krzysik and Sinead Farrelly repeated as first-team All-ACC picks
- Lauren Alwine, Meghan Lenczyk, and Alex Singer were named to the 2nd Team
- Alwine was also named to the All-Freshman Team

# **Cavaliers Offensive in ACC**

- •The Cavaliers scored 22 goals in conference games this season
- •That total is a school record for goals in an ACC regular season, breaking the previous record of 17 goals in 2004
- •That season the Cavaliers won the ACC Championship

# First Goal at an Opportune Time

- In each of the last two regular season wins, the Cavaliers got a game-winning goal from a player scoring her first career goal
- Colleen Flanagan scored her first career goal in overtime to give UVa a 3-2 win at Maryland
- Kika Toulouse's first career-goal broke a 1-1 tie in the 72nd minute to give Virginia a 2-1 win over Boston College

## **Cavaliers Set New Road Mark**

- The Cavaliers set a new school record with four ACC road wins in a season, breaking the record of three set in 2005
- Virginia finished that season with a school record 8-2-0 conference record

# Klöck-work at Home

- The Cavaliers had their school-record 20-game home unbeaten streak (18-0-2) broken with the loss to North Carolina on Oct. 24
- Virginia is 9-2-1 at Klöckner Stadium this season
- Since 2001, Virginia 76-12-8 at Klöckner Stadium

# Offense Explodes Against Wolfpack and Tigers

- In consecutive games, UVa beat NC State 6-0 and Clemson 7-1
- The 13 goals are the most Virginia has ever scored in consecutive ACC games
- UVa's seven goals against Clemson were the most for the team since a 9-0 win over Richmond in 2005
- It was the most goals Virginia scored against an ACC opponent since an 8-0 win over Virginia Tech in the quarterfinals of the 2004 ACC Tournament
- •The results are the most lopsided regular season games in the conference since a 9-3 Duke win over Virginia Tech in 2004

# **Lenczyk and Farrelly Score Hat Tricks**

- Meghan Lenczyk and Sinead Farrelly both have hat tricks this season, marking the first time in school history that Virginia has had two different players have a hat trick in the same season
- Farrelly had a career-high three goals in the first half of the 7-1 win at Clemson
- Lenczyk had a career-high three goals in the 5-0 win over Liberty
- Lenczyk's was the first hat trick by a Cavalier since 2004 (Kelly Hammond vs. JMU)
- Farrelly's was the first hat trick in school history against an ACC opponent

- She scored the game-winning goals at Florida State and Miami that week

# Six Named to Teams of the Week
