VIRGINIA-DUKE SERIES

- Virginia holds an 84-52-1 edge in its all-time series with Duke.
- UVA is 17-6 against Duke under the current coaching staff (since 2004).
- UVA swept the Blue Devils in three games at Durham Bulls Athletic Park in 2010 (12-3, 11-1, 10-6).

VIRGINIA TIES BEST START IN ACC HISTORY

- Virginia has started the season with a 33-3 record, tying the best start in conference history and becoming just the fifth ACC team to start 33-3.
- The 1999 and 2007 Florida State teams and 1989 and 1995 Clemson teams each started 33-3 as well.
- The best start in NCAA history came from the 1977 Texas team, which began the season with 34-consecutive wins.

O'CONNOR POISED FOR WIN NO. 350, QUICKEST IN ACC HISTORY

- In his eighth season as Virginia's head coach, Brian O'Connor stands at 349 wins entering the weekend (349-121-1).
- He is poised to reach 350 wins in the fewest number of games in ACC history; he has coached 471 games at UVA going into play Friday.
- Mike Martin of Florida State is the fastest in ACC history to reach 350 wins (while a member of the ACC). He needed 478 games (in seven seasons from 1992 to 1998) to reach the mark.
- Other current coaches of note in the ACC: Jack Leggett (Clemson) and Danny Hall (GT) each needed 487 games to reach 350 wins (350-137 each).

CAVALIERS RANKED NO. 2 IN SECOND RPI

- UVA is ranked No. 2 in the second RPI report, announced Tuesday by the NCAA.
- Florida holds the No. 1 spot in the second report.
- Virginia already has eight wins against the RPI top 25 and 13 against the top 50 this year.

BATS HAVE BEEN BUSY OF LATE

- Virginia has been hot at the plate over the last five games, hitting at a .335 clip.
- UVA has 57 hits, including 12 doubles, in the last five games.
- Six Cavalier regulars are hitting over .300 during that span, including three over .400 — Steven Proscia (.478), Keith Werman (.467) and Reed Gagnani (.412).

- Danny Hultzen aims for sole possession of the UVA career wins record on Friday night.

PITCHING, DEFENSE COMBINE FOR LETHAL COMBO

- Virginia boasts a strong tandem of pitching and defense this year.
- UVa has allowed just 2.8 runs per game, fourth fewest in Division I baseball.
- Virginia entered the week with a .982 fielding percentage, which was third in the nation behind San Francisco (.988) and Troy (.982).
- UVa has committed 23 errors in 36 games.
- The Cavaliers set a school record in 2010 with a .977 fielding percentage.

PAIR OF 10-GAME WIN STREAKS

- For the first time in school history, Virginia has recorded a pair of win streaks of 10 games or more in the same season.
- Virginia had a 12-game win streak, starting March 22, which ended last Sunday at Georgia Tech.
- The Cavaliers took 13 straight from March 1-19. It also is the first time UVa has posted two double-figure win streaks in one season.
- The loss to Georgia Tech also snapped a school-record 11-game game road win streak.

PITCHING HAS BEEN LINCHPIN TO SUCCESS

- Virginia is the lone team to rank among the top 20 nationally in ERA, strikeouts per nine innings and fewest hits and walks allowed per nine innings.
- UVa stands in the top-10 in all of those categories as of the Monday report: ERA (7th, 2.32), strikeouts/nine innings (2nd, 10.5), fewest hits/9 inns (3rd, 6.74), fewest walks/9 inns (5th, 2.21).
- UVa has recorded 10 shutouts and allowed more than four earned runs just four times this year.

VIRGINIA 42ND PROGRAM TO 2,000 WINS

- Virginia became the 42nd Division I program to reach 2,000 all-time wins on March 29 with its win over Geore Washington.
- The Cavaliers have won 2,008 games all time (1,609 losses, 40 ties).

VIRGINIA CUTS DOWN ON BASES ON BALLS

- UVa pitchers have reduced their bases on balls by more than one per game this season, walking just 79 batters (2.21/9 innings). In 2010 UVa averaged 3.31 walks per nine innings.
- This has been key to UVa racking up an ACC-leading 2.42 team ERA.
- UVa averages more than a walk fewer per nine innings than any other ACC team this year. (FSU, 3.16/9 IP).

HULTZEN CONTINUES TO DOMINATE

- Danny Hultzen ranks second in the nation in strikeouts this year with 90, trailing Trevor Bauer of UCLA (97).
- Hultzen has struck out at least nine batters in seven of his eight starts this season (14.91 per nine innings - first in the nation).
- He has issued only 10 walks (9:1 strikeout to walk ratio).
- UVa is 8-0 in Hultzen's starts this year and 32-8 in his career, including 22-2 since 2010; UVa is 13-0 when Hultzen racks up 10 or more strikeouts.
- Virginia has won 14 straight series openers with Hultzen pitching, dating to April 2, 2010 at NC State.
- He has allowed no more than seven hits in any start this season.
- With five strikeouts Hultzen will reach the top 10 in single-season strikeouts at UVa for the third time.

HULTZEN OWNS UVA STRIKEOUTS RECORD, MOVES UP ACC CHART

- Hultzen broke the Virginia career strikeouts record two weeks ago. With 320 career strikeouts Hultzen has passed Seth Greisinger (1994-96), who had 290.
- By passing Greisinger, Hultzen also moved into the top 25 on the ACC's all-time strikeouts ledger. He is tied for 15th in ACC history with Miami's Chris Hernandez (2008-10) and Florida State's Jon McDonald (1998-2000).

HULTZEN CLIMBS VIRGINIA CHARTS

- Danny Hultzen continues his march up the all-time Virginia pitching charts.
- He is now tied for first in career wins at UVa Jacob Thompson (2006-08) with 27.
- Hultzen is first in career winning percentage (.931; 27-2), just ahead of Robert Poutier (.917; 11-1).
- His career ERA of 2.28 stands fourth in UVa history, while his 320 strikeouts ranks first.
- He ranks eighth in innings pitched with 256.1. With 7.1 innings he will match Jeff Kamrath (2001-05) for seventh.

- He has not allowed a run in his last four starts (5.0 innings vs. Towson, 9.0 vs. George Washington, 7.0 vs. Radford, 5.0 vs. Georgetown).
- He last allowed a run in the sixth inning of the March 16 win over James Madison.
- Roberts currently leads the ACC with a 0.87 ERA and is tied for first in wins (7) and shutouts (2) while standing seventh in innings pitched (51.2).

SHUTOUTS PILING UP

- Virginia has recorded an ACC-best 10 shutouts in its 33 wins this season. That represents more than the last two seasons combined (five in 2009, two in 2010).
- It is the second most in program history.
- The school record for shutouts in a season is 11, set in 2005. That mark is tied for the ACC record with the 1977 Clemson team.

CAVALIERS GRIND OPPONENTS' RUNNING GAME TO A HALT

- Virginia has virtually stopped its opponents on the basepaths, giving up just 12 stolen bases in 24 attempts (50 percent success rate).
- UVa has allowed the fewest stolen bases of any ACC team (FSU ranks second with 15 stolen bases allowed).
- In throwing out 50 percent of potential base stealers, UVa easily tops the ACC. UNC is second at 44.2 percent.

KLINE EMPHATICALLY SHUTS THE DOOR

- In his first season as the Virginia closer, sophomore righty Branden Kline has been brilliant with 11 saves in as many opportunities.
- He ranks second in the nation in saves behind Georgia's Tyler Maloof; the total also is tied for the fourth most in a season in UVa history.
- Kline has struck out 26 in 19.2 innings. In that span he has allowed four runs, 13 hits and five walks (1.83 ERA).
- He pitched in 24 games (eight starts) as a freshman and was entrusted with big starts in the championship games of both the NCAA regional and super regional.

VIRGINIA RANKS IN TOP 25 IN ATTENDANCE

- Entering the week (through 20 dates), Virginia ranked 23rd nationally in total attendance in 2011 with a total of 52,316.
- UVa also stood 24th in average attendance at 2,615 fans per game.
- UVa has played in front of four home crowds of 3,000-plus this season.

HICKS SWINGING A HOT STICK

- John Hicks has been on fire at the plate this year.
- He is batting a team-best .362, which tied tied with teammate Steven Proscia and ranks 10th in the ACC.
- Hicks is the lone Cavalier to reach base in every game this season.
- Hicks has racked up a .323 batting average in 15 ACC games this season (18th in conference).

PROSCIA SCORCHING IN ACC PLAY

- Steven Proscia boasts Virginia's best batting average in ACC play, swinging it at a .406 clip (28-for-69). That ranks fourth in the conference.
- He stands second among the conference's players with 18 RBI and 28 hits in ACC games.
- He owns a .425 on base percentage in ACC play.
- Proscia has racked up two or more hits in nine of the 15 ACC games, with at least one hit in 12 of 15.

PROSCIA ETCHES NAME IN VIRGINIA CAREER RECORDS BOOK

- Steven Proscia continues to stand out as one of Virginia's all-time top run producers.
- He has moved into a fourth-place tie in career RBI at Virginia with 162. He is tied with Jon Benick (1998-2001) for fourth.
- Proscia needs four RBI to match Ryan Gilleland (1995-98) and Bill Narleski (1984-87) for second.
- He is five shy of Sean Doolittle's school record of 167.
- Proscia also owns 54 career doubles, which second in the Virginia career annals behind only Tyler Cannon (2007-10) with 62.
- Proscia also is six hits shy of reaching the top 10 in Virginia history.

TAYLOR SETS THE TABLE

- Chris Taylor has filled the leadoff slot in every game this season and has proven to be strong on that role.
- He ranks fourth on the team with a .291 batting average and stands fifth in the ACC with 36 runs.
- He has notched hits in 29 of his 36 games this year and has reached base safely in all but one game.
- Taylor had 59 at bats in 29 games last year (13 starts) and hit .305.

CAVALIERS SHUT DOWN BIG OFFENSES

- Virginia is yielding just 2.8 runs per game – the fourth fewest allowed in Division I baseball.
- It's not like UVa is padding its numbers against inferior offenses. UVa has played 10 games (eight wins) against top 30 offenses in the nation this year.
- UVa swept three games from Clemson (No. 25, 7.4 runs/game), won two of three against Florida State (No. 26, 7.4) and Georgia Tech (No. 24, 7.4) and picked up a 7-3 midweek victory over James Madison (No. 1, 10.1).

MOST MARCH WINS EVER

- Virginia recorded its best month of March in program history.
- UVa won a school-record 19 games in March (19-1).
- It marks the third-best winning percentage for a UVa team in March (.950), behind only the 1967 (5-0) and 1971 (6-0) teams.

LAST WEEKEND: VIRGINIA WINS 2 OF 3 AT GA TECH

- Virginia won two of three games last weekend at then-No. 8 Georgia Tech, taking the opener, 6-2, and the second game, 12-9, before dropping the finale, 10-8.
- UVa handed GT starter Mark Pope his first loss of 2011 in the opener; Danny Hultzen fanned 12 in 8.0 innings while David Coleman hit a 3-run home run.
- The Cavaliers pounded Saturday starter Jed Bradley for seven runs and eight hits in 4.2 innings (he entered with 1.85 ERA).
- Keith Werman hit .636 (7-for-11) with six RBI in the series, while Reed Gragnani was 5-for-11 (.455).
- Neither pitching staff fared well – UVa had a 6.58 ERA while Georgia Tech had a 7.33 (the two entered the weekend with the best two ERAs in the conference).

2010: VIRGINIA SWEEPS DUKE

- Virginia won all three games against Duke last year at Durham Bulls Athletic Park (12-3, 11-1, 10-6).
- The Cavaliers scored in double figures and had at least 16 hits in each of the three games, finishing with 33 runs and 49 hits in the series.
- It marked the first time Virginia has scored in double figures of all three games of an ACC series since the league went to the three-game series format in 1990.
- Danny Hultzen and Robert Morey recorded UVa's first back-to-back complete games since Jacob Thompson and Pat McAnaney on March 28-29, 2008 against Virginia Tech.

NOTING THE ROBERTS PERFECT GAME

Some quick bullet points on Will Roberts' perfect game against George Washington on March 29:

- Eighth nine-inning perfect game in NCAA Division I since 1957 (19 total - 10 7-inning, one 5-inning)
- Second ACC perfect game (Dick Reitz of Maryland vs. Johns Hopkins, 1957)
- First perfect game in Virginia history; first UVa no-hitter since Mike Ballard vs. BC on April 16, 2006
- First perfect game in Division I since March 2, 2002 (Auburn's Eric Brandon vs. Murray State)
- Roberts threw 98 pitches (67 strikes)
- He went to just four three-ball counts (one 3-0 count) and six two-ball counts
- He was behind in the count in just 12 instances (five were at 1-0); nine outs came on first two pitches
- Roberts recorded 10 strikeouts, 14 groundouts, two pop outs and one fly out
- He tied a career high with his 10 strikeouts
- Final out came on a groundout to second baseman Keith Werman, who was the busiest UVa defender with seven assists and two putouts
- It was Roberts' first career complete game and shutout (previous career high was 7.2 innings)
- He threw seven pitches in second and seventh inning and eight in the third
- Game lasted just 1 hour, 55 minutes
- The perfect game earned ESPN's top play that night and the next day
- The win marked Virginia's 2,000th victory in program history (122 seasons)

- UVa hit .398 in the series, led by Keith Werman (.667, 6-for-9) and Jarrett Parker (.538, 7-for-13). John Hicks, Tyler Cannon and Kenny Swab each hit .429 in the series.
- Virginia hit six homers over the weekend, highlighted by two long balls from Parker on Saturday.

WILSON SEAMLESSLY MOVES TO ROTATION

- After pitching out of the bullpen for most of his first three seasons, including 51 straight relief outings entering the season, Tyler Wilson has shifted to the weekend rotation in 2011.
- He is 4-0 with a 2.68 ERA this year. In 47.0 innings he has allowed just 38 hits and 15 walks with 56 strikeouts (sixth most in ACC).
- Wilson now owns 21 career wins, which is tied for third in Virginia history (21-7, 3.14 ERA).
- He ranks fourth in career pitching appearances at UVa with 80 (11 starts).

WILSON A CANDIDATE FOR SENIOR CLASS AWARD

- Tyler Wilson has been named one of 30 candidates for the 2011 Lowe's Senior CLASS Award.
- An acronym for Celebrating Loyalty and Achievement for Staying in School®, the award focuses on the total student-athlete and encourages students to use their platform in athletics to make a positive impact as leaders in their communities.
- A biology major, Wilson is planning to go into the medical field and become an orthopedic surgeon after his baseball career concludes.

SOUTHPAWS GIVE UVA MORE OPTIONS OUT OF 'PEN

- Virginia has added a quartet of left-handed options to its bullpen this year, with a healthy Scott Silverstein, sophomore Aaron Stull and freshmen Kyle Crockett and Ryan Ashooh.
- The lefties have combined to work 19.0 innings out of the bullpen and 23.0 innings total in 21 appearances.
- In 65 games last year, left-handers made just 25 appearances out of the bullpen for the Cavaliers.
- Silverstein did not pitch his first two seasons at UVA while recovering from shoulder surgery.

ROBERTS RECORDS FIRST PERFECT GAME IN VIRGINIA HISTORY

- Will Roberts notched the first perfect game in Virginia baseball history on March 29 in a 2-0 win over George Washington at Davenport Field.
- Roberts is the second ACC pitcher to record a perfect game and just the eighth in Division I history to post a nine-inning perfect game.
- He needed only 98 pitches to finish off the perfect game.

ROBERTS NAMED NATIONAL PLAYER OF WEEK, ACC PITCHER OF WEEK

- After his perfect game-effort against George Washington, Will Roberts was named one of Collegiate Baseball's National Players of the Week, the publication announced April 4.
- He also was named the NCBWA National Pitcher of the Week
- In addition, Roberts earned ACC Pitcher of the Week honors for the first time.

O'CONNOR RANKS FOURTH IN WIN PERCENTAGE ENTERING 2010

- UVA head coach Brian O'Connor entered 2011 with a career record of 316-118-1 (.728) and a 126-71-1 record in ACC play.
- O'Connor's 72.8 winning percentage ranked as the fourth best mark among active NCAA Division I coaches entering the 2011 season.
- The only coaches who own a higher winning percentage are Mike Martin (Florida State), Mike Fox (North Carolina) and Gene Stephenson (Wichita State).

HULTZEN NAMED NATIONAL PLAYER OF THE WEEK – AGAIN

- Virginia LHP/utility Danny Hultzen was named one of *Collegiate Baseball's* National Players of the Week Monday (March 11). He joined Baylor RHP Logan Verrett and Georgia Tech RHP Mark Pope in earning the honor.
- It marks the second time in three weeks that Hultzen gleaned this distinction from *Collegiate Baseball*.
- Hultzen improved to 4-0 on the season after firing 6.2 shutout innings Friday against Clemson, which came into the game as the top hitting team in the ACC with a .343 batting average. He fanned 14 Clemson batters and struck out at least two batters in six of the seven innings he worked during a 5-0 win against the Tigers.
- Hultzen also went 3-for-8 with three RBI at the plate for the week.

DEMAND RESULTS IN RECORD ATTENDANCE

- A school-record 125,959 fans walked through the turnstiles at Davenport Field in 2010 (14th nationally). UVA averaged 3,148 fans per game.
- Virginia obliterated all of its previous attendance records. The previous season highs were 1,774 per game and 65,661 total in 2007.
- Virginia played in front of 11 home sellout crowds, including a school-record 4,825 for the May 16 contest with North Carolina.

VIRGINIA LEADS NATION IN ERA LAST SIX YEARS

- Virginia led all NCAA Division I teams in ERA over the past six seasons, boasting a 3.26 team ERA.
- UVA is the only school to rank in the top 20 in the country in ERA each of the last six seasons, including No. 3 marks in 2005, 2006, 2007 and 2009.
- Virginia also is the only team in Division I to rank among the top 20 nationally in ERA, strikeouts and fewest hits allowed each of the last three years.

 - RHP Tyler Wilson (35th round, CIN) and C/1B/OF Kenny Swab each have returned for their senior seasons.
- The previous UVA high for draft picks in a year was six.

- Georgia Tech ranks second in the ACC over the same span with a .968 fielding mark.

VERSATILITY WILL BE KEY

- Much of the UVa’s depth comes because of its versatility – several players could see action at a variety of positions.
- John Hicks and Kenny Swab each are athletic players who primarily are catchers but both will shift to first base and the outfield at times.
- Danny Hultzen will pitch and also is a strong defensive first baseman and will DH and play the outfield as well.
- Reed Gragnani and Chris Taylor each can play multiple infield positions as well as the outfield.
- Corey Hunt (INF) and Shane Halley (OF) each will pitch, but are great defensive players in the field as well.
