VIRGINIA-NORTH CAROLINA SERIES

- North Carolina holds a 175-98-4 edge in its all-time series with Virginia.
- UNC swept the Cavaliers each of the last two years in the regular season. UVA defeated the Tar Heels, 3-2, in the 2011 ACC tournament.
- Thirteen of the last 17 games have been decided by three runs or fewer.

PITCHING DOMINATES RECENT UVA-UNC SERIES

- Pitching has been the focal point of the recent Virginia-UNC series.
- In the teams' 14 meetings since 2009, there has been just one instance where a team scored more than six runs in a game: UVA scored 11 runs in the 2009 ACC Tournament.

CAVALIERS HIT 40 WINS FOR EIGHTH TIME IN 10 YEARS

- Virginia recorded its 40th win of the year last Friday, reaching the 40-win plateau for the eighth time in the last 10 seasons.
- UVA had one season of 40 wins or more prior to 2004 (1996).
- UVA has recorded 39 wins or more in all 10 years under the current coaching staff (39 wins in 2008, 2012).
- The 43 wins in 2013 ranks eighth in program history.

CAVALIERS SET FOR GRADUATION THIS WEEKEND

- Seven members of the Virginia baseball program will earn degrees Sunday from the University of Virginia.
- Rob Amaro (sociology), Reed Gragnani (history), Colin Harrington (chemistry), Whit Mayberry (commerce) and manager Taylor Myers (psychology) all will earn their bachelor's degrees.
- Jared King (kinesiology) and Scott Silverstein (education) will earn their master's degrees.
- King and Silverstein have been on five UVA teams that have combined for 238 wins, while the fourth-year class has been a part of 189 victories.

OFFENSE PUTS UP BIG INNINGS REGULARLY

- Virginia has scored three or more runs in an inning 64 times this year.
- UVA has recorded three runs in an inning on 28 occasions this year.
- UVA has outscored foes 210-60 in the fifth through eighth innings: 40-18 in fifth, 48-18 in sixth, 52-16 in seventh and 70-8 in eighth.
- UVA averages 8.3 runs per game, outscoring its opponents 424-190.

ODDS AND ENDS

- Virginia stands third nationally in the latest NCAA RPI report.
- UVA is first in the ACC in batting (.317), fourth in ERA (2.99) and seventh in fielding (.969).
- UVA has won seven of its nine ACC series.
- Mike Papi leads the nation in on base percentage (.547).
- Joe McCarthy owns the third-best OBP of any freshman nationally (.472).

HOT WAHOO BATS

- Virginia has been scorching at the plate since returning from its exam break last week. UVa has hit .430 as a team in the four games since coming back, while recording double-figure hits in each game.
- UVa has scored 48 runs over the last three games, its most in a three-game stretch since March 8-11, 2009, when the Cavaliers tallied 48 against Wake Forest (21), Navy (17) and VMI (10).
- In addition to the big hit totals, Virginia batters did not record a strikeout Tuesday and fanned just once in their last two games.

PAPI RED-HOT AGAIN

- Mike Papi has been hot at the plate of late, going 9-for-16 with nine runs and nine RBI since UVa returned from its final break (all in leadoff spot in batting order).
- Papi was named ACC Co-Player of the Week on Monday in honor of his big weekend against Duke.
- He owns hits in eight of his last nine games.
- Since being inserted into the Cavaliers' lineup as a pinch hitter March 15 at Clemson, Papi is batting .444 (48-for-108) with 44 runs and 42 RBI (35 games).
- He leads the nation with a .547 on-base percentage and ranks fifth in batting (.411) and 20th in slugging (.653).

VIRGINIA STANDS THIRD IN RPI

- Virginia holds a No. 3 standing in the latest NCAA RPI report.
- The Cavaliers fall behind Vanderbilt and UNC.
- UVa is 12-6 against the RPI top 25 and 18-7 against the top 50.

GRAGNANI A TOUGH OUT

- Despite batting in the bottom third of Virginia's batting order, Reed Gragnani has been a tough out for opposing pitchers.
- Nationally, he is the fifth toughest to strike out, with just eight strikeouts in 173 at bats (one per 21.6 AB).
- He also has been one of UVa's top run producers, with 46 RBI, which is third on the team and tied for 12th in the ACC.
- Gragnani has a team-high 16 RBI in his last 10 games.

LATE-INNING THUNDER

- Virginia has been strong in the late innings, outscoring its foes 122-35 from the seventh inning on this year.
- UVa owns three ninth-inning rallies from two runs or more down – 5-2 in ninth at Clemson, won 6-5 in 11; 6-2 at Wake Forest, won 7-6; 5-3 vs. Duke, won 6-5.
- The Cavaliers also rallied from five runs down in the sixth inning on April 17 against Old Dominion to win 10-9 in 10 innings.

COMEBACK KIDS

- Virginia scored its 17th and 18th comeback wins of the season on last weekend against Duke.
- UVa has rallied from three runs or more behind to win on six occasions this year, with five coming in the sixth inning or later:

CROCKETT SETTLES INTO CLOSER ROLE

- Junior lefty Kyle Crockett has closed out games this season and been sensational. He owns 10 saves, which ranks second in the ACC.
- Crockett was named to the NCBWA Stopper of the Year Watch List (one of 25 players nationally).
- Crockett has made 23 appearances this year, allowing just six earned runs while opponents have hit .191 against him. He has appeared in 17 of UVa's 27 ACC games (most of any conference pitcher).
- He has made 82 career appearances – most on the staff and fifth most in program history.

VIRGINIA SLOWS THE RUNNING GAME

- Virginia has shown the propensity to shut down its opponents' running games this year.
- Virginia has allowed just 27 stolen base attempts in 47 games, with 16 successful steals (59% success rate).
- The Cavaliers also have picked off 11 baserunners.
- UVa has not allowed a stolen base attempt in the last five games and has given up just four stolen bases in seven attempts in the last 19 contests.
- UVa allowed three stolen bases to Maryland, which entered with 44 steals in 12 games, and none to NC State, who entered with 47 stolen bases in 53 attempts.

FRESHMEN PLAYING KEY ROLES

- Virginia has leaned heavily on its first-year players early this season, particularly on the mound.
- Twelve freshmen already have seen playing time – tied for seventh-most nationally and second among ACC teams (Clemson 13, Maryland 12).
- Tennessee leads the nation with 17 freshmen who have played this year.
- Seven true freshmen have accounted for 45 percent of the innings pitched this year (205 2/3 of 454 2/3 total).
- Joe McCarthy has started 49 of 51 contests in the batting order and currently is UVa's 3-hole hitter.

VIRGINIA AMONG NATIONAL LEADERS IN RUNS

- Virginia ranks third nationally in runs and fourth in scoring.
- The Cavaliers have scored 424 runs (8.3 per game) in 51 games.
- The Cavaliers rank among the nation's top 20 in eight statistical categories on offense.

THREE CAVALIERS NAMED TO AWARD WATCH LISTS

- Three Virginia players recently have been named to watch lists for various national awards.
- Branden Cogswell is one of 25 players to be named to the watch list for the Wallace Award, presented to the nation's top shortstop.
- Kyle Crockett is one of 51 players on the NCBWA's watch list for the Stopper of the Year Award, which is given to the premier relief pitcher in NCAA baseball.
- Nick Howard stands as one of 25 players on the John Olerud Two-Way Player of the Year Award Watch List. UVa's Danny Hultzen won this award in 2011.

COGSWELL OUT WITH FRACTURED FINGER

- Branden Cogswell suffered a fractured finger in practice on May 4, breaking the middle finger on his right hand.
- He had surgery to repair the break and will be reevaluated prior to the ACC tournament.
- Cogswell was having a sensational year, batting .346 (10th in ACC) with a .464 on base percentage (seventh).
- Prior to his injury, Cogswell was the lone Cavalier to play in every game in 2013 and had reached base safely in 43 of 47 games this year.

MCCARTHY AMASSING HUGE ROOKIE YEAR

- Virginia freshman Joe McCarthy has put together an impressive rookie campaign. He currently tops all ACC freshmen in batting with a .343 average (12th overall).
- He is tied for first among ACC rookies in walks with 43 (fourth overall) and is second in on base percentage at .472 (sixth overall).
- McCarthy has hits in eight straight games entering the series, batting .486 (18-37) in that stretch.

MCCARTHY A REGULAR ON BASEPATHS

- Joe McCarthy was the only ACC player to reach base safely in every game this year until April 14 when he went 0-for-3 in the rain-shortened game at Georgia Tech.
- He has reached base safely in 47 of his 49 games.
- The rookie reached base safely in the first 36 games this year, the longest streak by a UVa player since Dan Grovatt reached base in 43 straight games in 2009.
- He owns a .472 on base percentage, which is second on the team and fifth in the ACC.
- He owns the third-best OBP of any freshman in Division I this year.

DOWNES AN EXTRA-BASE HIT MACHINE

- In his first year as the Cavaliers' cleanup hitter, Brandon Downes has been solid and is batting .328 with a .407 on base percentage.
- Downes owns 31 extra-base hits and tops the team in home runs (7), triples (7), doubles (17), RBI (52) and total bases (119).
- Downes is first in the ACC in triples, sixth in doubles and 11th in home runs.
- Downes ranks first on the team in hits (67) and runs (57) and second in slugging (.583).

NO FREE PASSES ...

- Virginia pitchers make opposing batters earn their way on base. The UVa pitching staff has issued just 118 walks in 51 games, by far the fewest walks allowed in the ACC this year. Miami is second with 150.
- UVa allows just 2.34 walks per nine innings, which is fifth fewest nationally.
- The Cavaliers also have hit only 22 batters this year (third fewest nationally).
- UVa will be tested by a UNC team that is tied for the national lead in walks (300) and has been hit by 67 pitches.

... BUT PLENTY OF FREEBIES FOR UVA BATTERS

- While the Cavaliers' pitchers have thrived on not issuing walks, Virginia batters have found plenty of ways to get on base.
- Virginia batters rank seventh nationally with 264 walks (fourth in ACC).
- UVa batters also have been hit by 64 pitches, which is third among ACC squads.
- The Cavaliers rank fourth nationally with a .417 on base percentage.

VIRGINIA TOPS 100,000 IN ATTENDANCE AGAIN

- Despite the chilly temperatures and poor weather earlier this year, Virginia ranks 12th nationally in total attendance (102,410) and 16th in average attendance (3,012) this year (third in ACC).
- More than 100,000 fans have attended Cavalier games each of the past four seasons. UVa has ranked among the top 20 programs nationally in attendance each of the last four years.
- UVa ranked 15th nationally in total attendance (112,281) and 19th in average attendance (3,208) last year.
- Davenport Field seats 4,980 per game, slightly down this year after the addition of more chairback seats in place of the bleacher seats in the grandstand.
- The entire reserved section in the grandstand sold out once again this year.

UVA BREAKS SERIES ATTENDANCE RECORD

- Virginia broke the program's three-game series attendance record April 20-21 by drawing 13,890 fans for its series with Florida State.
- The program's three-game series record was 13,625, set April 13-15, 2012, against North Carolina.
- The final two games at Davenport Field each drew capacity crowds of 4,980.

UVA 10TH NATIONALLY IN SHUTOUTS

- Virginia has racked up eight shutouts, which is tied for 10th in the country.
- UVa is two off the lead, which is held by Cal State Fullerton and Louisville.
- The total is already tied with the 2007 squad for fourth most in a season at Virginia.
- UVa finished with just two shutouts in 2012.

PAPI MAKES A GRAND STATEMENT

- Mike Papi has had a flair for the dramatic this year.
- Two of his homers have been clutch, late-inning grand slams.
- Papi hit a seventh-inning grand slam to tie the game against Old Dominion.
- He hit a two-out grand slam on an 0-2 pitch in the ninth inning April 6 to rally UVa to a 7-6 win at Wake.
- Papi also blasted an 11th-inning homer to win the Clemson game on March 15, just two innings after he hit a two-out RBI single to tie the game in the ninth inning.

WADDELL STRONG IN FIRST YEAR

- Southpaw Brandon Waddell has been a standout while serving as UVa's Friday starter as a freshman.
- He owns 69 strikeouts in 67 1/3 innings this year; he ranks third among all freshmen nationally in strikeouts.
- He was named one of Collegiate Baseball's six National Players of the Week on Feb. 25 following a dominating outing vs. Toledo.
- In six innings, he struck out 15 batters, most by a UVa freshman hurler since Seth Greisinger fanned 15 against UNC in 1994. He allowed just six hits and one walk.
- On Feb. 15 at ECU, Waddell became the first UVa freshman to make the opening-game start since Dave Sammons on Feb. 26, 1986, at William and Mary.

FIFTH-YEARS PROVIDE LEADERSHIP

- Virginia has a pair of veteran fifth-year seniors set to guide the young 2013 team: Jared King and Scott Silverstein.
- King has played 192 career games, with 173 career starts. His streak of 90 straight starts, dating to 2011, was snapped March 2 in the first game of the DH.
- Silverstein was the Cavaliers' Saturday starter for most of 2012 after battling back from a pair of shoulder surgeries.
- The two have been part of two ACC championship teams, three regional championship squads and two College World Series teams.

CHANGES AT DAVENPORT FIELD

- Davenport Field underwent several changes during the offseason.
- A new sand-based playing surface has been installed. After removing the previous surface, crews put in a new irrigation and field drainage system (previous field had no drainage system).
- The \$1 million project also included the installation of a new synthetic warning track that runs in foul territory between the foul poles as well as new dugout flooring surfaces and a new FieldTurf collar behind home plate.
- Home plate was moved in about five feet, creating more foul territory down the lines as well as new field dimensions: 332-370-404-370-332.
- In separate projects, new chairback seats were added to replace the grandstand bleachers and a new video board was erected.

O'CONNOR NAMED BASEBALL AMERICA'S COACH OF THE FIRST HALF

- Virginia head coach Brian O'Connor was tabbed the National Coach of the First Half by Baseball America on April 4.
- The Cavaliers racked up a 27-3 record (9-3 ACC) at that point despite featuring a lineup of primarily sophomores and freshmen as well as a freshman-laden pitching staff.

O'CONNOR FOURTH AMONG ACTIVE COACHES IN WIN PERCENTAGE

- Virginia head coach Brian O'Connor is 454-157-2 (.738) in 10 seasons at the helm of the Cavaliers.
- O'Connor's 73.4 percent winning percentage entering the season ranked fourth among active Division I head coaches behind only UNC's Mike Fox (.744), Florida State's Mike Martin (.743) and Wichita State's Gene Stephenson (.735).

CAVALIERS OWN MOST WINS IN NATION SINCE 2009

- Virginia has posted 238 wins since the start of the 2009 season – most in Division I baseball.
- South Carolina has 236 victories in that span, while Florida State has 231.
- UVa set a school record with 49 wins in 2009, topped it in 2010 with 51 victories, then upped it again in 2011 with a national-best 56 wins.
- Jared King and Scott Silverstein are in their fifth years at UVa and have been part of this entire stretch.

- Virginia led the nation in ERA in 2012 (2.24) and posted No. 3 marks in 2005, 2006, 2007 and 2009.
- Virginia also was the only team in Division I to rank among the top 20 nationally in ERA, strikeouts and fewest hits allowed each season from 2008-11.
