GAME PREVIEW

No. 22/20 North Carolina will look to extend its eight-game road win streak when the Tar Heels visit Virginia on Saturday, Oct. 22. The game will kick off at 3 p.m. and will be televised by the Regional Sports Network. Saturday's game marks the end of a challenging October for the Tar Heels who opened the month against three consecutive ranked teams and finish it with a third road game in the last four weeks. Following the Virginia game, the Tar Heels will have a much-needed bye week on Oct. 29.

Carolina (5-2 overall, 3-1 ACC) is coming off a 20-13 victory at No. 16 Miami. UNC defensive end Malik Carney strip sacked Miami QB Brad Kaaya in the game's final two minutes and the ball was recovered by teammate Jeremiah Clarke. Quarterback Mitch Trubisky completed 33 of 46 attempts for 299 yards, two touchdowns and no interceptions as Carolina amassed 461 total yards of offense against the nation's No. 9 defense.

Virginia (2-4 overall, 1-1 ACC) is coming off a 45-31 loss vs. Pitt. The Cavaliers are under the direction of head coach Bronco Mendenhall, who coached 11 seasons at BYU before leaving for Virginia this year.

North Carolina, now in its 126th season of college football, has a record of 699-521-54 and is looking to earn its 700th all-time victory this weekend.

CAROLINA-VIRGINIA SERIES NOTES

■ North Carolina leads the series with Virginia, 62-54-4, and has won six straight in the series for the first time since winning nine in a row from 1974-82.

■ In Carolina's last trip to Charlottesville in 2014, QB Mitch Trubisky threw a 16-yard touchdown pass on his only play of the game, giving North Carolina its first lead with 4:05 remaining, and the Tar Heels stunned Virginia 28-27. Trubisky was called into action when starter Marquise Williams was sacked and his helmet came off, setting up a third-and-15 from the 16. Trubisky hit a wide open T.J. Thorpe to give North Carolina the lead.

■ Last year, Elijah Hood rushed for two touchdowns and Carolina forced five turnovers in a 26-13 win over Virginia, the Tar Heels' sixth straight victory. Hood finished with 101 yards rushing and two 3-yard scoring runs, T.J. Logan added a 16-yard TD and Nick Weiler kicked two field goals. UNC broke a 13-all halftime tie by scoring on its first three possessions of the second half, and pitched a second-half shutout.

■ Saturday's game will be the 121st meeting in the rivalry known as the "South's Oldest Rivalry." Only two other rivals in the country have played more often.

■ North Carolina's final game of the regular season was typically played against Virginia prior to 1950. In fact, from 1919-1950, Carolina played its regular season finale vs. Virginia 28 of 32 times.

■ Eight current Tar Heels are from Virginia: defensive end Malik Carney (Alexandria), defensive tackle Jeremiah Clarke (Alexandria), defensive tackle Aaron Crawford (Ashburn), offensive lineman Jay-Jay-McCarg (Alexandria), defensive end Tyler Powell (Midlothian), cornerback Patrice Rene (Alexandria), cornerback M.J. Stewart (Arlington) and kicker Nick Weiler (Fairfax Station).

FEDORA VS. VIRGINIA

■ Carolina head coach Larry Fedora is 6-0 against Virginia, including four wins at UNC and two wins while coaching Southern Miss. His wins over Virginia have featured several memorable plays, including a fake punt from the end zone in Southern Miss' 2011 victory at Virginia. In 2013, the Tar Heels executed a wide receiver pass back to Marquise Williams for a touchdown. It was the first time UNC had used that play under Fedora. In UNC's last win in Charlottesville, QB Mitch Trubisky came in for one play and hit T.J. Thorpe for a go-ahead touchdown with 4:05 remaining. On the ensuing kickoff, Mack Hollins recovered the onside kick and the Tar Heels ran out the clock.

OVERALL

🔵 **Winning True Road Games:** Carolina has won eight straight true road games, which is the fourth-longest road win streak in the country. It is the longest road win streak for the Tar Heels as a member of the ACC and the longest since winning 10 straight from 1947-49.

🔵 **The 700 Club:** Carolina, now in its 126th season of college football, has a record of 699-521-54 and is looking to earn its 700th all-time victory this weekend.

🔵 **Wins In Florida:** Carolina is just the second team in college football history to knock off Miami and Florida State on the road in the same season. Virginia in 2011 is the other.

🔵 **Ranked Wins:** Carolina's wins at No. 12 Florida State and at No. 16 Miami mark the first time the Tar Heels have won two games on the road over ranked teams in the same season.

🔵 **ACC Wins:** Carolina's three ACC wins this season have been decided by a combined total of 10 points. UNC beat Pittsburgh 37-36, FSU 37-35, and knocked off Miami, 20-13.

🔵 **Overall Wins:** Carolina has won 16 of its last 20 games, including 11 of 12 ACC regular season games.

🔵 **Wins At Virginia:** After enduring a 14-game losing streak at Virginia, which included some of the most gut-wrenching losses in school history, the Tar Heels have won three in a row in Charlottesville.

🔵 **ACC Win Streak:** Carolina's 10-game ACC regular-season win streak came to an end with a loss to Virginia Tech. The 10-game ACC win streak was the third longest in UNC history. UNC won 11 straight from 1979-81 (last two in 1979, went 6-0 in 1980 and won first three in 1981) and 15 in a row from 1970-72 (last three in 1970, went 6-0 next two seasons and lost league opener in 1973).

🔵 **Winning at Kenan:** Carolina has won nine of the last 10 games at Kenan Stadium, including all seven games in 2015 and two of three this season.

🔵 **ACC Opener:** North Carolina won its ACC opener for the second straight season with a 37-36 victory over Pitt. In 2015, Carolina opened league play with a 38-31 come-from-behind victory at Georgia Tech. It is the first time since 1996-97 that Carolina won ACC openers in back-to-back seasons.

🔵 **Facing New Coaches:** Carolina faces seven teams with new coaches in 2016, including Kirby Smart at Georgia, Lovie Smith at Illinois, Mike

MITCH & THE RECORD BOOK

■ Junior QB Mitch Trubisky has already posted his name in several places in UNC record book:

- most touchdowns in a game (5 vs. Pitt, tied with several others)
- consecutive completions in a single-game (18 vs. JMU)
- consecutive completions over multiple games (30, 18 vs. JMU, 12 vs. Pitt)
- most passing yards per attempt (16.0 vs. JMU)
- most passing yards in consecutive games (885 vs. JMU/Pitt)
- most passing yards in three straight games (1,290 vs. JMU/Pitt/FSU)
- most consecutive pass attempts without an interception (243).

Houston at JMU, Justin Fuente at Virginia Tech, Mark Richt at Miami, Bronco Mendenhall at Virginia and Brent Thompson at The Citadel.

🔵 **Fresh Faces:** Carolina has played 17 freshmen this season, including 10 true freshmen and seven redshirt freshmen. True freshmen to see action this year are tailback Jordon Brown, safety Myles Dorn, defensive tackle Marlon Dunlap, safety D.J. Ford, defensive end Tomon Fox, cornerback Patrice Rene, linebacker Dominique Ross, cornerback K.J. Sails, punter Tom Sheldon and linebacker Jonathan Smith. The redshirt freshmen include tight end Jake Bargas, offensive tackle Charlie Heck, offensive guard Tommy Hatton, wide receiver Anthony Ratliff-Williams, tight end Carl Tucker, defensive end Jason Strowbridge and OT William Sweet.

OFFENSE

🔵 **Trubisky Rankings:** Trubisky is fifth in the nation in total completions (179), sixth in completion percentage (70.5), ninth in total yards (2,068), 12th in pass efficiency rating (156.78), 19th in passing yards per game (295.4) and 18th in TD passes (15).

🔵 **Trubisky Streak:** QB Mitch Trubisky's school-record streak of consecutive pass attempts without an interception ended at 243 against Virginia Tech. His fourth pass of the game, which was intended for Mack Hollins, was tipped and then intercepted by Virginia Tech cornerback Greg Stroman. The previous record of 154 was set by Oscar Davenport in 1996-97. Trubisky attempted 178 consecutive passes this season before his first interception.

🔵 **Trubisky's Top Three:** In his first five games as a starter, Trubisky had three of the top 11 single-game passing performances in UNC history (453 vs. Pitt - ranks second all-time at UNC; 432 vs. JMU - ranks fourth; 405 vs. FSU - ranks 11th).

🔵 **100 Point Scorers:** Carolina has five players who have scored 100 or more career points. They are PK Nick Weiler (228 points), TB Elijah Hood (150), WR Ryan Switzer (138), TB T.J. Logan (138) and WR Mack Hollins (120).

🔵 **Averaging 400 yards under Fedora:** In 125 seasons of college football, Carolina has averaged 400 yards per game just 11 times, with four of those coming under Fedora's direction. The 2015 team set school marks for most points (570), points per game (40.7) and touchdowns (73). Carolina enters the Virginia game averaging 430.4 yards and 32.1 points per game.

🔵 **Offensive Line Experience:** Carolina's four returning offensive line starters have combined for 138 career starts. Senior Jon Heck (45 career starts) is at right tackle, senior Caleb Peterson (42) at left guard, senior Lucas Crowley (34) at center and junior Bentley Spain (17) at left tackle. Junior R.J. Prince has started the last six at right guard.

🔵 **Peterson's streak ends:** Carolina left guard Caleb Peterson had started 30 consecutive games before being sidelined vs. Virginia Tech and Miami with an injury.

🔵 **30 Consecutive Completions:** Trubisky set the school record with 30 consecutive pass completions, which he set against JMU and Pitt. He completed his last 18 in a row vs. JMU and had 12 straight completions in the first half vs. Pitt. The streak came to an end on an incomplete pass to Mack Hollins, which was caught out of bounds.

🔵 **Logan Fourth in All-Purpose:** Logan is fourth in the ACC with 135.1 all-purpose yards per game. He had 253 all-purpose yards in the season opener vs. Georgia, including a 95-yard kickoff return for touchdown, and followed that with 161 yards at Illinois and 151 vs. JMU.

🔵 **Highest Rushing Average in 20 years:** In the first four seasons under Larry Fedora, Carolina averaged 180.2 rushing yards per game. That is the highest four-year average since the 1992-95 seasons when Mack Brown's Tar Heels posted a 214.4 average. In 2015, Carolina finished 18th nationally with 224.4 rushing yards per game. That is the highest average per game on the ground at UNC since 1994 (226.9).

🔵 **Wide Receiver Trio:** The Tar Heels returned six of their top seven pass catchers from 2015, including senior standouts Ryan Switzer, Mack Hollins and Bug Howard. That trio has combined for 409 receptions, 5,718 yards and 49 touchdowns in their careers.

🔵 **Ryan Switzer** is Carolina's all-time leading receiver with 206 career catches. Against Miami, he eclipsed the record held previously by Quinshad Davis, who had 205 from 2012-15. Switzer ranks 12th in ACC history with 206 catches.

🔵 **Ryan Switzer** has at least one catch in 44 of 46 career games at UNC. Mack Hollins has made at least one catch in 33 of the last 34.

🔵 **Switzer** made an ACC record 30 combined receptions in consecutive wins over Pitt and Florida State. He tied the ACC single-game record with 16 catches vs. Pitt and then had 14 vs. FSU.

QUICK HITS

🔵 **Switzer** leads the ACC with 8.3 receptions per game and is second with 86.6 yards per game.

🔵 **Bug Catches:** Bug Howard has already matched his season total of 29 receptions from last year. His season high of 42 came during his sophomore season.

🔵 **Junior WR Austin Proehl**, son of Carolina Panthers' wide receivers coach Ricky Proehl, entered the season with 27 career catches. This season he has 24 receptions for 302 yards and two touchdowns.

🔵 **Final Drive vs. Pitt:** Carolina's winning drive vs. Pitt covered 63 yards in 17 plays and three minutes and 33 seconds. It was UNC's 12th drive of the game and was the longest in time and plays. UNC converted three fourth downs, including:

- 4th at 6 from UNC 41 – Trubisky to Switzer for 15 yards to the Pitt 45
- 4th and 6 from Pitt 40 – Trubisky to Austin Proehl for 13 yards to Pitt 27
- 4th and 9 from Pitt 26 – Trubisky to Switzer for 9 yards to Pitt 17

DEFENSE

🔵 **Defensive Line Starters:** Eight different players have made at least one start on the defensive line this season, including DE Mikey Bart (only player to start every game), DT Naz Jones (6), DE DT Aaron Crawford (4), DE Malik Carney (3), DT Jalen Dalton (2), DT Jeremiah Clarke (2), DE Tyler Powell (2) and DE Jason Strowbridge (1).

🔵 **Sack Increase:** Carolina averaged just 1.6 sacks per game in 2015. This season, the Tar Heels are averaging 2.14 per game with nine players accounting for the nine sacks. Sophomore Malik Carney leads the team with 3.5 sacks.

🔵 **Pass Defense:** Carolina has 28 pass breakups this year. M.J. Stewart leads the team with seven, and has 25 in his career, which ranks fifth all-time at UNC. Des Lawrence has 24 in his career, which ranks sixth at UNC.

🔵 **Late Game Defense vs. Pitt:** Pitt scored points on five of its first seven drives, including four touchdowns and a field goal (31 points). UNC forced punts on three of its final four drives.

🔵 **JMU Defense:** After surrendering 222 yards in the first quarter against James Madison, Carolina limited the Dukes to 273 the rest of the game. The Dukes were held scoreless on seven of their last eight drives.

🔵 **Sophomore Standout:** Sophomore middle linebacker Andre Smith has had double-digits in tackles in three of the seven games this year. He had a career-high 15 vs. Virginia Tech, 11 vs. Pitt and 14 vs. Illinois. Smith ranks sixth in the ACC with 9.1 tackles per game.

🔵 **Holcomb Stands Out:** Junior linebacker Cole Holcomb, a former walk-on who earned a scholarship at the end of fall camp, entered the season with 15 career tackles. This season, he has 59

tackles and ranks 10th in the ACC with 8.4 per game. He posted a career-high 13 tackles in the road win over No. 12 FSU.

🔵 **Safety in Numbers:** Safeties Donnie Miles and Dominique Green rank first and fourth, respectively, on the team in tackles. Miles has a team-high 66 stops, while Green has made 45. Green matched his career high with 10 tackles against Georgia. He also had 10 last year vs. Baylor.

🔵 **Jones Builds Resume:** Junior defensive tackle Nazair Jones has 35 tackles this season, including a team-best 4.5 tackles for loss. Jones was a third-team All-ACC selection a year ago and is one of the top defensive players on the team. A strong force on the inside of the line, Jones had 40 tackles, two fumble recoveries, one interception and one forced fumble in 2015.

🔵 **Most Improved:** Carolina had the most improved scoring defense in the country in 2015, allowing 14.5 fewer points per game than the previous season.

🔵 **2015 Rankings:** In 2015, Carolina was first in the ACC in interceptions (17), third in pass defense (187.7 ypg), third in pass efficiency defense (109.8 rating), third in red zone defense, third in turnover margin (+.50) and fifth in scoring defense (24.5 ppg).

SPECIAL TEAMS

🔵 **Punt Return Defense:** North Carolina leads the conference and is sixth nationally in punt return defense. Only six of Tom Sheldon's 25 punts have been returned for a combined total of 1 yard. The longest return Carolina has allowed this year was three yards at Illinois when the punt hit the returner in the leg and bounced forward and out of bounds three yards.

🔵 **Career Kickoff Return Leader:** T.J. Logan returned the opening kickoff of the second half 95 yards for a touchdown against Georgia. It was his third career kickoff return touchdown, which ties the UNC record. Brandon Tate (2005-08) also had three.

🔵 **Career Punt Return Leader:** Switzer has seven career punt return touchdowns, which is an ACC career record and is just one shy of tying the NCAA all-time record. The NCAA record of eight is held by Wes Welker of Texas Tech (2000-03) and Antonio Perkins of Oklahoma (2001-04).

🔵 **UNC Punt Return Yards Record:** Switzer also holds the UNC career record for punt return yards with 1,029. The previous mark was set by Charlie Justice with 966 yards from 1946-49. Switzer is one of just nine players in ACC history with more than 1,000 yards on punt returns. The ACC record of 1,296 is held by Virginia Tech's Eddie Royal. Switzer is the active career leader in the NCAA.

🔵 **Weiler Kicks:** Lou Groza Award candidate Nick Weiler has converted eight of 12 field goal attempts this season. He made a career-long 54-yarder to win the FSU game. He has made 33

of 43 career attempts, including 5 of 8 in 2014, 20 of 23 in 2015 and 8 of 12 in 2016. Last year, he converted all 67 extra point attempts and set the UNC single-season scoring mark with 127 points.

🔵 **Weiler Game-Winner:** Nick Weiler's 54-yard field goal vs. No. 12 Florida State was longest go-ahead field goal in the fourth quarter vs. ranked team in last 10 seasons. *Courtesy of ESPN.com.*

RECORD BOOK WATCH

🔵 Switzer has a UNC career record 1,029 punt return yards, which ranks seventh in ACC history. He needs 35 yards to move into sixth.

🔵 Switzer has a school-record 206 career receptions. He surpassed Quinshad Davis (205) in Carolina's win at Miami.

🔵 Elijah Hood is the 14th player in UNC history to rush for 2,000 career yards (2,091). He currently ranks 13th all-time at UNC and needs 303 yards to move past Ronnie McGill for 12th. Hood has 25 career rushing touchdowns and needs three more to move into a tie for seventh place at UNC.

🔵 Mack Hollins has 20 career touchdown receptions, which is third in UNC history. Hakeem Nicks is second all-time at UNC with 21. Quinshad Davis is first with 25.

🔵 T.J. Logan has 4,288 career all-purpose yards, which ranks eighth in UNC history. He is 104 yards shy of moving past Eric Blount for seventh place. Only eight players in UNC history have 4,000 all-purpose yards.

🔵 PK Nick Weiler ranks tied for eighth at UNC with 228 career points. He is three points shy of PK Tripp Pignetti for seventh and six points shy of TB Charlie Justice for sixth.

ATLANTA (AP) — Nick Chubb rushed for 222 yards in his return from a gruesome knee injury, including a 55-yard touchdown run late in the fourth quarter that clinched No. 18 Georgia's 33-24 victory over No. 22 North Carolina in Kirby Smart's debut as the Bulldogs' coach Saturday night.

Chubb scored a pair of touchdowns for Georgia (1-0), sending the largely red-clad crowd at the Chick-fil-A Kickoff Game into delirium when he broke loose down the right sideline with 3:34 remaining and the Bulldogs clinging to a two-point lead over the Tar Heels (0-1).

Leaving no doubt he was fully recovered from a horrific knee injury that looked like it might be career-threatening, Chubb carried a staggering 32 times and was every bit as dominating as the Heisman-touted back he was before.

Georgia also got some promising play from freshman quarterback Jacob Eason, who didn't start but was on the field as the Bulldogs rallied from a 24-14 deficit in the second half.

North Carolina ripped off 17 straight points, including a pair of touchdowns by T.J. Logan that included a 95-yard kickoff return to start the second half.

But a pair of pass interference penalties on freshman cornerback Patrice Rene set up a touchdown that got Georgia back in the game, and two more penalties - one an unsportsmanlike conduct penalty on coach Larry Fedora - backed the Tar Heels up deep in their own territory, leading to a safety when Elijah Hood caught a short pass in the end zone and was quickly knocked down for a safety.

Fifth-year senior Greyson Lambert started at quarterback for Georgia, but Eason - a touted freshman Georgia fans were clamoring to see - hooked up with Isaiah McKenzie on a 51-yard pass that set up William Ham's go-ahead, 29-yard field goal with 5:27 remaining.

CHAMPAIGN, ILL. (AP) --- Nursing an eight-point lead with just over 12 minutes left Saturday, North Carolina quarterback Mitch Trubisky heaved the ball deep toward Ryan Switzer but instead connected with the back of an Illinois defensive back.

No problem, as it turned out. The ball bounced high and came down in the hands of Tar Heel tight end Jake Bargas for a first down that set up a touchdown that gave North Carolina a 38-23 lead.

Sometimes, it's just your night, and Saturday was Trubisky's.

The junior quarterback threw for 265 yards and two touchdowns and ran for two more scores Saturday to lead the Tar Heels to a 48-23 win at Illinois.

"We took what the defense gave us," Trubisky said. "We were just rolling; whoever was open was making plays. Our o-line did a good job all night. We just kept attacking the areas they were giving us on the field."

Trubisky was coming off a workmanlike performance a week earlier against Georgia that wasn't enough to deliver a win.

On Saturday, he was 19-24 passing and didn't throw an interception. And he carried the ball nine times for 42 yards.

"He played well tonight, he took care of the football," North Carolina coach Larry Fedora said. "He ran the ball effectively and I thought he was into it, sharp, focused and tough and that's what I expect from him."

Illinois (1-1) went up 7-0 on the opening drive on a 65-yard Ke'Shawn Vaughn touchdown run while North Carolina's offense started slow.

Trubisky jump-started the attack, rushing for two short touchdowns by the end of the first quarter and giving UNC a 17-14 lead it never gave up.

The Tar Heels held Illinois quarterback Wes Lunt to 127 yards and two touchdowns on 17-35 passing.

Illinois also struggled with penalties. They were flagged 13 times for 99 yards.

First-year Illinois coach Lovie Smith called the game a learning experience for his team, but had no explanation for the penalties.

CHAPEL HILL, N.C. (AP) --- North Carolina quarterback Mitch Trubisky looked relaxed and made running the Tar Heels' high-powered offense look easy.

The first-year starter threw for a career-high 432 yards and three touchdowns while setting two school records, helping UNC beat James Madison 56-28 in Saturday's home opener.

"He's getting better and better, and more comfortable and more comfortable," UNC coach Larry Fedora said. "Now as you see him get more comfortable, you're seeing Mitch Trubisky come out now. You're seeing the guy that can do all the things that we think he can do."

Trubisky completed 24 of 27 passes for the Tar Heels (2-1), including a program single-game record of 18 straight before calling it a day in the fourth. He has thrown 156 passes without an interception, breaking a record that had stood since 1997.

The Tar Heels scored touchdowns on eight of the junior's nine drives, the exception being a one-snap possession before halftime. Each of those drives was at least 72 yards, with Trubisky connecting on a 75-yard flea flicker score to Ryan Switzer and a 71-yarder to Mack Hollins.

"I think it's just becoming more comfortable week to week," Trubisky said. "It's all about being better than the player I was last Saturday."

Meanwhile, Elijah Hood and T.J. Logan combined to rush for five scores for the Tar Heels (2-1), who finished with 635 yards and didn't punt until midway through the fourth quarter.

Khalid Abdullah ran for 116 yards and two touchdowns for the Dukes (2-1), who scored touchdowns on all three first-quarter drives. But they couldn't keep up with the Tar Heels' humming offense and didn't reach the end zone again until the third quarter after UNC led by 21.

"They've got some great athletes, but we made some mistakes there early that gave them some real cheap ones, some easy scores where they didn't have to work very much," JMU coach Mike Houston said. "That's our fault."

CHAPEL HILL, N.C. (AP) — Mitch Trubisky capped a huge day by throwing a 2-yard touchdown pass to Bug Howard with 2 seconds left to help North Carolina rally past Pittsburgh 37-36 on Saturday.

Trubisky threw for career highs of 453 yards and five touchdowns for the Tar Heels (3-1, 1-0 Atlantic Coast Conference), who never led until the final play and trailed by 13 midway through the fourth quarter.

But Trubisky coolly directed a 17-play, 63-yard drive that included three fourth-down conversions in a stunning finish that had UNC's players running onto the field to celebrate when stopping Pitt's last-play kick return.

"We had talked about before the game that we had an opportunity to establish the identity of this football team," UNC coach Larry Fedora said. "And I can say there's a lot of grit in this football team for one, a lot of toughness — all the intangibles that we need to be successful."

Ryan Switzer was the main target, tying a program record with 16 catches for 208 yards and a score in a matchup of the teams that finished 1-2 atop the ACC's Coastal Division last season.

Quadee Henderson ran for 107 yards for the Panthers (2-2, 0-1), who ran for 281 yards but went three-and-out on their last two drives to give UNC its opening.

"When something like that (comeback) happens, you have to look at yourself first: Did I do everything I needed to do to get us a victory?" Pitt defensive end Ejuan Price said. "I think that answer is no."

TALLAHASSEE, FLA. (AP) — Nick Weiler made a 54-yard field goal as time expired to give North Carolina a 37-35 win over No. 12 Florida State on Saturday, snapping the Seminoles' 22-game home winning streak.

It was the first field goal made by either team after their respective kickers missed their first four attempts. Weiler also atoned for a blocked extra point that allowed the Seminoles to take a late lead.

"I knew it was within his distance. That wasn't the issue," North Carolina coach Larry Fedora said. "He had something to prove. After the extra point got blocked I talked to him on the sideline and said he had to get it out of his head. He got his mind right and we gave him his shot."

After Florida State took a 35-34 lead with 22 seconds remaining on a Deondre Francois 2-yard touchdown run, the Tar Heels were able to drive 38 yards in three plays. They also took advantage of a pass interference call on Florida State's Tavarus McFadden to get them in range.

It is the second straight week that the Tar Heels (4-1, 2-0 Atlantic Coast Conference) have won in the final seconds. Last Saturday, they defeated Pittsburgh 37-36 with two seconds remaining on a Mitch Trubisky touchdown pass.

Against Florida State, Trubisky had his third straight 400-yard game, completing 31 of 38 passes for 405 yards and three touchdowns. Ryan Switzer, who had 16 catches last week, had 14 receptions for 158 yards.

The Tar Heels took a 34-28 lead on a 34-yard touchdown reception by Thomas Jackson, but Florida State's Wally Aime blocked Weiler's point-after attempt. Florida State (3-2, 0-2) then drove 75 yards in nine plays, culminating in Francois' score. The freshman quarterback looked like he was going to be sacked at the North Carolina 8 but eluded tackles by Mikey Bart and Malik Carney to score.

Florida State had the nation's longest active home winning streak. It is the Seminoles first home loss since falling to Florida in 2011.

"We had some critical mistakes in games, didn't finish drives early in games. Had some penalties," Florida State coach Jimbo Fisher said. "We have to play better. We have to do better. In all three phases. There's a lot of good there. There's way too much bad."

But Bud Foster's defense locked down on the Tar Heels and Mitch Trubisky, who entered as one of the nation's top passers. UNC finished with 131 yards, with Trubisky throwing his first two interceptions of the year, while the Hokies scored 20 points off four turnovers.

UNC, playing without injured top tailback Elijah Hood, failed to score a touchdown for the first time under fifth-year coach Larry Fedora.

MIAMI GARDENS, FLA. — Mitch Trubisky threw two touchdown passes, Malik Carney forced a turnover with 1:31 left to thwart Miami's last chance at a rally and North Carolina knocked off the 16th-ranked Hurricanes 20-13 on Saturday.

Ryan Switzer and Austin Proehl had scoring catches for the Tar Heels (5-2, 3-1 Atlantic Coast Conference). Bug Howard had 10 catches for 156 yards for North Carolina, which rebounded in a big way from last weekend's blowout loss against Virginia Tech.

Trubisky completed 33 of 46 passes for 299 yards for North Carolina, which went 2-1 in a three-week stretch against ranked foes.

"It's a huge bounce-back game for us, coming down on the road against a very good opponent," said Trubisky, whose team was embarrassed by Virginia Tech 34-3 last weekend while Hurricane Matthew poured down.

Brad Kaaya completed 16 of 31 passes for 224 yards for Miami, but he was hit by a blitzing Carney and lost the ball late in the game to send fans streaming for the exits. North Carolina took over and ran out the clock, sealing the deal when Elijah Hood rumbled 13 yards for a first down with 1:02 left — the 14th conversion in 23 third-down opportunities for the Tar Heels.

North Carolina now sits atop the ACC's Coastal Division, a half-game ahead of Virginia Tech and Pittsburgh.

"I'm pretty pleased with where this team is right now, where we sit and the job that they've done," said North Carolina coach Larry Fedora, whose club won the Coastal last season.

Miami's 2001 team — the last to win a national title for the Hurricanes and arguably one of the best college teams ever assembled — was honored at halftime, with coach Larry Coker running out of the traditional smoke first and followed by players who trotted from one of the end zones.

It was 10-0 North Carolina after one quarter, and Switzer made it 20-3 when he hauled in a 1-yard pass with 18 seconds left before halftime. Miami's defense didn't allow a point in the second half, highlighted by stopping the Heels on the Hurricane 1 to open the fourth quarter.
