VIRGINIA IN THE NCAA BASEBALL CHAMPIONSHIP

- Counting this year, Virginia has competed in each of the last eight NCAA tournaments and 11 overall.
- UVA is 22-22 all-time in the NCAA tournament.
- Under Brian O'Connor (since 2004), UVA is 16-16 in the NCAAs.
- UVA is a national seed for the second straight year and the second time in program history (No. 5 last year).

CAVALIERS ARE GRIZZLED VETERANS IN TOURNEY PLAY

- Virginia has plenty of experience when it comes to the NCAA tournament.
- The position players have combined to play in 95 NCAA tournament games, including 16 each from John Hicks, Steven Proscia and Keith Werman over the last two seasons.
- Six UVA pitchers have combined to throw in 24 tournament games, topped by Tyler Wilson with 10 tourney appearances, all out of the bullpen.

VIRGINIA ONE OF 13 IN LAST EIGHT NCAA TOURNAMENTS

- Virginia is one of 13 Division I baseball programs to reach the NCAA tournament each of the last eight seasons (including 2011).
- The Cavaliers are one of four schools in the ACC to hold that distinction, joining Florida State, Miami and North Carolina.
- The other programs are Arizona State, Arkansas, Cal State Fullerton, Oral Roberts, Rice, South Carolina, Southern Miss, TCU and Texas.

VIRGINIA AGAINST THE 2011 NCAA FIELD

- Virginia faced nine teams this year that advanced to the NCAA tournament (Clemson, Coastal Carolina, East Carolina, Florida State, Georgia Tech, James Madison, North Carolina, NC State, Miami).
- Twenty-six of Virginia's 58 games were against NCAA qualifiers (44.8 percent) – UVA went 18-8 against those teams.

VIRGINIA PLAYS HOST TO FIFTH REGIONAL

- This is Virginia's fifth home regional (2004, 2006, 2007, 2010, 2011).
- UVA is 8-7 in its previous four home regionals.
- The Cavaliers captured their first regional title on home soil last season.
- UVA has won back-to-back regionals (2009 Irvine).

ODDS AND ENDS

- Virginia owns the fewest losses and most wins in the tournament field.
- UVA ranks fifth nationally with 136 doubles.
- Opponents are batting .212 against UVA pitching this season.
- UVA is one of eight schools since 2000 to enter the NCAA tournament with fewer than 10 losses.
- UVA has seven All-ACC honorees – six earned the distinction for the first time.

WAHOOS ENTER TOURNEY WITH NINE LOSSES

- Virginia is one of eight teams since 2000 that have entered the NCAA tournament with fewer than 10 defeats.
- Two teams last year started the NCAA tournament with single-digit losses, but in the 10 prior seasons only five squads did so.
- The list of single-digit loss teams since 2000:
 - South Carolina (2000 - 8)
 - Southern (2002 - 8; 2003 - 5)
 - Tulane (2005 - 9)
 - Miami (2008 - 8)
 - Coastal Carolina (2010 - 7), Arizona State (2010 - 8)
 - Virginia (2011 - 9)

SERIES HISTORY VS. THE CHARLOTTESVILLE REGIONAL FIELD

- Virginia has a recent history with ECU and St. John's.
- UVa has played three-game series with ECU each of the last two years, winning two of three in both instances. UVa has a 22-18 lead in the all-time series.
- The Cavaliers saw St. John's last year in the regional. SJU won 6-5 to force a second championship game, but UVa picked up a 5-3 victory to win the regional. UVa has a 12-4 series lead over St. John's.
- Virginia last played Navy on March 10, 2009, a 17-1 UVa win. The Cavaliers own a 17-10 series lead.
- Full series history breakdowns are on page 8.

RECAPPING THE ACC BASEBALL CHAMPIONSHIP

- Virginia swept through the ACC Baseball Championship with four straight victories, with the final three all coming over top-20 foes.
- UVa run-ruled Wake Forest in the opener, then downed Miami, UNC and FSU to win the title.
- Steven Proscia was named the tournament's Most Valuable Player after going 7-for-16 with a pair of homers, five RBI and five extra-base hits.
- Chris Taylor (SS) and Kenny Swab (OF) joined Proscia (3B) on the all-tournament team.
- UVa pitchers surrendered just nine runs in the tournament, good for a 2.38 ERA.
- After hitting .190 in the previous six games, UVa's bats came alive to hit a tournament-best .328 with 18 extra-base hits.

CAVALIERS MOVE UP SINGLE-SEASON WINS LEDGER

- The 2011 Virginia team is tied with the 2009 squad for second in single-season wins in UVa history with 49.
- UVa needs two wins to match the 2011 team for the most victories in program history.
- UVa leads all Division I teams in wins this year (Vanderbilt, 47).

HOME COOKIN'

- Virginia won 30 home games in the regular season, which is tied for third most nationally behind North Carolina and South Carolina (31 each).
- In going 30-4, UVa matched Texas and Troy for the third-most home wins in Division I baseball this year.

UVA NEARS PROGRAM STRIKEOUT RECORD

- Virginia has recorded 573 strikeouts this season, which is second most in program history.
- The record of 593 was set in 2009 (65 games).
- For the first time, Virginia boasts two pitchers with 100 or more strikeouts in the same season, as Danny Hultzen has fanned 136 and Tyler Wilson 104.
- Virginia averages 9.88 strikeouts per nine innings, which is second most in school history (10.88, 1949).

CAVALIERS WIN NINE OF 10 ACC SERIES

- By winning all but one of its league series this season, Virginia joined elite company nationally.
- Among the five major baseball conferences (ACC, Big XII, C-USA, Pac-10, SEC), only four teams suffered just one series loss.
- Oregon State (Pac-10), South Carolina (SEC) and Texas (Big XII) each have absorbed one conference series loss. No teams in the major conferences won every league series (UVa and Oregon State were the last to lose a series).

UVA JOINS SELECT FEW TO WIN NINE ACC SERIES

- Virginia won nine ACC series for the second time in program history and the second straight year.
- UVa is the first ACC team to win nine league series in back-to-back seasons.
- Since the ACC went to the 10-series format in 2005, only six teams have won nine or more ACC series in a year (UVa in 2010, Miami and UNC in 2008, FSU in 2007 and Clemson in 2006).
- UVa won four of its ACC series by sweeps.

RECORD-TYING SEVEN ALL-ACC HONOREES

- Seven Virginia players earned All-ACC honors, tying a program record set in 2010.
- First team: David Coleman (OF), John Hicks (C), Danny Hultzen (SP), Branden Kline (RP), Steven Proscia (3B).
- Second team: John Barr (OF) and Tyler Wilson (SP).
- Hultzen was named the ACC Pitcher of the Year for the second straight year; he is the only Cavalier to ever win the award and the first at any school to win it twice.
- Brian O'Connor was named the ACC Coach of the Year for the second year in a row and the third time in his career (2004, 2010, 2011).

2011 TEAM IS FASTEST TO 40 WINS IN SCHOOL HISTORY

- With its 40-3 start, the 2011 Virginia team reached 40 wins in the fewest number of games in program history and tied for fewest in ACC history (Clemson, 1995).
- Virginia hit the 40-win plateau in game 49 last year (May 4 vs. VCU).
- This also marks the first time Virginia has reached 40 wins prior to the month of May.
- UVa has won 40 or more games in seven of the last eight seasons.

CAVALIERS RANKED NO. 2 IN LATEST RPI

- UVa was ranked No. 2 in the latest RPI report, announced May 31 by the NCAA.
- UVa held the No. 2 spot for the first two weeks, then supplanted Florida for the No. 1 position for a week before sliding back to No. 2 behind the Gators. UNC took over the top slot last week.
- Virginia is 12-6 against the RPI top 25 and 18-8 against the top 50 this year.

- UVa ranks fifth nationally in doubles with 136 (third most in program history).
- The Cavaliers rank third in the ACC in batting at .303.

SPREADING THE WEALTH ON OFFENSE

- Ten Virginia players have driven 20-plus runs each this season.
- This is just the fourth time this has occurred for a UVA baseball team, including the second straight year.
- UVA also had 10 players reach 20 RBI in 1988, 2007 and 2010.

VIRGINIA VS. RANKED TEAMS

- Virginia has played 19 games against five ranked teams this season (13-6 record).
- Nine of Virginia's last 10 games have come against ranked squads.
- UVA won two of three against then-No. 4 Florida State (March 18-20), then-No. 8 Georgia Tech (April 8-10) and then-No. 16 Miami (May 13-15).
- The Cavaliers swept then-No. 4 Clemson on the road (March 11-13) and won 13-2 at then-No. 23 Auburn (Feb. 19).
- UVA was swept at then-No. 13 UNC (May 18-20) but rebounded to beat Miami, UNC and FSU at the ACC Baseball Championship.
- Virginia is 44-24-1 against ranked foes since 2009.

CAVALIERS SUCCEED AT RUNNING GAME

- The Cavaliers have been extremely successful on the basepaths of late, going 38-for-47 (80.1 percent) in stolen base attempts since April 1 (31 games).
- In the first 27 games, UVA was 41-for-62 (66.1 percent) in its stolen base tries.

VIRGINIA RANKS IN TOP 20 IN ATTENDANCE

- Entering the week (through 32 dates), UVA ranked 22nd nationally in total attendance in 2011 at 95,356.
- This marks a regular season attendance record for Virginia Baseball.
- UVA also stood 20th in average attendance at 2,979 fans per game.
- UVA has played in front of 14 home crowds of 3,000-plus this season, including a midweek record of 3,128 on Wednesday, April 20 vs. Richmond.

O'CONNOR REACHES 350 WINS IN FEWEST GAMES IN ACC HISTORY

- In his eighth season as Virginia's head coach, Brian O'Connor stands at 365 wins entering the NCAA Baseball Championship (365-127-1); he reached 350 on April 15.
- He posted 350 wins in the fewest number of games in ACC history (472).
- Mike Martin of Florida State was the fastest in ACC history to reach 350 wins (while a member of the ACC). He needed 478 games (in seven seasons from 1992 to 1998) to reach the mark.
- Other current coaches of note in the ACC: Jack Leggett (Clemson) and Danny Hall (GT) each needed 487 games to reach 350 wins (350-137 each).

BIG APRIL LIFTS COLEMAN TO TOP OF ACC BATTING

- David Coleman enters the weekend second in the ACC with a .374 batting average
- He was named a First-Team All-ACC honoree last week.
- After a solid freshman year (.288 average in 50 games), Coleman played sparingly as sophomore and junior (68 games) before breaking out this year.
- Coleman recorded a monster April, hitting .549 (28-for-51) with a team-best 21 RBI during the month.
- He had a career-long 11-game hitting streak snapped at VCU on May 3.
- Coleman posted a pair of four-hit games in April and notched hits in 16 of the 17 games in which he played in the month (only exception was the 5-inning rain-shortened game).

PITCHING HAS BEEN LINCHPIN TO SUCCESS

- Virginia is the lone team to rank among the top 20 nationally in ERA, strikeouts per nine innings and fewest hits and walks allowed per nine innings.
- UVA stands in the top-5 in all of those categories as of the May 29 report: ERA (2nd, 2.34), strikeouts/9 innings (1st, 9.9), fewest hits/9 inns (3rd, 6.8), fewest walks/9 inns (5th, 2.3).
- UVA has allowed more than four earned runs just seven times this year.

PITCHING, DEFENSE COMBINE FOR LETHAL COMBO

- Virginia boasts a strong tandem of pitching and defense this year.
- UVA has allowed just 2.7 runs per game, fewest in Division I baseball. Texas and UCLA are tied for second fewest at 2.8 per game.
- Virginia enters the week with a .980 fielding percentage which is sixth nationally.
- UVA has committed 43 errors in 58 games.
- The Cavaliers set a school record in 2010 with a .977 fielding percentage.

WAHOOS RACK UP ACC-RECORD 14 SHUTOUTS

- Virginia has recorded 14 shutouts among its 49 wins this season, breaking the ACC record.
- The conference record of 11 shutouts was held by the 1977 Clemson and 2005 Virginia teams.
- UVA leads all Division I teams with 14 shutouts this year (Texas ranks second with 12).
- The NCAA single-season shutout record is 24, set by the 1972 Arizona State team.
- UVA posted two shutouts in 2010 and five in 2009.

VIRGINIA CUTS DOWN ON BASES ON BALLS

- UVA pitchers have reduced their bases on balls by more than one per game this season, walking just 133 batters (2.3/9 innings). In 2010 UVA averaged 3.31 walks per nine innings.
- This has been key to UVA racking up an ACC-leading 2.34 team ERA.
- UVA easily leads the ACC in fewest walks per nine innings this year. (Clemson, 3.0/9 IP).

CAVALIERS STRIKE FOR BIG INNINGS

- Virginia has a tendency to score in bunches, with 64 innings of three runs or more this season.
- The Cavaliers' single-inning high is 10 runs vs. Maryland; UVA scored nine in an inning vs. Duke as well.
- UVA has scored three runs in 36 different innings.
- On the flip side, Virginia has allowed just 17 innings of three or more runs (nine 3-run innings, five 4-run innings, two 5-run innings, one 6-run inning).

PAIR OF 10-GAME WIN STREAKS

- For the first time in school history, UVA has recorded a pair of win streaks of 10 games or more in the same season.
- Virginia had a 12-game win streak which started March 22 and ended April 10 at Georgia Tech.
- The Cavaliers took 13 straight from March 1-19.
- The loss to Georgia Tech also snapped a school-record 11-game game road win streak.

VIRGINIA 42ND PROGRAM TO 2,000 WINS

- Virginia became the 42nd Division I program to reach 2,000 all-time wins on March 29 with its win over George Washington.
- The Cavaliers have won 2,024 games all time (1,617 losses, 40 ties).

HULTZEN CONTINUES TO IMPRESS

- Danny Hultzen ranks second in the nation in strikeouts this year with 136, trailing Trevor Bauer of UCLA (189).
- Hultzen has struck out at least nine batters in 10 of his 14 starts this season (12.71 per nine innings - second in nation to Bauer, 13.32).
- He has issued only 17 walks (8:1 strikeout to walk ratio).
- UVA is 11-3 in Hultzen's starts this year and 35-11 in his career, including 25-5 since 2010; UVA is 13-1 when Hultzen racks up 10 or more strikeouts.
- Virginia's streak of 15 straight series-opening wins with Hultzen pitching came to an end April 25 against NC State.
- With 136 strikeouts this season, Hultzen ranks third in UVA single-season history (needs five to reach Seth Greisinger (1996) for second and 10 to tie Tim Burcham (1985) for first.

HULTZEN OWNS UVA STRIKEOUTS RECORD, MOVES UP ACC CHART

- Hultzen broke the Virginia career strikeouts record earlier this season. With 366 career strikeouts Hultzen has passed Seth Greisinger (1994-96), who had 290.
- By passing Greisinger, Hultzen also moved into the top 25 on the ACC's all-time strikeouts ledger. He currently is eighth in career strikeouts in ACC history.

HULTZEN CLIMBS VIRGINIA CHARTS

- Danny Hultzen continues his march up the all-time Virginia pitching charts.
- He ranks first in career wins with 30, passing Jacob Thompson (2006-08) for the most wins in program history. This also is tied for 19th in ACC history.
- Hultzen is third in career winning percentage at UVa (.857; 30-5).
- His career ERA of 2.20 stands third in UVa history, while his 366 strikeouts ranks first.
- He ranks third in innings pitched with 298.1. With 19.1 innings, he will match Joe Koshansky (2001-04, 317.2) for second.

WILSON ALSO MOVING UP VIRGINIA CHARTS

- Tyler Wilson has joined Hultzen on the top 10 lists at Virginia.
- Wilson now owns 24 career wins, which is third in Virginia history (24-7, 2.97 ERA).
- He ranks fourth in career pitching appearances at UVa with 87 (16 starts).
- Wilson has racked up 247 career strikeouts, which ranks sixth in UVa history; with one strikeout he will match Jacob Thompson (2006-08) for fifth.

WILSON SEAMLESSLY MOVES TO ROTATION

- After pitching out of the bullpen for most of his first three seasons, including 51 straight relief outings entering the season, Tyler Wilson has shifted to the week-end rotation in 2011.
- He is 7-0 with a 2.41 ERA in 13 starts (15 appearances) this year. In 82.0 innings he has allowed just 55 hits and

20 walks with 104 strikeouts (fourth most in ACC, 10th in UVa history).

- Batters are hitting .190 against him this year. That is second lowest in the ACC.

WILSON A FINALIST FOR SENIOR CLASS AWARD

- Tyler Wilson has been named one of 10 finalists for the 2011 Lowe's Senior CLASS Award for baseball.
- One-third of the final voting tally comes from fan votes at seniorclassaward.com. Voting lasts until June 6.
- An acronym for Celebrating Loyalty and Achievement for Staying in School®, the award focuses on the total student-athlete and encourages students to use their platform in athletics to make a positive impact as leaders in their communities.
- A biology major, Wilson is planning to go into the medical field and become an orthopedic surgeon after his baseball career concludes.

WILSON NAMED ACC PITCHER OF THE WEEK

- Tyler Wilson was named the ACC's Co-Pitcher of the Week May 16 following his outing on May 14 vs. Miami (he shared the honor with GT's Buck Farmer).
- Wilson allowed just two baserunners in 7.2 innings, giving up a sixth-inning hit and eighth-inning walk.
- He retired the first 17 Hurricane batters.
- This marks UVa's fourth ACC Pitcher of the Week honoree this year (Hultzen twice, Roberts once).

ROBERTS CONTINUES STRONG PITCHING

- Will Roberts currently ranks among the ACC leaders in several categories.
- Roberts stands fourth in the ACC with a 1.78 ERA, is tied for fourth in the league in wins (10), stands alone in second in shutouts (2) and complete games (2) and holds seventh in opponent batting average (.211).
- He is tied for 17th nationally in wins and 21st in ERA.
- Roberts has been a part of five shutouts in 2011—second to Kent State's Justin Gill (6) for most in the nation.
- He has walked 12 and hit just two batters in 86.0 innings this year.

ROBERTS HAS WIN STREAK SNAPPED

- Will Roberts owned the longest active win streak in the nation with 17 straight victories prior to his May 20 loss at North Carolina.
- The loss was the first in Roberts' career.
- Texas' Taylor Jungmann (15) now holds the longest streak in the country.
- UVa's Danny Hultzen had the longest active streak (17) until his April 25 loss to NC State.

ROBERTS SCORELESS STREAK ENDS AT 26.2 INNS

- Will Roberts gave up a run-scoring single to Duke's David Perkins April 17 in the first inning, ending his scoreless innings streak at 26.2.
- That is the longest scoreless streak for a UVa pitcher since Sean Doolittle worked 29.0-consecutive scoreless innings from April 10-May 25, 2005.
- He had not allowed a run in his previous four starts

- He last allowed a run in the sixth inning of the March 16 win over James Madison.

CAVALIERS GRIND OPPONENTS' RUNNING GAME TO A HALT

- Virginia has slowed its opponents on the basepaths, giving up just 21 stolen bases in 41 attempts (51.2 percent success rate).
- UVa has allowed the fewest stolen bases of any ACC team. FSU ranks second with 30 stolen bases allowed.
- In throwing out 48.8 percent of potential base stealers, UVa also tops the ACC. UNC is second at 41.4 percent (44-for-75).

KLINE EMPHATICALLY SHUTS THE DOOR

- In his first season as the Virginia closer, sophomore righty Branden Kline has been brilliant with 17 saves.
- He is tied for third in the NCAA in saves, one behind Georgia's Tyler Maloof and East Tennessee State's Bo Reeder.
- The total also is the second most in a season in UVa history, behind Kevin Arico's 18 from 2010.
- Kline also is one save shy of the ACC single-season record, which was matched by Arico last year.
- Kline has struck out 46 in 34.0 innings (team-high 27 games) with a 1.85 ERA.
- He pitched in 24 games (eight starts) as a freshman and was entrusted with big starts in the championship games of both the NCAA regional and super regional.

HICKS IN MIDST OF BIG OFFENSIVE YEAR

- John Hicks has posted a big year at the plate.
- He is batting .338, which ranks 10th in the ACC, and has 80 hits, which is second in the ACC.
- Hicks has reached base in all but four games this year.
- A semifinalist for the Johnny Bench Award, Hicks ranks in the ACC's top 10 in hits (2nd, 80), doubles (T5th, 19), total bases (T6th, 119), RBI (T9th, 50).

HICKS MOVES UP UVA CAREER CHART

- John Hicks is tied for fourth in Virginia history with 52 doubles; he needs one double to match Brandon Guyer (2005-07) for third.
- With 156 career runs scored, Hicks is tied with Greg Miclat for ninth in career runs at Virginia.
- He currently has 232 career hits – 10th in UVa history.

PROSCIA LEADS TEAM IN ACC PLAY

- Steven Proscia notched Virginia's best batting average in ACC play, swinging it at a .341 clip (44-for-129). That ranked ninth in the conference.
- Proscia ranked second in the ACC with 44 hits in conference games. He tied for fourth in the ACC with 25 RBI in ACC games.

- Proscia racked up two or more hits in 14 of the 30 ACC games, with at least one hit in 21 of 30.

PROSCIA ETCHES NAME IN VIRGINIA CAREER RECORDS BOOK

- Steven Proscia continues to stand out as one of Virginia's all-time top run producers, with a school-record 176 career RBI.
- He set the Virginia career RBI record April 30 at Boston College, moving past Sean Doolittle (2005-07, 167).
- Proscia now has 245 career hits, which ranks eighth in Virginia history. He needs five to tie for Ryan Zimmerman for seventh.
- Proscia also owns 57 career doubles, which is second in the Virginia career annals behind Tyler Cannon (2007-10) with 62.
- Proscia ranks ninth in career at bats with 750 and also owns 27 career homers, which is tied with Ryan Gilleland (1995-98) for seventh at UVa.

MOST MARCH WINS EVER ...

- UVa recorded its best month of March in program history.
- UVa won a school-record 19 games in March (19-1).
- It marks the third-best winning percentage for a UVa team in March (.950), behind only the 1967 (5-0) and 1971 (6-0) teams.

FOLLOWED BY SECOND-MOST WINS IN APRIL

- Virginia went 16-3 in April as it posted its second-most wins ever in the month.
- UVa went 18-4 in April 1996.
- It stands as UVa's second-best winning percentage ever in the month of April (.842), topped only by the 1959 team (7-1, .875).

SOUTHPAWS GIVE UVA MORE OPTIONS OUT OF 'PEN

- Virginia has added a quartet of left-handed options to its bullpen this year, with a healthy Scott Silverstein, sophomore Aaron Stull and freshmen Kyle Crockett and Ryan Ashooh.
- The lefties have combined to work 37.0 innings out of the bullpen and 44.0 innings total in 42 appearances.
- In 65 games last year, left-handers made just 25 appearances out of the bullpen for the Cavaliers.
- Silverstein did not pitch his first two seasons at UVa while recovering from shoulder surgery.

UVA BASEBALL PROGRAM HONORED FOR APR SCORES

- Virginia Baseball was one of three UVa programs to earn public recognition awards for its most recent multi-year Academic Progress Rate (APR) scores.
- The APR provides a real-time view of a team's academic success by tracking the progress of each student-athlete during the school year.
- By measuring eligibility and retention each semester or quarter, the APR provides a clear picture of the academic culture in each sport.

SEVEN CAVALIERS COMPLETE DEGREES

- Seven Virginia baseball players, including junior Will Roberts, graduated Sunday in ceremonies on the Lawn:
 - John Barr (foreign affairs)
 - Tyler Biddix (commerce)
 - David Coleman (foreign affairs)
 - Will Roberts (economics - graduated in three years)
 - Kenny Swab (foreign affairs)
 - Tyler Wilson (biology)
 - Cody Winiarski (chemistry)

ROBERTS RECORDS FIRST PERFECT GAME IN VIRGINIA HISTORY

- Will Roberts notched the first perfect game in Virginia baseball history on March 29 in a 2-0 win over George Washington at Davenport Field.
- Roberts is the second ACC pitcher to record a perfect game and just the eighth in Division I history to post a nine-inning perfect game.
- He needed only 98 pitches to finish off the perfect game.

ROBERTS NAMED NATIONAL PLAYER OF WEEK, ACC PITCHER OF WEEK

- After his perfect game-effort against George Washington, Will Roberts was named one of Collegiate Baseball's National Players of the Week, the publication announced April 4.
- He also was named the NCBWA National Pitcher of the Week
- In addition, Roberts earned ACC Pitcher of the Week honors for the first time.

BRANDON GUYER MAKES MLB DEBUT

- Former Cavalier Brandon Guyer made his Major League Baseball debut May 6 with the Tampa Bay Rays, starting in left field against the Baltimore Orioles.
- Guyer made quite a splash, hitting a 2-run home run on a 3-1 pitch off the Orioles' Zach Britton in his first at bat.
- He became just the 109th player in MLB history and the first in Rays' history to homer in his first career at bat.
- Guyer played at UVa from 2005-07 and became the 27th former Cavalier to reach the Major League level.
- He was optioned back to triple-A Durham on May 8 as the Rays needed another pitcher on the roster.

O'CONNOR RANKS FOURTH IN WIN PERCENTAGE ENTERING 2010

- UVa head coach Brian O'Connor entered 2011 with a career record of 316-118-1 (.728) and a 126-71-1 record in ACC play.
- O'Connor's 72.8 winning percentage ranked as the fourth best mark among active NCAA Division I coaches entering the 2011 season.
- The only coaches who own a higher winning percentage are Mike Martin (Florida State), Mike Fox (North Carolina) and Gene Stephenson (Wichita State).

• These programs have met in three-game series each of the last two years, with UVa winning two of three in both instances.



• The teams have never met in NCAA tournament play.

• UVa won the first two games

this year (10-1, 4-3) before ECU captured the final game, 4-3, thanks to a 4-run second inning.

• John Hicks hit a team-best .545 in the series for UVa, which batted .260 in the series. ECU hit .213 in the set.

• Defense was a key factor in the series this year – UVa made one error (.991 fielding percentage), while ECU committed eight (.930).



NO. 3 ST. JOHN'S Series: Virginia 12-4

• These programs played last season in the Charlottesville Regional, with the teams splitting a pair of nip-and-tuck contests.

• In the first championship game, SJU parlayed a 2-out, 2-run home run by Jeremy Baltz in the eighth

inning into a 6-5 victory.

• UVa rebounded to win the second championship game, 5-3, to advance.

• The programs also met in the 2005 NCAA Tournament when St. John's prevailed, 5-3, in the opener of the Corvallis Regional.

• Two players from that game have made the major leagues – UVa 3B Ryan Zimmerman (Washington) and SJU pitcher Craig Hansen (Boston, Pittsburgh).

• St. John's has not played in Charlottesville in the regular season since 1998, when the teams split a doubleheader.



NO. 4 NAVY Series: Virginia 17-10

• These schools last played in 2009, with UVa scoring a 17-1 win at Davenport Field.



• The programs have never met in the NCAA tourney.

• UVa has not lost to the Midship-

men since 1947, although the teams have only played six contests during that span.

• Ten current Cavaliers saw playing time in the 2009 win over Navy.
