### VIRGINIA-WAKE FOREST SERIES

- Wake Forest holds an 84-74 edge in the series with Virginia.
- Virginia has not played in Winston-Salem since March 6-8, 2009, when the Cavaliers swept the Demon Deacons.
- After sweeping Wake Forest last year in Charlottesville, the Cavaliers have won seven straight contests against the Demon Deacons; UVa's last loss to Wake came on May 24, 2008, in the ACC tournament.

### ROAD WARRIORS

- After playing 23 of its first 28 games at Davenport Field, Virginia will play 11 of its 19 games in the month of April on the road.
- UVa will play three of its four April ACC series on the road against Wake Forest, Georgia Tech and Virginia Tech.
- UVa's lone home ACC series in the month is April 19-21 against Florida State.
- The Cavaliers are 5-1 on the road in 2013, including a series win at Clemson.

### BULLPEN SLAMS THE DOOR

- Virginia's bullpen has been outstanding of late, allowing just two earned runs, 19 hits and four walks in the last 44 innings of work over 10 games (0.41 ERA, .130 BAA).
- UVa's pen did not allow a run in 13 innings in the Miami series.
- The Cavaliers' relief corps has a 1.78 ERA this year while limiting opponents to a .198 batting average.

### OFFENSE PUTS UP BIG INNINGS REGULARLY

- Virginia has scored three or more runs in an inning 40 times this year.
- The Cavaliers have had just seven games where they have not recorded at least three runs in one inning.
- UVa has scored three runs in an inning on 22 occasions this year.
- The Cavaliers' most dominant innings: the fifth (outscored opponents 32-6), seventh (30-7) and eighth (50-6).
- UVa averages 8.2 runs per game, outscoring its opponents 245-85.

### ODDS AND ENDS

- Virginia enters the weekend with the most wins in Division I (27).
- Virginia pitchers have issued by far the fewest walks in the ACC (61).
- UVa ranks second in the ACC in ERA (2.35), third in batting (.310) and sixth in fielding (.968).
- The Cavaliers are tied with Arizona for the national lead with 22 triples.
- UVa is 24-0 when leading after six innings this season.

## PAPI CONTINUES TO MASH

- While his career-best 10-game hit streak came to an end Tuesday, Mike Papi continued his strong play at the plate this week.
- He was on a torrid pace at the plate during the streak, with hits in 20 of his last 32 at bats (.625).
- Papi had seven doubles, a homer and 10 RBI in that stretch and also scored 14 runs while reaching base at an eye-popping .683 clip.
- He now owns enough at bats to qualify for the national rankings; as of Monday he stood second nationally with a .472 batting average. Georgia State's Chad PRAIN led at .486.

## CROCKETT SETTLES INTO CLOSER ROLE

- Virginia junior lefty Kyle Crockett has closed out games of late, pitching in five straight games while finishing the last four, with three saves.
- Crockett has made 13 appearances this year, allowing just two earned runs while opponents have hit .187 against him.
- He has made 72 career appearances — most on the staff and tied for eighth in program history (needs one appearance for seventh, two for sixth).

## MCCARTHY LONE ACC PLAYER TO REACH BASE IN EVERY GAME THIS YEAR

- Virginia freshman Joe McCarthy is the lone ACC player to reach base safely in every game this year.
- The rookie has reached base safely in all 30 games this year. Chris Taylor also made his way on base safely in 30 straight contests last season.
- The streak is the longest by a UVa player since Dan Grovatt reached base in 43 straight games in 2009.

## FRESHMEN PLAYING KEY ROLES

- Virginia has leaned heavily on its first-year players early this season, particularly on the mound.
- Twelve freshmen already have seen playing time — tied for seventh-most nationally and second among ACC teams (Clemson 13, Maryland 12).
- Tennessee leads the nation with 17 freshmen who have played this year.
- Seven freshmen have accounted for 48 percent of the innings pitched this year (130 of 271 2/3 total).
- Joe McCarthy has started all 30 contests in the batting order.

## VIRGINIA SLOWS THE RUNNING GAME

- Virginia has shown the propensity to slow its opponents' running game this year.
- Virginia has allowed just 14 stolen base attempts in 30 games, with eight successful steals.
- The Cavaliers also have picked off seven baserunners.
- UVa allowed three stolen bases to Maryland, which entered with 44 steals in 12 games, and none to NC State, who entered with 47 stolen bases in 53 attempts.

## VIRGINIA AMONG NATIONAL LEADERS IN RUNS

- Entering the week, Virginia was fourth nationally in runs scored and scoring.
- The Cavaliers have scored 245 runs (8.2 per game) in 30 games.
- The Cavaliers rank among the nation's top 15 in nine statistical categories on offense.

## COGSWELL A FORCE AT TOP OF LINEUP

- Branden Cogswell has stepped into the leadoff slot in the batting order and been sensational this year.
- He leads the team with a .360 batting average, 10 stolen bases and a .479 on-base percentage.
- Cogswell has reached base safely in 28 of 30 games this year; he had a career-best 12-game hit streak snapped Tuesday at Liberty.

## STARTERS SHINING IN 2013

- Virginia's starting pitchers have excelled this season.
- UVa's starters own a 17-2 record and 2.78 ERA this year, while allowing only 30 extra-base hits.
- The starters racked up a streak of 42 2/3 consecutive scoreless innings which ran from Feb. 16-March 2.

### NO FREE PASSES ...

- Virginia pitchers make opposing batters earn their way on base. The Virginia pitching staff has issued just 61 walks in 30 games, by far the fewest walks allowed in the ACC this year. Clemson is second with 86 walks.
- UVa allows just 2.02 walks per nine innings, which is fourth fewest nationally. In contrast, Wake Forest has drawn 168 walks (fifth most nationally).
- The Cavaliers also have hit only 11 batters this year (third fewest nationally).

### ... BUT PLENTY OF FREEBIES FOR UVA BATTERS

- While the Cavaliers' pitchers have thrived on not issuing walks, Virginia batters have found plenty of ways to get on base.
- Virginia batters rank eighth nationally with 156 walks (tied for third in ACC).
- UVa batters also have been hit by 45 pitches, which is tied for 18th most nationally and also ranks third among ACC squads.
- The Cavaliers rank seventh nationally with a .417 on base percentage.

### UVA LEADS NATION IN SHUTOUTS

- Virginia has racked up seven shutouts in its first 30 games, which is tops in the country.
- Seven teams have six shutouts this year.
- The total is already fifth most in a season at Virginia.
- UVa finished with just two shutouts in 2012.

### DOWNES ANCHORS LINEUP AT CLEANUP

- In his first year as the Cavaliers' cleanup hitter, Brandon Downes has started strong and is batting .313 with a .423 on base percentage.
- In 30 games he has five homers and 30 RBI; in 34 games (26 starts) last year, he posted one home run and 22 RBI.
- Downes also has scored a team-best 34 runs, eclipsing his 2012 mark of 20, and leads the team with 17 extra-base hits, including four triples (eighth most nationally).

### WADDELL STRONG IN FIRST YEAR

- Rookie southpaw Brandon Waddell has been sensational in his first six starts. With 48 strikeouts (in 37 2/3 IP) this year, he tops all freshmen nationally.
- He was named one of Collegiate Baseball's six National Players of the Week on Feb. 25 following a dominating outing vs. Toledo.
- In six innings, he struck out 15 batters, most by a UVa freshman hurler since Seth Greisinger fanned 15 against UNC in 1994. He allowed just six hits and one walk.
- On Feb. 15 at ECU, Waddell became the first UVa freshman to make the opening-game start since Dave Sammons on Feb. 26, 1986, at William and Mary.

- King has played 171 career games, with 152 career starts. His streak of 90 straight starts, dating to 2011, was snapped March 2 in the first game of the DH.
- Silverstein was the Cavaliers' Saturday starter for most of 2012 after battling back from a pair of shoulder surgeries.
- The two have been part of two ACC championship teams, three regional championship squads and two College World Series teams.

## A HOT TICKET AT DAVENPORT FIELD

- UVa fans continue to fill Davenport Field, as more than 110,000 fans have attended Cavalier games each of the past three seasons. UVa has ranked among the top 20 programs nationally in attendance each of the last three years.
- Despite the chilly temperatures and poor weather, Virginia ranks 13th in total attendance (61,367) and 16th in average attendance (2,668) this year.
- UVa ranked 15th nationally in total attendance (112,281) and 19th in average attendance (3,208) last year.
- Davenport Field seats 4,980 per game, slightly down this year after the addition of more chairback seats in place of the bleacher seats in the grandstand.
- The entire reserved section in the grandstand is sold out once again this year.

## CHANGES AT DAVENPORT FIELD

- Davenport Field underwent several changes during the offseason.
- A new sand-based playing surface has been installed. After removing the previous surface, crews put in a new irrigation and field drainage system (previous field had no drainage system).
- The \$1 million project also included the installation of a new synthetic warning track that runs in foul territory between the foul poles as well as new dugout flooring surfaces and a new FieldTurf collar behind home plate.
- Home plate was moved in about five feet, creating more foul territory down the lines as well as new field dimensions: 332-370-404-370-332.
- In separate projects, new chairback seats were added to replace the grandstand bleachers and a new video board was erected.

## O'CONNOR FOURTH AMONG ACTIVE COACHES IN WIN PERCENTAGE

- Virginia head coach Brian O'Connor is 438-152-2 (.738) in 10 seasons at the helm of the Cavaliers.
- O'Connor's 73.4 percent winning percentage entering the season ranked fourth among active Division I head coaches behind only UNC's Mike Fox (.744), Florida State's Mike Martin (.743) and Wichita State's Gene Stephenson (.735).

## CAVALIERS BOAST MOST WINS IN NATION SINCE 2009

- Virginia has posted 222 wins since the start of the 2009 season — most in Division I baseball.
- South Carolina ranks second with 221 victories.
- UVa set a school record with 49 wins in 2009, topped it in 2010 with 51 victories, then upped it again in 2011 with a national-best 56 wins.
- Jared King and Scott Silverstein are in their fifth years at UVa and have been part of this entire stretch.
