**THE GAME:** The Boise State football team will travel nearly 2,000 miles for its third meeting with a school from the Atlantic Coast Conference, squaring off against Virginia, Friday (Sept. 25). Kickoff is scheduled for 6 p.m. (MT) at Scott Stadium in Charlottesville, Va., and the game will be nationally televised on ESPN.

**ALONG TRIP:** At 1,999 miles (via TravelMath), Boise State's road trip to Charlottesville, Va., is the 10th-longest road trip in the country in 2015 (not including Hawaii).

**AGAINST THE ACC:** Boise State has squared off against an ACC squad just twice in school history, falling to Boston College in the 2005 MPC Computers Bowl (27-21), and knocking off Virginia Tech (33-30) in 2010.



# NATIONAL POLLS

## BRONCOS IN THE POLLS

**14 YEARS IN THE RANKINGS:** Boise State debuted at No. 23 and No. 24 in the preseason edition of the 2015 Associated Press and USA Today Coaches Polls, respectively, and moved up to Nos. 20 and 22 in week two before falling out with a loss to BYU.

The Broncos have been ranked for at least one week in both the AP and Coaches Polls in each of the last 14 seasons.

**EARLY EXPECTATIONS:** Boise State opened the 2015 season ranked in both the AP (23) and Coaches (24) Polls, the sixth time in the last seven seasons that the Broncos were ranked to start the year. Boise State opened 2014 outside of the top 25, and concluded the season ranked 16th in each. A look at where the Broncos started each of the last seven years can be found below:

- 2009 - 14 (AP) / 16 (Coaches)
- 2010 - 3 (AP) / 5 (Coaches)
- 2011 - 8 (AP) / 6 (Coaches)
- 2012 - 24 (AP) / 22 (Coaches)
- 2013 - 19 (AP) / 19 (Coaches)
- 2014 - Not Ranked
- 2015 - 23 (AP) / 24 (Coaches)

**SUCCESS WHEN RANKED:** Boise State has an all-time record of 92-12 (.885) when ranked in the top 25 of the AP and/or Coaches Polls. A complete breakdown of every game played while ranked can be found on page 20.

**CFP POLL:** Boise State concluded the inaugural season of the College Football Playoff Poll at No. 20 in the final edition of the rankings. As the highest-ranked team from the Group of Five, the Broncos earned a trip to the VIZIO Fiesta Bowl. The Broncos checked in at No. 23 in the CFP Poll Nov. 25, the team's first appearance in the new ranking system.

Only three Group of Five schools were ranked in the poll during the 2014 season, and Boise State was the only team to post a win the week after joining the rankings. The Broncos went 2-0 while ranked in the CFP Top 25.

**COACH TO CURE MD:** The Boise State and UVA coaching staffs will be wearing Coach to Cure MD patches this week to raise awareness and funding for Duchenne Muscular Dystrophy research. Fans are encouraged to donate online at [www.CoachtoCureMD.org](http://www.CoachtoCureMD.org) or donate \$5 by texting CURE to 90999.

**THE HARSIN ERA:** The Broncos are in their second year under head coach Bryan Harsin, a former Bronco quarterback and assistant coach. Harsin led the Broncos to a record of 12-2 in his debut season, which included the school's first outright Mountain West Championship since joining the league in 2011 and the school's third victory in the Fiesta Bowl.

For his efforts during his debut season, Harsin was named a finalist for the Paul "Bear" Bryant National Coach of the Year Award, the Eddie Robinson National Coach of the Year Award and the Dodd Trophy, given annually by the Bobby Dodd Coach of the Year Foundation.

**AGAINST THE RESOURCE FIVE:** The Broncos are 11-5 against schools from conferences that comprise the Resource Five since the start of the 2006 season, including victories in each of the last two meetings: Arizona in the 2014 VIZIO Fiesta Bowl (38-30), and in this season's opener against Washington (16-13). Also included was a streak of six-consecutive victories from 2008-11, which was snapped in the 2012 season opener against Michigan State.

Since notching its first such victory, a 34-16 win over Iowa State in the 2002 Humanitarian Bowl, the Broncos have gone 13-9. Boise State is 13-21 all-time in such games.

**FIRST SHUTOUT IN FOUR YEARS:** Boise State's 52-0 victory over Idaho State Friday night marked the Broncos' first shutout since the 2011 campaign. That season, the Broncos blanked New Mexico, 45-0, in Boise on Dec. 3, 2011.

Friday's shutout was the first of the Bryan Harsin era, and the previous shutout in 2011

was the final one in a stretch in which Boise State's defense goose-egged an opponent at least once in six-straight seasons (2006-11). Over that period, the Broncos notched nine shutouts, including a school record-tying three in 2010.

**BLOCK PARTY:** For the second time in a span of nine games Boise State's special teams blocked two kicks, a punt and a field goal, Friday night. Both blocks came courtesy of linebacker Tanner Vallejo, and were the first two blocked kicks of his career.

Vallejo was credited with a punt block on Idaho State's first possession of the second half, although the block occurred mostly by accident. Punting from his own 29-yard line, Idaho State punter Zak Johnson sent a low line drive right into Vallejo, who was standing about three yards behind the line of scrimmage, which was recovered by Vallejo at the 27.

On the next Bengals drive, they drove to the Boise State 19 and set up for a 36-yard field-goal attempt, which was thwarted when Vallejo stormed through a breach in the line and blocked Johnson's attempt to preserve the shutout.

**KICK RETURN DEFENSE:** The Broncos kick return unit allowed just 106 yards over five returns, a 21.2-yard average to Idaho State Friday night. After the first three weeks of the season, Boise State has allowed just 17.9 yards over eight returns, the 29th-best average in the country, and tops in the Mountain West.

**DEBUTS APLENTY:** Boise State had 15 players make their collegiate debuts Friday night: Troy Bacon, Brandon Brown, Jehren Ertel, Kaleb Hill, David McKinzie, Durrant Miles, David Moa, Sean Modster, Hunter Nettles, Alex Ogle, Andres Preciado, Brett Rypien, Paul Semons, Tommy Stuart and Cory Young.

Through three games the Broncos have had four true freshmen take the field: cornerback Tyler Horton (debuted against Washington), wide receiver Akilian Butler (debuted against Washington), Miles and Rypien.

Last year the Broncos burned only two the redshirts of two true freshmen: safety Dylan Sumner-Gardner and running back Jeremy McNichols.

**HOME OPENERS:** Boise State opened the 2015 season at home for the first time since defeating Oregon 19-8, Sept. 3, 2009. The Broncos won this year's opener 16-13 over Washington, Sept. 4. When opening the season in Boise, the Broncos have won nine-consecutive games, and are 21-8 all-time. The last loss came to Cal State-Northridge, Aug. 30, 1997, a game that was later forfeited to Boise State.

Overall in home openers, including seasons in which the Broncos played a road game before opening at home, Boise State is 38-10 since becoming a four-year institution prior to the 1968 season. The Broncos have won 14-straight such games, with the last loss coming against Washington State, Sept. 8, 2001 (42-20).

**MW CHAMPIONS:** Boise State won the 2014 Sports Authority Mountain West Football Championship, the team's second league title since joining the league in 2011 and the first outright championship since winning the Western Athletic Conference crown in 2009.

The conference championship was Boise State's 10th in the previous 12 seasons, and the 18th league title in school history.

**AMONG THE GREATEST:** Boise State began the 2015 season with the third-best all-time winning percentage amongst the Football Bowl Subdivision. The Broncos' all-time record at the four-year level is currently 410-156-2 (.724). Notre Dame is first (885-310-42; .732) on the all-time list, and Michigan is second (917-329-36; .729).

**17-YEAR WINNING STREAK:** Boise State enters 2015 with a streak of 17-straight winning seasons. The Broncos went 5-6 in 1997, the last season without a winning record and one of only five seasons with a losing record in school history.

**ESTABLISHING A LEGACY:** The Broncos are the winningest football program in the country since 2000, with an overall record of 169-29 (.854). Ohio State (160-36; .816), Oklahoma (164-39; .808), LSU (152-45; .772) and Oregon (149-47; .760) round out the top five.

**ANOTHER 10-WIN SEASON:** After winning just eight games in 2013, the Broncos once again reached the 10-win mark in 2014 (12-2), the eighth time in nine seasons and the 13th time in 16 seasons. Boise State has won 12-or-more games in six of the last nine.

**SENIOR SUCCESS:** Should this year's Boise State football team win at least nine games, the Broncos' 2015 senior class will become the 14th straight to win at least 40 games during their careers, or an average of 10 wins per season. This year's senior class already has 32 victories under its belt from 2012-15.

The Broncos' 2011 senior class won 50 games, the most in FBS history. The 2009 and 2012 senior classes won 49 games, tied for the second-most all-time, while the 48 victories for the 2010 class are tied for the sixth-most in FBS history. In all, Boise State senior classes boast four of the top-10 all-time marks, six of the top 20 and seven of the top 30.

**TURNOVER MARGIN:** Boise State won the turnover battle against Idaho State night for the first time this season, recording a takeaway while not committing a turnover.

Through three games in 2015, Boise State ranks 76th in the nation in turnover margin at -0.33. The Broncos are even on the turnover battle with four takeaways and giveaways apiece. Also on Friday night, for the first time this season the Broncos were able to turn a takeaway into points, as they drove 58 yards for a touchdown following Jonathan Moxey's second-quarter interception.

In Sept. 4's win over Washington, the Broncos were victorious despite losing the turnover battle, one of 24 such wins since 2006.

**THE BLUE:** Since opening Albertsons Stadium (formerly Bronco Stadium) in 1970, Boise State is 246-51 at home, a winning percentage of .828. The mark ranks fourth nationally amongst current stadiums, trailing only Baylor (McLane Stadium; 7-0, 1.000), Georgia Southern (Paulson Stadium; 182-33; .847) and Marshall (Joan C. Edwards Stadium; 144-26, .847).

The Broncos went 7-0 at Albertsons Stadium in 2014, the most home victories since also going 7-0 in 2009. Boise State was also perfect at home in 2013, going 6-0. The Broncos lost once at home in both 2011 and 2012, but prior to that had put together five-straight perfect seasons at home, and nine-straight perfect regular seasons at home. The only home loss during that time came in the 2005 MPC Computers Bowl against Boston College (27-21).

Boise State has the best home winning percentage in the country since the start of the 2000 season with a record of 94-4 (.959).

**MW SUCCESS:** Since joining the Mountain West for the 2011 season, Boise State has lost just five conference games. Prior to a 28-14 loss to Air Force (Sept. 27) last season, the Broncos' four league losses were by a combined seven points: TCU in 2011 (36-35); San Diego State in 2012 (21-19); Fresno State (41-40) and SDSU (34-31, OT) in 2013.

The Broncos' loss at Air Force was just the 10th conference loss since 2000. Boise State is 106-10 in conference games during that time - the highest winning percentage in the country (.914).

The Broncos' loss to the Falcons was the team's first to an opponent from the Mountain Division since Nov. 1, 1997 (Utah State). Despite not winning the division in 2013, Boise State went 5-0 against its counterparts, the only conference losses coming to West Division foes Fresno State and San Diego State.

Boise State is still undefeated against three of its five Mountain Division counterparts, going 18-0 against Colorado State (4-0), New Mexico (6-0) and Wyoming (9-0). Utah

State, the only division opponent to defeat the Broncos prior to 2015, has won just four times in the all-time series, and has lost 12-consecutive games to Boise State, which leads the all-time series 15-4. The Broncos are now 2-1 against Air Force.

Additionally, no team in the Mountain West boasts a winning record over Boise State.

**ADADEMIC SUCCESS:** The Boise State football team earned a Public Recognition Award from the NCAA for the fifth-consecutive year, for having its most recent multi-year Academic Progress Rate (APR) score rank in the top-10 nationally. Boise State is one of only five schools to receive the award in each of the last five years (Clemson, Duke, Northwestern and Rutgers). The Broncos' single-year APR score of 973 ranked tied for 10th nationally, the fifth-straight year inside the top 10 nationally.

**SHUTOUT STREAK:** Boise State has not been shutout in 227-consecutive games, tied for the 10th-longest active streak in the country (Georgia Tech) and tied for the 21st-longest streak in NCAA history.

The last shutout came on the road against No. 15 Washington State, Sept. 27, 1997 (58-0). The loss to the Cougars is one of only two shutouts the Broncos have suffered since becoming a four-year institution in 1968.

**RED ZONE SCORING:** Boise State continued its machine-like efficiency in the red zone Friday night against Idaho State, scoring on seven of its eight trips inside the Bengal 20. The Broncos were perfect over their first seven trips, with their only miss coming on the final trip in the fourth quarter when, already up 52-0, they turned the ball over on downs.

For the season, Boise State is 13-for-15 on its red-zone opportunities (.867), with 11 of those 15 trips resulting in touchdowns (.733 touchdown rate).

Boise State scored in each of its last 47 red zone opportunities of 2014, of which 38 were touchdowns. Following its loss to Air Force (Sept. 27), the Broncos ranked 112th nationally (.708), but climbed all the way to conclude the season at 17th (.901). On the season, Boise State was 64-of-71 inside the red zone.

The Broncos ran their streak to 49, scoring touchdowns on their first two possessions against Washington (Sept. 4), but were stopped on 4th-and-1 at the Washington 15 in the second quarter. Saturday at BYU, Boise State was perfect in red-zone scoring chances, going 3-for-3 with two touchdowns and a field goal.

**QUARTERBACK PARTY:** Boise State used four quarterbacks in Friday night's win over Idaho State, with the quartet combining to go 22-for-28 for 254 yards and a touchdown. Only redshirt freshman Alex Ogle, who played the final two drives, did not attempt a pass.

Starter Ryan Finley went 5-for-6 for 59 yards before leaving the game with an injury. He was relieved by Tommy Stuart, who showed his dual-threat talents by going 9-for-13 for 69 yards and a touchdown while also running 11 times for 46 yards.

Freshman Brett Rypien took over on the second drive of the third quarter, going 8-for-9 for 126 yards and leading the Broncos to three touchdowns and a field goal, while Ogle took over in the fourth and led the Broncos to the one-yard line before the run game was stuffed on a fourth-and-goal.

**OH WHAT A RUSH:** Boise State's rushing attack overwhelmed Idaho State Friday night to the tune of 344 yards and six touchdowns spread out over 10 different ball carriers.

The six rushing touchdowns, three of which came from sophomore Jeremy McNichols, two from redshirt senior Kelsey Young and one from redshirt junior Devan Demas, were the most by the Broncos since rushing for six against Utah State on Nov. 20, 2009. For Young, the two scores were his first as a Bronco since transferring to Boise State after four seasons at Stanford.

Three Bronco backs ran for over 60 yards apiece, led by 69 yards from McNichols (on 15 carries) and Cory Young (on nine carries), with Demas racking up 65 yards on just three carries. Quarterback Tommy Stuart ran 11 times for 46 yards, Kelsey Young, older brother of Cory, had 38 yards over eight carries, while junior Jack Fields carried five times for 20 yards to pace the main ground-gainers.

**HUFF BACK TO THE PROMISED LAND:** Redshirt senior tight end Holden Huff matched his career high with four catches Friday night against Idaho State, going for 56 yards and a touchdown, his first score since grabbing two TD passes in the 2012 MAACO Bowl Las Vegas against Washington.

On the year, Huff paces the Bronco tight ends with seven catches for 101 yards and a touchdown, while Jake Roh, Jake Hardee and David Lucero each had a catch. So far in 2015, the four Bronco tight ends have combined for 15 receptions for 190 yards and a touchdown.

Last year Boise State's talented group of tight ends enjoyed a breakout campaign, combining for 47 receptions for 540 yards and four touchdowns.

**DON'T FORGET THE WIDE RECEIVERS:** Boise State's wide receiver corps found a healthy amount of touches Friday night as Thomas Sperbeck, Shane Williams-Rhodes, Chaz Anderson and Terrell Johnson combined for 14 catches for 164 yards.

Sperbeck had his best night of the season, hauling in seven passes for 99 yards while Williams-Rhodes upped his team- and Mountain West-leading reception total to 18 with five catches for 50 yards. Anderson and Johnson each had a catch, going for nine and six yards. Johnson's catch was the first of his career, and he also caught a lateral and turned it into a 13-yard rush.

**O-LINE EXPERIENCE:** Entering 2015, Boise State returned a combined 95 career starts along the offensive line. The mark ranked tied for the 15th-most in the country – and first in the Mountain West – according to research done by Phil Steele.

**RUSH DEFENSE:** For the third-straight game, the Boise State held its opponent to under 100 yards on the ground, as Idaho State managed just 36 yards on 22 carries, an average of just 1.6 yards per attempt. The Broncos gave up only 72 yards on the ground to BYU on Sept. 12, a week after holding Washington to just 29 yards on 22 carries in the season opener (1.3 yards per rush). That total was the fewest allowed by Boise State since Colorado State rushed for 28 yards, Sept. 6, 2014.

Boise State held seven opponents to fewer than 100 yards rushing in 2014, the most since holding eight to less than 100 in 2009.

Through three weeks, Boise State's rush defense ranks second in the FBS and leads the Mountain West, giving up just 45.7 yards per game.

**FIRST SHUTOUT IN FOUR YEARS:** Boise State's 52-0 victory over Idaho State Friday night marked the Broncos' first shutout since the 2011 campaign. That season, the Broncos blanked New Mexico, 45-0, in Boise on Dec. 3, 2011.

Friday's shutout was the first of the Bryan Harsin era, and the previous shutout in 2011 was the final one in a stretch in which Boise State's defense goose-egged an opponent at least once in six-straight seasons (2006-11). Over that period, the Broncos notched nine shutouts, including a school record-tying three in 2010.

**MOXEY JOINS THE PICK PARADE:** Defensive backs Donte Deayon and Darian Thompson, with 30 career interceptions between them, may get all the attention when it comes to the Bronco secondary, but cornerback Jonathan Moxey has been inserting himself into the conversation with a solid 2015 through three games.

Moxey, playing on the other side of the field from Deayon, has punished opposing quarterbacks for attempting more of their passes on his side, leading the Broncos with three pass breakups and this past Friday against Idaho State grabbing his first interception of the season. He has also made his presence felt coming forward, sharing the lead in tackles (14) amongst Bronco secondary members with Thompson, with 12 of his tackles coming solo.

The trio of Deayon, Thompson and Moxey has accounted for four interceptions through just three games this season after Moxey's pick Friday night. Deayon and Thompson are tied with 15 career interceptions apiece, each ranking tied for fourth on Boise State's career list and tied for second on the Mountain West's all-time list. Among all-time Mountain West players, Deayon and Thompson are just three picks away from matching Eric Weddle's benchmark of 18. The 32 combined interceptions from Deayon, Thompson and Moxey also rank as the top total in the country among returning starting secondaries.

**PIN-POINT PUNTING:** Bronco punter Sean Wale continued his stellar placement-punting Friday night, pinning Idaho State inside the 20-yard line on all three of his punts. This performance followed a masterful effort Sept. 12 in Provo, in which Wale dropped four of his eight punts inside the 20-yard line with three of those pinning the Cougars inside their own 10. Wale averaged 41.5 yards per punt that game with a long of 55, and only had one go for a touchback despite three of his punts coming from inside BYU's 40-yard line.

**RETURN OF #DBU:** Boise State ranked tied for fifth nationally with 22 interceptions in 2014. Of the 22 interceptions, five were returned for touchdowns, tied for the most in the country (FIU, Georgia Tech and TCU).

So far this season, the Broncos have picked off three passes, with cornerback Donte Deayon recording two Saturday night and safety Darian Thompson grabbing his first of the season in Sept. 4's opener against Washington.

**BREAKING UP IS HARD TO DO:** Boise State's pass defense was strong at all levels Friday against Idaho State, as Bronco defenders broke up 12 passes. While Jonathan Moxey, Donte Deayon and Tyler Gray led the way with two breakups apiece, the Broncos also got contributions from its defensive line knocking passes down at the line of scrimmage, as linemen Jabril Frazier, Sam McCaskill and Justin Taimatua were all credited with a pass breakup.

**TOUGH UP FRONT:** The Broncos lost just one individual from its 2014 defensive line (Beau Martin), a unit that helped the Bronco rank seventh nationally in both tackles-for-loss (7.8 per game) and sacks (3.36 per game).

**RED ZONE DEFENSE:** Boise State has allowed just six red zone trips to opponents in 2015, and teams have scored just three times when getting inside the 20. The Broncos rank tied for third nationally (West Virginia) in red zone defense at .500.

## KAMALEI CORREA

ALL-MW: Junior STUD end Kamalei Correa was named first-team All-Mountain West this past season, the first all-league accolade of his career. He led the Mountain West in sacks (12.0) and ranked 13th nationally in sacks per game (0.86) in 2014. He also ranked third in the Mountain West with 19.0 tackles-for-loss and tied for 18th nationally with 1.4 TFLs per game.

He had a pair of tackles-for-loss and a sack in each of his first two games of 2015.

2015 WATCH LISTS: Correa was named to the Chuck Bednarik Award, Bronko Nagurski Trophy and Rotary Lombardi Award Preseason Watch Lists.

FOR COMPARISON'S SAKE: Former Bronco DeMarcus Lawrence was a second-round selection in the National Football League Draft following the 2013 season (No. 34 overall), having left Boise State a year early. During his sophomore year with the Broncos, Lawrence registered 48 tackles, 13.5 tackles-for-loss and 9.5 sacks in 11 games. Correa, in 14 games, recorded 59 tackles, 19.0 TFLs and 12.0 sacks.

## DONTE DEAYON

ALL-MW: Senior cornerback Donte Deayon was named second-team All-Mountain West for the second-straight season in 2014.

2015 WATCH LISTS: Deayon was named to the Jim Thorpe Award Preseason Watch List for the second-straight year in 2015.

INTERCEPTION MACHINE: Deayon hauled in a pair of interceptions against BYU (Sept. 12), giving him 15 for his career - tied for fourth all-time at Boise State and tied for second all-time in the MW. His two-interception game was the first for a Bronco since Darian Thompson had a pair against Nevada, Oct. 4, 2014.

Included in Deayon's career total were a team-high six in 2013, tied for the seventh-most in the country. His per-game average of 0.5 ranked ninth nationally. With six interceptions last season, he ranked third in the Mountain West and tied for ninth in the nation. He also hauled in six interceptions in 2013, leading the team and ranking tied for seventh nationally.

He led Boise State with 15 passes defended (nine pass break-ups and six interceptions), ranking tied for first in the Mountain West and tied for 19th nationally with 1.3 per game.

TOUCHDOWN, DEAYON: Deayon scored three non-offensive touchdowns in 2014, twice on interception returns - one each against Connecticut and 10th-ranked Arizona in the

2014 VIZIO Fiesta Bowl - and once on a punt return.

POW: Deayon garnered Mountain West Player of the Week honors on both defense (Fresno State) and special teams (Wyoming) in 2014, the first Bronco to earn both honors since Quinton Jones in 2006.

## RYAN FINLEY

QB FIRST STARTS: Redshirt sophomore quarterback Ryan Finley made the first start of his career against Washington, Sept. 4. The Broncos were victorious (16-13), making Finley the first Bronco signal caller to win his first start since Kellen Moore led the Broncos to a victory over Idaho State (49-7), Aug. 30, 2008. He is also the first Bronco quarterback to win his first start against a school from the Resource Five.

## TYLER GRAY

SHADES OF GRAY: Linebacker Tyler Gray enjoyed a fine game for the Broncos in Friday's shutout of Idaho State, leading the defense with seven tackles (four solo) and registering the only sack with a forced fumble. He also made his presence felt on pass defense, breaking up a pair of passes.

## MARCUS HENRY

ALL-MW: Redshirt senior center Marcus Henry was named first-team All-Mountain West in 2014, his first all-league accolade. Henry made the move to center last season after starting 12 games in 2013 at right guard.

2015 WATCH LISTS: Henry was named to the Rotary Lombardi Award, Outland Trophy and Rimington Trophy Preseason Watch Lists.

## JEREMY McNICHOLS

BIG NIGHT FOR THE WEAPON: Sophomore Jeremy McNichols continued his touchdown harvest Friday night, adding three more to his ledger in the 52-0 win over Idaho State. McNichols now leads the FBS with eight touchdowns overall and seven rushing scores.

McNichols scored the opener for Boise State, bringing his school-record total to six touchdowns to open the season before Holden Huff's touchdown reception broke the streak.

The Boise State single-season record for rushing touchdowns is 28, set by Jay Ajayi last year, and the overall single-season mark for touchdowns scored is 32, shared by Ajayi (2014) and Brock Forsey (2002). With eight touchdowns through three games, McNichols is ahead of the paces of Ajayi (four TDs through three games) and Forsey (three TDs through three games) for total touchdowns, and with seven rushing scores through three

games is ahead of Ajayi's 2014 pace (Ajayi had three rushing TDs through the first three games).

## REES ODHIAMBO

**ALL-MW:** Redshirt senior left tackle Rees Odhiambo garnered the first all-league accolade of his career in 2014, earning second-team All-Mountain West honors.

Odhiambo made the move to left tackle last season after starting eight games at right tackle in 2013.

**2015 WATCH LISTS:** Odhiambo was named to the Rotary Lombardi and Outland Trophy Preseason Watch Lists.

## JAKE ROH

**ALL-MW:** Redshirt sophomore tight end Jake Roh hauled in 35 catches for 408 yards and two touchdowns in 2014, his debut collegiate campaign, earning honorable mention All-Mountain West honors.

**RECEIVING TOTALS:** Roh led all Bronco tight ends in both receptions and yards, and tied for the group lead in touchdowns last season. The reception total was also the highest by a Bronco tight end since Jeb Putzier caught 44 passes as a senior in 2001. Putzier was a sixth-round selection in the National Football league Draft by the Denver Broncos.

He has five catches for 41 yards in 2015.

## BRETT RYPIEN

**RYPIEN DEBUT A BENCHMARK:** Freshman Brett Rypien made his collegiate debut in the third quarter of Friday night's win, finishing the game 8-for-9 for 126 yards. He became the first true freshman to play quarterback for Boise State since Tony Hilde in 1993. Hilde made his Bronco debut against Montana on Oct. 2, 1993.

Rypien entered the game for Boise State's second possession of the second half, and led the Broncos to three-straight touchdowns then a field goal on his four drives under center.

## THOMAS SPERBECK

**BREAKOUT RECEIVER:** Junior wide receiver Thomas Sperbeck led the Broncos with 877 receiving yards last season, and ranked second with 51 receptions. What makes the totals impressive is that he did not have a catch prior to then-starter Matt Miller going down with an injury in the Broncos' fifth game of the season (Air Force).

He has 12 receptions for 140 yards in 2015, including seven for 99 against Idaho State.

**2015 WATCH LISTS:** Sperbeck was named to the 2015 Fred Biletnikoff Award Preseason Watch List.

**MVP MOMENT:** Sperbeck caught 12 passes for 199 yards - both career highs - en route to Offensive Most Valuable Player honors at the 2014 VIZIO Fiesta Bowl.

## DARIAN THOMPSON

**ACCOLADES:** Redshirt senior safety Darian Thompson garnered the first all-league accolades of his career in 2014, being named first-team All-MW. Thompson was also named CBSSports.com All-America Second Team.

**2015 WATCH LISTS:** Thompson was named to the Walter Camp Player of the Year, Chuck Bednarik Award, Bronko Nagurski Trophy and Jim Thorpe Award Preseason Watch Lists.

**INTERCEPTION MACHINE:** Thompson recorded a team-high seven interceptions in 2014, tied for the third-most in the country. His per-game average of 0.6 also ranks tied for third nationally.

He hauled in his first interception of the 2015 season in the opener against Washington, bringing his career total to 15 - tied for the fourth-most in school history and the second-most in Mountain West history.

He also shares the lead amongst members of the Bronco secondary with 14 tackles.

## TANNER VALLEJO

**VALLEJO'S BLOCK PARTY:** Linebacker Tanner Vallejo usually makes his mark on defense, but Friday night against Idaho State he was instrumental on special teams, blocking a punt and a field goal.

The blocks came on consecutive possessions to start the second half. Idaho State opened the third quarter forced to punt, with Zak Johnson's low line drive going right into Vallejo, who stood two yards on front of the line of scrimmage, and was recovered on the 27-yard line by Vallejo.

On the next Bengal possession, they drove into Bronco territory and set up for a 36-yard field goal. Vallejo stormed through the line and made the block, preserving Boise State's shutout.

**ACCOLADES:** Junior linebacker Tanner Vallejo was named second-team All-MW in 2014, the first all-league honor of his career.

He was also named Defensive MVP of both the 2014 Sports Authority Mountain West Football Championship and the 2014 VIZIO Fiesta Bowl.

**2015 WATCH LISTS:** Vallejo was named to the Rotary Lombardi Award Preseason Watch List.

**RECOVERING FUMBLES:** Vallejo ranked tied for 10th nationally with three fumble recoveries last season.

**TACKLING MACHINE:** Vallejo started every game for the Broncos in 2014. He led the team with 100 tackles and was second on the team with 16.5 tackles-for-loss.

**TOUCHDOWNS:** Vallejo picked up a fumble and returned it 31 yards for a touchdown on Connecticut's opening drive, Sept. 13, 2014. It was the first fumble recovery for a touchdown by a Bronco since Demarcus Lawrence accomplished the feat against Hawai'i, Nov. 10, 2012.

Vallejo added an interception return for a touchdown against Fresno State in the league championship game. The interception was the first of his career, and the touchdown gave him two defensive scores on the season. He is the first Bronco with multiple defensive scores in the same year since Shea McClellin accomplished the feat in 2010.

## SHANE WILLIAMS-RHODES

**2015:** Williams-Rhodes leads the Mountain West with 18 receptions in 2015 after Friday night's five-catch, 50-yard performance against Idaho State.

**ALL-MW:** Senior wide receiver Shane Williams-Rhodes was named honorable mention All-Mountain West at wide receiver for a second-straight season in 2014.

**COMMUNITY SERVICE:** Williams-Rhodes was Boise State's nominee for the AFCA Good Works Team, the Wuerffel Trophy and the Senior CLASS Award, which each recognizes character and community service off the field.

**MANY, MANY RECEPTIONS:** Williams-Rhodes recorded the fifth 10-plus-catch performance of his career Sept. 12 at BYU, hauling in 11 passes for 107 yards. On the year he leads the Broncos with 13 receptions for 123 yards.

He now has 188 career receptions, the fifth-most in school history. Williams-Rhodes is one behind Don Hutt (1970-73) for fourth place and needs 56 more catches to match Matt Miller's Bronco benchmark of 244.

Williams-Rhodes led the Broncos with 68 catches last season, ranking fourth in the MW. His reception total is also the ninth-most in a single season all-time at Boise State.

He had 77 receptions in 2013, the fourth-most in school history.



# HEAD COACH BRYAN HARSIN



In his debut season as the head coach of the Boise State football team, Bryan Harsin, a former Bronco quarterback and assistant coach, led his alma mater back to where it rose to national prominence less than a decade ago. Boise State went 12-2 in Harsin's inaugural season, winning its first outright Mountain West Championship, and capping the campaign with a 38-30 victory over Arizona in the 2014 VIZIO Fiesta Bowl.

The victory in the Fiesta Bowl was the third such win for the Broncos in the last nine seasons. Harsin, serving as offensive coordinator in the first two Fiesta Bowl victories, has been a part of each of the school's three appearances in the game.

The team's victory in the 2014 Sports Authority Mountain West Football Championship marked the team's first outright league title since joining the league in 2011, and the first overall since 2009. The only alumnus to lead the Broncos as head coach in the history of Boise State, Harsin has now won a conference championship as a student-athlete, assistant coach and head coach.

For his efforts this past year, Harsin was named a finalist for the Paul "Bear Bryant" National Coach of the Year Award, the Eddie Robinson National Coach of the Year Award and the Dodd Trophy, given annually by the Bobby Dodd National Coach of the Year Foundation. He was also named the nation's top first-year head coach by the Football Writers Association of America.

The Broncos concluded the 2014 season ranked No. 16 in both the Associated Press and USA Today Coaches Polls.

In addition to rejoining the national rankings – Boise State ranked 20th nationally in the final College Football Playoff Top 25 – the Broncos' offense also returned the nation's elite. Boise State concluded the season ranked ninth nationally in scoring offense (39.7) and 14th nationally in total offense (494.3).

Harsin was named head coach, Dec. 11, 2013. A graduate of Capital High School in Boise, he played quarterback for the Broncos from 1995-99. Following his graduation from Boise State with a degree in business management, Harsin coached running backs and receivers at Eastern Oregon in 2000.

The former Bronco letterwinner began his coaching career at Boise State as a graduate assistant in 2001, before taking over the tight ends as a full-time assistant coach from 2002-05. When Chris Petersen was hired as head coach in 2006, Harsin assumed the role of offensive coordinator and quarterbacks coach.

Harsin was Petersen's offensive coordinator for five of his eight seasons as head coach (2006-10), and was named a finalist for the 2009 Broyles Award, awarded annually to the nation's top assistant coach. Boise State went 61-5 during his tenure as offensive coordinator.

The Broncos are in the midst of the seventh-longest active streak in the nation of consecutive bowl appearances (13), and Harsin has been a part of 10 of them – including each of the team's three Fiesta Bowl appearances.

With Harsin on staff, Boise State has also won nine conference championships.

Following the 2010 season, Harsin went to Texas, where he served as co-offensive coordinator from 2011-12. While with the Longhorns, Harsin helped guide the ascension of an offense that ranked 88th in scoring prior to his arrival, to No. 24 nationally in 2012 (36.1).

Harsin then earned his first head coaching opportunity at Arkansas State in 2013, which claimed a share of the Sun Belt Conference championship and a berth in the GoDaddy.com Bowl that season.

Harsin and his wife Kes have two daughters, Devyn Lynn and Dayn Mykena, and a son, Davis.





# HEAD COACH BRYAN HARSIN

## HARSIN NOTES

**COACHING THE ALMA MATER:** Bryan Harsin, a 2000 graduate of Boise State, is one of only 14 coaches in the country that played collegiate football for the school in which he is currently serving as head coach. Others include: Frank Beamer (Virginia Tech), John Bonamego (Central Michigan), Troy Calhoun (Air Force), Paul Chryst (Wisconsin), Pat Fitzgerald (Northwestern), Mike Gundy (Oklahoma State), Jim Harbaugh (Michigan), Paul Haynes (Kent State), Kliff Kingsbury (Texas Tech), Sean Kugler (UTEP), Ruffin McNeil (East Carolina), David Shaw (Stanford) and Matt Wells (Utah State).

**YOUNG COACHES:** Born on Nov. 1, 1976, Harsin is 38 years old entering the 2015 season – the fifth-youngest head coach in the country. Only PJ Fleck (Western Michigan; 34), Neal Brown (Troy; 35), Matt Campbell (Toledo; 35) and Kliff Kingsbury (Texas Tech; 36) are younger.

# GAMES AGAINST RESOURCE FIVE/ JERSEY COMBINATIONS

**AGAINST THE RESOURCE FIVE:** The Broncos are 11-5 against schools from conferences that comprise the Resource Five since the start of the 2006 season, including last year's win over Arizona in the VIZIO Fiesta Bowl (38-30) and this year's season-opening victory over Washington (16-13; Sept. 4). Included was a streak of six-consecutive victories, which was snapped in the 2012 season opener against Michigan State.

Since notching its first such victory, a 34-16 win over Iowa State in the 2002 Humanitarian Bowl, the Broncos have gone 13-9. Boise State is 13-21 all-time in such games.

Albertsons Stadium - and Lyle Smith Field - is the home of Boise State football and the annual Famous Idaho Potato Bowl.

Smith is the undisputed father of Bronco football, who from 1946-67 built one of the top junior college programs in the country. When he retired from his head coaching position to become the athletic director, Smith had a record of 156-26-6 (.846).

Completed during the summer of 1970 at a cost of \$2.2 million, what was originally known as Bronco Stadium had a seating capacity of 14,500. Since that time the stadium has expanded four times to its current capacity of 36,387.

Boise State established a first in 1986 by installing the first blue AstroTurf in the country. The second blue AstroTurf field was installed in 1995, with the third prior to the 2002 season.

The first Blue FieldTurf surface was installed in 2008. A second Blue FieldTurf field was installed prior to the 2010 season, making a total of five different blue fields at the stadium.

Boise State's was the first collegiate stadium to have the entire field produced in a special color.
