VIRGINIA-NC STATE SERIES

- NC State holds a 112-71-1 edge in the all-time series against Virginia.
- The teams did not play last season. UVa swept the Wolfpack March 23 and 24, 2013, in Charlottesville in the teams' last series.
- The Wolfpack won two of three games last year against the Cavaliers in Raleigh in 2012, and UVa continues to look for its first-ever three-game series win at NC State.
- No current UVa player has seen playing time at NC State. Kenny Towns and Thomas Woodruff are the lone Cavaliers who were on the roster in 2012.

OFFENSE CONTINUES UPSWING

- Since being shut out on two hits on March 24 against Georgetown, Virginia's offense has batted .303 and averaged 6.2 runs and 10.5 hits per game over the last 19 games.
- The Cavaliers have recorded at least 10 hits in 13 of the 19 contests.
- This stretch came while facing – by ERA – the best three pitching staffs in the ACC: Louisville, Notre Dame and Miami, all of whom rank among the top 35 teams nationally in ERA.
- In the first 22 games of the season, UVa batted .256 and averaged five runs and 8.8 hits per game.

LINEUP DOMINATED BY FRESHMEN

- Virginia has put at least four freshmen in 39 of the 41 starting lineups this year, including eight games with five rookies and three contests with six.
- Adam Haseley (RF/CF) and Pavin Smith (1B/LF) have started every game this year. Ernie Clement (CF/2B) missed his first game of the year last Wednesday.
- UVa has had first-years in all three outfield positions in eight games.
- Fourteen of UVa's 30 players are freshmen.

MCCARTHY, GERSTENMAIER ADD SPARK TO LINEUP

- Junior OF Joe McCarthy and freshman INF Jack Gerstenmaier returned to the Cavaliers' lineup last Wednesday. UVa has gone 5-1 since their return.
- McCarthy missed 11 weeks following back surgery on Jan. 29, while Gerstenmaier was out since late September following hamstring surgery.
- McCarthy started all six games, while Gerstenmaier started the first five.
- A two-time All-ACC selection, McCarthy has now reached base safely in 128 of his 135 career games.

ODDS AND ENDS

- UVa is No. 32 in the latest NCAA RPI for 2015 (NC State is No. 65).
- Nine of Virginia's 15 losses have come by two runs or fewer, including six by one run.
- Josh Sborz is first in the ACC and sixth nationally with 12 saves this season.
- Robbie Coman was 7-for-12 (.583) in the Miami series and is 15-for-37 (.405) in the nine games since taking a grounder to the face and missing the JMU game on April 8.

TOWNS STEPS UP TO MAN CLEANUP SPOT

- Senior Kenny Towns has been UVA's top run producer out of the cleanup spot with a team-high 45 RBI. He ranks fifth in the ACC in RBI and already has set his career high for RBI.
- Towns is batting .313 (second on team) and also leads the team in hits (51) and doubles (13).
- He owns 14 multiple-hit games and a team-leading 13 multiple-RBI games.
- His streak of reaching base safely in 36 straight games came to an end in the first game of the March 7 double-header against Pitt; it ranked fourth in Division I baseball and tops amongst ACC players at the time.

WEATHER WREAKS HAVOC ON HOME SCHEDULE

- Inclement weather has forced UVA to postpone or cancel four midweek games and relocate three week-end series.
- In all, Virginia has had 14 home games altered because of inclement weather.
- UVA was forced to shift its series with Marist (Feb. 20-22) to Charleston, S.C., and its round-robin tournament with Hartford and Seton Hall to Myrtle Beach.
- UVA played its first home game March 11 (but not until after a two-hour rain delay). UVA's midweek games with VCU and GW have yet to be rescheduled, while the Radford game was cancelled.

HASELEY GETS BAT GOING

- After a slow start at the plate, freshman Adam Haseley has been solid while primarily batting leadoff.
- He hit .169 over his first 15 games, but is batting .336 (37-for-110) in the last 26 games.
- He is batting a team-leading .393 in road games.
- Haseley is batting .322 in 27 games as the Cavaliers' leadoff hitter.
- He went 13-for-23 during UVA's five-game road swing from March 25-31, including 7-for-13 (.538) in the Notre Dame series.

INJURIES FORCE CAVALIERS TO JUGGLE LINEUP

- Virginia has been forced to alter its lineup after injuries have hampered three of its returning starters.
- The Cavaliers already have trotted out 23 different starting lineups in 41 games.
- Kenny Towns (3B) is the lone Cavalier to start every game at the same position, while freshmen Pavin Smith and Adam Haseley also have started every game.

THE WALKING WOUNDED

- Virginia position players have combined to miss 122 games because of injuries this season.
- Three returning starters have missed significant time:
 - OF Joe McCarthy had back surgery in late January and missed 11 weeks (35 games) prior to his return April 15.
 - C Robbie Coman injured his knee on Feb. 21 and missed eight games. He missed the April 1 game vs. VMI after taking a grounder to the eye in batting practice.
 - INF/OF John La Prise is out for the season with a hip injury that limited him to four games early this season.
- 2B/OF Ernie Clement has missed five of the last six games with a hamstring injury and is day-to-day.
- Matt Thaiss suffered an ankle injury April 12 but missed only one game. Daniel Pinero was hit in the chin with a pitch Tuesday and missed the Wednesday game.
- INF Jack Gerstenmaier (hamstring) made his season debut April 15 after undergoing hamstring surgery in late September (missed 35 games).

KIRBY, CASEY SIDELINED BY INJURIES

- In addition to the position player injuries, starting pitchers Nathan Kirby and Derek Casey each have gone down with injuries in the last week.
- A 2014 First-Team All-American and ACC Co-Pitcher of the Year, Kirby exited after three innings last Friday with a strained left lat muscle and will miss approximately 6-8 weeks.
- Casey left after 2 2/3 innings Tuesday with an undisclosed injury. His status is unknown at this time.
- Kirby currently leads the ACC in strikeouts (75) and is sixth in ERA (2.28).
- Pitcher Riley Wilson (shoulder) also has been sidelined and has not played this season.

THAISS PROVIDES THUNDER IN UVA LINEUP

- Sophomore catcher Matt Thaiss has given the Cavaliers' lineup a jolt of power this season. He has blasted eight home runs (eighth in the ACC).
- Thaiss leads the team in batting (.327), on base percentage (.436) and slugging (.551).
- Thaiss is batting .304 in ACC games (second on team).

DOHERTY GIVES CAVALIERS ANOTHER OPTION

- Junior Kevin Doherty has given Virginia a boost this season, both on the mound at the plate.
- He has been one of UVa's top left-handed options out of the bullpen, pitching in 14 games, which is third most on the team (1-1, 3.41 ERA, 2 saves, 29.0 IP, 22 K, .190 BAA).
- Doherty also has stepped this year at the plate. He has batted in 25 games, including 19 starts in the outfield.
- He has reached base safely in 20 of his 25 games this season and is batting .257 with 15 RBI.

VETERAN WADDELL MAKES 45TH START

- Brandon Waddell has been a consistent presence in UVa's rotation in his three seasons. This marks his 37th straight regular-season weekend start, dating to opening day in 2013.
- Waddell is scheduled to make his 45th career start Sunday. That ties him with Kent Kruse (1990-93) for the fifth-most starts in program history.
- Waddell has an 18-10 career record and needs a pair of wins to reach the top 10 in UVa history.
- He moved into ninth at UVa in career innings last Sunday with 251 1/3.

WALKS WILL HAUNT

- Virginia's pitching staff has been plagued at times by walks this year. UVa has walked six or more batters in 12 games (UVa is 3-9 in those games).
- UVa walked 34 batters in the three-game series with Florida State and 22 in the series at Georgia Tech.
- Those two series featured the most walks in a three-game series during Brian O'Connor's tenure – the previous high was 21 in a 2007 series vs NC State.
- UVa ranked No. 1 nationally in walks/hits per nine innings (WHIP) at 1.03 last year and was tops in the ACC in fewest walks per nine innings (2.88).

FRESHMEN PROVIDE BOOST

- Virginia's freshmen have played a key role this year.
- UVa's first-year players have combined to record 47.7 percent of the position player starts and 48.8 percent of the at bats.
- The first-years also are responsible for 45 percent of the hits and 43.6 percent of the runs scored.

JONES SETTLES INTO STARTING ROLE

- In his first season in the UVa rotation, Connor Jones has been solid, with a 4-2 record and 3.49 ERA.
- In 59 1/3 innings, Jones is limiting opponents to a .236 batting average, but he has walked 30 batters.
- Jones matched a career best by working 7 2/3 innings in the Game 2 win last Saturday against then-No. 9 Miami. He also struck out a career-high 11 batters.
- He has worked five innings or more in nine of his 10 starts.

SBORZ PUTS HIS STAMP ON CLOSER ROLE

- Josh Sborz moved into the bullpen and the closer role this season and has recorded an ACC-best 12 saves.
- Sborz is limiting opponents to a .145 batting average and has been named to the Stopper of the Year Midseason Watch List.
- He went 6-4 with a 2.92 ERA in 17 games (15 starts) during the 2014 season, primarily as the Saturday starter.
- Sborz took over for All-American Nick Howard, who saved an ACC-record 20 games last year and was taken 19th overall by the Cincinnati Reds in the MLB Draft.
- UVa closers own 155 saves in the 12 seasons under the current coaching staff (13.5 saves per season).
- Six of the seven closers since 2004 have been selected in the MLB Draft, including five in the top 10 rounds.

LA PRISE OUT FOR SEASON

- Virginia INF/OF John La Prise had hip surgery on April 1 and will miss the remainder of the season.
- His scheduled recovery period is approximately six months.
- La Prise was slated to be the Cavaliers' starting center fielder heading into the year but played in just four games early this season while battling the injury.
- La Prise batted .348 with 10 doubles and 17 RBI in 2014. He was fifth on the team with 62 hits and had the second-most hits of any returning Cavalier this year.

CAVALIERS ADD PAIR FROM CLUB TEAM

- With injuries causing some major depth issues early this season, Virginia added a pair of players to the roster. Both were members of the UVa club team.
- Catcher Ben Cassillo, a freshman, is wearing No. 41, while senior infielder Kevin Radford sports No. 5.
- Cassillo is a native of Latham, N.Y., while Radford hails from Norfolk, Va. (Maury HS).

UVa STARTS SEASON 10-0 FOR FOURTH TIME

- Virginia recorded a 10-0 start for the fourth time in program history – all during Brian O'Connor's 12 seasons as head coach. All 10 games were away from home (three road, seven neutral).
- UVa won 19 consecutive games to begin the 2009 season. That remains the longest win streak at any point in program history.
- UVa won 11 straight to open the 2008 season and 14 straight to begin the 2013 campaign.
- The Cavaliers were one of the last two unbeaten teams in the nation, joining Texas A&M.

CAVALIERS CAPTURE 18-INNING MARATHON

- Virginia defeated Marist 5-4 in 18 innings on Feb. 22 in Charleston, S.C. It is the longest game by innings in program history.
- The previous high was a 17-inning game, ironically also in Charleston, in 2006 against College of Charleston.
- It is believed to be the second-longest game by time (5:08), behind the 2006 CofC game, which lasted 5:19.
- Virginia shut out Marist over the final 11 innings.
- Freshman Christian Lowry's first college hit, a one-out single in the 18th, scored Matt Thaiss with the winning run.

PRESEASON ALL-AMERICANS

- Three Cavaliers were named preseason All-Americans: LHP Nathan Kirby, OF Joe McCarthy and LHP Brandon Waddell.
- Kirby was a unanimous first-team All-America selection, while McCarthy and Waddell each were named to various teams.

KIRBY, WADDELL ON GOLDEN SPIKES WATCH LIST

- Virginia left-handed pitchers Nathan Kirby and Brandon Waddell each were named to the preseason Golden Spikes Award watch list.
- The list consists of 50 players in amateur baseball.
- Virginia is one of seven schools who have multiple players on the list, joining Cal State Fullerton, Florida, Miami, TCU, UCLA and Vanderbilt.

VIRGINIA LANDS NO. 2 RECRUITING CLASS

- Virginia reeled in the No. 2-ranked recruiting class for 2014 according to Baseball America, behind only LSU. It marked the best recruiting ranking in program history.
- The class is comprised of 13 student-athletes.
- Three were selected in the 2014 MLB Draft: RHP Derek Casey (22nd round, St. Louis), 1B/LHP Pavin Smith (32nd round, Colorado) and RHP Tommy Doyle (35th round, Washington).

WHO'S GONE?

- Virginia has plenty of holes to fill after losing five position players and three key members of its bullpen to the 2014 MLB Draft.
- Virginia had three first-round picks, just the seventh program in the last 20 years to do so in one year: RHP Nick Howard (No. 19), OF Derek Fisher (No. 37) and OF Mike Papi (No. 38).
- UVa also lost OF Brandon Downes (7th round), INF Branden Cogswell (7th), RHP Artie Lewicki (8th), RHP Whit Mayberry (21st) and C Nate Irving (34th).
- With eight players drafted, UVa tied for the second most picks of any school in 2014 (Ole Miss, 9).
- UVa had six players taken in the top 10 rounds – most of any school.

O'CONNOR LEADS ACTIVE COACHES IN WIN PCT., 13TH ALL-TIME

- Virginia head coach Brian O'Connor is 540-192-2 (.735) in his 12th season in charge of the Cavaliers' program.
- O'Connor's 74.3 percent winning percentage entering the season ranked No. 1 among active Division I head coaches.
- O'Connor also ranks 13th all-time in career winning percentage among all coaches with at least 10 years of head coaching experience.
- Virginia has won at least 39 games in all 11 of O'Connor's seasons, including nine 40-win seasons and four 50-win campaigns.

- With 324 victories since the start of the 2009 season, Virginia owns the most wins of any team in the nation in that span.

- UVa ranked 11th nationally in total attendance (142,496) and average attendance (3,749).
- Both totals ranked third among ACC programs.
- UVa crushed its previous records for average (3,298 in 2011) and total attendance (125,959 in 2010).
- More than 110,000 fans have attended Virginia games each of the past five seasons as UVa has ranked among the top 20 programs nationally in attendance every year.

CAVALIERS TAKE FIRST-EVER FOREIGN TOUR

- Virginia went on an eight-day international tour to Central America from Dec. 17-24, marking the baseball program's first-ever foreign tour.
- UVa traveled to Panama and Costa Rica.
- The foreign tour enabled the young squad to gel through extra practice time, an exhibition game in Panama City and team-building events.
- In its exhibition contest, UVa scored a 9-1 win over Panama Metro on Dec. 18 at Rod Carew National Stadium, a 27,000-seat stadium which hosted games in the 2013 World Baseball Classic.
- During its travels through Panama, the Cavaliers had the opportunity to tour the Miraflores Locks at the Panama Canal, canoe down the Tigris River and visit the indigenous Embera Village, where the team toured and learned about the village's customs.
- While in Costa Rica, the team toured the Doka Coffee Plantation, zip-lined through the rainforest, hiked through the Arenal Volcano National Park and went white-water rafting on the Savegre River.
