FIVE THINGS YOU NEED TO KNOW

- Virginia makes the trip to Raleigh for the first time since 2007 and only the second time since a 2003 meeting.
- UVa has not won in Raleigh since a 47-26 triumph in 1999.
- With 330 career tackles, Steve Greer leads all active ACC members, is No. 10 among active FBS players and is No. 11 all-time at UVa.
- Oscar Smith High School teammates Perry Jones and Tim Smith each reached 1,000 career receiving yards last time out against Wake Forest and former Oscar Smith QB Phillip Sims connect with each Jones and Smith when the duo reached their milestone.
- Perry Jones is the fourth Cavalier in program history and twelfth player in ACC history with 1,000 career rushing yards and 1,000 receiving yards.

VIRGINIA FOOTBALL LOOKS TO END SIX-GAME SLIDE

- Virginia seeks to halt its current six-game losing streak when they travel to Raleigh for the first time since 2007 to face the NC State Wolfpack, for an Atlantic Coast Conference football match-up. Kick-off is scheduled for 12:30 p.m., and the game will be televised on the ACC Network (NBC 29 in the Charlottesville area).
- Virginia aims to end its losing streak, the longest by the Cavaliers since losing the last six games of the 2009 season. A loss would make this UVa team the first to lose seven games in a row since the 1981 squad started its season off 0-7.

VIRGINIA VS. NC STATE

- Virginia trails the all-time series with NC State, 21-34-1, including an 8-16 mark in Raleigh. The teams are meeting for only the third time in Raleigh since a 2003 showdown between current NFL signal callers – Matt Schaub and Phillip Rivers.
- The 2011 meeting in Charlottesville was the first in the series since the 2007 season. NC State Tom O'Brien is 3-0 vs. UVa – 2-0 with NC State (2007 & 2011) and 1-0 with Boston College (2005).
- Fifteen of Virginia's 21 series wins have occurred since 1983; UVa is 15-9 since then. Nine of the last 14 games have been decided by 10 points or fewer, including the last meeting in Raleigh in 2007 – a five-point Wolfpack win.

VIRGINIA-NC STATE CONNECTIONS

- NC State head coach Tom O'Brien was an assistant coach at Virginia from 1982-96.
- NC State's starting left guard, R.J. Mattes, is the son of former UVa All-ACC honoree and eight-year NFL veteran Ron Mattes. Ron Mattes was the offensive line coach and a graduate assistant for UVa in 2010 before moving on to an assistant coaching gig at Elon for the 2011 season.

A BATTLE TO THE FINISH

- Nine of the last 14 meetings between Virginia and NC State have gone down to the wire featuring amazing comebacks and nail-biting finishes on both sides.
- Trailing by five with the ball in 2007, Virginia had a chance but Willie Young sacked backup quarterback Peter Lalich on fourth down to seal it with 17 seconds left.
- Jason Snelling scored on a 17-yard run with 1:31 to play to lift UVa to a 14-7 win in 2006 at Scott Stadium.
- The 2003 match-up featured two NFL quarterbacks—Virginia's Matt Schaub and Philip Rivers from NC State—in a game that saw four ties and five lead changes before the Wolfpack pulled out a 51-37 win in the most recent game in Raleigh.
- Cornerback Jamaine Winborne batted away ball intended for Bryan Peterson in the end zone to preserve UVa's 14-9 win in 2002.
- Virginia won three straight from 1998-2000 and every win was sparked by a second half comeback.
- The Cavaliers used a 14-point second half outburst in 1998 to win 23-13 at home.
- The following year UVa erupted for 30 points in the third quarter to break open a tight ballgame (19-10 at halftime) and win going away 47-26 in 1999.
- Fullback Tyree Foreman broke loose for a 38-yard touchdown run with 9:49 remaining to provide the winning points in UVa's 24-17 triumph in 2000.

WEEKLY PRESS CONFERENCE

On each Monday during the football season, the UVa Athletics Media Relations office will conduct the weekly football press conference, attended by head coach Mike London and selected student-athletes. London will field questions beginning at 3 p.m. and student-athletes will begin interviews at 3:30 p.m. Snacks will be served.

Quotes from the Monday press conference will be posted on VirginiaSports.com Monday afternoon.

PLAYER INTERVIEWS

Players are available each Monday, depending on class schedules. This is the best opportunity to interview players. If you have specific player interview requests, they should be directed to Vincent Briedis in the UVa Athletics Media Relations office by Noon Sunday.

Requested defensive players and defensive coaches will be available for telephone interviews Tuesday, while offensive players and offensive coaches will be available Wednesday.

No player or coach interviews will be arranged after Wednesday during game week.

POSTGAME INTERVIEWS

Virginia's locker room is closed to media following games, both at home and on the road.

Coach London will hold his postgame press conference in the media room, while requested players and assistant coaches will be brought to the media room to meet with media representatives after London. UVa athletics media relations personnel will take player requests during the fourth quarter of each game.

ACC INJURY GUIDELINES

On each Monday during the season, ACC schools will announce any players who are out for the season or scheduled to have surgery.

No other announcements regarding player injuries will be made until the end of practice on Thursday or two days prior to the next football game (Tuesday for Thursday game, Thursday for Saturday). On that day, within 90 minutes of the end of practice, injured players' playing status for the next game will be announced in one of five categories:

- Definitely will play
- Probable
- Questionable
- Doubtful
- Out

STRANGE GAME BACK IN '44

- The 1944 meeting between these two teams, played in Norfolk, ranks as one of the strangest games in college football history.
- The Wolfpack pulled out a 13-0 win in a driving rainstorm by recovering two UVA fumbles in the end zone for touchdowns.
- While that is remarkable in itself, the Wolfpack failed to make a first down and had just 10 yards of total offense, an NCAA record for fewest yards gained by a winning team and one of only two games in Bowl Subdivision history where the winning team failed to make a first down.

SLOWING STATE'S GROUND GAME

- The Cavaliers' ability to contain the NC State rushing attack has been one of the factors enabling them to win seven of the last 11 games against the Wolfpack.
- Virginia has won all 10 meetings against the Wolfpack going back to World War II when holding them to fewer than 100 yards rushing.
- The only time in the modern day history of the series (since 1937), NC State won when rushing for fewer than 100 yards occurred in 1944 when the Wolfpack gained just 10 yards and won one of the oddest games in college football history. That game is the only time in series history the Wolfpack rushed for fewer than 110 yards and still won.
- Conversely, NC State has won 17 of the 18 games since 1937 when rushing for at least 200 yards. (The only time NC State rushed for at least 200 yards and failed to win occurred in 1998 as State gained 211 yards in a 23-13 loss)

TURNOVERS ALSO MAKE A DIFFERENCE

- Coaches cite turnovers as one of the keys to a team's success in any particular game and this series is a good example of this coaching philosophy
- Since 1983, the Cavaliers are 11-2 vs. the Wolfpack when committing fewer turnovers. NC State, on the other hand, is just 5-3 when it commits fewer turnovers
- There have been three games since 1983 ('85, '90, '03) where the teams had equal turnovers; UVA's won only the 1990 game
- Virginia has not committed a turnover five times since 1983 ('84, '96, '98, '00, '06), while State has had at least one turnover every year since 1963 (42 games)
- Virginia had committed only 10 turnovers in the previous 11 meetings before turning it over four times (3 INTs, 1 fumble) last year in Charlottesville. The Wolfpack has turned the ball over 24 times in that span
- Cavalier passers had thrown just 10 interceptions in the previous 17 games until David Watford threw three last year. NC State has thrown 24 picks over the last 18 meetings.
- Virginia has intercepted at least one pass in 24 of the last 27 meetings.

GRINDING OUT THE YARDS

- Virginia has had at least one 100-yard rusher in eight of the last 15 games against NC State and has gained at least 200 yards rushing in 10 of the last 17 games against the Wolfpack.
- When outrushing the Wolfpack, Virginia is 16-8 since 1944.
- The team with the most rushing yards has won 10 of the last 12 meetings and 42 of 51 games since 1944. At one point the team with the most rushing yards won 18 consecutive games between 1963-82.
- In their last seven wins over NC State going back to 1995, the Cavaliers have averaged 216.6 yards rushing per game.
- On the other hand, the Wolfpack has gained more than 200 yards only twice since 1981 (1997, '98).

LAST MEETING: 2011 (STATE 28 - UVA 14)

- After UVA opened up with a 7-0 lead in the second quarter, Mike Glennon and NC State scored 21 unanswered points to help the Wolfpack secure the victory.
- It was a 21-14 NC State lead with 2:19 left in the third quarter after David Watford found Tim Smith for a 60-yard TD pass, but David Amerson iced the game for NC State with a 12-yard INT return for a TD on an Watford pass that hit Tim Smith's hands bobbled, late in the fourth quarter.
- The game with NC State was one of three in 2011 where UVA failed to rush for a TD.

TOUGH OPENING SCHEDULE

- UVA is one of 11 teams in the nation that boasts four teams who played in 2011 bowl games on its schedule through the first five weeks of the season. The Cavaliers are the only team in the ACC that can lay claim to the list.

FIVE CAPTAINS NAMED FOR 2012 TEAM

- Virginia has five team captains this season.
- The captains: senior OT Oday Aboushi, senior ILB Steve Greer, senior DT Will Hill, senior TB Perry Jones and senior OLB LaRoy Reynolds.
- Perry Jones is the lone repeat captain from 2011 and becomes the first Cavalier to be named a captain multiple times since Nick Jenkins (2010-11).

THREE CAVALIERS COMPETING AS GRADUATE STUDENTS

- Three Cavaliers that are graduate students at UVA this fall.
- (HLD) Jacob Hodges, (TE) Kyle McCartin and (WR) Brian Pomper all already hold their undergrad degree from UVA.
- Pomper was a two-year letterwinner on the UVA men's lacrosse team and part of the Cavaliers No. 1 recruiting class in 2008.

- Fifteen Cavaliers have made their first career starts in 2012.
- Against Wake Forest, Jay Whitmire (OT) made his first start.
- Against Maryland, Kevin Parks (TB) made his first start.
- At Duke Phillip Sims (QB) and E.J. Scott (WR) made their first career starts.
- Seven Cavaliers made their first career starts against Richmond on Sept. 1. Off: Zachary Swanson (FB), Cody Wallace (OG), Sean Cascarano (OG). Def: Drequan Hoskey (CB), Brandon Phelps (SS), Anthony Harris (FS), Brent Urban (DT).
- Against Penn State Dominique Terrell (WR) and Conner Davis (OG) made their first career starts.
- Against Georgia Tech Jake McGee (TE) made his first career start.
- At TCU D.J. Hill (OLB) made his first career start for an injured La'Roy Reynolds.

YOUNG DEFENSE BY THE NUMBERS

- If you take out the 594 total yards UVA's defense gave up to the triple-option of Georgia Tech, it no longer would be No. 40 in the nation in total defense.
- In UVA's other seven games the defense has yielded a combined 2,261 yards, or 323.0 yards per game. UVA's defensive average would rank this week at No. 20 if the Georgia Tech was not included, and No. 3 in the ACC.
- UVA has also slowed down some of the nation's top passers. TCU's Casey Pachall (No. 4 when suspended) and Louisiana Tech's Colby Cameron (No. 14) rank in the Top 15 nationally in passing efficiency – both performed below their season average in efficiency when facing the Cavaliers.

UVA MAINTAINS HIGH RANKINGS IN U.S. NEWS & WORLD REPORT

- The University of Virginia retained its spot among the nation's elite institutions of higher education in the 2013 U.S. News & Report college rankings.
- In tact are UVA's string of more than 20 consecutive years in the top 25 listing of best national universities and its rank as the second-best public university, a spot now held for nine straight years.
- UVA lands this year in a three-way tie for No. 24 among all universities, public and private. It shares the position with the University of California, Los Angeles, and the University of Southern California.

HILL, TERRELL NAMED SPRING'S MOST IMPROVED

- Prior to the team's annual spring game, head coach Mike London announced the recipients of the Rock Weir Awards representing the most improved players during spring drills.
- Senior DT Will Hill was the most improved player on defense, while sophomore WR Dominique Terrell was tabbed the offense's most improved player.

LONDON FACES THREE FORMER COLLEAGUES IN 2012

- UVA head coach Mike London will face three head coaches this season (Danny Rocco of Richmond, Tom O'Brien of NC State and Al Golden of Miami) with whom he formerly worked.

FIVE FORMER UVA ASSISTANTS NOW HEAD COACHES

- Five current ACC head coaches have previously been assistant coaches at Virginia. Boston College's Frank Spaziani, NC State's Tom O'Brien, Miami's Al Golden, Wake Forest's Jim Grobe (graduate assistant) and of course UVA's Mike London.

NINE TRUE FRESHMEN DEBUT IN OPENER

- Nine true freshmen made their college debut against Richmond on Sept. 1.
- Demeitre Brim (OLB), Maurice Canady (CB) Trent Corney (LB), Anthony Cooper (DB), Adrian Gamble (WR), Eli Harold (DE), Kwontie Moore (LB), Mike Moore (DE), Canaan Severin (WR).
- Pablo Alvarez (FS), Ross Burbank (C), David Dean (DT), Jeremy Dollin (TE), Ian Frye (KO), Jon Goss (OG), Nick Koutris (OT), Darius Lee (SS), Sammy MacFarlane (FB), John Pond (OG), Mason Thomas (S), Jay Whitmire (OT) and Alec Vozenilek (P) also all made collegiate debuts against Richmond.
- A total of 22 total first-time players made their debut against Richmond.
- In all 16 freshmen, including true and redshirt, made their debut against Richmond.
- No new true freshmen have made a debut since the Richmond game.

CANADIANS ON UVA'S ROSTER

- UVA is tied for second behind Eastern Michigan for the most Canadian natives in the nation on its current roster.
- UVA has three (Trent Corney, Ryan Doull and Brent Urban).
- Buffalo, UConn, Iowa and Rice are tied for second with UVA.
- Boston College, Boise State, Northern Illinois, UNLV and Wyoming have two.
- There are 16 schools with at least one Canadian.
- Former UVA offensive guard Austin Pasztor hailed from Langton, Ontario and was a second team AP All-American last season and was part of the 2012 training camp with the Minnesota Vikings.

LONDON'S SECOND SEASON BY THE NUMBERS

- According to a study by Phil Steele's College Football Publications, UVA head coach Mike London in year two was ahead of the numbers of most second-year head coaches.
- According to research done on head coaches hired from 1990-2011, UVA's eight wins last season put Mike London 2.25 victories ahead of the average of 5.75 wins amongst all second-year coaches over the last 22 seasons.
- Since 1990 there have been 368 head coaches that have experienced a second season of their tenure, the combined record over that span is 2119-2268, good for a .483 winning percentage.
- In Year Two at UVA Mike London went 8-5, good for a .615 winning percentage.

LONDON SERVES AS VOTER ON USA TODAY COACHES' POLL

- For the third-consecutive season, Mike London will serve as a voter on the USA Today Coaches' Poll.
- Fifty-nine coaches from FBS institutions across the nation participate in the poll.

PENN STATE WIN GARNERS COMPARISONS

- The Virginia win over Penn State had some comparisons with notable Cavalier victories last season.
- The win, which pushed Mike London's career record versus the Big Ten to 2-0, was similar to his first win over the conference at Indiana last season.
- Playing Penn State on the same weekend they played Indiana a year ago — each game's outcome was determined on the game's final play. In 2011 at IU, it was a 23-yard field goal made by UVa's Robert Randolph as time expired. In the Penn State game it was the 42-yard missed field goal by Sam Ficken.
- The miss by Penn State's Ficken was from the same distance (42-yards) that Florida State's Dustin Hopkins miss was that sealed the 2011 win for the Cavaliers, making UVa the first team in college football history to win road games at Miami and Florida State in the same season.
- Both kicks sailed wide left.

WINNING THE TIME OF POSSESSION BATTLE

- Nineteen times in Mike London's time as head coach Virginia won the time of possession battle.
- London-led teams at UVa are 10-9 when winning the possession battle.

SWANSON TALLEST FB IN THE NATION

- UVa's starting fullback Zachary Swanson stands at **6-6** and is the tallest fullback in the nation.
- Three fullbacks closest in height all measure out at **6-4** and have all started games for their schools this season:
 - Braden Wilson (Kansas State)
 - Jake Sinkovec (Boston College)
 - Will Fleming (Akron)

PASSING GAME PRODUCES BIG PLAYS

- UVa has 15 pass plays in 2012 that have gone for 30 yards or more - six of those came in the Louisiana Tech game when the Cavaliers set a team record for most passing yards in a game with 480.
- Darius Jennings had two of the six, one going for 50 yards and the second going for 47 yards.
- Perry Jones was on the passing and receiving end of two of the six plays - throwing a 36-yard TD pass to Tim Smith and receiving a 34-yard pass from Phillip Sims.
- UVa's longest pass reception to date also came in the game - a 73-yard TD reception on a Michael Rocco to Khalek Shepherd connection.
- UVa has had five passes for 30 or more yards since the Louisiana Tech game.

UVa PASSING GAME GETS VERTICAL IN 2012

- UVa is creating more dynamic plays in the vertical passing game in 2012 with the wide receivers and tight ends compared to the 2011 season.
- So far in 2012, UVa has 29 pass plays that have gone to wide receivers or tight ends for 20 yards or more — an average of 3.63 per game.
- Compare that number to 2011 when the entire season saw 35 passes of 20 yards or more to wide receivers or tight ends for a rate of 2.69 per game.

RUSHING GAME DROUGHT GETTING BETTER

- Kevin Parks rushed for a career-high 129 yards as UVa rushed for the most yards all season against Maryland.
- UVa averaged 165.75 rushing yards a game over a span of four games (TCU, LA Tech, Duke, MD) before being held to only 48 yards rushing against Wake Forest.
- UVa has rushed for 1,025 yards and six TDs and is rushing for 3.7 yards per carry.
- Compare that to UVa eight games into the 2011 season when the Cavaliers had rushed for 1,491 yards and 13 TDs and posted 4.6 yards per carry.
- After rushing for 18 TDs in 2011, UVa only has six rushing TDs in 2012 and went 16 quarters without rushing for a TD until Kevin Parks scored on UVa's opening drive of the Duke game.
- UVa has now gone 11 quarters without a rushing TD since Perry Jones also rushed for a score at Duke.
- UVa rushed 50 more times in 2011 when compared to 2012 after eight games.
- However, UVa rushed for 164 yards at No. 17 TCU, becoming the first opponent of the Horned Frogs to rush for more than 100 yards.
- UVa rushed for 145 yards against La Tech.
- UVa rushed for 186 yards and two TDs at Duke, while Perry Jones became UVa's first 100-yard rusher of the season.

UVa RUSHING GAME LOOKS TO GET GOING

- The Virginia rushing attack is down thus far in 2012, averaging 128.13 yards per game - which ranks No. 92 nationally and No. 6 in the ACC.
- Those numbers are a stark difference to 2011 when UVa averaged 165.3 rushing yards per game. That number was the second-highest amount put up by the Cavaliers in the past 12 seasons. During that time only the 2004 team (242.8) had a higher rushing average than the 2011 squad.

PARKS REACHES 1,000 CAREER RUSHING YARDS

- With 74 rushing yards at Duke, Kevin Parks became the 41st player in program history to reach 1,000 career rushing yards.
- Parks now has 1,184 career rushing yards and currently ranks No. 37 all-time at UVa in career rushing.

OSCAR SMITH HS TEAMMATES SHARE MILESTONE

- UVa's Perry Jones and Tim Smith, teammates at Oscar Smith High School, became the 31st and 32nd players in UVa history to collect 1,000 career receiving yards when they each reached the milestone against Wake Forest.
- Phillip Sims, the Oscar Smith QB when Jones and Smith were seniors and won the 2008 state title, was the UVa QB that made the milestone connection against Wake Forest.

TIGHT ENDS CONTINUE TO PRODUCE

- Virginia has been strong at tight end over the last decade, and that continues with Colter Phillips, Paul Freedman, Jeremiah Mathis and Jake McGee back for 2012 (Mathis moved to tight end during the 2010 season).
- Phillips, Freedman and Mathis combined for 36 receptions for 264 yards and five TDs in 2010 and 20 receptions for 152 yards and two TDs in 2011.
- McGee turned the trio into a quartet in 2012 with his first collegiate receptions.
- UVa TEs have caught 564 passes for 6,116 yards and 77 TDs since 2001, by far the best figures in the ACC in that span.

UVA TEAM STRUGGLES

- Virginia is No. 124 in the nation in turnover margin per game at -2.00.
- UVA is the worst in the FBS with a -16 turnover margin and no team has caused fewer turnovers than UVA (four).
- The turnover margin is one aspect that has allowed UVA's opponents to start 27 drives, or 24.7 percent of overall opponent drives, inside UVA territory – while only seven of UVA's drives, or 6.5 percent of overall drives, have started in opponent territory.
- UVA has started 29 drives, or 26.9 percent of overall drives, inside its own 20.
- UVA's average starting field position is its own 27, while its opponent's average is own 36.

CONSISTENCY IS KEY FOR UVA

- For the third season in a row, the UVA coaching staff under head coach Mike London has remained intact.
- UVA is one of 16 schools in the nation entering 2012 with the same nine assistants that started the 2011 season.
- Florida State, Miami and Virginia Tech join UVA among ACC schools on the list of 16.
- BYU, Colorado, Georgia, Louisiana Tech, UL-Lafayette, Michigan, Michigan State, Minnesota, Mississippi State, Northwestern, Oregon, San Diego State and Texas also made the list.
- Virginia joins Florida State and Louisiana Tech as schools that have staffs that have remained intact for two years in a row, while the only school on the list of 16 with a longer tenure is Oregon (three years).

ABOUSHI GRADING OUT HIGH

- Oday Aboushi has graded out high on the offensive line during the first seven games.
- For the season, Aboushi has graded out over 90 percent each game and averaged 10-plus knockdown blocks a game.
- Aboushi graded out at 97 percent versus Richmond with seven knockdown blocks.
- Aboushi graded out at 94 percent versus Penn State with 12 knockdown blocks.
- For his effort against Penn State, Aboushi was named ACC Offensive Lineman of the Week.

PERRY JONES CLIMBS TWO UVA ALL-TIME LISTS

NOTING JONES AS A RECEIVER ...

- Jones became the fourth player in UVA history and 12th player in ACC history to rush for at least 1,000 career yards and record 1,000 career receiving yards.
- The other three players are Alvin Pearman (2,394 rush, 1,396 rec), Terry Kirby (3,348 rush, 1,022 rec) and Frank Quayle (2,695 rush, 1,145 rec).
- Only one other active FBS player is over 1,000 career yards in both rushing and receiving: Houston's Charles Sims (1,729 rushing/1,500 receiving).
- Jones with 108 career receptions sits No. 11 all-time at UVA in career receptions.

JONES HITS 100 IN RUSH/REC IN A GAME

- Perry Jones is one of three players in FBS football this season to have at least one game of 100 yards rushing and one game of 100 yards receiving.
- Jones had 100 receiving yards against La Tech and rushed for 100 yards at Duke.
- Northwestern's Kain Colter rushed for 161 yards and had 131 receiving yards against Indiana.
- Utah State's Kerwynn Williams had 147 receiving yards and 113 rushing yards against UNLV.

... AND JONES AS A PASSER

- Jones' 37-yard TD pass at Miami (Oct. 27, 2011) to Tim Smith was the first pass attempt, completion and TD toss of his career.
- Jones and Smith hooked up again against Louisiana Tech (Sept. 29) on an identical play - going for a 36-yard score in the first quarter.
- Jones for his career is 2-for-3 for 73 passing yards and two career TD passes - raking up a career 491.1 passing efficiency mark.
- The duo also had the same Jones to Smith hookup when they were teammates at Oscar Smith HS.
- Both Jones to Smith connections are the lone scoring "option play" for UVA since Vic Hall's 5-yard pass to Joe Torchia at Clemson in 2009.
- In 2011 Jones became the first Cavalier since Vic Hall in 2009 to rush for a TD, pass for a TD and catch a reception for a TD in the same season.

JONES ONE OF FEW RBs IN THE NATION

- With 108 career receptions, Perry Jones is No. 2 in the nation among active running backs in career catches and No. 1 among BCS running backs.
- Jones leads all active ACC running backs with his 108 career catches, with NC State's James Washington (78) the closest of all league backs.

PERRY JONES STANDS ALONE IN THE BCS

- Jones was one of only two players (only BCS player) in the nation last season to rush for at least 900 yards and notch at least 500 yards receiving, joining him was New Mexico State's Kenny Turner (1074 rush, 514 rec).

SPREADING THE RECEIVING WEALTH

- Virginia QBs have completed passes to 15 different receivers already in 2012.
- That number passes the 14 different receivers that caught passes in all of 2012.
- The 2010 season saw UVA connect on passes to 19 different receivers, the most since the 1959 season when that squad also found 19 different receivers during the season.
- Nine different receivers have caught TD passes for the second season in a row.
- During Mike London's first season in 2010 there were 10 different receivers who caught TD passes.
- Before London came in 2010, UVA hadn't had more than eight since 2003 when it had 10.

JENNINGS SCORES TDS ON BIG PLAYS

- UVA WR Darius Jennings has two career TDs, but when he scores six points for the Cavaliers, it comes in a big way.
- Jennings averages 52.0 yards per career TD, scoring on a 53-yarder at Miami in 2011 and a 51-yarder against Richmond on Sept. 1.

JAKE MCGEE NOTCHES CAREER DAY VS PENN ST.

- Jake McGee had a career day against Penn State catching four passes for 99 yards, both career highs. McGee's six-yard TD reception put UVA up for good with 1:28 left. The TD was the first of McGee's career.
- McGee was clutch against the Nittany Lions. Here is a break down of his four catches, all resulting in points or a first down:
 - first catch for 26 yards was in a 2nd and 15 situation (third quarter)
 - second catch for 23 yards was in a 3rd and 20 situation (third quarter)
 - third catch for 44 yards was in a 3rd and 16 situation (fourth quarter)
 - fourth catch for six yards was for a TD on a 3rd and goal from the six (fourth quarter).

PRO STYLE OFFENSE PAYS DIVIDENDS

- UVA has amassed more than 400 yards of total offense in 16-of-33 games since offensive coordinator Bill Lazor brought his pro-style attack to Charlottesville. The Georgia Tech (297) and Penn State games this year (295 yards), the Oct. 22, 2011 game vs. NC State (249 yards) and UVA's 2011 (241 yards) and 2010 (291 yards) regular-season finales against Virginia Tech are the only games during the Mike London tenure where the Cavaliers failed to amass at least 300 yards of total offense.
- The Penn State game this year is the only time UVA has failed to reach 300 yards of total offense and won the game.
- Five times since 2005 UVA has amassed 500 yards of total offense. They did so against La Tech (625) on Sept. 29, Richmond (545) in the season-opening win, at Maryland (527) in 2011, Duke (643) in 2010 and Indiana (536) in 2009.

UVA DEFENSE KEEPS TEAMS UNDER AVERAGE

- Only Georgia Tech and TCU went over its season average in total yards against UVa.
- Here is how UVa has done this season versus its opponents season average of total yards:

UVA RANKS IN TOP 20 ON THREE & OUTS

- UVa ranks No. 15 in the nation as a defense forcing three and outs, posting a 4.38 three and out average per game.
- UVa's opponents have gone three and out 35 times over eight games. 32.1 percent of UVa's opponents drives have ended in a three and out.
- UVa is No. 3 in the ACC as Florida State leads the nation at 49.2 percent of drives end in a three and out. NC State (4.63 per game) is No. 11 and Clemson (4.0 per game) is No. 22.
- UVa's week four opponent TCU is No. 2 this week with a 42.9 percent rate or 6.0 per game. UVa only had four drives end at TCU as a three and out, two drives fewer than the Horned Frogs' average.

DEFENSE CLAMPING DOWN

- The Virginia defense over the past two games against Maryland and Wake Forest has been forcing its opponents to average only 4.02 plays per drive.
- Over that span opponents are 3-of-28 on third down opportunities, which comes out to a 10.7 percent success rate.
- UVa's opponents have amassed only 448 total yards over the past two games for an average of 224 yards per game. That is an average of 51.5 rushing yards per game and 172.5 passing yards per game.

UVA HAS NO SENIORS IN SECONDARY

- UVa has zero seniors in its secondary after having three senior starters a year ago.
- Only three other schools (Florida State, LSU and North Texas) in the nation also lack a senior in their secondary.

NO UPPERCLASSMEN AT CORNERBACK

- UVa has zero upperclassmen on its roster at the cornerback position.
- On UVa's roster there are four freshmen and two sophomores listed as cornerbacks.
- UVa is one of 13 schools in the nation that has zero upperclassmen at a specific position on its roster.
- North Texas lacks upperclassmen at cornerbacks and safeties.
- Boston College, Navy and North Texas join UVa at the cornerback position.
- Six of those schools (Auburn, Indiana, Marshall, Nevada, Oregon and Texas A&M) are at the QB position.
- Rounding out the list are Illinois (RBs), Idaho (TEs) and Tulsa (TEs).

NICHOLSON SENIOR STATESMAN AS SO. AT CB

- In 2011 Demetrius Nicholson became the first freshman to start the season-opener at the cornerback position since Kevin Cook did so in 1986, when the Cavaliers faced South Carolina in Scott Stadium.
- He started all 13 of the Cavaliers' 2011 contests and earned freshmen All-America honors from two different publications.
- Now Nicholson (eight starts in '12) is the veteran in experience in a UVa secondary that features four sophomore starters: Harris (FS), Hoskey (CB) and Phelps (SS).

DYNAMIC DUO OF GREER AND REYNOLDS

- The last three seasons the linebacker duo of Steve Greer and LaRoy Reynolds has been solid, accumulating 440 tackles between the two since the start of the 2010 season. Below is a list that shows where they rank among the top active tackling duos in the ACC since the start of 2010:

UVA DEFENSE STRUGGLING TO TACKLE BALL CARRIERS FOR A LOSS

- Virginia is ranked No. 85 in the nation in tackles for a loss, registering only 32 tackles for losses of 95 yards.
- Through six games in 2011 UVa had already amassed 49 tackles for a loss of 164 yards.
- UVa will have the opportunities against Wake Forest to improve that number as the Demon Deacons rank No. 99 in rushing offense with 123.17 yards per game on the ground.

GREER CLIMBS UVA CAREER TACKLE LIST

- LB Steve Greer has 330 career stops in 44 career games, including 15 tackles (2 TFL) Sept. 8 against Penn State, 14 against La Tech on Sept. 29, 10 at Duke on Oct. 6.
- Greer has 11 career games with double digit numbers in tackles, four of which came in 2011. The other three games came as a redshirt freshman in 2009. Below is where Greer racks up all-time on UVa's career list for tackles:

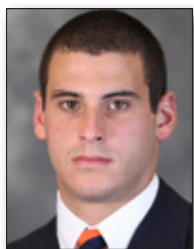

- UVa WR Tim Smith is cousins with MLB stars B.J. and Justin Upton. Smith's father, Timothy Smith, Sr., is first cousins with B.J. and Justin's father, Manny Upton.
- Ausar Walcott has a unique story behind the meaning of his name first name. His mother, Pamela Robinson, named him Ausar, which is a derivative of Osiris, the Egyptian god of the afterlife. Osiris is classically depicted with two large ostrich feathers at either side, ironic since Ausar has stated over his life people have told him it looks like he runs like an ostrich.
- 2012 marks the fifth season in a row that UVa has seven home games on the schedule.
- Cornerback Demetrius Nicholson has been growing his signature dread locks since the summer of 2005, just before he entered the sixth grade.
- Freshman Kyle Dockins also has been growing his dread locks since the sixth grade, dating back to 2006.
- Cavalier TE Colter Phillips has two brothers who also played college football - Andrew was a former guard at Stanford and Paul is a sophomore tight end at Indiana.
- Freshman CB Kelvin Rainey, like Colter Phillips, also has two brothers who have played FBS football. His older brother Johnathan was a senior last season at New Mexico, while his other older brother Derrick is a junior this year at Arizona.
- Freshman Israel Vaughan's older brother, Joshua, is a member of the Carolina Panthers, played for Mike London at Richmond and was a member of its 2008 FCS National Championship team.
- Air Force Academy graduate and UVa assistant coach Scott Wachenheim was awarded his bachelor's degree by then-President Ronald Reagan.
- Holder Jacob Hodges served as a team manager for two years (2008, 2009).
- Sophomore CB Drequan Hoskey ran track at Virginia in 2010 and competed at the ACC and NCAA Championships.
- UVa's oldest living football alum, Dr. John Risher, turned 102 years old this year; he also works in the press box on the UVa stats crew on game day.
- Freshman CB C.J. Moore is the nephew of Gail Devers, three-time Olympic champion in track & field.
- TB Perry Jones, WR Tim Smith and QB Phillip Sims were all members of Oscar Smith High School's Virginia Group AAA Division 6 State Championship in 2008.
- Senior walk-on WR Brian Pomper was a two-year letterwinner (2009-10) on the UVa men's lacrosse team, a member of its 2010 ACC championship squad and part of its 2008 No. 1 recruiting class.

- Junior QB Michael Rocco has reached the 200-yard plateau 10 times in his career.
- Rocco sits tied for No. 6 all-time at UVa with 10 games of 200-yards passing or more.
- With a 312 passing game vs. Auburn in the Chick-fil-A Bowl and a 311 passing game vs. Richmond, Rocco became the first UVa QB to pass for 300 yards in back-to-back games since Jameel Sewell in 2009 - at Southern Miss (312) and vs. Indiana (308).

ROCCO GETTING IT DONE IN THE CLUTCH

- Michael Rocco was pinpoint on UVa's final offensive drive against Penn State, throwing what proved to be the game-winning TD pass in the process.
- Rocco was 6-of-6 passing for 97 yards and had the one TD pass to Jake McGee during the drive against PSU. He was 4-of-4 on the drive when in a third down situation.
- The Penn State game was the third time in Rocco's career he has marched down the field in the closing minutes to tie a game or win it.
- The other games: **at Indiana** (Sept. 10, 2011) when Rocco orchestrated a 15-play, 77-yard drive that tied the contest with 1:36 left in the game after Rocco found Paul Freedman on the two-point conversion. **At Florida State** (Nov. 19, 2011) when Rocco started the game-winning drive with 1:53 left on the clock and he marched the Cavaliers down the field on a five-play, 75-yard five in 47 seconds, culminating with a Kevin Parks TD run.

ROCCO EFFICIENT ON 3RD DOWN

- Michael Rocco, as the starting quarterback, has completed 59.9 percent (88-of-147) of his third down passes during the 2011 and 2012 seasons.
- Rocco is also completing 59.6 percent (62-of-104) of his third down and long opportunities through his 18 career starts.
- His third down numbers are relatively consistent to his overall passing percentage of 60.5 percent (310-of-512) through 18 career starts.
- Third down and long represents any situation of seven yards or longer needed to reach a first down.

THE MCGEE AND ROCCO CONNECTION

- UVa QB Michael Rocco and TE Jake McGee have a connection that goes back before both enrolled at UVa back in 2010, both as QBs.
- McGee led his high school, Collegiate School in Richmond to the 2008 & 2009 VIS Division I state titles, defeating Michael Rocco's Liberty Christian Academy squad in the state title game in 2009. McGee tallied seven TDs in the game, four passing and three rushing.
- McGee later got the best of Rocco in the boys' basketball state quarterfinal round.
- McGee asked the UVa coaching staff to move from QB to TE after two practices in fall camp of 2010.

BIG OFFENSIVE NUMBERS IN OPENER

- Michael Rocco's 311 passing yards against Richmond are the most ever by a UVa QB in a season opener.
- Rocco became the first UVa QB since Aaron Brooks in 1997 to pass for over 300 yards in season opener. Brooks had 305 in a loss to Auburn at Scott Stadium.
- With 545 yards of total offense against Richmond, UVa amassed the most yardage in a season opener since the 1990 Cavaliers trounced Kansas for 564 yards of total offense in Lawrence, Kan., ironically 22 years to the day of this year's Richmond game.

PHILLIP SIMS HAS SECOND BEST UVA QB DEBUT

- UVa head coach Mike London announced during the ACC weekly teleconference on Oct. 3 that Phillip Sims would start against Duke on Oct. 6.
- Sims became only the third different QB to start a game during the Mike London era.
- Of London's 33 games at UVa, 12 have been started by Marc Verica, 18 by Michael Rocco and three by Sims.
- Sims is only the sixth different UVa QB to start a game since the start of the 2007 season. Included in that group was two games started by Vic Hall and two by Peter Lalich. The other 63 games over the span of six seasons have been started by Jameel Sewell (23), Marc Verica (22) and Michael Rocco (18).

NOTING THE LAST QB START FOR PHILLIP SIMS PRIOR TO 2012

- Phillip Sims' start at Duke was his first start since Dec. 5, 2009 when at Oscar Smith High School.
- Sims is former Oscar Smith HS teammates with current Cavalier starters Perry Jones and Tim Smith. Smith missed the Duke game with an injury - Until the Wake Forest game - the last time all three started in a game together was Dec. 6, 2008 at Lane Stadium in Blacksburg, Va., that the trio took the field together as starters.
- In that game Sims threw for 334 yards and six touchdowns, while Smith had six receptions for 224 yards and four TDs as Oscar Smith rung up its first state championship in any sport since the school opened in 1954, defeating Osbourn, 54-24, in the Group AAA Division 6 state championship.
- Perry Jones rushed 23 times for 162 yards and two TDs in the championship game.

SCOTT STADIUM, HOME OF THE CAVALIERS

The Carl Smith Center, home of David A. Harrison III Field at Scott Stadium, with its unique architectural design, scenic setting on the University's Grounds and exceptional sight lines, is one of the nation's finest college football settings.

Opened in 1931, Scott Stadium might be one of the oldest campus college football stadiums in the nation, but you could never tell from its appearance. Numerous upgrades and expansions make it a modern home for the Cavaliers and their fans.

Scott Stadium was the gift of Frederic William Scott and Elisabeth Strother Scott, and was dedicated to the memory of his parents, Frederic Robert Scott and Frances Branch Scott.

Virginia played its dedication game at Scott Stadium on Oct. 15, 1931 against the Virginia Military Institute before a then-capacity crowd of 22,000. Prior to that season, the Cavaliers staged their home games at the University's Lambeth Field.

Virginia has played 427 games in the historic venue. UVa's all-time record at Scott Stadium stands at 243-172-12.

Mike London's plans to build the Virginia football program made remarkable progress during his second season in 2011.

The Cavaliers went 8-4 during the regular season, finished second in the ACC's Coastal Division with a 5-3 mark and played Auburn in the 2011 Chick-fil-A Bowl. The Cavaliers were one win from advancing to the

ACC's Championship game.

The Virginia turnaround featured four games that the team won in the final seconds. Along the way the Cavaliers became the first college football program to ever win road games at Miami and Florida State in the same season on the way to UVA being ranked in the Associated Press Top-25 poll for the first time since the 2007 season.

For his efforts, London was recognized as the Atlantic Coast Conference's Coach of the Year. He was also selected by the Fellowship of Christian Athletes to receive its 2011 Grant Teaff Coach of the Year Award. A total of five Cavalier players earned either first or second-team All-ACC honors. The 2011 team saw two players - CB Chase Minnifield and OG Austin Pasztor - receive All-America honors and CB Demetrious Nicholson was named a Freshman All-American.

Virginia's 2011 squad ranked No. 4 in the ACC in total offense at 399.8 yards per game and rose to No. 3 in total defense at 351.7 yards allowed per game. The Cavaliers were one of just two ACC teams to be ranked in the top four of both of those key statistical categories.

In the spring of 2012 DE Cam Johnson was selected by the San Francisco 49ers to mark the 29th consecutive season a UVA player has been picked in the NFL Draft, the second longest streak among ACC schools.

Since taking over the Virginia program London has worked tirelessly to build relationships with the University's faculty and staff, alumni and former players, fans and supporters and the region's high school coaches. He has made dozens of appearances, spoke at clinics and been readily available to the media. He did not just wait for constituents to come to Virginia, he actively took the Cavalier program to the public.

London embraced a groundbreaking 18-episode television production entitled "The Building of a Program" that gave an all-access look at UVA football. He has had the team hold spring practices and coaches clinics across the state, including in Virginia Beach to build support and interest in one of the state's most fertile recruiting areas.

He quickly defined the culture for the football team by prescribing three basic tenets for his players:

- Go to Class
- Show Class
- Treat People with Dignity and Respect

The results of his actions were tangible. In his first spring semester at UVA the team posted its best cumulative grade point average in 10 years and student-athletes were heavily involved in community service projects and outreach programs.

While all of those things are impressive, London is the first to remind everyone his primary goal is to reverse the fortunes of the Cavalier program on the field. His first edition of Virginia football produced a 4-8 record but achieved a number of milestones that showed positive progress.

The Cavalier offense ranked third in the ACC at 404.8 yards per game after finishing last in 2009 at 269.6 yards per game. Senior Marc Verica led the league's fourth-best passing attack, finishing with 2,799 yards in the air, marking the third-best season mark in UVA history. Wide receivers Dontrelle Inman and Kris Burd became the first UVA wide receiving duo to each total a minimum of 40 receptions in a season. They also recorded over 600 yards receiving, also a program first for a wide receiver tandem.

Keith Payne led a much-improved rushing attack that featured two of the ACC's most productive runners. Payne led

the ACC with 14 rushing touchdowns, 16 total touchdowns and an 8.7 points per game scoring average.

Honorable mention All-American Chase Minnifield anchored the UVA defense in 2010, earning first-team All-ACC honors. Minnifield's two interceptions helped spark the Cavaliers' upset of No. 22 Miami, giving UVA its first win over a ranked team since 2008. Minnifield finished the year No. 2 in the ACC and No. 6 in the nation with six INTs.

Offensive lineman Morgan Moses earned freshman All-America honors by helping the Cavaliers go 13 consecutive quarters without allowing a quarterback sack.

Success has been a big part of the Mike London story even prior to being named the 39th coach in the Virginia program's history.

In two seasons at Richmond, London led the Spiders to a 24-5 record. In his first year at the helm, his team went 13-3 and won the Football Championship Series national title. The 2009 Spider team, ranked nine consecutive weeks at No. 1 in the FCS polls, went 11-2 and reached the quarterfinals of the FCS playoffs. His teams were 13-4 in the Colonial Athletic Association during the 2008 and 2009 campaigns.

London's efforts in 2008 earned him FCS National Coach of the Year honors from both the American Football Coaches Association and Schutt Sports/ American Football Monthly magazine. London was also honored as the Black Coaches Association Male Coach of the Year in 2008, beating out Mike Tomlin of the Super Bowl Champion Pittsburgh Steelers for the award. In addition to the national honors, London was tabbed the State Coach of the Year from both VaSID and the Peninsula Sports Club.

Under London's watch, 16 Spiders were named to the All-CAA Football Team in 2009 after placing 12 in 2008. His first year at UR, nine Spiders garnered 15 All-America awards and six were recognized on the Academic All-Conference Team. DE Lawrence Sidbury was a fourth-round NFL draft pick by the Atlanta Falcons, while RB Josh Vaughan was a free-agent signee by the Tampa Bay Buccaneers.

Before returning to coach his alma mater, London spent six of seven seasons coaching for Al Groh at Virginia. In 2001 London joined the UVA staff for the first time as the defensive line coach. He took over the responsibilities as recruiting coordinator in 2002. In 2005 London left UVA to work as the defensive line coach for the NFL's Houston Texans. He returned to Virginia in 2006 as the defensive coordinator and defensive line coach.

During his tenure with the Cavaliers, he saw five defensive players (Chris Long, Marcus Hamilton, Chris Canty, Andrew

Hoffman and Monsanto Pope) drafted by NFL teams. Long was the ACC Defensive Player of the Year in 2007, earned unanimous All-America honors, was the Ted Hendricks Award winner as the nation's top defensive end and the second overall selection in the 2008 NFL Draft.

A native of Hampton, Va., London played defensive back at Richmond from 1979-82. Under head coach Dal Shealy, he led the Spiders with six interceptions as a senior captain in 1982. In addition to earning all-state honors, he was chosen the team's MVP and received the Spiders' Coaches Award. In 1982, the Virginia Peninsula Sports Club selected him as the male in-state Athlete of the Year.

London graduated from Richmond in 1983 with a bachelor's degree in sociology and a year later received a degree in law enforcement from the Richmond Police Academy, serving as a detective for the street crimes unit from November of 1984 to July of 1989. The Dallas Cowboys signed him as a free agent in 1983.

- Jake McGee caught two passes for 23 yards, his first two collegiate receptions.
- Darius Jennings' 51-yard TD catch is the second longest reception of his career. He had a 53-yard TD reception in '11 at Miami. Both of his TD receptions have gone for over 50 yards.
- Jennings set career highs with five receptions and 84 yards receiving.
- Drew Jarrett attempted his first career FG, and his 45-yard make ranks as the fifth-longest initial FG by a UVa kicker.
- Khalek Shepherd returned his first career punt and returned two for nine yards.
- Shepherd's 59-yard kick return to start the second half was the longest return of his career.
- E.J. Scott caught three balls for 54 yards, the first catches of his career.
- Kevin Parks had two TDs and now has five career TDs in UVa season openers.

- UVa is now 3-5 all-time against Penn State and 2-2 in Charlottesville.
- Four Penn State drives following UVa's four turnovers, the Cavalier defense allowed minus-14 yards, resulting in just three points.
- The Cavaliers were 4-4 on third downs during the game-winning drive.
- With UVa's win over Penn State (17-16) today and Indiana (34-31) last season, it is only the fourth time an ACC team has defeated different Big Ten opponents in successive seasons - NC State (Indiana in '00 and Minnesota in '01), NC State (Iowa in '92 and Purdue in '93) and North Carolina (Michigan State in '64, Ohio State in '65 and Michigan in '66).
- It was only the fourth time in the Mike London era that UVa failed to reach 300 yards of total offense (295), but marked the first victory. The losses for UVa were: 2010 Virginia Tech (291), 2011 vs. Virginia Tech (241) and 2011 vs. NC State (249).

- Penn State's Sam Ficken missed four field goals against UVa, becoming the first opponent kicker to miss four field goals against the Cavaliers since Maryland's Bernardo Bramson went 1-for-5 in the 1964 meeting.
- The last time UVa was minus four in the turnover battle and won the game was on Sept. 17, 1994 against Clemson. UVa had four INTs and lost three fumbles, while Clemson threw three INTs. UVa won the game 9-6.
- Michael Rocco was 6-of-6 passing for 97 yards and a touchdown on the game-winning drive.

- Virginia held Wake Forest to its second lowest number of total yards in a game this season with 213. Wake's 126 at Florida State is the only total lower.
- The 213 total yards by Wake Forest is the fewest allowed by UVa since William & Mary had 169 in the 2011 season opener. It's the fewest by a UVa ACC opponent since North Carolina's 174 in 2009.
- Wake Forest's 213 total yards is the fewest by a UVa opponent in a win against the Cavaliers since Clemson had 192 in a 13-3 Tigers' victory in 2008 — also played at Scott Stadium.
- UVa's defense has allowed a combined 448 yards in the last two games, an average of 224 yards per game.
- UVa held Wake Forest to 1-of-15 on third downs, including 0-of-11 to start the game.
- UVa came into the game averaging 4.0 three and outs per game (19th nationally) and forced Wake Forest into seven three and out situations.
- With 30 yards receiving, Perry Jones became 31st player in UVa history with 1,000 career receiving yards.
- Jones is now the fourth player in UVa history, and 12th player in ACC history, with 1,000 career receiving yards and 1,000 career rushing yards. Other UVa players are Frank Quayle, Terry Kirby and Alvin Pearman.
- Jones is also only the second active FBS player and only in the BCS to have 1,000 career rushing yards and 1,000 career receiving yards — Houston's Charles Sims is also part of the club.
- With five receptions, Jones passed Terry Kirby (105) and is now tied with Patrick Jeffers (108) for No. 11 all-time at UVa in career receptions.
- With 79 yards receiving, Tim Smith became the 32nd player in UVa history with 1,000 career receiving yards.
- Phillips Sims' 56-yard pass to Tim Smith was the longest completion of his career.
- Sims found Smith for a 13-yard TD pass in the second quarter, the first time the duo hooked up on a score since Dec. 6, 2008 when Sims threw four TDs to Smith in the 2008 Group AAA Division 6 state championship game at Virginia Tech's Lane Stadium.
- Sims had 253 yards passing, his second career game with at least 200 yards passing, become the 24th Cavalier to pass for over 200 yards at least twice in their career.
- Khalek Shepherd had UVa's longest punt return of the season for 25 yards. Entering today's game UVa had 14 punt returns that had netted 34 total yards (all by Shepherd).
- Ian Frye made a career long 30-yard field goal in the third quarter. Frye also had a miss of 44 yards, his first career miss and the longest attempt of his career.
- With 14 tackles, Steve Greer passed P.J. Killian (316) for sole possession of 11th all-time in the UVa annals for career tackles with 320. Greer, for the third week in a row, is the ACC active leader in career tackles.
- Chris Brathwaite's nine tackles and 2.0 tackles for a loss are both career highs.
- Eli Harold had a career-high seven tackles.
