

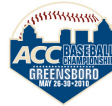

VIRGINIA AT THE ACC BASEBALL CHAMPIONSHIP

- Virginia has won two tournament titles (1996, 2009).
- Virginia is the tournament's No. 1 seed for the second time (1985); UVA has now played in each of the 37 ACC tournaments.
- As the No. 6 seed last year, the Cavaliers won four games in four days to claim the crown (Clemson, UNC, Duke, FSU); UVA was the lowest seed ever to win the title.
- Virginia is 43-62 all-time at the ACC Baseball Championship.
- Under Brian O'Connor (since 2004), Virginia is 12-8 in the tournament.

RECORD SEVEN CAVALIERS NAMED ALL-ACC

- A school-record seven Virginia baseball players were named to the 2010 All-Atlantic Coast Conference Team by voting of the league's coaches.
- Danny Hultzen (starting pitcher), Phil Gosselin (outfield) and Kevin Arico (relief pitcher) made the All-ACC First Team.
- UVA had four second-team honorees: Keith Werman (second base), Tyler Cannon (shortstop), Jarrett Parker (outfield) and Robert Morey (starting pitcher).
- It marks the most players Virginia has ever put on the All-ACC Baseball Team. The previous high was five, set in 2007 and 2009.

HULTZEN FIRST CAVALIER NAMED ACC PITCHER OF YEAR

- Danny Hultzen was named the 2010 ACC Pitcher of the Year; he is the first Cavalier to earn that distinction.
- Hultzen was a first-team honoree at utility last season as a freshman.
- In 2010, he leads the ACC with a 2.08 earned run average as well as 106 strikeouts. He boasts an 8-1 record, including a 6-0 mark in ACC games.

O'CONNOR HONORED AS ACC'S TOP COACH

- Brian O'Connor earned ACC Coach of the Year honors for 2010.
- This is his second such honor; he also earned the award in his first season at Virginia (2004).
- He led the Cavaliers to a 45-10 overall regular-season record, a Coastal Division title (with a 23-7 ACC mark) and the top seeding for the ACC Championship.

- John Hicks enters the tournament on a career-best 14-game hit streak.
- Opponents are 10-for-24 in stolen base attempts over the last 17 games.
- UVA has 17 wins this season against the RPI Top 50.
- UVA has set school single-season records for doubles (143) and triples (30).
- UVA earned its most road wins (15) since the 2004 season (19).

UVA JOINS SELECT FEW TO WIN NINE ACC SERIES

- Virginia won nine ACC series for the first time in program history.
- UVA is the first ACC team to win nine league series since Miami and North Carolina did so in 2008.
- Since the ACC went to the 10-series format in 2005, only five teams have won nine or more ACC series in a year (FSU in 2007 and Clemson in 2006 were the others).
- UVA won four of its ACC series by sweeps.

STRONG PITCHING SINCE EXAM BREAK

- Since returning from a nine-day break for final exams, the Cavaliers' pitching staff has been sensational.

- UVA has posted a 2.43 ERA in six games since May 14 (three vs. UNC and Miami).
- UVA's pitchers have limited opponents to a .188 batting average in those six games.
- Virginia has not given up big innings either – opponents have scored more than one run in just two innings (two runs in each).

VIRGINIA CAPTURES FIRST COASTAL CROWN

- Virginia captured its first-ever ACC Coastal Division crown this year, winning a school-record 23 ACC games in the process.
- UVA now has won three regular-season ACC titles (1972, 1985, 2010).

40 WINS IN RECORD TIME

- Virginia earned its 40th victory with its win May 4 vs. VCU, marking the earliest UVA has reached the mark.
- It is the first time UVA has gotten to the 40-win mark before its exam break.
- Overall, this is the seventh time Virginia has won 40 games in a season; UVA has won at least 40 games in six of Brian O'Connor's seven seasons at Virginia (39 in '08).
- Virginia enters the tournament as one of 15 schools in Division I with 40 or more wins this season (third most overall).

NO SLOUCHES IN THE NINE-HOLE

- Virginia has gotten big production out of its nine-hole hitters this season.
- The No. 9 hitters in the Virginia lineup have combined to go 79-for-192 (.412) this season with 41 RBI and 57 runs scored.
- Outside of the top two spots in the lineup, UVA has gotten its most hits out of the ninth spot in the order.
- Keith Werman, out of the nine-hole, has gone 24-for-46 with 14 runs scored and eight RBI this year.
- Stephen Bruno is 23-for-59 (.390) with two homers, 17 RBI and 21 runs scored in the ninth spot.

MORE PRODUCTION FROM MOREY

- Robert Morey has pitched some of the best baseball of his career over his last five starts.
- Morey has won each of his last five starts, going at least seven innings in each.
- He has a 1.62 ERA in 39 innings in that stretch and has allowed no more than five hits in any of the outings.
- In each of his last two starts, Morey has taken a no-hitter into the sixth inning (through 5 IP vs. UNC, 5.1 IP at Miami).
- He pitched back-to-back complete games vs. Duke and UNC, a first at UVA since Andrew Dobies in 2004.

ROTATION PRODUCING FOR WAHOOS

- Virginia's starting rotation has produced 17 ACC wins this season – most of any ACC team.
- Robert Morey led the league with seven ACC wins, while Danny Hultzen earned six ACC victories, which tied for second. Cody Winiarski has four ACC wins which is tied for ninth.
- Only six other pitchers in the ACC have at least five wins in league games.

ANOTHER DAY, ANOTHER GAME FOR CANNON

- Senior infielder Tyler Cannon broke the UVA career games played record April 30, playing in his 226th game.
- He stands at 234 career games entering the ACC Baseball Championship.
- David Stone set the previous record (225) from 1999-2002.

PARKER RIDES HOT STRETCH

- Jarrett Parker has come on strong over the last month (since April 20), batting .400 during UVa's stretch of 16 wins in 17 games.
- During that time, Parker has a team-best 15 extra-base hits (5 2B, 5 3B, 5 HR), 26 hits and 21 runs.
- He leads the ACC with eight triples this year and is tied for 10th in ACC history with 18 career triples.

GOSSELIN HAS BIG SUCCESS AT TOP OF ORDER

- Phil Gosselin moved into the Cavaliers' leadoff slot this year and has been solid, with a .379 batting average, .457 on base percentage and 15 stolen bases.
- He is second in the ACC in batting and third in hits (85).
- He ranks second in the ACC in doubles (21), seventh in triples (4) and 10th in stolen bases.
- Gosselin has reached base to lead off 20 games.
- He had a streak of 122-consecutive starts snapped April 24 when he sat out because of food poisoning.

HICKS SHOWS OFF THE ARM

- John Hicks has thrown out seven of the last 11 potential basestealers over the past 16 games.
- For the season, Hicks has thrown out 50 percent (16-of-32) of runners attempting to steal. That percentage ranks third nationally.
- As a team, UVa has thrown out 29-of-67 (ACC-best 43.3 percent) of potential basestealers.
- Opponents have stolen an ACC-low 38 bases vs. UVa.

BALANCE THROUGHOUT LINEUP

- UVa has gotten production from its entire lineup, with 10 players boasting at least 35 hits and 25 runs each.
- In 23 games at least eight of the nine Virginia starters have recorded at least one hit.
- On six occasions all nine UVa starters posted at least one hit.
- The Cavaliers are hitting an ACC-best .335 as a team. Ten regular starters are batting .290 or better.

VIRGINIA PITCHING LIMITS HITS

- Virginia's pitchers had given up an average of 7.68 hits per nine innings – first in the ACC and fourth fewest in the nation.
- UVa ranked third nationally last year in fewest hits allowed per nine innings (7.97).
- UVa has given up more than nine hits just 16 times this season and four times in the last 21 games.

LEGGING OUT THE EXTRA BAGGERS

- Virginia has sprayed the ball all over the field this year and ranks among the nation's leaders in triples and doubles (ACC leader in triples, second in doubles).
- UVa has set school records in both categories, with 143 doubles and 30 triples.
- UVa ranks third nationally in triples behind Air Force and Arizona State (36 each)
- The Cavaliers also were 16th nationally in doubles.
- The extra-base hits are coming from everyone – Jarrett Parker is the only Cavalier ranks in the top 50 nationally in either category; he is seventh nationally in triples with eight.

CANNON CLIMBS VIRGINIA CHARTS

- Tyler Cannon has now played in the most career games at UVa with 234. He passed David Stone (1999-2002) for first on the all-time UVa list April 30 at Duke.
- Cannon also comes into the week with 873 career at bats, which also is first in UVa history. He recently passed Ryan Gilleland (1995-98) for first.
- Cannon has 60 career doubles and has broken the UVa career doubles record, previously set by Brandon Guyer (53, 2005-07). He needs one double to reach the ACC's career Top 25.
- He also is third in triples (12), fourth in hits (266), fifth in runs (175), sixth in total bases (368), eighth in stolen bases (48), ninth in walks (106) and 11th in HBP (19).

GOLDEN EYES

- Virginia's offense ranks 24th nationally with 263 bases on balls.
- Interestingly, the Cavaliers are just sixth in walks in the ACC – six ACC teams rank among the NCAA's top 25 in walks.
- FSU (2), Clemson (3), NC State (4), Georgia Tech (6), and UNC (8) also rank among the top 25.

DEFENSE REMAINS AMONG NATION'S BEST

- Through 55 games, Virginia has committed 47 errors – good for a .977 fielding percentage.
- UVa is second in the ACC in fielding and ninth nationally in fielding.
- The Cavaliers recorded a .972 fielding mark last year.
- The school record for fielding percentage is .975, set in 2005.

ARICO TIED FOR NATIONAL LEAD IN SAVES

- Kevin Arico leads all Division I pitchers in saves with 15 this season (in 18 attempts).
- He boasts 26 career saves – second in Virginia history and tied for eighth in ACC history with UNC's Derrick DePriest (1997-2000).
- Former Cavalier Casey Lambert (2004-07) is the ACC's all-time leader with 43 saves.
- Arico was named to the midseason watch list for the NCBWA Stopper of the Year Award, presented to the top relief pitcher in NCAA Division I baseball.

OFFENSE REVS UP IN SECOND

- Virginia has outscored its opponents 41-28 in the first inning this year, but the Cavaliers have exploded from there.
- UVa has outscored its opponents 59-17 in the second inning this year and 175-54 from the second through the fourth innings.
- Overall, Virginia is outscoring its opponents 455-210 this season.

NOTING THE 14-GAME WIN STREAK

- Virginia posted the seventh-longest winning streak in the country this season, 14 games, from April 20 to May 16; the streak was snapped last Thursday at Miami.
- Virginia hit .351, with 71 extra-base hits, including 44 doubles, in the streak.
- The team posted a 2.50 ERA during this stretch, walking just 32 while striking out 111. Opponents batted just .216 in the 14 games.
- UVa also stole 17 bases in 21 attempts – opponents were just 7-for-20 in that same 14-game span.
- Steven Proscia and John Hicks each had 18 RBI during the streak, while Phil Gosselin and Jarrett Parker had a team-high 21 hits each.

VIRGINIA RANKS 22ND NATIONALLY IN ATTENDANCE

- With a season average of 2,819 spectators per game, Virginia ranks 22nd nationally in attendance.
- UVa has drawn 93,040 fans this year (33 dates).
- Both totals easily are school records; UVa has obliterated the single-season attendance average record of 1,774, set in 2007.
- On April 6 vs. James Madison, UVa had its largest mid-week attendance ever with 2,521 spectators.
- UVa ranks fourth in attendance this season among ACC schools, behind Florida State, Clemson and Miami.

UVA SHATTERS ATTENDANCE RECORDS

- Virginia broke its three-game series attendance record again last weekend, as 13,294 fans came out for

- Over the final three home weekends, UVa drew 38,530 fans for series against Georgia Tech, Virginia Tech and North Carolina.
- UVa has had six sellouts this season, including a stadium-record crowd of 4,825 on May 16 vs. UNC.
- A record total of 93,040 fans have come out this year (33 dates) – the record was 65,661 in 2007 (37 dates).
- UVa has had 11 home crowds of more than 3,500 and averaged 3,801 for home ACC games.

IF YOU BUILD IT, THEY WILL COME

- Virginia has added 979 general admission bleacher seats down the right-field line this season.
- Nearly 600 new bleacher seats in right field were added for the UNC series (May 14-16), pushing the Davenport Field capacity to 4,825.
- Davenport Field started the season with a capacity of 3,600, and UVa has added seats on three occasions to push the capacity to 4,825.

VETERAN-LADEN CAVALIERS

- Virginia has one of its most experienced teams ever.
- The Cavaliers' returning position players have combined for 1,364 career starts, led by senior shortstop Tyler Cannon, who has started 228 games.
- Eleven players have started at least 50 career games apiece for UVa. Cannon, Dan Grovatt (170), Jarrett Parker (165), Phil Gosselin (157), Steven Proscia (118), John Hicks (112), Franco Valdes (110) and John Barr (100) each have made at least 100 career starts.

FRESHMEN PRODUCE WHILE WAITING TURN

- UVa's freshman infielders (Stephen Bruno, Reed Gragnani and Chris Taylor) have combined to go 77-for-209 (.368).
- Bruno is batting .392 and had a 15-game hit streak at one point this season.
- Gragnani is 11-for-25 in his last nine games.
- Taylor scored nine runs the week ending April 24 and had a career-high three hits out of the leadoff spot April 24 at Maryland.

BRUNO STREAK COMES TO HALT AT 15

- Stephen Bruno had his 15-game hit streak snapped April 16 vs. Virginia Tech.
- He batted .397 (23-for-58) during that stretch.
- It was the longest hit streak for a UVa freshman since Brandon Guyer recorded hits in 15 straight games in 2005.

MOST MARCH WINS EVER

- Virginia recorded one of its best months of March in program history.
- UVa won a school-record 16 games in March (16-3).
- It also is the third-best winning percentage for a UVa team in March (.842), behind only the 1967 (5-0) and 1971 (6-0) teams.

WAHOOS NOTCH FIRST SERIES WIN VS. FLORIDA STATE

- Virginia scored its first-ever series win against Florida State March 12-14, taking two of three games in Tallahassee.
- UVa was 0-for-14 in its previous three-game series with the Seminoles.
- It also marked the highest-ranked opponent that UVa has won a series against since March 17-18, 2007 at then-No. 1 North Carolina.

CAVALIERS EARN FIRST-EVER NO. 1 NATIONAL RANKING

- Virginia earned a No. 1 ranking from Baseball America and Rivals.com for six-consecutive weeks this season and has been back at No. 1 in the Baseball America rankings for the last five weeks.
- It marks the first No. 1 ranking in school history for Virginia Baseball.
- The baseball team becomes the 10th athletics program at Virginia to garner a No. 1 national ranking, joining men's basketball, women's basketball, field hockey, football, men's lacrosse, women's lacrosse, men's soccer, women's soccer and men's tennis.
- Virginia has had five teams ranked No. 1 this season – baseball, men's lacrosse, women's rowing, men's soccer and men's tennis.

UVA LEADS NATION IN ERA LAST FIVE YEARS

- Virginia led all NCAA Division I teams in ERA over the past five seasons, boasting a 3.13 team ERA.
- UVa ranked in the top 15 in the country in ERA each of the last six seasons, including No. 3 marks in 2005, 2006, 2007 and 2009.
- North Carolina is the only other team to rank among the top 15 nationally in ERA for the last six years.
- Virginia is the only team in Division I to rank among the top 20 nationally in ERA, strikeouts and fewest hits and walks allowed each of the last two years.

- The Cavaliers stole 119 bases in 145 attempts last year, as five players stole at least 13 bases apiece.

VERSATILITY KEY FOR CAVALIERS

- Much of the UVa's depth comes because of its versatility – several players could see action at a variety of positions.
- John Hicks and Kenny Swab each are athletic players who primarily are catchers but both will shift to first base and the outfield at times.
- Danny Hultzen will pitch and also is a strong first baseman and will DH as well, while Phil Gosselin could play at second or left field.
- Corey Hunt (INF) and Shane Halley (OF) each will pitch, but are great defensive players in the field as well.

CAVALIERS LOOK TO REPEAT

- The Cavaliers claimed their first ACC Baseball Championship since 1996 last year. UVa won the tournament title in '96.
- The sixth seed, UVa was the lowest-seeded team to ever win the ACC Baseball Championship.
- Virginia defeated Clemson, North Carolina (by run rule), Duke and Florida State in consecutive days to win the crown.
- Virginia had three representatives on the ACC All-Tournament Team, highlighted by tournament MVP Dan Grovatt (8-for-15, 3 2B, HR, 5 RBI).
- Franco Valdes (5 RBI) and Danny Hultzen (6.1 IP, .357 BA) also made the squad.
- Virginia's bullpen stepped up and was outstanding at the ACC Baseball Championship.
- The bullpen combined to throw 17.1 innings in the four games (1.67 ERA).
- The 'pen allowed only three earned runs, 11 hits and five walks while striking out 20.
- Tyler Wilson notched two wins, while Andrew Caraway picked up one.
- Kevin Arico saved two games and finished three.

STARTING LINEUP BACK IN TACT

- Virtually the entire offense returns from 2009, including everyone from the starting lineup.
- Almost all of the offensive production is back – 99 percent of the RBI-production returns, with 98.4 percent of the hit-producers (755 of 767) coming back.
- Virginia hit .327 last season – the Cavaliers' best mark since 1985 – and swatted 59 home runs – UVa's most since 2002.
- Dan Grovatt (.356), Jarrett Parker (.355) and Tyler Cannon (.351) led UVa in batting last year. UVa has nine regular starters back who hit at least .292 last year.

CAPTAIN OF THE WEEK

- Instead of naming team captains for the season, UVa has decided that all 35 players are responsible to take captain roles throughout the year.
- Each week, one player will be designated the team captain and don the captain's C on his jersey.

NO. 8 BOSTON COLLEGE 2010 (UVa 3-0)

- Virginia swept a three-game series with BC in Charlottesville March 19-21.
- UVa pitchers limited BC hitters to just five runs and 18 hits in the series.
- Phil Gosselin was 7-for-10 in the series, while Dan Grovatt went 4-for-10 and drove in six runs.
- Virginia pitchers posted a 1.67 ERA in the series, with starters Danny Hultzen, Robert Morey and Cody Winiarski combining for a 0.81 ERA while striking out 23 and walking just three
- Cody Winiarski (UVa's scheduled starter Wednesday) worked six innings to earn the Sunday win (ER, 3 H, 2 BB, 3 K).

ALL-TIME SERIES

- Virginia is 13-1 all-time against Boston College, with all the meetings coming since BC started ACC play in 2006.
- UVa has won all five series; BC won its first game against UVa last year in Chestnut Hill, although the Cavaliers won two of three in the series.
- This is the teams' first-ever meeting in the tournament.



NO. 4 MIAMI 2010 (UVa 2-1)
