VIRGINIA-CLEMSON SERIES

- Clemson leads the all-time series, 101-49, but UVa has held the edge of late.
- Since the current coaching staff started in 2004, Virginia has won 21 of its 25 games versus the Tigers.
- Virginia has won eight straight games in the series, its longest winning streak ever against Clemson.
- UVa swept Clemson last season in Charlottesville and scored two runs in the eighth inning to rally and win, 3-2, in the ACC tournament.

STARTERS SHINE IN FIRST MONTH

- Virginia's starting pitchers have excelled over the first four weeks of the season.
- UVa's starters own a 10-1 record and 1.53 ERA this year, while batters have hit just .229 against them, including only 11 extra-base hits.
- The Cavaliers racked up a streak of 42 2/3 consecutive scoreless innings which ran from Feb. 16-March 2.

OFFENSE SLOW AT FIRST, THEN GETS ROLLING

- While Virginia's offense has been strong this year, it typically takes a few innings for it to get going.
- Of UVa's 140 runs, 108 have come after the third inning (77 percent).
- The Cavaliers' most dominant innings: the fifth (outscored 26-3), seventh (23-6) and eighth (24-3).
- UVa averages 8.8 runs per game, outscoring its opponents 133-39, and has trailed after the sixth inning in just two games.

FRESHMEN PLAYING KEY ROLES

- Virginia has leaned heavily on its first-year players early this season, particularly on the mound.
- Eleven freshmen already have seen playing time – tied for 13th-most nationally and third among ACC teams (Clemson 13, Maryland 12, BC 11).
- Tennessee leads the nation with 17 freshmen who have played this year.
- Freshmen have accounted for 48.4 percent of the innings pitched this year (69 2/3 of 144 total).
- Joe McCarthy has started all 16 contests in the batting order.

ODDS AND ENDS

- UVa ranks second in the ACC in ERA (1.88) and batting (.313) and 10th in fielding (.962).
- UVa has surrendered just eight stolen base attempts this year (six SB).
- The Cavaliers are tied with Arizona for the national lead in triples.
- Virginia pitchers have issued the fewest walks in the ACC (36).
- Virginia's 14-0 start was its second-best opening to a year in program history (19-0 in 2009).

VIRGINIA SLOWS THE RUNNING GAME

- Virginia has shown the propensity to slow its opponents' running game this year.
- UVa has allowed just eight stolen base attempts in 16 games, with six successful steals.
- UVa pitchers also have picked off six baserunners.
- Last weekend UVa allowed three stolen bases to Maryland, which entered with 44 steals in 12 games.

VIRGINIA AMONG NATIONAL LEADERS IN RUNS

- Entering the week, Virginia was tied for 11th nationally in runs scored.

- With 133 runs scored in 15 games (8.8/game), Virginia was eighth nationally in scoring.
- The Cavaliers rank among the nation's top 20 in seven statistical categories on offense.

COGSWELL A FORCE AT TOP OF LINEUP

- Branden Cogswell has stepped into the leadoff slot in the batting order and been sensational in the first month of the year.
- He leads the team with a .392 batting average, 22 runs and .573 on-base percentage.
- Cogswell has struck out only three times in 78 plate appearances.

UVA TIED FOR NATIONAL LEAD IN SHUTOUTS

- Virginia has racked up five shutouts in its first 16 games, which is tied for the national lead.
- Florida Gulf Coast and NC State also have five shutouts.
- The total is already tied for sixth most in a season at Virginia.
- UVa finished with just two shutouts in 2012.

DOWNES ANCHORS LINEUP AT CLEANUP

- In his first year as the Cavaliers' cleanup hitter, Brandon Downes has started strong and is batting .338 with a .442 on base percentage.
- In 16 games he has three homers and 18 RBI; in 34 games (26 starts) last year, he posted one home run and 22 RBI.
- Downes also has scored 19 runs, one off of his 2012 mark, and leads the team with 11 extra-base hits, including four triples.

TOWNS MAKES EARLY MARK AS RUN PRODUCER

- Kenny Towns already has nearly doubled his 2012 RBI total (12) with a team-high 22 RBI in the first month of the season.
- He slugged two grand slams in the season opener at ECU, going yard in the first and seventh innings – both to the opposite field. They were his first career home runs.
- He added a 2-run homer to left field vs. William and Mary.

WADDELL DAZZLES IN FIRST THREE OUTINGS

- Rookie southpaw Brandon Waddell has been sensational in his first four starts. With 33 strikeouts this year, he tops all freshmen nationally.
- He was named one of Collegiate Baseball's six National Players of the Week on Feb. 25 following a dominating outing vs. Toledo.
- In six innings, he struck out 15 batters, most by a UVa freshman hurler since Seth Greisinger fanned 15 against UNC in 1994. He allowed just six hits and one walk.
- On Feb. 15 at ECU, Waddell became the first UVa freshman to make the opening-game start since Dave Sammons on Feb. 26, 1986, at William and Mary.

FIFTH-YEARS PROVIDE LEADERSHIP

- Virginia has a pair of veteran fifth-year seniors set to guide the young 2013 team: Jared King and Scott Silverstein.
- King has started 158 career games, with 139 career starts. His streak of 90 straight starts, dating to 2011, was snapped March 2 in the first game of the DH.
- Silverstein was the Cavaliers' Saturday starter for most of 2012 after battling back from a pair of shoulder surgeries.
- The two have been part of two ACC championship teams, three regional championship squads and two College World Series teams.

CHANGES AT DAVENPORT FIELD

- Davenport Field underwent several changes during the offseason.
- A new sand-based playing surface has been installed. After removing the previous surface, crews put in a new irrigation and field drainage system (previous field had no drainage system).
- The \$1 million project also included the installation of a new synthetic warning track that runs in foul territory between the foul poles as well as new dugout flooring surfaces and a new FieldTurf collar behind home plate.
- Home plate was moved in about five feet, creating more foul territory down the lines as well as new field dimensions: 332-370-404-370-332.
- In separate projects, new chairback seats were added to replace the grandstand bleachers and a new video board was erected.

A HOT TICKET AT DAVENPORT FIELD

- UVa fans continue to fill Davenport Field, as more than 110,000 fans have attended Cavalier games each of the past three seasons. UVa has ranked among the top 20 programs nationally in attendance each of the last three years.
- Despite the chilly temperatures, Virginia ranks 15th in total attendance (30,604) and 18th in average attendance (2,550) this year.
- UVa ranked 15th nationally in total attendance (112,281) and 19th in average attendance (3,208) last year.
- Davenport Field seats 4,980 per game, slightly down this year after the addition of more chairback seats in place of the bleacher seats in the grandstand.
- The entire reserved section in the grandstand is sold out once again this year.

O'CONNOR FOURTH AMONG ACTIVE COACHES IN WIN PERCENTAGE

- Virginia head coach Brian O'Connor is 426-150-2 (.738) in 10 seasons at the helm of the Cavaliers.
- O'Connor's 73.4 percent winning percentage entering the season ranked fourth among active Division I head coaches behind only UNC's Mike Fox (.744), Florida State's Mike Martin (.743) and Wichita State's Gene Stephenson (.735).

CAVALIERS BOAST SECOND-MOST WINS IN NATION SINCE 2009

- Virginia posted 195 wins from 2009-12 – second most in Division I baseball (South Carolina, 198).
- UVa set a school record with 49 wins in 2009, topped it in 2010 with 51 victories, then upped it again in 2011 with a national-best 56 wins.
- Jared King and Scott Silverstein are in their fifth years at UVa and have been part of this entire stretch.
