Third-Ranked Clemson, Fifth-Ranked Florida State Meet in Clemson in Primetime With GameDay North Carolina Hosts 10th-ranked Miami on ESPN Thursday Night Georgia Tech Hosts Syracuse; Duke-Virginia and Maryland-Wake Forest Square off in ACC Action

Passing the halfway point of the 2013 regular season, all eyes in the Atlantic Coast Conference and nationally will be in Clemson this Saturday, as the 3rd-ranked Tigers and 5th-ranked Florida State Seminoles face each other in the first meeting of ACC teams ranked in the nation's Top Five since Nov. 5, 2005...It is also just the fourth meeting of Top Five ACC teams in league history...The game will be nationally televised on ABC with an 8 pm kickoff...ESPN's GameDay makes its second appearance at Clemson this year, the first time that GameDay has visited the same campus twice in the first eight weeks of a season...Three ACC teams are ranked in the nation's Top 10 this week in No. 3 Clemson, No. 5 Florida State and No. 10 Miami, the first time the ACC has had three Top 10 teams since Oct. 30, 2005, when three league teams (3-VT, 5-Mia, 9-FSU) earned Top 10 rankings in both the AP and USA Today Coaches poll...The ACC is the only conference nationally to have three undefeated teams in Clemson (6-0), Florida State (5-0) and Miami (5-0)...The contest in Death Valley will match two of the top QBs in the nation

in Clemson senior **Tajh Boyd**, who is 8th nationally in pass efficiency, and Florida State redshirt freshman **Jameis Winston**, who ranks 2nd... The Tigers are coached by **Dabo Swinney**, while the Seminoles are led by coach **Jimbo Fisher**... This game marks the second straight year the Atlantic Division rivals have met ranked in the Top 10 and it is the 11th such meeting of ACC schools ranked in the nation's Top 10 (AP)...The winner of this game has produced the Atlantic Division representative in the Dr Pepper ACC Football Championship Game in each of the last four years...While the game with the Tigers and Seminoles concludes Week Eight, 10th-ranked Miami and Coastal Division foe North Carolina kick off the weekend on Thursday night, when Coach **Larry Fedora's** Tar Heels host the unbeaten Hurricanes at Kenan Stadium before a national TV audience (7:45 pm, ESPN)...UNC is led by junior **TE Eric Ebron** and **QB Bryn Renner** while Miami, coached by **Al Golden**, counters with a potent offensive attack led by **QB Stephen Morris** and big-play **RB Duke Johnson**... Mor-

ris is 9th nationally in pass efficiency (169.7) while Johnson is 4th nationally in all-purpose yards per game (190.8), 10th in kickoff return average (30.5) and 13th in rushing yards per game (113.4/gm)...Miami has the best winning percentage of any ACC school on ESPN Thursday Nights (16-3, .842), while North Carolina is 6-5...In Atlanta, a pair of ground-oriented football teams will face each other when Syracuse visits Georgia Tech for the first time at Bobby Dodd Stadium (12:30 pm, ACC Network)...The Orange, coached by **Scott Shafer** and led by the twin TB tandem of **Jerome Smith** and **Prince-Tyson Gulley**, face the Yellow Jackets, coached by Paul Johnson and led by **BB David Sims** and **QB Vad Lee**... Georgia Tech ranks 6th nationally in rushing offense (290.3 yds/gm) and Syracuse is 22nd (220.7), but the Orange are coming off a 362-yard effort in a win last week over NC State, their first ACC triumph and inaugural conference win on the road...Maryland (5-1), one

of five ACC teams with five or more victories, faces another Atlantic Division test when the Terrapins travel to Winston-Salem, N.C., to meet the Wake Forest Demon Deacons in a nationally televised game at BB&T Field (3:30 pm; ESPN)...The Terrapins, coached by **Randy Edsall**, and led by the wide receiver combination of **Stefon Diggs** and **Deon Long**, received a 332-yard passing effort by backup **QB Caleb Rowe** in its win over Virginia...Maryland is looking to achieve bowl eligibility for the first time since 2010...The Demon Deacons, coached by **Jim Grobe**, are led by **QB Tanner Price** and **WR Michael Campanaro**, the ACC's leading pass receiver (8.8 catches/gm)...Wake is one of five ACC teams with 3-3 records this week that is looking to write a positive second half to their season...In Charlottesville, Va., Coastal Division rivals Duke and Virginia will collide at Scott Stadium (3:30 pm; Regional Sports Networks)...The Blue Devils, coached by **David Cutcliffe** and led by **QB Anthony Boone** and **WR Jamison Crowder**, will be meeting the Cavaliers for the 65th time in a series in which Duke has recently held the upper hand, winning four of the last five meetings...Boone recently returned from an injury which forced him to miss three game and threw for 295 yards in a win over Navy... Virginia, coached by **Mike London**, and led by **QB David Watford** and **RB Kevin Parks**, is looking to get back on the winning track after dropping three straight, including a one-point heartbreaker to Maryland last Saturday.... Parks ranks third in the ACC in rushing, averaging 85.0 yards per game and has topped the 100-yard mark in three of his six games...Finally, Pitt steps out of conference to host Old Dominion this Saturday at Heinz Field in Pittsburgh (7 pm, Regional Sports Networks)...The Panthers are coached by Paul Chryst and are led by **DT Aaron Donald**, **WRs Devin Street** and **Tyler Boyd** and **QB Tim Savage**...Donald leads the nation in quarterback sacks per game (1.6) and tackles for loss (2.4)...Street ranks 2nd in the ACC in yards per game (109.8) and Boyd is 7th (89.0), while Savage is 4th in the league in passing yards per game (247.6)... The Monarchs of ODU, who are transitioning to the FBS this year, are coached by **Bobby Wilder** and led by **QB Taylor Heinicke**, who has completed 70 percent of his passes in his career for over 9,500 yards and 83 TDs.

ACC Is Only Conference With Three Undefeated Teams

The Atlantic Coast Conference is the only conference in the FBS to have three unbeaten teams at this stage of the season. Heading into the final half of the year, Clemson (6-0), Florida State (5-0) and Miami (5-0) are all unbeaten.

ACC Features Top Five Matchup For Fourth Time in League History

For only the fourth time in league history, the ACC will see a clash of two league teams ranked in the nation's Top Five when 3rd-ranked Clemson hosts 5th-ranked Florida State this Saturday at Memorial Stadium. It's the first meeting of Top Five ACC teams since Nov. 5, 2005, when No. 3 Virginia Tech hosted 5th-ranked Miami. The other top five meetings occurred in 2004 (#5 Miami d. #4 FSU in Miami) and 1997 (#3 FSU d. #5 North Carolina in Chapel Hill).

ACC Has Three AP Top 10 Teams

In this week's Associated Press poll, for the first time since Oct. 30, 2005, three ACC teams are ranked among the nation's Top 10 in No. 3 Clemson, No. 5 Florida State and No. 10 Miami. Eight years ago, AP and the USA Today Coaches poll ranked Virginia Tech No. 3, Miami No. 5 and Florida State No. 9.

First Back-to-Back Top 10 Matchups for ACC Teams

This week's game between No. 3 Clemson and No. 5 Florida State marks the first time in ACC history two teams have played each other in back-to-back years and have been ranked in the nation's Top 10 on each occasion. Florida State (4th) and Clemson (10th), were both ranked in the AP's Top 10 last year when they met in Tallahassee.

GameDay Makes Record Return to Tigertown

For the second time this season and for the first time in the history of ESPN's GameDay, the show is headed back to a campus for the second time in the first eight weeks of a season. GameDay was on hand when Clemson, then ranked 8th nationally, opened the year with a dramatic 38-35 win over then 5th-ranked Georgia. This marks the third time Clemson has hosted GameDay, as the Tigers welcomed the GameDay crew on Oct. 21, 2006 as Clemson prepared to play Georgia Tech.

Donald Leads Nation in Sacks, Tackles for Loss

Pitt **DT Aaron Donald** has been a consistently disruptive force for the Panthers in their defensive front this year. Donald leads the ACC and the nation in quarterback sacks (1.6/gm) and tackles for loss (2.4/gm).

Three ACC QBs Rank In Top 10 Pass Efficiency Leaders

Three ACC signal callers rank in the top 10 nationally among pass efficiency leaders. Florida State record freshman **Jameis Winston** is 2nd nationally with a 213.9 rating, trailing only Bryce Petty of Baylor (230.6). **Tajh Boyd** of Clemson ranks 8th (172.0) while Miami's **Stephen Morris** is 10th (169.7). Additionally, **C.J. Brown** of Maryland is 12th (166.0) nationally while Duke's **Brandon Connette** is 20th (158.2).

2013 ACC FB Game Summaries -- Oct. 12

Clemson 24, Boston College 14

The third-ranked Tigers turned back a determined upset bid by the visiting Eagles and set up this Saturday night's Atlantic Division showdown with fellow unbeaten and nationally-ranked Florida State. The Tigers (6-0, 3-0) did not lead for good until QB Tajh Boyd's 6-yard touchdown early in the fourth quarter put them in front 17-14. The insurance score came with 12:42 to play, when LB Tony Steward sacked Boston College QB Chase Rettig and forced a fumble, and DE Vic Beasley scooped up the ball and returned it 13 yards for a touchdown. Clemson WR Sammy Watkins had seven receptions for 101 yards, including a 48-yard touchdown strike from Boyd in the third quarter that gave the Tigers their first lead of the day at 10-7. Rettig finished 13-of-21 passing for 192 yards, including a 69-yard touchdown pass to Alex Amidon that gave Boston College a 14-10 lead with 6:40 remaining in the third quarter. Amidon finished with six catches for 121 yards, and RB Myles Willis added a 38-yard touchdown run for the Eagles (3-3, 1-2).

Syracuse 24, NC State 10

The Orange claimed its first ACC victory at NC State on Saturday. Syracuse (3-3, 1-1) dominated the run game, tallying 362 yards on the ground. RBs Jerome Smith and Prince-Tyson Gulley each had big days, with Smith rushing for 140 yards and Gulley right behind him with 132. Both scored a touchdown and each had a run of more than 55 yards. It marked the first time the Orange have had two 100-plus yard backs since the 2012 Pinstripe Bowl, when the same duo accomplished the feat. Syracuse QB Terrel Hunt completed 10 of 20 passes for 74 yards and rushed for 92 yards and a touchdown. Two Orange defenders had career days with LB Cameron Lynch posting a career- and game-high 14 take downs, including two tackles for a loss of 12 yards. FS Durell Eskridge made a career-high 13 stops and snagged an interception, which he returned for 32 yards. NC State (3-3, 0-3) had passing attempts from four different players. QB Pete Thomas completed 17 of his 35 attempts for 151 yards and a touchdown. WR Bryan Underwood led the Wolfpack receivers, catching six passes for 89 yards.

Virginia Tech 19, Pitt 9

Virginia Tech's defense recorded eight sacks and kicker Cody Journell hit four field goals to lift the 24th-ranked Hokies past Pitt in Saturday afternoon's game at Lane Stadium. Tech (6-1, 3-0) snapped a four-game series losing streak to the Panthers (3-2, 2-2) and continued its hot start to this season. The Hokies have now won nine of their past 10 games dating back to last season and six straight after dropping their season opener to No. 1 Alabama in Atlanta. Virginia Tech's eight sacks in Saturday's game were the program's the second-most in 27 years under head coach Frank Beamer (nine vs. Pittsburgh, 1999). The Hokies limited Pitt to 23 yards on the ground and 210 yards total. DE Dadi Nicolas recorded three of Virginia Tech's sacks, DT Derrick Hopkins had two, and QB Logan Thomas' 27 yard strike to TE Calvin Cline accounted for the Hokies' lone touchdown. Pitt's scoring came on PK Chris Blewitt's 47-yard field goal in the waning seconds of the first half and QB Tom Savage's 9-yard touchdown run with 2:10 to play.

Maryland 27, Virginia 26

QB Caleb Rowe, starting in place of injured C.J. Brown, threw for 332 yards and hit tight end Dave Stinebaugh for the go-ahead score with 5:14 left to lead the Terrapins (5-1, 1-1). Maryland held on for the win when Virginia PK Alec Vozenilek's 42-yard field goal attempt sailed wide right with 10 seconds remaining. Maryland RB Brandon Ross ran for 88 yards and a pair of touchdowns, one of which was set up by his 77-yard pass reception. QB David Watford completed 27-of-44 passes for 263 yards and a score, and TE Jake McGee had eight catches for 114 yards for Cavaliers (2-4, 0-2) lost three straight. RB Kevin Parks ran for 112 yards and a touchdown, and RB Khalek Shepherd contributed 81 yards rushing to an offense that came up short despite finishing with 505 total yards.

Duke 35, Navy 7

Redshirt junior QB Anthony Boone completed 31-of-38 passes for a career-high 295 yards and three touchdowns to lead Duke (4-2) in his first game back from injury. Four different Duke players registered touchdowns, while the Blue Devil defense forced Navy into a season-high three turnovers. Junior WR Jamison Crowder led all receivers with 10 catches for 88 yards, and sophomore running back Jela Duncan led a balanced ground game with 45 yards from nine carries. Three different Duke receivers had at least five catches, while six had three-plus on the afternoon. Defensively, the Blue Devils held the Midshipmen to 73 yards and only five first downs in the second half. The 319 total yards by Navy (3-2) were the fewest by a Duke opponent since Memphis managed just 237 on Sept. 7. The Memphis game was also the one in which Boone suffered a broken collarbone, an injury that kept him on the sidelines for three full games.

BYU 38, Georgia Tech 20

QB Taysom Hill threw for 244 yards and one touchdown, and three players added rushing touchdowns for BYU (4-2). LB Iona Pritchard added a 51-yard interception return for the homestanding Cougars. QB Vad Lee scored Georgia Tech's first touchdown on a 2-yard keeper in the first quarter. Backup QB Justin Thomas finished 3-of-3 for 25 yards, including a 5-yard scoring toss to AB Deon Hill with just under a minute remaining in the game. Defensively, Georgia Tech (3-3) saw NT Adam Gotsis register a pair of sack and four total tackles for loss totaling minus-19 yards.

ACC Notes By The Numbers

Undefeated - The ACC is the only conference nationally to have three teams that are undefeated this season. **Clemson (6-0)**, **Florida State (5-0)** and **Miami (5-0)** all enter the week with spotless records.

.783 - The winning percentage for Florida State head coach **Jimbo Fisher**, now in his fourth season as head coach of the Seminoles. Fisher is 10-4 (.714) against ACC foes on the road.

.842 - The winning percentage for **Miami** when it plays in Thursday night games nationally televised by ESPN. The Hurricanes have a 16-3 overall record on Thursday nights, including a 5-2 mark on the road. The Hurricanes play at UNC this Thursday night.

.900 - The winning percentage for Clemson in home ACC football games under current head coach **Dabo Swinney**. The Tigers are 18-2 against league foes in the cozy (or uncozy) confines of Memorial Stadium.

.939 - Clemson **PK Chris Catanzaro** has made 31 of his last 33 field goal attempts, a .939 percentage. He had a school-record string of 20 field goal attempts without a miss in 2012.

1.60 - The average number of sacks per game by Pitt **NT Aaron Donald**. Donald leads the nation not only in sacks per game but also leads the nation in tackles for loss, averaging 2.40 tackles for loss per game.

1.71 - Virginia Tech senior **CB Kyle Fuller** leads the ACC and ranks 9th nationally in passes defended. Fuller has deflected 10 passes and intercepted 2 in 7 games, an average of 1.71 per game

3 - The **ACC** had three teams chosen for this week's Top 10 in the Associated Press poll in 3rd-ranked Clemson, 5th-ranked Florida State and 10th-ranked Miami. That marked the first time since Oct. 30, 2005 (VT-3, Mia.-5, FSU-9) that the league has placed three teams in the Top 10 of the AP poll.

4 - The number of **ACC teams** ranked in the Top 10 in the country in scoring defense. **Florida State** is 3rd in the nation allowing just 12.0 points per game. The Seminoles are followed by **Virginia Tech** (7th, 15.0), **Miami** (9th, 16.0) and **Clemson** (10th, 16.2).

4th - Saturday's meeting between No. 3 **Clemson** and No. 5 **Florida State** is the 4th in ACC history involving ACC teams that were both ranked in the nation's Top Five by the Associated Press poll.

6 - Boston College senior **RB Andre Williams** is 6th nationally in rushing yardage per game. Williams, who became the first ACC running back with multiple 200-yard games in the same season since Virginia Tech's Brandon Ore did it in 2006, is averaging 139.7 yards per game after rushing for 204 yards against Wake Forest and 263 versus Army.

6.81 - The average career yards per carry for Miami sophomore **RB Duke Johnson**. Johnson, who had 184 yards on just 22 carries (8.4) in Miami's win over Georgia Tech. Johnson's per-carry average would be the 7th-best in ACC history.

8.8 - Wake Forest senior **WR Michael Campanaro** leads the ACC and ranks 6th nationally in pass receptions per game. Campanaro, who moved into a tie for 7th place with Clemson's DeAndre Hopkins on the ACC career receptions list, now has 206 career catches.

9 - Clemson junior **DE Vic Beasley** has 9 sacks in six games for Clemson and leads the ACC in total sacks. In his last 12 games, including the final six games of 2012, he has made 15 sacks.

11 - Clemson junior **WR Sammy Watkins** recorded the 11th 100-yard performance in his career last Saturday with a seven-catch, 101-yard, 1 TD performance against Boston College. Watkins has topped 100 receiving yards in four of Clemson's six games this year, including efforts against 5th-ranked Georgia (127) and Wake Forest (113) and just missing against NC State (96).

11.5 - The number of tackles for loss for Wake Forest senior **NG Nikita Whitlock** which leads the ACC. Whitlock has 11.5 tackles for loss in 6 games, a 1.92 average. Pitt **NT Aaron Donald** leads the ACC in tackles for loss per game, averaging 2.40 per contest.

83.08 - The pass efficiency defense rating for **Miami**. The Hurricanes lead the nation in pass efficiency defense and fewest passing yards allowed per game (141.4).

88.6% - The completion percentage for Clemson's backup QB junior **Cole Stoudt**. The Dublin, Ohio junior has completed 31 of 35 passes this season in relief of Tajh Boyd for 238 yards, 4 TDs, no interceptions and a pass efficiency rating of 183.41.

145 - The number of pass receiving yards that Boston College senior **WR Alex Amidon** needs to become the all-time leading receiver in Eagle history. Amidon, who had 121 receiving yards against 3rd-ranked Clemson last week for his 10th career 100-yard game, has 2,315 career receiving yards and trails only Kelvin Martin (2,337, 1983-86), Pete Mitchell (2,388/1991-94) and Rich Gunnell (2,459, 2006-09) on the BC career receiving yards list.

153.10 - The pass efficiency rating for Boston College senior **QB Chase Rettig**, one of the most improved players in the Atlantic Coast Conference this year. Rettig entered the 2013 season with a career rating of just 111.86 and a pass completion percentage of just 53.4. This year, he is completing 63.8 percent of his passes. That's an increase of over 10 percent.

153.12 - Clemson's **Tajh Boyd** has pushed his career pass efficiency rating to 153.12, which, if maintained would be an ACC career mark. Florida State's Chris Weinke set the ACC standard in 2000, when he finished with a 151.15 rating.

159.0 - The number of all-purpose yards per game for Duke **WR Jamison Crowder**. Crowder is 2nd in the ACC in pass receptions per game (7.8), 3rd in pass receiving yards per game (103.0), leads the ACC in punt return average (17.5) and is 2nd in the ACC in all-purpose yards per game.

164 - The number of passing yards Clemson **QB Tajh Boyd** needs to become only the third player in ACC history to throw for 10,000 or more yards in his career. Boyd, who has thrown for 9,836 yards is currently 4th on the ACC career list trailing only NC State's Philip Rivers (13,484), Duke Thaddeus Lewis (10,065) and Florida State's Chris Weinke (9,839).

213.9 - The pass efficiency rating for Florida State redshirt freshman **QB Jameis Winston**. Winston has recorded the fourth-best pass efficiency rating this century for a quarterback in his team's first five games of a season (minimum 15 attempts per game). This season, Winston ranks 2nd nationally only to Baylor's Bryce Petty (230.6). Winston's rating trails only that of Petty, Russell Wilson (216.9, Wisconsin, 2011) and David Johnson (214.8, Tulsa, 2008) and is just ahead of Robert Griffin, III (212.9, Baylor, 2011).

264 - Virginia Tech head coach **Frank Beamer** has a total of 264 coaching victories in his career and leads all active NCAA FBS head coaches. Beamer is in 6th place on the NCAA FBS all-time wins list. The late Joe Paterno (298) is next on the list.

272 - The number of rushing yards that Syracuse **RBs Jerome Smith** and **Prince-Tyson Gulley** combined for in the Orange's 24-10 win over NC State. Smith ran for 140 yards on 19 carries and a TD, while Gulley had 132 yards on just 9 carries (14.7 avg.) and a TD as Syracuse claimed its first Atlantic Coast Conference win as well as its first ACC road win.

332 - The number of passing yards for Maryland sophomore **QB Caleb Rowe** who led the Terrapins to a 27-26 win over Virginia as he filled in for starter C.J. Brown. In his only two games as a starter, including against Boston College last year as a true freshman, Rowe has completed 41 of 76 passes for 572 yards and 3 TDs.

The ACC & ESPN Thursday Night: A Great College and ACC Tradition

When North Carolina hosts Miami this Thursday night (7:45 p.m.) at Kenan Stadium in Chapel Hill, the game will be the 87th contest involving an ACC team on ESPN on Thursday night. It will also mark the 12th appearance for North Carolina and the 20th for Miami on the ESPN Thursday night package.

The game marks the first time the two teams have played on ESPN's Thursday night. It also marks the second time North Carolina has hosted a Thursday night contest at Kenan Stadium.

North Carolina has posted a 6-5 record on ESPN Thursday night, including an impressive, 5-4 record on the road. The Tar Heels dropped their only previous Thursday night game in Chapel Hill, a 30-27 thriller to Florida State in 2009.

Miami comes into this week's game with the highest winning percentage (.842) of any ACC team on ESPN Thursdays, having posted a 16-3 mark, including a 5-2 record on the road. The Hurricanes have been better at home, posting a 11-1 mark in the Old Orange Bowl (8-0) and at Sun Life Stadium (3-1). The only UM loss came in 2011, when Virginia snapped the Canes' 10-game home win streak with a 28-21 verdict.

Georgia Tech has hosted more games than any other ACC school, a total of 19. The Yellow Jackets actually began the Conference's Thursday night tradition, which, more often than not, has featured high drama. Tech hosted Virginia on Sept. 19, 1991, at Bobby Dodd Stadium in Atlanta, utilizing a 34-yard field goal by Scott Sisson on the game's final play to record a 24-21 victory.

The Yellow Jackets are 11-15 overall, Virginia Tech has the second-best record and the most wins on ESPN Thursdays, with a 20-7 record overall, including a 9-3 mark on the road. The Hokies have won more ESPN Thursday night road games than any other ACC school.

In all, after this week's game, ACC teams will have made 149 appearances on ESPN's Thursday night package.

After the Hokies and Yellow Jackets, Miami and NC State lead in total appearances, each with 19, followed by Maryland (13), Boston College (12), Florida State (12), Virginia (12), Clemson (12) and North Carolina (11).

There have been many other great moments in the series, including the 2007 game when 2nd-ranked Boston College rallied to beat 8th-ranked Virginia Tech, 14-10, behind a pair of touchdown passes from QB Matt Ryan in the game's final two minutes and 11 seconds. That game still stands as

the only ESPN Thursday night meeting of ACC opponents that were both ranked in the Top Ten nationally.

The 2009 season featured a pair of thrillers both involving North Carolina. The Tar Heels and Seminoles were involved in an offensive gut-wrencher, as FSU overcame a 24-6 third quarter deficit to capture a 30-27 triumph. A week later, UNC turned the tables, upsetting 14th-ranked Virginia Tech, 20-17, on the game's final play, a 22-yard field goal by UNC placekicker Casey Barth.

The 2010 match-up between Georgia Tech and Virginia Tech was also a classic; a see-saw battle which featured a dramatic 90-yard kickoff return for a touchdown by the Hokies' David Wilson with 2:23 remaining as the deciding play.

Perhaps the most memorable Thursday night moment and biggest upset on the Thursday night ESPN package was 24th-ranked Virginia's dramatic upset of 2nd-ranked Florida State in 1995. That game snapped the Seminoles' 29-game Conference winning streak, which began when FSU joined the ACC in 1992.

Miami still has claim to the highest-rated game on Thursday night, when it met 10th-ranked Houston in an early season showdown in 1991. The Hurricanes and Cougars drew a 6.5 national rating as Miami took a lopsided 40-10 triumph.

The highest-rated Thursday ESPN battle between two ACC teams was the 1995 Virginia-Florida State telecast, which resulted in a 6.1 rating.

This week's game is the fourth of five ACC Thursday ESPN contests this year. North Carolina lost to 6th-ranked South Carolina, 27-10 on Aug. 29; Clemson downed NC State, 26-14, on Sept. 19 and Virginia Tech edged Georgia Tech, 17-10, on Sept. 26 in Atlanta. Georgia Tech then travels to Clemson on Nov. 14 for the second 2013 Thursday night appearance by both the Yellow Jackets and Tigers.

Two ACC games have been televised by ESPNU on Thursday night. Wake Forest hosted Vanderbilt in 2005 and Clemson and Temple met in Charlotte in 2006.

Virginia Tech's Frank Beamer Is NCAA FBS Active Career Leader in Wins

Virginia Tech's **Frank Beamer** is now the leading active head coach in the NCAA's FBS in career victories with a total of 264 triumphs in his 33-year coaching career. With a win over Rutgers in last year's Russell Athletics Bowl, Beamer passed former BYU head coach LaVell Edwards for 6th place on the all-time NCAA FBS coaching victory list. Penn State's Joe Paterno, with an NCAA adjusted total of 298, is next on the list in 5th place. Georgia Tech head coach Paul Johnson ranks 13th on the active FBS list with 150 career wins. Former Florida State head coach Bobby Bowden, who retired after the 2009 season, is now the NCAA FBS all-time leader with 377 victories.

Golden, London, Grobe Have Virginia Ties

Three current ACC head football coaches

have ties to Virginia in Miami head coach Al Golden, Uva head coach Mike London and Wake Forest head coach Jim Grobe. Golden served as defensive coordinator under former Uva head coach Al Groh at Virginia for five seasons from 2001-2005. London, served two terms as an assistant coach at Uva under Groh. London was an assistant in Charlottesville from 2001 through 2004, then returned as defensive coordinator during the 2006 and 2007 seasons. Grobe is actually a Virginia graduate, a two-year starter for the Cavaliers under former head coach Sonny Randall, and a former member of the 1974 All-ACC Academic team.

Golden served as defensive coordinator under former Uva head coach Al Groh at Virginia for five seasons from 2001-2005. London, served two terms as an assistant coach at Uva under Groh. London was an assistant in Charlottesville from 2001 through 2004, then returned as defensive coordinator during the 2006 and 2007 seasons. Grobe is actually a Virginia graduate, a two-year starter for the Cavaliers under former head coach Sonny Randall, and a former member of the 1974 All-ACC Academic team.

Now in his fourth season as head coach at Florida State, head coach **Jimbo Fisher** has already joined some select company among ACC football coaches. Fisher has compiled a 36-10 record (.783). His winning percentage has him in 3rd place among all ACC head coaches after four seasons, ahead of such prominent figures as NC State's Lou Holtz, Clemson's Danny Ford, Maryland's Ralph Friedgen and Georgia Tech's Bobby Ross. The best mark recorded by an ACC head coach in his first three years in the league was by Fisher's predecessor at FSU, Bobby Bowden, who posted a 45-5-1 record (.892). Virginia Tech's Frank Beamer has the 2nd-best record at 42-11-0 (.792), followed by Fisher and Clemson's Danny Ford (.772).

Clemson's Memorial Stadium Is Home Sweet Home for Tiger's Dabo Swinney



Clemson head coach **Dabo Swinney** has enjoyed coaching in the cozy and imposing confines of the Tigers' home field, also known as Death Valley. Now in his sixth season as head coach of the Tigers, Swinney's teams won 18 of the first 20 home ACC games, a winning percentage of .900. That is the best among ACC coaches who have coached a minimum of four seasons. He is just ahead of former Tiger coach Ken Hatfield, who posted a 12-1-1 mark in four seasons (.893). Legendary Florida State coach Bobby Bowden won more ACC home games than any other coach, with 62 triumphs in his 18 years in the league. His winning percentage of .861, is third-best. Bowden's successor at Florida State, Jimbo Fisher is on a pretty good pace himself, having won 11 of his first 13 ACC home games. Four Clemson coaches rank in the Top 10 including Swinney (1st), Hatfield (2nd), Danny Ford (7th) and the legendary Frank Howard (tied for 9th).

North Carolina Sets Offensive Records In First Year Under Larry Fedora

North Carolina Head Coach **Larry Fedora's** fast-paced offense had his team scoring at a school-record pace in his first year in Chapel Hill. UNC ranked 8th nationally in scoring offense in 2012, averaging 40.6 points a game while also ranked 14th nationally in total offense,

■ In Fedora's first 17 games as head coach at UNC, North Carolina has topped the 40-point mark 7 times.

■ Also, in his first 17 games, UNC has topped the 30-point mark on 11 occasions.

■ In his first 17 games at UNC, the Tar Heels have gained 400 or more yards of total offense 14 times.

■ UNC set school records in 2012 for most points, highest scoring average and highest average of total offense (485.6).

■ UNC's 487 total points in 2012 were the 7th-highest single-season total in ACC history.



NC State's New Head Coach Dave Doeren Among Nation's Winningest Coaches in 2011-12

New NC State Head Coach, **Dave Doeren**, who led the Wolfpack to a 3-3 record in his six games as State's head coach and now is 26-7 overall, has not wasted time in winning games in his first two years as a head coach at the FBS level. In fact, only one other coach in the Football Bowl Subdivision--Alabama's Nick Saban--has won more games than has Doeren in the past two seasons. He guided Northern Illinois to a 23-4 mark in 2011 and 2012, including the school's first berth in the BCS bowl game, a slot in the 2013 Discover Orange Bowl this past January. Only Saban, among current FBS coaches, posted more wins in the past two years than Doeren's teams at Northern Illinois. In all, three current ACC Coaches rank among the Top 11 coaches nationally in wins among current college coaches th past two years. Both Florida State's Jimbo Fisher and Clemson's Dabo Swinney have 21 wins in 2011 and 2012, tying Kansas State's Bill Snyder for the 8th.



Duke Experiencing Success Under ACC Coach of the Year David Cutcliffe

With a 4-2 start to the 2013 season, David Cutcliffe, the ACC's 2012 Coach of the Year, has led the Blue Devils to 24 victories since coming to Durham in 2008. That may not sound like a great record, except when you consider that it is more wins than the Blue Devils totalled in the 12 seasons before Cutcliffe came to Durham. Cutcliffe led the Blue Devils to a 6-7 mark in 2012, their first appearance in a bowl game since 1994 and came within a few yards of claiming the Blue Devils' first winning season in 18 years and their first bowl triumph since 1961.

■ In the five-plus years that Cutcliffe has been in Durham, he has already mentored a pair of quarterbacks who finished their careers ranked in the ACC's top seven of career passing yardage. **Thaddeus Lewis** (2006-09) threw for 10,065 yards, the second-highest total in league history and **Sean Renfree** (2009-12), threw for 9,465 career yards, the 7th-best total by an ACC player.

■ Also, under his guidance, Duke **WR Conner Vernon** became the all-time leading pass receiver in ACC history setting conference career marks for pass receptions (283) and pass reception yardage (3,749).

Grobe led his 2006 Wake Forest squad to the ACC championship.



ACC Announces 2013 Football Championship Game Legends Class

National Football Foundation College Hall of Famers

Terry Kinard, Tom Scott, Floyd Little and Johnny Majors;

ACC 50th Anniversary Team Members Kinard and Boomer Esiason Headline 2013 Class

Led by four members of the National Football Foundation and College Hall of Fame and two members of the Atlantic Coast Conference's prestigious 50th Anniversary team, the ACC has announced the 2013 Class of Legends for its 9th Annual Dr Pepper Football Championship Game, which will be played in Charlotte, N.C. on December 7.

Leading this year's class are former Maryland quarterback **Boomer Esiason (East Islip, N.Y.)**, Clemson safety **Terry Kinard (Sumter, S.C.)**, Virginia defensive end **Tom Scott (Baltimore, Md.)**, Syracuse running back **Floyd Little (New Haven, Conn.)** and former Pitt head coach **Johnny Majors (Lynchburg, Tenn.)**.

Esiason and Kinard were both chosen in 2003 to be members of the ACC's 50th Anniversary team, which honored the 50 best players of the league's first 50 years, while Kinard, Scott, Little and Majors are members of the National Football Foundation and College Football Hall of Fame.

The Legends will be honored during this year's Dr Pepper ACC Football Championship Game weekend. They will be honored at the ACC Night of Legends sponsored by the Belk Bowl on Friday, Dec. 6, and on Dec. 7, during ceremonies at Bank of America Stadium for the 9th Annual Dr Pepper ACC Football Championship, which will be nationally televised with either a 7:45 pm (ESPN) or 8 p.m. (ABC) kickoff.

The group of 15 former gridiron standouts from current ACC schools includes a former ACC Football Player of the Year; 10 former All-Americans, including six first-team All-America honorees; and 12 players who combined for 97 years in the National Football League. Twelve of the Legends were drafted into the NFL, including six first- or second-round draft choices.

In all, the collection of players combined for two national championships, five ACC Championships and one Super Bowl title.

Joining the aforementioned selections are Boston College running back **Mike Cloud (Portsmouth, R.I.)**, who ended his collegiate career in 1998 as the Eagles' all-time leading rusher with 3,597 yards; Duke halfback and end **Wes Chesson (Edenton, N.C.)**, who ended his career with nine 100-yard receiving games, at the time the most in ACC history; Florida State guard **Jamie**

Dukes (Orlando, Fla.), a consensus first-team All-America for the Seminoles in 1985; and Georgia Tech tailback **"Rambling" Robert Lavette (Cartersville, Ga.)**, who is still the leading career rusher in Yellow Jacket history with 4,066 yards.

Completing the ACC Football Legends Class of 2013 are Miami's **Edgerrin James (Immokalee, Fla.)**, one of the most successful running backs in Hurricane history; North Carolina's **Ken Willard (Richmond, Va.)**, a second-team All-America fullback for the Tar Heels; NC State's famed Buckeye twins, **Dave Buckey (Akron, Ohio)**, an All-ACC quarterback, and **Don Buckey (Akron)**, an All-ACC wide receiver, who keyed the Wolfpack's football resurgence in the 1970s under then head coach Lou Holtz; Virginia Tech wide receiver **Andre' Davis (Niskayuna, N.Y.)**, a first-team All-America and explosive performer who was one of the leaders of Tech's 2000 team which reached the BCS National Championship Game; and Wake Forest quarterback **Jay Venuto (Salem, N.J.)**, the 1979 ACC Player of the Year who led the Deacons to wins over three nationally-ranked foes that year.

Esiason (1981-83), one of the most successful quarterbacks in Maryland and ACC history, led the Terrapins to the 1983 ACC Championship and back-to-back bowl game appearances (1982-83) under then head coach Bobby Ross. Named a second-team All-America by The Sporting News in 1983, Esiason set 17 school records during his collegiate career, completing 461 of 850 passes for 6,259 yards and 42 touchdowns. He was the first quarterback selected in the 1984 NFL Draft, chosen in the 2nd round by the Cincinnati Bengals. He enjoyed a 14-year NFL career, the first nine with the Bengals, three seasons with the New York Jets and one year at Arizona. He led Cincinnati to Super Bowl XXIII and was named to the Pro Bowl four times, an All-Pro twice, and in 1988 was honored as MVP of the National Football League. He ended his career as perhaps the best left-handed quarterback in league history, completing 57 percent of his passes for 37,920 yards with 247 touchdowns. Following the conclusion of his professional career, Esiason has appeared in a variety of television programs, has hosted both the 1998 Miss America Pageant and

CBS' Thanksgiving Day parade coverage and served as the color commentator on ABC's Monday Night Football. He is currently a studio analyst for The NFL Today on CBS, is a color analyst for Westwood One's radio broadcasts of Monday Night Football and co-hosts a long-running and top-rated morning radio show, "Boomer and Carton," on WFAN the Fan in New York City. In 1993, after his son Gunnar was diagnosed with cystic fibrosis, Esiason created the Boomer Esiason Foundation, which has raised in excess of \$100 million to fund research to find a cure for the disease of the respiratory and digestive systems. In 1995, he was honored with the NFL's Walter Payton Man of the Year Award for his community service. Originally a native of East Islip, N.Y., he currently lives in Plandome, N.Y.

Kinard (1979-82), one of the leaders of Clemson's 1981 National Championship team, was a two-time first-team All-America safety who earned unanimous All-America honors in 1982. Named the CBS National Defensive Player of the Year in 1982, Kinard was also selected to the USA Today All-College Football team in the 1980s and to the Sports Illustrated All-Century team of College Football. He helped lead the Tigers, under coach Danny Ford, to a four-year record of 33-10-1 including a 21-1-1 mark in his final two seasons of play. His 17 career interceptions is still a Clemson record. He was named to the College Football Hall of Fame in 2001. That same year he was inducted into Clemson's Ring of Honor. The 10th overall pick on the first round in the 1983 NFL Draft by the New York Giants, he went on to have an eight-year NFL career. He started in 115 NFL games, making 31 interceptions and seven fumble recoveries, helped lead the Giants to Super Bowl XXI and completed his career with the Houston Oilers in 1990. Originally a native of Sumter, S.C., Kinard now lives in Hilton Head Island, S.C.

Scott (1950-52), one of many standout players for Virginia in the early 1950s, played in the era of single platoon football as a stand-out offensive and defensive end for the Cavaliers. Named a first-team All-America in 1952 by both the Associated Press and NEA, he helped lead Virginia to a three-year 24-5 record, including an 8-1 mark and a No. 13 national ranking in 1951. The first two-sport All-America for the Cavaliers, Scott was a member of UVa's 1952 National Champion lacrosse

team, earning All-America honors that season. The 60th overall pick in the 5th round of the 1953 NFL Draft by the Los Angeles Rams, he played 12 seasons in the NFL, six years each with the Philadelphia Eagles and New York Giants. He was twice named to the NFL Pro Bowl (1957-58), and played on New York Giant teams that played in NFL title games in 1961, 1962 and 1963. He was named to the National Football Foundation and College Hall of Fame in 1979. Originally a native of Baltimore, Md., Scott now lives in Charlottesville, Va.

Little (1964-66), a three-time All-America for Syracuse under coach Ben Schwartzwalder, still holds the school record for career touchdowns (46) and career punt returns for touchdowns (6). He helped lead the Orange to a three-year 22-10 record, including appearances in the 1965 Sugar Bowl and the 1966 Gator Bowl. Voted the 1966 ECAC Player of the Year, he finished his college career as Syracuse' all-time leading rusher with 2,704 yards and still ranks sixth on the school's career rushing list. The sixth overall selection in the 1967 NFL Draft by the Denver Broncos, Little enjoyed a spectacular 9-year NFL career, all with Denver. He rushed for 6,323 yards and 43 touchdowns and led all of American Professional Football in rushing in 1969 and 1971. He was named an American Football League All-Star in 1968 and to the first-team All-AFL team in 1969. He was named to the AFC-NFC Pro Bowl three times in 1970, 1971 and 1973. He was inducted into the National Foundation and College Football Hall of Fame in 1983 and was inducted into the Professional Football Hall of Fame in 2010. His jersey, the famed number "44" which was also worn by Jim Brown, Ernie Davis and several others, was retired by Syracuse in 2005. Originally a native of New Haven, Conn., he currently lives in Syracuse and serves as Special Assistant to Syracuse Athletics Director Dr. Daryl Gross.

Majors (1973-76; 1993-96) inherited a Pitt program which had won 23 games in nine years prior to his arrival, including a 1-10 season in 1972. He then guided the Panthers to a four-year record of 33-13-1, including three bowl trips and a perfect 12-0 National Championship campaign in 1976. In two of his four seasons at Pitt he was named National Coach of the Year in 1973 and 1976. He coached or recruited 23 All-Americans in his career including nine at Pitt. An All-America tailback at Tennessee as a player, he was twice named MVP in the SEC, leading the Vols to a perfect 10-0 re-

cord in 1956. After Pitt's national championship season, he returned to his alma mater as head coach in 1977, guiding the Vols to three SEC championships. In 29 years as a head coach at Iowa State, Pittsburgh and Tennessee, Majors posted a 185-137-10 (.572) record. He was inducted into the National Football Foundation and College Football Hall of Fame in 1987 as a player. Originally a native of Lynchburg, Tenn., he currently lives in Knoxville, Tenn.

Cloud (1995-98) is one of the top running backs in Boston College history. His total of 3,597 rushing yards still ranks third on the BC all-time rushing list. In his senior season of 1998, he set the Eagles single-season rushing record which still stands when he ran for 1,726 yards in just 11 games, an average of 156.9 yards per game, while scoring 14 touchdowns. That year he was named a consensus first-team All-America being selected by both the Football Writers Association of America (FWAA) and by the Football Coaches. The 54th overall selection in the second round of the 1999 NFL draft, he went on to a seven-year career in the NFL with Kansas City, New England and the New York Giants. Born in Charleston, S.C., he grew up Portsmouth, R.I., and now lives in Rockwell, Texas.

Chesson (1968-70) is a record-setting receiver for the Duke teams of 1968, 1969 and 1970 for Coach Tom Harp. Chesson earned first-team All-Atlantic Coast Conference honors in 1970 after setting ACC single-season records with 74 pass receptions for 1,080 yards. His per-catch average of 6.73 per-game still ranks as the ninth-best single-season mark in ACC history. He ranks fifth on the Duke career receiving list with 2,399 career yards, averaging 14.6 yards per catch on his 164 career catches. His nine 100-yard receiving games were also an ACC record at the time. His 13 pass receptions against Clemson in 1970 is tied for the third-best single-game mark in Duke history. Selected in the seventh round of the 1971 NFL Draft, he played four seasons in the NFL, two each with the Atlanta Falcons and Philadelphia Eagles. He is the principal owner of the Chesson Company, an investment firm in Raleigh, N.C., and has served for over 30 years on the Duke Radio network as color analyst. He will be inducted into the Duke Athletics Hall of Fame on Oct. 11. A native of Edenton, N.C., he currently lives in Raleigh.

Dukes (1982-85), one of the important building blocks of Bobby Bowden's early Florida State programs in the 1980s,

earned consensus All-America honors as a senior offensive guard for Florida State in 1985. He started all 48 games during his four-year career at Florida State, helping lead the Seminoles to a record of 33-13-2 (.708) and appearances in four straight bowl games. Those bowl appearances were the beginning of Florida State's current 31-year consecutive bowl streak. A first-team Freshman All-America in 1982, Dukes earned Honorable Mention All-America honors in 1983 and second-team All-America accolades in 1984. Though not selected in the 1986 NFL Draft, Duke enjoyed a 10-year career in the National Football League, spending eight seasons with the Atlanta Falcons and one year each with Green Bay and Arizona. In all, he played in 124 professional games, starting 62. After retirement from football, Dukes has enjoyed a successful broadcasting career and joined the NFL Network in 2006 as an analyst on NFL Total Access and NFL GameDay Scoreboard. He is also a regular contributor to NFL.com. Born in Schenectady, N.Y., he played his high school football in Orlando, Fla., and currently lives in Atlanta.

Lavette (1981-84), perhaps the most productive running back in Georgia Tech history, is still the Institute's all-time rushing leader with 4,066 yards. He is one of only five ACC running backs to have topped the 4,000-yard mark and still ranks fourth on the league's all-time rushing list. While playing for the Bill Curry-coached Tech teams of the early 1980s, he topped the 1,000-yard mark in rushing twice, gaining 1,208 yards and scoring a then ACC-record 19 touchdowns in 1982. A versatile performer, Lavette ended his Tech career as the school's leading career rusher, pass receiver (114 catches) and scorer (276 points). At his best in the big games, Lavette contributed greatly to Tech's upsets over No. 1-ranked Alabama in 1981 and 13th-ranked Clemson in 1984. He earned third-team All-America honors in 1984 by the Football News and was a first-team All-ACC selection in 1982 and 1984. Selected in the fourth round of the 1985 NFL draft by the Dallas Cowboys, Lavette played three seasons for the Cowboys and Philadelphia Eagles. A native of Cartersville, Ga., he now resides in Austell, Ga.

James (1996-98), an explosive runner who averaged 6.2 yards per carry throughout his career, is one of the most successful running backs in Miami history. Though he played just three seasons in college, James totaled 2,960 yards and still has the top two

single-game rushing days in schools history. James ran for a school-record 299 yards against UCLA in 1998 and for 271 yards against Boston College in 1997. He is the only running back in school history to have multiple 1,000-yard seasons. James helped Miami compile a 23-12 mark and earn two bowl berths. The fourth overall selection in the 1999 NFL Draft by Indianapolis, he played 11 seasons in the NFL, including his first seven with the Colts. He was named to the NFL's Pro Bowl four times. He was named the 1999 NFL Offensive Rookie of the Year by the Associated Press and claimed the NFL rushing title in each of his first two seasons in the league. After leaving Indianapolis, he played three seasons with Arizona, helping the Cardinals to Super Bowl XLIII. He completed his professional career with Seattle in 2009 with 12,246 career rushing yards and 80 touchdowns. He was named to the NFL All-Decade team for the 2000s. Originally from Immokalee, Fla., James now resides in Miami.

Willard (1962-64), a hard-running fullback, was one of the mainstays of the North Carolina teams of Jim Hickey in the early 1960s. He was named to the All-ACC teams in 1963 and 1964 and helped the Tar Heels claim a share of the 1963 ACC Championship. That year, he helped lead UNC to a 9-2 record that included a 35-0 win over Air Force in the Gator Bowl. He led North Carolina in rushing in each of his three varsity seasons and still ranks 14th on UNC's career rushing list with 1,949 yards. A two-sport standout in college, he was a stand-out baseball player for the Tar Heels as well. He is also the first North Carolina player to be honored as an Academic All-America. Named a 2nd-team All-America in 1964, he was the second player chosen in the 1965 NFL Draft. He enjoyed a 10-year NFL career,

the first nine with the San Francisco 49ers before closing out his pro career with the then St. Louis Cardinals. He earned selection to the NFL's Pro Bowl four times and played on three 49er teams that won the NFC West title in 1970, 1971 and 1972, and the Cardinals team that won a division title in 1974. Originally from Richmond, Va., he resides in nearby Midlothian, Va.

Dave Buckey (1972-75) and Don Buckey (1972-75), the only identical twins to earn All-ACC football honors, were two of the key performers in the resurgence of NC State football in the early 1970s under Lou Holtz. The pair formed a potent passing combination that complemented the run-oriented split-back Veer offenses of Holtz as the Wolfpack earned four consecutive bowl bids. Dave Buckey was an accurate passer and skilled operator of the Veer offense, while Don was the sure-handed clutch receiver for the Wolfpack. Dave Buckey still holds the career mark for passing yards per attempt, averaging 8.18 yards a throw. Don Buckey had 102 career receptions, averaging 17 yards a catch. They combined to help the Wolfpack post a four-year record of 33-12-3 and claim the 1973 ACC Football title. During this span, State earned trips to two Peach Bowls, the Liberty Bowl and the Bluebonnet Bowl. Both Buckeys were named to the 1975 All-ACC team, with Don also earning first-team All-America honors from the FWAA. Both were selected by the New York Jets, and their former coach Holtz in the 1976 NFL Draft, and taken one right after another: Don at No. 327 and Dave at No. 328. Don played one season with the Jets. Originally natives of Akron, Ohio, they now live in Raleigh.

Davis (1998-2001) was one of the main offensive weapons for the Frank Beamer coached teams at the turn of this century. An explosive receiver and kick returner, he still

holds the Virginia Tech record for most yards per catch in a season, averaging 27.5 yards a reception in 1999 with 35 catches for 962 yards and nine touchdowns as the Hokies reached the 2000 BCS Championship Game in the Sugar Bowl before losing to Florida State. Dangerous in the return game as well, he averaged 15.9 yards on 55 career punt returns, including four for touchdowns. In 2000, he finished ranked 21nd nationally in punt return average. During his four seasons in Blacksburg, Davis helped lead the Hokies to a 39-5 record, including 11-1 campaigns in 1999 and 2000, and four consecutive bowl game appearances including the Music City Bowl (1998), the Sugar (1999) and back-to-back trips to the Gator Bowl (2000, 2001). He earned first-team All-America honors by the FWAA in 2000. The 47th overall selection on the second round of the 2001 NFL Draft, Davis went on to enjoy an eight-year NFL career with Cleveland, New England, Buffalo and Houston. Originally from Niskayuna, N.Y., he currently resides in Myrtle Beach, S.C.

Venuto (1979-80) quarterbacked Wake Forest to a dream season in 1979 as the Demon Deacons defeated 12th-ranked Georgia in Athens, 14th-ranked North Carolina in Chapel Hill and 13th-ranked Auburn at home en route to an 8-4 season and a berth in Tangerine Bowl for Coach John Mackovic. That year, Venuto led the ACC in total offense, broke six ACC records including total offense, pass attempts, pass completions, passing yards and total plays, and also set a single-game mark with 28 completions against East Carolina. For his efforts, he was named the ACC's Football Player of the Year. A first-team All-ACC selection in both 1979 and 1980, he led the league in total offense and passing efficiency as a senior. Originally from Salem, N.J., he now lives in Newfield, N.Y.

ACC Overtime Games

The ACC & Overtime

When Virginia Tech and Marshall ended regulation tied at 21 in week four of the 2013 season, it marked the 63rd game featuring an ACC team that has had to go to extra sessions. Of the 63 overtime contests, a large portion of them--27--have been played in the month of September. Games have gone into overtime for ACC teams a total of 14 times in November, while 12 have been played in October, three in August, five in December and two in January (2006 FedEx Orange Bowl, 2012 Allstate Sugar Bowl). Of the 63 overtime contests, 31 have been ACC games while 32 nonconference games have gone into overtime. The home team has a 35-20 advantage in the 55 games played on campus. The team which wins the toss has a 32-31 record. Forty-nine of the games were decided in the first overtime with nine games in double overtime and five in triple overtime.
