4th-Ranked FSU Travels to South Florida; Virginia Tech Meets Cincinnati at FedEx Field 10th-Rank Clemson Travels to Boston College; Coastal Leader Miami Hosts NC State and Duke Visits Wake Forest in ACC Action

The Atlantic Coast Conference heads into Week Five of the 2012 season with a pair of non-conference contests with Big East foes and three ACC games highlighting the action...4th-ranked Florida State, fresh off its impressive 49-37 win over 10th-ranked Clemson, travels to Tampa's Raymond James Stadium for a nationally televised clash with South Florida (6 pm, ESPN)...The 4th-ranked Seminoles, coached by **Jimbo Fisher**, are led by **QB EJ Manuel**, who is coming off a 482-yard total offense effort against the Tigers, the 3rd-highest total by an ACC player against a nationally ranked team...The Bulls are led by QB B.J. Daniels, a Tallahassee, Fla., native...Virginia Tech, ranked 25th by USA Today and coached by **Frank Beamer**, travels to Landover, Md., for a rare game at FedEx Field against unbeaten Cincinnati...The Hokies are led by **QB Logan Thomas**...The game is a home game for the Bearcats...17th-ranked Clemson, coached by **Dabo Swinney**, heads to Chestnut Hill, Mass., to play its second straight Atlantic Division game facing Boston College in a nationally televised game at Alumni Stadium (ESPN2, 3:30 pm)...The Tigers are led by **QB Tajh Boyd** and **RB Andre Ellington**, who

leads the ACC in rushing (95.8 ypg)...The Eagles, coached by **Frank Spaziani** and led by **QB Chase Rettig**, are coming off an open date...Coastal Division leader Miami, coached by **Al Golden** and led by **QB Stephen Morris**, who passed for a career-high 436 yards in leading the Hurricanes to a 42-36 overtime upset win over Georgia Tech, faces its second straight ACC foe in NC State at Sun Life Stadium in Miami Gardens (Noon, ESPNU)...The Wolfpack of coach **Tom O'Brien** will be opening ACC play, led by **QB Mike Glennon**...The game will be the third interdivisional game of the year in the ACC and since the beginning of division play in 2005, the Atlantic Division holds a 70-63 advantage...In Winston-Salem, N.C., Wake Forest, coached by **Jim Grobe**, will host Duke, coached by **David Cutcliffe**, in another interdivisional battle at BB&T Field (12:30 p.m., ACC Network)...The Blue Devils, led by **WR Conner Vernon**, who is on the verge of breaking the ACC career pass reception record, are seeking to snap a 12-game winning streak by the Deacons in the series which began in 1889...Saturday's game is the 93rd meeting between the two teams...Vernon needs only 6

catches to break the current ACC career mark held by Clemson's Aaron Kelly (232)...The Deacons are led by their own versatile **WR Michael Campanaro**, who leads the ACC and ranks 5th nationally in pass receptions (9.0 rpg)...Three additional ACC teams step out of conference this Saturday beginning with Georgia Tech, coached by **Paul Johnson**, which hosts Middle Tennessee of the Sun Belt Conference at Bobby Dodd Stadium (Noon, RSN)...The Jackets are ranked 3rd nationally in rushing and are led by **QB Tevin Washington**, the ACC's leading scorer (10.5 ppg)...In Chapel Hill, N.C., the Tar Heels of coach **Larry Fedora** are hosting Idaho of the Western Athletic Conference (WAC) at Kenan Stadium (3:30 pm, RSN)...UNC is led by **QB Bryn Renner**, who leads the ACC in total passing yards (1,191) and TDs (11)...Finally in Charlottesville, coach **Mike London's** Virginia Cavaliers are looking to get back on the winning track after two consecutive road losses, but face a tough test from unbeaten Louisiana Tech of the WAC at Scott Stadium (3:30 pm, ESPN3)...UVA is led by junior **QB Michael Rocco**.

National Football Hall of Fame To Induct Miami's Jimmy Johnson



Atlantic Coast Conference schools will have one inductee this year at the annual National Football Foundation and College Hall of Fame annual banquet in New York City. Former Miami head coach **Jimmy Johnson**, who also coached at Arkansas and went on to professional fame as head of the Super Bowl champion Dallas Cowboys, will be inducted at the annual National Football Foundation banquet, which will be held Tuesday, December 4 at the Waldorf Astoria Hotel in New York City. Johnson's induction brings the total to 16 former players or coaches who have been tabbed for induction into the College Hall of Fame from current Atlantic Coast Conference schools over the last seven years.

Johnson coached five seasons at Miami, leading the Hurricanes to record of 52-9 and a winning percentage .852. His 1987 Miami team captured the school's second National Championship and his 1986 team played for the national title, but lost to Penn State. During his years with the Hurricanes, his teams defeated 19 nationally-ranked teams, 8 teams ranked in the top five and three teams ranked No. 1. His teams played in two Fiesta Bowls, two Orange Bowls and one Sugar Bowl game. During his five years in Miami, his teams were ranked nationally on 55 occasions, including 13 times being ranked No. 1 nationally. Prior to joining the Hurricanes, he served as head coach at Oklahoma State, rebuilding that program and posting a 29-26-2 record. His overall record in college is 81-35-2. Johnson played his collegiate football at Arkansas, where he was a starter on the Razorback's 1964 national championship team. After leaving Miami he enjoyed a successful career in the National Football League as head coach of the Dallas Cowboys and Miami Dolphins. He coached the Cowboys to two Super Bowl Championships. Johnson joins 15 other former players or coaches from current ACC schools who have been

selected for the Hall of Fame since 2006 including:

2 - Florida State junior **DE Bjoern Werner** is tied for 2nd nationally in QB Sacks, averaging 1.62 sacks per game. The Berlin, Germany native is also averaging 2.25 tackles for loss which ranks him 8th nationally.

3 - Florida State senior **QB EJ Manuel** accounted for 482 yards of total offense against 10th-ranked Clemson--380 yards passing and 102 on the ground. It was the 3rd-highest total in ACC history against a nationally-ranked team. Former FSU great Chris Weinke recorded the only two better totals during his Heisman Trophy winning season of 2000, including a 509-yard effort against then 10th-ranked Clemson on the same Doak Campbell Stadium field.

4 - Boston College junior **WR Alex Amidon** (Greenfield, Mass.), who was added to the Watch List for the prestigious Biletnikoff Award, given annually to the nation's top pass receiver, ranks 4th nationally this week in pass reception yardage per game. Amidon is averaging 122 yards a game. He also ranks 8th nationally in receptions per game (8.33).

4-0 - Miami's record in overtime on the road since becoming a part of the ACC for the 2004 season. The Hurricanes have captured four straight extra session games away from home. In Miami, though, the Canes are just 1-4 for an overall 5-4 overtime record.

6 - Six of the ACC's 12 starting quarterbacks hail from Virginia and all six led their teams to bowl games in 2011 including Clemson's **Tajh Boyd** (Hampton, Discover Orange), Virginia Tech's **Logan Thomas** (Lynchburg, Allstate Sugar), Virginia's **Michael Rocco** (Lynchburg, Chick-fil-A), Florida State's **EJ Manuel** (Virginia Beach, Champs Sports), NC State's **Mike Glennon** (Centerville, Belk) and North Carolina's **Bryn Renner** (West Springfield, Advocate V100 Independence).

7 - When NC State **WR Rashard Smith** returned a punt 73 yards for touchdown in the Wolfpack's 52-14 win over The Citadel, it was the 7th punt return for a touchdown in the ACC this year after just four weeks of the season. In all of 2011, the ACC saw only three touchdowns scored on punt returns.

8 - Maryland's defense is ranked 8th nationally in total defense this week, despite having to play one of the top offenses in the nation in West Virginia. Led by All-America DE Joe Vellano and LB Demetrius Hartsfield, the Terrapins are allowing only 261.25 yards of offense to its opponents per game. That's 195.95 yards less per game than last season.

9.0 - The number of receptions per game by Wake Forest junior **WR Michael Campanaro**. Campanaro leads the ACC in pass receptions this

year and ranks 5th nationally. His 12 catches for 153 yards and 2 TDs against Army marked the second time this season he has had 12 or more receptions in a game.

12 - Wake Forest and Duke meet this Saturday for the 93rd time in their series which dates back to 1889. Duke holds a 53-37-2 advantage in the series but the Deacons have won the last 12 meetings between the two teams. No Jim Grobe-coached Wake team has lost to the Blue Devils. It is the 2nd longest winning streak in a current ACC series.

13 - The number of team statistical categories in which Florida State ranks 8th nationally or better. The Seminoles are ranked in rushing offense (8), total offense (4), scoring offense (2), third-down conversion (5) and passing efficiency (7) as well as rushing defense (5), pass efficiency defense (7), pass defense (4), total defense (2), scoring defense (2) and 3rd down defensive conversion (5). FSU is also in the nation's top 10 in kickoff returns (4) and kickoff return yardage defense (10).

14.3 - The number of tackles per game for Boston College **LB Nick Clancy**. Clancy, a fifth-year senior starting for the first time in his career, leads the nation in tackles per game this week. Clancy's predecessor, two-time All-America Luke Kuechly, led the nation in tackles per game in each of the past two seasons.

15 - Clemson **PK Chandler Catanzaro** has made 15 consecutive field goals, a streak which began in the 2011 season. He broke the Clemson school record of 14, set by Obed Arriri, in 1980, with a 50-yarder last Saturday against Florida State. The ACC record is 27 straight set by NC State's Marc Primanti during the 1995-96 seasons. Catanzaro is now 43-56 over his career, a .768 percentage.

25 - The number of career touchdowns for Georgia Tech senior **QB Tevin Washington**. Washington ranks 4th on the ACC career list in career TDs for a QB. Only former ACC standouts Joshua Nesbitt of Georgia Tech (35), Larry Russell of Wake Forest (29) and Woodrow Dantzler of Clemson (27) have scored more TDs.

35.40 - The punt return average for Virginia Tech sophomore **S Kyshoen Jarrett**. Jarrett leads the nation in punt return average this week, having recorded a 94-yard return earlier this year against Pittsburgh. That return was the 4th-longest in ACC history.

40 - The jersey number of Georgia Tech **LB Julian Burnett**, who was forced to give up football prior to this season due to an injury. His teammates are taking turns wearing his jersey this fall to honor him.

49 - Florida State became the first team in ACC history to score 49 or more points in four consecutive games in a single season. The Seminoles opened the year with a 69-3 win over Murray State, then defeated Savannah State (55-0), Wake Forest (52-0) and Clemson (49-37). FSU is also the third team since 1920 to score 49 or more in its first

four games at the start of the year joining Nebraska (1995) and Oklahoma (2007).

52 - The yardage distance of the touchdown pass thrown by Clemson **WR Sammy Watkins** to RB Andre Ellington against Florida State. The play was the first TD pass throw by a Clemson WR since 2009.

67.2 - Florida State quarterback **EJ Manuel** is one of the most accurate passers in ACC history. Manuel, who only became a full-time starter in 2011, has completed 406 of 604 passes in his career, a completion percentage of .672. If maintained for the rest of this year, that would be the best in ACC history. Virginia's Matt Schaub (.670) and Wake Forest's Riley Skinner (.669) are currently 1-2 on the career list.

132.36 - The pass efficiency rating for Maryland **QB Perry Hills**. Hills is one of only two true freshmen QBs in the NCAA's pass efficiency ratings. He is also the highest-ranked true freshman who did not participate in spring practice. Oklahoma State's Wes Lunt ranks ahead of Hills and is a true freshman, but entered school last January in time for spring drills. Hills entered school in time only for fall pre-season practice.

145 - NC State true freshman **RB Shadrach Thornton** ran for 145 yards on 21 carries and 2 TDs in his first collegiate game for the Wolfpack against The Citadel. The last time the Wolfpack had a player run for over 100 yards in his first game was 1981, when Joe McIntosh ran for 131 yards against Richmond.

227 - The number of career pass receptions for Duke senior wide receiver **Conner Vernon**. Vernon moved into 2nd place on the ACC career list for pass receptions in the Blue Devils' win over North Carolina Central. He now trails only Aaron Kelly of Clemson (232) on the ACC career list. His career total of 3,075 receiving yards puts him in 5th place on the ACC career list. He needs 443 receiving yards to set a new standard, currently held by FSU's Peter Warrick (3,517).

254 - Virginia Tech head coach **Frank Beamer** has a total of 254 coaching victories in his career and now leads all active NCAA FBS head coaches. Beamer is now 8th on the NCAA's career FBS list with 7th-place Tom Osborne (Nebraska) now one win away at 255.

365 - Florida State **PK Dustin Hopkins** has 365 career points, putting him in 3rd place on the ACC career scoring list. Hopkins now only trails Maryland's Nick Novak, who scored 393 points during the 2001-04 seasons, and Florida State's Xavier Beitia who scored 375 points concurrently with Novak. Hopkins, though, had his consecutive PAT streak end at 145 straight PATs without a miss against Savannah State, which was the 6th longest in NCAA history.

436 - The number of passing yards for Miami junior **QB Stephen Morris** in the Hurricane's 42-36 overtime win at Georgia Tech. The yards were a career-high for the Miami native and the 2nd-highest total in the ACC this year. It was also the most yards by a Miami QB in 21 years, or since Gino Torretta threw for a school-record 485 yards against San Diego State in 1991.

2012 ACC FB Game Summaries -- Sept. 22

#4/4 Florida State 49, #10/9 Clemson 37

The fourth-ranked Seminoles (4-0, 2-0) overcame a fast start by the ninth-ranked Tigers (3-1, 0-1) in Saturday night's Atlantic Division showdown in Tallahassee. Florida State QB EJ Manuel threw for 380 yards and two touchdowns and added 102 rushing yards to become the first FSU player since Heisman Trophy winner Charlie Ward in 1992 to pass for over 300 yards and rush for over 100 yards in the same game. Clemson gained the upper hand early, as QB Tajh Boyd connected with WR DeAndre Hopkins on a 60-yard touchdown pass five plays into the game. The Tigers led 28-14 after WR Sammy Watkins connected with RB Andre Ellington for a 52-yard TD early in the third quarter. But a 90-yard return by Florida State S Lemarcus Joyner on the ensuing kickoff set up a 9-yard TD run by RB Chris Thompson that shifted the momentum back in the Seminoles' favor and sparked the home team's comeback.

Miami 42, Georgia Tech 36 (OT)

RB Mike James scored four touchdowns, including the tying TD in the closing seconds of regulation and the winning score in overtime, as the Hurricanes won a wild one in Atlanta. Miami (3-1 overall, 2-0 ACC) jumped out to a 19-0 lead, yielded 36 unanswered points, then rallied from a 36-19 deficit to stun the Yellow Jackets (2-2, 1-2). QB Stephen Morris (436 yards passing) hooked up with James for the tying touchdown with 38 seconds left in regulation. Then, after Miami stopped Tech on fourth-and-inches on the Yellow Jackets' overtime possession, James raced for a 25-yard touchdown on the Hurricanes' first play to end it. QB Tevin Washington rushed for three touchdowns for the Yellow Jackets, who suffered their second overtime loss in ACC play this season.

Virginia Tech 37, Bowling Green 0

QB Logan Thomas threw two touchdown passes and ran for another score as Virginia Tech (3-1) got back on track with a shutout of the visiting Falcons (1-3). In addition to a solid effort from Thomas, who connected on a 10-yard touchdown pass to RB J.C. Coleman and a 42-yard scoring strike to WR Dyrell Roberts, the Hokies limited Bowling Green to 266 total yards. Virginia Tech CB Darrell Hunter led all tacklers with eight and intercepted a pass. The shutout marked the 26th for the Hokies under current defensive coordinator Bud Foster.

Wake Forest 49, Army 37

WR Michael Campanaro scored a career-high three touchdowns to lead the Demon Deacons (3-1) who won their third home game of the season. Campanaro scored on a 4-yard run and caught a pair of touchdown passes from QB Tanner Price as Wake Forest piled up 517 offensive yards -- its most since accumulating 555 yards against Miami in 2009. Josh Harris led the Demon Deacons' rushing attack with 129 yards and two TDs, and fellow RB Deandre Martin rushed for 115 yards and two scores. Army (0-3) came up short despite 506 total offensive yards, 426 of which came on the ground.

North Carolina 27, East Carolina 6

North Carolina (2-2) scored a pair of touchdowns in the first 7:05 of the second half to break open a close game against the visiting Pirates. QB Bryn Renner threw a 62-yard touchdown pass to WR Sean Tapley, and an ECU turnover set up a 4-yard run by RB Giovanni Bernard as the Tar Heels built on a 10-6 halftime lead. LB Kevin Reddick finished with 9 tackles while recording one of UNC's seven sacks and a forcing a fumble as UNC held an opponent without a touchdown for the second time this season.

NC State 52, The Citadel 14

Freshman Shadrach Thornton rushed for 145 yards and two touchdowns in his first college game to key the Wolfpack (3-1), which won its third straight game. Rashard Smith added a 73-yard punt return for a touchdown, while QB Mike Glennon rushed for a pair of touchdowns and passed for another. Wolfpack CB David Amerson came up with his third interception of the season, giving him 16 for his career and tying the NC State school record.

Duke 38, Memphis 14

QB Sean Renfree threw for 314 yards and four touchdowns to lead Duke (3-1) to its best start to a season since 2008. Renfree threw touchdown passes of 37 and 31 yards to WR Conner Vernon, who moved into fifth place on the ACC career receiving yards list. Memphis (0-4) led 14-7 in the opening half, but the Blue Devils closed the game with 31 unanswered points. Duke has opened the season with three consecutive home wins for the first time since 1994.

#8/7 West Virginia 31, Maryland 21

Maryland freshman QB Perry Hills threw for 305 yards and three touchdowns, including two to freshman WR Stefon Diggs, but it wasn't enough for the Terrapins (2-2) on the road against the eighth-ranked Mountaineers (3-0). WR Geno Smith threw three touchdown passes to WR Tavon Austin to lead West Virginia.

#17/16 TCU 27, Virginia 7

QB Casey Pachall threw for 305 yards and three touchdowns for the Horned Frogs (3-0), who extended their nation's-best winning streak to 11 games. Virginia QB Phillip Sims threw a 5-yard touchdown pass to E.J. Scott that brought the Cavaliers within 20-7 with 5:08 to play, but the Horned Frogs countered with their final scoring drive. The Cavaliers (2-2) are the only team to score a touchdown against TCU so far this season.

Florida State's Manuel, Watson, and Joyner headline honorees for performance against No. 10 Clemson

GREENSBORO, N.C. – Florida State quarterback EJ Manuel, offensive lineman Menelik Watson, and defensive back Lamarcus Joyner headline a list of eight players named as the Atlantic Coast Conference Football Players of the Week, announced by the conference on Monday. Manuel passed for a career-high 380 yards and had 482 total yards, Watson helped the Seminoles accumulate 667 total yards, and Joyner sparked a comeback as Florida State defeated No. 10 Clemson, 49-37.

Miami's Phillip Dorsett, the Receiver of the Week, set a new career high with nine receptions for 184 yards to help the Hurricanes win at Georgia Tech in overtime, 42-36. Teammate Eddie Johnson was named the Linebacker of the Week for tallying a career-high nine tackles, including a stop on 4th-and-1 in overtime on Miami's 2-yard line.

Wake Forest's Zach Thompson, the Defensive Lineman of the Week, recorded a career-high 12 tackles in the Deacons' 49-37 win over Army. North Carolina's Jabari Price is the Defensive Back of the Week for his performance in the Tar Heels' 27-6 victory over East Carolina. Maryland's Stefon Diggs, the Rookie of the Week, posted 113 yards and two touchdowns on only three receptions as the Terrapins fell to No. 8 West Virginia, 31-21.

OFFENSIVE BACK – EJ Manuel, Florida State, Senior, QB, 6-5, 240, Virginia Beach, Va.

Manuel turned in one of the most complete performances by a Seminole quarterback in ACC play, passing for a career-high 380 yards (27-35-0) and two touchdowns, while adding 102 rushing yards on 11 carries in the 49-37 victory over No. 10 Clemson. He is the first Seminole quarterback since Charlie Ward in 1992 against Maryland to pass for more than 300 yards and rush for more than 100 yards. Manuel calmly led the Seminoles back from a 14-point, second half deficit, completing 12 of 17 second half attempts for 199 yards and a pair of scores. The Seminoles erased a 28-14 deficit by outscoring Clemson 28-3, a streak that included TD passes of nine yards to Rashad Green and 29 yards to Rodney Smith. Manuel was named National Offensive Player of the Week by the College Football Performance Awards. His performance was also notable because he moved to the No. 1 spot in ACC career history in completion percentage (67.2) and passing efficiency (151.41).

OFFENSIVE LINEMAN – Menelik Watson, Florida State, Junior, OL, 6-6, 320, Manchester, Great Britain

Making just his second career start at the Division I level, Watson was a force from his right tackle position for the Seminoles. Florida State amassed 667 yards of total offense – 287 rushing and 380 passing – against the Tigers. Watson was often at the point of attack on a day when the Seminoles pounded out five rushing touchdowns, pushing their ACC-leading total to 20 on the year. It was Florida State's most productive effort in an ACC game since compiling more than 700 yards against Clemson in 2000. Watson graded out at 82 percent with just one missed assignment in 78 snaps. He was flawless in pass protection as the Tigers managed just one sack, which came on a blitz from the opposite side.

RECEIVER – Phillip Dorsett, Miami, Sophomore, WR, 5-9, 187, Ft. Lauderdale, Fla.

Dorsett tallied career highs with nine receptions for 184 yards and a touchdown in Miami's thrilling 42-36 come-from-behind overtime win at Georgia Tech. His first catch of the game came on a career-long 65-yard TD reception in the first quarter, and his 184 receiving yards are the seventh-most in a single game in school history. The Ft. Lauderdale, Fla., native also added a 41-yard reception in the second quarter. Dorsett entered the game with 12 catches for 89 yards through first three games of season and only 236 receiving yards in 15 career games.

DEFENSIVE LINEMAN – Zach Thompson, Wake Forest, Junior, DE, 6-5, 255, Ashburn, Va.

Thompson, a 6-5, 255-pound redshirt junior defensive end from Ashburn, Va., recorded a career-high 12 tackles and tied for the team high as Wake Forest downed Army, 49-37. Thompson had seven solo stops and five assists versus the Black Knights.

LINEBACKER – Eddie Johnson, Miami, Freshman, LB, 6-1, 238, Atlanta, Ga.

The Atlanta native had a career-high nine tackles (six solo) and assisted on a tackle-for-loss in front of his hometown crowd during Miami's 42-36 overtime road win at Georgia Tech. The biggest tackle came on 4th-and-1 on Miami's 2-yard line in overtime as Johnson stopped Yellow Jacket quarterback Tevin Washington for no gain, giving the ball to Miami that led to the eventual game-winning overtime drive.

DEFENSIVE BACK – Jabari Price, North Carolina, Junior, CB, 6-0, 195, Pompano Beach, Fla.

Price posted eight tackles (five solo, three assists), had a 13-yard sack, and broke up a pass in Carolina's 27-6 victory over East Carolina. Price's sack was the first of his career and it forced ECU to punt. The Tar Heels accumulated seven sacks on the day, the most since 2000 vs. Wake Forest. Price was part of a defensive effort that limited the Pirates to 233 total yards.

SPECIALIST – Lamarcus Joyner, Florida State, Junior, DB, 5-8, 195, Ft. Lauderdale, Fla.

Joyner was responsible for perhaps the biggest momentum changing play of the 49-37 victory over No. 10 Clemson when he raced 90 yards with a third quarter kickoff return in response to the Tigers taking a 31-21 lead with 7:32 remaining in the quarter. Joyner, who finished with 185 kickoff return yards on five attempts, was brought down at the Clemson 10-yard line. Two plays later, EJ Manuel completed a 9-yard touchdown pass to Rashad Greene as the Seminoles reeled off 28 unanswered points. In addition to his return work, Joyner was also instrumental on defense, contributing three tackles.

ROOKIE – Stefon Diggs, Maryland, Freshman, WR, 6-1, 185, Gaithersburg, Md.

Diggs made the most of his three touches on offense, turning three receptions into 113 yards and a pair of touchdowns in Maryland's 31-21 loss to No. 8 West Virginia. The freshman had a 42-yard touchdown catch in the first quarter on a highlight-reel play in which he raced down the sideline and dove into the end zone from four yards out. In the fourth quarter, he had a 56-yard touchdown catch. Diggs also added 63 kickoff return yards and 25 punt return yards to total 201 all-purpose yards, his second straight game with 200-plus.

Boston College

QB Chase Rettig is closing in on the 1,000-yard passing mark for the season ... Through three games, Rettig has thrown for 951 yards (317 yards per game) and ranks 11th nationally...

Rettig has thrown six touchdown passes while completing close to 57 percent of his passes and has thrown 114 times without an interception since Miami's Denzel Perryman's pick and 41-yard TD return in the season opener ... **LB Nick Clancy** leads the nation with 14.3 tackles per game ... Clancy's predecessor, two-time All-America Luke Kuechly, now in his rookie season with the Carolina Panthers, led the nation in tackles per game each of the past two seasons ... Clancy is also the national leader in solo tackles (9.3), while fellow Eagles **LB Kevin Pierre-Louis** is tied for fourth (7.00) ... Pierre-Louis also ranks sixth in total tackles per game (12.00) ... Junior **WR Alex Amidon**, recently added to the Watch List for the prestigious Biletnikoff Award, ranks fourth nationally this week in pass reception yardage per game. Amidon is averaging 122 yards per game ... Amidon also ranks eighth nationally in receptions per game (8.33).



Maryland

Maryland's run defense continues to be a major strength ... The Terps entered last Saturday's game at No. 8 West Virginia allowing just 2.58 yards per carry and held the Mountaineers to 1.0 yard per carry ... The Mountaineers had averaged 226 rushing yards per game but against the Terps had only 25 yards on 25 carries ... Maryland ranks 15th nationally in rushing defense (83.5 yards allowed per game) ... Freshman **QB Perry Hills** had the best game of his young career at West Virginia, completing 20-of-29 passes for 305 yards and three touchdowns, all career highs ... Freshman **WR Stefon Diggs** had his second straight game with 200-plus all-purpose yards by finishing with 201 against West Virginia ... Diggs had a team-high 113 receiving yards and two touchdowns on three receptions ... Diggs' touchdowns came on 42 and 56-yard receptions, and he had 25 punt return yards and 63 kickoff return yards ... With 160.5 all-purpose yards per game, Diggs ranks 12th nationally ... Redshirt junior **DB Dexter McDougle** had a career-high eight tackles, all of them unassisted, against West Virginia.



Clemson

RB Andre Ellington ranks among the top of the ACC career charts in a number of categories, including touchdowns scored (33), rushing attempts (476), rushing yards (2,738) and rushing touchdowns (30) ... When **WR Sammy Watkins**

threw a 52-yard scoring pass to Ellington in the third quarter of Saturday night's road game at Florida State, it marked the first scoring pass by a Clemson wide receiver since the 2009 Coastal Carolina game, when Jacoby Ford threw a 23-yard touchdown pass to Xavier Dye ... **WR DeAndre Hopkins** caught a 60-yard touchdown pass from **QB Tajh Boyd** on Clemson's first drive of the game vs FSU ... It was the longest reception of Hopkins career, whose previous long was a 50-yarder against Florida State last year ... Hopkins has five touchdown catches this season, tying his total for all of last year ... Clemson has scored touchdowns on its first two possessions in each of its last three games ... **P/K Spencer Benton** has now made 25 tackles in his career, more than any other kicker in Clemson history.



NC State

Junior **CB David Amerson** picked off a pass for the third straight game in last Saturday's win over The Citadel, tying the school record with 16 for his career ... NC State is now 10-2 when Amerson records an interception over the last two seasons ... The Wolfpack finished with 282 rushing yards against the Bulldogs, its highest team total since putting up 297 against Southern Miss. in 2005 ... True freshman **RB Shadrach Thornton** finished the game with 145 yards on 21 carries with two TDs ... Thornton is the first NC State running back to rush for over 100 yards this season, the first freshman to gain at least 100 yards in a game since Andre Brown had 248 against Southern Miss. in 2005, and the first freshman to go over 100 yards in his very first collegiate game since Joe McIntosh had 131 yards against Richmond in 1981 ... Sophomore **WR Bryan Underwood** has caught a touchdown pass in each of the Wolfpack's first four games ... During the Wolfpack's current three-game winning streak, senior **QB Mike Glennon** has completed 58-of-88 passes (65.9 percent), for 694 yards, five touchdowns and no interceptions.



Florida State

QB EJ Manuel, the Davey O'Brien National Quarterback of the Week, compiled 27 of 35 passes for a career-high 380 yards with two TDs and no interceptions in last Saturday's win over ranked

Clemson ... For his career, Manuel has completed 406-of-604 attempts for a completion percentage of 67.2 percent, which moves him into first place all-time on the ACC career completion percentage list ahead of Virginia's Matt Schaub (67.0) ... Manuel added 102 yards rushing to become the first FSU player to throw for 300 and rush for 100 since former Heisman winner Charlie Ward did it against Maryland in 1992, throwing for 395 yards and rushing for 111 ... FSU ranks fourth nationally in total offense (574.5 yards per game), second in scoring (56.25 points per game) and second in total defense (184 yards allowed per game) ... When **S Lamarcus Joyner** took a third quarter kickoff return 90 yards to the Clemson 10-yard line in the third quarter, it marked the first kickoff return of at least 90 yards since Michael Ray Garvin's 94-yard return for a touchdown against Colorado on Sept. 27, 2008.



Wake Forest

RB Josh Harris finished with 129 yards on 12 carries with two touchdowns vs. Army last Saturday, while fellow **RB Deandre Martin** posted 115 yards on 13 carries with two touchdowns ... The duo is the first Wake Forest tandem to each rush for over 100 yards in a game since Chris Barclay (210) and Micah Andrews (142) each ran for over 100 yards against East Carolina on Sept. 17, 2005 ... The Demon Deacons had a season-high 296 yard on the ground against Army ... **WR Michael Campanaro** ranks fifth nationally with 9.0 receptions per game ... Campanaro had 12 catches for 153 yards and two touchdowns vs. Army and also ran for another score ... Campanaro is the first Demon Deacon to score three touchdowns in a game since Barclay scored three against East Carolina in the aforementioned 2005 game ... **OLB Justin Jackson** finished the Army game with a career-high 11 tackles, his second blocked kick and his first career fumble recovery ... Wake Forest's 49 points scored against Army were the fifth-most points scored in the 45-season history of BB&T Field.

Duke

Duke has opened the season with three consecutive home wins for the first time since 1994 (Maryland, East Carolina & Army) ... This also marks Duke's first 3-1 start to a season since 2008 ... Duke's 151 points in the first four games rank as the third-highest total in school history, trailing the Blue Devil teams in 1945 (162) and 1943 (156) ... **WR Conner Vernon** has caught two or more passes in 18 consecutive games and in 38 career games to match the Duke record set by Donovan Varner ... Vernon ranks fifth all-time in ACC career receiving yards (3,075) and his 227 career catches rank second all-time, just five behind leader Aaron Kelly of Clemson (232 from 2005 through 2008) ... Duke **QB Sean Renfree** has reached double figures in the completion column in 28 consecutive games to tie the Duke record held by Thaddeus Lewis ... Renfree and Vernon rank fourth on Duke's all-time list of QB-to-WR touchdown combinations with 13 ... Backup **QB Brandon Cornette** is the first Blue Devil to rush for a touchdown, receive a touchdown pass and pass for a touchdown since D. Bryant in 2000.



North Carolina

QB Bryn Renner's 684 passing yards in UNC's last two games set a school record ... The previous record was 683 shared by T.J. Yates (2007 - vs. East Carolina and Virginia) and Darian Durant (2002 - vs. Arizona State and NC State ... The Tar Heels outscored their first four opponents of the season by a combined 52-0 in the third quarter ... Defensively, UNC recorded seven sacks in last Saturday's 27-6 win over East Carolina after tallying a total of six in the opening three games of the season ... The seven sacks matched an ACC season high thus far (NC State also had seven vs. South Alabama on Sept. 15) and are the most for UNC since the second game of the 2000 season, when the Tar Heels sacked Wake Forest 10 times in a 35-14 victory ... UNC has made 138 consecutive extra points and **PK Casey Barth** has made a school-record 100 in a row ... Barth's third PAT of the game vs. East Carolina was his 134th successful extra point overall, passing Jeff Hayes (133 from 1978-81) for the UNC career record ... Sophomore **RB Gionvani Bernard** now has 19 career touchdowns, including 15 rushing scores .



Georgia Tech

Over its last five games, which includes the 2011 Sun Bowl game against Utah, Georgia Tech has lost three games – all in overtime and all following a similar script ... In each of the three losses, the Yellow Jackets fell behind early, stormed back to take a lead, and led in the fourth quarter before giving up a tying score and falling short in OT ... Georgia Tech's offense did not have a three-and-out in either of its last two games ... Senior **QB Tevin Washington**, who has rushed for six touchdowns over the last two games combined, is tied for ninth nationally in scoring (11.0 points per game) ... The Yellow Jackets have outscored their opponents 46-0 in the second quarter ... Tech has played 188 consecutive games without being shut out, the eighth-longest streak nationally ... Senior **AB Orwin Smith** now has 17 career rushing touchdowns, tying Malcolm King for the 17th-most career rushing touchdowns in Tech history ... Junior **DB Jemea Thomas** has four interceptions over the last nine games, dating back to last season.



Virginia

Sophomore **OLB D.J. Hill** made his first collegiate start last Saturday at 16th-ranked TCU last Saturday in place of injured starter **LaRoy Reynolds** ... Hill responded with a game-high eight tackles ... **QB Michael Rocco** made his 17th consecutive start last Saturday ... Backup **QB Phillip Sims'** 5-yard touchdown pass to **WR E.J. Scott** with 4:22 remaining against TCU represented the first touchdown allowed by the Horned Frogs this season ... Sims has thrown three touchdown passes in the last two games ... Cavalier special teams have been strong so far this season ... Redshirt sophomore **RB Khalek Shepherd** leads the ACC in kick return average a 32.4 yards per runback, including a 72-yard return ... **PK Drew Jarrett** is perfect on all 13 of his kicking attempts so far this season (10-for-10 on extra points, 3-for-3 on field goals) ... **P Alex Voznelik's** 45.4 average per punt ties Duke's Will Monday for tops in the conference ... Senior **LB Steve Greer's** 31 tackles in four games (7.8 per game) is tied for eighth best in the ACC.



Miami

Freshman **RB Duke Johnson** has 838 all-purpose yards through four games and is the national leader in that category ... Johnson is on pace for 2,514 yards in 12 games ... The single-season all-purpose mark at Miami is 2,102 by Willis McGahee in 2002 ... Junior **QB Stephen Morris** threw for a career-high 436 yards in Miami's 42-36 overtime road win at Georgia Tech ... Morris is the first UM quarterback to throw for 400-plus yards since 2002, and it marked the most passing yards by a Miami QB since Gino Torretta's 485 yards against San Diego State in 1991 ... **RB Mike James** rushed for three touchdowns against Georgia Tech and added another on a receiving score ... James' effort came one week after Johnson scored four touchdowns in a win over Bethune-Cookman ... The Hurricanes are the only team in the nation this season to have two different players score four touchdowns in a game ... Eight of Miami's 20 scoring drives this season have needed less than two minutes of game clock time ... Senior **PK Jake Wieclaw** is tied for second in the ACC and tied for 13th nationally in field goals per game (1.75)



Virginia Tech

Virginia Tech has scored 10 touchdowns on 14 trips inside the red zone this season ... Tech ranks ninth nationally in pass defense, allowing an average of 143.50 yards per game ... Sophomore **KR Kyshoen Jarrett** ranks No. 1 nationally in punt returns with an average of 35.4 yards per return ... Opponents have returned just six of the Hokies' 21 punts this season for 19 total yards ... **QB Logan Thomas** ranks fifth in career rushing TDs by a Tech quarterback with 13 ... Virginia Tech's Frank Beamer Becomes NCAA FBS Active Career Leader in Wins

Virginia Tech's Frank Beamer is now the leading active head coach in the NCAA's FBS in career victories with a total of 254 triumphs in his 32-year coaching career. Beamer is currently in 8th place on the all-time career wins list for the FBS, and trails former Nebraska head coach Tom Osborne (255) by one triumph and former BYU head coach LaVell Edwards (257) by three wins. Georgia Tech head coach Paul Johnson ranks 13th on the active FBS list with 142 career wins and NC State's Tom O'Brien is in 21st place (111). Former Florida State head coach Bobby Bowden, who retired after the 2009 season, finished his career in 2nd place on the all-time list with 389 victories, though the NCAA recognizes only 377 triumphs due to NCAA sanctions. With the NCAA sanctions levied against Penn State, Bowden is now the NCAA FBS all-time leader.

Five Current ACC Head Football Coaches Have UVa Ties

When **Al Golden** joined the ACC as Miami's head coach for the 2011 season, he became the fifth former UVa assistant or graduate assistant coach to be a current head football coach in the Atlantic Coast Conference. Golden joined Boston College's **Frank Spaziani**, NC State's **Tom O'Brien**, Virginia's **Mike London** and Wake Forest's **Jim Grobe** as current ACC head coaches who have spent time as assistants or graduate assistants for the Cavaliers. Golden spent four seasons (2001-04) at Virginia as defensive coordinator under Al Groh. The Eagles' Spaziani served as an assistant coach at Virginia under then head coach George Welsh for nine seasons (1982-90), the last five as defensive coordinator. O'Brien also served under Welsh at UVa, spending 15 seasons (1982-96) there including the last six as offensive coordinator. London served two terms at UVa under Groh, serving as defensive line coach in 2001-04 and again in 2006-07 as defensive coordinator and defensive line coach. London and Golden also served as assistants to Tom O'Brien at Boston College. Wake Forest head coach Jim Grobe, a 1975 Virginia graduate, who just completed his 11th season with the Deacons, lettered two seasons at UVa as a middle guard and linebacker and also spent one year as a graduate assistant coach (1975) under then Virginia head coach Sonny Randle.

Wake Forest head coach Jim Grobe is the fourth active ACC coach with 100 career wins. Grobe now has a record of 104-100-1 career mark for 18 seasons, the last 12 with the Deacons. NC State's Tom O'Brien has 111 wins, having accumulated 75 of them in a 10-year stay at Boston College. Virginia Tech's Frank Beamer (254), the nation's leading active coach in the FBS in wins, and Georgia Tech's Paul Johnson (142) are the other ACC coaches over the century mark in career triumphs.

North Carolina's Larry Fedora Makes UNC/ACC Coaching Debut

North Carolina made his debut as head coach a successful one, leading the Tar Heels to a 62-0 win over in-state foe Elon on Sept. 1. Fedora, who led Southern Mississippi to the 2011 Conference USA championship last year, is now the 35th head coach in UNC history and its 11th since joining the ACC in 1953. Fedora compiled a record of 34-19 in four years as head coach at Southern Miss.

NC State's Tom O'Brien Latest To Coach at Multiple ACC Schools

NC State's Tom O'Brien is the fifth coach in Atlantic Coast Conference history to have served as a head coach of two ACC schools. O'Brien coached at Boston College from 1997 through 2006, which included the school's first two seasons (2005-06) of ACC membership. Jim Tatum was the first ACC coach at two schools; he first coached at North Carolina in 1942, then at Maryland from 1947-55 before returning to UNC beginning in 1956 until his death in 1958. Others who have coached at two ACC schools include Bobby Ross (Md, GT), Al Groh (WF, UVa) and Bill Dooley (UNC, WF).



Dooley actually coached at three current ACC schools as he spent nine seasons at Virginia Tech before the Hokies joined the ACC, in between stints at UNC and Wake Forest, winning 162 games in his career. Dooley and Ross are the only coaches in ACC history to be named ACC Coach of the Year at more than one school. Others who have coached at more than one current ACC school, though not necessarily when they were in the ACC, include John Heisman, who coached at both Georgia Tech and Clemson.

Tech's Beamer Becomes 10th FBS Head Coach To Win 200 Games At One School

With a 17-10 win over East Carolina in 2011, Virginia Tech head football coach Frank Beamer accomplished yet another milestone in a career which now spans 32 years as a head coach. The win was Beamer's



200th at his alma mater making him only the 10th head coach in NCAA FBS history to have won 200 games at one school. He became only the second ACC head coach to do so, joining former Florida State head coach Bobby Bowden, Beamer's overall record, now in his 26th year at Virginia Tech is 212-99-2 (.681). He is now only the second active FBS head coach with 200 wins at one school with Nevada's Chris Ault (229).

In just his third season as head coach at Florida State, head coach **Jimbo Fisher** has joined some select company among ACC football coaches. Fisher has compiled a 23-8 record (.742) just four games into his third season. His winning percentage ranks him 7th among all ACC head coaches in their third season, ahead of such figures as Maryland's Ralph Friedgen and Georgia Tech's Bobby Ross. The best mark recorded by an ACC head coach in his first two years in the league was by Fisher's predecessor at FSU, Bobby Bowden, who posted a 33-3-1 mark (.905) during the 1992-94 seasons. Maryland's Jim Tatum was 27-4-1 (.859) in his first three years with Virginia Tech's Frank Beamer third at 31-8-0 (.859).

Clemson's Memorial Stadium Is Home Sweet Home for Tiger's Dabo Swinney



Clemson head coach Dabo Swinney has enjoyed coaching in the cozy and imposing confines of the Tigers' home field, also known as Death Valley. In his first four seasons as head coach of the Tigers, Swinney's teams have won 12 of the first 14 home ACC games, a winning percentage of .857. That stacks up pretty well with some of the great names in ACC coaching. Swinney's winning percentage ties him with Maryland's Jerry Claiborne for 3rd among ACC head coaches. Another former Tiger coach, Ken Hatfield, has the highest percentage, posting a 12-1-1 mark in four seasons (.893). Legendary Florida State coach Bobby Bowden won more ACC home games than any other coach, with 62 triumphs in his 18 years in the league. His winning percentage of .861, is second-best. Bowden's successor at Florida State, Jimbo Fisher is on a pretty good pace himself, having won six of his first eight ACC home games. Four Clemson coaches rank in the Top 10 including Hatfield (1st), Swinney (tie for 3rd), Danny Ford (7th) and the legendary Frank Howard (tied for 9th).

Florida State's EJ Manuel Joins Heisman Winners With Game Against Clemson



Florida State senior QB EJ Manuel turned in one of the best quarterback performances in ACC history in the Seminoles' 49-37 win over 10th-ranked Clemson. Manuel completed 27 of 35 passes (77 percent) for a career-high 380 yards and 3 TDs and ran for another 102 yards on 12 carries against the Tigers. Manuel's performance fueled a Seminole

comeback that saw FSU overcome a 28-14 Clemson third-quarter lead. The effort marked:

■ The first time an FSU player had rushed for 100 or more yards and thrown for 300 or more yards in the same game since Heisman Trophy winner Charlie Ward managed the feat against Maryland in 1992.

■ The 482 total yards against 10th-ranked Clemson, were the third-most by an ACC player against a nationally-ranked opponent. FSU's other Heisman Trophy winner, Chris Weinke, totalled 509 yards in 2000 against then 10th-ranked Clemson in Tallahassee.

■ Manuel now has completed 406 of 604 passes in his career, a completion percentage of .672, which if he maintains for the rest of the year, would be an ACC career mark.

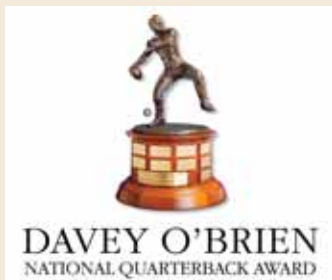

Florida State's EJ Manuel Named Davey O'Brien National QB of the Week



After guiding Florida State to a 49-37 come-from-behind victory over Clemson, EJ Manuel has been named the Davey O'Brien Quarterback of the Week.

The 6-5, 240-pound signal caller had a night to remember, successfully completing 27 of 35 passes for a career-high 380 yards while rushing for an additional 102 yards. Manuel was the first Seminole quarterback to surpass 300 passing yards and 100 rushing yards since 1993 Davey O'Brien Winner Charlie Ward did it in 1992.

"They were mixing up looks and bringing in blitzes from everywhere and he made plays when he had to," said Florida State head coach Jimbo Fisher. "But I thought he was extremely selfless and understood how to win. I was very proud of him."

The Seminoles will try to protect their perfect 4-0 record as they head out on the road for the first time this season to take on the USF Bulls in Raymond James Stadium Saturday night.

Duke's Sean Renfree Piling Up 300-Yard Games

When Duke junior QB Sean Renfree threw for 314 yards in the Blue Devils' 38-14 win over Memphis, he topped the 300-yard mark in passing yards for the 9th game of his 27-game career as a starter. Renfree leads all active ACC players in most 300-yard performances and is tied for the 9th-highest total in ACC history. NC State's Philip Rivers holds the ACC record with 18. In 33 total games, six of which he was in a reserve role, Renfree has averaged 225.2 yards per game passing.

Renfree has thrown for 7,430 yards in his career, currently good enough for 22nd place on the ACC career list and 5th on Duke's career passing list.

His 700 career completions rank him just outside of the ACC's career Top 10. Miami's Jacory Harris currently sits in 10th place, having completed 70-3 passes during his four-year career (2008-11).

The ACC quarterbacks who roam the ACC gridiron this fall are some of the most accurate passers in league history. Florida State's **EJ Manuel** has completed 67.2 percent of his passes and currently has the best career mark in league history. But North Carolina junior **Bryn Renner** is right behind, having completed 66.5 percent of his passes. In all, six ACC quarterbacks have completed better than 60 percent of their passes for their careers, while eight have completed 57 percent or better. Manuel ranks 4th in the NCAA among active players in career completion percentage with Renner 8th and Duke's Sean Renfree 14th.

Vernon has caught a pass in 39 straight games--every game of his college career.

Boston College's Alex Amidon Named to Biletnikoff Watch List

After starting the season with 25 catches for 366 yards and a TD in his first three games, Boston College junior **WR Alex Amidon** was named to the prestigious Fred Biletnikoff Award Watch List. If more than one team in the same division is tied for the best winning percentage in its Conference games, then, in order to determine the Divisional Champions, the procedures listed below will be followed:

Two-Team Tie:

1. Head-to-head competition between the two tied teams.
2. Records of the tied teams within the division.
3. Head-to-head competition versus the team within the division with the best overall record. (Divisional) Conference record and preceding through the division. Multiple ties within the division broken from first-to-last.
4. Overall record versus all common non-divisional opponents.
5. Combined record vs. all non-divisional teams.
6. Record versus common non-divisional teams based on their order of finish (divisional and non-divisional) and proceeding through other common non-divisional teams based on their order of finish within their division.
7. The tied team with the highest ranking in the Bowl Championship Series Standings following the end of regular season game shall be the divisional representative in the ACC Championship Game.
8. The representative shall be chosen by a draw.

Three-Team (or More) Team Tie

(Once tie has been reduced to two teams, the two-team tiebreaker format is used.)

1. Combined head-to-head record among teams.
2. Records of the tied teams within the division.
3. Head-to-head competition versus the team within the division with the best overall (divisional or conference) record, and proceeding through the division. Multiple ties within the division will be broken first to last.
4. Overall record for non-divisional teams.
5. Combined record versus all common non-divisional teams.
6. Record versus common non-divisional with the best overall Conference (divisional and non divisional record) and proceeding through the other common non-divisional teams based on their order of finish within the division.
7. The tied team with the highest ranking in the BCS Standings following the conclusion of regular season games shall be the divisional representative in the ACC Championship Game, unless the second of the tied teams is ranked within five-or-fewer places of the highest ranked tied team. In this case, the head-to-head results of the top two ranked tied teams shall determine the representative in the ACC Championship Game.

Bowl Championship Series

The winner of the Dr Pepper ACC Football Championship Game will be selected to play in the Bowl Championship Series. Unless the winner of the Dr Pepper ACC



Football Championship Game is ranked No.1 or No. 2 in the final BCS Standings and plays in the BCS National Championship Game, then the ACC Champion will serve as the host team of the Discover Orange Bowl in Miami, Fla. This year's Discover BCS National Championship Game will be hosted by the Discover Orange Bowl on Jan. 7 in Miami Gardens, Fla. The BCS may also select a second ACC team, if one is eligible for selection (Won at least nine regular season games and is ranked among

the Top 14 in the final BCS Standings), and there is an At-Large berth available and the team is selected by one of the four BCS Bowl Games—Discover Orange (only if the ACC Champion is in the BCS National Championship Game), Allstate Sugar, Tostitos Fiesta and the Rose Bowl Game presented by Vizio.

After the BCS selections, then the selection order is:

1. Chick-fil-A Bowl, Atlanta
2. Russell Athletic Bowl, Orlando
3. Hyundai Sun Bowl, El Paso, Tex.
4. Belk Bowl, Charlotte, N.C.

Conditions:

1. The runner-up of the ACC Championship Game, provided, is guaranteed not to fall further than the Hyundai Sun Bowl. The Sun Bowl will select the ACC Championship Game runner-up in any year that team is available to them.

2. Otherwise, if the bowl does not select the team available with the best Conference record, then it must choose a team that is within one conference win of the team (The "One-Win Rule") with the best conference record (ie. 5-3 to 6-2), The bowl may take a team that has more than a one game difference, only if the team is ranked more than five spaces above the team with the best Conference record in the final BCS Standings.

3. If, after all bowl selections have been made, and the Kraft Fight Hunger Bowl has an opening due to the inability of either the Pac-12 Conference or Army to provide a team, and the ACC has an available, eligible team, then the ACC will send a team to the Kraft Fight Hunger Bowl

Selection Time Frame

The Bowl Championship Series will announce its selections on the BCS ESPN Selection Show on Sunday, December 2. In conjunction with the BCS selections, each Atlantic Coast Conference affiliated bowl game will make their selections in the order specified above. The ACC, the Bowls and individual schools will announce the selections after all selections are completed on Sunday.

The ACC and The Bowl Championship Series

The Atlantic Coast Conference and the BCS

The Atlantic Coast Conference has been a member of the Bowl Championship Series (BCS) since its inception for the 1998 season. ACC Commissioner John Swofford, is the only Commissioner to twice serve as BCS Coordinator, having done so in the 2000 and 2001 seasons and again in the 2008 and 2009 campaigns, as the ACC successfully administered the BCS on two separate occasions. Swofford is also the last Commissioner to serve as BCS Coordinator. In 2009, the BCS group named longtime college administrator Bill Hancock to serve as the first Executive Director of the Bowl Championship Series. Hancock has since assumed most of the duties previously handled by the coordinator. Prior to being named Executive Director, Hancock served four years as the Administrator for the BCS.

BCS Standings

The BCS Standings are composed of three elements that are weighted equally: the USA Today Coaches poll, 2) the Harris poll, and 3) the average of six computer poll rankings. The highest and lowest computer ranking is discarded each week with the computer average based on the remaining four rankings. The BCS Standings are compiled and released by the National Football Foundation eight times during the season, beginning this year on Sunday, October 16 and ending on BCS Selection Sunday, December 4.

(2013 bowl games) is the third year of the current four-year television agreement with ESPN, which will televise all five BCS games.

Six conferences (ACC, Big East, Big 12, Big Ten, SEC and Pac-12) have earned annual automatic qualification for the 2010-13 seasons by virtue of contracts to host the bowl games, and/or by having met a four-year metric based on competitive results (The ACC champion plays in the Discover Orange Bowl, the Big Ten and Pac-12 champs in the Rose Bowl presented by Vizio, Big 12 in the Tostitos Fiesta Bowl and SEC in the Allstate Sugar Bowl). Playoff Coming In 2014-15

On June 26, 2012, the BCS Presidential Oversight Committee agreed to launch a four-team playoff beginning with the 2014-15 season. The new format will continue at least 12 years, through the 2025-26 season. The semifinals will be rotated among six bowl games and will be played either New Year's Eve or New Year's Day. The championship game, to be managed by the 11 conferences and rotated among neutral sites every year, will be on a Monday at least six days after the last semifinal game. A selection committee will rank the teams for the playoff.

The champions of the Big Ten and the Pac-12 will play in the Rose Bowl if they do not qualify for the National Championship Game. Other "regional consideration" tie-ins include the SEC champion in the Sugar Bowl, the ACC champion in the Orange Bowl and the Big 12 champion in the Fiesta Bowl if those teams are not ranked No. 1 or No. 2 in the final BCS Standings.

Bill Hancock, Executive Director

Longtime athletics administrator Bill Hancock was named the first Executive Director of the Bowl Championship Series on November 17, 2009 and, in doing so, achieved a unique double-double at the upper echelon of intercollegiate athletics. He was the first full-time director of the NCAA Final Four and is now the first executive director of the BCS. Hancock served for 13 years as director of the NCAA's Division I Men's Basketball Championship--the three-week March Madness event that culminates at the Final Four. After a family tragedy, he retired in 2002 and for three years was the tournament's media coordinator on a consulting basis before being named BCS administrator in October of 2005. He is a 1972 journalism graduate of the University of Oklahoma and worked in sports information at his alma mater and also on the staff of the Big Eight Conference before being named director of the Final Four in 1989.

Heading into its 15th year of determining the National Championship in college football, the **Bowl Championship Series (BCS)** is a five-game arrangement that is designed to match the two top-rated teams and to create competitive match ups among eight other highly regarded teams in four other games.

The bowl games participating are the Tostitos Fiesta Bowl, the Discover Orange Bowl, the Rose Bowl Game presented by Vizio and the Allstate Sugar Bowl. In addition, the BCS National Championship Game is played at one of the bowl sites, this year at Sun Life Stadium in Miami Gardens Fla., on January 7, 2013.

The term "BCS conference" frequently is used incorrectly. Actually, all 11 NCAA Football Bowl Subdivision (FBS) conferences are "BCS conferences" because the BCS arrangement is managed by the commissioners of the 11 NCAA FBS conferences and the director of athletics at the University of Notre Dame. The conferences are Atlantic Coast, Big East, Big Ten, Big 12, Conference USA, Mid-American, Mountain West, Sun Belt, Pacific-12, the Southeastern and the Western Athletic.

The conference commissioners and the Notre Dame athletics director make decisions regarding all BCS issues, in consultation with an athletics directors advisory group and subject to the approval of a presidential oversight committee whose members represent all 120 NCAA FBS programs.

The BCS games are operated by community-based organizations in each of the host cities. In addition, there are 30 other post-season bowls, which are managed independently by entities in 27 cities around the nation. All bowl games provide meaningful season-ending opportunities for student-athletes.

The BCS is remarkably successful. It maintains and enhances the importance of the regular season and preserves the unique bowl tradition to the benefit of the student-athletes. And it matches the top two teams. Before the creation of the BCS and its predecessors, the Bowl Coalition and Bowl Alliance, the top two teams had met in a bowl game only eight times in the previous 56 seasons. They have met in each of the last 14 seasons by BCS standards, and 11 of the last 14 seasons according to the Associated Press poll. The 2012 regular season

The ACC & Overtime

When Georgia Tech and Miami ended regulation tied at 36-36, it marked the 60th game featuring an ACC team that has had to go to extra sessions. Of the 60 overtime contests, a large portion of them--26--have been played in the month of September. Games have gone into overtime for ACC teams a total of 13 times in November, while 12 have been played in October, three in August, four in December and two in January (2006 FedEx Orange Bowl, 2012 Allstate Sugar Bowl). Of the 60 overtime contests, 30 have been ACC games while 30 nonconference games have gone into overtime. The home team has a 34-19 advantage in the 53 games played on campus. The team which wins the toss has a 32-28 record. Forty-seven of the games were decided in the first overtime with nine games in double overtime and four in triple overtime.
