FIRST-AND-10...

- Led by a defense that ranks as one of the nation's best, Maryland will look to build on its ACC-opening victory over Wake Forest when it travels to Virginia for a 3 p.m. game that will be broadcast on Comcast SportsNet Mid-Atlantic locally. The Terps and Cavaliers will be meeting for the 77th time, the most between Maryland and any other school in the Terps' 120-year football history.

- For the first time since 1999, Maryland has held its opponent under 300 yards of total offense in four of the season's first five games. Only No. 5 West Virginia, which is averaging 570.8 yards of total offense per game, exceeded the 300 mark against the Terrapins (363). The Terps rank seventh nationally in total defense (257.2 ypg), seventh in rushing defense (81.0 ypg) and 15th in passing defense (176.2 ypg). Maryland has been very tough against the run with an experienced front seven highlighted by senior defensive linemen **Joe Vellano** and **A.J. Francis**, and senior linebacker **Demetrius Hartsfield**. Those three have played a big role in holding opponents to an average of just 2.3 yards per rush, which ranks third nationally. The Terps received a major boost to their linebacking corps with the return of **Kenneth Tate** in the West Virginia game. Tate, a 2010 consensus first team All-ACC choice, had missed the previous 11 games dating back to the 2011 season due to a knee injury. The fifth-year senior has already made an impact in his two games back: he has eight tackles, two for a loss, a sack, two pass breakups, a forced fumble and a fumble recovery. He and Hartsfield helped seal the victory over Wake Forest by providing back-to-back sacks late in the fourth quarter, preserving a 19-14 win. Hartsfield earned ACC Linebacker of the Week honors for his play.

- The Maryland defense has also been disruptive - its 7.4 tackles for loss per game are tied for 22nd in the FBS and its 2.5 sacks per game are tied for 39th. And against Wake Forest, the secondary had perhaps its best game yet, holding the Demon Deacons to a .342 completion percentage and 170 yards. The Terps combined for 11 pass breakups, led by **Jeremiah Johnson's** four, which ties a single-game high for an ACC player this year.

- Offensively, wide receiver **Stefon Diggs** continues to be Maryland's most dynamic playmaker. The freshman has put together back-to-back 100-yard receiving games by catching three passes for 113 yards and two TDs against West Virginia and then hauling in five passes for 105 yards vs. Wake Forest. Against the Demon Deacons, his 63-yard reception midway through the fourth quarter setup the game-winning score. Diggs, who ranks second in the ACC and 19th nationally with 154.8 all-purpose yards per game, is the only player in the conference with 350 receiving yards, 150 punt return yards and 150 kickoff return yards. He has been named ACC Rookie of the Week in each of his last two games.

- Quarterback **Perry Hills**, who is just the third true freshman quarterback to start for Maryland in school history (Randall Jones in 1998; Latrez Harrison in 1999), is directing the offense. Hills had his best collegiate game against West Virginia when he finished 20 of 29 for 305 yards and three touchdowns, all season highs. He led Maryland on the game-winning touchdown drive in the fourth quarter of the season opener against William & Mary, and was named ACC Rookie of the Week after going 11 of 21 for 190 yards and two touchdowns in the win at Temple.

- The Maryland running game has been a work in progress as four capable backs have all seen time this season. Sophomore **Justus Pickett**, the most experienced of the four, and true freshman **Wes Brown** received the bulk of the carries against Wake Forest. Brown leads the team with 150 rushing yards and 4.5 yards per carry, while Pickett is second with 137 rushing yards and is a threat on screen passes, having caught 13 passes for 70 yards. True freshman **Albert Reid**, who started against William & Mary, and redshirt freshman **Brandon Ross**, who started the last two games, have also been in the mix.

QUICK HITTERS...

- A Terrapin has received Rookie of the Week honors three times in Maryland's last four games. Quarterback Perry Hills earned the award for his play against Temple (9/8), while Stefon Diggs received the honor for his play against West Virginia (9/22) and Wake Forest (10/6). Hills became the first Maryland true freshman QB to earn the award since Calvin McCall on 9/20/99, while Diggs became the first Maryland freshman receiver to earn it since Darrius Heyward-Bey on 10/30/06.
- Diggs ranks ninth in the conference and first among freshmen with 72.8 receiving yards per game. Diggs, who has 17 catches for 364 yards, is averaging 21.4 yards per catch. That leads all ACC receivers with 15 or more catches. It also ranks third among the top-100 receivers (yards per game) nationally.
- Diggs is the only Maryland freshman to record back-to-back 100-yard receiving games since at least 1985, the earliest game-by-game statistics were recorded at the school.
- Maryland allowed Wake Forest to complete just 32.4 percent of its passes (13 of 38). That is the lowest percentage by an opponent with at least 30 passing attempts since Duke went 13 of 42 (30.9%) on Nov. 14, 1998.
- Joe Vellano's father, Paul Vellano, was inducted into the Maryland Athletics Hall of Fame on Oct. 5. The elder Vellano was a first team All-American in 1973, while Joe was a second team All-American in 2011. The father-son combo represent one of four known father-son All-America combos to attend the same FBS school (also Lee and Travis McGriff at Florida; Kevin and Drew Butler at Georgia; Archie and Eli Manning at Ole Miss).
- Thirteen players have made their first career starts at some point this season. In the season opener against William & Mary, quarterback Perry Hills, running back Albert Reid, safety Sean Davis, defensive back Jeremiah Johnson, linebacker Cole Farrand, nose tackle Darius Kilgo and offensive lineman Nick Klemm debuted. Against Connecticut, wide receiver Stefon Diggs made his first career start; defensive back Isaac Goins and running back Brandon Ross made their starting debuts at West Virginia. Defensive back Anthony Nixon and offensive linemen Mike Madaras and Andrew Zeller made their first starts vs. Wake Forest.
- Fourteen players saw their first career action for Maryland against William & Mary, and 22 players have seen their first career action for Maryland at some point this season (12 true freshmen, seven redshirt freshmen, two juniors, one senior).
- Maryland's defense allowed just 682 total yards to opponents through its first three games (William & Mary - 229, Temple - 230, Connecticut - 223). That marks its best defensive performance in a three-game span since 2004, when it held The Citadel (137), West Virginia (156) and Eastern Michigan (275) to a total of 568.
- Maryland held a high-powered West Virginia offense that came in averaging 226 rushing yards per game to just 25 yards on 25 attempts.
- West Virginia came into its game with Maryland averaging 612 yards of total offense and 55.5 points per game. The Terps held the Mountaineers well below those averages, surrendering 363 yards and 31 points, seven of which came on a fumble return for a TD by the WVU defense.
- The Terps surrendered just 45 yards to Wake Forest in the second half, including just four in the fourth quarter. Maryland has been at its best in the second half all year, surrendering just 121.4 yards in the second half.
- The Terps are holding opponents to 2.3 yards per carry, which ranks third nationally. Of the opponents' 174 rushing attempts this season, 122 (70.1%) have been for three yards or less (28 of 41 vs. William & Mary; 28 of 39 vs. Temple; 25 of 40 vs. Connecticut; 20 of 25 vs. West Virginia; 21 of 29 vs. Wake Forest).
- Demetrius Hartsfield leads the team with 43 tackles and three sacks, and has had a hand in three turnovers, also a team high (one interception, two fumble recoveries).
- The Terps have done a good job controlling the clock. In five games, Maryland has had the ball for an average of 31:43 to 28:17 for the opponent. That's a major

- Head coach Randy Edsall hands out game balls for each win. In the win over William & Mary, Marcus Leak got the game ball for offense, Joe Vellano for defense and Nathan Renfro for special teams. In the win over Temple, Sal Conaboy got the game ball for offense, Demetrius Hartsfield for defense and A.J. Francis for special teams. Against Wake, Kevin Dorsey got the offensive game ball, Jeremiah Johnson the defensive and Anthony Nixon special teams.

- Against William & Mary, Perry Hills became the first true freshman starter at quarterback for Maryland since Latrez Harrison in 1999. He also became the first freshman to start a season opener since redshirt freshman Calvin McCall on Sept. 2, 1999, in a 6-0 win over Temple.

- Nine bowl teams from last year appear on Maryland's 2012 schedule: Temple (Gildan New Mexico Bowl), West Virginia (Discover Orange Bowl), Wake Forest (Franklin American Mortgage Music City), Virginia (Chick-fil-A Bowl), NC State (Belk Bowl), Georgia Tech (Hyundai Sun Bowl), Clemson (Discover Orange Bowl), Florida State (Champs Sports Bowl) and UNC (AdvoCare V100 Independence Bowl).

YOUTH A THEME EARLY ON...

- Maryland has relied on a number of young players early on this season as injuries took their toll in the preseason and underclassmen earned playing time and even starting positions. In the season opener against William & Mary, the Terps played 12 true freshmen, including four that started (place-kicker Brad Craddock, safety Sean Davis, quarterback Perry Hills and running back Albert Reid). That marks the most true freshmen to play in a game for the Terps since at least 1998, the first year records of game-by-game starts were recorded at Maryland. The closest the Terps have come to that in the past 15 years was in 2009, when nine true freshmen played in three different games (Virginia, Duke, NC State).

- No team in the ACC has played more true freshmen than Maryland so far. The closest team is Duke, which has played 10. In fact, just eight teams in the FBS have played more than Maryland (LSU, Ohio State, TCU, Texas - 15; - 14; Akron, Colorado, Georgia, Tulane - 13).

OPPONENT DRIVES...

- Maryland ranks third in the ACC and 33rd nationally in scoring defense, having allowed 20.4 points per game through five contests. Those numbers are somewhat deceiving though, as several of the opponents' points have come on defense, special teams, or on short fields. Opponents have scored 47 points off Maryland turnovers (of 102 total points surrendered) and seven more on a punt return TD (Connecticut).

MARYLAND-VIRGINIA SERIES HISTORY...

- Saturday's game will mark the 77th meeting between the Terrapins and Cavaliers, the most between Maryland and any other school in the Terps' 120-year football history. The schools have met every season since 1957.

- Maryland leads the all-time series, which began in 1919, by a 42-32-2 margin.

- Maryland is 21-18 all-time against Virginia on the road, and has won two of the last three meetings in Charlottesville. The road team has won five of the last six meetings.

- Virginia has won four out of the last five in the series, with Maryland's win coming in Charlottesville in 2010.

- From 1969 through 2000, play between the two schools was feast or famine for one team. From 1969-87, the Terrapins held an 18-1 advantage in the series and at one point ran off 16 wins in a row,

the longest streak in the series. Then from 1988 to 2000, the series swung almost exclusively to the Cavs as they were 11-2 in that span. Over the last 11 meetings, Virginia holds a 6-5 edge.

- Maryland's 41-21 win in 2001 broke a string of nine straight losses to Virginia. In the win, the Terps allowed a 24-7 lead to be cut to three in the third quarter before scoring 17 unanswered points in the fourth to win going away.

MIX OF YOUTH & EXPERIENCE AT THE SKILL POSITIONS...

- Freshman Stefon Diggs and sophomore Marcus Leak have been the biggest playmakers in the receiving corps through five games. Diggs has a team-high 17 catches for 364 yards, while Leak has 14 receptions for 231 yards. Diggs is coming off back-to-back 100-yard receiving games, with 113 yards and two touchdowns on three catches vs. West Virginia and 105 yards on five catches vs. Wake Forest. The freshman leads the ACC with 21.4 yards per catch (minimum 15 catches).

- The Terps have experience at receiver as well with seniors Kevin Dorsey and Kerry Boykins. Dorsey has seven catches for 90 yards and caught his first

touchdown of the season against Wake Forest, a 33-yarder. Dorsey is first on Maryland career receptions (70) and receiving yards (867) lists, while Boykins is second with 57 receptions and third with 669 yards.

- The running back position is represented by all underclassmen with sophomore Justus Pickett and true freshmen Wes Brown and Albert Reid. Redshirt freshman Brandon Ross saw his first game action against West Virginia after missing the first three games with a hamstring injury. Pickett was the workhorse against Temple, carrying the ball a career-high 21 times for 69 yards and he owns the team lead with three rushing touchdowns. Brown has shown the ability to break runs - his 21-yard run against the Owls is the longest rush by a Terp so far this year, and he had a 19-yard touchdown run against Connecticut. Brown had seven carries for 50 yards against Temple, an average of 7.1 yards per carry. He had 14 carries for 74 yards against Connecticut's No. 1 ranked rushing defense and on the season is averaging 4.5 yards per carry.

DEPTH, EXPERIENCE ON THE D-LINE...

- The defensive line has been a major strength of the team through the season's first five games. All-American Joe Vellano (end), A.J. Francis (end) and Darius Kilgo (nose) have seen the majority of the action, with Keith Bowers, Justin Anderson and Quinton Jefferson also in the rotation.

- The Terps rank highly in a number of key defensive statistics: Maryland is allowing just 257.2 yards of total offense which ranks seventh in the FBS; opponents are averaging just 2.3 yards per rush, which ranks third; and the Terps are surrendering 81.0 rushing yards per game, which ranks seventh.

- In addition to that, the defensive line has been disruptive in getting to the backfield. Vellano ranks sixth in the conference with 1.6 tackles for loss/game and third among defensive linemen with 5.6 total tackles per game. Francis has two sacks and Kilgo has one and a half.

- The Terps have held opponents to low rushing yards per attempt throughout the season. William & Mary had just 2.5 yards per carry, Temple had just 1.3, West Virginia had just 1.0 and Wake Forest had 2.4.

CORE OF LINEBACKERS RETURN...

- The Terps have a talented and experienced group of linebackers. Maryland is in possession of the ACC's No. 2 active player in career tackles and top forced-fumble producer in the league last year. Demetrius Hartsfield's 303 career tackles are the second most by an active player in the conference, while Darin Drakeford tied for the ACC lead in forced fumbles (four) despite missing four games due to injury a year ago. Alex Twine has started the first four games at one of the outside spots opposite

a sack, two pass breakups, a forced fumble and a fumble recovery in two games. Cole Farrand starts at the other inside spot opposite Hartsfield and has provided very solid play, with 26 tackles and five tackles for a loss (2nd on the team) so far.

• Hartsfield is the leader, having played in 37 career games with 34 starts. He's off to a splendid start to the 2012 season, with 43 tackles, three sacks (6th in the ACC), an interception and two fumble recoveries already. Hartsfield has helped seal wins in all three games: he recovered a fumble late against William & Mary, intercepted a deflected pass late against Temple; and sacked Wake Forest QB Tanner Price on fourth-and-15 with under a minute to play.

SECONDARY ROLES...

• The Terps have three veterans and one first-year starter in the secondary. Maryland ranks 15th nationally in passing defense, having allowed just 176.2 passing yards per game. Opponents have completed just 71 of 139 passes (51.0 percent) and thrown just seven touchdowns.

• Dexter McDougle started all 12 games last season at cornerback, leading the team with six pass breakups and tying for the team lead with three interceptions, and is again the starter at one cornerback position. He's joined by freshman Jeremiah Johnson, who saw most of his time on special teams in 2011. Johnson was a disruptive force in the season opener; he recorded seven tackles, a pass breakup, 1.5 sacks and forced a fumble with under two minutes to play that Maryland recovered to seal the win over William & Mary. He has a team-high six pass breakups, four of which came against Wake Forest. That's tied for the most in a game by any ACC player this year (also Ross Cockrell, Duke).

• Safeties Eric Franklin and Matt Robinson are the other veterans in the secondary. Franklin led the team in solo tackles (64), ranked second in total tackles (106) and tied for second on the team with four pass breakups last year, and is second on the team with three pass breakups this season. Robinson has only played in two games due to injuries - he missed the first two games with a shoulder injury and the Wake Forest game with a groin injury. In his absence, freshmen Sean Davis and Anthony Nixon have filled in ably. Nixon got a game ball for his play against Wake Forest.

STABILITY AT TIGHT END...

• Tight end is one of the most experienced positions on the team with all four players back this season. Senior Matt Furstenburg has started the last two years and has become one of the top tight ends in the ACC. A member of the 2011 John Mackey Award midseason watch list and the preseason watch list this fall, he ranked third in the conference among tight ends in both receptions (2.6 pg) and receiving yards (29.0 pg). Furstenburg has nine catches for 113 yards so far this year, including a 22-yard touchdown reception against Temple.

• Furstenburg has a capable backup in Devonte Campbell, who had a pair of touchdown catches last season. The senior is a strong, athletic presence who has played in 32 career games. Senior Ryan Schlothauer served as the No. 3 tight end a year ago, and is perhaps Maryland's most valuable player on special teams. Schlothauer has seen action on five of Maryland's six special teams units (kickoff, kickoff return, punt, punt return and field goal/PAT). Dave Stinebaugh adds depth at tight end and is a special teams contributor.

ELECTRIFYING FRESHMAN...

• Stefon Diggs has been electric for Maryland as a return man and receiver early this season. The true freshman ranks second in the ACC and 19th nationally with 154.8 all-purpose yards per game, and he has caused problems for opposing defenses in a variety of ways.

• Diggs leads the ACC with 21.4 yards per catch and ranks ninth with 72.8 receiving yards per game. He has been named ACC Rookie of the Week twice (Sept. 24, Oct. 8) after recording 100-yard receiving games vs. West Virginia and Wake Forest. Diggs is the first Maryland freshman to record back-to-back 100-yard receiving games since at least 1985, when the school started recording game-by-game stats.

• Diggs' 223 all-purpose yards against Connecticut are the most by a Maryland freshman since 2008 when Torrey Smith had 245 all-purpose yards against Boston College (11/29/08), and the most for a true

freshman since 1992 when Jermaine Lewis had 236 yards against Florida State (11/7/92).

- Against West Virginia, Diggs had his best game yet by turning three receptions into 113 yards and two touchdowns. His two TDs came on catches of 44 and 56 yards.

- Diggs 26.6 yards per kickoff return on the season ranks 27th in the country. In addition, he ranks 33rd in the nation in punt return average (10.9 yards).

- Diggs was one of the top ranked players in the country as a high school senior. He was rated the No. 2 wide receiver by Rivals.com and the best recruit in Maryland by Rivals.com. He was selected to participate in the 2012 U.S. Army All-American Bowl and finished his senior season with 770 yards receiving and eight touchdowns to go along with 277 rushing yards and three touchdowns.

FRESHMAN UNDER CENTER...

- Perry Hills became the first true freshman to start for Maryland since Latrez Harrison in 1999 when he started the season opener against William & Mary. He also became the first freshman to start a season opener since redshirt freshman Calvin McCall on Sept. 2, 1999.

- Hills was named the backup to C.J. Brown on Aug. 14 after a morning practice. Brown suffered a torn ACL that evening, and Hills earned the starting job by impressing his coaches and teammates with poise and command. Though he threw three interceptions in his first collegiate game, Hills was steady in the fourth quarter when he led Maryland on a 69-yard game-winning drive. He finished 16 of 24 for 145 yards.

- In week two against Temple, Hills was much improved. En route to ACC Rookie of the Week honors, Hills went 11 of 21 for 190 yards, two passing TDs and a rushing TD. He led Maryland on six scoring drives (four TDs, two field goals), including a 23-point second quarter in the 36-27 victory.

- Against No. 8 West Virginia, Hills turned in his best performance yet. The freshman went 20 of 29 for 305 yards and three touchdowns.

- Hills has been at his best in the fourth quarter. He is 19 of 27 for 340 yards and two touchdowns in the final stanza.

- Hills was a two-sport star in high school at Central Catholic in Pittsburgh, Pa. He led the football team to the WPIAL semifinals in his junior and senior seasons, throwing for over 2,000 yards and 13 touchdowns in 2011. As a wrestler, he had a career record of 145-24, including going 35-0 at 195 pounds as a senior en route to the state title. Hills' wrestling acumen is something that Edsall was drawn to in the recruiting process. "I have always had good luck with guys who are wrestlers who play football," said Edsall. "With wrestling there is a lot of discipline and sacrifice. His experience as a wrestler is something that I really liked as well."

SPECIAL TEAMS MAKEOVER...

- Maryland has all new faces on special teams this season. Freshman Brad Craddock, a native of Adelaide, Australia, is handling the place-kicking duties and hit a 49- and 52-yarder against Wake Forest. Redshirt freshman Nathan Renfro took over the punting duties, while junior Greg Parcher took over long-snapping duties for four-year starter Tim Downs, who graduated. Renfro is averaging 41.3 yards per punt. Freshman Stefon Diggs has taken over in the return game and ranks in the top 35 nationally in punt and kickoff returns.

COACHING STAFF AT A GLANCE...

- Mike Locksley was hired in December as the offensive coordinator and quarterbacks coach. Locksley, a native of Washington, D.C., returned to Maryland after previously spending six years (1997-2002) as an assistant coach on the Terrapins staff. A veteran coach with over 20 years experience, Locksley most recently spent four years (2005-08) as offensive coordinator/quarterbacks coach for the University of Illinois and two-plus years (2009-11) as head coach at the University of New Mexico. Locksley helped the Fighting Illini offense improve from No. 86 nationally in total offense (338.1 yards per game) in 2005 to No. 19 (438.3 yards per game) in 2008. The Illinois

offense ranked in the top 10 nationally (No. 10 in 2006; No. 5 in 2007) in rushing yards. Known for strong recruiting skills, Locksley was listed as a top-25 recruiter in the nation three different times (2003, 2005, 2006) and was a finalist for 2007 recruiter of the year by Rivals.com.

- Brian Stewart was hired in January as the defensive coordinator and secondary coach. A former NFL defensive coordinator, Stewart recently completed a successful two-year stint with the Houston Cougars, who ended 2011 with a 13-1 record and a No. 14 ranking in the final USA Today poll. The Cougars had one of the best defenses in the Football Bowl Subdivision (FBS) in 2011, ranking in the top 15 in five categories: red-zone scoring (second – 67 percent), interceptions (t-third – 21), tackles for loss (sixth – 7.7 per game), turnovers gained (t-10th – 31) and opponent passing efficiency (12th – 111.75 rating). Houston also improved from 96th nationally in scoring defense (32.2 points per game) in 2010 to 35th (22.4) this past year. Stewart went to Houston after an eight-year run as an NFL assistant, including two years (2007-08) as the defensive coordinator with Dallas.

- With the change to a 3-4 defense, Lyndon Johnson will now oversee both outside linebacker positions (Sam and Will), while Andre Powell will take over as special-teams coordinator, in addition to his running

back chores. Last season, Johnson was responsible for the Star position on the defensive side of the ball. Powell was a special-teams coordinator during each of his last two stops – Clemson (2007-10) and North Carolina (2001-06). He handled both running backs and special-teams duties the final three seasons at each job.

- Defensive line coach Greg Gattuso was elevated to assistant head coach. The former head coach of Duquesne (1992-2004), Gattuso spent six seasons (2005-10) as the defensive line coach at Pittsburgh.
- Former offensive lineman Pete DeSouza is now

a student assistant coach. DeSouza, who had not played since his redshirt freshman season (2010) when he was injured in a traffic accident, took a medical hardship.

BYRD GETS A FACELIFT...

• Maryland in August finished the installation of a brand new FieldTurf Revolution surface at Capital One Field at Byrd Stadium. The privately funded \$3 million project resulted in the “coolest” synthetic turf field in the nation and was completed in time for preseason camp. In order to enhance playability for all sports expected to use the facility, and after various tests and discussions, it was decided the playing surface would be a traditional green in color. The end zones for football will have a design reminiscent of the Maryland state flag and reinforcing the “Maryland Pride” theme of Maryland Athletics. The project at Maryland is the first of its kind in the United States and features exclusive new heat-reducing technology - CoolPlay - which, coupled with the patented silica sand and cryogenic rubber infill, will provide the facility with the “coolest” infill technology. FieldTurf has done extensive temperature testing which shows that CoolPlay infill provides for a difference of up to 15 degrees Fahrenheit versus traditional rubber infill systems. The many benefits of the new field include protecting the health of the student-athletes, improved playability in inclement weather, annual savings on field maintenance, a fantastic recruiting tool and tremendous revenue-generating opportunities through events such as concerts, high school games and other outside athletic events.

WALK-ONS REWARDED...

• On Aug. 28, head coach Randy Edsall announced that he would award six walk-ons scholarships for the 2012-13 academic year for their hard work, dedication and commitment to the football program. The six walk-ons that earned scholarships for the season are: senior defensive back Clarence Claiborne, junior linebacker Yannik Cudjoe-Virgil, senior running back Jeff Hernandez, senior running back Kwabena Ofori, junior long snapper Greg Parcher and sophomore defensive lineman Alex Walker. “I was fortunate today that I could bring [those six] in and put [them] on scholarship and to see the reaction from all of the guys. Some of them were very emotional. To be able to do that makes you feel good for them and their families. To let them know that if you work hard and have ability and do what people ask you do to there are rewards out there for you... We are all very proud of them and thankful for their hard work. I know their parents will be proud of them and what they accomplished.”

INJURIES TAKE A TOLL...

• In 2011, Maryland suffered a number of injuries throughout the season on both sides of the ball. In fact, according to research done by Phil Steele, the Terps lost the most starts due to injury in the FBS last season.

RANDY EDSALL

Head Coach

Syracuse '80 • Second Year

Randy Edsall enters his second season as head football coach at the University of Maryland coming off a tremendous off-season for the program in the areas of recruiting and academics.

Edsall was named the 34th coach in Maryland football history in January 2011 when he signed a six-year contract.

In the area of recruiting Coach Edsall and his staff placed a great emphasis on the local Maryland/Washington, D.C. market which is heavily recruited by schools across the nation and is considered a football hotbed. The result of this focus was the signing of 25 athletes, 13 from the area.

In addition, under Edsall's command and following a pattern he started at the University of Connecticut, the football program's Athletic Progress Rate (APR) moved significantly upward after a five year decline. The football team's APR, which measures eligibility and retention, increased its multi-year score from 922 (2009-2010) to 931 and its single year score from 905 to 972.

Prior to coming to College Park, Edsall, a native of nearby Glen Rock, Pa, spent 12 seasons coaching the University of Connecticut Huskies where he took the program from FCS (formerly I-AA) to five bowl games, including a BCS bowl. The 2010 Big East Coach of the Year led the Huskies to a 33-19 record over his last four seasons there, including two bowl victories and his leadership resulted in UConn being the first program ever to go from FBS newcomer to BCS bowl participant in just seven seasons.

Randy departed UConn as the school's all-time leader in career wins (74) and most games coached (144). He was a two-time recipient of the prestigious Bowl Championship Division Head Coach of the Year in New England by the Gridiron Club of Greater Boston (2007, 2010).

During his tenure at UConn, the Huskies finished in the top twenty nationally for total offense twice (2003, 2004) and total defense three times (2002, 2005, 2008). Under Edsall's guidance Connecticut defeated teams from the ACC, Big Ten, Big East, Big 12, Conference USA and the SEC.

In 2007, as Edsall continued to grow the program to prominence, the Huskies earned their first-ever national rankings peaking at #13 in the BCS standings in November. That year they became just the second Big East team ever to go 7-0 at home and defeat three teams at home that were ranked in the top ten during the season.

Off the field, just as he is doing at Maryland, Edsall's teams were strong in the classroom as well. In 2007,

2008 and 2009 UConn was recognized by the American Football Coaches Association for its high graduation rate. In 2003 UConn was the only public Division I-A school to graduate at least 90% of its football players and in 2005, it was one of only eight schools to both graduate 70% and win a bowl game.

When Randy was named the head coach at Connecticut on December 21, 1998 he brought 19 years of coaching experience with him. He earned the job at Connecticut after a year as the defensive coordinator at Georgia Tech where the 14th ranked Yellow Jackets went 9-2.

Prior to his season at Georgia Tech Edsall spent three seasons under two-time Super Bowl Champion coach Tom Coughlin as the secondary coach for the NFL Jacksonville Jaguars. During his time in Jacksonville the expansion Jaguars reached the playoffs twice, including a berth in the 1996 AFC Championship Game.

Edsall began his coaching career in 1980 at his alma mater, Syracuse University. The former quarterback at Syracuse started as a graduate assistant (1980-82) before joining the staff in 1983 overseeing the running backs under head coach Dick MacPherson. Edsall oversaw the running backs for three years (1983-84 and 1986) and oversaw the tight ends in 1985 before making the switch to defense.

He coached the Syracuse defensive backs from 1987-1990 and during that time the Orangemen were ranked among the Division I-A leaders in pass defense. After the 1990 season Tom Coughlin, then coach of Boston College, hired Randy to coach the defensive backs at BC.

Edsall was a three-year letter winner in football, basketball and baseball at Susquehannock High School (Pa.) and was an all-state selection in all three sports as a senior which led to induction into the York Area Sports Hall of Fame.

At Syracuse he earned a bachelor's degree in physical education from Syracuse in 1980 and a master's degree in health and physical education in 1982.

Edsall and his wife, Eileen met at Syracuse University where she was a basketball and volleyball standout who was later inducted into the Syracuse University Hall of Fame. They have a daughter, Alexi (22) and a son, Corey (19).

COLLEGE PARK, Md. - Justus Pickett ran for a 6-yard touchdown with 9:52 left in the fourth quarter, and Brad Craddock added the tie-breaking extra point to give Maryland a 7-6 victory over William & Mary in the season opener for both teams Saturday.

Maryland overcame a slow start against its Football Championship Subdivision opponent, which led most of the game before losing its opener for the 10th time in 11 years.

The Terrapins won despite turning the ball over four times and missing a short field goal.

Freshman quarterback Perry Hills, in his first collegiate start, completed 16 of 24 for 145 yards and directed the winning 10-play, 69-yard drive, but he threw three interceptions.

The Terrapins turned the ball over three times in the first quarter, when the Tribe took a 6-0 lead on two Drake Kuhn field goals.

Maryland missed a short field goal in the second quarter and left the field at halftime trailing 6-0.

Maryland's scoring drive came on its first possession of the fourth quarter and began after Kuhn missed a 48-yard field goal.

The Terrapins went 69 yards in 10 plays to get up Pickett's 6-yard scoring scamper around left end. The Terps converted two third-down plays on the drive, including a 22-yard pass from Hills to Kevin Dorsey on a third-and-8.

Hills went 3-for-4 passing for 41 yards on the drive and added an 8-yard scramble.

Maryland's defense, led by 13 stops by Demetrius Hartsfield and 11 by Joe Vellano, held the Tribe to 229 yards in total offense, no touchdowns in the game and no points in the final three quarters.

PHILADELPHIA - Perry Hills threw two touchdowns and ran for one and Stefan Diggs had 135 all-purpose yards to help Maryland beat Temple 36-27 Saturday.

The Terps built a 26-3 lead by halftime on Hills' three touchdowns and a stingy defense. A week after holding William & Mary to 104 rushing yards, Maryland's front seven was even stronger, holding the Owls to 28 rushing yards in the first half and 52 in the game.

Still, Temple made a game out of it in a turnover-filled second half. The Terps lost three fumbles in the half, and Temple got within 29-27 on Chris Coyer's 35-yard touchdown pass to Jalen Fitzpatrick with 7:04 left to play.

COLLEGE PARK, Md. - Freshman Stefan Diggs had 223 all-purpose yards, including a 29-yard touchdown catch, but Maryland's comeback attempt fell short as Connecticut defeated the Terps 24-21 Saturday.

Lyle McCombs rushed for 94 yards and a fourth-quarter touchdown to lead the Huskies. Scott McCummings, who also came in at quarterback occasionally, ran for a 3-yard score that gave the Huskies a 14-0 first-half lead.

That came after Nick Williams scored the game's first touchdown on a 58-yard punt return.

The Huskies outgained Maryland 148-80 in total yardage in the first half and controlled the ball for 18 minutes, 40 seconds. They also came up with timely plays, converting four of nine third-down situations to keep the Maryland offense off the field.

But Maryland's offense responded in the second quarter. A key play came on fourth-and-4 from the Connecticut 37, when quarterback Perry Hills completed an 18-yard pass to Diggs.

One play later, Wes Brown ran for a 19-yard touchdown, and Brad Craddock's extra point cut the lead to 14-7 with 10:24 remaining in the half.

Connecticut linebacker Yawin Smallwood sacked Hills and forced a third-quarter fumble that Angelo Pruitt recovered for the Huskies at the Maryland 23. They couldn't pick up a first down, but Chad Christen kicked a 34-yard field goal with 3:29 left in the quarter for a 17-7 lead.

After a 75-yard drive, Maryland made it 17-14 on the second play of the fourth quarter when Hills threw a 29-yard touchdown pass to Stefan Diggs on third-and-10. The Terrapins' Marcus Leak tipped the pass and Diggs grabbed it for a touchdown to make it 17-14.

The Huskies answered on their next possession, driving 76 yards to take a 24-14 lead on McCombs' 11-yard touchdown run, but Maryland again countered.

Diggs returned the ensuing kickoff 45 yards to setup great field position, and Hills led the Terps on a seven-play, 53-yard drive capped by his 10-yard touchdown run to make it 24-21 with 4:39 left.

After the defense forced a three-and-out and Maryland got the ball back following a Huskies punt, the Terps reached the Connecticut 39 before their drive stalled with 17 seconds left.

MORGANTOWN, W.Va. - Freshman Perry Hills threw for a season-high 305 yards and three touchdowns, two to freshman Stefon Diggs, but Maryland fell to No. 8 West Virginia 31-21 on Saturday.

Maryland held the high-powered offense of West Virginia, which came in averaging 55.5 points per game and 612 yards per game, mostly in check.

Fourteen of the Mountaineers points came off Terrapin turnovers, including a 51-yard fumble return TD by Doug Rigg early in the first quarter. The Terps allowed 363 yards of total offense, had nine tackles for loss and allowed just 25 rushing yards on 25 attempts.

COLLEGE PARK, Md. - Stefon Diggs caught five passes for 105 yards, including a 63-yard reception that set up Justus Pickett's game winning one-yard touchdown run with 5:37 left, as Maryland knocked off Wake Forest 19-14 Saturday afternoon.

Maryland's defense limited Wake Forest to 45 yards in the second half, including just three in the fourth quarter. The Terps controlled possession in the second half, holding the ball for 19:59 compared to 10:01 for Wake Forest.

That allowed Maryland, now 3-2 overall and 1-0 in the ACC, to win its ACC opener for the fifth straight season. The last time the Terps didn't win their conference opener was 2007, a 31-24 overtime loss at Wake Forest.

The Terps took the lead for good with a 5-play, 58-yard drive ending with Pickett's one-yard plunge on third-and-goal. Diggs, who had 113 receiving yards at West Virginia two weeks ago, provided the key play with his 63-yard catch.

Wake Forest had opened the game with a bang. Quarterback Tanner Price connected with Terence Davis on the third play of the game for a 73-yard touchdown to put the Deacons up 7-0.

Maryland answered on the next drive as Brad Craddock connected on a 49-yard field goal to cut the Wake Forest lead to 7-3. Craddock added another field goal later in the first quarter, this time from 52 yards, to make it 7-6.

Just before halftime, Maryland quarterback Perry Hills connected with Kevin Dorsey for a 33-yard touchdown to give the Terps a 13-7 lead heading into the locker room.

Wake Forest answered and took a 14-13 lead in the third quarter when Price threw a 7-yard touchdown to Tommy Bohanon.

After Pickett's touchdown, the Maryland defense protected that lead with two key sacks late in the fourth quarter. Kenneth Tate sacked Price with 2:38 remaining in the game on a key third down. On fourth-and-15, Demetrius Hartsfield ended the drive with another sack, sealing the victory.
