VIRGINIA-LIBERTY SERIES

- Virginia owns a 30-20-1 edge in its series with Liberty.
- UVa is making its first trip to Lynchburg since April 5, 2005, a 10-2 UVa win.
- The Cavaliers downed Liberty, 7-2, on March 13 in Charlottesville and have won nine of their last 10 games against the Flames.
- The Flames ended an eight-game losing streak to Virginia last year with an 8-0 win at Davenport Field.

VIRGINIA-VMI SERIES

- Virginia holds a 101-29 advantage in the series with VMI.
- UVa has won 10 of the last 12 meetings and 14 straight home games against the Keydets (last home loss on March 6, 1990).
- The Cavaliers picked up a 12-3 win over VMI last season at Davenport Field (March 21).

CAVALIERS POPULAR IN MIDWEEK ROAD GAMES

- Virginia has been a big draw during its intrastate road games over the past few years, setting attendance records at five schools.
- The Liberty game sold out last week, filling the 2,500-seat Liberty Baseball Stadium.
- With Virginia as the opponent since 2010, school attendance records have been set at William and Mary (3/10/10, 1,304), James Madison (3/17/10, 1,815), VMI (4/14/10, 1,463), Radford (4/19/11, 1,373) and VCU (5/3/11, 5,421).
- The VCU mark also was a state record for a college baseball game.

VIRGINIA BATTLES PAIR OF IN-STATE OPPONENTS THIS WEEK

- Under the current coaching staff (since 2004), the Cavaliers have a 83-12-1 record against in-state opponents.
- UVa is 2-0 this year against foes from the commonwealth of Virginia.

ROAD WARRIORS

- After playing 23 of their first 28 games at Davenport Field, UVa will play 11 of its next 19 games on the road.
- UVa will play three of its four April ACC series on the road against Wake Forest, Georgia Tech and Virginia Tech.
- UVa's lone home ACC series in the month is April 19-21 against Florida State.

ODDS AND ENDS

- UVa is playing its first game on FieldTurf this year and will play four of its next five games on artificial turf.
- UVa ranks second in the ACC in ERA (2.31), third in batting (.315) and seventh in fielding (.968).
- The Cavaliers are tied with Arizona for the national lead with 22 triples.
- Virginia pitchers have issued by far the fewest walks in the ACC (60).
- UVa is 22-0 when leading after six innings this season.

PAPI CONTINUES HIS TEAR

- Mike Papi has been on a torrid pace at the plate of late, with hits in 20 of his last 32 at bats over his last 10 games (.625).
- He owns seven doubles, a homer and 10 RBI in that stretch and also has scored 14 runs while reaching base at an eye-popping .683 clip.
- Papi now owns enough at bats to qualify for the national rankings; he stands second nationally with a .472 batting average. Georgia State's Chad Prain leads (.486).
- He owns a 10-game hit streak, which is second longest on the team this year (Branden Cogswell currently is on a 12-game hit streak).

BULLPEN SLAMS THE DOOR

- Virginia's bullpen has been outstanding of late, allowing just an earned run, 15 hits and four walks in the last 35 1/3 innings of work (0.25 ERA, .129 BAA).
- UVA's pen did not allow a run in 13 innings in the Miami series.
- The Cavaliers' relief corps has a 1.84 ERA this year while limiting opponents to a .203 batting average.

OFFENSE PUTS UP BIG INNINGS REGULARLY

- Virginia has scored three or more runs in an inning 38 times this year.
- The Cavaliers have had just six games where they have not recorded at least three runs in one inning.

- UVA has scored three runs in an inning on 20 occasions this year.
- The Cavaliers' most dominant innings: the fifth (outscored opponents 32-6), seventh (30-7) and eighth (49-5).
- UVA averages 8.4 runs per game, outscoring its opponents 235-77.

STARTERS SHINING IN 2013

- Virginia's starting pitchers have excelled this season.
- UVA's starters own a 15-2 record and 2.64 ERA this year, while allowing only 25 extra-base hits.
- The starters racked up a streak of 42 2/3 consecutive scoreless innings which ran from Feb. 16-March 2.

FRESHMEN PLAYING KEY ROLES

- Virginia has leaned heavily on its first-year players early this season, particularly on the mound.
- Twelve freshmen already have seen playing time – tied for seventh-most nationally and second among ACC teams (Clemson 13, Maryland 12).
- Tennessee leads the nation with 17 freshmen who have played this year.
- Seven freshmen have accounted for 46 percent of the innings pitched this year (117 1/3 of 253 2/3 total).
- Joe McCarthy has started all 28 contests in the batting order.

VIRGINIA SLOWS THE RUNNING GAME

- Virginia has shown the propensity to slow its opponents' running game this year.
- Virginia has allowed just 14 stolen base attempts in 28 games, with eight successful steals.
- The Cavaliers also have picked off seven baserunners.
- UVA allowed three stolen bases to Maryland, which entered with 44 steals in 12 games, and none to NC State, who entered with 47 stolen bases in 53 attempts.

VIRGINIA AMONG NATIONAL LEADERS IN RUNS

- Entering the week, Virginia was fourth nationally in runs scored and scoring.
- The Cavaliers have scored 235 runs (8.4 per game) in 28 games.
- The Cavaliers rank among the nation's top 15 in nine statistical categories on offense.

NO FREE PASSES ...

- Virginia pitchers make opposing batters earn their way on base. The Virginia pitching staff has issued just 60 walks in 28 games, by far the fewest walks allowed in the ACC this year. Clemson is second with 84 walks.
- UVA allows just 2.13 walks per nine innings, which is fourth fewest nationally.
- The Cavaliers also have hit only 11 batters this year (third fewest nationally).

... BUT PLENTY OF FREEBIES FOR UVA BATTERS

- While the Cavaliers' pitchers have thrived on not issuing walks, Virginia batters have found plenty of ways to get on base.
- Virginia batters rank eighth nationally with 149 walks (fourth in ACC).
- UVA batters also have been hit by 44 pitches, which is tied for 18th most nationally and also ranks third among ACC squads.
- The Cavaliers rank seventh nationally with a .422 on base percentage.

COGSWELL A FORCE AT TOP OF LINEUP

- Branden Cogswell has stepped into the leadoff slot in the batting order and been sensational this year.
- He leads the team with a .377 batting average, 32 runs and a .496 on-base percentage.
- Cogswell has struck out only 11 times in 137 plate appearances.

UVA TIED FOR NATIONAL LEAD IN SHUTOUTS

- Virginia has racked up six shutouts in its first 28 games, which is tied for the national lead.
- Florida Gulf Coast, Rice, South Carolina and Texas Tech also have six shutouts.
- The total is already tied with the 1996 team for fifth most in a season at Virginia.
- UVA finished with just two shutouts in 2012.

DOWNES ANCHORS LINEUP AT CLEANUP

- In his first year as the Cavaliers' cleanup hitter, Brandon Downes has started strong and is batting .321 with a .438 on base percentage.
- In 28 games he has five homers and 28 RBI; in 34 games (26 starts) last year, he posted one home run and 22 RBI.
- Downes also has scored 32 runs, eclipsing his 2012 mark of 20, and leads the team with 16 extra-base hits, including four triples (sixth most nationally).

WADDELL STRONG IN FIRST YEAR

- Rookie southpaw Brandon Waddell has been sensational in his first six starts. With 48 strikeouts (in 37 2/3 IP) this year, he tops all freshmen nationally.
- He was named one of Collegiate Baseball's six National Players of the Week on Feb. 25 following a dominating outing vs. Toledo.
- In six innings, he struck out 15 batters, most by a UVA freshman hurler since Seth Greisinger fanned 15 against UNC in 1994. He allowed just six hits and one walk.
- On Feb. 15 at ECU, Waddell became the first UVA freshman to make the opening-game start since Dave Sammons on Feb. 26, 1986, at William and Mary.

FIFTH-YEARS PROVIDE LEADERSHIP

- Virginia has a pair of veteran fifth-year seniors set to guide the young 2013 team: Jared King and Scott Silverstein.
- King has played 168 career games, with 149 career starts. His streak of 90 straight starts, dating to 2011, was snapped March 2 in the first game of the DH.
- Silverstein was the Cavaliers' Saturday starter for most of 2012 after battling back from a pair of shoulder surgeries.
- The two have been part of two ACC championship teams, three regional championship squads and two College World Series teams.

A HOT TICKET AT DAVENPORT FIELD

- UVa fans continue to fill Davenport Field, as more than 110,000 fans have attended Cavalier games each of the past three seasons. UVa has ranked among the top 20 programs nationally in attendance each of the last three years.
- Despite the chilly temperatures and poor weather, Virginia ranks 13th in total attendance (58,622) and 16th in average attendance (2,664) this year.
- UVa ranked 15th nationally in total attendance (112,281) and 19th in average attendance (3,208) last year.
- Davenport Field seats 4,980 per game, slightly down this year after the addition of more chairback seats in place of the bleacher seats in the grandstand.
- The entire reserved section in the grandstand is sold out once again this year.

CHANGES AT DAVENPORT FIELD

- Davenport Field underwent several changes during the offseason.
- A new sand-based playing surface has been installed. After removing the previous surface, crews put in a new irrigation and field drainage system (previous field had no drainage system).
- The \$1 million project also included the installation of a new synthetic warning track that runs in foul territory between the foul poles as well as new dugout flooring surfaces and a new FieldTurf collar behind home plate.
- Home plate was moved in about five feet, creating more foul territory down the lines as well as new field dimensions: 332-370-404-370-332.
- In separate projects, new chairback seats were added to replace the grandstand bleachers and a new video board was erected.

O'CONNOR FOURTH AMONG ACTIVE COACHES IN WIN PERCENTAGE

- Virginia head coach Brian O'Connor is 436-152-2 (.738) in 10 seasons at the helm of the Cavaliers.
- O'Connor's 73.4 percent winning percentage entering the season ranked fourth among active Division I head coaches behind only UNC's Mike Fox (.744), Florida State's Mike Martin (.743) and Wichita State's Gene Stephenson (.735).

CAVALIERS BOAST SECOND-MOST WINS IN NATION SINCE 2009

- Virginia posted 195 wins from 2009-12 – second most in Division I baseball (South Carolina, 198).
- UVa set a school record with 49 wins in 2009, topped it in 2010 with 51 victories, then upped it again in 2011 with a national-best 56 wins.
- Jared King and Scott Silverstein are in their fifth years at UVa and have been part of this entire stretch.
