VIRGINIA-NC STATE SERIES

- NC State holds a 116-63-1 edge in the all-time series.
- The Wolfpack took two of three games against the Cavaliers last year in Raleigh.
- All three games last year were decided by two runs, and six of the last seven have been decided by three runs or fewer.
- UVa has not won a series vs. NC State since March 23-25, 2001, when it took two of three from the Wolfpack in Charlottesville.

IN ELITE COMPANY

- With 32 wins, UVa joins Georgia and North Carolina with the most wins in the country.
- Only nine teams nationally boast 30 or more wins – George Mason has 31, while Coastal Carolina, East Carolina, LSU, New Mexico and Ole Miss each have 30 victories.

O'CONNOR LOOKS TO BECOME THIRD-FASTEST TO 250

- UVa head coach Brian O'Connor enters the weekend with 248 career wins in his six seasons at Virginia (346 games total).
- If he can win twice this weekend, he will become the third-fastest to reach 250 wins in ACC history.
- Only Clemson's Jack Leggett (338 games) and FSU's Mike Martin (343 - since joining ACC) have reached 250 wins faster.
- O'Connor is 248-97-1 (.718) at Virginia.

THE HOMERS KEEP COMING

- Virginia has hit 38 home runs in 41 games this year, topping its total from the entire 2008 season (25 in 62 games).
- It is the most home runs of any UVa team in the Brian O'Connor coaching era (since 2004); the previous high was 35 in 2005.
- Six Cavaliers have at least three homers this year – only three players had at least three in 2008.

HITTING, PITCHING NOT LIMITED TO NON-CONFERENCE

- Virginia, which leads the league in batting (.347) and pitching (3.11), also paces the conference in batting in ACC games only. UVa is hitting .343 in ACC contests.
- In contrast, UVa hit just .260 in ACC games last season.
- UVa also is fourth in ERA in ACC games only with a 4.64 mark (BC leads at 4.46).

NAILBITERS BECOME THE NORM

- Twelve of UVa's last 14 ACC games have been decided by three runs or fewer. (seven wins, six losses, one tie)
- Five of UVa's seven ACC losses have come by one run, with the others coming by two and three runs. Four of the seven came to top-five teams (UNC, Miami).

DEFENSE SHINES OF LATE

- Virginia has not committed an error in the last four games.
- The Cavaliers now have a .971 fielding percentage, which is tied for third in the ACC.
- UVa has a .977 fielding percentage in ACC games, trailing only BC (.983) and Duke (.979).

UNDERCLASSMEN PUT UP BIG NUMBERS

- UVa's offense has been dominated by the freshmen and sophomores.
- In all, 83 percent (424 total) of the Cavaliers' hits this year have come from underclassmen (85 from upperclassmen).
- Freshmen and sophomores also account for 83 percent of the team's runs and RBI.

GROVATT STRONG ON WEEKENDS

- Dan Grovatt has a team-best .397 batting average in ACC games this year (sixth-best in conference).
- His three home runs and four of his five doubles have come in ACC play.
- Grovatt is hitting .400 overall in Virginia's 26 weekend games.

HIGH MARKS IN THE RPI

- Virginia is ninth in the latest RPI ratings, released Tuesday by the NCAA.
- The Cavaliers are up from No. 13 last week.

• The Cavaliers have combined to outscore their opponents 137-43 in the first three innings this season.

HOOS HAVE TOP K:BB RATIO IN ACC, FIFTH BEST OVERALL

• Virginia pitchers currently have the best strikeout to walk ratio in the ACC and the fifth-best in the nation (3.1:1).

• The Cavaliers have recorded the second-most strikeouts in the league (388) – only North Carolina (438) has more.

• UVa has allowed the fewest walks (125) in the ACC.

PARKER SETS THE TABLE WELL

• Jarrett Parker has been strong as UVa's lead-off hitter.

• He leads the ACC with 58 runs scored and has scored at least one run in 31 of 41 games.

• Despite a recent slump, Parker ranks seventh in the ACC in batting (.386). He leads the ACC in runs (58), triples (4) and total bases (121) and is tied for fifth with 61 hits.

PARKER SPRINTS TOWARD RUNS RECORD

• Jarrett Parker has scored 58 runs this season and already is within two runs of tying the school single-season record of 60.

• The record is currently held by two former players, Mark Reynolds (2004) and David Guy (1988).

• Reynolds needed 59 games to score 58 times, and it took Guy 49 games.

LEADING OFF WITH A BANG

• Jarrett Parker has hit four home runs to lead off games this season – UVa had not had a leadoff homer in the four previous years.

• Parker's first leadoff homer was Virginia's first since Mark Reynolds hit one at Liberty on May 18, 2004.

• Parker also has hit leadoff home runs against Delaware, North Carolina and Maryland.

GOSSSELIN REBOUNDS FROM TOUGH START

• After starting the season 0-for-16 in the first weekend, Phil Gosselin has bounced back in a big way, going 57-for-140 (.407) since (37 games).

• He has been the Cavaliers' top run-producer this year with an ACC-high 51 RBI – more than doubling his 2008 total of 20 (40 games).

PITCHING AT TOP OF ACC HEAP

• The Virginia pitching staff has racked up the best ERA (3.11) in the conference thus far.

• Clemson is second with a 3.61 ERA.

• The Cavaliers have surrendered 304 hits (7.4/game) this year.

• Opponents are batting an ACC-low .227 against Virginia pitching.

DON'T FORGET THE SPEED TOO

• Virginia leads the ACC with 83 stolen bases.

• That total ranks 16th nationally.

• UVa has been caught stealing just 17 times.

• In the ACC, only NC State (84) has attempted more stolen bases than UVa has stolen.

• Four Wahoos ranks among the top 10 in the ACC in steals – Phil Gosselin (third, 17), Jarrett Parker (fourth, 16), Tyler Cannon (sixth, 14) and Dan Grovatt (ninth, 11).

• Virginia has led the ACC in stolen bases in each of the last three seasons.

PROSCIA KEEPS MASHING

• In his freshman season, Steven Proscia has gotten off to an outstanding start.

• He ranks first among ACC freshmen with a .354 batting average.

• Proscia is tied for fifth in the ACC with 15 doubles.

OFFENSE AMONG NATION'S BEST

• In the NCAA's latest rankings (4/19), Virginia ranked 11th nationally in team batting average (.349 entering the week). Eastern Illinois leads at .375.

• The Cavaliers also are sixth in hits (486), ninth in doubles (97), 12th in triples (16) and 15th in runs (344).

PITCHING UP THERE AS WELL

• Virginia's pitching staff ranks third in the country in ERA (3.17 entering the week). Only Texas (2.17) and Arizona State (2.48) were better.

• UVa also stands fourth in hits allowed per nine innings (7.66) and 10th in strikeouts per nine innings (9.7).

DAVENPORT DOMINANCE

• Virginia is 23-4 this year at Davenport Field after going 31-9 last season.

• UVa is 169-39 (.812) at Davenport since 2004, including 56-23 (.711) in ACC games.

• In nonconference games, the record is even more impressive – 113-16 (.875).

EVERYONE HITS!

• Virginia has made a habit of batting around in innings this year.

• In 41 games, the Cavaliers have batted around 23 times.

• UVa's high in one inning this year is 13 batters, set March 31 against Radford.

• UVa scored a season-high nine runs in the second inning vs. Radford.

HULTZEN GETS OFF ON THE RIGHT FOOT

- Freshman Danny Hultzen has had a strong start to his college career, going 5-0 in nine starts.
- In 53.1 innings this year, Hultzen has whiffed 66 batters – third-most in the ACC.
- Hultzen already has a 13-strikeout game (vs. FSU), a 12-strikeout performance (vs. Fordham) and a nine-strikeout game (at Wake Forest).

13 Ks: IT’S BEEN AWHILE

- Hultzen’s 13-strikeout performance vs. FSU was the most for a UVa pitcher since Sean Doolittle had 13 at Maryland in 2006.
- It was the most by a UVa freshman since 1994 when Seth Greisinger recorded 15 against North Carolina.
- Greisinger was the last Cavalier pitcher to post more than 13 strikeouts – he had 16 in 1996 against North Carolina.

RUNNING THE GAUNTLET

- UVa recently finished a brutal ACC stretch, competing against each of the league’s 2008 College World Series participants in consecutive weeks.
- It started when the Cavaliers played host to Florida State. Miami then came to Charlottesville before Virginia traveled to North Carolina. UVa went 3-4 in the stretch (1-0 vs. FSU, 1-2 vs. Miami, 1-2 vs. UNC). Three of the four losses were by one run, the other by two.
- Virginia is the lone ACC school to face these three teams in consecutive weeks this year.

NOTING THE 19-GAME WIN STREAK

- Virginia started the season with a 19-game winning streak, the longest win streak in school history.
- The streak came to a halt with a 4-3 loss March 21 to Miami.
- UVa was the last unbeaten team in Division I and held the longest active winning streak in Division I.
- The Cavaliers also started 5-0 in the ACC for the first time in school history.

FIFTH-LONGEST STREAK IN ACC HISTORY

- The Cavaliers’ 19-game win streak is tied for the sixth-longest in ACC history.
- It was the longest streak by an ACC team since FSU ran off 25 straight wins in 2002.

RACKING UP RUNS IN RECORD NUMBERS

- Virginia piled up 177 runs through its first 15 games – the most ever at UVa.
- The previous high was 161 runs during the first 15 games of the 1898 season.

CARRAWAY, POUTIER SERVE AS 2009 CAPTAINS

- Virginia has two captains this year – seniors Andrew Carraway and Robert Poutier.
- Poutier, who graduated in 2008 and is currently working on his master’s degree, is serving as a captain for the second straight year.
- Carraway is a three-time All-ACC Academic Baseball Team honoree and currently is living on the Lawn at UVa – one of the highest honors bestowed upon UVa students.

UVa AMONG SELECT FEW IN LAST FIVE NCAA TOURNAMENTS

- Virginia is one of just 17 Division I baseball programs to reach the NCAA Tournament in each of the last five seasons.
- The Cavaliers are one of five schools in the ACC to hold that distinction, joining Florida State, Miami, North Carolina and NC State.
- The other programs are Arizona State, Arkansas, Cal State Fullerton, Missouri, Oral Roberts, Pepperdine, Rice, South Carolina, Southern Miss, TCU, Texas and Wichita State.

ERA TOPS IN NATION OVER LAST FOUR YEARS

- Virginia pitchers boast a 3.10 ERA over the last four seasons – the lowest ERA in NCAA Division I over the last four seasons.
- UVa ranked third in the nation in ERA in 2005, 2006 and 2007 and was 15th last year.

- From 2006-08, UVa stole 376 bases, an average of 125.3 stolen bases per season.
- The Cavaliers ranked fifth nationally last year with 134 stolen bases. They were 11th in 2007 (128) and 19th in 2006 (114).
