## VIRGINIA VS. WEEKEND FOES

- Virginia leads its series with Seton Hall, 33-20-1 as well its series with Cornell, 26-11-1. UVa is meeting Hartford for just the second time; the Cavaliers lost 17-7 to Hartford on March 19, 1989, in Charlottesville.
- UVa and Seton Hall last played in 2012 in Charlottesville; as part of the Cavaliers' round-robin tournament, the teams split their games, with UVa winning on Saturday, 10-4, and the Pirates taking the Sunday tilt, 5-2.
- Virginia last played Cornell in 2011 as part of the Cavaliers' round-robin tournament, with UVa taking both contests, 12-1 and 14-2.

## VIRGINIA MOVES SERIES TO MYRTLE BEACH

- Because of the recent and projected inclement weather in Charlottesville, Virginia was forced to move the weekend tournament to Myrtle Beach.
- UVa last played in Myrtle Beach in 2012, going 1-1-1 in Coastal Carolina's season opening tournament on Feb. 17 and 18.
- UVa was forced to shift its series with Marist last weekend to Charleston, S.C.
- The Cavaliers are slated to open their home schedule Tuesday. If the game is played as scheduled, it will mark the latest UVa home opener since 2003.

## PITCHING REMAINS AT FOREFRONT

- Virginia's pitching staff has been solid through the season's first two weeks.
- UVa pitchers have a combined 1.12 ERA while limiting opponents to a .212 batting average. The ERA is No. 1 in the nation through Wednesday (Hartford is No. 14 nationally).
- The starting rotation has been particularly stingy, going 5-0 with a 0.70 ERA. UVa's starters have allowed three earned runs in seven games.

## FRESHMEN GALORE IN LINEUP

- Virginia has started six freshmen during the first two weeks of the season.
- UVa has put at least four freshmen in each lineup, including four games with five and one with six.
- Ernie Clement (CF), Adam Haseley (RF), Justin Novak (2B) and Pavin Smith (1B/DH) have started all seven games.
- UVa has had first-years in all three outfield positions in four games.
- Fourteen of UVa's 29 players are freshmen.

### CAVALIERS CAPTURE 18-INNING MARATHON

- Virginia defeated Marist 5-4 in 18 innings on Sunday in Charleston. It is the longest game by innings in program history.
- The previous high was a 17-inning game, ironically also in Charleston, in 2006 against College of Charleston.
- It is believed to be the second-longest game by time (5:08), behind the 2006 CofC game, which lasted 5:19.
- Virginia shut out Marist over the final 11 innings.
- Freshman Christian Lowry's first college hit, a one-out single in the 18th, scored Matt Thaiss with the winning run.

### WACKY WEATHER CONTINUES TO DELAY HOME OPENER

- For the first time since 2003, Virginia will not play a home game in February.
- If UVa plays its scheduled Tuesday (March 3) home game vs. VMI, it will mark the latest home opener since the 2003 season (with a March 4 start).
- Virginia has missed nine scheduled home games because of the winter weather.
- Virginia is 69-9 at home over the past two seasons.
- UVa finished 34-4 at home in 2014, boosting its record to 340-73 (.823) at Davenport Field since 2004.

### TOWNS EXTENDS STREAK TO 33 GAMES

- Kenny Towns has reached base safely in all seven games this season. He finished the 2014 season by reaching safely in 26 straight games.
- His 33-game streak currently ranks fifth in Division I baseball and tops amongst ACC players.
- Ball State's Alex Call boasts the longest current streak at 47 games.

### INJURIES FORCE CAVALIERS TO JUGGLE LINEUP

- Virginia has been forced to alter its lineup after injuries have hampered three of its returning starters.
- Two-year starting outfielder Joe McCarthy had back surgery in late January and will miss approximately 12 weeks.
- Catcher Robbie Coman was injured last weekend and will be out at least two weeks.
- John La Prise is day-to-day with a hip injury that has limited him to one game this season.

### SBORZ THRIVES IN FIRST CHANCE AS CLOSER

- Sborz moved into the closer role this season and has been solid. He recorded a pair of saves against East Carolina, retiring all eight batters he faced.
- He went 6-4 with a 2.92 ERA in 17 games (15 starts) during the 2014 season, primarily as the Saturday starter.
- Sborz took over for All-American Nick Howard, who saved an ACC-record 20 games last year and was taken by the Cincinnati Reds with the 19th pick in the first round of the MLB Draft.
- UVa closers own 150 saves in the 12 seasons under the current coaching staff (13.5 saves per season).
- Six of the seven closers since 2004 have been selected in the MLB Draft, including five in the top 10 rounds.

### PRESEASON ALL-AMERICANS

- Three Cavaliers were named preseason All-Americans: LHP Nathan Kirby, OF Joe McCarthy and LHP Brandon Waddell.
- Kirby was a unanimous first-team All-America selection, while McCarthy and Waddell each were named to various teams.

### MCCARTHY OUT FOLLOWING BACK SURGERY

- Junior OF Joe McCarthy will miss approximately 12 weeks after undergoing back surgery on Jan. 29.
- A 2015 Preseason All-American, McCarthy started all 69 games last season, batting .301 with six home runs and 49 RBI. He led the team with 16 doubles and 11 stolen bases and was one off the team lead with 77 hits.
- During his two seasons at UVa, McCarthy is a .317 batter with 152 hits in 129 games.

### KIRBY, WADDELL ON GOLDEN SPIKES WATCH LIST

- Virginia left-handed pitchers Nathan Kirby and Brandon Waddell each were named to the preseason Golden Spikes Award watch list.
- The list consists of 50 players in amateur baseball.
- Virginia is one of seven schools who have multiple players on the list, joining Cal State Fullerton, Florida, Miami, TCU, UCLA and Vanderbilt.
- A preseason First-Team All-American, Kirby was a semifinalist for the 2014 Golden Spikes Award.

### KIRBY AIMS FOR ANOTHER QUALITY START

- Nathan Kirby has a penchant for earning quality starts during his two years as a starter.
- He has one this year after opening the year with a quality start of seven shutout inning
- Kirby recorded 15 quality starts in his 18 attempts last season (quality start = at least six IP and three runs or fewer allowed).
- He started the 2014 season with 11 straight quality starts and was one of four pitchers nationally to record 11 straight quality starts last year (the only one from a power conference).

### VIRGINIA LANDS NO. 2 RECRUITING CLASS

- Virginia reeled in the No. 2-ranked recruiting class for 2014 according to Baseball America, behind only LSU. It marked the best recruiting ranking in program history.
- The class is comprised of 14 student-athletes.
- Three were selected in the 2014 MLB Draft: RHP Derek Casey (22nd round, St. Louis), 1B/LHP Pavin Smith (32nd round, Colorado) and RHP Tommy Doyle (35th round, Washington).

### OUTFIELD TAKES ON NEW LOOK

- A year after having one of the nation's top outfields, Virginia will sport a new look this year in the outfield.
- Roles still are up in the air, but freshman Adam Haseley is slated to man right field and also could see time in center.
- Infielders John La Prise, Ernie Clement and Charlie Cody each have been working on transitioning to the outfield; Clement and La Prise should spend time in center, while Cody is an option in left.
- Primarily an infielder, senior Thomas Woodruff provides another option in the outfield.
- Freshman Christian Lowry also could see time in the outfield.

### WHO'S GONE?

- Virginia has plenty of holes to fill after losing five position players and three key members of its bullpen to the 2014 MLB Draft.
- Virginia had three first-round picks, just the seventh program in the last 20 years to do so in one year: RHP Nick Howard (No. 19), OF Derek Fisher (No. 37) and OF Mike Papi (No. 38).
- UVa also lost OF Brandon Downes (7th round), INF Branden Cogswell (7th), RHP Artie Lewicki (8th), RHP Whit Mayberry (21st) and C Nate Irving (34th).

### CAVALIERS TAKE FIRST-EVER FOREIGN TOUR

- Virginia went on an eight-day international tour to Central America from Dec. 17-24, marking the baseball program's first-ever foreign tour.
- UVa traveled to Panama and Costa Rica.
- The foreign tour enabled the young squad to gel through extra practice time, an exhibition game in Panama City and team-building events.
- In its exhibition contest, UVa scored a 9-1 win over Panama Metro on Dec. 18 at Rod Carew National Stadium, a 27,000-seat stadium which hosted games in the 2013 World Baseball Classic.
- During its travels through Panama, the Cavaliers had the opportunity to tour the Miraflores Locks at the Panama Canal, canoe down the Tigris River and visit the indigenous Embera Village, where the team toured and learned about the village's customs.
- While in Costa Rica, the team toured the Doka Coffee Plantation, zip-lined through the rainforest, hiked through the Arenal Volcano National Park and went white-water rafting on the Savegre River.

- With eight players drafted, UVa tied for the second most picks of any school in 2014 (Ole Miss, 9).
- UVa had six players taken in the top 10 rounds – most of any school.

### CAVALIERS LEAN ON EXPERIENCED ROTATION

- A year after having the youngest weekend pitching rotation in the ACC, Virginia boasts an experienced group of weekend starters in 2015.
- Preseason All-Americans Nathan Kirby and Brandon Waddell anchor the rotation. Waddell has made 34 career starts, while Kirby made 18 starts in 2014.
- Sophomore Connor Jones enters the weekend mix this year. He led UVa's freshmen with 25 appearances and 54 2/3 innings, primarily out of the bullpen, in 2014.
- UVa starting pitchers combined to go 39-11 with a 2.13 ERA in all games last year while limiting opponents to a .198 batting average.

### LEFT SIDE OF INFELD RETURNS IN TACT

- While much of the Cavaliers' defense is in flux, the left side of the infield returns in tact as sophomore SS Daniel Pinero and senior 3B Kenny Towns are back.
- Towns has played in a team-high 142 games, including 113 starts. Pinero started 68 of UVa's 69 games last year – all at shortstop.
- The two were a key part of the Cavaliers' defense which recorded a program-best .981 fielding percentage in 2014.
- Towns reached base safely in each of his final 26 games last season, including all 12 games in the NCAA tournament.



## O'CONNOR LEADS ACTIVE COACHES IN WIN PCT., 13TH ALL-TIME

- Virginia head coach Brian O'Connor is 521-177-2 (.745) in his 12th season in charge of the Cavaliers' program.
- O'Connor's 74.3 percent winning percentage entering the season ranked No. 1 among active Division I head coaches.
- O'Connor also ranks 13th all-time in career winning percentage among all coaches with at least 10 years of head coaching experience.
- Virginia has won at least 39 games in all 11 of O'Connor's seasons, including nine 40-win seasons and four 50-win campaigns.

## PITCHING STRONG IN 2014

- Virginia returns seven pitchers who saw playing time as part of the Cavaliers' CWS team in 2014.
- The Cavaliers led the ACC and ranked second nationally with a 2.23 ERA. That mark tied the 1971 team for the second-lowest in program history, behind only the 1950 team's 1.77 ERA.
- Batters hit .201 against UVa, lowest in the nation.
- UVa gave up three runs or fewer in 54 of its 69 games, including a streak of 18 straight at one point.

## EXPERIENCE RETURNS BEHIND PLATE

- Virginia returns a pair of its catchers from 2014: junior Robbie Coman and sophomore Matt Thaiss.
- Coman played in 45 games, making 28 starts, last season and batted .283.
- Thaiss played in 26 games, with 16 starts at DH, and hit .265.
- Both also are options to play at first base.

## CAVALIERS LOOK TO MAINTAIN STRONG DEFENSE

- Virginia had its best year in program history on the defensive end in 2014.
- UVa set a program record with a .981 fielding percentage, committing 51 errors in 69 games.
- The Cavaliers ranked fourth nationally in fielding last season.
- UVa is fielding .974 as a team since 2004, tops in the ACC.

## NO FREE 90S

- Virginia prides itself on not giving easy passes to potential baserunners; that was never more evident than the 2014 season.
- The Cavaliers ranked No. 1 nationally in walks/hits per nine innings (WHIP) at 1.03.
- UVa pitchers were best in the ACC and 36th nationally in fewest walks per nine innings (2.88).
- The Cavaliers ranked ninth nationally in K-to-BB ratio (2.81) and 14th in strikeouts per nine innings (8.1).
- UVa pitchers also allowed the fewest hits per nine innings in Division I (6.37).

## GET 'EM ON, GET 'EM OVER, GET 'EM IN

- Virginia led the ACC and finished fifth nationally in 2014 with 87 sacrifice bunts.
- The Cavaliers set a program record for sac bunts in 2014.
- Forty of Virginia's bunts came in ACC play.
- UVa laid down an NCAA record-tying seven bunts in its win over Boston College on March 15 (game 1 of DH).

## UVa BREAKS SCHOOL ATTENDANCE RECORDS

- Virginia broke the school records for season and average attendances last season.
- UVa ranked 11th nationally in total attendance (142,496) and average attendance (3,749).
- Both totals ranked third among ACC programs.
- UVa crushed its previous records for average (3,298 in 2011) and total attendance (125,959 in 2010).
- More than 110,000 fans have attended Virginia games each of the past five seasons as UVa has ranked among the top 20 programs nationally in attendance every year.

## MOST WINS SINCE 2009

- With 301 victories since the start of the 2009 season, Virginia owns the most wins of any team in the nation in that span.
- The Cavaliers have won 50 games or more four times in the last five seasons.
