FOR OPENERS

- Justin Anderson will miss the game after having an appendectomy on March 5. He has missed the past seven games with a fractured a finger and his status for the ACC Tournament is to be determined.
- UVa ranks first nationally in scoring defense at 49.9 points per game, which is the third lowest average in the shot clock era (since 1986).
- UVa is first in the ACC at 16-1, while Louisville is fourth at 11-6.
- Virginia's 28-1 record marks its best start in school history.
- Virginia has clinched its second consecutive ACC regular-season title and No. 1 seed in the ACC Tournament.
- Virginia is the first ACC school besides Duke or North Carolina to earn back-to-back outright ACC regular-season titles since NC State in 1973-74.
- Virginia is the first ACC school to record 16 or more league wins in back-to-back seasons.
- UVa has held its opponents to fewer than 50 points in six of the last eight games.
- Virginia has beaten ACC opponents by 10 or more points in five straight games.

A WIN AT LOUISVILLE:

- Would improve UVa's best start in school history to 29-1.
- Would give UVa a school record 29 regular-season wins.
- Would give UVa an ACC record 17 regular-season wins.
- Would increase UVa's school record for most true road wins in a season to 12.
- Would give UVa an undefeated road schedule (12-0) for the first time since 1915 (2-0).
- Would give UVa a 10-game winning streak.
- Would give UVa a two-game season sweep of Louisville.
- Would give UVa 7-3 series lead, including a 4-2 mark in Louisville, against the Cardinals.
- Would make Virginia the first school since Duke (1999-2000) to have three or fewer ACC losses over a two-year span.
- Would give UVa 82 wins during a three-year span, its most since winning 88 games from 1981-83.
- Would mark the fourth time an ACC school won the regular season title by at least two games in consecutive years (Duke 1963 & 1964, NC State 1973 & 1974, Duke 1998, 1999 & 2000).
- Would make UVa the first ACC school to go unbeaten (9-0) on the road during regular season league play since Duke in 2012.

LAST TIME OUT

- No. 2 Virginia overcame a sluggish start to defeat Syracuse 59-47 on March 2 at the Carrier Dome.
- The Cavaliers scored their first points at 11:46 and rallied to take a 23-20 halftime lead.
- Anthony Gill had game highs in points (17) and rebounds (9) and London Perrantes had his first career double-double with 10 points and a career-high 10 assists.
- Malcolm Brogdon added 10 points and Mike Tobey contributed 10 points and eight rebounds off the bench.
- Virginia dominated Syracuse with a 42-20 rebounding advantage.
- The Cavaliers shot 46.2 percent from the floor and limited the Orange to 38.3 percent, including 4-19 from 3-point range.

ALL-TIME AGAINST LOUISVILLE

- The Cavaliers are 6-3 all-time vs. Louisville in the series that dates back to 1923-24.
- Virginia and Louisville meet for the second time this season.
- Then-No. 3 Virginia defeated then-No. 9 Louisville 52-47 on Feb. 7 in Charlottesville.
- The Cavaliers are 3-2 against the Cardinals in Louisville and the teams are meeting for the first time at KFC Yum! Center.

LAST TIME VS. THE CARDINALS

- Malcolm Brogdon scored 15 points and Virginia's defense held Louisville to 13 first-half points in the Cavaliers' 52-47 win over the Cardinals on Feb. 7.
- Anthony Gill added 10 points and eight rebounds off the bench, and Darion Atkins and Mike Tobey added nine points each.
- Terry Rozier led Louisville with 16 points, and Montrezl Harrell had 12 and Chris Jones added 11.
- London Perrantes had a game-high six assists.
- Virginia had just two turnovers in the contest, but was outrebounded 36-33.
- The Cavaliers shot 33.3 percent from the floor and limited Louisville to 37 percent.

ON THE ROAD AGAIN

- UVA has won 11 true road games, breaking the school record of 10 set in 1981 and 1982.
- The Cavaliers are 13-0 away from home this season.
- Virginia is 15-2 in ACC road games over the past two seasons, the most road wins in the conference over that period.
- UVA owns the nation's longest current road winning streak at 11 games.

UVA RANKED NO. 2/2 IN THE LATEST NATIONAL POLLS

- UVA is ranked No. 2 in the AP and USA Today coaches' polls.
- The Cavaliers have been ranked in the top 10 for the first 18 weeks of the season for the first time since 1982-83.
- Prior to this year, the Cavaliers achieved their last No. 2 ranking on March 8, 1983.
- Virginia has delivered three of the 21 home losses by teams currently ranked in the top 20 of this week's AP poll (Notre Dame, North Carolina, Maryland).
- The No. 9 AP preseason ranking was UVA's best since a No. 1 ranking to start the 1982-83 season.
- UVA is one of three teams (Duke and Arizona) that have been ranked in the top 10 for 20 straight weeks dating back to last season.

VIRGINIA HEAD COACH TONY BENNETT

- Sixth-year head coach Tony Bennett sports a 134-61 mark at Virginia and 203-94 mark in nine seasons overall.
- Bennett was named 2014 ACC Coach of the Year after guiding the Cavaliers to their first ACC Tournament championship since 1976.
- In 2013-14, he guided UVA to its first ACC regular season and tournament championship in the same season for the first time in school history.
- Bennett has guided the Cavaliers to three consecutive postseason tournaments (NCAA in 2012 and 2014 and NIT in 2013).
- Bennett has increased UVA's win total in each of the last five seasons (15 in 2009-10, 16 in 2010-11, 22 in 2011-12, 23 in 2013-13 and 30 in 2013-14).
- Bennett-coached teams are 75-3 when holding opponents to fewer than 50 points during his nine-year coaching career.
- Bennett-coached teams have finished in the top five nationally in scoring defense in five of eight seasons (first in 2008-09 and 2013-14, second in 2007-08 and 2011-12, and fifth in 2012-13).
- Bennett is one of 24 Division I head coaches who played in the NBA.
- Bennett is the only active coach to have wins over the five active Hall of Fame coaches (Jim Boeheim, Larry Brown, Mike Krzyzewski, Rick Pitino, Roy Williams).
- Bennett became the 15th coach in NCAA Division I history to reach the 200 career-win mark in nine seasons or less on Feb. 22, 2015.

EMBRACE THE PACE

- Virginia is averaging 65.8 points and yielding a nation-leading and school-record (modern era) 50 points (third best defensive average in shot clock era).
- UVA has shot 46.3 percent from the field and 36 percent from 3-point range, while limiting its opponents to 35.3 percent from the field (2nd nationally) and 29.9 percent from 3-point range.
- As of March 4, the Cavaliers rank in the top five nationally in 11 defensive categories: points per game (1st), field goal percentage (2nd), points per possession (2nd), true shooting percentage (2nd), effective shooting percentage (3rd), rebounds per game (3rd), possessions per 40 minutes (4th), assists per game (5th), offensive rebound percentage (5th), rebound percentage (9th) and defensive rebounds per game (10th).
- As of March 4, the Cavaliers rank in the top 10 nationally in three offensive categories: defensive rebound percentage (5th), assist-to-turnover ratio (10th) and rebound percentage (10th).
- UVA has limited its opponents to 71 fast break points, but allowed a season-high 14 in its loss to Duke.

THE DEFENSE NEVER RESTS

- Virginia has held its opponents scoreless for five or more minutes 25 times.
- Virginia held Louisville scoreless for 12:06, Tennessee State scoreless for 10:23 and Cleveland State scoreless for 10:03 this season.
- Virginia has also limited its opponents without a field goal for eight or more minutes 11 times, highlighted by Harvard for 19:53 on Dec. 21.

HOLDING FOES UNDER 50

- Virginia is 49-2 when holding opponents under 50 points in the Tony Bennett era.
- Virginia is 14-0 this season and 33-1 over the last three seasons when holding opponents under 50 points.

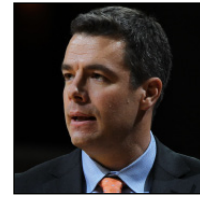

TWENTY-SOMETHINGS:

- NCAA Division I teams have been held under 30 points seven times this season, and Virginia is responsible for three of them (Rutgers-26, Harvard-27, Georgia Tech-28).
- Virginia is the first Division I team to hold multiple opponents under 30 in a season since Bucknell did it twice in 2003-04.
- The last Division I team to hold three opponents under 30 in a season was NC State in 1996-97 (Winthrop, Arkansas-Pine Bluff, Texas-Pan American).
- The last time Virginia held at least three opponents under 30 points in a season was in 1945-46 (five times).
- Georgia Tech's 28 points on Jan. 22 marked the lowest point total ever in an ACC regular season game.
- Virginia has held six opponents under 40 points this season, twice as many as any other team in the nation.

GETTING REALLY DEFENSIVE

- UVa is responsible for three of the top five defensive performances for fewest points in a game by Power 5 conference teams this season (ACC, Big Ten, Big 12, Pac 12, SEC).

ABOUT THE 2014-15 SCHEDULE

- Five of Virginia's opponents are ranked in the latest AP poll (Duke, Maryland, Notre Dame, Louisville and North Carolina).
- UVa is 4-1 vs. ranked opponents, defeating then-No. 21 Maryland, then-No. 13 Notre Dame, No. 12 North Carolina and No. 9 Louisville.
- The Cavaliers have also defeated three opponents (George Washington, VCU and Davidson) that were receiving votes in the AP poll.
- Nine opponents (Duke, Louisville, Pittsburgh, NC State, George Washington, Harvard, North Carolina, Syracuse and VCU) played in the 2014 NCAA Tournament, while three (Clemson, Davidson and Florida State) participated in the National Invitation Tournament and two (Norfolk State and Cleveland State) in the Collegelinsider.com Tournament.

- Hall had a season-high nine points at Wake Forest, and had five points and five steals in a starting role at James Madison.
- Wilkins is the stepson of NBA Hall of Famer Dominique Wilkins, and B.J. Stith is the son of UVa all-time leading scorer Bryant Stith.

BROGDON NAMED TO ALLSTATE NABC GOOD WORKS TEAM®

- Malcolm Brogdon was one of 10 players named to the 2015 Allstate NABC Good Works Team® on Feb. 10.
- The award pays tribute to college basketball players at all levels for their impressive commitment to giving back to their communities and positively impacting the lives of those around them.
- Brogdon has volunteered as a reader and mentor to fifth grade students at Broadus Elementary School in Charlottesville and served as a mentor at the Charlottesville Boys and Girls Club.
- He is a dual-degree student in the Accelerated Bachelor/MPP Program in the Batten School of Leadership and Public Policy, and has made mission trips to South Africa and Malawi, and Ghana.
- Brogdon served as a mentor in both the W.E.B. DuBois Society and Norcross Elementary school in Georgia, and was also a counselor at the East Lake YMCA summer camp in Atlanta.

You must have a press pass to be admitted to the media area and the press room.

PHOTO CREDENTIALS

All photographers and camera operators must wear a visible credential issued by the Virginia athletics media relations office. Photographers work from the baselines at both ends of the court at John Paul Jones Arena. Live television is given top priority for courtside space.

PRESS PARKING

Press parking passes are provided upon request on a limited basis. If you need a parking pass, please be sure to inform the UVa athletics media relations office when making your press or photo credential request.

INTERVIEWS

All requests for interviews with Virginia basketball coaches and players should be made through Erich Bacher in the athletics media relations office. It is requested you allow the athletics media relations staff at least one day to arrange an interview.

POSTGAME INTERVIEWS

Virginia head coach Tony Bennett and the visiting head coach will meet with media representatives in the press room after each game at John Paul Jones Arena. Coach Bennett will be available in the press room approximately 10 minutes after the conclusion of the game and the visiting coach will be in the press room approximately 20 minutes after the game. Virginia players will be available in the team meeting room adjacent to the men's basketball locker room after Coach Bennett is done with his postgame press conference.

RADIO

Each visiting school is allowed one free radio broadcast from John Paul Jones Arena.
