## FSU and Clemson Trade Places in Coaches Poll; ACC Has Three in Top 10 of Coaches, AP

Florida State moved ahead of Clemson into the second spot in this week's AP and Coaches polls. The Tigers are ranked No. 3 in the coaches, No. 5 in AP. Louisville moved up to 10th in both polls, giving the ACC three Top 10 teams.

## Louisville-Florida State Is 13th Top 10 AP Meeting of ACC Teams

When Louisville and Florida State meet Saturday it will mark the 13th meeting of ACC teams ranked in the AP Top 10, and the first since No. 3 Florida State hosted No. 7 Miami in 2013.

## ESPN's GameDay Heads to the Ville

ESPN's iconic Saturday pre-game show will be at the site of an ACC game for the second straight week as it will originate from Louisville, prior to this week's Top 10 matchup between the Cardinals and Seminoles. This is the first time GameDay has visited the Cardinals.

## Louisville's Jackson Earns Second Straight Walter Camp National Offensive Player of the Week Award

Louisville sophomore **QB Lamar Jackson** was named the Walter Camp National Offensive Player of the Week for the second straight week after totalling an ACC-record 610 yards of offense in the Cardinals' 62-28 win over ACC rival Syracuse. Jackson also set an ACC two-game record for TDR with 13, throwing for four TDs and running for another. He is only the 2nd player in FBS history to throw for over 400 yards (411) and run for over 150 (199). Since 2004, Jackson is only the second player to repeat as Walter Camp Player of the Week.

## ACC Posts 17-5 Start: Third-Best Opening Record in League History

With a 7-3 mark on the second week of the season, the ACC now has a 17-5 non-conference record through the first two weeks of the season, the third-best start percentage-wise in conference history.

## Battle at Bristol Sets Attendance Mark

The Virginia Tech-Tennessee game drew a total of 156,990 fans at the Bristol Motor Speedway, shattering the college football attendance record. The previous mark was a crowd of 115,109 for the 2013 Notre Dame at Michigan game.

## No. 2 Florida State Travels to No. 10 Louisville Virginia Tech, BC Open in ACC Play Pitt Faces Oklahoma State in Stillwater

A Top 10 ACC match-up in Louisville awaits this Saturday when second-ranked **Florida State** travels to 10th-ranked Louisville in an early-season ACC meeting of Atlantic Division contenders at Papa John's Cardinal Stadium (Noon, ABC)...The game will mark the 13th meeting of ACC teams ranked in the Top 10 of the AP poll, and the first since Florida State, then ranked third, hosted Miami, then seventh, on Nov. 2, 2013...The game headlines a schedule of 12 Saturday games for the Atlantic Coast Conference this week, including two conference tilts, with **Virginia Tech** also hosting **Boston College** at Lane Stadium in Blacksburg, Va. (ESPNU, 3:30 pm), and 10 non-conference tests.

## FSU, Louisville Meet In Early Atlantic Division Showdown

The Seminoles, coached by **Jimbo Fisher** and led by **RB Dalvin Cook**, will face a Cardinal team, coached by **Bobby Petrino**, that is averaging an FBS-best 66 points per game and ranks third nationally in total offense, averaging 754 yards per game. The contest

features two of the most exciting young quarterbacks in college football in Louisville's **Lamar Jackson**, who has accounted for 13 TDs in the Cardinals first two games--an ACC record--and Florida State's **Deondre Francois**, who is averaging 368 yards per game of total offense in the first two games of his young career. FSU is 5-1 at Louisville, though the two teams have split the last two meetings in Kentucky.

son. Louisville sophomore **QB Lamar Jackson** was named the Walter Camp Offensive Player of the Week for totalling eight TDR by halftime in a win over Charlotte. Florida State **DE DeMarcus Walker** was named the Bednarik National Defensive Player of the Week after recording a nation's-leading 4.5 sacks against Ole Miss; and the Noles' redshirt **QB Deondre Francois** was named the Davey O'Brien National QB of the Week, after leading the biggest comeback in Seminole history, guiding FSU to a 22-point come-from-behind win with 478 yards of total offense in his first career start.

### Virginia Tech Hosts Boston College in Interdivisional Test

**Virginia Tech** and **Boston College** open conference play this weekend in Blacksburg, Va., when the two teams meet in Lane Stadium. The Hokies, coached by **Justin Fuentes** and led by **QB Jerod Evans**, hosts Boston College, coached by **Steve Addazio** and led by **QB Patrick Towles** and **LB Connor Strachan**. The Eagles, who led the nation in total defense in 2015, rank third nationally this year, allowing just 205 yards per game. The Atlantic Division enters this game with a 101-98 advantage over the Coastal Division since divisional play began in the ACC in 2005.

### Pitt Travels to Oklahoma State

Pitt, coached by **Pat Narduzzi** and led by **RB James Conner**, will face a stiff road test when it travels to Stillwater, Okla., to face Oklahoma State at Boone Pickens Stadium (3:30 pm, ESPN). OSU is coached by Mike Gundy and led by sophomore QB Mason Rudolph. Former Georgia Tech DT and Duke assistant coach Glenn Spencer is the defensive coordinator for the Cowboys. The game is one of 13 ACC teams will play against teams in the preseason AP Top 25, as the Cowboys were ranked 22nd last week before dropping a dramatic decision to Central Michigan. The game is also the only ACC-Big 12 matchup of the regular season.

### Duke, Miami, Virginia Face Road Tests

Three other ACC schools take to the road this week for important games, beginning with **Duke**, coached by **David Cutcliffe** and led by redshirt freshman **QB Daniel Jones**, facing Big Ten foe Northwestern at Ryan Field in Evanston, Ill. (8 pm, Big Ten Network). The Wildcats are coached by Pat Fitzgerald. The Blue Devils, who haven't won in Evanston since 1998, are seeking to snap a two-game losing streak in the series, though all of the last three games have been decided by nine or fewer points. Miami, ranked 25th nationally by both the AP and Coaches polls, is coached by **Mark Richt**. The Hurricanes will make a rare appearance in Boone, N.C. Led by **QB Brad Kaaya** and a defense ranked fourth nationally in total defense (205.5) and first in tackles for loss (14.0), the Canes will face Appalachian State of the Sun Belt Conference at Kidd Brewer Stadium (Noon, ESPN). Miami's ground attack has seen RBs **Mark Walton** and **Joe Yearby** top the 100-yard mark in each of their first

two games. Appalachian State, which dropped an OT heartbreaker to Tennessee in week one, is coached by Scott Satterfield. **Virginia**, coached by **Bronco Mendenhall** and led by **QB Kurt Benkert**, spends its second straight week on the road, travelling to Storrs, Conn., to face UConn of the American Athletic Conference at Rentschler Field (1:30 pm, SNY, ESPN3). The Huskies are coached by Bob Diaco, who served as an assistant at UVa (2006-08) under Al Groh, and defensive coordinator Anthony Poindexter, who is a former UVa All-American and assistant coach.

### No. 5 Clemson Hosts S.C. State; Georgia Tech Entertains SEC foe Vanderbilt

**Clemson**, ranked fifth nationally, hosts in-state foe South Carolina State this Saturday at Memorial Stadium in Clemson (Noon, Regional Sports Networks). The Tigers are coached by **Dabo Swinney** and are led by Heisman Trophy candidate **QB Deshaun Watson**. The Bulldogs are coached by Buddy Pough. Georgia Tech, coached by **Paul Johnson** and led by **QB Justin Thomas**, hosts SEC foe Vanderbilt this Saturday at Bobby Dodd Stadium (12:30 pm, ACC Network). The Commodores are coached by Derek Mason. The Yellow Jackets and Tigers will face each other next week on Thursday, Sept. 22 at Bobby Dodd Stadium.

### Syracuse, North Carolina, NC State and Wake Forest Hope to Enjoy the Comforts of Home

Four more ACC teams will be playing in the familiar confines of home, as **Syracuse**, coached by **Dino Babers**, and led by sophomore **QB Eric Dungey**, hosts South Florida of the American Athletic Conference at the Carrier Dome in Syracuse (3:30 ACC Network Extra). USF is coached by Willie Taggart. **North Carolina** will be at home for the first time this season as the Tar Heels, coached by **Larry Fedora** and led by the **QB Mitch Trubisky**, will host James Madison at Kenan Stadium in Chapel Hill (3:30 pm; Regional Sports Networks). The Dukes are coached by former Citadel head coach Mike Houston, who is in his first season leading the program in Harrisonburg. JMU Defensive Coordinator Bob Trott has had stints as an assistant coach at North Carolina, Clemson, Duke and Virginia, while Offensive Run Game Coordinator Bryan Stinespring spent 26 years as an assistant to Frank Beamer at Virginia Tech. **NC State**, coached by **Dave Doeren** and led by **QB Drew Finley** and **RB Matthew Dayes**, hosts Old Dominion at Carter-Finley-Stadium in Raleigh, N.C. (6 pm, ACC Network Extra). ODU is coached by Bobby Wilder, now in his eighth season as head coach. Old Dominion Assistant Head Coach Jeff Commissiong spent six years as D-Line coach at Boston College. **Wake Forest**, coached by **Dave Clawson**, ranks 9th nationally in scoring defense and is led by **LB Marquel Lee**. Wake will host Delaware at BB&T Field in Winston-Salem, N.C. (6:30 pm, ACC Network Extra). The Deacons are 2-0 for the first time since 2012. Delaware is coached by Dave Brock, a former assistant coach at both Boston College and North Carolina.





# The ACC By The Numbers

**-23** - The number of rushing yardage which **Boston College** held UMass to in its 26-7 win over the Minutemen. BC led the nation in 2015 in total defense and is ranked third this season.

**1** - Boston College **LB Connor Strachan** is tied for the nation's lead in tackles for loss per game. Strachan has 6.5 in two games, an average of 3.3 per contest.

**1.88** - The average number of field goals made per game by Clemson **PK Greg Huegel**. Huegel leads all active kickers in the FBS in career field goals made per game.

**3** - Louisville sophomore **QB Lamar Jackson** ranks third nationally in rushing yards per game (159.0) and also ranks 9th nationally in passing efficiency (188.1). He ranks second nationally in total offense per game (507.5).

**4.5** - The number of tackles for loss for NC State **LB Airius Moore** in the Wolfpack's loss to East Carolina. Moore had 11 total tackles in the game.

**6** - **North Carolina** has faced its last six opponents away from the confines of Kenan Stadium in Chapel Hill. That's the longest stretch for an ACC opponent without a home game since NC State went eight games without a home contest during the 1967-68 seasons. UNC began its journey with a short trip to Raleigh, N.C. to play NC State, then faced Clemson in Charlotte, N.C., for the ACC Championship; Baylor in Orlando, Fla., for the Russell Athletic Bowl; Georgia in Atlanta for the Chick-fil-A Kickoff Game and last Saturday's trek to Champaign-Urbana, Illinois to face Illinois.

**7** - The number of quarterbacks who started for the first time for their ACC teams on the opening week of the season. **Patrick Towles** of Boston College, **Daniel Jones** of Duke, **Deondre Francois** of Florida State, **Mitch Trubisky** of North Carolina, **Drew Finley** of NC State, **Kurt Benkert** of Virginia and **Jerod Evans** of Virginia Tech also started for the first time for their respective teams. Jones, Francois, Trubisky, Benkert and Evans made their major college starting debuts, while Towles (Kentucky) and Finley

(Boise State) were graduate transfers who had previously started for the Wildcats and Broncos, respectively. Jones, Francois and Evans saw the first FBS action of their careers.

**8** - Also the number of career returns for touchdowns by Duke's **CB DeVon Edwards**. Edwards has returned six kickoffs for scores, one shy of the ACC and NCAA record, and also has two interception returns for TDs in his career. Edwards leads all ACC active players in returns for TDs.

**9** - Pitt's **James Conner** topped the 100-yard rushing mark for the ninth time in his career Saturday against Penn State. Conner rushed for 117 yards on 22 carries against the Nittany Lions. He now has 2,811 yards in 28 career games, an average of 100.4 yards per game

**9.77** - The average number of tackles per game for Virginia junior **S Quin Blanding** throughout his career. That leads all active players in the FBS. Blanding has 254 tackles in 26 career games.

**10.0** - the average number of pass receptions for Syracuse graduate transfer **WR Amba Etta-Tao**. He ranks third nationally in receptions per game.

**13** - Saturday's game between second-ranked Florida State and 10th-ranked Louisville will be the 13th contest of two **ACC teams** ranked in the Top 10 of the AP national Poll, and the first since Miami (7) and the Seminoles (3) faced off on Nov. 2, 2013.

**18** - Syracuse sophomore **QB Eric Dungey** ranks 18th nationally in total offense. Dungey is averaging 327 yards per game.

**23** - When **North Carolina** scored 48 points in its 48-23 win over Illinois, it marked the 23rd time in 52 games that the Tar Heels have topped the 40-point mark under current head coach **Larry Fedora**. UNC also scored 48 against the Illini in 2015 in Chapel Hill.

**40** - The number of career touchdowns for Pitt **TB James Conner**. Conner, who battled through a knee injury and Hodgkin's lymphoma in the off-season, has two TDs rushing and two more receiving this

year. That gives him 40 touchdowns in his career, including 38 rushing. The ACC record for scores is 52 by Virginia's Wali Lundy and 49 for rushing touchdowns held by NC State's Ted Brown.

**170** - The number of career wins for Georgia Tech's **Paul Johnson** in his 18-year head coaching career at Georgia Southern, Navy and Georgia Tech. Johnson now ranks fifth among all active FBS head coaches in career victories. Five ACC coaches begin 2016 ranked in the Top 25, including Miami's **Mark Richt** (10th), Louisville's **Bobby Petrino** (21st), Virginia's **Bronco Mendenhall** (23rd) and Wake Forest's **Dave Clawson** (24th)

**199** - The number of rushing yards for Louisville **QB Lamar Jackson** in his record-setting performance against Syracuse. That's the third-best effort by a quarterback in league history. Jackson now has recorded four of the top six rushing days by a signal-caller in ACC history.

**201** - Pitt **WR Quadree Henderson** recorded 201 yards of all-purpose offense against Penn State. Demonstrating his versatility, Henderson had an 84-yard kickoff return, averaged 15.3 yards on three pass receptions and 14.5 yards on four runs from scrimmage.

**845** - When Louisville gained 845 yards in its 62-28 ACC opener against Syracuse, it marked the second-highest offense total in league history. The record, of 858 yards were set by Florida State in 1992 against Maryland.

**1,508** - The number of yards of total offense for **Louisville** in its first two games of the season. The Cardinals had 663 yards versus Charlotte and 845 against Syracuse. The total is an ACC two-game record.

**1892** - **Georgia Tech** played Mercer last week, its very first opponent some 124 years ago as the two met on Nov. 5, 1892. Coincidentally, this week Tech will hosts Vanderbilt, its second football foe, this Saturday at Bobby Dodd Stadium. The Commodores were Tech's first home opponent, as the two met in Piedmont Park on Nov. 19, 1892.

## ESPN's College Football GameDay Makes First Appearance in Louisville

*Iconic College Football Show Originates from Louisville for the First Time*

Louisville will host ESPN's College GameDay Built by the Home Depot this week for the first time when the Cardinals host second-ranked Florida State at Papa John's Cardinal Stadium this Saturday. This marks the eighth time Clemson has played in a game from where GameDay has emanated.



This week marks the second straight week that GameDay has been at the site of a game involving an ACC team. Last week, GameDay emanated from the Bristol Motor Speedway, where Virginia Tech met Tennessee in the Pilt J Battle at Bristol, which set an all-time college football attendance record of 156,990.

Including this weekend, current ACC schools have hosted College GameDay a total of 36 times, while current ACC schools have appeared 89 times on the sites where College GameDay has been held. Florida State has hosted GameDay more than any other ACC school (11), followed by the Hokies and Miami (6), Clemson (4), Boston College, Georgia Tech and Pitt (2 each) and North Carolina, NC State and now Louisville (1 each).

An ACC record 331 Olympic sporting events will be streamed live this fall by ACC Network Extra, a dedicated digital channel for ACC sports that made its debut on August 19. The coverage marks the initial phase

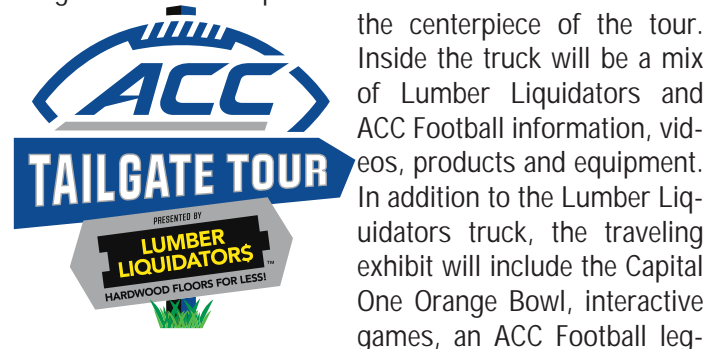

# Collaborative Instant Replay

NCAA Football Rules require that all instant replay equipment and personnel be located in the stadium. For the 2016 season, the Football Rules Committee has approved a one-year experimental exception which allows conferences to use a “collaborative” process for instant replay. Under this exception, personnel in a location away from the stadium may assist the replay official at the stadium in making replay decisions.

The ACC has approved the implementation and use of a collaborative replay system for the 2016 season. Under this system, replay officials located in the Conference’s Game Day Operations Center (GDOC) in Greensboro will have the ability to view exactly what the in-stadium replay officials are viewing in real time. The replay officials in the GDOC will also be able to participate in the communication between the referee and the in-stadium replay official.

In order to implement this process, technology enhancements and upgrades are taking place this summer, both at the ACC GDOC and at all of the ACC’s stadiums. This will allow the replay officials in the GDOC and the in-stadium replay officials to simultaneously view the same camera angles of a play under review, and to communicate with one another, and with the referee.

The expected benefits of this collaborative process are greater consistency and accuracy in replay decisions

## FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS

### **WHO WILL BE THE REPLAY OFFICIALS LOCATED IN THE GDOC?**

**ANSWER:** They will be experienced replay officials who have consistently performed at a high level as in-stadium replay officials.

### **Q: HOW MANY REPLAY OFFICIALS WILL BE IN THE GDOC ON GAME DAYS?**

**A:** There will be from one to three officials, depending on the number of games.

### **Q: WHAT WILL BE THEIR ROLE IN THE REPLAY PROCESS?**

**A:** Their role will be to assist the in-stadium replay officials in the replay decision-making process, to ensure that the decisions being made are in accordance with the replay rules and are consistent with the replay philosophies established nationwide.

### **Q: TO WHAT VIDEO WILL THE OFFICIALS IN THE GDOC HAVE ACCESS?**

**A:** They will have access to the same video that the in-stadium replay officials are provided, at the same time.

### **Q: WILL THE OFFICIALS IN THE GDOC BE ABLE TO COMMUNICATE WITH THE IN-STADIUM REPLAY OFFICIALS?**

**A:** Yes, they will be able to speak with the in-stadium replay officials, and they will also have the capability to be involved in the communication with the referee during the replay process.

### **Q: DO THE ROLES AND RESPONSIBILITIES OF THE IN-STADIUM REPLAY OFFICIALS CHANGE AS A RESULT OF THIS NEW PROCESS?**

**A:** No, the in-stadium replay officials will operate exactly as they have done in past seasons.

### **Q: DOES THIS NEW PROCESS CHANGE THE TYPES OF PLAYS THAT ARE REVIEWABLE?**

**A:** No, having this new system neither adds to nor deletes from the list of reviewable plays.

### **Q: DOES THIS NEW PROCESS CHANGE THE REPLAY STANDARD OF REVIEW?**

**A:** No, in order to reverse an on-field ruling, there still must be indisputable video evidence that the ruling on the field was incorrect.

### **Q: IN WHAT GAMES WILL THIS NEW SYSTEM BE USED?**

**A:** The collaborative replay system will be used in all games played at ACC stadiums and at Notre Dame.

# 2016 ACC Players of the Week

## Atlantic Coast Conference Announces Football Players of the Week

### *Louisville's Jackson named Offensive Back of the Week after Record-Setting Performance*

GREENSBORO, N.C. – Louisville sophomore quarterback Lamar Jackson, who has accounted for over 1,000 yards from scrimmage in the Cardinals' first two games, leads the ACC Football Players of Week for September 12. The honor adds to a growing list for Jackson, who was named the Walter Camp National Offensive Player of the Week for the second week in a row after leading Louisville to a 62-28 victory at Syracuse on Friday night. Jackson is only the second student-athlete to repeat as Walter Camp National Offensive Player of the Week since the award originated in 2004. Two Wake Forest players were recognized for their play in Saturday's conference road win at Duke, as redshirt junior defensive end Duke Ejiofor picked up ACC Defensive Player of the Week honors, while freshman running back Cade Carney was voted the Rookie of the Week. Pitt also had a pair of players recognized following its win over rival Penn State, as Ryan Lewis was named the Defensive Back of the Week and Quadree Henderson the Specialist of the Week. North Carolina senior center Lucas Crowley was voted the ACC Offensive Lineman of the Week, while UNC sophomore Andre Smith was named the Linebacker of the Week following their play in the Tar Heels' road win at Illinois. Florida State junior Travis Rudolph is the Receiver of the Week following his performance in Saturday's win over Charleston Southern. ACC Football Player of the Week selections are determined by a vote of a 14-member media panel.

#### **OFFENSIVE BACK – Lamar Jackson, Louisville, So., QB, 6-3, 204, Pompano Beach, Fla.**

Jackson followed up his big numbers from week one by accounting for an ACC-record 610 yards from scrimmage in Friday night's 62-28 win at Syracuse. The sophomore rushed for 199 yards while setting a school record for most rushing touchdowns by a quarterback with four. Jackson also completed 20-of-39 passes for a career-best 411 yards and one touchdown — including a 72-yard touchdown pass to James Quick on the first play of the game. He became the first player in FBS history to pass for 400 yards and rush for 175 yards in a game. Jackson currently ranks second nationally in total offense with an average of 507 yards per game, and has accounted for 13 touchdowns (six rushing, seven passing) to lead the Cardinals' 2-0 start.

#### **OFFENSIVE LINEMAN – Lucas Crowley, North Carolina, Sr., C, 6-3, 290, Ponte Verda, Fla.**

Crowley graded out at 87 percent, had nine knockdown blocks and did not allow a sack in Saturday night's 48-23 road victory at Illinois. Carolina had 426 total yards of offense and rushed for 5.3 yards per carry. Crowley's work helped pave the way for four rushing touchdowns – two apiece by UNC running back Elijah Hood and quarterback Mitch Trubisky. Trubisky also found time to complete 19 of 24 passes.

#### **RECEIVER – Travis Rudolph, Florida State, Jr., WR, 6-1, 192, West Palm Beach, Fla.**

Rudolph tallied his third career 100-yard receiving game and his second multi-touchdown game with 105 yards on seven catches and two touchdowns – all in the first half of FSU's 52-8 win over Charleston Southern. Both touchdowns came in the first quarter – a 36-yarder to open the scoring and a 21-yarder to make the score 21-0. In all three of Rudolph's career 100-yard receiving games, he has tallied 100-plus yards in a half. He has scored a receiving touchdown in each of the past three games.

#### **DEFENSIVE LINEMAN – Duke Ejiofor, Wake Forest, Jr.-r, DE, 6-4, 270, Houston, Texas**

Ejiofor made seven total tackles, including four solo stops with three assists, in Wake Forest's 24-14 win over Duke on Saturday. Ejiofor finished one sack shy of the school single-game record, collecting three total sacks and four total tackles for loss. He forced two fumbles, recovered one, and had a pair of quarterback hurries. Wake Forest held Duke to just 37 yards rushing, the fewest by a Wake Forest opponent since the Deacons held Boston College to 12 yards on the ground in 2012.

#### **LINEBACKER – Andre Smith, North Carolina, So.-r, MLB, 6-0, 240, Jacksonville, Fla.**

Smith had a career-high 14 tackles, including eight solo and six assists in the Tar Heels' 48-23 win at Illinois on Saturday night. He also had a tackle for loss and a pass breakup. Three of his tackles came on third down to force punts. His previous high was 11 tackles in a win last season at Pittsburgh. Smith was part of a defensive unit that limited Illinois to 309 yards, including just 127 in the air on 35 pass attempts. UNC limited Illinois to just 3.6 yards per pass attempt.

#### **DEFENSIVE BACK – Ryan Lewis, Pitt, Sr.-r, CB, 6-0, 200, Seattle, Wash.**

Lewis joined a long list of Pitt players to make unforgettable plays in the historic Penn State series, which resumed on Saturday with a 42-39 win by the Panthers at Heinz Field. With the Nittany Lions threatening at the Pitt 31 with 1:15 to play, Lewis intercepted a pass by Penn State quarterback Trace McSorley in the end zone, ending both the drive and the game. In addition to his interception, Lewis added a game-high nine tackles, all solo.

#### **SPECIALIST – Quadree Henderson, Pitt, So., WR/KR, 5-8, 190, Wilmington, Del.**

Henderson compiled 201 all-purpose yards, making big plays as a runner, receiver and returner in the Panthers' win over Penn State. His biggest play came in the kick-return game after Penn State closed to within four points early in the fourth quarter. Henderson responded on the subsequent kickoff with an 84-yard return down to the Penn State 10. Pitt scored a touchdown three plays later to go up 42-31, providing enough cushion to hold off the Nittany Lions. Henderson also averaged 14.5 yards per rush (four carries for 58 yards) and three catches for 47 yards, including a 7-yard TD. Henderson leads the nation in kick-return average (53.5 yards per return) and is sixth in all-purpose yards (206 per game).

#### **ROOKIE – Cade Carney, Wake Forest, Fr., RB, 5-11, 215, Advance, N.C.**

Carney had the biggest game of his brief collegiate career when he scored three touchdowns and rushed for 108 yards in Wake Forest's 24-14 win at Duke. Carney, who carried the ball 17 times, scored on a 7-yard run in the second quarter to tie the game at 7-7. He scored on a 1-yard run in the third to put Wake Forest ahead 14-7. After Duke again tied the game, Carney burst for a 55-yard touchdown run late in the third quarter to put Wake Forest ahead 21-14. Carney became the first Wake Forest true freshman to score three touchdowns in a game since Chris Barclay had three against Purdue in 2002. He was also the first Deacon running back to go over 100 yards rushing since 2012.

## Four ACC Coaches In Top 15 in Wins Per Season



With the addition of **Mark Richt** and **Bronco Mendenhall** to the ACC, the league now features five of the top 11 coaches nationally in wins per season. Led by Florida State's **Jimbo Fisher**, who has averaged 11.33 wins during his first six seasons as a head coach, four other ACC coaches rank among the nation's top 11 coaches in wins per season with a minimum of five seasons as a head coach.



Miami's **Richt** is fifth (9.67), followed by Clemson's **Dabo Swinney** (7th), Louisville's **Bobby Petrino** (10th) and Virginia's **Bronco Mendenhall** is 11th.

Georgia Tech's **Paul Johnson** is not far behind, averaging 8.84 wins a year, which puts him in 14th place. Beamer, the winningest active FBS head coach, retired after the Camping World Independence Bowl.

## Georgia Tech's Paul Johnson Ranks 5th Among NCAA FBS Active Career Leaders in Wins; Five ACC Coaches in Top 25

Georgia Tech's **Paul Johnson**, in his 20th year as a head coach, is ranked fifth in the NCAA's FBS in career victories with a total of 170 triumphs.

Johnson is one of four current ACC coaches who rank among the FBS Top 25 in career wins. Johnson is joined by Miami's **Mark Richt**, who is 10th on the active FBS list with 147 career wins. Louisville's **Bobby Petrino** and Virginia's **Bronco Mendenhall** rank 21st and 23rd with 102 and 99 triumphs, respectively, while Wake Forest's **Dave Clawson** ranks 24th with 98 wins.

## ACC Divisional Tiebreaker

If more than one team in the same division is tied for the best winning percentage in its Conference games, the procedures listed below will be followed to determine the division's representative in the ACC Championship Game:

### Two-Team Tie:

1. Head-to-head competition between the two tied teams.
2. Win percentage of the tied teams within the division.
3. Head-to-head competition versus the team within the division with the best overall win percentage. (Divisional and non-divisional) and proceeding through the division. Multiple ties within the division will be broken from first-to-last using the league's tiebreaking procedures.
4. Overall win percentage versus all common non-divisional opponents.
5. Combined win percentage vs. all non-divisional opponents.
6. Win percentage versus common non-divisional opponents based on their order of finish (overall conference win percentage) and proceeding through other common non-divisional teams based upon their divisional order of finish.
7. The tied team with the higher ranking by the Team Rating Score metric provided by SportSource Analytics following the conclusion of regular season games.
8. The representative shall be chosen by a draw.(as administered by the Commissioner or the Commissioner's designee.)

### Three-Team (or More) Team Tie:

(Once a team is eliminated from the tie, the tie-breaker procedures restart for the remaining teams. If the three (or more) team tie can be reduced to two teams, the two-team tiebreaker format will then be applied.)

1. Combined head-to-head win percentage among the tied teams.
2. Win percentage of the tied teams within the division.
3. Head-to-head competition versus the team within the division with the best overall (divisional and non-divisional) Conference win percentage, and proceeding through the division. Multiple ties within the division will be broken first to last, using the league's tie-breaker policies.
4. Combined win percentage versus all common non-divisional opponents.
5. Overall win percentage versus non-divisional opponents.
6. Win percentage versus common non-divisional opponents based upon their order of finish (overall win percentage) and proceeding through other common non-divisional opponents based upon their divisional order of finish.
7. The tied team with the highest ranking by the Team Rating Score metric provided by SportSource Analytics following the conclusion of regular season games.
8. The representative shall be chosen by a draw as administered by the Commissioner or the Commissioner's designee.





# COLLEGE FOOTBALL PLAYOFF, ACC BOWL LINEUP



## COLLEGE FOOTBALL PLAYOFF

The College Football Playoff begins its third year of operation after two highly-acclaimed years of operation season. The Playoff features the top four teams, two semifinals played in bowl games, and a national championship game played in a different city each year. Each semifinal is played during the New Year's holiday with the National Championship Game in prime time on a Monday night at least a week later.

The College Football Playoff selection committee chooses the four teams for the playoff based on their performance during the regular season, including, strength of schedule, head-to-head results, championships won, and other factors. The teams are seeded so that #1 will play #4 in one semifinal and #2 will meet #3 in the other, with the winners advancing to the national championship game. The selection committee announces its rankings each week on Tuesdays beginning this year on Nov. 1. The final rankings will be announced on Sunday, Dec. 4.

The semifinals rotate among six different bowls: the Chick-fil-A Peach, Goodyear Cotton, Fiesta and Capital One Orange Bowls; the Rose Bowl presented by Northwestern Mutual and the Allstate Sugar Bowl. In the years when the bowls are not hosting semifinals, the bowls will feature eight other teams in four compelling matchups.

## ACC Bowl Quick Selection Order

(The ACC is in the third year of six-year contracts with its current bowl partners. The current College Football Playoff format is a 12-year agreement)

### College Football Playoff (four teams)

If the ACC Champion is not in one of the semifinal games this year, it will appear the Capital One Orange Bowl. There is no limit on how many teams the College Football Playoff may choose from a particular conference. There is also a possibility an ACC team could be chosen for a berth in one of the New Year's Six Bowls if it is ranked high enough. This year only one at-large spot is open in a New Year's Six Bowl, that would be in the Goodyear Cotton Bowl.

### Capital One Orange Bowl

The ACC champion, if not in the College Football Playoff, will appear this year in the Capital One Orange Bowl. The opponent will be the highest-ranked available team from the SEC, Big Ten or Notre Dame. If the ACC champion is selected for the College Football Playoff, then the next highest ranked ACC team will serve as the host team in the Capital One Orange Bowl.

### Buffalo Wild Wings Citrus Bowl

In a year in which the Capital One Orange Bowl will not host the national semifinals, and the ACC opponent in the Orange Bowl is a team from the Big Ten, then the ACC will have a team selected to the Buffalo Wild Wings Citrus Bowl prior to the selection for the Russell Athletic Bowl.

### Russell Athletic Bowl

Has first pick of ACC teams in 2016 after the College Football Playoff, the Capital One Orange Bowl, the Host Bowls (if applicable) and the Buffalo Wild Wings Citrus Bowl (only should the ACC Orange Bowl opponent be a team from the Big Ten).

### The One-Win Rule Applies Only to Notre Dame

The ACC's bowl selection will no longer be bound by the rigidity of a "one-win rule" but will have a general list of criteria to emphasize regionality and quality matchups on the field. A one-win rule does apply to Notre Dame's participation in the ACC Bowl structure. Notre Dame is eligible for ACC Bowl selection beginning with the Buffalo Wild Wings Citrus Bowl and continuing through the league's bowl selections. However, Notre Dame must be within one win of the ACC available team which has the best overall record, in order to be chosen. In other words, if an ACC team was 9-3, a 7-5 Notre Dame team could not be chosen in its place. Notre Dame would have to be 8-4 to be chosen over a 9-3 league team.

### ACC Bowl Expenses And Revenue

The Atlantic Coast Conference shares all bowl revenues. Each school is provided an initial expense allotment. The Conference will share in the cost of unsold tickets for participating bowl institutions. After all bowl expense allotments and ticket reimbursements are subtracted from the total bowl revenue, the remaining revenue is distributed evenly among ACC schools.

# The ACC In Overtime

## The ACC & Overtime

When Duke ended regulation tied with Indiana at 41-41 in the New Era Pinstripe Bowl on December 26, 2015, they played the 77th game featuring an ACC team that has had to go to extra sessions. Of the 77 overtime contests, a large portion of them--31--have been played in September. Games have gone into overtime for ACC teams a total of 20 times in November, while 14 have been played in October, three in August, seven in December and two in January (2006 FedEx Orange Bowl, 2012 Allstate Sugar Bowl). Of the 77 overtime contests, 38 have been ACC games while 39 nonconference games have gone into overtime. The home team has a 41-26 advantage in the 67 games played on campus. The team which wins the toss has a 41-36 record. Fifty-six of the games were decided in the first overtime with 14 games in double overtime, six in triple overtime and one in four overtimes.
