ACC Has Two Teams in

Amway Coaches' Poll Top Eight; Clemson, 6th, Florida State 8th Duke Enters Poll at No. 24

Both undefeated **Clemson** (6th) and **Florida State** (8th) are in the Top 10 of the Amway Coaches poll again this week. **Duke** entered the national rankings for the first time this season at No. 24 with **North Carolina** among others receiving votes.

Four of the Top Seven Defenses

Nationally Reside in the ACC

Boston College, which leads the nation in virtually every major defensive category, leads a contingent of four ACC schools that rank in the nation's Top 7 in total defense. BC, which is yielding just 140.3 yards a game, is followed by NC State (3rd, 247.8), Duke (4th, 252.8) and Pitt (7th, 264.6). In all, seven ACC teams rank in the Top 25 in total defense.

Pitt's Narduzzi Off To Notable Start

New Pitt head coach **Pat Narduzzi** has coached his Panthers to wins in his first two ACC games. Only four others in ACC history have achieved this distinction in their first year as FBS head coaches in league history: Boston College's Jeff Jagodzinski (4-0, 2007); Florida State's Jimbo Fisher (4-0, 2010), South Carolina's Warren Geise (3-0, 1956); and Maryland's Ralph Friedgen (2-0, 2000).

Boston College Defense on Historic Start

Boston College's defense has permitted only two touchdowns through its first six games. It's the first FBS defense to allow two or fewer TDs through six games since Wisconsin allowed two in 2004. The Eagles have been charged with four allowed touchdowns as a team, but one of them was on a fumble return and another on a kickoff return.

ACC is One of Only Two Leagues With 10 Teams in the Sagarin Index Top 50

In this week's Sagarin Index computer ratings published by USA TODAY, the ACC is one of only two conferences (the SEC, which also has 10, is the other) in the nation to have 10 teams ranked in Sagarin's Top 50. The next closest league has eight.

11th-Ranked Florida State Hosts Louisville

Fifth-Ranked Clemson Hosts Boston College

106th Meeting for Wake Forest and North Carolina

Heading into the midway point of the 2015 season, three Atlantic Coast Conference teams are ranked in this week's Amway Coaches poll, two of them in the Top 10...**Clemson** (6th) and **Florida State** (8th) continue to be ranked in the Coaches Top 10, and this week they were joined in the national rankings by **Duke**, which debuted at No. 24... In the Associated Press poll, Clemson and Florida State each moved up one place to fifth and 11th, respectively, while Duke also made its first appearance of the year in AP at No. 25... The Blue Devils and **NC State** each have bye weeks this week after six consecutive games to open the season...In all, the ACC is 33-15 (.688) against non-conference competition but Week Seven of the Road to Charlotte features exclusively conference play on Saturday: four intradivisional games and two interdivisional contests on the slate...The Coastal and Atlantic Divisions have split four meetings this fall with the Atlantic maintaining a slight overall edge (96-89, .518) since the beginning of Divisional play in 2005... Defense continues to dominate in the ACC, with

seven league teams ranked among the NCAA's Top 22 in total defense, led by top-ranked **Boston College**, and including **NC State** (third), **Duke** (fourth), **Pitt** (seventh), **Clemson** (13th), **Wake Forest** (15th) and **Florida State** (22nd)...In a pair of important Atlantic Division matchups, division leader **Florida State** (3-0) will seek to maintain its half-game advantage over **Clemson**, hosting **Louisville** at Doak Campbell Stadium in Tallahassee, Fla. (Noon, ESPN), while **Clemson** hosts **Boston College** at Memorial Stadium in Clemson (7 p.m., ESPNU)...The key Coastal Division matchups include **Georgia Tech** hosting **Pitt** at Bobby Dodd Stadium in Atlanta, Ga. (12:30 p.m., ACC Network) and **Miami** hosting **Virginia Tech** at Sun Life Stadium in Miami Gardens, Fla. (3:30 p.m., ESPNU)...The Panthers of Coach **Pat Narduzzi** are tied with **Duke** for the Coastal Division lead with a 2-0 ACC mark...The interdivisional contests include **Virginia** hosting **Syracuse** (3:30 p.m., RSN) and **North Carolina** hosting **Wake Forest** (7 p.m., RSN)...The Tar Heels and Demon

The ACC On Sirius/XM Satellite Radio

The first intercollegiate athletics conference to reach agreement to have its sports broadcast on satellite radio, the Atlantic Coast Conference begins its 12th season in its partnership with Sirius/XM Radio. Since 2004, the ACC has had its football and men's basketball games broadcast over XM or Sirius Satellite Radio. In addition to the ACC Football Championship Game, Sirius/XM also broadcasts the ACC Men's and Women's Basketball Tournaments and the ACC Baseball Tournament.

Deacons will be meeting for the 106th time, but the first since 2012 and the first in Chapel Hill since 2011.

Louisville at No. 11 Florida State (Saturday, Noon, ESPN)

This Atlantic Division matchup at Doak Campbell Stadium in Tallahassee, Fla., features the Cardinals, coached by **Bobby Petrino** and led by true freshman **QB Lamar Jackson** and a strong defense ranked 26th nationally in total defense and tied for 12th in pass interceptions, against the 11th-ranked Seminoles, coached by **Jimbo Fisher** and led by **QB Everett Golson**, who has not thrown a pass interception in 139 attempts this year...Florida State **RB Dalvin Cook** ranks second nationally in rushing and is averaging 152 yards a game in his last eight contests stretching back to the final three games of 2014.

Boston College at No. 5 Clemson (Saturday, 7 p.m., ESPNU)

In the second half of a nationally-televised ACC doubleheader on ESPNU, the **Clemson Tigers**, coached by **Dabo Swinney** and led by **QB Deshaun Watson** and **TB Wayne Gallman** face the nation's best defense in Boston College, which is coached by **Steve Addazio** and led defensively by **DE Harold Landry** and **LBs Steve Daniels** and **Connor Strachan**...BC leads the nation in six major defensive categories including yards allowed per play (2.58)...The Tigers are hosting their third consecutive contest and will look to Watson, who leads the ACC and is 10th nationally in completion percentage (.690), and Gallman, who is second in the ACC in rushing yards per game (107.2). The Tigers' defense, led by **S Jayron Kearse**, is ranked 13th nationally in total defense. BC has not won in Clemson since 2007.

Pitt at Georgia Tech (Saturday, 12:30 p.m., ACC Network)

Pitt, which finds itself in a tie for the Coastal Division lead with Duke, heads to Atlanta to face **Georgia Tech** at Bobby Dodd Stadium...The Panthers, under first-year head coach Pat Narduzzi, are led by junior **QB Nate Peterman**, who ranks third in the ACC in pass efficiency, and **WR Tyler Boyd**, who leads the ACC in receptions per game (8.3) and a much-improved defensive unit that is ranked seventh nationally in total defense...The Panthers' stop troops are led by **LB Matt Galambos** and freshman **CB Jordan Whitehead**...**Georgia Tech**, coached by **Paul Johnson**, and led by **QB Justin Thomas**, is looking to snap a four-game losing streak...**DT Adam Gotsis** scored his first career touchdown against Clemson with a fumble recovery in the end zone.

Virginia Tech at Miami (Saturday, 3:30 p.m., ESPNU)

The Hokies of Coach **Frank Beamer** head to South Florida to face **Miami**, coached by **Al Golden**, at Sun Life Stadium in Miami Gardens...Both teams impressed last week, Tech in a 28-13 home win over NC State, and the Hurricanes in a close road loss to arch-rival Florida State...Tech is led by **QB Brenden Motley** and **WR Isaiah Ford**, while Miami features the nation's 18th-best passing offense, guided by **QB Brad Kaaya** and **WR Herb Waters**...Kaaya, who threw for 405 yards in a losing cause to 11th-ranked Florida State, leads the ACC in passing offense (299.8) and total offense (292.4) and Miami is fourth nationally in turnover margin (+1.8).

Syracuse at Virginia (Saturday, 3:30 p.m., RSN)

After four straight home games to begin the season, **Syracuse** takes to the road for the second straight week, facing **Virginia** at Scott Stadium in Charlottesville...The game will be the first of a doubleheader on the Regional Sports Networks this weekend...The Orange, coached by **Scott Shafer**, are looking to rebound from two straight non-conference losses but enter Saturday's contest with a 1-0 ACC slate...Syracuse is led by freshman QB Eric Dungee, who leads the ACC in pass efficiency with a 169.3 rating and versatile **WR Brisly Estime**...Estime leads the ACC and is third nationally in punt returns (21.1 avg.)...Virginia, coached by **Mike London**, and led by **QB Matt Johns**, is also looking to get back on the winning track, after dropping its ACC opener to Pitt last week...Cavaliers' **WR Canaan Severin** is fourth in the ACC in receptions and receiving yards per game.

Wake Forest at North Carolina (Saturday, 7 p.m., RSN)

Long-time rivals Wake Forest and North Carolina meet for the 106th time in a series that dates back to 1888 and was played every year from 1919 through 2003...The Demon Deacons, coached by **Dave Clawson** and led by **LB Brandon Chubb** and **QBs John Wolford** and **Kendall Hinton**, feature a defensive unit that ranks 15th nationally in total defense, allowing just 296 yards a game...**North Carolina**, coached by **Larry Fedora** and led by **QB Marquise Williams**, rely on an explosive offense that features **RB Elijah Hood** (6.3 avg.) and a deep WR corps that includes **Quinshad Davis**, **Ryan Switzer**, **Bug Howard** and **Mac Hollins**...The Tar Heels have won four straight after a season-opening loss to South Carolina, including a Coastal division win over Georgia Tech on Oct. 3....Wake is coming off a 3-0 triumph at BC last Saturday.

ACC Football By The Numbers

1 - Boston College leads the nation in every major defensive category, including total defense (140.3 yds/gm.), rushing defense (41.7 yds/gm.), passing yards allowed (98.7 yds/gm.), pass efficiency defense (75.52), yards per play (2.58) and first downs allowed (56). The Eagles are also tied for first in fourth-down conversion percentage (.000) and are second nationally in scoring defense (7.2) and third-down conversion percentage (.190).

2.60 - Having made 13 of 16 field goals this season through five games, Miami **PK Michael Badgley** now leads the nation in field goals per game, averaging 2.6 a contest.

3 - Virginia Tech sophomore **WR Isaiah Ford** became the first Virginia Tech player to catch three or more touchdown passes in an ACC game. Ford is the first Hokie with three or more receiving TDs since Ernest Wilford had four at Syracuse on Nov. 9, 2002, when both schools were members of the Big East Conference.

8 - Clemson has now won eight straight games, and that ties for the fifth-longest current winning streak in the nation.

8.3 - Pitt **WR Tyler Boyd** leads the ACC and is sixth nationally in pass receptions per game, averaging 8.3 with 33 catches in four games.

11 - Duke has won five straight and 11 of its past 12 games on the opponent's home field. Since the start of the 2013 season, only one FBS team, Northern Illinois with 13, has more true road victories than Duke. FSU, Missouri, Ohio State and UCLA also have 11.

12 - Since its 17-16 loss at NC State in 2012, **Florida State**, coached by Jimbo Fisher, has won 12 consecutive games decided by eight or fewer points.

24 - With six regular-season games remaining, Duke head coach **David Cutcliffe** has already led Duke to 24 wins over the past three seasons. The school record is 25, set originally by the 1936-38 teams of Wallace Wade, which posted a 25-4-1 record and tied by Cutcliffe's 2012-14 teams (25-15).

27 - Florida State has won 27 consecutive games against Atlantic Coast Conference teams since a 17-16 loss at NC State on Oct. 6, 2012. The Noles' winning streak ties for

the second-longest in league history, bettered only by the 29-game skein FSU achieved when it entered the ACC in 1992. That streak ended at Virginia in 1995. The streak is the longest by any team in any conference since USC won 27 straight Pac-10 (now Pac-12) games from October 2003 until October 2006. Oklahoma holds the record by winning 44 straight games in the Big 7 (later Big 8) from 1952-59. Boise State (WAC, 2001-05) and Oklahoma (Big 8, 1984-88) are tied for second at 31 consecutive wins. The intra-conference success string is tied for the fifth-longest in FBS history.

51.3 - Wake Forest **P Alex Kinal** played a big factor in the Deacons' 3-0 win over Boston College, booming 10 punts an average of 51.3 yards, with four placed inside BC's 20 yard line. Kinal broke the ACC career punting yardage record in the game and now has punted for 12,383 yards in his career.

87.0 - The per-game rushing average for Louisville true freshman **QB Lamar Jackson**. Jackson ranks third nationally among all quarterbacks and is third nationally among all freshman runners. He also leads all true freshmen nationally in rushing as the two ahead of him (Iowa State's Mike Warren and Pitt's **Qadree Ollison**) are redshirt freshmen.

121.7 - The per-game rushing average for Clemson **TB Wayne Gallman** during his last three games. Gallman has topped 100 rushing yards against each of the Tigers' last three opponents--Louisville, Notre Dame and Georgia Tech.

139 - Florida State **QB Everett Golson** has now thrown 139 passes without an interception, having not tossed a pick in FSU's five games.

158.4 - The per-game rushing average for Florida State **RB Dalvin Cook** after he rushed for 222 yards on 22 carries against Miami. Cook ranks second nationally, having topped the 200-yard mark twice this year and the 100-yard mark four times in five games. Only a hamstring injury against Wake Forest kept him from topping the 100-yard mark in every game this year, as he rushed for 95 yards against the Deacons on just two carries.

174.8 - Duke held Army to just 113 rushing yards in its 44-3 win over the Cadets. That's 174.8 yards below their average. Army entered the game ranked 10th nationally in rushing of-

fense averaging 287.8 yards per game.

222 - For the second time this season, Florida State **RB Dalvin Cook** topped the 200-yard mark, rushing for 222 yards on just 22 carries (10.1) and TD runs of 23 and 72 yards. He also added a 37-yard YD catch, accounting for all of the Seminoles' touchdowns.

231 - NC State **QB Jacoby Brissett** had his streak of 231 consecutive passes without an interception snapped on his final pass attempt against Virginia Tech. The streak is the fifth-longest in ACC history. Brissett's streak of 187 passes without a pick last year is the eighth-longest streak in ACC history. The ACC record is held by former NC State standout Russell Wilson, who had 379 passes without a pick during the 2008 and 2009 seasons.

365 - The number of career points for Duke senior **PK Ross Martin**, who now ranks fifth on the ACC career scoring list, having passed North Carolina's Casey Barth (358) last weekend. Martin, who has made all 12 of his FG attempts this year, has made 64 of his 75 career attempts, an .853 percentage, the fourth-best career percentage among active FBS placekickers. Martin needs 11 more points to move past former FSU PK Xavier Beitia (375, 2001-04) for fourth place on the ACC career scoring list.

405 - The number of passing yards for Miami **QB Brad Kaaya** against 12th-ranked Florida State. Kaaya, who completed 29 of 49 passes for three TDs and no interceptions, has averaged 332 yards a game in his last four contests. He has thrown 95 consecutive passes without an interception.

421 - Virginia Tech head coach **Frank Beamer**, who leads all active NCAA FBS coaches and ranks sixth all-time with 276 career wins, passed another milestone on Saturday, coaching in his 421st college football game. Beamer passed former Iowa legend Hayden Fry for sixth place on the all-time list. Alabama legend Bear Bryant is next on the list, having coached in 425 games.

700 - The number of all-time wins for the **Pitt Panthers**. They became the fourth current ACC team to crack the 700-win mark when they defeated Virginia, 26-19, last Saturday. They joined Virginia Tech (715), Georgia Tech (713) and Syracuse (700).

Atlantic Coast Conference Announces Football Players of the Week

Florida State, Pitt, Wake Forest Each Have Two Selections

October 12, 2015

Florida State sophomore running back Dalvin Cook earned his second Atlantic Coast Conference Offensive Back of the Week honor of the season after leading the eighth-ranked Seminoles to Saturday night's 29-24 win over rival Miami, and teammate DeMarcus Walker was chosen as the ACC Defensive Lineman of the Week.

Florida State was one of three schools with two student-athletes recognized among ACC Football Player of the Week selections following last weekend's action, joining Pitt and Wake Forest.

Matt Galambos (Linebacker of the Week) and Jordan Whitehead (Rookie of the Week) were recognized for their play in Pitt's win over Virginia. The Demon Deacons' Zach Dancel (Defensive Back of the Week) and Alex Kinal (Specialist of the Week) were tabbed following their performances in a shutout win at Boston College.

Clemson's Jay Guillermo (Offensive Lineman of the Week) and Miami's Stacy Coley (Receiver of the Week) round out this week's list of ACC honorees.

ACC Football Players of the Week are selected by a 14-member media panel.

OFFENSIVE BACK – Dalvin Cook, Florida State, So., RB, 5-11, 202, Miami, Fla.

Cook had one of the greatest performances ever in the storied FSU-Miami rivalry on Saturday night at Doak Campbell Stadium, rushing for 222 yards and two touchdowns on 22 carries and catching three passes for 47 yards and another score. Listed as day-to-day with a hamstring injury, Cook was explosive from the start against his hometown Hurricanes, taking his first touch – an option pitch – 72 yards for a touchdown. He added a 36-yard touchdown reception in the first quarter and scored the game-winning touchdown on 23-yard run with 6:44 left in the fourth quarter. Cook's 222-yard performance is the most ever by a Nole against the Hurricanes and marks his second 200-yard game of the season, which ties the school record (1981, Greg Allen).

OFFENSIVE LINEMAN – Jay Guillermo, Clemson, Jr., C, 6-3, 310, Maryville, Tenn.

Guillermo graded a team-best and career-high 93 percent on 61 plays in Clemson's 43-24 win over visiting Georgia Tech. For the second straight game, he did not have a bad snap in the driving rain and helped the sixth-ranked Tigers to 201 yards rushing and 537 yards of total offense. He added three knockdown blocks and did not give up a sack. He had the key block on two Clemson touchdown runs.

RECEIVER – Stacy Coley, Miami, Jr., WR, 6-2, 287, Pompano Beach, Fla.

Coley had a career night on Saturday as he posted highs as a collegiate player in receptions (seven) and receiving yards (139) against Florida State. Coley's 139-yard effort marked the first time he has surpassed 100 yards receiving, and his 38-yard touchdown reception gave the Hurricanes a 24-23 fourth-quarter lead over the eighth-ranked Seminoles.

DEFENSIVE LINEMAN – DeMarcus Walker, Florida State, Jr., 6-3, 281, Jacksonville, Fla.

Walker was a force for the Seminoles in the 29-24 win over Miami, recording a career-high two sacks and forcing a fumble. Walker also helped lead a defensive effort that limited Miami to just 20 rushing yards on 19 carries (1.1 yards per carry) – the lowest rushing yards total that an FSU defense has allowed against an FBS opponent since 2007.

LINEBACKER – Matt Galambos, Pitt, LB, Jr., 6-2, 240, Collingdale, Pa.

Galambos had two quarterback sacks and a momentum-changing interception return in Pitt's 26-19 victory over Virginia. With Pitt holding a 17-10 halftime lead, Virginia opened the second half by driving to the Panthers' 34-yard line. Galambos ended the threat by perfectly jumping a route, intercepting the pass and returning for 51 yards to set up what proved to be the decisive Pitt touchdown. The interception return was the longest by a Pitt player in five years. Galambos' two sacks went for 15 yards in losses and included an 11-yard sack on Virginia's final possession. He had five total stops on the afternoon to help Pitt move to 4-1 for the first time since 2009 and 2-0 in ACC play for the first time since joining the league in 2013.

DEFENSIVE BACK – Zach Dancel, Wake Forest, Gr., S, 6-0, 200, Ellicott City, Md.

Dancel had six tackles, including five solos in Wake Forest's 3-0 road win over Boston College. Dancel had a tackle for loss of four yards, forced a fumble that led to Wake Forest's field goal, and then recovered another fumble to halt an Eagles' drive late in the fourth quarter.

SPECIALIST – Alex Kinal, Wake Forest, P, Sr.-r, 6-4, 205, Adelaide, South Australia

Kinal punted 10 times for 513 yards – a 51.3 average – against Boston College on Saturday, flipping the field on numerous occasions in the Demon Deacons' 3-0 ACC win. Kinal had eight punts of 50 or more yards, including a 62-yarder. Four of his punts were downed inside the BC 20-yard line, and he placed two punts inside the 10. During the game, Kinal set the ACC record for career punting yards. He now has 12,383 career punting yards, exceeding the previous record of 12,000 set by Duke's Brian Morton (1997-2000).

ROOKIE – Jordan Whitehead, Pitt, SS, Fr., 5-11, 185, Aliquippa, Pa.

Whitehead collected a game-high 12 tackles (seven solo) and was a disruptive force defending the run and the pass in the Panthers' win over Virginia. The true freshman leads Pitt's nationally ranked defense with 41 stops on the season. He is averaging 8.2 tackles per game, which ranks ninth (tied) in the ACC. Whitehead is the only freshman among the league's top-24 tacklers.

Virginia Tech's Frank Beamer Is NCAA FBS Active Career Leader in Wins

Virginia Tech's **Frank Beamer** is now the leading active head coach in the NCAA's FBS in career victories with a total of 276 triumphs in his 35-year coaching career. Georgia Tech head coach Paul Johnson ranks ninth on the active FBS list with 167 career wins. Beamer is sixth on the all-time list and Amos Alonzo Stagg is next on the list with 314 wins at Springfield, Chicago and Pacific. Former Florida State head coach Bobby Bowden, who retired after the 2009 season, is second in the NCAA's FBS with 377 career victories only to Penn State's Joe Paterno. Clemson's Swinney, Georgia Tech's Johnson In Good Company As ACC Head Coaches

After their first seven seasons at Clemson and Georgia Tech, head coaches **Dabo Swinney** and **Paul Johnson** have recorded excellent numbers. Only four other coaches in league history have had a better winning percentage after seven years than Swinney (.701) and only two have won more games. Only four other coaches in league history have won more games (58) than has Johnson after his first seven seasons in the league and he ranks 10th in winning percentage.

Boston College's Steve Addazio Leads Eagles to Back-to-Back Bowl Bids

In his first two seasons as the head coach at Chestnut Hill, Steve Addazio led Boston College to back-to-back bowl appearances utilizing a physical ground game and a hard-hitting defensive unit. In each of his first two years, Addazio has had a player lead the nation in rushing. In 2013, tailback Andre Williams led the nation and set an ACC single-season record with 2,177 yards. On year later, QB Tyler Murphy led all quarterbacks nationally, rushing for 1,184 yards, while setting an ACC rushing mark for signal-callers. Last year, BC was one of just three schools (Oklahoma and Toledo were the others) that ranked in the nation's Top 15 in rushing defense (2nd) and rushing offense (14th).

North Carolina's Fedora Putting Points on the Board for the Tar Heels

Now, in its fourth season with Larry Fedora as head coach, North Carolina has topped the 40-point mark 18 times and bettered 30 points 29 times in 43 games. His Tar Heel teams have averaged 35.74 points per game. In the previous 13 seasons before Fedora came to Chapel Hill, UNC had averaged just 23.3 points per game, a 14-point difference. Also, in his first four seasons, UNC has averaged 448.9 yards per game of total offense. That compares with the previous 13 seasons when the Tar Heels averaged just 349.25 yards per game on offense. Fedora's first three Tar Heel teams bettered the previous school mark for scoring. UNC scored a school-record 487 points in 2012 and tallied 425 points in 2013 and 432 in 2014. Previously, the school had only topped 400 points once. The school put up 421 points in 1993.



NC State's Dave Doeren: Winning the Close Ones

Now in just his third season as head coach at NC State, Dave Doeren has already made a name for himself on the national stage. After winning 23 of his first 27 career games as a head coach at Northern Illinois, he had an 8-5 mark in 2014, winning his final three games, including a 34-27 win over Central Florida in the Bitcoin St. Petersburg Bowl. Doeren's teams are 7-2 (.778) in games decided by four or fewer points. That's the best winning percentage in such games by any Power 5 coach. Doeren guided State to three wins by a touchdown or less in 2014.

Home Sweet Home for Noles' Fisher, Tigers' Swinney

Florida State head coach **Jimbo Fisher** and Clemson head coach **Dabo Swinney** have both enjoyed coaching in the cozy and imposing confines of the Seminoles' Doak Campbell Stadium and the Tigers' Memorial Stadium, also known as Death Valley. Now, after five seasons as head coach of the Seminoles, Fisher's teams have won 19 of 21 ACC games at home, a winning percentage of .905, the best by any ACC coach with a minimum of five seasons on the job. Swinney is right behind as his teams have won 24 of his first 27 home ACC games, a winning percentage of .889. They are both just ahead of legendary FSU coach Bobby Bowden, who also won more ACC home games than any other coach, with 62 triumphs in his 18 years in the league.



Cutcliffe Leading Duke to Unprecedented Success

Duke's **David Cutcliffe** is leading the Blue Devils to success unprecedented in the school's history. Cutcliffe has led Duke to three consecutive bowl game appearances, a first in Blue Devil history. He has also led Duke to 19 wins in 2013 and 201, the most in a two-year span since Duke began playing football in 1888. Now in his 8th season, Cutcliffe has led Duke to more wins (45) as the program experienced in the 18 years (43) before he took over the reins in Durham





ACC 2015 Football Championship Game Legends Class

Quartet of National Champions Headline the 2015 ACC Legends Class in Pitt's Tony Dorsett, Georgia Tech's Bobby Ross, FSU's Warrick Dunn, Miami's Clinton Portis

One of the game's most renowned Heisman Trophy winners and a trio of other major contributors to national championship teams lead the 2015 Atlantic Coast Conference Class of Football Legends announced on Sept. 29.

Pitt running back Tony Dorsett, Florida State running back Warrick Dunn, Georgia Tech coach Bobby Ross and Miami running back Clinton Portis are among the 14 all-time greats who will be honored during the weekend of the 2015 Dr Pepper ACC Football Championship Game, which will be played in Charlotte, N.C., on the evening of Saturday, Dec. 5.

Boston College center Dan Koppen, Clemson linebacker Anthony Simmons, Duke running back Chris Douglas, Louisville quarterback Chris Redman, North Carolina offensive lineman Ken Huff, NC State defensive back and return specialist Fred Combs, Syracuse tight end Chris Gedney, Virginia defensive end Patrick Kerney, Virginia Tech defensive end Corey Moore and Wake Forest punter Chuck Ramsey also headline this year's Legends class.

Dorsett – a member of both the College and Pro Football Halls of Fame – earned the Heisman Trophy as a senior in 1976, when he led Pitt to the national title to conclude a stellar collegiate career in which he rushed for over 6,000 yards. Dunn cemented his lasting impact on Florida State football as a freshman in 1993, when he helped key the Seminoles and head coach Bobby Bowden to their first national championship.

Ross oversaw a return to football glory at Georgia Tech, highlighted by the 1990 national title and the Yellow Jackets' first ACC football crown. Portis helped Miami claim the national championship in 2001 by rushing for 1,200 yards and 10 touchdowns on 220 carries.

Koppen made his mark as the center on Boston College's strong offensive lines before moving on to start on four Super Bowl teams with the New England Patriots. Clemson's Simmons established himself in the 1990s as one of the leading tacklers ever to take the field for an ACC team. Duke's Douglas set school rushing marks that still stand, while Louisville's Redman displayed passing skills that led to national honors, including the trophy named for ultimate Cardinal great John Unitas.

North Carolina's Huff epitomized the "Tailback U" teams of head coach Bill Dooley in the early 1970s, opening holes for 1,000-yard rushers in the patented ground game. The multi-talented Combs proved a mainstay for head coach Earle Edwards' NC State teams of the mid-1960s, including a starring role on the 1967 squad that played its way to a No. 3 national ranking.

Gedney upheld the high standard for tight ends at Syracuse, set by the legendary John Mackey, establishing school receiving records for his position and leading the Orange to four bowl games. Virginia's Kerney emerged as one of the game's top pass rushers, earning All-America honors after ranking second in the nation in quarterback sacks as a senior.

Virginia Tech's Moore was another elite defensive end, garnering both the Nagurski and Lombardi awards in his final collegiate season and piling up 35 quarterback sacks over his three years in Blacksburg. Wake Forest's Ramsey proved a valuable weapon in the battle for field position, leading the nation in punting in 1973 and claiming consensus All-America honors.

Each of the ACC's 14 football schools selected its 2015 Legend. The group will be honored at the ACC Night of Legends on Friday, Dec. 4, and on Saturday Dec. 5, during the 11th annual Dr Pepper ACC Football Championship Game at Bank of America Stadium. The game will be nationally televised with either a 7:45 pm (ESPN) or 8 p.m. (ABC) kickoff.

ACC Divisional Tiebreaker

If more than one team in the same division is tied for the best winning percentage in its Conference games, the procedures listed below will be followed to determine the division's representative in the ACC Championship Game:

Two-Team Tie:

1. Head-to-head competition between the two tied teams.
2. Win percentage of the tied teams within the division.
3. Head-to-head competition versus the team within the division with the best overall win percentage. (Divisional and non-divisional) and proceeding through the division. Multiple ties within the division will be broken from first-to-last using the league's tiebreaking procedures.
4. Overall win percentage versus all common non-divisional opponents.
5. Combined win percentage vs. all non-divisional opponents.
6. Win percentage versus common non-divisional opponents based on their order of finish (overall conference win percentage) and proceeding through other common non-divisional teams based upon their divisional order of finish.
7. The tied team with the higher ranking by the College Football Playoff Selection Committee following the conclusion of regular season games. (If both tied teams are not ranked in the ranking by the College Football Playoff Selection Committee, the higher ranked team in the Amway Coaches Poll (including others receiving votes).
8. The representative shall be chosen by a draw. (as administered by the Commissioner or the Commissioner's designee.)

Three-Team (or More) Team Tie:

(Once a team is eliminated from the tie, the tie-breaker procedures restart for the remaining teams. If the three (or more) team tie can be reduced to two teams, the two-team tiebreaker format will then be applied.)

1. Combined head-to-head win percentage among the tied teams.
2. Win percentage of the tied teams within the division.
3. Head-to-head competition versus the team within the division with the best overall (divisional and non-divisional) Conference win percentage, and proceeding through the division. Multiple ties within the division will be broken first to last, using the league's tie-breaker policies.
4. Combined win percentage versus all common non-divisional opponents.
5. Overall win percentage versus non-divisional opponents.
6. Win percentage versus common non-divisional opponents based upon their order of finish (overall win percentage) and proceeding through other common non-divisional opponents based upon their divisional order of finish.
7. The tied team with the highest ranking by the College Football Playoff Selection Committee following the conclusion of regular season games, unless the second of the tied teams is ranked within five or fewer places of the highest ranked tied team. In this case, the two-team tiebreaker procedure shall be applied between the top two ranked tied teams. If none of the tied teams are ranked in the rankings of the College Football Playoff Committee, the higher ranked team in the officially released Amway Coaches poll (including others receiving votes), following the conclusion of regular season games, unless the second of the tied teams is within five or fewer places of the highest ranked team. (For the sake of clarity, the team receiving the second-most votes but not ranked in the Top 25 would be ranked 27th.) In this case the two-team tiebreaker procedure

COLLEGE FOOTBALL PLAYOFF

The College Football Playoff begins its second year of operation after a highly-acclaimed first season in 2014-15. The Playoff features the top four teams, two semifinals played in bowl games, and a national championship game played in a different city each year. Each semifinal is played during the New Year's holiday with the National Championship Game in prime time on a Monday night at least a week later.

The College Football Playoff selection committee chooses the four teams for the playoff based on their performance during the regular season, including, strength of schedule, head-to-head results, championships won, and other factors. The teams will be seeded so that #1 will play #4 in one semifinal and #2 will meet #3 in the other, with the winners advancing to the national championship game. The selection committee will announce its rankings each week on Tuesdays beginning this year on Nov. 3. The final rankings will be announced on Sunday, Dec. 6.

The semifinals will rotate among six different bowls: the Chick-fil-A Peach, Goodyear Cotton, Fiesta and Capital One Orange Bowls; the Rose Bowl presented by Northwestern Mutual and the Allstate Sugar Bowl. In the years when the bowls are not hosting semifinals, the bowls will feature eight other teams in four compelling matchups.

ACC Bowl Quick Selection Order

(The ACC is in the second year of six-year contracts with its current bowl partners.
The current College Football Playoff format is a 12-year agreement)

College Football Playoff (four teams)

If the ACC Champion is not in one of the semifinal games this year, it will appear in one of the Playoff "host" bowls, either the Fiesta or Chick-fil-A Peach, since the Capital One Orange Bowl will serve as a semifinal site this year. There is no limit on how many teams the College Football Playoff may choose from a particular conference.

Capital One Orange Bowl

The ACC champion, if not in the College Football Playoff, would normally play in the Capital One Orange Bowl against the highest-ranked and available team from Notre Dame, the SEC or the Big Ten. With the Capital One Orange Bowl serving as a Playoff semifinal this year, the CFP Selection Committee will determine the game (Chick-fil-A or Fiesta) and opponent for the ACC champion if that team is not in the Playoff.

Buffalo Wild Wings Citrus Bowl

The One-Win Rule Applies Only to Notre Dame

The ACC's bowl selection will no longer be bound by the rigidity of a "one-win rule" but will have a general list of criteria to emphasize regionality and quality matchups on the field. A one-win rule does apply to Notre Dame's participation in the ACC Bowl structure. Notre Dame is now eligible for ACC Bowl selection beginning with the Buffalo Wild Wings Citrus Bowl and continuing through the league's bowl selections. However, Notre Dame must be within one win of the ACC available team which has the best overall record, in order to be chosen. In other words, if an ACC team was 9-3, a 7-5 Notre Dame team could not be chosen in its place. Notre Dame would have to be 8-4 to be chosen over a 9-3 league team.

ACC Bowl Expenses And Revenue

The Atlantic Coast Conference shares all bowl revenues. Each school is provided an initial expense allotment. The Conference will share in the cost of unsold tickets for participating bowl institutions. After all bowl expense allotments and ticket reimbursements are subtracted from the total bowl revenue, the remaining revenue is distributed evenly among ACC schools.

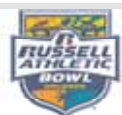

The ACC In Overtime

The ACC & Overtime

When Miami and Nebraska ended regulation tied at 33-33 and Syracuse and Central Michigan ended regulation tied at 24-24 on September 19, 2015, they played the 72nd and 73rd games featuring an ACC team that has had to go to extra sessions. Of the 73 overtime contests, a large portion of them--31--have been played in September. Games have gone into overtime for ACC teams a total of 19 times in November, while 12 have been played in October, three in August, six in December and two in January (2006 FedEx Orange Bowl, 2012 Allstate Sugar Bowl). Of the 73 overtime contests, 35 have been ACC games while 38 nonconference games have gone into overtime. The home team has a 40-24 advantage in the 64 games played on campus. The team which wins the toss has a 39-34 record. Fifty-four of the games were decided in the first overtime with 14 games in double overtime and five in triple overtime.
