#### **Today's Game**

- The Cavaliers continue their three-game road swing Thursday at Virginia Tech
- UVa is looking to win their school record fourth ACC road game of the season and start the ACC campaign with a 5-0-0 record for the first time in history

#### **About the Cavaliers**

- The Cavaliers are coming off a 7-1 win at Clemson on Sunday
- Meghan Lenczyk leads UVa in scoring with 10 goals
- Celeste Miles has posted seven shutouts this season

#### **About the Hokies**

- Virginia Tech is coming off a 3-0 win over NC State on Sunday
- The Tigers are 1-1-2 in the ACC this season
- Emily Jukich leads the team with 10 goals this season

#### **Series History**

- Virginia leads the all-time series-12-0-0 (Virginia leads 3-0-0 in Blacksburg)
- The Cavaliers are 5-0 against VT since the Hokies joined the ACC in 2004, outscoring them 19-1 in those games
- · Last season the Cavaliers topped the Hokies 2-0 at Klöckner Stadium

#### **Against the State**

- Virginia has won 21 straight games against in-state foes, outscoring them 75-2

### **Cavaliers Match Best ACC Start**

- The Cavaliers enter today's game with a 4-0-0 record in the ACC, matching their best start in conference play set in 2005
- That season, Virginia won its first four conference games all by shutout
- Virginia finished that season with a school record 8-2-0 conference record
- $\bullet$  The Cavaliers have already matched the school record of three ACC road wins in a season, set in 2005

#### Offense Explodes Against Wolfpack and Tigers

- In their last two games, UVa has beaten NC State 6-0 and Clemson 7-1
- The 13 goals are the most Virginia has ever scored in consecutive ACC games
- UVa's seven goals against Clemson were the most for the team since a 9-0 win over Richmond in 2005
- It was the most goals Virginia scored against an ACC opponent since an 8-0 win over Virginia Tech in the quarterfinals of the 2004 ACC Tournament
- •The results are the most lopsided regular season games in the conference since a 9-3 Duke win over Virginia Tech in 2004

#### **Lenczyk and Farrelly Score Hat Tricks**

- Meghan Lenczyk and Sinead Farrelly both have hat tricks this season, marking the first time in school history that Virginia has had two different players have a hat trick in the same season
- Farrelly had a career-high three goals in the first half of the 7-1 win at Clemson
- Lenczyk had a career-high three goals in the 5-0 win over Liberty
- Lenczyk's was the first hat trick by a Cavalier since 2004 (Kelly Hammond vs. JMU)
- Farrelly's was the first hat trick in school history against an ACC opponent

#### **Alwine Piling Up Assists**

- Lauren Alwine already has 10 assists this season, which ranks 5th by a Cavalier in a season
- She is only four assists shy of the school record of 14 in a season, set by Sarah Huffman in 2004

#### Spreading the Wealth

- Through the first 12 games of the season, Virginia has 18 different players with a point
- •The number already is one more than the number of point scorers last year
- That list includes 12 different goal scorers

#### **Second Half Strong**

- The Cavaliers have scored 22 of their 36 goals this season in the second half
- Last year Virginia had 30 second half goals, compared to just 10 in the first half

#### **ACC Leaders**

- Lauren Alwine leads the conference with 10 assists
- Celeste Miles is tied for the conference lead with seven shutouts

#### **Lenczyk Named Player of the Week**

- Meghan Lenczyk was honored as the ACC Co-Player of the Week and the Soccer America National Player of the Week on Tuesday
- She scored the game-winning goals at Florida State and Miami last week

#### **Game-Winning Connection**

- In four of the past six Cavalier wins (vs. William & Mary, vs. Dartmouth, at Florida State, at Miami), the game-winning goal has been scored by Meghan Lenczyk on an assist by Lauren Alwine
- Those goals are the only four GWG of Lenczyk's career and only four GWA of Alwine's career

#### Klöck-work at Home

- The Cavaliers are on a 19-game home unbeaten streak (17-0-2)
- Last year Virginia went undefeated at home (11-0-2) for the first time in history
- Since 2001, Virginia 73-10-7 at Klöckner Stadium
