OPENING KICK

MILITARY APPRECIATION DAY AT SCOTT STADIUM

- The University of Virginia welcomes the Indiana Hoosiers to Charlottesville on Saturday for Military Appreciation Day.
- The National Anthem will be performed by the U.S. Army Training and Doctrine Command Band (TRADOC) Herald Trumpets from Fort Eustis, Va.
- Brigadier General Andrea Tullos (Begel) will conduct the coin toss. Tullos is a 1991 Virginia graduate and a three-year letterwinner with the UVA Field Hockey program.
- The flag will be unfurled by Virginia's ROTC units
- There will be several veteran recognitions to highlight the service of individuals from World War II, Vietnam, Operation Desert Storm and Operation Iraqi Freedom.
- Army cadet recognition for recent Air Assault and Airborne School.
- Red, white and blue ribbons will be painted on the field.

VIRGINIA VS. INDIANA

- Virginia leads the all-time series with Indiana, 2-0.
- UVA defeated the Hoosiers at Scott Stadium by 40 points in 2009, 47-7. In UVA's return trip to Bloomington in 2011 it took a Robert Randolph 23-yard field goal as time expired to escape with a 34-31 triumph.
- Randolph's game-winning field goal is one of two all-time game-winning field goals for the Cavaliers that came as time expired. Jake McInerney's 37-yard field goal against Louisville in 1989 is the other.

FIVE TOP STORYLINES

- Saturday's game serves as UVA's seventh all-time contest against a school from the state of Indiana. The Cavaliers own a 3-3 record against the state. Indiana (2-0), Purdue (1-1) and Notre Dame (0-2).
- Saturday marks only the fifth time an active member of the Big Ten has visited Charlottesville. Indiana's previous visit in 2009 is one of the games, while Penn State's visits in 2001 and 2012 are two others. Chicago's 1939 visit was the first. UVA is 3-1 all-time against the Big Ten at Scott Stadium. See more on UVA vs. the Big Ten on page No. 4.
- OLB **Malcolm Cook** made his first collegiate start last Saturday against William & Mary and led the Cavaliers with a career-high 13 tackles. He also made his first career sack. Cook missed most of 2014 and 2015 with injuries and all of 2016 with a medical condition. In six previous career games he made four combined tackles, mostly on special teams.
- FS **Quin Blanding** was second on the team with 12 tackles against William & Mary. Of Blanding's 37 career games, he has 19 contests in which he has reached double digits in tackles. For his career, Blanding is averaging 10 tackles per game.
- QB **Kurt Benkert** has started 11 career games for the Cavaliers and in five of those starts he has thrown for at least three touchdowns.



Playing in his first game in nearly two years last Saturday, Malcolm Cook made his first career start and led UVA with a career-high 13 tackles. He missed most of 2015 with an injury and all of 2016 with an unrelated medical condition.

PLAYER INTERVIEWS

Players are available for interviews each Monday, depending on class schedules. If you have specific player interview requests, they should be directed to Vincent Briedis in the UVA Athletics Media Relations office by noon Sunday.

Requested defensive players and defensive coaches will be available for telephone interviews Tuesday, while offensive players and offensive coaches will be available Wednesday.

No player or coach interviews will be arranged after Wednesday during game week.

POSTGAME INTERVIEWS

Coach Mendenhall will hold his postgame press conference in the media room, while requested players will be brought to the media room to meet with media representatives after Mendenhall. UVA athletics media relations personnel will take player requests during the fourth quarter of each game.

No other announcements regarding player injuries will be made until the end of practice on Thursday or two days prior to the next football game (Wednesday for Friday game, Thursday for Saturday). On that day, within 90 minutes of the end of practice, injured players' playing status for the next game will be announced in one of five categories:

- Definitely will play
- Probable
- Questionable
- Doubtful
- Out

UNIQUELY UVA

The University of Virginia is an institution rich with history and tradition. Here is some of the terminology that contributes to UVA's culture.

Grounds: The term used by students, faculty and alumni to refer to the University dating as far back as Thomas Jefferson. "Campus" is never used.

First Year, Second Year, Third Year, Fourth Year: Instead of freshman, sophomore, junior, senior. Why you may ask? To be a "senior" implies that a person has reached the final phase of learning, a feat that Thomas Jefferson believed to be impossible, arguing instead that education is a life-long process.

Commonwealth: Virginia is one of four constituent states of the United States of America that officially uses the name "Commonwealth" instead of the word state in all references. The other three commonwealths are Kentucky, Massachusetts and Pennsylvania.

UNIVERSITY NICKNAMES

Virginia's athletics teams have been accompanied by a somewhat confusing array of nicknames. The most prominent and widely accepted of these monikers are "Cavaliers," "Wahoos" and "Hoos."

Although the terms "Cavaliers," "Wahoos" and "Hoos" are used almost interchangeably to refer to University teams and players, "Cavaliers" is more often used by the media, while "Wahoos" and "Hoos" are frequently used by Virginia students and fans.

Legend has it that Washington & Lee baseball fans dubbed the Virginia players "Wahoos" during the fiercely contested rivalry that existed between the two in-state schools in the 1890s. By 1940, "Wahoos" was in general use around Grounds to denote University students or events relating to them. The abbreviated "Hoos" sprang up later in student newspapers and has gained growing popularity in recent years.

THE CAVALIER MASCOT

The costumed Cavalier with a large character head debuted during Virginia's 1984 football season and has remained the official mascot of the University.

The first documented Cavalier on horseback was Francis Bell, a Virginia student from Dublin, Va., in 1947. Bell rode onto the field dressed as Cavaliers for Virginia's home football game with Harvard on the afternoon of October 11.

The Cavalier on horseback returned as the University's mascot in 1963. The UVA Polo Club provided both the horse and rider. However, the mounted Cavalier and his horse parted company in 1974 with the inception of AstroTurf at Scott Stadium.

The mounted Cavalier made its return in the Florida Citrus Bowl at the end of the 1989 football season. Due to its instant popularity, the Cavalier on horseback returned the following season on a regular basis and continues to lead the Virginia football team onto the field at the beginning of all home games.

UNIVERSITY COLORS

Orange and blue were adopted as the University of Virginia's official athletic colors at a mass student meeting in 1888. UVA athletic teams had previously worn silver gray and cardinal red, but those colors did not stand out on muddy football fields, prompting a student movement to change them.

One of the students attending the mass meeting was Allen Potts, a star athlete who played on Virginia's first football team in 1888. Potts showed up at the meeting wearing a navy blue-and-orange scarf that he had acquired during a summer boating expedition at Oxford University. Orange and blue were chosen as the official athletic colors after one of Potts' fellow students pulled the scarf off Potts' neck and, waving it to the crowd, yelled, "How will this do?" UVA later served as the inspiration for schools like Auburn and Florida when they selected school colors.

WAH-HOO-WAH

The origin of "Wah-hoo-wah" is uncertain. The cheer was used to root on Virginia teams as early as 1890 and may have been borrowed from Dartmouth College, whose athletics teams were once known as the Indians.

Legend attributes the yell to Natalie Floyd Otey, who sang the ballad "Where'er You Are, There Shall My Love Be" at Charlottesville's Levy Opera House in 1893. The predominantly student audience noticed that Otey warbled the first three words of the song between each of the stanzas and decided to join in the refrain. By evening's end, goes the legend, the crowd had corrupted "Where'er You Are" into "Wah-hoo-wah."

The Levy Opera House stands at the corner of High Street and Park Street and has since been renovated into an office building.

VIRGINIA - INDIANA CONNECTIONS

- Virginia has two "Hoosiers State" natives on its 2017 roster. Redshirt freshman offensive guard Ben Knutson hails from Granger, Ind., while redshirt freshman punter/holder Nash Griffin calls Indianapolis home.
- Not many connections between the Virginia coaching staff and Indiana's coaching staff. IU line-backer coach William Inge served in the same position at San Diego State in 2006 and 2007, facing Bronco Mendenhall's BYU teams. BYU won both games in 2006 and 2007 as UVA's offensive coordinator, Robert Anae, served in the same capacity. UVA assistant coaches Kelly Poppinga, Jason Beck and Vic So'oto were BYU players that played in at least one or both of those SDSU games in 2006-07.

VIRGINIA VS. THE BIG TEN

- In all-time meetings with schools currently in the Big Ten, UVA is 41-57-2.
- Seventy eight of those meetings came against Maryland (32-44-2), a former ACC rival.
- Saturday's game is only the 17th time UVA has faced an active member of the Big Ten. UVA is 7-9 in those games.
- Virginia's wins over the Big Ten include a 47-0 triumph over the University of Chicago in 1939 (Chicago left the conference a year later). It was UVA's first Big Ten win.
- Virginia is 1-0 vs. Chicago and Minnesota, 2-0 vs. Indiana, 2-1 vs. Penn State (Big Ten member only), 1-1 vs. Purdue, 0-3 vs. Michigan, 0-2 vs. Illinois, 0-1 vs. Ohio State and Wisconsin.
- UVA has a four-game winning streak against the Big Ten, dating back to a 34-31 Music City Bowl win over Minnesota. Wins over Indiana in 2009 and 2011, followed by a 2012 win over Penn State round out the current streak.
- There are more Big Ten games on the horizon for UVA: Virginia returns the trip to Bloomington on Sept. 8, 2018 to face Indiana.
- UVA has a future series slated with Illinois, starting in Charlottesville on Sept. 11, 2021 and Champaign on Sept. 10, 2022.
- The Cavaliers will renew their old ACC rivalry with Maryland, starting in College Park on Sept. 16, 2023. The Terps will return the visit on Sept. 14, 2024 at Scott Stadium.

MORE ON THE UVA-IU SERIES

- Indiana is playing only its second game all-time in the Commonwealth of Virginia. Its first trip to Scott Stadium in 2009 was the first.
- In UVA's 47-7 triumph in the 2009 meeting, the Cavaliers were led by Jameel Sewell, who was 20-of-30 passing for 308 yards and one score. He also rushed for 29 yards and another score.
- Mikell Simpson led UVA with four rushing touchdowns on 15 carries and 83 rushing yards.
- Eight Cavaliers made receptions, led by Vic Hall's six for 85 yards and a score.
- Ras-I Dowling made nine tackles, one interception and one sack to lead the UVA defense.
- Rodney McLeod picked up one fumble and returned it 32 yards, setting up UVA's first score of the game, a five-yard rushing touchdown by Simpson.

Last Meeting

Virginia defensive end Cam Johnson ripped the ball right out of Edward Wright-Baker's hands with 1:13 left, setting up a 23-yard field goal from Robert Randolph to give the Cavaliers a 34-31 come-from-behind win at Indiana the last time these two teams met.

Indiana seemed poised to give Hoosier head coach Kevin Wilson his first victory at IU after rallying from a 20-point second half deficit by turning three late turnovers into three touchdowns and 31-23 lead with just 6:34 to play.

Virginia, however, had the answer.

The Cavaliers drove down the field, getting a 3-yard touchdown run from Perry Jones to close to 31-29. Michael Rocco connected with tight end Paul Freedman, who twisted his way into the end zone for the tying 2-point conversion.

It still was not over.

Indiana got the ball back with 1:36 and was playing to win in regulation. But on third-and-3 from the Hoosiers' 23, Wright-Baker took a seven-step drop and had barely set up in the pocket when the untouched Johnson raced around the corner. Wright-Baker never saw Johnson, who stripped the ball as both players fell to the ground at the Indiana 14.

Four plays later, Randolph trotted onto the field and lined up between the hash marks for the winning kick.

Kevin Parks carried 11 times for 37 yards and two touchdowns, while Jones carried 22 times for 78 yards and the one score.

UVA WINS OPENER OVER WILLIAM & MARY

- Virginia's 28-10 win over William & Mary is the first season-opening win since 2013 when the Cavaliers defeated BYU, 19-16, at Scott Stadium.
- That BYU team was coached by current UVA head coach Bronco Mendenhall.

TEN TRUE FRESHMEN DEBUT IN OPENER

- Ten true freshmen made their collegiate debut against William & Mary on Sept. 2. Mandy Alonso (DL), Lamont Atkins (TB), Joey Blount (FS), Germane Crowell (CB), Brian Delaney (PK), Matt Gahm (LB), Terrell Jana (WR), PK Kier (TB), A.J. Mejia (PK) and Jamari Peacock (FB) all made their collegiate debuts against the Tribe.
- In the 2016 season-opening game against Richmond, only five true freshmen played for UVA.
- Six redshirt freshmen also made their collegiate debut against William & Mary. Dillon Reinkensmeyer (OT), Brenton Nelson (CB), DeVante Cross (WR), Nick Grant (CB) Nash Griffin (Holder) and Ben Knutson (OG) also made their collegiate debuts against the Tribe.
- Additionally, sophomore walk-on linebacker Reed Kellam and junior punter Lester Coleman also made their collegiate debut against William & Mary.

NOTING FIRST CAREER STARTS IN 2017

- Six Cavaliers made their first career starts against William & Mary on Sept. 2.
- First time starters on offense vs. William & Mary: Jordan Ellis (TB), Ben Hogg (WR), John Montelus (OG) and Dillon Reinkensmeyer (OT).
- First time starters on defense vs. William & Mary: Malcolm Cook (OLB) and Brenton Nelson (CB).

UVA WAS +16 IN FIELD POSSESSION AGAINST WILLIAM & MARY

- UVA was +16 in the field possession battle with the Tribe. UVA's average starting field possession was on its own 37-yard line.
- It was UVA's best advantage in field possession since being +24 against then-No. 21 Louisville in 2014.

CHRIS MOORE HAS SHINED OVER THE LAST TWO GAMES

- OLB/DB Chris Moore appeared in 11 games for UVA in 2016, but really saw a lot of playing time in the finale against Virginia Tech, making a career-high eight tackles on defense.
- Moore made five stops in the 2017 season-opener against William & Mary, giving the sophomore 13 tackles over UVA's last two games.

REINKENSMeyer STARTS OPENER AT LEFT TACKLE

- Dillon Reinkensmeyer is the first freshman, true or redshirt, to start a season-opening game on the offensive line for UVA since R-Fr. Will Barker started at RT in 2006 vs. Pitt.
- Reinkensmeyer is the first freshman, redshirt or true, to start a season-opening game at LT since D'Brick-ashaw Ferguson (true freshman) in 2002 vs. Colorado State.

LEVRONE FINDS ENDZONE AGAINST WILLIAM & MARY

- WR Andre Levrone's 34-yard touchdown reception against the Tribe was his first score since Nov. 8, 2014, when he made a tremendous scoring grab at then-No. 2 Florida State.
- Levrone missed 11 games in 2015 due to injury and was slowed at the start of 2016 with another injury.

FORMER WALK-ON BEN HOGG GETS FIRST COLLEGIATE RECEPTION

- WR Ben Hogg, a former walk-on, made his first collegiate catch in UVA's opener against William & Mary.
- The reception came on UVA's first offensive snap, in what was Hogg's first career start.
- Hogg was awarded a scholarship on the eve of the 2016 season. He went on to appear in nine games that season.
- Hogg walked-on to UVA in 2014 after earning first-team VHSL all-state honors at Brookville High School in Lynchburg, Va., where he caught 63 passes for 1,078 yards and nine scores as a senior.

VIRGINIA FOOTBALL TO WEAR #HOOSTOGETHER PATCHES ON UNIFORMS IN 2017

- In the aftermath of the events that took place in Charlottesville this summer, the Virginia athletics department initiated the #HoosTogether campaign on social media in an effort to unite our community in support of love, diversity and inclusion.
- During the 2017-18 academic year, all UVA sports programs will incorporate a #HoosTogether patch on their uniforms or equipment. It is UVA's hope the patches serve as a reminder of what can be accomplished when we are united behind a common goal and we hope this effort continues to help bring our community together.

THIRTEEN RETURNING STARTERS IN 2017

- The 2017 roster features 13 returning starters (five on offense, eight on defense, plus a long snapper).
- Virginia has had at least 10 returning starters every season since 1998.
- Overall, UVA welcomes 36 lettermen back.
- Overall, 30 returning Cavaliers have started at least one game at UVA.
- Virginia opened fall practice with 36 returning letterwinners from 2016 - 18 on offense, 17 on defense and one on special teams. Here is a nine-year breakdown of returning UVA letterwinners.

BLANDING AND KISER RETURN TO ANCHOR DEFENSE

- FS Quin Blanding and ILB Micah Kiser return to anchor the UVA defense. The duo finished No. 1 and No. 2 in the ACC in tackles. Kiser (11.2) led the ACC in tackles and finished No. 4 nationally. Blanding (10.0) finished No. 2 in the ACC in tackles for the third year in a row and No. 9 nationally.
- Kiser (9.75) and Blanding (9.58) also finished No. 1 and No. 2, respectively, in the ACC in tackles in 2015.
- Since the ACC started tracking tackle leaders in 1990, no tandem of tacklers has led the league in tackles for two consecutive seasons.
- Blanding, who also finished No. 2 in the ACC in tackles in 2014 (10.25), is the first player in ACC history to finish second in tackles for three straight seasons.
- The only ACC player since 1990 to lead the league in tackles for three consecutive seasons is Boston College's Luke Kuechly (2009-11), now of the NFL's Carolina Panthers.

BLANDING DOUBLES UP THE TACKLES

- UVA's Quin Blanding has with 19 double-digit tackle games over 37 collegiate games.
- Blanding has had six double-digit tackle games in each of his first three seasons.
- Blanding has 370 career tackles, 10 per game.

ZACCHEAUS GIVES BENKERT A BIG OFFENSIVE WEAPON

- Junior Olamide Zaccheaus returns for his third season with Virginia. The HB led UVA with 584 receiving yards and seven receiving touchdowns in 2016 as one of QB Kurt Benkert's primary targets. His 51 receptions was one behind team leader Doni Dowling's 52 receptions.
- Zaccheaus needs 200 receiving yards to become the 37th Cavalier all-time with 1,000 career receiving yards.
- Benkert found Zaccheaus for an 82-yard touchdown against Central Michigan. Zaccheaus' 82-yard touchdown reception is one of UVA's 19 all-time receptions of 80 yards or more.
- Zaccheaus has also rushed for 286 yards and one score over his first two seasons on Grounds.
- Olamide is Nigerian for "the blessing has come."

HAMM LOOKS TO RUSH FOR A TOUCHDOWN IN FIVE STRAIGHT SEASONS

- TB Daniel Hamm has rushed for at least one touchdown in each of the past four seasons.
- No Cavalier has ever rushed for at least one touchdown in five straight seasons.
- With available records dating back to 2004, no ACC player has rushed for at least one touchdown in five straight seasons.
- Hamm played in two games as a true freshman in 2013 before being hurt at Pitt and receiving a medical hardship. In his collegiate debut, he set a UVA record for most rushing yards in a college debut with 136 against VMI. Hamm also rushed for two touchdowns against the Keydets in 2013.
- Hamm has five career rushing touchdowns.

SCOTT STADIUM, HOME OF THE CAVALIERS

The Carl Smith Center, home of David A. Harrison III Field at Scott Stadium, with its unique architectural design, scenic setting on the University's Grounds and exceptional sight lines, is one of the nation's finest college football settings.

Opened in 1931, Scott Stadium might be one of the oldest campus college football stadiums in the nation, but you could never tell from its appearance. Numerous upgrades and expansions make it a modern home for the Cavaliers and their fans.

Scott Stadium was the gift of Frederic William Scott and Elisabeth Strother Scott, and was dedicated to the memory of his parents, Frederic Robert Scott and Frances Branch Scott.

Virginia played its dedication game at Scott Stadium on Oct. 15, 1931 against the Virginia Military Institute before a then-capacity crowd of 22,000. Prior to that season, the Cavaliers staged their home games at the University's Lambeth Field.

Virginia has played 458 games in the historic venue. UVA's all-time record at Scott Stadium stands at 257-189-12.

JOE REED EXCELS ON KICK RETURN

- Wide Receiver Joe Reed returned three kicks for 91 yards in the opener against William & Mary, with a long of 44 yards.
- Reed is coming off a solid 2016 where led UVA with 678 kick return yards as a true freshman.
- Reed's 25.1 yards per kick return average was No. 3 in the ACC and No. 21 in the nation in 2016.
- Reed's 678 kick return yards are the second most in a season by a Cavalier, trailing only Khalek Shepherd's single-season program record of 929 in 2012.
- Reed's best game in 2016 was 117 return yards against Miami and his 50-yard return against North Carolina was a season best.

BREAKING IN A NEW PLACEKICKER/PUNTER

- Entering 2017, zero of the UVA kickers on the 2017 roster had attempted a field goal or a punt in a collegiate game. In fact, no UVA kicker or punter had appeared in a college game.
- Virginia, Arizona State and UAB were the only programs in the nation that entered 2017 with a kicker or a punter on its roster with zero collegiate experience.
- Virginia was one of six schools in the nation that had zero career collegiate field goal attempts and punts among the kickers on its roster entering 2017. Arizona State, Georgia Tech, Hawaii, Troy and UAB are the other schools.
- This was the the second year in a row UVA has entered a season without a kicker that had attempted a field goal in college.
- Punter Lester Coleman and placekicker A.J. Mejia both made debuts last Saturday.

Bronco Mendenhall Head Coach • First Season

Bronco Mendenhall is in his second season as Virginia's head football coach after being named the program's 40th head coach on Dec. 4, 2015.

In Mendenhall's first season on Grounds he oversaw a secondary that boasted first-team All-ACC honoree and All-American, Quin Blanding. Blanding finished the season No. 2 in the ACC in tackles for the third year in a row with 120 stops. Inside linebacker Micah Kiser, an All-American and first-team All-ACC honoree, thrived to lead the ACC in tackles for the second year in a row with 134, which is tied with former Cavalier great Wali Rainer for fourth-most in a single season in program history. Kiser was also a second-team CoSIDA Academic All-American, becoming the first Cavalier since Tiki Barber in 1996 to earn both academic and athletic All-America honors in the same season.

Offensively, in Mendenhall's first season, Taquan Mizzell became the first player in ACC history to record at least 1,500 career rushing and 1,500 career receiving yards. UVA quarterback Kurt Benkert set a couple of passing marks in UVA's new offense, including a program record for passing yards in a game with 421 against Central Michigan, which was only the second time in program history a UVA quarterback surpassed 400 passing yards in a game. Benkert reached 1,000 passing yards in four games and 2,000 passing yards in eight games, setting a program record for fastest to that standard in a season.

Mendenhall came to Charlottesville after 11 years as the head coach at Brigham Young University. In his 11 seasons, from 2005-2015, Mendenhall compiled an overall record of 99-43 at BYU to rank 12th in total wins among all FBS teams during that time.

In the three seasons prior to Mendenhall becoming the head coach at BYU, the Cougars compiled an overall record of 14-21. Over the last 11 years, the Cougars are one of only 11 programs to advance to a bowl game each season (includes the 2015 season). BYU is joined by Alabama, Boise State, Clemson, Florida State, Georgia, LSU, Oklahoma, Oregon, Virginia Tech and Wisconsin on that list.

Among those 11 teams, only Florida State has achieved more bowl wins (seven) than BYU's six bowl game victories.

BYU football student-athletes have earned freshman All-America recognition in eight of the past 10 seasons. More than 60 BYU players have signed with NFL teams since Mendenhall arrived in Provo, including defensive end Ezekiel Ansah, the No. 5 overall pick in the 2013 NFL Draft and Kyle Van Noy, the No. 40 overall pick in the 2014 NFL Draft.

Under Mendenhall, the Cougars tied for seventh among all FBS programs for the most Academic All-America citations over the last decade and BYU tops all FBS programs with the most selections (39) to the National Football Foundation Hampshire Honor Society (recognizing starters and significant contributors finishing their eligibility with a 3.2 GPA or better over their college career) since the program began in 2007.

The success of Mendenhall's leadership approach in running the BYU football program has been highlighted in a management book, *Running Into the Wind: Bronco Mendenhall -- 5 Strategies for Building a Successful Team*, written by Alyson Von Feldt and Paul Gustavson, a leading management consultant specializing in leadership development and organizational design.

Mendenhall was elected in 2013 to the American Football Coaches Association Board of Trustees as the District 8 Representative and also serves on the AFCA Ethics Committee.

Following the 2006 season, Mendenhall was named the American Football Coaches Association Region IV Coach of the Year. In addition, the Football Writers Association of America named Mendenhall one of nine finalists for the prestigious Eddie Robinson Coach of the Year Award.

A dominant defense led BYU to its seventh winning season in as many years as the BYU football team finished the 2012 season with eight wins, a program-best fourth consecutive bowl victory and the No. 3 defense in the nation. With an 8-5 record, BYU claimed its sixth season with at least eight wins under Mendenhall's eight-year head coaching tenure. Incredibly consistent all year long, BYU finished the year ranked No. 3 in total defense, allowing just 266.1 yards per game. The Cougars ended the season ranked in the top four in five major defensive categories.

Mendenhall has served as the BYU's defensive coordinator for much of his tenure as the head coach. He returned to a full-time role with the defense again in 2015.

During his tenure in Provo, the Cougars have consistently fielded one of the nation's strongest defenses. Mendenhall's defense excels at keeping opponents out of the end zone. Entering the 2015 season, they averaged a No. 20 national ranking in scoring defense while he oversees the defense, including three top-10 ratings.
