FOR OPENERS

- Virginia (8-0) meets in-state rival VCU (5-2) for the first time at the Siegel Center in Richmond.
- Virginia seeks its first 9-0 start since 2001-02.
- The Cavaliers are 2-0 against in-state opponents this season, defeating James Madison (79-51) and Norfolk State (67-39).
- The Cavaliers rank second in the nation in scoring defense (46.3 ppg) and fourth in field goal percentage defense (31.1%).
- Virginia has held opponents under 70 points in a nation-leading 14 contests.

UVA MOVES UP TO NO. 7 IN LATEST ASSOCIATED PRESS POLL

- UVA is ranked No. 7/6 in the latest Associated Press and USA Today coaches' polls.
- The Cavaliers were ranked No. 9 in the AP poll for the first three week of the season and No. 8 last week.
- The No. 9 AP preseason ranking was UVA's best since a No. 1 ranking to start the 1982-83 season.
- UVA's No. 3 final AP ranking last season marked its highest final ranking since 1982.

SERIES HISTORY

- UVA sports a 10-2 all-time mark, including a 5-1 mark in Richmond, against VCU in the series that dates back to 1976-77.
- VCU snapped Virginia's four-game winning streak in the series with last year's 59-56 win over the Cavaliers in Charlottesville.
- The Cavaliers play VCU for the first time in Richmond since the 1998-99 season.

LAST TIME VS. VCU

- Treveon Graham hit a game-winning 3-pointer with 1.4 seconds remaining to send VCU to a 59-56 win over Virginia on Nov. 12, 2013.
- Graham led the Rams with a game-high 22 points.
- Joe Harris led Virginia with 18 points on 7-of-12 shooting and Malcolm Brogdon added 10 points.

- Mike Tobey added nine rebounds as the Cavaliers held a 41-28 advantage on the glass.

- Virginia committed a season-high 19 turnovers and shot just 39.1 percent (18-46) from the field, 12.5 percent from 3-point range (1-8) and 57.6 percent (19-33) from the charity stripe.

ALL-TIME AGAINST THE ATLANTIC 10

- VCU is one of four Atlantic 10 Conference opponents on UVA's 2014-15 schedule (Davidson, George Washington and La Salle).
- The Cavaliers are 2-0 against the A-10 this season, defeating George Washington (59-42) and La Salle (64-56).
- Virginia is 114-79 all-time against current Atlantic 10 members (11-4 vs. Davidson, 2-0 vs. Dayton, 0-3 vs. Fordham, 7-1 vs. George Mason, 26-23 vs. George Washington, 1-2 vs. LaSalle, 2-0 vs. UMass, 1-1 vs. Rhode Island, 52-36 vs. Richmond, 2-6 vs. Saint Joseph's, 0-1 vs. Saint Louis and 10-2 vs. VCU).

AGAINST THE COMMONWEALTH

- Since the 1999-2000 season, Virginia has a 53-13 record against teams from the Commonwealth of Virginia.
- UVA is 19-4 in its last 23 games vs. in-state opponents.

LAST TIME OUT

- Malcolm Brogdon led four Cavaliers in double figures with 18 points as No. 7 Virginia defeated No. 21 Maryland 76-65 in the ACC/Big Ten Challenge on Dec. 3.
- Justin Anderson added 16 points, Mike Tobey had 14 points and Anthony Gill added 11 as Virginia led the entire game.
- The Cavaliers shot 53.1 percent from the field and outrebounded Maryland 34-22 in their first win over a ranked team this season.
- Rookie Marial Shayok added nine points, five rebounds and four assists off the bench.
- The Cavaliers limited the Terrapins to 40 percent shooting from the field and only six assists on 16 made field goals.

VIRGINIA HEAD COACH TONY BENNETT

- Sixth-year head coach Tony Bennett sports a 114-60 mark at Virginia and 183-93 mark in nine seasons overall.
- Bennett was named 2014 ACC Coach of the Year after guiding the Cavaliers to their first ACC Tournament championship since 1976.
- In 2013-14, he guided UVa to its first ACC regular season and tournament championship in the same season for the first time in school history.
- Bennett has guided the Cavaliers to three consecutive postseason tournaments (NCAA in 2012 and 2014 and NIT in 2013).
- Bennett has increased UVa's win total in each of the last five seasons (15 in 2009-10, 16 in 2010-11, 22 in 2011-12, 23 in 2013-13 and 30 in 2013-14).
- Bennett-coached teams are 65-3 when holding opponents to fewer than 50 points during his nine-year coaching career.
- Bennett-coached teams have finished in the top five nationally in scoring defense in five of eight seasons (first in 2008-09; second in 2007-08 and 2011-12, fifth in 2012-13 and first in 2013-14).
- Bennett is one of 24 Division I head coaches who played in the NBA.

EMBRACE THE PACE

- Virginia is averaging 68.0 points and allowing the 46.3 points (second in the nation), marking its best averages under head coach Tony Bennett.
- UVa has shot 46.8 percent from the field and 35.5 percent from 3-point range, while limiting its opponents to 31.1 percent from the field and 27.9 percent from 3-point range.
- The Cavaliers have held 32 straight opponents and 37 straight ACC opponents under 50 percent shooting from the field.
- UVa has limited its opponents to 12 fast break points.
- As of Dec. 5, the Cavaliers rank in the top six nationally in 10 defensive categories: points per game (2nd), rebound percentage (2nd), assists per game (2nd), points per possession (3rd), rebounds per game (3rd), effective shooting percentage (4th), field goal percentage (4th), offensive rebounding percentage (4th), true shooting percentage (4th) and possessions per 40 minutes (6th).

BARCLAYS CENTER CLASSIC RECAP

- The Cavaliers' Barclays Center title on Nov. 29 marked their third tournament championship in the Tony Bennett era (2014 ACC Tournament and Corpus Christi Challenge).
- Virginia defeated Norfolk State (67-39), Tennessee State (79-36), La Salle (64-56) and Rutgers (45-26) en route to the title.
- The 26 points allowed against Rutgers were the fewest allowed by UVa in the shot clock era (since 1986).
- The Cavaliers held Rutgers scoreless for 9:24 in the second half of the title game.
- Anthony Gill was named tournament MVP after averaging 14 points and eight rebounds in the four games.
- Justin Anderson joined Gill on the all-tournament team.

BROGDON LEADS CAVALIERS INTO ACTION

- Preseason All-ACC performer Malcolm Brogdon leads UVa into action this season.
- Brogdon ranks third on the team at 12.3 points per game and had a season-high 20 points against La Salle and added 18 at Maryland.
- In 2013-14, Brogdon averaged a career-high 12.7 points and 5.4 rebounds en route to All-ACC honors.
- Brogdon scored a career-best 23 points in the 2014 ACC Tournament final win against Duke.

SIXTH MAN NO MORE

- Junior guard Justin Anderson has started and led or tied for the team lead in scoring in six games.
- Anderson tallied a season-high 20 points against Tennessee State and 18 points against James Madison and George Washington.
- He is averaging career highs in points (15.1), rebounds (4.5), field goal percentage (54.4%) and 3-point field goal percentage (56.7%).
- Anderson tied a career high with five 3-pointers on 5-5 shooting from distance against Tennessee State.
- Anderson was named 2014 ACC Sixth Man of the Year after averaging 7.8 points and 3.2 rebounds off the bench.
- In 2013-14, Anderson led the team in scoring in five games and had several game-changing defensive plays to ignite UVa.

HIGH POINT MAN IN THE PAINT

- Anthony Gill, a High Point, N.C., native, is averaging career highs in points (12.4) and rebounds (6.4) this season.
- Gill tallied his first career double-double with 16 points and a career-high 10 rebounds en route to MVP honors at the Barclays Center Classic.
- Gill has hit doubles figures in four straight games, and is averaging 14 points over the last four games.
- Gill leads the team in field goal percentage (63.6%) and is shooting a career-best 78.4 percent (29-37) from the free-throw line after shooting 62.7 percent last season and 64.6 percent at South Carolina in 2011-12.

LONDON CALLING

- Sophomore point guard London Perrantes had seven assists and no turnovers in UVa's win at Maryland.
- Perrantes has a 3.3 assist-to-turnover ratio.
- Perrantes averaged 5.5 points and 3.8 assists and ranked sixth nationally in assist-to-turnover ratio (3.5) to earn All-ACC Freshman Team honors last season.
- Perrantes (140 assists) became the fourth UVa freshman to record 100 assists in a season, joining Cory Alexander (144 in 1991-92), Jeff Jones (136 in 1978-79) and Sean Singletary (113 in 2004-05).

NOLTE KNOWS SHOOTING

- Junior forward Evan Nolte is one of Virginia's top 3-point shooting threats.
- Nolte, who keyed UVa's rally with a pair of 3-pointers against Coastal Carolina in the 2014 NCAA Tournament, has shot 34.7 percent from 3-point range during his career.
- Nolte tallied five points against Norfolk State and four points at Maryland.

ROOKIES ARE FINDING THEIR WAY ON GROUNDS

- Redshirt freshman Devon Hall and true freshmen Isaiah Wilkins and Marial Shayok have made solid contributions in 2014-15.
- Shayok had nine points, five rebounds and four assists at Maryland.
- Hall had five points and five steals in a starting role in place of London Perrantes at James Madison.
- Wilkins chipped in eight points, five rebounds, three assists, two steals and two blocks at James Madison.
- Freshman B.J. Stith has seen limited action in six games, scoring his first career points (4) against Tennessee State.
- Wilkins averaged 18.2 points, 10.3 rebounds and 3.4 blocks en route to Georgia Gatorade Player of the Year honors for Greater Atlanta Christian last season, while Shayok averaged 15 points and 6 rebounds per game for Blair Academy.
- Stith averaged 12.4 points and 4.3 rebounds for national runner-up Oak Hill Academy.
- Wilkins is the stepson of NBA Hall of Famer Dominique Wilkins, and Stith is the son of UVa all-time leading scorer Bryant Stith.

PAINT IT ORANGE AND BLUE

- Virginia is averaging 34.8 points in the paint, while limiting its opponents to 16 points per game in the paint.
- Frontcourt players Anthony Gill, Mike Tobey and Darion Atkins have combined to shoot 57 percent (85-149) from the field and are averaging 19.3 rebounds as a unit.
- UVa has outrebounded its opponent in every game and has a +14.5 rebounding margin.
- Gill, Tobey, Atkins and Isaiah Wilkins have combined for 33 blocked shots.

ABOUT THE 2014-15 SCHEDULE

- Five of Virginia's opponents are ranked in the latest AP poll (Duke, Louisville, North Carolina, Miami and Maryland), while four (VCU, Syracuse, NC State and Notre Dame) received votes.
- Nine opponents (Duke, Louisville, Pittsburgh, NC State, George Washington, Harvard, North Carolina, Syracuse and VCU) played in the 2014 NCAA Tournament, while three (Clemson, Davidson and Florida State) participated in the National Invitation Tournament and two (Norfolk State and Cleveland State) in the CollegeInsider.com Tournament.

VIRGINIA PICKED 4TH IN THE ACC

- Virginia was selected fourth in the preseason poll at ACC Operation Basketball for the second consecutive season.
- The Cavaliers, who were picked fourth and finished first last season, have finished at or higher than their predicted finish in each of the last five seasons.
- Duke was the preseason favorite, followed by North Carolina, Louisville, Virginia, Syracuse, Pitt, Notre Dame, Florida State, NC State, Miami, Clemson, Wake Forest, Georgia Tech, Boston College and Virginia Tech.

You must have a press pass to be admitted to the media area and the press room.

PHOTO CREDENTIALS

All photographers and camera operators must wear a visible credential issued by the Virginia athletics media relations office. Photographers work from the baselines at both ends of the court at John Paul Jones Arena. Live television is given top priority for courtside space.

PRESS PARKING

Press parking passes are provided upon request on a limited basis. If you need a parking pass, please be sure to inform the UVa athletics media relations office when making your press or photo credential request.

INTERVIEWS

All requests for interviews with Virginia basketball coaches and players should be made through Erich Bacher in the athletics media relations office. It is requested you allow the athletics media relations staff at least one day to arrange an interview.

POSTGAME INTERVIEWS

Virginia head coach Tony Bennett and the visiting head coach will meet with media representatives in the press room after each game at John Paul Jones Arena. Coach Bennett will be available in the press room approximately 10 minutes after the conclusion of the game and the visiting coach will be in the press room approximately 20 minutes after the game. Virginia players will be available in the team meeting room adjacent to the men's basketball locker room after Coach Bennett is done with his postgame press conference.

RADIO

Each visiting school is allowed one free radio broadcast from John Paul Jones Arena. The Virginia athletics media relations office provides two ISDN lines and three business touchtone lines for use by the visiting broadcast crew. Radio network crews work from a courtside location at the scorer's table. Three seats are available at the table and one seat behind the visitor's broadcast location.

GAME SERVICES

Information packets are available before each game at John Paul Jones Arena, and a full statistical summary and play-by-play sheets are distributed at halftime and after the game. Quotes from both coaches and two or three players from each team will be available at the conclusion of the game.
