QUICK HITS - WEEK EIGHT

Three intra-divisional battles – Wake Forest at Georgia Tech, Syracuse at Miami and Boston College at Virginia – are part of the ACC schedule on Saturday, Oct. 21. The Atlantic Division holds a 5-2 lead over the Coastal this season. Historically, the Atlantic owns a 114-105 advantage in the 219 games played to date, which also includes ACC Championship Game contests.

No. 8/7 Miami looks to stay unbeaten when the Hurricanes face Syracuse at Hard Rock Stadium on Saturday, Oct. 21, at 3:30 p.m. on ESPN. The Orange is coming off a 27-24 upset win over No. 2 Clemson, and has improved to 4-3 under second-year head coach Dino Babers. Syracuse receiver Steve Ishmael leads the nation in receptions, while teammate Ervin Philips is third.

Miami (5-0 overall, 3-0 ACC Coastal) has won 10 consecutive games dating back to last season, which is the nation's second-longest winning streak. The Hurricanes stayed perfect with a 25-24 come-from-behind victory over Georgia Tech last Saturday. Miami converted a fourth-and-10 to set up Michael Badgley's 24-yard game-winning field goal with four seconds remaining.

Miami moved to No. 8 in this week's Associated Press Top 25 poll and No. 7 in the Amway Coaches poll. That is the highest AP ranking for the Hurricanes since Oct. 27, 2013, when they were seventh.

Miami is one of four ACC teams ranked in the top 25 polls. In the AP poll, Clemson leads the way at No. 7, followed by the Hurricanes at No. 8, Virginia Tech at No. 14 and NC State is tied at No. 16. In the coaches poll, Miami is seventh, Clemson is eighth, Virginia Tech is 14th and NC State is 17th.

After a week off, No. 14/14 Virginia Tech returns to action this Saturday against North Carolina in Blacksburg at 3:30 p.m. on ESPN2. Virginia Tech has won 10 of 13 ACC meetings versus the Tar Heels since joining the ACC, including a 34-3 victory in a matchup of top 25 teams last year in Chapel Hill.

Looking to end a three-game losing streak, Duke welcomes Pitt to Durham for a 12:20 p.m. kickoff on the ACC Network. Pitt has won four straight at Wallace Wade Stadium.

Boston College travels to Virginia to face the 5-1 Cavaliers. The Eagles' 5-0 record in the series includes three ACC victories (28-17 in 2005 at home, 14-10 in 2009 at Virginia, 17-13 in 2010 at Chestnut Hill).

Clemson saw its nation's best 11-game win streak end at Syracuse last Friday. The Tigers have this week off before an Oct. 28 contest against Georgia Tech. NC State, which won at Pitt last Saturday, also has a bye this week.



QUICK HITS

- Georgia Tech and Wake Forest renew a series under the lights at Bobby Dodd Stadium on Saturday at 7:30 p.m. on ESPNU. This will be the first game between the schools since the Yellow Jackets' 24-20 win at Winston-Salem in 2010.

- Each of Georgia Tech's two losses came by just one point. The Yellow Jackets lost 42-41 to Tennessee in the season opener and fell 25-24 last week at Miami. Georgia Tech's average margin of victory in its three wins is 27.0 points.

- Virginia is 5-1 for the first time since starting the 2007 season 7-1 en route a 9-4 record and a berth in the Gator Bowl.

- Florida State's five opponents to date are 19-4 overall, a winning percentage of .826. That is the highest opponent winning percentage of any team in the nation. The Seminoles' schedule, including future opponents, ranks third nationally with a .673 winning percentage.

- Clemson has been ranked in the top 10 of the AP poll in each of the past 34 weeks. That ties Alabama for the longest current streak in the nation.

- NC State is tied for 16th in the AP Top 25 poll this week. That is the Wolfpack's highest ranking since it was ranked 14th on September 1, 2003.

- Florida State head coach Jimbo Fisher (80-20, .800) and Clemson head coach Dabo Swinney (95-29, .766) are the two winningest coaches by percentage in ACC history.

- One of the national media personalities that Florida State and Louisville share is ESPN GameDay's Lee Corso. In a four-year stint (1969-72) as the head coach at Louisville. Corso, who played collegiately at Florida State from 1953 through 1957, posted a 28-11-3 mark as head of the Cardinals. Louisville travels to Florida State this Saturday in an Atlantic Division contest.

- Louisville QB Lamar Jackson became the fastest player in league history to gain 10,000 yards of total offense, accomplishing the feat in just 31 games. He is only the second junior to top the 10,000-yard mark, joining Clemson's Deshaun Watson who did so in 33 games. Jackson's career total now stands at 10,926 through 32 games. He ranks fourth on the ACC career list, trailing only Watson (12,097), Tajh Boyd of Clemson (13,069) and Philip Rivers (13,582) of NC State.

- The Nagurski Trophy, given annually to the nation's top defensive player, honored Virginia Tech LB Andrew Motuapuaka with its Defender of the Nation weekly award as one of the nominees on Oct. 9. Motuapuaka is averaging 7.3 tackles per game with 2.5 sacks, leading a unit that ranks eighth nationally in scoring defense, allowing just 13.7 points per game.

- The Maxwell Club honored Duke LB Joe Giles-Harris as one of its hot candidates for the Bednarik Awards for his performance the past two weeks. The Bednarik is given by the Maxwell Club to the nation's top defensive player. Against Virginia on Oct. 7, Giles-Harris notched a game-high 15 stops, including 3.5 tackles for loss, a sack, a forced fumble and a pass breakup.

- Three ACC quarterbacks – Clemson's Kelly Bryant, Miami's Malik Rozier and Virginia Tech's Josh Jackson – were added to the Manning Award watch list this past week. The Manning Award is presented annu-

In The Rankings:

- Syracuse senior WR Steve Ishmael leads the nation with 62 receptions and is second in receptions per game (8.9), third in total receiving yards (802), and third in receiving yards per game (114.6). Ishmael is one of three ACC players in the top 10 in receptions per game, including his teammate Ervin Philips, who is tied for fifth (8.0), and NC State's Jaylen Samuels, who is eighth (7.7).

- Boston College's Michael Walker leads the nation in combined return yardage. Walker, who is eighth nationally in punt return average (16.8), has 753 total return yards, including both punt (320) and kick-off (433) returns. North Carolina sophomore Anthony Ratliff-Williams is second with 605 yards, all on kickoff returns, while Pitt's Quadree Henderson is third with 561, and NC State's Nyheim Hines is seventh with 512.

- NC State senior DE Bradley Chubb is second nationally in tackles for loss, averaging 2.0 per game. He is also sixth nationally in quarterback sacks, averaging 0.93 per game.

- After racking up 512 yards last week against Boston College, Louisville QB Lamar Jackson leads the nation in total offense. Jackson is averaging 430.2 yards per game, and is ahead of the ACC-record of 393.4 yards per game, set by Jackson last year. Syracuse junior QB Eric Dungey is currently seventh nationally in total offense, averaging 352.3 yards per game.

- Jackson also ranks second in the country in points responsible for (156).

ally to the nation's top quarterback and has been won the last two years by former Clemson standout Deshaun Watson.

- ACC teams have performed well this season on third-down with six teams ranking among the top eight nationally in third down defensive percentage. Georgia Tech is second (.224), followed by No. 3 Syracuse (.239), No. 4 Virginia Tech (.247), No. 5 Virginia (.268) and No. 8 Duke (.269).

- Eight ACC football players have been named semifinalists for the National Football Foundation's Campbell Trophy, which is given annually to the nation's top football scholar-athlete. The semifinalists are OT Gabe Brandner of Duke; OT Andrew Marshall of Georgia Tech; WR Braxton Berrios of Miami; TE Cole Cook of NC State; P Ryan Winslow of Pitt; DB Jordan Martin of Syracuse; LB Micah Kiser of Virginia and TE Cam Serigne of Wake Forest.

- Twelve ACC football players have been nominated for the 2017 Allstate AFCA Good Works team. The list is led by Heisman Trophy winning QB Lamar Jackson of Louisville and includes DT Christian Wilkins of Clemson, T Gabe Brandner of Duke, TE Mavin Saunders of Florida State, QB Matthew Jordan of Georgia Tech, DL Demetrius Jackson of Miami, WR Austin Proehl of North Carolina, P A.J. Cole III of NC State, T Brian O'Neill of Pitt, QB Zack Mahoney of Syracuse, S Quin Blanding of Virginia and PK Joey Slye of Virginia Tech.

Eleven quarterbacks from ACC schools have started an NFL game this season. Four of those signal callers are from NC State, including Philip Rivers (Chargers), Russell Wilson (Seahawks), Jacoby Brissett (Colts) and Mike Glennon (Bears). They are joined by Clemson's Deshaun Watson (Texans), Boston College's Matt Ryan (Falcons), North Carolina's Mitch Trubisky (Bears), Pitt's Tom Savage (Texans), Virginia Tech's



Win Streaks:

- Miami's 10-game win streak is the second-longest in the country behind only USF (11 games). Miami won 10 in a row over the 2003-04 seasons, but has not won 11 consecutive since a 12-game streak in 2002.
- Florida State has now won six straight true road games, which is the third-longest current streak in the FBS. The Seminoles are joined by Virginia Tech, which has won five straight road games and is tied for fifth, while both Miami and NC State have each won four consecutive road games and are each tied for 10th.
- Clemson has won eight straight over top 25 teams, the longest streak in Tiger history. The Tigers are 10-1 in matchups of top 15 teams over the last three years and 13-1 in its last 14 games against teams ranked in the top 25 of at least one poll.
- NC State's six-game win streak is sixth-best nationally.
- Georgia Tech has won five straight at home and welcomes Wake Forest to Atlanta this weekend.

Tyrod Taylor (Bills) and Florida State's Jameis Winston (Buccaneers) and E.J. Manuel (Raiders). All 11 played in the ACC.

Seven ACC quarterbacks have made their first career starts this season. Boston College's Anthony Brown, Clemson's Kelly Bryant, Virginia Tech's Josh Jackson and Georgia Tech's TaQuon Marshall all made their first starts in week one. North Carolina's Chazz Surratt made his first career start in week two vs. Louisville. Florida State true freshman James Blackman and Pitt sophomore Ben DiNucci made their first starts on Sept. 23. In addition, Miami's Malik Rosier made just the second start of his career in the Hurricanes' season-opener against Bethune-Cookman.

COASTAL NOTES

Virginia leads the nation in red zone defense, allowing its opponents to score just 57.1 percent of the time (eighth of 14).

Duke is 50-4 when leading or tied after three quarters of play under head coach David Cutcliffe, a winning percentage of .926.

Miami PK Michael Badgley successfully converted all four of his field goal attempts in the Hurricanes' 25-24 win over Georgia Tech, including a 24-yard game-winner with four seconds remaining. Badgley now has 69 career field goals, third-most among active players and tied for the eighth-best career total in league history. He also ranks third nationally among all active kickers in field goals per game (1.68).

Virginia LB Micah Kiser, who is one of the semifinalists for the prestigious National Football Foundation Campbell Trophy, the award also known as the academic Heisman, is ninth nationally in total tackles, averaging 10.5 per game. Kiser is also 15th nationally in sacks (0.83).

Virginia Tech freshman QB Josh Jackson leads all freshmen nationally in passing yards (1,700), completion percentage (.656) and TD passes (13).

Virginia Tech WR Cam Phillips ranks second nationally among all active receivers with 207 career catches. That total ties him for 13th place on the ACC career list with FSU's Peter Warrick and Duke's Donovan Varner.

Virginia Tech PK Joey Slye moved into sixth place on the ACC career scoring list with 376 points. Slye tallied 11 points in the Hokies' win over Boston College, including three field goals. He now has 74 career field goals, which is the fourth-highest total in league history. Slye ranks second nationally among all active career players in field goals.

Virginia safety Quin Blanding leads all active FBS players in career total tackles with 419. Blanding, currently in his fourth year as a starter, averages 9.98 tackles per game. He recorded his first career interception for a TD in UVA's win over Duke, returning a Blue Devil pass 58 yards for a score to give the Cavaliers a 7-0 lead.

ATLANTIC NOTES

Boston College RB A.J. Dillon ran for 272 yards and four TDs in the Eagles win over Louisville to earn Walter Camp National Offense Player of the Week honors. His 272 yards are the highest rushing total in the ACC since BC's Andre Williams set the league record with 339 yards against NC State in 2013. The 272 yards are the second-highest total by a freshman in league history and the fifth-highest single game total in the nation this year. It is also the 11th-best rushing effort by an ACC player in league history.

Syracuse' 27-24 upset of No. 2-ranked Clemson marked the highest-ranked opponent the Orange had defeated since downing No. 1 Nebraska (17-9) in Syracuse in 1984, a span of 33 years. It was the first top five foe defeated by the 'Cuse since a 22-14 win over fifth-ranked Virginia Tech in 2001. It was also the third time in the AP poll era Syracuse beat the defending national champion (1987 - Penn State, 1998 - Michigan) and the first time the Orange defeated a No. 2-ranked team.

NC State's Nyheim Hines had an 83-yard touchdown run and a 92-yard punt return for a touchdown in the win over Pitt. He is the first FBS player this century with touchdowns of 80-or-more yards on both a punt return and a rush in the same game. Hines was named to the Hornung Award honor roll for the third time this season following the game.

Clemson's Clelin Ferrell posted 5.5 tackles in the Tigers' upset loss to Syracuse, which ties for the most in a single-game in the nation this year.

When Louisville's Lamar Jackson rushed for 180 yards against Boston College, it was the ninth-best rushing total by a quarterback in ACC history. Of the nine performances, Jackson has recorded six of them.

Jackson has rushed for 42 touchdowns, an ACC career record for a quarterback. The conference career mark for rushing touchdowns regardless of position is 52, set by Pitt's James Conner. The 42 rushing scores ties North Carolina's Mike Voight (1973-76) for ninth on the ACC career list.

Louisville WR Dez Fitzpatrick has seven TD receptions this year, which is the most nationally by any freshman and ties for the third-highest total in the FBS.

Louisville PK Blanton Creque has made 25 of 28 career field goal attempts, a percentage of .893, which ranks second nationally among all active place-kickers. Creque has made all nine of his attempts this year and is one of three players who has yet to miss on a field goal attempt, though the other two only have six attempts.

When Syracuse defeated Pitt and No. 2-Clemson by the same 27-24 score, it marked only the ninth time in ACC history a team has won back-to-back games on successive weekends by the same score.

Wake Forest leads the nation in team tackles for loss, averaging 9.2 hits behind the line of scrimmage per game. The Deacons are one of four ACC teams ranked in the Top 10, and are followed by Miami (third, 8.6), Duke (eighth, 8.1) and Clemson (tied for ninth, 8.0).

NC State quarterback Ryan Finley has thrown 313 consecutive passes without an interception, which is the second-longest streak in ACC history. He trails only former NC State QB Russell Wilson, who set the ACC mark of 379 passes without a pick during the 2008-09 seasons. Finley and Louisiana-Monroe's Caleb Evans are the only remaining FBS quarterbacks who have not thrown an interception. Finley also ranks seventh nationally in completion percentage (.694).

Clemson has won 10 or more games in each of the last six years. The Tigers and Alabama are the only two teams that currently have active streaks of six or more years with double-figure victories. The Tigers are only the 11th team to have had 10 wins in six successive seasons.

ACC COACHING SUCCESS

Six ACC coaches – the most of any conference – rank in the top 17 of all active coaches in career winning percentage with a minimum of five years as a head coach. Florida State's Jimbo Fisher ranks third (.800), followed by Clemson's Dabo Swinney (sixth, .766), Miami's Mark Richt (seventh, .743), Louisville's Bobby Petrino (10th, .711), Georgia Tech's Paul Johnson (16th, .669) and Virginia's Bronco Mendenhall (17th, .663).

Georgia Tech head coach Paul Johnson ranks fourth among all active head coaches in career victories, having recorded 180 wins in his 20-year career. Miami's Mark Richt is eighth with 159 wins, followed by Louisville's Bobby Petrino, who is 16th with 113 wins, Dave Clawson of Wake Forest (107) who is 21st, Virginia's Bronco Mendenhall, who is 22nd with 106 wins, and Duke's David Cutcliffe, who is 23rd with 100 wins.

FSU head coach Jimbo Fisher is just the eighth coach in ACC history to have won at least 80 games at an ACC school since the conference began in 1953. Fisher won his 80th game at Duke last Saturday and is currently 80-20. He joins Dabo Swinney, Danny Ford and Frank Howard of Clemson; Bill Murray of Duke; Bobby Bowden of Florida State; George Welsh of Virginia and Frank Beamer of Virginia Tech with 80 wins at one ACC school.
