VIRGINIA-PITT SERIES

- Virginia owns a 7-2 edge in the series after winning two of three games last season in Pittsburgh in the teams' first games as ACC foes.
- The teams combined for 10 runs in the 2014 series, with both of UVa's wins coming by shutout, including Nathan Kirby's no-hitter in Game 1.
- Pitt was slated to make its first appearance in Charlottesville since March 24, 1981, before the latest storm put a stop to that.
- UVa has won its last six ACC season-opening series, dating to a 2008 series loss at Duke.

VIRGINIA STARTS SEASON 10-0 FOR FOURTH TIME

- Virginia is off to a 10-0 start for the fourth time in program history – all during Brian O'Connor's 12 seasons as head coach.
- UVa won 19 consecutive games to begin the 2009 season. That remains the longest win streak at any point in program history.
- UVa won 11 straight to open the 2008 season and 14 straight to begin the 2013 campaign.
- The Cavaliers are one of two unbeaten teams thus far, joining Texas A&M (12-0); five schools have yet to play their first game.

THE HOME OPENER IS COMING ... EVENTUALLY

- As long as Virginia opens its home schedule in the next couple of weeks, the home opener will be the latest Virginia home opener since the Cavaliers began the 1988 home slate on March 26 against West Chester.
- UVa has thrived at home during the Brian O'Connor era. The Cavaliers finished 34-4 at home in 2014, boosting their record to 340-73 (.823) at Davenport Field since 2004.
- Virginia is 69-9 (.885) at home over the past two seasons.
- For the first time since 2003, Virginia did not play a home game in February.

WEATHER WREAKS HAVOC ON HOME SCHEDULE

- Inclement weather has forced Virginia to postpone three midweek games and relocate three weekend series, now including the Pitt series.
- In all, Virginia has had 13 home games altered because of inclement weather.
- UVa was forced to shift its series with Marist (Feb. 20-22) to Charleston, S.C., and its round-robin tournament with Hartford and Seton Hall to Myrtle Beach.
- UVa's midweek games with VCU and GW have yet to be rescheduled.

ODDS AND ENDS

- UVa joins Texas A&M as the lone unbeaten teams in Division I baseball, among teams that have played at least one game (five schools have not yet played).
- Pavin Smith ranks third nationally among freshmen with 21 hits (tied for first overall in ACC).
- Matt Thaiss is second in the ACC and 11th nationally in home runs (4).
- Virginia ranks fourth nationally in team ERA at 1.27.

FRESHMEN GALORE IN LINEUP

- Virginia has started six freshmen during the first three weeks of the season.
- UVa has put at least four freshmen in each lineup, including six games with five and one with six.
- Ernie Clement (CF), Adam Haseley (RF), Justin Novak (2B) and Pavin Smith (1B/DH) have started all 10 games.
- UVa has had first-years in all three outfield positions in six games.
- Fourteen of UVa's 29 players are freshmen.

FRESHMEN PROVIDE BOOST

- Virginia's freshmen have played a key role in the early going this season.
- UVa's first-year players have combined to record 52.2 percent of the position player starts as well as 51.5 percent of the hits.
- 55 percent of the extra-base hits have come from freshmen.

SMITH OFF TO FAST START

- Rookie Pavin Smith is off to a great start, batting .500 (21-for-42) with hits in all 10 games.
- He has the third-most hits of any freshman in the na-

tion, behind only KJ Harrison or Oregon State and John Clay Reeves of Rice (22 each).

- Smith went 9-for-13 in three games last week.
- He ranks second in the ACC in batting and has the best average among all conference freshmen.
- He is tied with Notre Dame's Cavan Biggio for first in the ACC in hits and also ranks second in doubles (7), total bases (34) and slugging (.810) and fourth in OBP (.563).

PITCHING REMAINS AT FOREFRONT

- Virginia's pitching staff has been solid through the season's first three weeks.
- UVa pitchers have a combined 1.27 ERA while limiting opponents to a .207 batting average. The ERA is tops in the ACC and No. 4 in the nation through Wednesday.
- The starting rotation has been particularly stingy, going 7-0 with a 0.84 ERA. UVa's starters have allowed five earned runs in 10 games.

TOWNS EXTENDS STREAK TO 36 GAMES

- Kenny Towns has reached base safely in all 10 games this season. He finished the 2014 season by reaching safely in 26 straight games.
- His 36-game streak currently ranks fourth in Division I baseball and tops amongst ACC players.
- Appalachian State's Michael Pierson boasts the longest current streak at 40 games.

THAISS PROVIDES THUNDER IN UVA LINEUP

- Matt Thaiss has given the Cavaliers' lineup a jolt of power in the first three weeks of the year.
- The sophomore has four home runs, which is tied for second in the ACC and 11th nationally.
- He did not homer in 72 plate appearances during his 26 games (15 starts) last season.

INJURIES FORCE CAVALIERS TO JUGGLE LINEUP

- Virginia has been forced to alter its lineup after injuries have hampered three of its returning starters.
- Two-year starting outfielder Joe McCarthy had back surgery in late January and will miss approximately 12 weeks.
- Catcher Robbie Coman was injured Feb. 21 and is slated to be out at least two weeks.
- John La Prise is day-to-day with a hip injury that has limited him to one game this season.

SBORZ THRIVES IN FIRST CHANCE AS CLOSER

- Josh Sborz moved into the closer role this season and has been solid. He has recorded three saves this year while opponents have just three hits in 10 2/3 innings.
- He went 6-4 with a 2.92 ERA in 17 games (15 starts) during the 2014 season, primarily as the Saturday starter.
- Sborz took over for All-American Nick Howard, who saved an ACC-record 20 games last year and was taken by the Cincinnati Reds with the 19th pick in the first round of the MLB Draft.
- UVa closers own 154 saves in the 12 seasons under the current coaching staff (13.5 saves per season).
- Six of the seven closers since 2004 have been selected in the MLB Draft, including five in the top 10 rounds.

CAVALIERS CAPTURE 18-INNING MARATHON

- Virginia defeated Marist 5-4 in 18 innings on Feb. 22 in Charleston, S.C. It is the longest game by innings in program history.
- The previous high was a 17-inning game, ironically also in Charleston, in 2006 against College of Charleston.
- It is believed to be the second-longest game by time (5:08), behind the 2006 CofC game, which lasted 5:19.
- Virginia shut out Marist over the final 11 innings.
- Freshman Christian Lowry's first college hit, a one-out single in the 18th, scored Matt Thaiss with the winning run.

PRESEASON ALL-AMERICANS

- Three Cavaliers were named preseason All-Americans: LHP Nathan Kirby, OF Joe McCarthy and LHP Brandon Waddell.
- Kirby was a unanimous first-team All-America selection, while McCarthy and Waddell each were named to various teams.

MCCARTHY OUT FOLLOWING BACK SURGERY

- Junior OF Joe McCarthy will miss approximately 12 weeks after undergoing back surgery on Jan. 29.
- A 2015 Preseason All-American, McCarthy started all 69 games last season, batting .301 with six home runs and 49 RBI. He led the team with 16 doubles and 11 stolen bases and was one off the team lead with 77 hits.
- During his two seasons at UVa, McCarthy is a .317 batter with 152 hits in 129 games.

KIRBY, WADDELL ON GOLDEN SPIKES WATCH LIST

- Virginia left-handed pitchers Nathan Kirby and Brandon Waddell each were named to the preseason Golden Spikes Award watch list.
- The list consists of 50 players in amateur baseball.
- Virginia is one of seven schools who have multiple players on the list, joining Cal State Fullerton, Florida, Miami, TCU, UCLA and Vanderbilt.
- A preseason First-Team All-American, Kirby was a semifinalist for the 2014 Golden Spikes Award.

VIRGINIA LANDS NO. 2 RECRUITING CLASS

- Virginia reeled in the No. 2-ranked recruiting class for 2014 according to Baseball America, behind only LSU. It marked the best recruiting ranking in program history.
- The class is comprised of 14 student-athletes.
- Three were selected in the 2014 MLB Draft: RHP Derek Casey (22nd round, St. Louis), 1B/LHP Pavin Smith (32nd round, Colorado) and RHP Tommy Doyle (35th round, Washington).

WHO'S GONE?

- Virginia has plenty of holes to fill after losing five position players and three key members of its bullpen to the 2014 MLB Draft.
- Virginia had three first-round picks, just the seventh program in the last 20 years to do so in one year: RHP Nick Howard (No. 19), OF Derek Fisher (No. 37) and OF Mike Papi (No. 38).
- UVa also lost OF Brandon Downes (7th round), INF Branden Cogswell (7th), RHP Artie Lewicki (8th), RHP

CAVALIERS TAKE FIRST-EVER FOREIGN TOUR

- Virginia went on an eight-day international tour to Central America from Dec. 17-24, marking the baseball program's first-ever foreign tour.
- UVa traveled to Panama and Costa Rica.
- The foreign tour enabled the young squad to gel through extra practice time, an exhibition game in Panama City and team-building events.
- In its exhibition contest, UVa scored a 9-1 win over Panama Metro on Dec. 18 at Rod Carew National Stadium, a 27,000-seat stadium which hosted games in the 2013 World Baseball Classic.
- During its travels through Panama, the Cavaliers had the opportunity to tour the Miraflores Locks at the Panama Canal, canoe down the Tigris River and visit the indigenous Embera Village, where the team toured and learned about the village's customs.
- While in Costa Rica, the team toured the Doka Coffee Plantation, zip-lined through the rainforest, hiked through the Arenal Volcano National Park and went white-water rafting on the Savegre River.

- With eight players drafted, UVa tied for the second most picks of any school in 2014 (Ole Miss, 9).
- UVa had six players taken in the top 10 rounds – most of any school.

LEFT SIDE OF INFELD RETURNS IN TACT

- While much of the Cavaliers' defense is in flux, the left side of the infield returns in tact as sophomore SS Daniel Pinero and senior 3B Kenny Towns are back.
- Towns has played in a team-high 149 games, including 120 starts. Pinero started 68 of UVa's 69 games last year – all at shortstop.
- The two were a key part of the Cavaliers' defense which recorded a program-best .981 fielding percentage in 2014.
- Towns reached base safely in each of his final 26 games last season, including all 12 games in the NCAA tournament.

O'CONNOR LEADS ACTIVE COACHES IN WIN PCT., 13TH ALL-TIME

- Virginia head coach Brian O'Connor is 524-177-2 (.745) in his 12th season in charge of the Cavaliers' program.
- O'Connor's 74.3 percent winning percentage entering the season ranked No. 1 among active Division I head coaches.
- O'Connor also ranks 13th all-time in career winning percentage among all coaches with at least 10 years of head coaching experience.
- Virginia has won at least 39 games in all 11 of O'Connor's seasons, including nine 40-win seasons and four 50-win campaigns.

PITCHING STRONG IN 2014

- Virginia returns seven pitchers who saw playing time as part of the Cavaliers' CWS team in 2014.
- The Cavaliers led the ACC and ranked second nationally with a 2.23 ERA. That mark tied the 1971 team for the second-lowest in program history, behind only the 1950 team's 1.77 ERA.
- Batters hit .201 against UVa, lowest in the nation.
- UVa gave up three runs or fewer in 54 of its 69 games, including a streak of 18 straight at one point.

NO FREE 90S

- Virginia prides itself on not giving easy passes to potential baserunners; that was never more evident than the 2014 season.
- The Cavaliers ranked No. 1 nationally in walks/hits per nine innings (WHIP) at 1.03.
- UVa pitchers were best in the ACC and 36th nationally in fewest walks per nine innings (2.88).
- The Cavaliers ranked ninth nationally in K-to-BB ratio (2.81) and 14th in strikeouts per nine innings (8.1).
- UVa pitchers also allowed the fewest hits per nine innings in Division I (6.37).

GET 'EM ON, GET 'EM OVER, GET 'EM IN

- Virginia led the ACC and finished fifth nationally in 2014 with 87 sacrifice bunts.
- The Cavaliers set a program record for sac bunts in 2014.
- Forty of Virginia's bunts came in ACC play.
- UVa laid down an NCAA record-tying seven bunts in its win over Boston College on March 15 (game 1 of DH).

UVA BREAKS SCHOOL ATTENDANCE RECORDS

- Virginia broke the school records for season and average attendances last season.
- UVa ranked 11th nationally in total attendance (142,496) and average attendance (3,749).
- Both totals ranked third among ACC programs.
- UVa crushed its previous records for average (3,298 in 2011) and total attendance (125,959 in 2010).
- More than 110,000 fans have attended Virginia games each of the past five seasons as UVa has ranked among the top 20 programs nationally in attendance every year.

MOST WINS SINCE 2009

- With 308 victories since the start of the 2009 season, Virginia owns the most wins of any team in the nation in that span.
- The Cavaliers have won 50 games or more four times in the last five seasons.
