### VIRGINIA-MIAMI SERIES

- Miami holds a 19-18 lead in the all-time series with Virginia.
- Virginia has claimed nine of the last 10 meetings, including its first-ever series sweep of the Hurricanes last year in Coral Gables.
- The Cavaliers also have won their last three series with Miami.
- UVa is 7-8 all-time against the Canes at Davenport Field.

### VIRGINIA TIES BEST 25-GAME START TO SEASON

- Virginia has matched the program's best 25-game start to a season with a 23-2 record, which also was set two years ago during the 2011 campaign.
- UVa's top five starts to a season all have been set during the last seven years:  
**• 2013:** 23-2, **2011:** 23-2, **2009:** 22-3, **2010:** 21-4, **2007:** 21-4

### CAVALIERS STINGY AT HOME

- Off to a 19-1 home start this year, Virginia is 143-29 at Davenport Field since 2009.
- That equates to an 83.1 winning percentage.
- UVa was 26-10 at home last year, after setting the school record for home victories each of the previous two years (34 in 2010, 35 in 2011).

### LOCK DOWN BULLPEN

- Virginia's bullpen was lights out in the NC State series, allowing just an earned run with no walks in 12 innings of work.
- UVa's pen has allowed just one run in the last five games (22 1/3 IP).
- The Cavaliers' relief corps has a 2.10 ERA this year while limiting opponents to a .214 batting average.

### OFFENSE PUTS UP BIG INNINGS REGULARLY

- Virginia has scored three or more runs in an inning 34 times this year.
- The Cavaliers have had just five games where they have not recorded at least three runs in one inning.
- UVa has scored three runs in an inning on 18 occasions this year.
- The Cavaliers' most dominant innings: the fifth (outscored opponents 32-6), seventh (30-7) and eighth (36-5).
- UVa averages 8.7 runs per game, outscoring its opponents 209-70.

### ODDS AND ENDS

- UVa ranks third in the ACC in ERA (2.26) and batting (.313) and seventh in fielding (.968).
- UVa is 14-0 when committing one error or fewer this year.
- The Cavaliers lead the nation with 22 triples and are tied with 23 wins.
- Virginia pitchers have issued by far the fewest walks in the ACC (50).
- UVa is 20-0 when leading after six innings this season.

## STARTERS SHINING IN 2013

- Virginia's starting pitchers have excelled this season.
- UVa's starters own a 14-1 record and 2.38 ERA this year, while allowing only 23 extra-base hits.
- The starters racked up a streak of 42 2/3 consecutive scoreless innings which ran from Feb. 16-March 2.

## FRESHMEN PLAYING KEY ROLES

- Virginia has leaned heavily on its first-year players early this season, particularly on the mound.
- Twelve freshmen already have seen playing time – tied for seventh-most nationally and second among ACC teams (Clemson 13, Maryland 12).

- Tennessee leads the nation with 17 freshmen who have played this year.
- Seven freshmen have accounted for 49 percent of the innings pitched this year (111 of 226 2/3 total).
- Joe McCarthy has started all 25 contests in the batting order.

## VIRGINIA SLOWS THE RUNNING GAME

- Virginia has shown the propensity to slow its opponents' running game this year.
- Virginia has allowed just 13 stolen base attempts in 25 games, with eight successful steals.
- The Cavaliers also have picked off seven baserunners.

- UVa allowed three stolen bases to Maryland, which entered with 44 steals in 12 games, and none to NC State, who entered with 47 stolen bases in 53 attempts.

## VIRGINIA AMONG NATIONAL LEADERS IN RUNS

- Entering the week, Virginia was tied for sixth nationally in runs scored.
- With 202 runs scored in 24 games (8.4/game), Virginia was sixth nationally in scoring.
- The Cavaliers rank among the nation's top 15 in eight statistical categories on offense.

## NO FREE PASSES

- Virginia pitchers make opposing batters earn their way on base. The Virginia pitching staff has issued just 50 walks in 25 games, by far the fewest walks allowed in the ACC this year. Clemson is second with 77 walks.
- UVa allows just 1.99 walks per nine innings, which is third fewest nationally.
- The Cavaliers also have hit only nine batters this year (third fewest nationally).

## COGSWELL A FORCE AT TOP OF LINEUP

- Branden Cogswell has stepped into the leadoff slot in the batting order and been sensational in the first six weeks of the year.
- He leads the team with a .391 batting average, 30 runs and a .511 on-base percentage.
- Cogswell has struck out only nine times in 122 plate appearances.

## UVA TIED FOR NATIONAL LEAD IN SHUTOUTS

- Virginia has racked up six shutouts in its first 25 games, which is tied for the national lead.
- Rice, South Carolina and Texas Tech also have six shutouts.
- The total is already tied with the 1996 team for fifth most in a season at Virginia.
- UVa finished with just two shutouts in 2012.

### DOWNES ANCHORS LINEUP AT CLEANUP

• In his first year as the Cavaliers' cleanup hitter, Brandon Downes has started strong and is batting .319 with a .439 on base percentage.  
 • In 25 games he has four homers and 23 RBI; in 34 games (26 starts) last year, he posted one home run and 22 RBI.  
 • Downes also has scored 29 runs, topping his 2012 mark of 20, and leads the team with 14 extra-base hits, including four triples (sixth most nationally).

### TOWNS MAKES EARLY MARK AS RUN PRODUCER

• Kenny Towns already has more than doubled his 2012 RBI total (12) with a team-high 26 RBI in 24 games.  
 • He slugged two grand slams in the season opener at ECU, going yard in the first and seventh innings – both to the opposite field. They were his first career home runs.  
 • He hit his team-leading fourth homer of the year last week against Yale (March 19).

### WADDELL DAZZLES IN FIRST YEAR

• Rookie southpaw Brandon Waddell has been sensational in his first six starts. With 47 strikeouts (in 34 2/3 IP) this year, he tops all freshmen nationally.  
 • He was named one of Collegiate Baseball's six National Players of the Week on Feb. 25 following a dominating outing vs. Toledo.  
 • In six innings, he struck out 15 batters, most by a UVa freshman hurler since Seth Greisinger fanned 15 against UNC in 1994. He allowed just six hits and one walk.  
 • On Feb. 15 at ECU, Waddell became the first UVa freshman to make the opening-game start since Dave Sammons on Feb. 26, 1986, at William and Mary.

## FIFTH-YEARS PROVIDE LEADERSHIP

- Virginia has a pair of veteran fifth-year seniors set to guide the young 2013 team: Jared King and Scott Silverstein.
- King has played 165 career games, with 146 career starts. His streak of 90 straight starts, dating to 2011, was snapped March 2 in the first game of the DH.
- Silverstein was the Cavaliers' Saturday starter for most of 2012 after battling back from a pair of shoulder surgeries.
- The two have been part of two ACC championship teams, three regional championship squads and two College World Series teams.

## CHANGES AT DAVENPORT FIELD

- Davenport Field underwent several changes during the offseason.
- A new sand-based playing surface has been installed. After removing the previous surface, crews put in a new irrigation and field drainage system (previous field had no drainage system).
- The \$1 million project also included the installation of a new synthetic warning track that runs in foul territory between the foul poles as well as new dugout flooring surfaces and a new FieldTurf collar behind home plate.
- Home plate was moved in about five feet, creating more foul territory down the lines as well as new field dimensions: 332-370-404-370-332.
- In separate projects, new chairback seats were added to replace the grandstand bleachers and a new video board was erected.

## A HOT TICKET AT DAVENPORT FIELD

- UVa fans continue to fill Davenport Field, as more than 110,000 fans have attended Cavalier games each of the past three seasons. UVa has ranked among the top 20 programs nationally in attendance each of the last three years.
- Despite the chilly temperatures and poor weather, Virginia ranks 15th in total attendance (45,984) and 18th in average attendance (2,554) this year.
- UVa ranked 15th nationally in total attendance (112,281) and 19th in average attendance (3,208) last year.
- Davenport Field seats 4,980 per game, slightly down this year after the addition of more chairback seats in place of the bleacher seats in the grandstand.
- The entire reserved section in the grandstand is sold out once again this year.

## O'CONNOR FOURTH AMONG ACTIVE COACHES IN WIN PERCENTAGE

- Virginia head coach Brian O'Connor is 434-151-2 (.738) in 10 seasons at the helm of the Cavaliers.
- O'Connor's 73.4 percent winning percentage entering the season ranked fourth among active Division I head coaches behind only UNC's Mike Fox (.744), Florida State's Mike Martin (.743) and Wichita State's Gene Stephenson (.735).

## CAVALIERS BOAST SECOND-MOST WINS IN NATION SINCE 2009

- Virginia posted 195 wins from 2009-12 – second most in Division I baseball (South Carolina, 198).
- UVa set a school record with 49 wins in 2009, topped it in 2010 with 51 victories, then upped it again in 2011 with a national-best 56 wins.
- Jared King and Scott Silverstein are in their fifth years at UVa and have been part of this entire stretch.

- Virginia led the nation in ERA in 2012 (2.24) and posted No. 3 marks in 2005, 2006, 2007 and 2009.
- Virginia also was the only team in Division I to rank among the top 20 nationally in ERA, strikeouts and fewest hits allowed each season from 2008-11.
