VIRGINIA-FLORIDA STATE SERIES

- Florida State owns a 51-26 edge in the all-time series against Virginia.
- Virginia has won five of its last six series against FSU.
- The Cavaliers have won 15 of the last 23 meetings; the teams split four games last year, with UVa taking two of three in Tallahassee before the Seminoles won in the ACC tournament.
- Since 2010, 13 of the 20 meetings have been determined by three runs or fewer, including three of four last season.

FINALLY, SOME WEEKEND BASEBALL AT DAVENPORT

- With the crazy weather that has plagued Charlottesville this year, Virginia at long last will play host to its first weekend games of 2015.
- This marks the latest date for the first home weekend game since March 26, 1988, against West Chester.
- Virginia had three weekend series moved south, including the opening ACC series against Pitt, which was moved to Cary, N.C.

SPEAKING OF WEEKENDS AT DAVENPORT ...

- Virginia has thrived at home in ACC play in recent years, winning 11 straight series and 27 of its last 28 ACC series, dating to April 2009.
- UVa last lost a home ACC series in 2012 when North Carolina came to town and swept the Cavaliers.

HASELEY GETS BAT GOING

- After struggling at the plate to start the season, Adam Haseley concluded the Virginia Tech series with back-to-back three-hit games.
- It marked the first time he has recorded more than one hit in a game.
- Haseley batted .169 over the first 15 games before going 6-for-9 in the final two games in Blacksburg; he batted leadoff in each of those two contests.

FRESHMEN GALORE IN LINEUP

- Virginia has started six freshmen during the first month of the season.
- UVa has put at least four freshmen in each lineup, including eight games with five rookies and a three contests with six.
- Ernie Clement (CF), Adam Haseley (RF), Justin Novak (2B) and Pavin Smith (1B/DH) have started all 18 games.
- UVa has had first-years in all three outfield positions in eight games.
- Fourteen of UVa's 29 players are freshmen.

- UVa has started 13 different lineups through the first 18 games.
- Matt Thaiss has thrown out nine of 19 baserunners attempting to steal against him (47.4%).
- Virginia ranks first in the ACC and ninth nationally in team ERA at 2.03.

CAVALIERS END LOSING STREAK TUESDAY

- Virginia snapped a four-game losing streak Tuesday with its win against Towson. It marked UVa's longest losing skid since April 23-27, 2008.
- It marked just the fourth four-game losing streak during the current coaching staff's tenure (one in 2005, two in 2008).
- UVa has not lost five straight games since April 29-May 12, 2003.

ROTATION EXCELLING THROUGH FIRST MONTH

- The weekend rotation of Nathan Kirby, Connor Jones and Brandon Waddell has been strong, going 8-2 with a 1.54 ERA.
- The trio has allowed 15 earned runs in 15 games.
- The threesome also is averaging 10.6 strikeouts per nine innings.
- UVa is 11-4 in their starts.

WEATHER WREAKS HAVOC ON HOME SCHEDULE

- Inclement weather has forced Virginia to postpone three midweek games and relocate three weekend series.

- In all, Virginia has had 13 home games altered because of inclement weather.
- UVa was forced to shift its series with Marist (Feb. 20-22) to Charleston, S.C., and its round-robin tournament with Hartford and Seton Hall to Myrtle Beach.
- UVa played its first home game Wednesday (but not until after a two-hour rain delay). UVa's midweek games with VCU and GW have yet to be rescheduled.

FRESHMEN PROVIDE BOOST

- Virginia's freshmen have played a key role in the early going this season.
- UVa's first-year players have combined to record 53 percent of the position player starts as well as 50 percent of the hits.

JONES SETTLES INTO STARTING ROLE

- In his first season in the UVa rotation, Connor Jones has been impressive, with a 4-1 record and 1.57 ERA.
- He is tied for second in the ACC with four wins
- In 28 2/3 innings, Jones is limiting opponents to a .221 batting average.
- He is seventh in the ACC in ERA and 10th in strikeouts.

THAISS PROVIDES THUNDER IN UVA LINEUP

- Matt Thaiss has given the Cavaliers' lineup a jolt of power in the first month of the season.
- The sophomore has blasted six home runs, which puts him in a tie for ninth nationally and second in the ACC.
- Thaiss hit his sixth homer in UVa's 14th game of the season; last season it took Mike Papi 33 games to hit his sixth long ball and become the first Cavalier to reach six homers.
- He also is sixth in the league in slugging (.759).
- Thaiss did not homer in 72 plate appearances during his 26 games (15 starts) last season.

TOWNS STREAK ENDS, BUT A NEW ONE BEGINS

- Kenny Towns's streak of reaching base safely in 36 straight games came to an end in the first game of the March 7 doubleheader against Pitt.
- He actually did reach base in the game, but it was on an eighth-inning throwing error.
- Since that game, he has reached safely in all seven UVa games.
- He reached base safely in the first 13 games this season after finishing the 2014 season by reaching safely in 26 straight games.
- His 36-game streak ranked fourth in Division I baseball and tops amongst ACC players.

KIRBY AIMS FOR ANOTHER QUALITY START

- Nathan Kirby has a penchant for earning quality starts during his two years as a starter.
- In the last two seasons, Kirby has recorded 19 quality starts in 23 attempts (quality start = at least six IP and three runs or fewer allowed).
- He has three quality starts in four starts this year after recording 15 in 18 starts in 2014.
- Kirby currently leads the ACC in strikeouts (43) and ranks second in ERA (0.83) after allowing one run in each of his two ACC starts.
- He also ranks eighth nationally in strikeouts.

INJURIES FORCE CAVALIERS TO JUGGLE LINEUP

- Virginia has been forced to alter its lineup after injuries have hampered three of its returning starters.
- The Cavaliers already have run out 13 different starting lineups in the first 18 games.
- Two-year starting outfielder Joe McCarthy had back surgery in late January and will miss approximately 12 weeks.
- Catcher Robbie Coman injured his knee on Feb. 21 and is just returning to action after missing eight games.
- John La Prise is day-to-day with a hip injury that has limited him to four games this season.
- Freshmen Jack Gerstenmaier (hamstring) and Riley Wilson (shoulder) also have been sidelined by injuries and have not played this season.

SBORZ THRIVES IN FIRST CHANCE AS CLOSER

- Josh Sborz moved into the closer role this season and has been solid. He has recorded four saves this year while opponents have just six hits in 15 2/3 innings.
- Sborz currently is second in the ACC and tied for 34th nationally in saves this year.
- He went 6-4 with a 2.92 ERA in 17 games (15 starts) during the 2014 season, primarily as the Saturday starter.
- Sborz took over for All-American Nick Howard, who saved an ACC-record 20 games last year and was taken by the Cincinnati Reds with the 19th pick in the first round of the MLB Draft.
- UVA closers own 155 saves in the 12 seasons under the current coaching staff (13.5 saves per season).
- Six of the seven closers since 2004 have been selected in the MLB Draft, including five in the top 10 rounds.

UVA STARTS SEASON 10-0 FOR FOURTH TIME

- Virginia recorded a 10-0 start for the fourth time in program history – all during Brian O'Connor's 12 seasons as head coach. All 10 games were away from home (three road, seven neutral).
- UVA won 19 consecutive games to begin the 2009 season. That remains the longest win streak at any point in program history.
- UVA won 11 straight to open the 2008 season and 14 straight to begin the 2013 campaign.
- The Cavaliers were one of the last two unbeaten teams in the nation, joining Texas A&M.

CAVALIERS CAPTURE 18-INNING MARATHON

- Virginia defeated Marist 5-4 in 18 innings on Feb. 22 in Charleston, S.C. It is the longest game by innings in program history.
- The previous high was a 17-inning game, ironically also in Charleston, in 2006 against College of Charleston.
- It is believed to be the second-longest game by time (5:08), behind the 2006 CofC game, which lasted 5:19.
- Virginia shut out Marist over the final 11 innings.
- Freshman Christian Lowry's first college hit, a one-out single in the 18th, scored Matt Thaiss with the winning run.

CAVALIERS TAKE FIRST-EVER FOREIGN TOUR

- Virginia went on an eight-day international tour to Central America from Dec. 17-24, marking the baseball program's first-ever foreign tour.
- UVA traveled to Panama and Costa Rica.
- The foreign tour enabled the young squad to gel through extra practice time, an exhibition game in Panama City and team-building events.
- In its exhibition contest, UVA scored a 9-1 win over Panama Metro on Dec. 18 at Rod Carew National Stadium, a 27,000-seat stadium which hosted games in the 2013 World Baseball Classic.
- During its travels through Panama, the Cavaliers had the opportunity to tour the Miraflores Locks at the Panama Canal, canoe down the Tigris River and visit the indigenous Embera Village, where the team toured and learned about the village's customs.
- While in Costa Rica, the team toured the Doka Coffee Plantation, zip-lined through the rainforest, hiked through the Arenal Volcano National Park and went white-water rafting on the Savegre River.

PRESEASON ALL-AMERICANS

- Three Cavaliers were named preseason All-Americans: LHP Nathan Kirby, OF Joe McCarthy and LHP Brandon Waddell.
- Kirby was a unanimous first-team All-America selection, while McCarthy and Waddell each were named to various teams.

MCCARTHY OUT FOLLOWING BACK SURGERY

- Junior OF Joe McCarthy will miss approximately 12 weeks after undergoing back surgery on Jan. 29.
- A 2015 Preseason All-American, McCarthy started all 69 games last season, batting .301 with six home runs and 49 RBI. He led the team with 16 doubles and 11 stolen bases and was one off the team lead with 77 hits.
- During his two seasons at UVA, McCarthy is a .317 batter with 152 hits in 129 games.

KIRBY, WADDELL ON GOLDEN SPIKES WATCH LIST

- Virginia left-handed pitchers Nathan Kirby and Brandon Waddell each were named to the preseason Golden Spikes Award watch list.
- The list consists of 50 players in amateur baseball.
- Virginia is one of seven schools who have multiple players on the list, joining Cal State Fullerton, Florida, Miami, TCU, UCLA and Vanderbilt.
- A preseason First-Team All-American, Kirby was a semifinalist for the 2014 Golden Spikes Award.

VIRGINIA LANDS NO. 2 RECRUITING CLASS

- Virginia reeled in the No. 2-ranked recruiting class for 2014 according to Baseball America, behind only LSU. It marked the best recruiting ranking in program history.
- The class is comprised of 14 student-athletes.
- Three were selected in the 2014 MLB Draft: RHP Derek Casey (22nd round, St. Louis), 1B/LHP Pavin Smith (32nd round, Colorado) and RHP Tommy Doyle (35th round, Washington).

WHO'S GONE?

- Virginia has plenty of holes to fill after losing five position players and three key members of its bullpen to the 2014 MLB Draft.
- Virginia had three first-round picks, just the seventh program in the last 20 years to do so in one year: RHP Nick Howard (No. 19), OF Derek Fisher (No. 37) and OF Mike Papi (No. 38).
- UVa also lost OF Brandon Downes (7th round), INF Branden Cogswell (7th), RHP Artie Lewicki (8th), RHP Whit Mayberry (21st) and C Nate Irving (34th).
- With eight players drafted, UVa tied for the second most picks of any school in 2014 (Ole Miss, 9).
- UVa had six players taken in the top 10 rounds – most of any school.

O'CONNOR LEADS ACTIVE COACHES IN WIN PCT., 13TH ALL-TIME

- Virginia head coach Brian O'Connor is 527-182-2 (.743) in his 12th season in charge of the Cavaliers' program.
- O'Connor's 74.3 percent winning percentage entering the season ranked No. 1 among active Division I head coaches.
- O'Connor also ranks 13th all-time in career winning percentage among all coaches with at least 10 years of head coaching experience.
- Virginia has won at least 39 games in all 11 of O'Connor's seasons, including nine 40-win seasons and four 50-win campaigns.

PITCHING STRONG IN 2014

- Virginia returns seven pitchers who saw playing time as part of the Cavaliers' CWS team in 2014.
- The Cavaliers led the ACC and ranked second nationally with a 2.23 ERA. That mark tied the 1971 team for the second-lowest in program history, behind only the 1950 team's 1.77 ERA.
- Batters hit .201 against UVa, lowest in the nation.
- UVa gave up three runs or fewer in 54 of its 69 games, including a streak of 18 straight at one point.

NO FREE 90S

- Virginia prides itself on not giving easy passes to potential baserunners; that was never more evident than the 2014 season.
- The Cavaliers ranked No. 1 nationally in walks/hits per nine innings (WHIP) at 1.03.
- UVa pitchers were best in the ACC and 36th nationally in fewest walks per nine innings (2.88).
- The Cavaliers ranked ninth nationally in K-to-BB ratio (2.81) and 14th in strikeouts per nine innings (8.1).
- UVa pitchers also allowed the fewest hits per nine innings in Division I (6.37).

GET 'EM ON, GET 'EM OVER, GET 'EM IN

- Virginia led the ACC and finished fifth nationally in 2014 with 87 sacrifice bunts.
- The Cavaliers set a program record for sac bunts in 2014.
- Forty of Virginia's bunts came in ACC play.
- UVa laid down an NCAA record-tying seven bunts in its win over Boston College on March 15 (game 1 of DH).

UVa BREAKS SCHOOL ATTENDANCE RECORDS

- Virginia broke the school records for season and average attendances last season.
- UVa ranked 11th nationally in total attendance (142,496) and average attendance (3,749).
- Both totals ranked third among ACC programs.
- UVa crushed its previous records for average (3,298 in 2011) and total attendance (125,959 in 2010).
- More than 110,000 fans have attended Virginia games each of the past five seasons as UVa has ranked among the top 20 programs nationally in attendance every year.

MOST WINS SINCE 2009

- With 311 victories since the start of the 2009 season, Virginia owns the most wins of any team in the nation in that span.
- The Cavaliers have won 50 games or more four times in the last five seasons.
