2013 WOMEN'S COLLEGE CUP

THIS WEEK:

- Virginia makes its second NCAA Women's College Cup appearance
- The Cavaliers first trip to the Final Four came in 1991
- Both postseason tournaments Virginia has won (2004 ACC Tournament, 2012 ACC Tournament) have come at the WakeMed Soccer Park

NCAA TOURNAMENT HISTORY:

- UVa is an overall top-four seed for the fifth time (1990, 1991, 1992, 2004, 2013)
- Virginia is participating in its 20th consecutive NCAA Tournament and 26th NCAA Tournament overall
- Only North Carolina and Notre Dame have longer active consecutive NCAA streaks
- Virginia has a 31-23-4 all-time NCAA Tournament record
- Under Steve Swanson, UVa has a 28-12-3 NCAA Tournament record
- Virginia's only previous semifinal appearance was in 1991, a 5-1 loss at UNC

LOOK HOOS THE TOP SEED:

- Virginia is the overall No. 1 seed in this year's NCAA Tournament
- UVa is the ninth school to be the overall No. 1 seed (Brown, Connecticut, Massachusetts, North Carolina, Notre Dame, Penn State, Santa Clara, Stanford)
- UVa is the sixth consecutive overall No. 1 seed to make the College Cup, but only one of those teams won the championship (Stanford - 2011)

CAVALIERS IN CARY:

- Virginia is 7-6-3 all-time in Cary (all games in the ACC Tournament)
- The Cavaliers won the 2004 and 2012 ACC Championships in Cary
- UVa's only loss this season came in Cary, 4-2, to Virginia Tech in ACC semis



WELCOME BACK TO THE COLLEGE CUP:

- Virginia returns to the Women's College Cup for the first time in 22 years
- The Cavaliers were a semifinalist in 1991 when the tournament was 12 teams
- The 22-year gap between College Cups is the largest in women's soccer history (Duke, 19 years: 1992-2011)
- It is the second-longest gap between final four appearances in Division I women's sports (Illinois Volleyball, 23 years: 1988-2011)
- Mary Morgan, Kate Norbo and Morgan Stith are the only current Cavaliers who were born the last time Virginia made the College Cup

HOOS VS. A FORMER HOO:

- UCLA head coach Amanda Cromwell was the captain of Virginia's only previous College Cup squad
- She scored UVa's goal in their only previous College Cup match, a 5-1 loss at North Carolina in the 1991 semifinals
- Cromwell was a two-time All-American during her career at Virginia (88-91)
- She still ranks T-6th in career goals (35) and T-10th in career points (84) at UVa
- Friday's semifinal is the first time UVa has played a team with a head coach who is a former Cavalier player

A RECORD SETTING YEAR:

- Virginia has set numerous school records this year
- UVa records include 24 wins, 77 goals, 80 assists, 234 points, 21.0 shots/game and 16 shutouts
- Virginia also had a school-record 20-game win streak and set numerous attendance records

PERFECTION IN THE REGULAR SEASON:

- Virginia completed a perfect regular season with a 19-0 record (13-0 ACC)
- First team to have a perfect regular season since Stanford in 2009 (20-0)
- First ACC team to have a perfect regular season since UNC in 2003 (18-0)
- First team to go unbeaten/untied in ACC play since UNC in 2006 (10-0)
- Virginia won its first ACC regular season championship

GOALS, GOALS, GOALS!!!:

- Virginia leads the nation in scoring at 3.08 goals per game, scoring a national-best 77 goals
- UVa also leads the nation in assists and points per game
- Of the 77 goals scored, the Cavaliers have 14 different goal scorers

SCORING STREAK:

- Virginia is one of two schools nationally to have scored a goal in every game this season (Elon)
- Dating back to last year, UVa has scored in 33 consecutive games, the longest active streak in the nation (next longest, Elon 21)

WHILE YOU WERE DISTRACTED BY ALL THE GOALS:

- The Cavalier defense has posted shutouts in 11 of the last 15 games
- Virginia leads the ACC with 16 shutouts, setting a new school record
- UVa's 0.60 goals against average ranks 3rd in the ACC

DOMINATING PERFORMANCES:

- Virginia has more goals (77) this season than shots on goal allowed (59)
- That +18 ratio isn't just the highest in the nation, UVa is the only school in positive figures
- UVa had more goals than shots on goal allowed in 17 of 25 games this season
- Virginia leads the nation with a +62 goal differential this season

THE SCHOOL-RECORD 20-GAME WIN STREAK:

- UVa had its school-record 20-game win streak snapped in the ACC semis
- The previous school record was a 16-game win streak set in 1990
- It was 10th 20-game streak in ACC history, the first by a team other than UNC

BENCH PRODUCTION:

- Virginia has recorded 20 goals and 22 assists this season from substitutes
- 92 of 323 Division I teams scored fewer goals this season than the UVa bench
- The Cavaliers have gotten a goal or assist off the bench in 15 of 25 games

COMEBACK CAVALIERS:

- Virginia rallied from a deficit to win at BC, Pitt and Duke, the first time in school history with three consecutive come-from-behind wins
- UVa has five come-from-behind wins this season, the most in school history for an entire season, breaking the previous high of four (1997 and 1998)
- The win at Duke marked the sixth time in school history that UVa rallied to win when trailing by two goals (first time since at PSU in 2009 NCAA 2nd rd)

PACK THE HOUSE:

- Virginia had a record women's soccer crowd of 3,894 for the Florida State game on Oct. 27
- It broke the previous record of 2,838 set 17 days earlier during the win over Notre Dame
- This season has produced the five largest crowds in school history and six of the top 10
- Virginia ranked fourth nationally in attendance, averaging a school-record 1,923 fans per game
- The crowd of 1,988 for the NCAA 2nd round game vs. Georgetown was the largest women's soccer NCAA Tournament crowd in Klöckner history

SWANSON REACHES PAIR OF MILESTONES:

- Virginia head coach Steve Swanson earned his 300th career win on Sept. 19 with the 2-1 victory at Boston College
- Swanson became the 16th Division I coach to join the 300 win club, and the 11th to accululate 300 wins at the Division I level
- He became the 31st NCAA coach (all divisions) to reach the milestone
- On Oct. 6, he posted his 200th win at Virginia with the 3-0 win over Clemson

FOUR HOOS SCORE 20:

• Virginia leads the nation with four players with at least 20 points (Brian-46, Doniak-44, Ratcliffe-27, Colaprico-23)

TRIO OF DOUBLE DIGIT SCORERS:

- With Makenzy Doniak (19 goals), Morgan Brian (16) and Brittany Ratcliffe (12), UVa is the one of two teams nationally with three 10-goal scorers (Santa Clara)
- It is the first time in school history that UVa has had three 10-goal scorers
- UVa is the first ACC team with three double-digit goal scorers since UNC in 2006 (Yael Averbuch-16, Heather O'Reilly-12, Whitney Engen-12)

20-20-20 VISION WITH BRIAN, DOUGLAS & DONIAK:

- Virginia has three players with at least 20 career goals in Morgan Brian (31), Makenzy Doniak (29) and Gloria Douglas (22)
- It is the first time UVa has had three active 20-goal scorers since 1991

MO AND MAK LEAD THE ATTACK:

- \bullet Morgan Brian (16G-14A-46P) and Makenzy Doniak (19G-6A-44P) are the top two scorers in the ACC
- UVa is the first team to have two 40-point scorers since 2009 when three schools accomplished the feat: UCLA (Sydney Leroux & Lauren Chaney), Stanford (Christen Press & Kelley O'Hara) and Florida St. (Tiffany McCarty and Jessica Price)

ACC-OLADES:

- Virginia had six players named to All-ACC teams
- Morgan Brian, Makenzy Doniak and Emily Sonnett were on the first team
- Brian became UVa's seventh 3-time first-team All-ACC selection
- Danielle Colaprico (2nd team) and Molly Menchel (3rd team) were also honored
- Steve Swanson was named ACC Coach of the Year

BRIAN DOES DOUBLE DUTY WITH VIRGINIA & USWNT:

- Morgan Brian has earned three caps with the United States Women's National Team this year, as she has played for both UVa and the USWNT this fall
- She has made appearances against South Korea (June 15), Mexico (Sept. 3) and Australia (Oct. 20)
- She scored her first USWNT goal on Sept. 3 in the 7-0 victory over Mexico
- She became the first active collegian to score for the USWNT since Alex Morgan in 2010 (as a senior at Cal)
- At age 20, Brian is the youngest USWNT goal-scorer since Christine Nairn (at age 18) scored for the team in 2009
- She is one of three current collegians to have earned a cap with the USWNT (North Carolina's Crystal Dunn, Santa Clara's Julie Johnston)
- Brian will participate in the USWNT's camp in December in Carson, Calif. following the conclusion of the collegiate season

BRIAN AND DONIAK NAMED HERMANN SEMIFINALISTS:

- Morgan Brian and Makenzy Doniak were named among the 15 semifinalists for the MAC Hermann Trophy this week
- Virginia is the only school with two semifinalists this season

DONIAK WITH THE HAT TRICK:

- Makenzy Doniak scored her first career hat trick against Saint Francis in the first round of the NCAA Tournament
- It was the first hat trick by a Cavalier this season and the 14th in UVa history
- It was the fourth NCAA Tournament hat trick in Virginia history (Angela Hucles vs. JMU-1997; Lindsay Gusick vs. Cincinnati-2001; Kelly Hammond vs. JMU-2004)



BRIAN PASSING WITH FLYING COLORS:

- Morgan Brian has tied the school record for assists in a season with 14
- She leads the ACC in assists and is ninth nationally in assists/game (0.58)
- Brian's 29 career assists already rank fourth in school history

BRIAN SCORING & SETTING UP GOALS:

- Morgan Brian has double-figure goals (16) and assists (14) this season
- She is just the second Cavalier to reach double figures in both categories in the same season, joining Andrea Rubio (13 goals, 10 assists) in 1990

RATCLIFFE, THE SUPER SUB:

- Brittany Ratcliffe has 12 goals this season, 11 of which have come off the bench
- Her 11 goals off the bench is a school record for goals as a substitute for a season, breaking the previous record of six

STEARNS SHINES IN GOAL:

- Morgan Stearns is the first true-freshman goalkeeper to start multiple games in a season for Virginia since Jodi Clugston made 11 starts in 2000
- She ranks fourth in the ACC with a 0.64 goals against average

MENCHEL STEPS UP WHEN IT COUNTS:

- Defender Molly Menchel has scored 13 career goals, the most career goals by a Cavalier defender
- Eight of her 13 career goals have been game-winning goals, including four this season (VCU, Richmond, Boston College, Michigan)

COLAPRICO ASSISTS:

- Danielle Colaprico is second in the ACC in assists with 13, trailing only teammate Morgan Brian's 14 assists
- Colaprico's 13 assists rank fourth for a season in UVa history
- She has three multi-assist games this season and four for her career (including two in the NCAA Tournament)

TRIO SET APPREANCE RECORD:

- Gloria Douglas, Molly Menchel and Kate Norbo have all set the UVa record for career appearances with their 95 games
- The record was held by Sarah Senty, who made 93 appearances from 2005-08

AGAINST UCLA:

- UVa is 1-4-1 all-time vs. UCLA (0-4 in LA, 1-0 in Charlottesville, 0-0-1 neutral)
- Virginia is 0-3 vs. UCLA in the NCAA Tournament (all three games in LA)

IF VIRGINIA ADVANCES:

- If UVa advances to the final, it would play an ACC rival on Sunday
- Virginia is 3-8-0 vs. ACC foes in the NCAA Tournament (2-0 vs. Wake, 1-0 vs. Virginia Tech, 0-1 vs. Florida State, 0-2 vs. North Carolina, 0-5 vs. Duke)
- UVa is 18-3-4 vs. Florida St. (UVa leads 2-1-0 in Cary; FSU leads 1-0-0 in NCAA)
- UVa is 17-3-1 vs. Virginia Tech (Tied 1-1-1 in Cary; UVa leads 1-0-0 in NCAA)
- Virginia won the regular season meeting 1-0 in overtime vs. FSU on Oct. 27 in Charlottesville
- UVa and VT split two meetings this year, with the Cavaliers winning 2-0 on Oct. 31 in Charlottesville and the Hokies winning 4-2 on Nov. 8 in Cary

HEAD COACH STEVE SWANSON

It is no coincidence that success has followed University of Virginia head coach Steve Swanson throughout his career. In his 24th season as a head coach, his 14th at Virginia, he has established himself as one of the elite coaches in collegiate soccer, and certainly one of the most respected. Swanson has led his teams to six conference championships, 19 NCAA Tournament appearances and 23 consecutive winning seasons during his 24-year career.

This season Swanson has led the Cavaliers to the best season in school history. As Virginia makes its second NCAA College Cup appearance, the team has set school records with 24 wins and 77 goals scored. The Cavaliers went undefeated through the regular season (19-0 overall, 13-0 ACC) as Swanson earned ACC Coach of the Year honors for the first time in his career. On Sept. 19, Swanson became the 16th Division I coach to join the 300-win club, and the 11th to accululate 300 wins at the Division I level

During his tenure as head coach of the Virginia women's soccer team, Swanson has had a dramatic impact on the program since he replaced former United States National Team Head Coach April Heinrichs in the spring of 2000. Over the past 14 years, the Cavaliers are 212-72-34 (.720) under his direction, as Swanson has the highest winning percentage in the history of the program.

Swanson's track record of success, not only on the collegiate level but also at the international level, was evident in 2012. That year he won a pair of championships, leading Virginia to its second ACC title and guiding the United States to the FIFA U-20 Women's World Cup Championship in Japan. For those feats, he was one of ten coaches named to the shortlist for FIFA Women's World Coach of the Year.

Swanson came to Virginia after two highly successful stops at Stanford and Dartmouth. At Dartmouth, Swanson guided the Big Green to national prominence. He did an equally impressive job at Stanford, helping maintain the program's standing as one of the premier teams in the country while leading the Cardinal to two Pac-10 titles in four seasons. In 2004, he led Virginia to the first ACC Championship in school history, making him the only coach in Division I history to win titles in three different conferences. He has since become the only coach in history to win multiple conference championships in three difference conferences. Swanson also enjoyed success as a player in college and as a professional.

In addition to his collegiate coaching experience, Swanson has been associated with the United States youth national teams for over a decade. Most recently he was the head coach of the U-20 Women's National Team from 2011-12, leading the team to a World Cup championship. It is the third different age group he has led for the US Soccer Federation.

Last year the Cavaliers won their second ACC Championship, defeating three top-10 opponents to capture the title. Virginia finished the year with an 18-5-1 record and reached the round of 16 of the NCAA Tournament for the eighth consecutive year.

During his four seasons at Stanford, Swanson guided the Cardinal to an overall record of 48-27-4, two Pac-10 championships and three NCAA Tournament appearances. His 1999 squad finished with an impressive 14-4-1 record, captured a Pac-10 title and advanced to the third round of the NCAA Tournament. Three of Swanson's players were named to the 1998 All-Pac-10 team and four earned Pac-10 All-Academic recognition. Swanson also coached the 1998 Pac-10 Co-Player of the Year. In 1999, he was honored as the Pac-10 Coach of the Year.

Prior to serving as Stanford's head coach, Swanson served as both the head women's soccer coach and assistant director of athletics at Dartmouth College from 1990-1995. During his years at Dartmouth, he transformed the Big Green into a national powerhouse with an overall record of 55-35-7 (.603). Under his guidance, Dartmouth made its first two NCAA Tournament appearances in school history (1993 and 1994) and won its first two lvy League Championships in school history (1991 and 1993). During his last three years at the helm, the Big Green was ranked in the year-end top 20. Named New England Coach of the Year in 1992, Swanson led his team to an undefeated conference

season the following year en route to winning the Ivy League title for the second time in three years. His 1993 Dartmouth squad not only went through league play undefeated, but also was unscored upon in the conference.

Swanson has coached 21 All-Americans, nine conference players of the year, and 79 all-conference selections. Of his former players at Dartmouth, Stanford and Virginia, 28 have played professionally in the WUSA, WPS or NWSL. In 2002, Swanson became the third coach to win at least 40 games with three different NCAA Division I women's soccer programs.

Swanson has been heavily involved with the United States youth National Teams. In addition to his recent stint as head coach of the U-20 National Team, he was the head coach of the U-16 National Team and head coach of the U-18 National Team from 2000-02. In addition, Swanson has been an assistant coach with the U-17, U-18, U-19 and U-20 National Teams in recent years.

A graduate of Michigan State in 1984, Swanson played professionally in the United States and Canada for four years before returning to school to obtain his master's degree at Iowa. He played more than 150 consecutive games in tours of duty with the Milwaukee Wave and the Chicago Shoccers of the American Indoor Soccer Association, and with AC Roma and the Windsor Wheels in the National Soccer League of Canada (NSLC). While at Michigan State, Swanson was a four-year letterwinner in soccer. He was the team's leading scorer, captain and a regional All-American his senior year.

Swanson and his wife Julie have three children, daughters Alexis and Kelsey, and son Sam.
