FIVE THINGS YOU NEED TO KNOW

- Kris Burd (752) and Dontrelle Inman (750) are the first UVa duo to each reach 700 yards receiving in a season.
- Dontrelle Inman has 395 receiving yards the last three weeks – more than his first three years combined.
- Marc Verica needs 176 yards passing to become the sixth UVa QB to reach 5,000 career passing yards.
- Keith Payne ranks first in the ACC in scoring (9.0 points/game) and rushing TDs (14).
- UVa has allowed two sacks in the last 22 quarters after surrendering 17 in its first 22 quarters of 2010.

VIRGINIA-VIRGINIA TECH RIVALRY

- Virginia Tech leads the all-time series 49-37-5 and has won 10 of the last 11 meetings, including six straight. Tech also has taken 13 of the teams' last 17 games.
- Tech is 19-9-1 at home against Virginia, including a 13-6-1 mark inside Lane Stadium.
- The series began in 1895 with UVa gaining a 38-0 win in Charlottesville.
- UVa's last win in Blacksburg came in 1998 (36-32); the Cavaliers have lost five straight at Lane Stadium. UVa dropped a 17-14 decision in its most recent visit to Tech in 2008.
- Virginia's most recent victory in the series was a 35-21 win at home in 2003.
- The Hokies (91 games) are UVa's second most-frequent opponent – UVa has played North Carolina 115 times.

COMMONWEALTH CUP UP FOR GRABS

- The winner of this game claims the Commonwealth Cup for the next year.
- After holding the trophy following wins in 1997 and 1998, the Cavaliers have taken it just once since then (2003) with the Hokies winning 10 of the last 11 meetings.
- The award was started for the 1996 game between the two state foes, with the Hokies receiving the trophy for the first time with a 26-9 win.
- The cup is made of marble and cherry wood, stands four feet high and weighs more than 100 pounds.
- The scores of all 91 games in the rivalry are engraved on the sides of the trophy.

COACHES FAMILIAR WITH RIVALRY

- Four UVa coaches are veterans of the Virginia-Virginia Tech rivalry.
- Shawn Moore, Anthony Poindexter and Ron Mattes all are Virginia alums.
- Moore quarterbacked the Cavaliers in wins over the Hokies in 1988 and 1989 and a loss in 1990.
- Poindexter was 2-2 during his tenure at defensive back from 1995-98, with wins over Tech in 1997 and 1998, although he was injured for the 36-32 victory in 1998 in Blacksburg.
- A letterwinner from 1981-84, Mattes was 1-3 against the Hokies, with a 26-23 win in his senior year.
- Head coach Mike London was a UVa assistant coach during the 2001-04 and 2006-07 seasons, with the Cavaliers going 1-5 during that span, including a victory in 2003.
- In addition, UVa graduate assistants Gordie Sammis, Brennan Schmidt and Josh Zidenberg all played for the Commonwealth Cup as Cavalier players.
- Virginia Tech head coach Frank Beamer was varsity defensive back for the Hokies from 1966-68. He made his first start in Tech's 1966 game against Virginia, a 24-7 Hokies' victory.

32 IS VIRGINIA'S MAGIC NUMBER

- Scoring plenty of points against the Hokies means good things for the Cavaliers.
- Virginia has scored at least 32 points in each of its last seven series wins dating back to 1989.

No player or coach interviews will be arranged after Wednesday during game week.

Virginia's locker room is closed to media following games, both at home and on the road.

Coach London will hold his postgame press conference in the media room, while requested players and assistant coaches will be brought to the media room to meet with media representatives after London. UVa athletics media relations personnel will take player requests during the fourth quarter of each game.

VIRGINIA IN SEASON ENDERS

- This game is the Cavaliers' final contest of the 2010 season.
- UVa is 44-72-4 all-time in regular-season finales and has lost its last six.
- This is the fifth straight year and the 16th time in the last 20 seasons Virginia has closed the regular season against the Hokies.

OFFENSES ON DISPLAY

- Two of the ACC's top offenses will square off Saturday.
- Virginia ranks second in the ACC in total offense (415.2/game), while Virginia Tech is just behind in third (410.8/game).
- UVa ranks third in the conference in passing (269.5/game), while Tech stands second in rushing (212.4/game).

CAVALIERS LOOK TO END NOVEMBER DOLDRUMS

- November has not been kind to Virginia of late.
- Virginia has lost 12 straight games in the month, dating to a 48-0 win at Miami on Nov. 10, 2007.
- UVa lost all four of its November games in 2008 and 2009 as well as the final November game in 2007.

MOSES A RARE FRESHMAN TO ENTER STARTING LINEUP

- Starting at right tackle against North Carolina, Morgan Moses became just the third true freshman in UVa history to start at an offensive tackle position.
- Moses made his first start at right guard at Duke but later shifted back to right tackle.
- He follows D'Brickashaw Ferguson (2002- LT), who is Virginia's only true freshman to start the season opener on the offensive line, and Brad Butler (2002- RT), who only started the bowl game, as the only true freshmen to start at either of the tackle positions.
- Moses is the seventh true freshman to start at offensive tackle in Division I this season. Others include: Seantrel Henderson (Miami - RT) - James Hurst (North Carolina - LT) - Rob Crisp (NC State - LT) - Luke Joeckel (Texas A&M - LT) - Davonte Wallace (New Mexico State - LT) - Ja'Wyan James (Tennessee - RT).
- In addition to Moses, John Fullington of Washington State (RT) joined that list Oct. 16 when the Cougars kicked off against Arizona.

SIX CAVALIERS NAMED TO PHIL STEELE'S MIDSEASON ALL-ACC TEAM

- Phil Steele has released his Midseason All-ACC team and six Cavaliers were mentioned on his list.
- Raynard Horne headlines the honorees as a first team member at kick return.
- Listed on the second team are Austin Pasztor (OG) and Chase Minnifield (CB).
- Keith Payne (RB), Kris Burd (WR) and Cam Johnson (DE) all were named to the third team.

NOTING THE BURD/INMAN DUO

- Virginia's receiving duo of Kris Burd and Dontrelle Inman has combined to produce the best season for a UVa receiving tandem in school history.
- The two each have racked up 700 yards receiving – a first in Virginia history.
- They are one of 11 duos in FBS football this year with 700 yards receiving each.
- They are just the eighth ACC receiving duo in the last 10 years to post 700 receiving yards each in one year.

MORE ON BURD/INMAN

- Burd leads the team with 55 receptions for 752 yards and five touchdowns – he is sixth in the ACC with 68.4 receiving yards per game and fourth with 5.0 receptions per game.
- Inman ranks second on the team with 49 catches for 750 yards and three TDs – he is seventh in the ACC in receiving yards per game (68.2) and eighth in receptions per game (4.3).
- The duo is the first UVa tandem to post at least 600 receiving yards each in a season since Herman Moore (848) and Bruce McGonnigal (634) in 1989 and just the third ever at UVa, joining Dave Sullivan (662) and Chuck Belic (613) in 1972.

BURD-INMAN FIRST UVA WR DUO TO 40 CATCHES

- Burd and Inman also have become the first Virginia wide receiver duo to reach 40 receptions apiece in the same season.
- On four other occasions, at least two Virginia players reached 40 receptions in the same season, but this is the first time that both are wide receivers.

VIRGINIA FOOTBALL HONORS DUDLEY

- The Virginia football team will honor former Cavalier great "Bullet" Bill Dudley this season by wearing helmet stickers with his number 35.
- Dudley, who played at UVa from 1939 to 1941, passed away in February.
- In 1941 Dudley was named an All-American and winner of the Maxwell Award as the nation's top player. He was fifth in the Heisman Trophy balloting.
- Dudley was inducted into the College Football Hall of Fame in 1956 and the Pro Football Hall of Fame in 1966.

NOTE THE MATHIS NUMBER CHANGE

- Please note that Jeremiah Mathis has changed numbers from No. 58 to No. 84.
- Mathis is now a backup tight end.
- He had his first career reception in the fourth quarter Oct. 16 against North Carolina.

NOTING THE BOSTON COLLEGE GAME

- Virginia has now lost 12-straight games in the month of November dating back to the last game in the history of the Orange Bowl, a 48-0 UVa triumph over Miami, on Nov. 10, 2007.
- Perry Jones 1-yard TD run in the second quarter was his first career rushing touchdown
- La'Roy Reynolds' sack in the second quarter was the first of his career.
- Will Hill recorded his first career sack in the third quarter.
- Rodney McLeod recorded his second INT of the season and of his career in the fourth quarter.
- Kris Burd (752) and Dontrelle Inman (750) became the first duo of receivers to have over 700 receiving yards in UVa history.
- With 284 yards passing, Marc Verica has surpassed 200 yards passing in a game for the 14th time in his career. He currently holds down the No. 3 spot all-time at UVa with career 200-yard games, one off second place - Shawn Moore (15).
- Verica now has 4,824 career passing yards which keeps him in seventh all-time in the UVa annals, chasing No. 6 Marques Hagans (4,877).

FIFTEEN MAKE FIRST STARTS IN 2010

- Fifteen Cavaliers have broken into the starting lineup for the first time this season, including senior tailback Keith Payne two weeks ago against Miami.
- Darnell Carter (LB), Terence Fells-Danzer (FB), Dom Joseph (FS), Mike Price (C), Jake Snyder (DE) each made their first career starts the week prior vs. EMU.
- Morgan Moses (RT) cracked the starting lineup for the first time vs. North Carolina.
- Oday Aboushi (RT), Perry Jones (TB), Max Milien (FB), Devin Wallace (CB), Trey Womack (SS), LaRoy Reynolds (SLB), Aaron Taliaferro (MLB) and Ausar Walcott (WLB) each made their first career starts in the season opener against Richmond.

FIVE CAPTAINS NAMED FOR 2010 TEAM

- Virginia will have five team captains this season.
- The captains: senior DT John-Kevin Dolce, senior CB Ras-I Dowling, junior DT Nick Jenkins, senior TE Joe Torchia and senior QB Marc Verica.

TWENTY-ONE WAHOOS EARN FIRST PLAYING TIME

- Twenty-one Cavaliers have made their college debuts in 2010 after WR Bobby Smith earned his first appearance against Maryland.
- Among the 21 are true freshmen Morgan Moses, Michael Rocco and Rijo Walker. (Virginia played 14 true freshmen last season).
- Chris Broadnax, Jacob Hodges, Jeremiah Mathis, Brian Oden, Justin Renfrow and Jake Snyder saw their first playing time as Cavaliers against Richmond.
- Luke Bowanko, Ross Metheny, Sean Cascarano, Trevor Grywatch, Brendan Lane, Christian Waddy, Kevin Harrington, Mike Price, Connor Miles, Michael Rocco, Billy Skrobacz and Jeremy Martin also have earned their first game action this year.

OH CANADA!

- Virginia boasts four Canadians on the roster this season: TB Brendan Morgan, G Austin Pasztor, OL Hunter Steward, DE Brent Urban.
- That marks four of the six Canadians in the ACC.
- The quartet joins Duke's Chris Rwabukamba and Maryland's Michael Carter as residents from north of the border.

COACHES' POLL

- Mike London is a voter on the 2010 USA Today Coaches' Poll.
- Fifty-nine coaches from Division I-A institutions across the nation participate on the poll.

EIGHT COMPETING AS GRADUATE STUDENTS

- Eight Cavaliers have received their undergraduate degrees and are participating as graduate students this season.
- UVa is tied for fourth nationally in the most graduates on its 2010 roster - only Boston College (14), Auburn (11) and Tennessee (9) have more; UVa is tied with Kansas State, Virginia Tech and UCF.
- The list of grad students and their undergraduate degrees include:

FELLS-DANZER, TALIAFERRO NAMED SPRING'S MOST IMPROVED

- Prior to the team's annual spring game, head coach Mike London announced the recipients of the Rock Weir Awards representing the most improved players during spring drills.
- Junior middle linebacker Aaron Taliaferro was the most improved player on defense, while junior fullback Terence Fells-Danzer was tabbed the offense's most improved player.
- Taliaferro appeared in two games last season. Fells-Danzer moved to fullback in the spring and played all 12 games on special teams last year. He blocked a punt at Miami.

VERICA PUTS UP BIG NUMBERS AS HE CONCLUDES CAREER

- Marc Verica is finishing his career with a bang.
- Over the last three games, Verica has tossed for 967 yards (322.3/game) and five touchdowns.
- Verica is 80-for-138 during that span.
- He has now thrown for 2,631 yards this year, which is third in a single season at UVa. He needs 345 yards to match the single-season school record.
- Only Matt Schaub threw for more yards in a year – 2,976 in 2002 and 2,952 in 2003.

OFFENSE MAKES BIG STRIDES FROM 2010

- Through 11 games, Virginia has scored 36 offensive touchdowns and topped the TD total of all of 2009 (23).
- UVa is second in the ACC in total offense with 415.2 yards per game after ranking last in the ACC in 2009 with 269.6 yards per game.
- UVa has over 1,300 yards more total offense through 11 games than it did in all of 2009.
- The Cavaliers rank third in the conference with 269.5 passing yards per game; UVa was 11th in the league in 2009 with 170.5 passing yards per game.

INMAN HAS HOT HANDS OVER LAST THREE WEEKS

- Dontrelle Inman has racked up 395 yards receiving over the last three games – most of any ACC player during that span.
- That is more than his entire first three years at UVa, when he racked up 283 yards on 27 catches.
- Inman has 23 receptions in the last three games.
- He tallied 239 yards receiving against Duke (second all-time at UVa), then followed it up with a 60-yard outing vs. Maryland and 96 yards at Boston College.
- Inman currently ranks No. 31 all-time in receiving yards at UVa with 1,033.

BURD REACHES TOP 20 IN CAREER RECEIVING

- Kris Burd now ranks No. 18 all-time in the UVa annals in career receiving yards with 1,230.
- With his 104-yard game vs. Miami, Burd became the 30th player in UVa history to reach 1,000 career receiving yards.
- Burd has made at least once catch in 22 of the last 23 games for the Cavaliers. The only game in the streak where Burd didn't make a reception was the 2009 contest at Miami where UVa had only 75 passing yards.

VERICA MOVES UP UVA CAREER PASSING LEDGER

- With 2,631 yards passing this season, Marc Verica has moved into seventh place in career passing yards at Virginia with 4,824.
- Verica stands 53 yards behind sixth-place Marques Hagans (2002-05; 4,877) and needs 176 yards to become the sixth quarterback in Virginia history to reach 5,000 yards passing.

VIRGINIA AIMS FOR MOST PASSING YARDS IN SCHOOL HISTORY

- UVa has passed for 2,965 yards this year – third most in school history. UVa had 3,324 yards in 2003 (13 games) and 3,222 in 2002 (14 games).
- Virginia ranks third in the ACC in passing, with 269.5 yards per game.
- If that total holds it will mark Virginia's most passing yards per game in school history.
- The current record is 255.7, set by the Matt Schaub-led Cavaliers in 2003.
- Virginia has passed for 19 touchdowns this year, more than doubling the 2009 total of eight.
- UVa passed for a school-record 417 yards at Duke.
- UVa threw for five TDs vs. VMI (9/25), marking the most in a game since UVa also threw five against Akron in 2002.

MORE ON VERICA IN THE CAREER RECORD BOOK

- Marc Verica (475) ranks third in career completions at Virginia.
- Against Maryland Verica passed Shawn Moore (421) for No. 3 on UVa's career completions list; Moore currently is UVa's wide receivers coach.
- Jameel Sewell is No. 2 on the list with 514 completions.
- Verica has recorded 221 completions this year –most ever by a UVa senior.
- Verica has thrown 22 career touchdown passes, which is tied for 11th in UVa history with Don Majkowski, Symmion Willis and Rufus Barkley.
- Verica also is edging closer to the following players:

NOTING MARC VERICA'S CAREER STARTS

- Marc Verica has passed for at least 200 yards in 14 of his 21 career starts.
- Verica has attempted at least 30 passes in 16 of his 20 starts.
- He has thrown for 4,824 yards and 22 touchdowns in his career – 2,631 yards and 14 TDs this year.
- In 2008, he threw for 2,017 yards while playing in 11 games (nine starts).
- At one point in 2008, he threw for 200 yards or more in six straight games, tying a Virginia school record (Matt Schaub, 2003).

- Marc Verica has passed for a career-high 14 TDs this year.
- That total currently ranks as the third-most TDs in a season for a UVa QB since 2000.
- He needs three touchdowns to crack the top 10 in single-season passing TDs at Virginia.

- Marc Verica has thrown for 200 or more yards in 14 of his 21 career starts.
- With his 14th career 200-yard passing game against Boston College, Verica has the third-most 200-yard passing games in Virginia history.
- Shawn Moore (1988-90) ranks second with 15 career 200-yard passing games.
- Matt Schaub holds the UVA record with 20 200-yard games.

BALANCE ON OFFENSE

- Through 11 games Virginia has run 802 total plays – 385 rushes and 417 passes.
- Last week UVA rushed 31 times and passed 53 times.
- Twice this season the Cavaliers have had perfect balance on offense – against Richmond (35 each) and at USC (36 each).

JONES, PAYNE FORM 1-2 PUNCH IN BACKFIELD

- Keith Payne and Perry Jones each have rushed for more than 600 yards this season. Payne has 741 yards, while Jones has rushed for 635.
- UVA has not had a pair of rushers with 600 rushing yards each since 2004 – Alvin Pearman (1,037) and Wali Lundy (864).
- Payne and Jones each have rushed for at least 50 yards in the same game seven times this season, including five of the last seven weeks (Payne did not play last week).
- A pair of UVA backs rushed for 50-plus yards each just once last season – Mikell Simpson (83 yards) and Rashawn Jackson (73) against Indiana.

PAYNE IN THE BACKFIELD

- After a year away from the team, senior TB Keith Payne has returned with a vengeance.
- He has a team-high 741 rushing yards this season, an average of 4.8 yards per carry.
- Payne is first in the ACC in scoring, with 9.0 points per game, and ranks 15th nationally in scoring.
- He ranks seventh in the conference in rushing with 74.1 yards per game.

PAYNE TRUDGES UP RECORD BOOKS

- Keith Payne needs four yards rushing to become the 38th player all-time at UVA to reach 1,000 career rushing yards. He has 996 career rushing yards.
- Payne has 16 career rushing touchdowns – No. 16 all-time in the UVA annals.

PAYNE LEADS ACC IN RUSHING TOUCHDOWNS

- Keith Payne has rushed for 14 touchdowns, doubling Jameel Sewell's team high of seven TDs last season.
- He leads the ACC in rushing touchdowns this year and owns all but three of UVA's rushing TDs in 2010.
- It also is the third most rushing touchdowns by a UVA player in a single season in school history.
- Payne had his third straight two-touchdown day against Duke; he is the first UVA player to record three straight two-TD rushing games since Wali Lundy did so

against Temple (4), Georgia Tech (2) and Virginia Tech (2) in 2005.

- He tied the modern UVA record for TDs in a game against Richmond, becoming the ninth player to score four in a game (post-World War II).

PAYNE AMONG NATIONAL LEADERS IN TOUCHDOWNS

- Keith Payne has scored 15 touchdowns this season (14 rushing, one receiving).
- He leads the ACC and is tied for 16th nationally in touchdowns.

JONES PROVIDES JOLT TO OFFENSE

- Perry Jones is averaging a team-best 5.0 yards per carry this season.
- He has rushed for at least 50 yards in nine of his 11 games this year.
- Jones also is a pass-catching threat out of the backfield, with 28 receptions for 209 yards – he is tied with Matt Snyder for third on the team in receptions.
- Jones recorded his first career rushing touchdown last week at Boston College.

CAVALIERS SPREAD THE WEALTH

- Virginia has used many options this year, as 14 different Cavaliers have scored a touchdown.
- TE Jeremiah Mathis became the 14th UVA player to record a TD with his 1-yard catch from Marc Verica against Maryland.
- That is tied for the third-most players to score a TD in a season at UVA since 2000 (17 in 2002, 15 in 2007, 14 in 2003).

CAVALIERS BUCKLE DOWN AGAINST SACKS

- After allowing 17 sacks in the first 22 quarters this year, Virginia has allowed just two sacks in the last 22 quarters.
- Virginia had a streak of 13 sackless quarters broken in the fourth quarter vs. Duke.
- UVA had not given up a sack since the last play of the second quarter in the UNC game (39 drives total).
- This coincides with Morgan Moses joining the starting unit.

PLENTY OF RECEIVING OPTIONS

- Virginia has had 18 different receivers catch passes in 2010.
- That is the most at UVA since 19 different Cavaliers caught at least one pass in 1959.
- That season, four players caught only one pass compared to three this year.
- UVA had an opportunity to push its receiver total to 19 against Maryland, but a Marc Verica pass intended for Bobby Smith fell incomplete.

TIGHT ENDS CONTINUE TO PRODUCE

- Virginia has been strong at tight end over the last decade, and that has continued with Joe Torchia, Colter Phillips and Paul Freedman back for 2010.
- Jeremiah Mathis has joined the mix this year; he caught his first career TD pass against Maryland.
- The quartet has combined for 37 receptions for 376 yards and five TDs this season (10.2 yards/reception).
- The five TDs are the most in a season by UVa tight ends since the 2007 crew of tight ends recorded seven TDs.
- Phillips' three receiving TDs marks the most by a UVa tight end since Tom Santi posted three in 2007.
- Phillips had career highs in receptions (4) and yards (31) last week at Boston College.
- UVa TEs have caught 519 passes for 5,631 yards and 46 TDs since 2001, by far the best figures in the ACC in that span.

CAVALIERS SHOW BIG-PLAY ABILITY

- Virginia has made some big plays this season. Already, the Cavaliers have eight plays of 50 or more yards – UVa had three such plays in the 2009 season.
- Marc Verica and Kris Burd have combined for a pair of receptions of 50-plus yards.
- Burd is the first UVa receiver since Billy McMullen in 2000 to have a pair of 50-yard receptions in the same year.
- Raynard Horne has recorded a pair of 50-plus-yard plays – an 87-yard kickoff return for a touchdown and a 53-yard kickoff return.

NOTING VERICA'S RECORD PERFORMANCE

- Marc Verica threw for a school-record 417 yards against Duke.
- The previous high was 393, set by Matt Schaub in 2003 against NC State.
- Verica fired for 165 yards in the fourth quarter alone, nearly matching his performance in the entire game vs. Miami the previous week (176 yards).
- Verica's 413 yards of total offense set a school record, breaking Bryson Spinner's mark of 399 in 2001 against Georgia Tech.
- Verica set his previous career high in the season opener vs. Richmond with 283 yards passing.

TOTAL OFFENSE AMONG PROGRAM'S BEST

- Virginia racked up the fourth-most total offense in school history against Duke.
- It also marked the most total offense Virginia has ever accrued in an ACC game and in a road contest.

INMAN HAS A BIG DAY

- Dontrelle Inman's career-high 239 receiving yards against Duke is the second-most by a receiver in the country this season – second only to Michigan's Roy Roundtree's 246 receiving yards in the Wolverines' triple-overtime win over Illinois.
- Inman's day against Duke ranks No. 13 all-time in ACC history for single-game receiving yards.
- Inman's 239 receiving yards is the second-most all-time at UVa, trailing only Ken Shelton's 241 yard day against William & Mary in 1974.
- Inman's 10 receptions also marked a career high and the most by a UVa receiver since Mikell Simpson caught 13 passes against Maryland in 2007.
- His reception total matches the most by an ACC player this season and his yardage total is an ACC single-game high this season. Inman had more receiving yards by himself than seven ACC teams totaled that week in their games.
- During the fourth quarter of the game he had four catches for 107 yards, including a 10-yard scoring catch. Six of his 10 catches were for 24-or-more yards.

BURD RECORDS ANOTHER 100-YARD DAY

- Kris Burd racked up 104 yards receiving on seven catches against Miami – his fourth 100-yard receiving game of the season and in his career.
- He is the first Cavalier to put up four 100-yard receiving games in a year since Billy McMullen in 2001.
- Germane Crowell, with six in 1997, is the only Cavalier to record more 100-yard receiving games in a season.
- John Ford (1987), Herman Moore (1990) and Terrence Wilkins (1998) also have recorded four 100-yard receiving games in a season.
- With four career 100-yard receiving games, Burd is tied for seventh on the all-time UVa list.
- Burd had back-to-back 100-yard receiving days against VMI (119) and Florida State (118) earlier this year, becoming the first Cavalier to record consecutive 100-yard receiving games since Heath Miller did so in 2003 (110 vs. Georgia Tech, 145 vs. Virginia Tech).

NOTING VIRGINIA ATHLETICS

- Virginia finished third in the final 2009-10 Learfield Sports Academy Directors' Cup competition for Division I schools – the program's best finish ever.
- It was the 17th-consecutive year (since program's inception) that UVa has recorded a top-30 finish.
- UVa is one of 15 schools to rank in the top 30 of the final Directors' Cup standings in all 17 years of the program's existence.
- Teams or individuals in 21 of Virginia's 25 intercollegiate athletics programs advanced to postseason competition in 2009-10; 15 teams finished in the top 16 of NCAA championships.
- UVa won three team national championships and three individual national titles. Virginia won NCAA titles in women's rowing and men's soccer along with a third consecutive ITA National Team Indoor Championship in men's tennis.
- UVa's men's tennis doubles team of Drew Courtney and Michael Shabaz won the NCAA title in that event as did Robby Andrews in the 800 meters at the NCAA Indoor Track and Field Championships and the women's rowing team's Varsity Four crew (coxswain Sarah Pichardo, Ruth Retzinger, Hunter Terry, Chelsea Simpson and Inge Janssen).
- The Cavaliers won a school-record seven Atlantic Coast Conference championships in 2009-10, the most of any league member (men's lacrosse, women's rowing, men's soccer, men's and women's swimming and diving, men's tennis and wrestling).
- Virginia has won 42 ACC championships in the last eight years, the most of any school in the conference during that period. The women's rowing title was UVa's 100th ACC championship.
- Five different Virginia teams (baseball, men's lacrosse, women's rowing, men's soccer and men's tennis) were ranked No. 1 during the 2009-10 athletics year.

SNYDER ADDS ANOTHER THREAT TO RECEIVING GAME

- Matt Snyder has had 25 catches in the last seven games and 28 this season.
- He did not record a catch in the first two games this season, but has been a big threat ever since.
- Snyder racked up a career-high six receptions against Eastern Michigan (68 yards).
- He had four receptions and a career-high 96 receiving yards against Georgia Tech.
- Snyder had just one reception in the first game of the 2009 season coming into this year.

BURD A FREQUENT VISITOR TO END ZONE

- With five receiving TDs in 2010, Kris Burd is tied for the fifth-most receiving TD in a season at UVa since 2000.
- Burd tallied a receiving touchdown in four straight games to start the year.
- That is a first for UVa since Heath Miller scored receiving touchdowns in the first five games of the 2002 season – all thrown to him by Matt Schaub.

MINNIFIELD SECOND IN ACC, FIFTH IN FBS IN INT

- With six interceptions this season, Chase Minnifield ranks second in the ACC and fifth nationally in interceptions.
- He is tied for fifth with Buffalo's Domonic Cook and Tulsa's Marco Nelson.
- Minnifield's six INTs are most by a Cavalier since Marcus Hamilton led the ACC with six in 2005.
- No one at UVa has had more than six INTs in a season since Ronde Barber led the ACC with eight in 1994.
- He owns six of UVa's 10 picks this season – all of his INTs have come in Virginia wins.
- Minnifield had his second two-interception game of the season against Miami; he also had two INTs vs. VMI.
- Minnifield had a 65-yard interception return against Richmond (seventh-longest INT return in UVa history).

MINNIFIELD MOVES UP CAREER LIST AS WELL

- With his two interceptions against Miami, Chase Minnifield has moved into a 14th-place tie on UVa's all-time interceptions ledger with 10 career picks.
- Minnifield is tied with six others: Bill Dudley (1939-41), Bill King (1950-52), George Stetter (1964-66), Steve Sroba (1971-73), Percy Ellsworth (1992-95) and Paul

London (1992-95).

- Among active players in the FBS, Minnifield is tied for 16th in career interceptions.
- With his next interception Minnifield will move into a ninth-place tie on the UVa list.
- Keith McMeans (1987-90) holds the UVa interceptions record with 17.

JOHNSON A MENACE ON D-LINE

- DE Cam Johnson leads the team with 13.5 TFL and 6.5 sacks. He also has a career-high 49 tackles in 2010.
- He is tied for seventh in the ACC in sacks and 10th in TFL.
- Johnson needs 0.5 more tackles for loss and 1.5 more sacks to reach the top 15 in a single season in UVa history.
- He already has more than doubled his 2009 totals for tackles for loss (5.0) and sacks (2.0).
- Johnson had a career-high 3.5 TFL and 2.5 sacks vs. VMI.

REYNOLDS LEADS TEAM IN TACKLES

- First-year starter LaRoy Reynolds (SLB) leads the Cavaliers in tackles this year with 65 tackles.
- He is tied for 25th in the ACC in tackles (6.1/game).
- If this holds up, it will mark the second straight year that a first-year starter will lead the Cavaliers in tackles.
- Steve Greer led UVa with 92 tackles last year as a freshman.
- Reynolds had his first career sack last week vs. BC.

PICK-FIVE FOR CAVALIERS' DEFENSE

- Virginia intercepted Miami quarterbacks five times, tying a school record and marking the most by the Cavaliers since 1994 vs. Virginia Tech.
- It tied the most INTs by an ACC school this season.
- Chase Minnifield and Corey Mosley each had two interceptions in the game – a first at UVa since Percy Ellsworth and Joe Crocker each had a pair of interceptions against Virginia Tech in 1994.

DOWLING NAMED FINALIST FOR LOWE'S SENIOR CLASS AWARD

- Virginia CB Ras-I Dowling has been recognized as one of 10 NCAA FBS student-athletes as a finalist for the football Lowe's Senior CLASS Award.
- To be eligible for the award, a student-athlete must be classified as an NCAA Division I senior and have notable achievements in four areas of excellence - classroom, character, community and competition.
- An acronym for Celebrating Loyalty and Achievement for Staying in School, the Lowe's Senior CLASS Award focuses on the total student-athlete and encourages students to use their platform in athletics to make a positive impact as leaders in their communities.
- Nationwide fan voting to determine the winner lasts through December 6. Fan votes will be combined with media and coaches votes to determine the winner.

HINKEBEIN PILES UP TOUCHBACKS

- Chris Hinkebein has made a habit of putting his kickoffs deep in opponent territory, resulting in 16 touchbacks, including five against vs. EMU.
- That is the most touchbacks by a UVa kicker since Chris Gould had 21 in 2006 – the year before the NCAA moved the kickoff line from the 35 to the 30.
- It also ranks third in the ACC this season.
- Hinkebein has 21 career touchbacks.

HORNE RANKS THIRD IN ACC IN KICKOFF RETURNS

- Averaging 24.9 yards per kick return, Raynard Horne ranks third in the ACC and 46th nationally.
- Horne has 573 kickoff return yards on the season and is aiming to become just the sixth UVa player to reach 600 return yards in a season.
- It also is the sixth-most kick return yards in school history.
- With 768 kick return yards in 1986, Chris Warren holds the school record for a season.
- Horne returned a first-quarter kickoff 87 yards for a touchdown against VMI.
- It was UVa's first kickoff return since Sept. 11, 2004, when Marquis Weeks took a kick back 100 yards for a TD against North Carolina.
- Horne's return was the 12th-longest return in UVa history and the senior's first career scoring play.
- Horne's 144 kickoff return yards against UNC (Oct. 16) ranks as the eighth-most kickoff return yards in UVa history.
- UVa got its second kickoff return for a TD from Terence Fells-Danzer against Eastern Michigan (70 yards).

HOWELL RANKS SIXTH ON SINGLE-SEASON PUNTING LIST

- With his 42.4-yard punt average, Howell currently ranks No. 6 on the single-season UVa punting ledger.
- Howell chases only Russ Henderson's 1976 mark of 45.9, Ryan Weigand's 2007 mark of 45.2, Will Brice's 1996 mark of 44.7 and Donnie Scott (1998) and Mike Abrams (2000), who both hit on a 42.6 average.

VIRGINIA SCORES TWICE OFF TRICK PLAYS ON SPECIAL TEAMS

- Virginia has reached the end zone twice this year on trick plays.
- Against Maryland, UVa reached paydirt on a 16-yard flip pass from holder Jacob Hodges to Terence Fells-Danzer on a field goal attempt.
- A former high school quarterback, punter Jimmy Howell tossed a 56-yard touchdown pass to Trey Womack on a fake punt against Eastern Michigan.
- It marked the first touchdown UVa has scored off a fake punt in modern school history (since 1945).
- Howell's pass was the first completion by a Virginia punter since Tom Hagan's 8-yard completion in 2002.

On December 7, Mike London was named the head football coach at the University of Virginia after serving in the same capacity the previous two years at the University of Richmond. London heads up a Cavalier program where he twice previously served stints as an assistant coach. He is the 39th coach in the program's history.

In two seasons at Richmond, London led the Spiders to a 24-5 record. His first year at the helm his team went 13-3 and won the Football Championship Series national title. The 2009 Spider team, ranked nine consecutive weeks at No. 1 in the FCS polls, went 11-2 and reached the quarterfinals of the FCS playoffs. His teams were 13-4 in the Colonial Athletic Conference during the 2008 and 2009 campaigns.

London's efforts in 2008 earned him FCS National Coach of the Year honors from both the American Football Coaches Association and Schutt Sports/ American Football Monthly magazine. London was also honored as the Black Coaches Association Male Coach of the Year in 2008, beating out Mike Tomlin of the Super Bowl Champion Pittsburgh Steelers for the award. In addition to the national honors, London was tabbed the State Coach of the Year from both VaSID and the Peninsula Sports Club.

Under London's watch, 16 Spiders were named to the All-CAA Football Team in 2009 after placing 12 in 2008. His first year at UR, nine Spiders garnered 15 All-America awards and six were recognized on the Academic All-Conference Team. DE Lawrence Sidbury was a fourth-round NFL draft pick by the Atlanta Falcons, while RB Josh Vaughan was a free-agent signee by the Tampa Bay Buccaneers.

Before returning to coach his alma mater, London spent six of seven seasons coaching for Al Groh at Virginia. In 2001 London joined the UVa staff for the first time as the defensive line coach. He took over the responsibilities as recruiting coordinator in 2002. In 2005 London left UVa to work as the defensive line coach for the NFL's Houston Texas. He returned to Virginia in 2006 as the defensive coordinator and defensive line coach.

During his tenure with the Cavaliers, he saw five defensive players (Chris Long, Marcus Hamilton, Chris Canty, Andrew Hoffman and Monsanto Pope) drafted by NFL teams. Long was the ACC Defensive Player of the Year in 2007, earned unanimous All-America honors, was the Ted Hendricks Award winner as the nation's top defensive end and the second overall selection in the 2008 NFL Draft.

A native of Hampton, Va., London played defensive back at Richmond from 1979-82. Under head coach Dal Shealy, he led the Spiders with six interceptions as a senior captain in 1982. In addition to earning all-state honors, he was chosen the team's MVP and received the Spiders' Coaches Award. In 1982, the Virginia Peninsula Sports Club selected him as the male in-state Athlete of the Year.

London graduated from Richmond in 1983 with a bachelor's degree in sociology and a year later received a degree in law enforcement from the Richmond Police Academy, serving as a detective for the street crimes unit from November of 1984 to July of 1989. The Dallas Cowboys signed him as a free agent in 1983.

London broke into the collegiate coaching ranks in 1989, spending two seasons with Richmond as the outside linebackers coach and admissions liaison, followed by four seasons (1991-94) as the defensive line coach at William & Mary.

He returned to Richmond for two more years (1995-96) as the outside linebackers coach and recruiting coordinator, coaching All-America LB Shawn Barber, who was a fourth-round draft pick by the Washington Redskins in 1998 and played 10 years in the NFL. London served as defensive line coach at Boston College for the 1997-2000 seasons, where he helped lead the Eagles to two bowl appearances.

London and his wife Regina have seven children, Michael, Jr., Brandon, Kristen, Ticynn, Korben, Jaicyn and Madicyn. The 49-year-old London was born in West Point, N.Y. in 1960.

His son, Brandon, led Massachusetts in receiving in 2006 and finished his career as the school's second leading receiver. He was signed to the Miami Dolphins active roster in 2008 after spending the 2007 season on the Super Bowl Champion N.Y. Giants practice squad. One of London's daughters, Kristen, played on the UVa women's basketball team during the 2007-08 and 2008-09 seasons. His younger brother, Paul, was a defensive back at UVa from 1991-95.

- London became the first UVa coach to win his debut UVa game since the Bill Elias-led Cavaliers defeated William and Mary 21-6 in 1961. London snapped a streak of six-straight first-year UVa head coaches losing their first games at the University.
- Virginia improved to 26-2-2 in the all-time series with Richmond and won its seventh-consecutive contest vs. the Spiders.
- Virginia snapped Richmond's streak of 12-consecutive road victories – FCS's longest streak and second-longest in the NCAA (Boise State's 13 is NCAA's best).
- Virginia TB Keith Payne rushed for 114 yards and four touchdowns vs. Richmond. It was the most rushing yards by a Virginia player since Cedric Peerman rushed for 118 yards against Georgia Tech in 2008. It was a single-game career high for Payne (previous high was 70 yards against Middle Tennessee State in 2007).
- Payne became the first Cavalier to rush for four touchdowns in a game since Mikell Simpson did it against Indiana in 2009.
- Marc Verica had a career-high 283 passing yards and registered his seventh 200+ yard passing game of his career (his previous high was 279 at Wake Forest in 2008).
- Virginia TB Perry Jones had a career-long 38-yard rush in the first quarter. His previous long was three yards. It was the longest rush by a Cavalier since Vic Hall (40 yards vs. Virginia Tech in 2008).
- Kris Burd's 51-yard reception in the fourth quarter was longest of Burd's career and tied the longest completion for Verica.
- Burd finished with 122 yards receiving. The last time a Virginia player had a 100-yard receiving game was Kevin Ogletree (100 yards even) vs. Maryland in 2008.
- Burd and Dontrelle Inman each set career highs with 7 receptions, also more than any player for Virginia had in a single-game in 2009.
- First field goal attempt of Chris Hinkebein's career (51 yard attempt no good in the second quarter).
- Longest FG attempt of Robert Randolph's career (50 yards in the second quarter).
- Chase Minnifield's fourth-quarter 65-yard interception return is the seventh-longest interception return in school history.

- Marc Verica's 76-yard touchdown pass to Kris Burd in the third quarter marked his longest career completion. Verica's previous long was 51 yards, which he recorded against Richmond earlier this year and against Maryland in 2008.

Game Notes

- North Carolina earned its first victory in Charlottesville since 1981, snapping the Cavaliers' 14-game home win streak against the Tar Heels with a 44-10 victory Saturday.
- Starting at RT against North Carolina, Morgan Moses became just the third true freshman in UVa history to start at an offensive tackle position. He follows D'Brickshaw Ferguson (2002- LT) and Brad Butler (2002- RT). Moses is the seventh true freshman to start at offensive tackle in Division I this season.
- With Colter Phillips' 8-yard catch in the first quarter, Virginia recorded its 500th reception by a tight end since 2001.
- Saturday's game marked the first time the Cavaliers sported an orange-on-orange uniform combination since 1986, when the team fell to Maryland, 42-10. Previous to that, Virginia wore the all-orange ensemble in 1979, in 20-18 win against Virginia Tech.
- Throwing for 139 yards against North Carolina, Marc Verica passed Scott Secules for 10th all-time in passing at Virginia.
- Keith Payne scored his eighth rushing touchdown of the season against the Tar Heels, eclipsing Jameel Sewell's team-high of seven touchdowns in 2009.
- North Carolina's 27 first-half points ties the most surrendered by the Cavaliers in the first half this season. Florida State also scored 27 points in the opening period against Virginia.
- Keith Payne's 49-yard run in the third quarter marked the longest carry of his career and the longest by a Virginia player this season. His previous long was 17 yards against Middle Tennessee State in 2007.
- Matt Conrath recorded his first career fumble recovery against the Tar Heels.
- Keith Payne rushed for over 100 yards for the second time this season and the second time in his career, tallying 107 yards on the ground against North Carolina.
- North Carolina's T.J. Yates became the first player since Duke's Thaddeus Lewis in 2009 to pass for over 300 yards against the Cavaliers.
- With its 44-10 victory, North Carolina scored the most points against Virginia since 1997, when the Tar Heels notched a 48-20 victory against the Cavaliers. The Tar Heels' 44 points also marks their highest total in Charlottesville since a 44-40 loss in 1973.

Game Notes

- It was a noteworthy day for minority football coaches and athletic directors on the Division I FBS and FCS levels (excluding historically black colleges). Virginia coach Mike London and Uva athletics director Craig Littlepage hosted Eastern Michigan coach Ron English and EMU athletics director Dr. Derrick Craig in what is believed to be the first Division I football game with the opposing coaches and athletic directors being African-Americans.
- LB Darnell Carter, FB Terence Fells-Danzer, FS Dom Joseph, C Mike Price and DE Jake Snyder earned their first career starts for the Cavaliers.
- Running back Keith Payne's 4-yard touchdown run marked the third time this season Virginia has scored a touchdown on its opening drive. The Cavaliers also made it into the end zone on their first possession against Richmond and VMI.
- Tight end Paul Freedman scored his first career touchdown against the Eagles. His 21-yard reception for a score also marked the longest catch of his career, passing his previous long of five yards.
- Fells-Danzer also notched the second touchdown of his career against the Eagles, recording his first-ever kickoff return for a touchdown in the third quarter. The 70-yard return for a score was the second shortest in Virginia history, the shortest coming on a 46-yard kickoff return for a touchdown by Joe Crocker against Maryland in 1994.
- Trey Womack recorded his first career touchdown on a fake punt and pass by Jimmy Howell in the third quarter. The 56-yard play marked the first pass attempt and completion of Howell's career and Womack's first-ever reception. It marked the first TD off a fake punt in modern Uva history (since 1945).
- Howell's pass was the first completion by a Virginia punter since Tom Hagan's 8-yard completion in 2002.
- With Howell's TD pass, four different Cavaliers-Marc Verica, Ross Metheny, Michael Rocco, and Jimmy Howell-have now thrown for a TD this season. The last time Virginia accomplished the feat was in 2003, when Matt Schaub, Marques Hagans, Wali Lundy, and Anthony Martinez all recorded passing TD.
- Chase Minnifield tallied his team-high fourth interception this season and the eighth of his career against the Eagles.
- The game against EMU was the first time Virginia quarterbacks have avoided a sack since a home game against Duke in 2007.

Game Notes

- Virginia's win over No. 22 Miami was the Cavaliers' first over a ranked team since beating No. 21 Georgia Tech in Atlanta 24-17 on Oct. 25, 2008.
- For the first time in ACC history, two African-American head coaches faced off with Mike London leading the Cavaliers against Randy Shannon and the Hurricanes.
- Senior TB Keith Payne earned his first career start.
- Virginia's five interceptions against Miami were the program's most since 1994 against Virginia Tech. In that game, Percy Ellsworth and Joe Crocker both had two interceptions in a 42-23 victory against the Hokies.
- The Virginia offense has not allowed a sack since the second quarter of its game against North Carolina.
- Jimmy Howell's 52-yard punt in the first quarter marked his ninth kick over 50 yards this season; Howell landed three punts inside the 15-yard line against UM.
- Chase Minnifield had two interceptions against the Hurricanes, marking the second time he has recorded two pick-offs in a game this season. Minnifield also had two interceptions against VMI.
- With six interceptions this season, Minnifield now has 10 career picks to tie for 14th on Virginia's all-time list.
- Colter Phillips' 16-yard touchdown reception in the second quarter was his third receiving touchdown of the season, the most by a Virginia tight end since Tom Santi recorded three in 2007.
- Corey Mosley tallied his first two interceptions of the season against the Hurricanes. Mosley now has three career picks.
- Keith Payne notched his 11th and 12th rushing touchdown of the season against the Hurricanes, scoring on a 30-yard run in the second quarter and later on a five-yard run in the fourth quarter.
- Payne's 12 rushing touchdowns this season are the second-most by a Cavalier since 2000, second only to Wali Lundy's 17 in 2004.
- Rodney McLeod tallied his first career interception against Miami, picking off a pass from Miami quarterback Spencer Whipple in the second quarter.
- With his 104 receiving yards against Miami, Kris Burd became the 30th player in program history to reach 1,000 career receiving yards.

- Randolph's score off the fake field goal was a Cavalier first since Scott Deke tossed a 12-yard pass on a fake field goal to John Phillips in UVA's 35-20 triumph over East Carolina in 2008.
- Keith Payne's 9-yard touchdown reception in the second quarter was the first TD reception of his career.
- Payne rushed for over 100 yards for the third time this season and the third time in his career, tallying 121 yards on the ground against Duke.
- Payne's 121 yards was a career high, passing his 114 yards gained against Richmond in season opener.
- Perry Jones touchdown reception was his first career score of any variety.
- Jones also rushed for a career-high 89 yards. His previous high was 77 earlier this year at USC.

- 32 fourth-and fifth-year players were honored in the Cavaliers' Senior Day ceremonies Saturday.
- In honor of Military Appreciation Day, the Virginia coaching staff sported camouflage pants and hats against Maryland.
- Linebacker Steve Greer started his first game of the season Saturday.
- Kris Burd (686) and Dontrelle Inman (654) became the first UVA tandem to post at least 600 receiving yards each in a season since 1989, when Herman Moore (848) and Bruce McGonnigal (634) accomplished the feat.
- Kris Burd (47) and Dontrelle Inman (41) became the first UVA wide receiver duo in program history to amass at least 40 receptions apiece in a season.
- Kris Burd returned the first punt of his career Saturday, recording a 4-yard return in the second quarter.
- With 44 return yards against Maryland, Raynard Horne (537) became the 13th UVA player to amass over 500 yards on kick returns in a season. A Cavalier has now reached the mark five of the past six years, with Chase Minnifield (513) most recently reaching the milestone in 2009.
- Junior Jacob Hodges became the fifth Cavalier to throw for a touchdown this season, completing a 16-yard pass to Terence Fells-Danzer for a score on a fake field goal attempt in the first quarter. The touchdown pass was the first of Hodges' career.
- The last time five different Cavaliers threw TD passes was 2002 when Matt Schaub (28), Marques Hagans (1), Wali Lundy (1), Billy McMullen (1) and Heath Miller (1) all tossed scores.
- Jeremiah Mathis recorded his first career touchdown against the Terrapins, scoring on an 11-yard pass from Marc Verica in the second quarter.
- Mathis became the 14th different Cavalier in 2010 to score a touchdown, moving into a tie for third most since 2000. The 2003 season also saw 14 different Cavaliers score touchdowns.
- Chris Hinkebein made the first field goal of his career against Maryland, converting on a 52-yard attempt to end the second quarter. Hinkebein's FG ties for the fourth longest in UVA history and marks the longest by a Cavalier since 2003, when Connor Hughes also notched a 52-yarder against N.C. State.
- With his 37-yard field goal in the third quarter, Robert Randolph has now converted on eight of his last nine attempts.
- Bobby Smith made his collegiate debut, becoming the 21st different Cavalier to make their first appearance at UVA in 2010.
