VIRGINIA IN THE NCAA CHAMPIONSHIP

- Counting this year, Virginia has competed in each of the last six NCAA tournaments and nine overall.
- UVa is 12-16 all-time in the NCAA tournament.
- Under Brian O'Connor (since 2004), UVa is 6-10 in the NCAAs.
- Seven current Cavaliers have competed in the NCAA Tourney.

UVa ONE OF 15 IN LAST SIX NCAA TOURNAMENTS

- Virginia is one of 15 Division I baseball programs to reach the NCAA tournament each of the last six seasons (including '09).
- The Cavaliers are one of four schools in the ACC to hold that distinction, joining Florida State, Miami and North Carolina.
- The other programs are Arizona State, Arkansas, Cal State Fullerton, Missouri, Oral Roberts, Rice, South Carolina, Southern Miss, TCU, Texas and Wichita State.

SERIES HISTORY VS. THE IRVINE FIELD

- Virginia has never faced any of the teams in the Irvine Regional.
- UVa made its first-ever trip to California last year at the Fullerton Regional.

VIRGINIA AGAINST THE 2009 NCAA FIELD

- Virginia faced six teams this year that advanced to the NCAA tournament (Boston College, Clemson, Florida State, Georgia Tech, North Carolina, Miami).
- UVa went 9-6-1 against those teams.

CAVALIERS WIN THIRD ACC CHAMPIONSHIP

- The Cavaliers claimed their third ACC title on Sunday. It was the UVa's second tournament title (1996).
- Virginia also won the ACC regular-season title in 1972 in the pre-tournament era.
- The sixth seed, UVa was the lowest-seeded team to ever win the ACC Baseball Championship.

CAVALIERS A FAN OF BIG INNINGS

- Virginia has scored four or more runs in 34 innings this year.
- UVa recorded three such innings at the ACC Baseball Championship, including a 10-run third inning Friday vs. North Carolina.
- The Cavaliers also scored seven in the seventh inning vs. Duke and four in the fifth inning against Clemson.

SEASON HIGHLIGHTS

- UVa defeated Clemson, North Carolina, Duke and Florida State to win the ACC Baseball Championship last week.
- UVa leads the ACC in batting, ERA and stolen bases.
- Jarrett Parker has become a force, batting .377 with 16 home runs and 60 RBI.
- ACC Freshman of the Year Danny Hultzen emerged as a two-way threat, leading ACC starters in ERA while hitting .333.
- UVa has more than doubled its HR output from 2008 and has its most HR (50) since 2002.
- The Cavaliers' seven everyday starters are each hitting over .300.
- The Cavaliers have 43 wins despite an everyday lineup which features seven underclassmen.
- Even with 43 wins, the season has been full of near-misses - eight ACC losses by one run.

DOUBLING UP ON HOMERS

- Virginia has hit 53 home runs this year, more than doubling its total from the entire 2008 season (25 in 62 games).
- It is easily the most home runs of any UVA team in the Brian O'Connor coaching era (since 2004); the previous high was 35 in 2005.
- Six Cavaliers have at least five dingers this year – in the four previous years, only seven players had five or more homers in a season.

THREE NAMED TO ALL-TOURNEY TEAM

- Virginia had three representatives on the ACC All-Tournament Team, highlighted by tournament MVP Dan Grovatt (8-for-15, 3 2B, HR, 5 RBI).
- Grovatt is UVA's first ACC Tournament MVP since P Seth Greisinger in 1996.
- Franco Valdes (5 RBI) and Danny Hultzen (6.1 IP, .357 BA) also made the squad.

RECORD FIVE WAHOOS NAMED TO ALL-ACC FIRST TEAM

- Five UVA players earned All-ACC First-Team honors this year – Tyler Cannon (SS), Phil Goselin (2B), Dan Grovatt (OF), Danny Hultzen (UTL) and Jarrett Parker (OF).
- It was the most first-team honorees of any ACC school and the most ever for a Virginia baseball team.
- Hultzen was honored as the ACC Freshman of Year – the first in UVA history.

HULTZEN, PARKER INVITED TO NATIONAL TEAM TRIALS

• UVa's Danny Hultzen and Jarrett Parker are two of 36 college players to be invited to the USA Baseball National Team Trials.
• The trials will be conducted June 14-24 in Cary, N.C. A 22-member team will be selected June 24.

UVA VS. RANKED OPPONENTS

• The Cavaliers are 7-5-1 against ranked teams, going 2-0 against Florida State (14th, 7th), 1-2 vs. then-No. 4 Miami, 2-2 vs. then-No. 5 North Carolina and 1-1-1 against then-No. 8 Georgia Tech.
• Four of the five losses were by one run (the other loss was by two runs).
• UVa went 3-0 vs. ranked foes in the ACC Baseball Championship.
• If UVa faces UC Irvine, it will be the Cavaliers' first meeting vs. a No. 1-ranked team since winning 8-7 in 11 innings against North Carolina on May 21, 2008.

BULLPEN ROCK SOLID IN ACC TOURNEY

• Virginia's bullpen stepped up and was outstanding at the ACC Baseball Championship.
• The bullpen combined to throw 17.1 innings in the four games (1.67 ERA).
• The 'pen allowed only three earned runs, 11 hits and five walks while striking out 20.
• Tyler Wilson notched two wins, while Andrew Carraway picked up one.
• Kevin Arico saved two games and finished three.

TWO-OUT MAGIC

• In the final three games of the ACC Baseball Championship, Virginia scored 17 of its 28 runs with two outs.
• The Cavaliers' seven-run seventh inning vs. Duke started with two outs – the next eight batters reached safely.

CAVALIERS SHOOT FOR UVA K RECORD

• Virginia pitchers have 519 strikeouts this year – tied for second most in program history with the 2006 squad.
• The program record is 551, set last year (62 games).

AMONG A CHOICE FEW

• The Cavaliers are one of just seven teams in the nation to boast 43 or more wins this season.
• Coastal Carolina and LSU (46) lead the nation in wins. Arizona State and Louisville each have 44.
• UVa is tied with Middle Tennessee and UC Irvine for fifth nationally with 43 victories.
• Virginia also is tied with Arizona State and George Mason for the fewest losses in the country (12).

CANNON EXPLODES OF LATE

• On a team devoid of upperclassmen, junior Tyler Cannon made a big impact the last two weekends.
• He has gone 14-for-26 (.538) over the last two weeks.
• May 15, he recorded his second career five-hit game, with three doubles (hitting right-handed) and two singles (hitting left).
• He finished the regular season as UVa's leading hitter in ACC games – .377, sixth in the conference.

HULTZEN BREAKS UVA FRESHMAN K RECORD

• Danny Hultzen (86) has set the Virginia freshman record for strikeouts.
• Jacob Thompson previously held the freshman record of 77 strikeouts in 2006.

CAVALIER COMEBACK KIDS

• Virginia has displayed a 'never-say-die' attitude throughout the year.
• The Cavaliers have rallied from deficits of three or more to win seven times this year, including two late comebacks of five or more.

CARRAWAY CLIMBS UVA CHARTS

• Andrew Carraway has moved into a seventh-place tie in career strikeouts at UVa (229). He is tied with Joe Koshansky (2001-04) for seventh and needs four to match Kevin Shrout (1997-2000) for sixth.
• He is third in career winning percentage at UVa (17-4 record, .809 pct.).
• He also has made 70 career appearances – tied for fifth in UVA history.

HICKS BECOMES JACK OF ALL TRADES

- In each of the last two ACC weekends, John Hicks has started at first base, catcher and left field in one game each.
- Hicks made his first career appearance in left field on May 10 vs. Duke.
- In 50 starts this season, Hicks has made 22 at catcher, 16 at first, nine at DH and three in left field.

FRESHMEN DIG THE LONG BALL

- UVa freshmen Steven Proscia and John Hicks each have been key figures in the Cavaliers' power surge this year.
- Proscia has eight homers, and Hicks has seven.
- Proscia's eight homers are the most by a Cavalier freshman since Sean Doolittle swatted 11 in 2005.

GRAND SLAMS KEEP COMING TOO

- Jarrett Parker's grand slam May 10 vs. Duke was the Cavaliers' fourth this season.
- UVa had four grand slams in the previous four seasons combined.
- Parker, Phil Gosselin, Steven Proscia and Franco Valdes each have one grand slam.

ONE FOR THE RECORD BOOKS

- Jarrett Parker is having a monster season.
- He ranks among the top 10 in UVa single-season history in the following categories:

Runs	73 – 1st
Doubles	18 – T8th
Triples	6 – T3rd
Home runs	16 – T3rd
Runs batted in	60 – T3rd
Total bases	162 – 2nd

- He is two shy of the top 10 in stolen bases (19).

PARKER SETS THE TABLE WELL

- Jarrett Parker has been strong as UVa's lead-off hitter.
- He is second in the ACC with 73 runs scored and has scored at least one run in 42 of 56 games (75 percent).
- Parker ranks eighth in the ACC in batting (.375). He leads the ACC in triples (6), is second in total bases (162) and fourth in hits (84).

PARKER SPRINTS PAST RUNS RECORD

- Jarrett Parker scored his 61st run of the season April 26, breaking the previous record of 60. It took Parker 44 games to break the mark.
- The record was held by two former players, Mark Reynolds (2004) and David Guy (1988).
- Reynolds needed 59 games to score 58 times, and it took Guy 49 games.

LEADING OFF WITH A BANG

- Jarrett Parker has hit five home runs to lead off games this season – UVa had not had a leadoff homer in the four previous years.

- Parker's first leadoff homer (Feb. 22 vs. Bucknell) was Virginia's first since Mark Reynolds hit one at Liberty on May 18, 2004.
- Parker also has hit leadoff home runs against Delaware, North Carolina, Maryland and Virginia Tech.

OFFENSE CONTINUES TO PUT UP BIG NUMBERS

- In 56 games, UVa already has easily topped its 2008 totals in runs (466), triples (24), home runs (53) and extra-base hits (194).
- The Cavaliers scored 384 runs and hit 18 triples, 25 home runs and 163 extra-base hits last year (62 games).

GROVATT KEEPS UP THE HITS STREAKS

- Dan Grovatt has three hitting streaks of nine or more games this year (19, 9, 10).
- He has three of the four longest streaks on the team this year.
- Grovatt had a 12-game ACC hitting streak snapped last Friday and has hits in 24 of 28 ACC games this year.

CAVALIERS KEEP IT UP IN ACC PLAY

- Virginia, which leads the league in batting (.333) and pitching (3.33), also paces the conference in batting in ACC games only. UVa hit .330 in ACC contests.
- In contrast, UVa hit just .260 in ACC games last season.
- UVa also finished third in ERA in ACC games only with a 4.63 mark (UNC led at 4.25).

CLOSE TO THE VEST IN ACC PLAY

- Twenty of UVa's last 27 games vs. ACC opponents have been decided by three runs or fewer (including the tournament).
- Eight of UVa's 11 ACC losses came by one run, with one coming by two and another by three.
- UVa leads the ACC with eight one-run defeats (VT and UNC have five, Duke four).

DEFENSE COMES THROUGH

- The Cavaliers have a .971 fielding percentage, which is second in the ACC (Duke - .979).
- In ACC games, that mark is even higher – Virginia has a .972 fielding percentage, trailing only Duke (.978) and BC (.975).
- UVa had three errors in four games at the ACC Baseball Championship – a .978 mark.

UNDERCLASSMEN PUT UP BIG NUMBERS

- UVa's offense has been dominated by the freshmen and sophomores.
- In all, 83 percent (553 total) of the Cavaliers' hits this year have come from underclassmen (115 from juniors, 0 from seniors).
- Freshmen and sophomores also account for 83 percent of the team's runs and RBI.

- The Cavaliers and Texas each allow 7.66 hits per nine innings.

UVa GETS EARLY JUMP ON FOES

- Virginia has scored first in 36 of its 56 games, including 18 of the 28 ACC games.
- UVa is 30-5-1 when scoring first, including 12-5-1 in ACC games.
- The Cavaliers have combined to outscore their opponents 162-75 in the first three innings this season.

RAIN RAIN GO AWAY

- Rain and poor weather have been main adversaries of the Cavaliers this year.
- UVa has lost five games to weather this year, including two games with then-No. 14 Florida State and one game against then-No. 19 Coastal Carolina.
- The Cavaliers also have had five games delayed by rain.
- Including the May 9 Duke game, Virginia has altered seven game times in order to get in games (not including cancelled games).

PITCHING AT TOP OF ACC HEAP

- The Virginia pitching staff has racked up the best ERA (3.33) in the conference thus far.
- Clemson is second with a 3.68 ERA.
- The Cavaliers have surrendered 434 hits (7.75/game) this year.
- Opponents are batting an ACC-low .236 against Virginia pitching.

DON'T FORGET THE SPEED TOO

- UVa leads the ACC with 102 stolen bases.
- That total ranks 20th nationally.
- UVa has been caught stealing just 23 times.
- Florida State (118) and NC State (105) are the only ACC teams that have attempted more stolen bases than UVa has stolen.
- Three Wahos ranks among the top 10 in the ACC in steals – Phil Gosselin and Jarrett Parker (third, 19) and Tyler Cannon (seventh, 16).
- Virginia has led the ACC in stolen bases in each of the last three seasons.

CAVALIERS ARE TOP TWO FROSH HITTERS

- UVa's Danny Hultzen (.333) and Steven Proscia (.326) rank one-two among the ACC's freshman hitters.
- Proscia also is tied for eighth in the ACC with 18 doubles.

OFFENSE AMONG NATION'S BEST

- In the NCAA's latest rankings (5/10), Virginia ranked 15th nationally in team batting average (.341 entering the week). Eastern Illinois leads at .366.
- The Cavaliers also are 28th in hits (585) and 17th in triples (20).

PITCHING UP THERE AS WELL

- Virginia's pitching staff ranks third in the country in ERA (3.26 as of 5/10). Only Texas (2.66) and Arizona State (2.89) were better.
- UVa also stands first in hits allowed per nine innings (7.66) and 14th in strikeouts per nine innings (9.1).

HULTZEN ANCHORS PITCHING STAFF

- Freshman Danny Hultzen has gone 8-1 with a 2.21 ERA in 13 appearances (12 starts). His ERA ranks second in the ACC and first among starting pitchers.
- In 73.1 innings this year, Hultzen has whiffed 86 batters – fourth-most in the ACC.
- Hultzen already has a 13-strikeout game (vs. FSU), a 12-strikeout performance (vs. Fordham) and a pair of nine-strikeout games (at Wake Forest, vs. NC State).

CARRAWAY NAMED ACADEMIC ALL-DISTRICT

- Andrew Carraway has been named to the 2009 *ESPN The Magazine* Academic All-District Baseball Team. Carraway was a first-team selection on the District 3 First Team.
- District 3 consists of schools from Florida, Georgia, North Carolina, South Carolina and Virginia.
- It marks the second straight year that he has earned the honor. He will now be on the ballot for the Academic All-America award.

EVERYONE HITS!

- Virginia has made a habit of batting around in innings this year.
- In 56 games, the Cavaliers have batted around 28 times.
- UVa's high in one inning this year is 15 batters, set May 22 in the ACC Baseball Championship against North Carolina (third inning).
- UVa scored a season-high 10 runs in that inning against UNC – eight vs. Tar Heel ace Alex White.

O'CONNOR BECOMES THIRD-FASTEST TO 250

- UVa head coach Brian O'Connor has 259 career wins in his six seasons at Virginia (361 games total).
- With his 250th career win April 25 vs. NC State (348th career game), he became the third-fastest to reach 250 wins in ACC history.
- Only Clemson's Jack Leggett (338 games) and Florida State's Mike Martin (343 - since joining ACC) reached 250 wins faster.
- O'Connor is 259-101-1 (.716) at Virginia.

RUNNING THE GAUNTLET

- UVa had a brutal ACC stretch in March, competing against each of the league's 2008 College World Series participants in consecutive weeks.
- It started when the Cavaliers played host to Florida State. Miami then came to Charlottesville before Virginia traveled to North Carolina. UVa went 3-4 in that stretch (1-0 vs. FSU, 1-2 vs. Miami, 1-2 vs. UNC). Three of the four losses were by one run, the other by two.
- UVa was the lone school to face these three teams in consecutive weeks this year.

NOTING THE 19-GAME WIN STREAK

- Virginia started the season with a 19-game winning streak, the longest win streak in school history.
- The streak came to a halt with a 4-3 loss March 21 to Miami.
- UVa was the last unbeaten team in Division I and held the longest active winning streak in Division I.
- The Cavaliers also started 5-0 in the ACC for the first time in school history.

FIFTH-LONGEST STREAK IN ACC HISTORY

- The Cavaliers' 19-game win streak is tied for the sixth longest in ACC history.
- It was the longest streak by an ACC team since FSU ran off 25 straight wins in 2002.

- Virginia has two captains this year – seniors Andrew Carraway and Robert Poutier.
- Poutier, who graduated in 2008 and is currently working on his master's degree, is serving as a captain for the second straight year.
- Carraway is a three-time All-ACC Academic Baseball Team honoree and currently is living on the Lawn at UVa – one of the highest honors bestowed upon UVa students.

ERA TOPS IN NATION OVER LAST FOUR YEARS

- Virginia pitchers boast a 3.10 ERA over the last four seasons – the lowest ERA in NCAA Division I over the last four seasons.
- UVa ranked third in the nation in ERA in 2005, 2006 and 2007 and was 15th last year.
