FOR OPENERS

- Virginia has won nine consecutive games vs. William & Mary.
- All-American Malcolm Brogdon has three consecutive 20-point games and leads UVA in scoring for the third straight season at a career-best 17.4 points per game.
- Junior point guard London Perrantes missed the Ohio State game following an appendectomy and his status for the William & Mary game is to be determined.
- Virginia has scored 80 or more points in five games, the most under under Tony Bennett and most since five in 2008-09 and 11 in 2007-08.
- UVA is shooting 50.7 percent from the field (best since 52.3% in 1982-83), 40.2 percent from 3-point range (school best) and 75.7 percent from the free throw line (best since 76.2% in 1978-79).
- Former UVA manager Luke Ford (2011-14) is the Director of Basketball Operations at William & Mary.
- William & Mary assistant coach Austin Shaver is a 2007 graduate from the University of Virginia.

VIRGINIA'S RANKED NO. 10 IN LATEST POLLS

- UVA is ranked No. 10 in the latest Associated Press and USA Today Coaches' polls.
- UVA was ranked No. 12 in both polls last week, falling out the top 10 for the first time since Feb. 24, 2014.
- UVA had been ranked in the top 10 in 25 consecutive AP polls since March 3, 2014, its longest span since 49 consecutive polls from 1980-83.
- The Cavaliers' No. 6 preseason ranking was UVA's best since a No. 1 ranking to start the 1982-83 season.
- Virginia has been ranked in the preseason top-10 in back-to-back seasons for the first time since 1981-82 and 1982-83.
- UVA has finished in the top 10 (No. 3 in 2014 & No. 6 in 2015) in the final AP rankings in back-to-back seasons for the first time since three straight seasons from 1981-83.

LAST TIME OUT

- Malcolm Brogdon had a game-high 22 points to send No. 10 Virginia to a 64-58 win over Ohio State in a Big Ten/ACC Challenge game on Dec. 1.
- Darius Thompson had 12 points and six assists in place of London Perrantes and Anthony Gill (10 points) hit double figures for the 10th straight game dating back to last season.
- Marc Loving led Ohio State with 19 points as the Buckeyes shot 50 percent from the field.
- UVA out-rebounded its opponent for the fifth straight game and shot 50 percent (8-16) from 3-point range.

BACK TO THE FUTURE

- Virginia's 78.6 points per game average is its highest under Tony Bennett and highest since averaging 79.6 points in 2001-02.
- UVA has tallied 80 or more points in five of seven games this season, including four straight from Nov. 19-25, after recording 80 or more points in two of 34 games in 2014-15.
- The Cavaliers scored 82 or more points in three straight games (Nov. 19-22 at Charleston Classic) for the first time since the first three games of the 2001-02 season.

VIRGINIA HEAD COACH TONY BENNETT

- Head coach Tony Bennett sports a 142-65 mark in seven seasons at Virginia and 211-98 career mark in 10 seasons.
- Bennett was named 2015 USBWA National Coach of the Year after leading Virginia to a school-record tying 30 wins and its second consecutive ACC regular-season title.
- Bennett was also named ACC Coach of the Year, NABC District 2 Coach of the Year and USBWA District 3 Coach of the Year for the second consecutive year.
- Bennett has led the Cavaliers to 30 wins in back-to-back seasons for the first time in school history.
- In 2013-14, Bennett guided UVA to its first ACC regular season and tournament championship (first since 1976) in the same season for the first time in school history.
- Bennett has led the Cavaliers to four consecutive postseason tournaments (NCAA in 2012, 2014 and 2015, and NIT in 2013).
- Bennett-coached teams are 76-3 when holding opponents to fewer than 50 points during his 10-year coaching career.
- Bennett-coached teams have led the nation in scoring defense three times (2008-09, 2013-14 & 2014-15), and finished in the top five nationally in six of nine seasons.
- Bennett is one of 26 Division I head coaches who played in the NBA.
- UVA is 74-24 (.755) in non-conference action and 87-20 (.813) at home under Tony Bennett.

'HOO ARE THESE WAHOOS?

- UVA is averaging 78.3 points per game and yielding 58.3 ppg (most since 62.4 ppg in 2010-11).
- Senior All-America candidate Malcolm Brogdon leads UVA in scoring for the third consecutive season at a career-best 17.4 points per game, while All-ACC performer Anthony Gill is averaging 12.1 points and 5.6 rebounds.
- Brogdon has four 20-point efforts, including a career-high 28 at George Washington, and Gill has reached double figures in scoring in all seven games.
- London Perrantes is averaging career highs in points (10.0), assists (5.3) and assist-to-turnover ratio (4.57).
- Marial Shayok has reached double figures in scoring in three of the last five games, including a career-high 17 vs. Long Beach State, since joining the starting lineup.
- UVA has out-rebounded its opponents in each of its six wins and has a +9.6 rebounding margin overall.
- Nine players are averaging 10 or more minutes per game.
- The Cavaliers, who have shot 50 percent or better from 3-point range in three of their last four games, are shooting 40.2 percent from beyond the arc, its best in school history.

ALL-AMERICAN BROGDON LEADS CAVALIERS INTO ACTION

- Preseason co-ACC Player of the Year Malcolm Brogdon leads UVA into action this season.
- Brogdon is averaging a team-leading 17.4 points and 4.7 rebounds per game in 2015-16.
- Brogdon's 17.4 scoring average is the highest for UVA since Mike Scott's 18.0 ppg in 2011-12.
- Brogdon was named a preseason All-American by The Sporting News (1st team), Blue Ribbon Yearbook (1st team), CBSSports.com (2nd team), NBCSports.com (2nd team), Bleacher Report (2nd team), USA Today (3rd team) and CollegeInsider.com.
- In 2014-15, Brogdon averaged 14.0 points and 3.9 rebounds en route to All-America second-team and All-ACC first-team accolades.
- The two-time All-ACC performer, who was a John Wooden Award finalist last season, ranks 28th on UVA's all-time scoring list with 1,261 points in 107 career games (11.8 career ppg).
- Brogdon ranks second on UVA's career free-throw percentage list at 85.6% (298-for-348).
- Brogdon, who is a candidate for the 2016 Senior CLASS Award and Wooden Citizen Cup Award, was named to the 2014 Allstate NABC Good Works Team.
- Brogdon helped Team USA to a bronze medal at the 2015 Pan American Games in Toronto.
- The redshirt senior earned a degree in history and is pursuing a master's degree in public policy from the Frank Batten School of Leadership and Public Policy.

LONDON CALLING THE SHOTS

- Junior point guard London Perrantes is enjoying a breakout season in 2015-16.
- Perrantes has hit double figures in scoring in three of his last four games, including a season-high 16 points vs. George Mason.
- He tallied his second career double-double with 16 points and career-high 11 assists against George Mason en route to MVP honors at the Charleston Classic.
- Perrantes is shooting a career-best 47.8 percent (11-23) from 3-point range.
- Perrantes has a career 3.3 assist-to turnover ratio (320 assists, 96 turnovers) in 75 career games.
- Perrantes averaged 6.4 points and 4.6 assists en route to honorable mention All-ACC honors last season.
- He set career highs in points (26) and 3-pointers (5) at Miami (1/3/15).
- Perrantes earned All-ACC Freshman Team honors in 2013-14.

DT SHOWING HIS VERSATILITY

- Darius Thompson has averaged 7.7 points, 2.7 rebounds, 2.2 assists and 1.0 steals in 22.4 minutes in his first season at UVA.
- Thompson sat out as a transfer last season after averaging 2.6 points and 2.4 assists in 37 games at Tennessee in 2013-14.
- Thompson had 12 points, six rebounds, four assists and three steals in his UVA debut as a starter vs. Morgan State, 12 points off the bench vs. Lehigh and 12 points in a start at Ohio State.

HIGH POINT MAN TO THE GILLS

- Preseason All-ACC second-team selection Anthony Gill, who is averaging 12.1 points and 5.6 rebounds, is Virginia's top frontcourt offensive player.
- Gill, a High Point, N.C., native, averaged 11.6 points and 6.5 rebounds en route to All-ACC third-team (media) honors in 2014-15.
- Gill's team-leading 29 steals helped earn him a spot on the coaches' All-ACC Defensive Team in 2014-15.
- Gill, who has led UVA in field goal percentage in each of the past two seasons, is shooting 57.8 percent during his UVA career.
- Gill earned MVP honors at the 2014 Barclays Center Classic and ranked 13th in the ACC in rebounding.
- Gill has amassed 1,046 career points in three seasons at UVA and one at South Carolina.

HALL OF A SPARK OFF THE BENCH

- Redshirt sophomore guard Devon Hall has earned increased playing time this season for UVA.
- Hall has played in all seven games this season and is averaging 18.4 minutes after averaging 10.6 minutes in 23 contests last season.
- Hall netted a career-high 13 points vs. Morgan State and drained a career-best four 3-pointers for 12 points vs. Long Beach State.
- He played a career-high 24 minutes at Ohio State.

GETTING SALTY

- Redshirt freshman center Jack Salt earned a starting role in each of his last three games because of his defensive presence.
- Salt has averaged 3.3 points and 1.7 rebounds in 10.6 minutes, converting 57.9 percent from the field with three blocked shots.
- Salt played at the same high school as former All-Big 10 player and current New Zealand pro basketball player Kirk Penney, whom Tony Bennett coached while an assistant at Wisconsin.

BROGDON AND GILL ON WOODEN AWARD WATCH LIST

- Malcolm Brogdon and Anthony Gill are among 50 players on the preseason 2016 John R. Wooden Award Watch List, honoring the nation's top player.
- Gill earns his first preseason Wooden Award Watch List honor, while Brogdon was a Wooden Award All-American and finalist last season.

- Malcolm Brogdon is one of 50 players on the Naismith Trophy Men's College Player of the Year Early Season Watch List.
- Brogdon is one of 33 players on USBWA's Oscar Robertson Troy Watch List, honoring the nation's top player.
- Brogdon is one of 20 players on the preseason Jerry West Award Watch List, honoring the nation's top shooting guard.
- Brogdon was a candidate for all three awards last season after leading UVA in scoring at 14 points per game.

- Anthony Gill is among an all-time high 257 total nominees for the 2016 Allstate NABC and WBCA Good Works Teams®.
- This distinguished award shines a spotlight on a select group of student-athletes who have shown dedication to service in their communities.
- Gill has volunteered at hospitals, schools, Boys and Girls Club's, mentoring and speaking to children and at-risk youth.
- Gill made a mission trip to Jamaica with Athletes in Action, started a fundraiser for Love 146, packaged shoes for the Sole Hope organization and is planning a shoe drive in Charlottesville for the Dominican Republic.
- Joe Harris (2014) and Malcolm Brogdon (2015) were named to the Allstate NABC Good Works Team in the past two years.

- Virginia is 51-2 when holding opponents under 50 points in the Tony Bennett era.
- UVA is 35-1 over the past four seasons when holding opponents to fewer than 50 points.
