VIRGINIA-GEORGIA TECH SERIES

- Georgia Tech holds a 68-49-2 series edge over Virginia, but UVa is 23-13-1 against the Yellow Jackets since the current coaching staff took over in 2004.
- Virginia has won four of its last five series against Georgia Tech, although the Yellow Jackets won two of three in 2013 in Atlanta.
- Recent games have been extremely tight – 28 of the 37 games since 2004 have been decided by three runs or fewer (16 by one run or a tie).
- UVa swept the series last year in Charlottesville, although all three games in were nailbiters – a pair of 4-3 games as well as a 3-1 contest.

STREAKY CAVALIERS LOOK TO START NEW ONE

- After snapping a four-game losing streak Wednesday, Virginia looks to start a new streak Friday.
- The Cavaliers have had five winning/losing streaks of three or more games this year – two winning streaks and three losing streaks.
- UVa won 10 straight to begin the season and had a five-game win streak snapped on April 1.
- The Cavaliers have had a three-game losing streak in addition to a pair of four-game streaks.

LINEUP DOMINATED BY FRESHMEN

- Virginia has put at least four freshmen in 31 of the 32 starting lineups this year, including eight games with five rookies and three contests with six.
- Ernie Clement (CF/2B), Adam Haseley (RF/CF) and Pavin Smith (1B/LF) have started every game this year.
- UVa has had first-years in all three outfield positions in eight games.
- Fifteen of UVa's 31 players are freshmen.

CAVALIERS MOVING TOWARD MORE CONSISTENT LINEUP

- After plenty of lineup juggling through the first 22 games of the season, Virginia has used a similar lineup over nine of the past 10.
- Prior to the Wednesday game, UVa had used the same nine players in nine straight games.
- UVa used 15 different lineups in the first 22 games.

- Virginia is No. 46 in the first NCAA RPI for 2015 (Georgia Tech is No. 13).
- UVa is 17-4 away from home this year (3-8 at home).
- UVa has started 18 different lineups in 32 games, but has used the same players in nine of the last 10 games.
- Seven of Virginia's 12 losses have come by two runs or fewer, including five by one run.
- UVa averages 9.7 strikeouts per nine innings (seventh nationally).

HASELEY GETS BAT GOING

- After a slow start at the plate to begin his career, Adam Haseley has gotten it going over the last three weeks.
- He hit .169 over his first 15 games, but is batting .356 since (26-for-73).
- Haseley leads the team with a .438 batting average in true road games.
- He went 13-for-23 during UVa's five-game road swing from March 25-31, including 7-for-13 (.538) in the Notre Dame series.

• He is batting .340 in league games (second on team) and hit his first college home run in Game 1 at Notre Dame.

THAISS PROVIDES THUNDER IN UVA LINEUP

- Sophomore catcher Matt Thaiss has given the Cavaliers' lineup a jolt of power this season. He has blasted seven home runs (sixth in the ACC).
- Thaiss hit his seventh homer in UVa's 18th game of the season on March 20 vs FSU; last season it took Mike Papi 42 games to hit his seventh long ball.

• Thaiss leads the team in batting (.328) and on base percentage (.444). He is batting a team-best .319 in ACC games.

DOHERTY GIVES CAVALIERS ANOTHER OPTION

- Junior Kevin Doherty has given Virginia a boost this season, both on the mound at the plate.
- He has been one of UVa's top left-handed options out of the bullpen, pitching in 12 games, which is third most on the team (1-1, 3.76 ERA, 2 saves, 26.1 IP, 21 K, .185 BAA).
- Doherty has stepped up of late at the plate and been in the lineup in each of the last 16 games, including 14 starts in the outfield.
- He has reached base safely in 14 of the last 16 contests. In 19 games total, he is batting .268 with 11 RBI.

ROTATION ANCHORS PITCHING STAFF

- The weekend rotation of Nathan Kirby, Connor Jones and Brandon Waddell has been strong, going 10-5 with a 2.67 ERA.
- They have combined to pitch into at least the sixth inning in 17 of their 24 starts this season.
- The threesome is averaging 10.4 strikeouts per nine innings.
- Last weekend the trio combined to work 19 innings and allow four earned runs and six walks in the sweep at Notre Dame.

KIRBY AIMS FOR ANOTHER QUALITY START

- Nathan Kirby has a penchant for earning quality starts during his two years as a starter.
- In the last two seasons, Kirby has recorded 21 quality starts in 26 attempts (quality start = at least six IP and three earned runs or fewer allowed).
- He has six quality starts in eight starts this year after recording 15 in 18 starts in 2014.
- Kirby currently leads the ACC in strikeouts (69) and is second in ERA (1.94) and strikeouts (62).
- He also ranks fifth nationally in strikeouts.
- Currently with 218 career strikeouts, Kirby needs 11 punchouts to reach the top 10 in the Virginia career annals.

VETERAN WADDELL SET FOR 43RD START

- Brandon Waddell has been a consistent presence in UVa's rotation in his three seasons. This marks his 36th straight regular-season weekend start, dating to opening day in 2013.
- Waddell is scheduled to make his 43rd career start Sunday. That ranks as the sixth-most starts in program history.
- Waddell has an 18-8 career record and needs a pair of wins to reach the top 10 in UVa history.
- He also is nearing the UVa top 10 in innings pitched – with 243 innings, Waddell needs 6 1/3 innings to match Tyler Wilson for 10th in program history.

WALKS WILL HAUNT

- Virginia's pitching staff has been plagued at times by walks this year. UVa has walked six or more batters in eight games (2-6 in those games).
- UVa walked 34 batters in the three-game series with Florida State (14 came around to score), including 12 in the Saturday game and 15 Sunday.
- It marked by far the most walks in a three-game series during Brian O'Connor's tenure – the previous high was 21 in a 2007 series vs NC State.
- UVa ranked No. 1 nationally in walks/hits per nine innings (WHIP) at 1.03 last year and was tops in the ACC in fewest walks per nine innings (2.88).

WEATHER WREAKS HAVOC ON HOME SCHEDULE

- Inclement weather has forced UVa to postpone three midweek games and relocate three weekend series.
- In all, Virginia has had 13 home games altered because of inclement weather.
- UVa was forced to shift its series with Marist (Feb. 20-22) to Charleston, S.C., and its round-robin tournament with Hartford and Seton Hall to Myrtle Beach.
- UVa played its first home game March 11 (but not until after a two-hour rain delay). UVa's midweek games with VCU and GW have yet to be rescheduled.

FRESHMEN PROVIDE BOOST

- Virginia's freshmen have played a key role in the early going this season.
- UVa's first-year players have combined to record 50.5 percent of the position player starts as well as 46 percent of the hits and runs.

TOWNS STEPS UP TO MAN CLEANUP SPOT

- Senior Kenny Towns has been UVa's top run producer out of the cleanup spot with a team-high 28 RBI.
- He is batting .326 (second on team) and also leads the team in hits (42) and doubles (11).
- Towns's streak of reaching base safely in 36 straight games came to an end in the first game of the March 7 doubleheader against Pitt.
- He reached base safely in the first 13 games this season after finishing the 2014 season by reaching safely in 26 straight games.
- His 36-game streak ranked fourth in Division I baseball and tops amongst ACC players.

HOME RUN TRACKER

- Virginia has hit 20 home runs through its first 32 games, with seven players going deep thus far.
- This mirrors the uptick in home runs across the country this season. The NCAA reported last week that home runs are up 39 percent this year.
- UVa home runs are up 63 percent compared to this point last season. The Cavaliers hit 12 home runs through 28 games and finished with 33 long balls in 69 games in 2014.

INJURIES FORCE CAVALIERS TO JUGGLE LINEUP

- Virginia has been forced to alter its lineup after injuries have hampered three of its returning starters.
- The Cavaliers already have trotted out 18 different starting lineups in the first 32 games.
- Kenny Towns (3B) and Daniel Pinero (SS) are the lone Cavaliers to start every game at the same position.
- Two-year starting OF Joe McCarthy had back surgery in late January and is slated to miss approximately 12 weeks.
- Catcher Robbie Coman injured his knee on Feb. 21 and missed eight games, although he still is unavailable to catch.
- John La Prise is out for the season with a hip injury that limited him to four games early this season.
- Freshmen Jack Gerstenmaier (hamstring) and Riley Wilson (shoulder) also have been sidelined by injuries and have not played this season.

JONES SETTLES INTO STARTING ROLE

- In his first season in the UVa rotation, Connor Jones has been solid, with a 4-1 record and 2.89 ERA.
- In 46 2/3 innings, Jones is limiting opponents to a .229 batting average, but he has walked 24 batters.
- He is 16th in the ACC in ERA.
- Jones is coming off one of his best performances, a career-best 7 2/3 inning stint in the Game 2 win at Notre Dame. He struck out a career-high nine batters.

SBORZ TAKES OVER AS CLOSER

- Josh Sborz moved into the bullpen and the closer role this season and has recorded eight saves (second to FSU's Billy Strode with 10).
- Sborz is limiting opponents to a .159 batting average.
- He went 6-4 with a 2.92 ERA in 17 games (15 starts) during the 2014 season, primarily as the Saturday starter.
- Sborz took over for All-American Nick Howard, who saved an ACC-record 20 games last year and was taken 19th overall by the Cincinnati Reds in the MLB Draft.
- UVa closers own 155 saves in the 12 seasons under the current coaching staff (13.5 saves per season).
- Six of the seven closers since 2004 have been selected in the MLB Draft, including five in the top 10 rounds.

LA PRISE OUT FOR SEASON

- Virginia INF/OF John La Prise had hip surgery on Wednesday (April 1) and will miss the remainder of the season.
- His scheduled recovery period is approximately six months.
- La Prise was slated to be the Cavaliers' starting center fielder heading into the year but played in just four games early this season while battling the injury.
- La Prise batted .348 with 10 doubles and 17 RBI in 2014. He was fifth on the team with 62 hits and had the second-most hits of any returning Cavalier this year.

CAVALIERS ADD PAIR FROM CLUB TEAM

- With injuries causing some major depth issues early this season, Virginia has added a pair of players to the roster. Both were members of the UVa club team.
- Catcher Ben Cassillo, a freshman, is wearing No. 41, while senior infielder Kevin Radford sports No. 5.
- Cassillo is a native of Latham, N.Y., while Radford is from Norfolk, Va. (Maury HS).

UVA STARTS SEASON 10-0 FOR FOURTH TIME

- Virginia recorded a 10-0 start for the fourth time in program history – all during Brian O'Connor's 12 seasons as head coach. All 10 games were away from home (three road, seven neutral).
- UVa won 19 consecutive games to begin the 2009 season. That remains the longest win streak at any point in program history.
- UVa won 11 straight to open the 2008 season and 14 straight to begin the 2013 campaign.
- The Cavaliers were one of the last two unbeaten teams in the nation, joining Texas A&M.

CAVALIERS CAPTURE 18-INNING MARATHON

- Virginia defeated Marist 5-4 in 18 innings on Feb. 22 in Charleston, S.C. It is the longest game by innings in program history.
- The previous high was a 17-inning game, ironically also in Charleston, in 2006 against College of Charleston.

PRESEASON ALL-AMERICANS

- Three Cavaliers were named preseason All-Americans: LHP Nathan Kirby, OF Joe McCarthy and LHP Brandon Waddell.
- Kirby was a unanimous first-team All-America selection, while McCarthy and Waddell each were named to various teams.

MCCARTHY OUT FOLLOWING BACK SURGERY

- Junior OF Joe McCarthy is scheduled to miss approximately 12 weeks after undergoing back surgery on Jan. 29.
- A 2015 Preseason All-American, McCarthy started all 69 games last season, batting .301 with six home runs and 49 RBI. He led the team with 16 doubles and 11 stolen bases and was one off the team lead with 77 hits.
- During his two seasons at UVa, McCarthy is a .317 batter with 152 hits in 129 games.

KIRBY, WADDELL ON GOLDEN SPIKES WATCH LIST

- Virginia left-handed pitchers Nathan Kirby and Brandon Waddell each were named to the preseason Golden Spikes Award watch list.
- The list consists of 50 players in amateur baseball.
- Virginia is one of seven schools who have multiple players on the list, joining Cal State Fullerton, Florida, Miami, TCU, UCLA and Vanderbilt.
- A preseason First-Team All-American, Kirby was a semifinalist for the 2014 Golden Spikes Award.

VIRGINIA LANDS NO. 2 RECRUITING CLASS

- Virginia reeled in the No. 2-ranked recruiting class for 2014 according to Baseball America, behind only LSU. It marked the best recruiting ranking in program history.
- The class is comprised of 13 student-athletes.
- Three were selected in the 2014 MLB Draft: RHP Derek Casey (22nd round, St. Louis), 1B/LHP Pavin Smith (32nd round, Colorado) and RHP Tommy Doyle (35th round, Washington).

WHO'S GONE?

- Virginia has plenty of holes to fill after losing five position players and three key members of its bullpen to the 2014 MLB Draft.
- Virginia had three first-round picks, just the seventh program in the last 20 years to do so in one year: RHP Nick Howard (No. 19), OF Derek Fisher (No. 37) and OF Mike Papi (No. 38).
- UVa also lost OF Brandon Downes (7th round), INF Braden Cogswell (7th), RHP Artie Lewicki (8th), RHP Whit Mayberry (21st) and C Nate Irving (34th).
- With eight players drafted, UVa tied for the second most picks of any school in 2014 (Ole Miss, 9).
- UVa had six players taken in the top 10 rounds – most of any school.

O'CONNOR LEADS ACTIVE COACHES IN WIN PCT., 13TH ALL-TIME

- Virginia head coach Brian O'Connor is 534-189-2 (.740) in his 12th season in charge of the Cavaliers' program.
- O'Connor's 74.3 percent winning percentage entering the season ranked No. 1 among active Division I head coaches.
- O'Connor also ranks 13th all-time in career winning percentage among all coaches with at least 10 years of head coaching experience.
- Virginia has won at least 39 games in all 11 of O'Connor's seasons, including nine 40-win seasons and four 50-win campaigns.

UVA BREAKS SCHOOL ATTENDANCE RECORDS

- Virginia broke the school records for season and average attendances last season.
- UVa ranked 11th nationally in total attendance (142,496) and average attendance (3,749).
- Both totals ranked third among ACC programs.
- UVa crushed its previous records for average (3,298 in 2011) and total attendance (125,959 in 2010).

- More than 110,000 fans have attended Virginia games each of the past five seasons as UVa has ranked among the top 20 programs nationally in attendance every year.

- In its exhibition contest, UVa scored a 9-1 win over Panama Metro on Dec. 18 at Rod Carew National Stadium, a 27,000-seat stadium which hosted games in the 2013 World Baseball Classic.
- During its travels through Panama, the Cavaliers had the opportunity to tour the Miraflores Locks at the Panama Canal, canoe down the Tigris River and visit the indigenous Embera Village, where the team toured and learned about the village's customs.
- While in Costa Rica, the team toured the Doka Coffee Plantation, zip-lined through the rainforest, hiked through the Arenal Volcano National Park and went white-water rafting on the Savegre River.
