### VIRGINIA-BOSTON COLLEGE SERIES

- Virginia is 10-1 all-time against Boston College, with all the meetings coming since BC started ACC play in 2006.
- UVa has won all four series; BC won its first game against UVa last year in Chestnut Hill, although the Cavaliers won two of three in the series.
- UVa has won all six games in Charlottesville.

### NO STRANGERS TO BIG CROWDS

- Virginia has gotten used to playing in front of large crowds at home and on the road this season.
- UVa already has played in front of six road crowds of more than 3,500.
- In midweek action, the Cavaliers have been welcomed by sellout, record-setting crowds at William and Mary and James Madison.
- Virginia's home attendance also is up nearly 900 fans per game from this point last season, despite a cool February and early March.

### WAHOOS NOTCH FIRST SERIES WIN VS. FLORIDA STATE

- Virginia scored its first-ever series win against Florida State last weekend, taking two of three games in Tallahassee.
- UVa was 0-for-14 in its previous three-game series with the Seminoles.
- It also marked the highest-ranked opponent that UVa has won a series against since March 17-18, 2007 at then-No. 1 North Carolina.

### HULTZEN LOOKS TO CONTINUE DOMINANCE

- Danny Hultzen has been sensational this season, posting a 3-1 record with a 1.04 ERA.
- In 26 innings, he has struck out an ACC-best 31 and walked just three. Batters are hitting .146 against him – second lowest in the ACC
- Since allowing two runs, two hits and two walks in the first inning of the season opener at East Carolina, Hultzen has surrendered just two runs (one earned), 11 hits and one walk, with 31 strikeouts.

- Phil Gosselin reached base six times Wednesday – five by BB, one by HBP.
- Tyler Cannon has moved into eighth place on the all-time UVA hits list (226).
- UVa has not allowed a run in the ninth inning this season (11-0).
- Virginia's returning starters have combined for over 1,000 career starts.

## GROVATT FINDS POWER STROKE

- After not recording a long ball in the first dozen games, Dan Grovatt broke out in a big way with three in the FSU series.
- He was named the ACC Player of the Week after going 9-for-17 (.529) with seven RBI last week.
- Friday he recorded his first career two-home run game and UVa's first since Jeremy Farrell swatted two against Georgia Tech on May 16, 2008.
- He added a solo dinger on Sunday.

## NO SLOUCHES IN THE NINE-HOLE

- Virginia has gotten big numbers out of its nine-hole hitters this season.
- The No. 9 hitters in the Virginia lineup have combined to go 25-for-57 (.439) this season with 15 RBI and 19 runs scored.
- Outside of the leadoff and No. 3 holes, UVa has gotten its most hits out of the ninth spot in the batting order.
- Keith Werman, out of the ninth spot, has gone 13-for-22 with eight runs scored and five RBI this year.
- John Barr, David Coleman and freshmen Chris Taylor, Reed Gragnani and Stephen Bruno also have gotten opportunities out of the nine-hole.

## OFFENSE REVS UP IN SECOND

- Virginia has been outscored 13-10 in the first inning this year, but the Cavaliers have rebounded to outscore their foes 64-16 over the next three innings, including 22-3 in the second inning and 23-3 in the fourth.
- Overall, Virginia is outscoring its opponents 157-68 this season.

## GOSSELIN HAS BIG SUCCESS AT TOP OF ORDER

- Phil Gosselin moved into the Cavaliers' leadoff slot this year and has been solid thus far, with a .380 batting average and .483 on base percentage.
- He had his career-best 10-game hitting streak snapped at William and Mary (3/10).
- Gosselin has reached base to lead off 10 of 17 games.
- He ranks second in the ACC in doubles (7) and is nearing the leaders in walks (14).

## BALANCE THROUGHOUT LINEUP

- UVa has gotten production from its entire lineup, with five players boasting at least 20 hits and 15 runs.
- In seven games, at least eight of the nine Virginia starters have recorded at least one hit.
- On three occasions, all nine UVa starters posted at least one hit.
- The Cavaliers are hitting .359 as a team through 17 games (second in the ACC to NC State - .370).

## PROSCIA PICKS UP GAME

- Steven Proscia has been a force in the cleanup spot. He ranks third in the ACC in RBI with 28.
- He also ranks seventh in doubles (7).
- He has 10 multiple-hit and eight multiple-RBI games this year – both team highs.
- Proscia typically hit in the five-hole last season.

## NOT EASY TO RUN AGAINST CAVALIERS

- Virginia's battery has done a good job of holding runners on and cutting them down on the basepaths.
- UVa catchers have thrown out 9-of-23 (39.1%) would-be base stealers this season.
- Only Florida State (50%, 11-of-22) and Georgia Tech (45.4%, 10-of-22) have a higher percentage in the ACC this season.
- Virginia threw out 26-of-63 (41.3%) potential base stealers last season.

## FRESHMEN PRODUCE WHILE WAITING TURN

- UVa's freshman infielders have made the most of their opportunities thus far. At the plate, Stephen Bruno, Reed Gragnani and Chris Taylor have combined to go 20-for-50 (.400).
- Bruno went 3-for-6 in the Florida State series and had a grand slam against Rhode Island.
- Gragnani is 7-for-15 with six RBI in three starts at DH.
- Taylor hit a big run-scoring triple in the ninth inning in UVa's win at East Carolina Feb. 21.

### VIRGINIA RANKS 28TH NATIONALLY IN ATTENDANCE

- With a season average of 1,993 per game, Virginia ranks 28th nationally in attendance through the first four weeks of the season.
- Virginia's attendance is up nearly 900 fans per game from the same point last season.
- UVa ranks fourth in attendance this season among ACC schools, behind Florida State, Clemson and Miami.
- UVa averaged 1,513 fans per game last season. The UVa single-season attendance average record is 1,774, set in 2007.

### CAVALIERS EARN FIRST-EVER NO. 1 NATIONAL RANKING

- Virginia has earned a No. 1 ranking by Baseball America and Rivals.com for the fourth straight week. UVa also was tabbed No. 1 by the National Collegiate Baseball Writers Association (NCBWA) this week.
- It marks the first No. 1 ranking in school history for Virginia Baseball.
- The baseball team becomes the 10th athletics program at Virginia to garner a No. 1 national ranking, joining men's basketball, women's basketball, field hockey, football, men's lacrosse, women's lacrosse, men's soccer, women's soccer and men's tennis.
- Virginia currently has three teams ranked No. 1 – baseball, men's lacrosse and men's tennis.

### DEFENSE OFF TO GOOD START

- Through 17 games, Virginia has committed just 15 errors – good for an impressive .977 fielding pct.
- The Cavaliers recorded a .972 fielding mark last year.
- The school record for fielding percentage is .975, set in 2005.

### CANNON RIDES NINE-GAME HIT STREAK

- Tyler Cannon has a nine-game hit streak entering the weekend; it is one shy of his career best, set from Feb. 23-March 8, 2008.
- In the streak, he has at least two hits in seven of the nine games.
- UVa's best hit streak this season is 12, set by John Hicks to start the season.

### CANNON CLIMBS VIRGINIA CHARTS

- Tyler Cannon comes into the week with 748 career at bats, which is seventh in UVa history.
- Cannon also is in seventh place in career games played with 201.
- Cannon now has 51 doubles – third at UVa. He needs one to reach second and two to tie Brandon Guyer (2005-07) for the career lead.
- He also is tied for second in triples (11), eighth in hits (226) and runs scored (151) and 10th in HBP (19).

### ARICO, PARKER MOVE UP IN UVA ANNALS

- With his save Wednesday, Kevin Arico now has 17 career saves – third in Virginia history.
- He needs one save to match Tim LaVigne (1997-2000) for second in the UVa annals.
- With his triple at ECU, Jarrett Parker has hit 11 triples in his career, which is tied for second in UVa history. He needs two more three-baggers to tie Brian Buchanan (1992-94) for the Virginia record.

## VETERAN-LADEN CAVALIERS

- Virginia has one of its most experienced teams ever.
- The Cavaliers' returning position players have combined for 1,053 career starts, led by senior shortstop Tyler Cannon, who has started 195 games.
- Ten players have started at least 50 career games apiece for UVA. Cannon, Dan Grovatt (136), Jarrett Parker (127) and Phil Gosselin (120) each have more than 100 career starts.

## STARTING LINEUP BACK IN TACT

- Virtually the entire offense returns from 2009, including everyone from the starting lineup.
- Almost all of the offensive production is back – 99 percent of the RBI-production returns, with 98.4 percent of the hit-producers (755 of 767) coming back.
- Virginia hit .327 last season – the Cavaliers' best mark since 1985 – and swatted 59 home runs – UVA's most since 2002.
- Dan Grovatt (.356), Jarrett Parker (.355) and Tyler Cannon (.351) led UVA in batting last year. UVA has nine regular starters back who hit at least .292 last year.

## WHO'S GONE?

- Virginia will need to replace 229.0 innings lost from the 2009 squad.
- The top loss comes from starter Andrew Carraway, who tossed 91.0 innings last year.
- Matt Packer pitched 61 innings – second-most out of the bullpen.

## UVA LEADS NATION IN ERA LAST FIVE YEARS

- Virginia led all NCAA Division I teams in ERA over the past five seasons, boasting a 3.13 team ERA.
- UVA ranked in the top 15 in the country in ERA each of the last six seasons, including No. 3 marks in 2005, 2006, 2007 and 2009.
- North Carolina is the only other team to rank among the top 15 nationally in ERA for the last six years.
- Virginia is the only team in Division I to rank among the top 20 nationally in ERA, strikeouts and fewest hits and walks allowed each of the last two years.

## STRONG CORE OF PITCHERS BACK, BUT HOLES REMAIN

- UVA has to fill the holes of six pitchers who logged 226.0 innings and made 30 starts last season. Nine pitchers return.
- Danny Hultzen (9-1, 2.17) and Robert Morey (3-0, 3.33) each had strong 2009 seasons and will anchor the rotation, but the third weekend rotation slot as well as several bullpen spots are still in limbo.
- UVA had a 3.23 ERA last year (third nationally) and has the best ERA in the nation (3.13) over the last five seasons.

## NEXT MAN UP ON MOUND

- While Virginia has plenty of arms returning, they still need players to step up, particularly in the bullpen.
- Senior Neal Davis and freshman Aaron Stull both will be key left-handed options.
- From the right side, Kevin Arico, Corey Hunt, Ryan Briggs, Tyler Wilson, Chad O'Connor, Branden Kline, Shane Halley, Will Roberts, Justin Thompson, Cody Winarski and Whit Mayberry all will have chances to step up for UVA.

## NEWCOMERS ADD TALENT, DEPTH

- UVA welcomes a top-10 recruiting class this year, including five who were previously drafted.
- Stephen Bruno, Reed Gagnani and Chris Taylor all will push the returning infielders at second, third and shortstop for immediate playing time.
- Kenny Swab (C/1B/OF) and Ryan Levine (C/1B) each are physical players who add power to the lineup.
- Ryan Briggs, Branden Kline, Cody Winarski, Whit Mayberry and Aaron Stull all provide pitching options.
- Rob Amaro gives UVA another option at first or behind the plate, while Colin Harrington adds depth in the infield and outfield.

## VERSATILITY WILL BE KEY

- Much of the UVA's depth comes because of its versatility – several players could see action at a variety of positions.
- John Hicks and Kenny Swab each are athletic players who primarily are catchers but both will shift to first base and the outfield at times.
- Danny Hultzen will pitch and also is a strong first baseman and will DH as well, while Phil Gosselin could play at second or left field.
- Corey Hunt (INF) and Shane Halley (OF) each will pitch, but are great defensive players in the field as well.

## 2009 IN REVIEW

- Virginia finished 49-15-1 (16-11-1 ACC) and advanced to the College World Series for the first time in program history.
- UVA won the NCAA Irvine Regional and Oxford Super Regional – the program's first NCAA regional and super regional championships.
- UVA defeated Clemson, UNC, Duke and Florida State to win the ACC Baseball Championship – the third ACC crown in school history. Dan Grovatt (8-for-15, .533) was named the tournament MVP, while Danny Hultzen and Franco Valdes joined him on the All-Tournament Team.
- As the sixth seed, UVA became the lowest seed ever to win the ACC Baseball Championship.
- The Cavaliers won a school-record 49 games, while posting a record .761 winning percentage.
- Brian O'Connor was named the NCBWA and CBI National Coach of the Year.
- UVA led the ACC in batting (.327), ERA (3.23) and stolen bases (119) – the first school since Maryland in 1954 to lead the ACC in all three categories.
- UVA ranked third nationally with a 3.23 ERA.
- The Cavaliers set 11 team school records, including hits (767), runs (507) and strikeouts (593).
- Virginia had a school-record five players picked to the All-ACC First Team – Tyler Cannon (SS), Phil Gosselin (2B), Dan Grovatt (OF), Danny Hultzen (UTL) and Jarrett Parker (OF).

## SCHEDULE WILL CHALLENGE

- Virginia's schedule is not for the faint of heart – 11 teams from the 2009 NCAA Tournament line the schedule.
- Thirty-six games will come against teams that won at least 30 games last year.
- UVA opened with a three-game set at East Carolina, a 2009 Super Regional qualifier.
- The ACC slate features six NCAA teams from last season – North Carolina (CWS), Clemson and Florida State (Super Regionals) and Boston College, Georgia Tech and Miami (Regionals).
- The Cavaliers also have non-conference matchups with 2009 NCAA Tournament foes Coastal Carolina, Dartmouth, George Mason and Wright State.
